RE: APPLICATION FOR PUBLIC EXHIBITION LICENSE
FOR MOTORCYCLE RACES - Stockton Road

A hearing was held before the Zoning Commissioner of
Baltimore County on March 13, 1951 to determine whether or
not an Application for a Public Exhibition License for the
conduct of motorcycle races, at Carroll and Stockton Roads,
in the Tenth District, should be approved by the Zoning
Department of Baltimore County.

The Baltimore Ramblers Motorcycle Club, Incorporated,
the applicant for this license, conducted two such exhibi-
tions on the site in question in 1950; applications for the
public exhibition licenses for these exhibitions having been
approved by the Zoning Department of Baltimore County.

Subsequent to the issuance of the licenses by
the Clerk of the Court for Baltimore County for the
conduct of these exhibitions, the applicant incurred
considerable expense in constructing a quarter mile track
and making other minor improvements. Also, subsequent
to the conduct of the races in 1950 considerable complaint
was lodged with this Department concerning the conduct of
these exhibitions.

Considering the above complaints this hearing
was held to determine the facts in the case so that the
pending application could be passed upon.

Complaints from the residents in the neighborhood
consist of the following:

1. That on the day of the race much congestion
is generated on the narrow roads in the neigh-
borhood resulting in actual hazard to life and
limb of local residents.

2. The noise of the motorcycles and the loud
speaker used at the exhibitions are very
annoying and disturbing to the residents.
3. Lack of adequate sanitary facilities to
prevent contamination of local water supplies
and the Loch Haven Watershed.

It is the opinion of the Zoning Commissioner that
due to the fact that these applications for licenses were
approved by the Zoning Department of Baltimore County in
1950 and said licenses were issued by the Clerk of the
Court and that the applicant has gone to considerable
expense in preparing a track for the conduct of these
races and in view of the shortage of time allowed the
applicant to find another site, this application should
be approved by this Department, subject to the following
provisions and restrictions:

1. That no loud speakers shall be used on the
property before 12:45 P. M. or after 11:00 P. M.;
that no music shall be played over said loud
speaker system and that said system shall be
tuned down to the lowest extent commensurate with
proper operation.
2. That no motorcycle motors shall be tested or
tried out before 12:00 Noon.
3. That toilet facilities be provided for 2000
people as required by the Health Department
of Baltimore County.
4. That the entrance to this site on Stockton
Road be barricaded with barbed wire or some
other suitable fencing at all times except on
the day of the two races.
5. That letters be written to the other clubs
invited to participate in these exhibitions
notifying them of the traffic problems involved
in coming to and going from these exhibitions
and advising them to conduct themselves in such
manner as to be the least obnoxious to the
people of the neighborhood, (a copy of this
letter to be forwarded to this office for our
files).

6. That the applicant request the Police Depart-
ment of Baltimore County to provide proper
police and traffic control over the people
attending these exhibitions. (Copy of said
letter to be forwarded to this office for
our files.)

In consideration of the foregoing the Zoning
Commissioner of Baltimore County this 14th day of
March, 1951, hereby approves the Application for Public
Exhibition License.

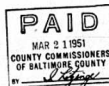
