On or about January S, 1954, Mr. Wilsie H. Adens, Zoning Commissioner of Baltimore County, held a hearing for the purpose of determining whether or not the Wood Products, Inc. was operating a Light Industrial plant for the manufacture of wood shipping crates or palletts in violation of the Zoning Regulations of Baltimore County.

The Zoning Commissioner held that the property in question is zoned residential, and that it enjoys a non-conforming commercial use, but not an industriel use.

The testimony before this Board showed that from about 1925 to 1953 the several owners of said property conducted thereon a general automobile sales, service and repair business. Repair service extended to passenger cars, trucks, tractors, lawn nowers, farm implements and occasionally other machinery and equipment. In the course of repairing various types of equipment, it frequently became necessary to do welding, lathe end drill press work in making warn or broken parts which were not read'ly obtainable.

The occasional making of discellaneous machine parts was incidental to the general repair business conducted on the promises. On one occasion one of the operators of the business made a wood bleaching machine for the Williams Manufacturing Co., and on another occasion he made a backet type of loading attachment for a tractor. However, this operator, who testified before this Board, was unable to say whether the manufacturing of the bleaching machine or bucket type londer was before or after the adoption of the Zoning Regulations of Saltimore County on January 2nd, 1945.

The evidence further showed that the various operators of said business also kept on the premises a number of automobiles and trucks, not in running condition, for miscellaneous parts.

The operation which has been carried on, on the premises in question, since about May, 1953, and which the neighbors complain about, consists of the manufacture and storage on the premises of shipping crates and palletts, using electrically operated saws sud wood working equipment.

The Board finds from the evidence that the occasional manufacture of miscellaneous parts for various types of machine equipment prior to January 2nd. 1945 was incidental to the commercial business being carried on on the premises and was not such a use as would give the owner an industrial non-conforming use for the manufacture of wood products or products of any kind, nature or description not incidental to the commercial use carried on prior to the adoption of the Zoning Regulations.

Therefore this Board finds that the manufacturing of wood products, shipping crates and palletts on said premiser is in violation of the Zoning Regulations and Restrictions for Baltimore County and should be terminated at once.

A hearing was held before me, Wilsie H. Adams, Zoning dissioner of Baltimore County on Friday, January 8, 195h at 10:00 a.m. in regard to a complaint that the Mood Products, Incorporated, was operating in violation of the Zoning Regulations and Sestrictions for Baltimore County.

It is the opinion of the Zoning Commissioner from the evidence heard that this location has a non-conforming connercial use. The testimony of Mr. Edgar A. Peppler, Jr. was that this building was used as a repair shop for trucks and automobiles up until the time he rented the building, which was May 13, 1949. Mr. Peppler testified that in the garage was a lathe and welding equipment and with the lathe a small amount of manufacturing was

Manufacturing which is incidental to a retail business is permitted in a commercial some under the Regulations and Restrictions but this incidental manufacturing does not give rise to a nonconforming use for a light industrial operation which has no connection with the nonconforming use.

It is, therefore, the opinion of the Zoning Commissioner of daltimore County that the Wood Products, Incorporated, are in violation of the Zoning Regulations and Restrictions.
