Pursuant to the advertisement, posting of property and public hearing on the above petition, upon hearing the testimony and after having seen the subject property both from the creek as well as from the surrounding roads. I can only conclude that this application for regoning is premature.

There is no question that the real and basic change in this area has been from a wooded area to an area developed with substantial homes. Many of the older homes have been renovated to restore life and vigor to a now active residential community.

The Court of Appeals has continuously stated that, either there must be changes to warrant such a reclassification or that the original soning be proven arroneous. The burden of proof rests with the petitioner and since in my opinion he failed to prove either I can only

OPINION

The petition in this case seeks a reclassification from an "R-6" (residence) Zone to a "M-L" (manufacturing light) Zone of property at the northeast corner of Nanticoke and Tred Avon Roads, in the Fifteenth Discrict of Baltimore County.

In this case the Board is presented with a number of problems which are compounded by the nonconforming use which is claimed but meither proven nor contested. After deliberation it is concluded that the petitioners' plan, as stated at the hearing, can be accomplished by a special exception rather than to change the classification and if properly covered with written restrictions the test of Section 502.1 can be successfully met and the surrounding neighborhood protected against what has been, and could continue to be under a nonconforming use, an objectionable use of land in

Therefore, under authority of Section 501.7 the Bourd denies the petition for reclassification from "R-6" Zone to a "N-L" Zone and modifies the Order appealed from to grant a special exception to the petitioners to build in the basin, or lower section of the lot, a building to be used for boat repairs and storage

The size of such building shall not be such as to constitute an encreachment on the socalled high ground, which should be restricted as subsequently defined and there shall be maintained a side yard of at least 25 feet from any neighboring residential property. The building line on the water side shall not be extended into the water beyond the normal shore line. The building shall not exceed two stories and shall be of construction which is harmonious with the meighborhood. The area covered by the building may be dredged to provide water-ways into the building, or the entire lot could be filled to provide proper floor levels.

The socalled high ground may be used for small boat storage or display but must be maintained in an orderly manner with setbacks for the storage or display area of 50 feet from both adjoining residential properties to conform to the residential character of the neighborhood. The front and side lot lines must be carefully defined with shrubbery or fence as limited in Section 102.5 with one entrance and one exit clearly defined with driveways that lead to adequate off-street parking which may be located behind the shrubbery or fence on the setbacks of the outside lot lines.

This Order does not affect the nonconforming use of this property which is not at issue but is intended to allow a betterment of conditions for the owner and enable the neighbors to enjoy residential property alongside this commercial use without fear of further encroachment of commercial enterprise.

ORDER

For the reasons set forth in the aforegoing Opinion it is this 23rd day of May, 1957, by the County Board of Appeals ORDERED that the reclassification from an "R-6" Zone to a "M-L" Zone is hereby denied but modifies the Order to grant a special
