OPINION

The petitioner seeks a special exception for a Boarding
Home or Care Home at the southeast corner of South Prospect and
Altamont Avenues of the First District of Baltimore County.

The petitioners testified that the subject property was purchased in May, 1960, and said property consists of fifteen rooms. They seek to operate this Care Home for convalescent or infirmed persons who are ambulatory and not confined to bed. Further testimony revealed that the petitioners were not experienced in this type of operation and that they did not plan to hire an experienced staff to maintain the premises.

The protestants gave convincing testimony that the granting of this petition would tend to overcrowd this essentially residential neighborhood and that a potential parking and traffic problem would be created.

The Board is of the opinion that the petitioners have neither the experience, facilities, or personnel to staff such an undertaking, and therefore, the specifications as set forth in Section 502.1 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations in regard to the general welfare of the neighborhood, traffic, and overcrowding, could not be complied with.

ORDER

For the reasons set forth in the aforegoing Opinion it is

this 9th day of February, 1961, by the Board of Appeals, ORDERED

that the special exception should be and the same is hereby denied.
