The petition of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, legal owner, and Westinghouse Electric Corporation, lessee respectfully represents:

 That the Mayor and City Council is the owner of property the Fourth Election Discrict located in/Baltimore County, Maryland, being known as the Liberty Dam site and has leased the following described parcel thereof to the Westinghouse Electric Corporation:

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OPINION AND ORDER

The above entitled Petition was heard before me on November 1, 1961. The Petitioners were represented by Theodore C. Waters and Richard C. Murray and Mr. Thomas L. Hennessey of the Office of Law was present.

It appears that Westinghouse Electric Corporation is engaged in a radar testing project for the United States Air Force and is required to erect and operate a test range for that purpose. The test range lies partly in Baltimore County and partly in Carroll County. That portion of the range in nore County consists of a receiver site which will be improved by a receiver tower and a ground building. These improvements will be located entirely upon property owned by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore which has leased the property for that purpose to Westinghouse, a copy of the lease being filed in this proceeding.

It further appears that the property in question is shown upon the Balt im ore County zoning map as publicly owned land. The Petition was filed under Sections 500.6 and 500.7 of the zoning regulations seeking an interpretation as to whether or not this property is subject to Baltimore County zoning regulations. The official zoning map indicates that the property is un-zoned. In addition, Section 103.2 of the zoning regulations indicates, in my opinion, an intention by the legislative body of Baltimore County not to mone publicly owned property. This conclusion is concurred in by the Office

For the above reasons, it is hereby ORDERED this 2nd of November, 1961, that the property owned by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore and leased onto Westinghouse Electric Corporation is not subject to the zoning regulations of Baltimore County nor is the contemplated use of subject property subject to those regulations.

4. That your Petitioners believe that the property described above is unzoned and being publicly owned may be used for any purpose by either the Mayor and City Council

5. That in the event that it is determined that the aforesaid property is zoned and that Baltimore County has the power to zone property of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, your Petitioners have simultaneously filed a Petition for a special exception for the aforementioned us

Wherefore, your Petitioners pray

(a) That the Zoning Commissioner may conduct a hearing under Sections 500.6 and 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations to interpret said Regulations and to determine the rights of your Petitioners in the use of the aforementioned property to the end that it may be declared that said use is not governed by the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations.

(b) In the alternative, if it be determined that the aforementioned property is zoned and that the Petitioners are subject to the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations, that their request for a special exception for a wireless transmitting and receiver structure may be granted.
