The Maryland Court of Appeals has addressed traulf to similar attempt to follow what has been termed the "Kenyor" route in the case of Smith v. Miller, surra, civing Keryon v. Even additional construction of on-site parking facilities will at best only take care of the events now being generated by the banquet and catering facilities. The narrow streets do not permit two cars to pass readily side by side: those attending functions speed away afterwards, with 500 or more persons attempting to leave through those residential streets in a period of fifteen minutes. The doubling of the commercial facility will only exacerbate the present traffic problems and create even more detriment to the neighborhood than now exists. Given no other reason, traffic impact alone would be sufficient to deny the application for special exception. Gowl v. Atlantic Richfield Co., 27 Md. App. 410. J41 A.2d 832, Gerczak v. Appellants ignored this section and proceeded with the case as some sort of violation procedure, designed to stop any use of the premises in violation of the zoning regulations, although utterly failing to support their misquided efforts by any substantial evidence.

Thus, while Appellants missed the mark set up under their wrong view of the case, coming up short in their attempts to elicit some "admissions of guilt", the Club virtually demonstrated that the special exception sought by it would in no way:

Eugene Raphel, an admittedly qualified engineering expert, who prepared the plans accompanying the Petition for Spe-ial Exception, and inspected the clv premises and the neighborhood generally, testified that, in his opinion, the grant of the special exception could in no way be detrimental to the health, safety or general welfare of the locality, or create congestion in the nearby roads, streets or alleys. He further testified that grant of the special exception would not materially affect water, sewage, storm drainage or other public utilities or facilities. No one, expert or non-expert, disputed Mr. Raphel.

Precerick Klaus, an admittedly qualified real estate and appraisal expert, who reviewed the Club plans, and also inspected the property and neighborhood, with which he was thoroughly familiar, teartified, without contradiction, that the grant of special exception could in no way adversely affect the neighborhood or neighboring property values and in no way be detrimental to the health, safety or general welfare of the locality. While not a traffic expert, he agreed with the report of the County Traffic Engineer, that the grant of the special exception could not increase the traffic, already in the neighborhood, or already travelling to or from the premises. He thought that the neighborhood could only be improved by the proposed plan to take off the streets all parking attributable to Club affairs, about which a

then acquired the remainder of the premises in April 1959. However, none of Appellant's witnesses could explain why a grant of the special exception would not largely solve their problems by eliminating Club parking on meighborhood streets, or why a denial of the special exception would not automatically lock in their problems forever, by retaining the parking complained of, while eliminating policing power over operation of the Club under the special exception.

Reports of County agencies showed conclusively that grant of the special exception sought by the Club conformed with established standards and regulations. The County Department of Traffic Engineering saw no major increase in trip generation, and the State Department of Transportation saw no adverse effect on any highway. Further, the Planning Board found compliance with Section 22-15.1(f) of the County Code, relating to wehicular access and utilities. Lastly, the Baltimore County Office of Planning and Zoning found no site planning factors of any moment, requiring its comments.

Appellants' counsel conjured up some zoning transgression of the Club, not supported by the factr in evidence, proceeded to attack this figment of her imagination, and now seeks to claim some victory. Without supporting factual data, counsel arbitrarily, and wrongfully, categorizes the Club operation as an "illegal non-conforming use". Conversely, County zoning enforcement authorities, fully aware, factually, of the Club's operation since at least September 1963, when converted from a permitted to a non-conforming use, see no illegality. Unabashedly, Appollants counsel continues to label the Club Contrary to statements contained in the last paragraph on page 6 of Appellants' Remorandum, no buildings or structures were added to the premises after September 26, 1963, smoopt the ringle family decling house, added in May 1966, as a matter of right, because rot used as a club facility, and the tennis courts, added in June 1966, and June 1972, where members of the Club previously played noftball, volloyhall, bedminton, croquetts and the like, not a change or extension in use.

The oremines are computed from the neighborhood. They are located at the east end of an extension of Templeton Road, providing the only normal vehicular and redestrian access to the Club, via either Landon or Templeton Roads to Alston, and themce on to the macadam surfaced parking area of the premises. The west side of the premises runs along the rear of the properties in the 8200 and 8300 blocks of Alston Road, from which screemed by an existing 6-foot high stockade-type fence. The south side of the premises binds along jet'ers Road, from which screemed by a 10-foot high chain link slatted fence and high hedge. Access to Jeffers Road is provided only for emergency purposes. The remainder of the premises bind along cither State or County land to which it has no access and from which acreemed by either an 8 or 6-foot high chain link fence. trees and shrubbery.

Mrs. Dorothy Donovan, President of the Club, testified without contradiction about operation of the premises. It clearly appears that the Club has operated in exactly the same manner, and to the same extent, from at least 1962, after construction of the ballroom addition, to the present time, except that tennis courts have replaced other recreational facilities. The Club now wents to expand only by addition of approximately 200 off-street parking agaces and 5,000 square feet of ground floor building area to allow for modornization of Kitchen facilities, primarily to meet the demands of County health authorities, and increase ballroom ceating cupacity to eliminate the complaints of Club members

"commercial", despite the uncontradicted testimory, and documentation, produced by the Club, at Appellants' request, showing the normal type of social-recreational club operation permitted by law. Her statement that at least one-half of the income of the Club was derived from "commercial events other than calendar membership events", represents a fantasy, fully dispelled by the evidence, which showed no illegal club activity. Advertising for weddings, banquets and the like, was only in the past, and has been discontinued, and in any event there was no affair of any kind, except a "member related" one. Time after time, Mrs. Donovan connected each effair held at the Club with some member, without hesitation, and no one contradicted her about this. The self-serving statement of Appellants' counsel that "The Club is operating illegally and in 1979 is a far different facility than at its inception in 1955, is false, and directly contrary to all evidence in the case. Her statement shout land coverage before 1963 is not relevant, because all club buildings, additions and uses before September 26, 1963 were allowed, as a matter of right. Only the residential dwelling and the five tennis courts appeared after September 1963, and these were entirely legal, raving nothing whatsoever to do with any commercial operation.

If Appellants' counsel has grounds for any complaint of illegality in club operation, she ought to lodge it with the proper authorities for investigation and hearing, rather than cloud up the instant matter with unsupported innumendos, fanciful charges and wrong statements, made with reckless abandon for the undisputed evidence in the case. Her memorandum is not tailored to this case, involving application for a special exception, expressly provided for in the zoning regulations, and she ought to redirect her efforts elsewhere, if bent on attacking some past

about frequent placement in alcoves and outlying rooms of the present Club house. Presently so the presides are: two-story building, with 6,330 square fest of floor space, per floor, used for club setlyfines swimming pool, with welling pool, bathbours, smack bur, patio and pavillions five tennis courts; about 86 parking spaces; and manager's residence. The Club operates on a year-round basis, with approximately 250 family memberships - 92 swimming/tennie/social memberships - 122 swimming/social memberships; It tennie memberships; and 20 social memberships. However, the Club is making, and will continue to make efforts to increase its rostes to 300 family memberships. Provided for these members, and their quests, generally, are:

Swimming and bathhouse use, from Memorial Day through Labor Day of each year, 7 days a week, from about 9:00 a.m., for competitive swim, and 11:00 a.m. for general members to 8:00 p.m., except on Friday sights, when closing is at 10:00 p.m. The snack bar is open only during the swimming season, from 12:00 Woon to 7:00 p.m., except on Friday, when it closes at 8:00 p.m. Au average of 150 swimmers per day participate, with about 50 at any one time, except on weekends, when there may be as many as 125 persons at one time. On some peak days, such as July 4, as Many as 300 may participate, but not at one time.

Tennis Court use, during warm veather, from about March 1 to Hovember 1, 7 days a week, from daylight to Cusk, with evening play until about 10:30 P.M., and lights automatically turning off shortly thereafter; and

LEGAL PRINCIPLES

This case involves application for special exception, not any request for determination of nen-conforming use, only incidentally an issue herein. The special exception is sought for country club and recreational uses, as authorized by the zoning regulations, not for any restaurant or catering business, admittadly not authorized in the residential some and beyond the power of the Board. Therefore, as fully set forth in Miller v. Kiwanis Club of Loch Raven, 29 Md. App. 265, at pages 288 through 290, the Club has a prima facie right to enjoy the benefits of the special exception if it brings itself within the specific requirements of section 502.1 of the zoning regulations, which it unquestionably did. The special exception is as much a part of the comprehensive zoning plan as the permitted uses, sharing the general presumption that it is in the interest of the general welfare, and valid and permissible, absent some fact or circumstance negating the presumption. Accordingly, the Club must only adduce testimony showing that its use meets the prescribed standard and requirements, as it did, and it does not have any burden of establishing affirmatively that its proposed use would be a benefit to the community. When the Club showed, and virtually demonstrated, as it did in this case, that the proposed use would be conducted without detriment to the neighborhood and would not adversely affect the public interest, it fully met its

The Board is only to judge whether the neighboring properties in the nemeral neighborinod would be adversely affected by exercise of the special exception and whether the use in the particular case is in hermony with the general purpose and intent

of the coning plan. In this case, it must so find because the uncontradicted testimony showed that to be the fact. There was no probative evidence of harm or disturbance in light of the nature of the zone involved, or of any factors causing disharmony to the operation of the comprehensive plan, so that any denial of the special exception herein would be arbitrary, capricious and illegal.

As stated in the Miller case, supra, at pages 296-297, it can hardly be said that the granting of the special exception, designed to alleviate parking in the neighborhood and lessen the impact of traffic, would in any way "tend to create congestion in roads and streets". The traffic impact of a special exception must be measured against the impact of traffic under existing uses and which could arise under permissible uses, not merely by comparison with some undeveloped property. Accordingly, where, as here, the potential volume of traffic under the requested use will be no greater than that existing, or that may arise from permitted uses, it would be arbitrary, capricious and illega) to demy the special exception on traffic grounds.

The foregoing principles, applicable to the grant of any special exception, so clearly stated in the Hiller case, supra, were digested from a series of cases of like import and are, therefore, beyond question.

Clearly, some change in use is permitted so long as there be no extension into other properties c: eas. Thus, the Maryland Court of Appeals approved a swit cupancy of a Md. 245, 247, and the substitution of professional baseball for college football at a sports center, Green v. Garrett, 192 Md. 52, 61-63. Similarly, the Maryland Court of Appeals has continuously upheld the intensification of a non-conforming use by increase in activity, or in the number of goods or persons involved. Thus, in Nyburg v. Solmson, 205 Md. 150, 161, the increase in parking of cars from 10 to 50, practically a new car agency, was allowed; in Jahnigen v. Staley, 245 Md. 130, 137, 139, increase in the number of rowboats rented from 7 to an unlimited number within the same area, was deemed an intensification of nonconforming use and not an extension; and in Feldstein v. Zoning Board, 246 Md. 204, 211, the increase in quantity and height of stored scrap material was permitted as an intensification and not an extension. Likewise, the more frequent use for the same or similar purpose than that for which used less frequently is intensification and not an extension. Green v. Garrett, supra, and Nyburg v. Solmson, supra. See also Kast'adike v. Baltimore Ass'n.

At most, there is involved the addition of 5 tennis courts in the area previously used for softball, badminton, vollvball, croquette and the like, clearly permissible as an allowable intensification or substitution of the non-conforming use. Green v. Garrett; and Parr v. Bradyhouse, supra. No other addition or change in Club use was shown by the evidence.

appellents produced no probative evidence of any kind of any harm or disturbance to the residents of the neighborhood of the Club, or of any increase in the volume of traffic over existing traffic. or even of any traffic conditions more disadvantageous to the area. so that a denial of the special exception herein would be based on no evidence at all, and, therefore, clearly arbitrary and illegal.

The Club does not ask for anything beyond the jurisdiction of the Zoning Commissioner or Eoard, or for more than is allowed by special exception under applicable zoning regulations. The Club itself concedes that neither the Zoning Commissioner nor Board can authorize any business use beyond the scope of the special exception applied for. Hence, Appellants' contention about illegality, if supported by some evidence, which, in fact, it is not, tows with immaterial and irrelevant matters, having no bearing on the actual issues arising under section 502.1 of the soning regulations.

As to traffic. Appellants' counsel distorts the Her memorandum first states, on page 8, that "There was clear testimony from experts and residents alike that the tregent traffic problems generated by the Club are at a saturation point." No expert so testified, and, in fact, Appellants engaged no expert to testify about traffic. Her statement is directly contrary to all the evidence, which showed no traffic congestion of any kind. Appellants' witnesses testified, at most. to a few occasional speeders and "horn tooters" leaving the Club premises, about which they never complained to police authorities ever, denial of the special exception will not alleviate this irritation, which arises from a violation of traffic, not zoning laws. Conversely, grant of the special exception will allow for off-street parking for Club members and their quests, thereby

CONCLUSION

The Club fully met its burden of showing compliance with the requirements set up by Section 502.1 of the zoning regulations. Clearly, exercise of the special exception will not be detrimental to anyone or anything. Testimony of a very few residents of the neighborhood about some speeding cars and thoting horns leaving the Club, more a police than zoning matter, cannot legally justify denial of the special exception, particularly where the allowance of theuse can only improve the situation. The charge of commercialization, not supported by any evidence, car represent no more than an artful use to befuddle the main issue of section 502.1 compliance, where the Club seeks from the Board no more than the law allows. For all of the foregoing reasons, the Club respectfully requests affirmation of the order of the Zoning Commissioner granting the Special Exception applied for herein.

freeing the neighborhood of any parking burden which it may have heretofore suffered. Appellants' counsel next states, on page 8, that "The doubling of the commercial facility will only exacerbate the present traffic problems and creats even more detriment to the neighborhood than now exists". She wrongly assumes "doubling of the commercial facility", not shown by any evidence in the case, and "present traffic problems", not mentioned by any witness appearing before the Board. Again, her statement is contrary to the evidence, which showed that grant of the special exception would facilitate the flow of traffic by removing much of the parking from the streets. Finally, Appellants' counsel, cast out the last vestige of her credibility when she states, in the bottom two lines on page 8 of her memorandum, that "it is abundantly clear that Petitioner has failed to meet any of the requirements of section 502". (Emphasis supplied). This statement, in tune with the fantasy of the entire memorandum, but blind to the facts in evidence, is not worthy of belief an requires no further reply.

The major thrust of Appellants' counsel was her attack or the obviously established non-conforming use of the Club premises and operation, fully recognized by County authorities, and never before challenged by anyone else, though a conspicuous landmark in the neighborhood. As above poted, the non-conforming use issue is only circuitously involved in any detrimination of the propriety of the special exception, governed entirely by section 502.1 of the zoning regulacions. In any event, Appellants' blits on the Club floundered when foiled by their own strategy reliance on the Club's books and records which showed only the usual operation of the normal social-recreational type club, permitted under the special exception sought. The legal machinations of Appellants' counsel must likewise now fail because not

orted by the facts which she herself brought to light, nor the cases which she citer

The authorities relied upon by Appellants' counsel, in Part 1 of her Memorandum, are not applicable to the facts of this case. Phillips v. Zoning Commissioner, 225 Md. 102, Coalt with the question of whether the lower court was "clearly errorsous" in finding the non-conforming use to be only for storage and sale of second. and furniture and automobiles, and not for a junk yard, an independent category set up by the zoning regulations, far from skin to any issue in the instant case. In Knox v. City of Baltimore, 180 Md. 88, the appellate court affirmed the finding of the Sching Board that no non-conforming use aver existed and that, if it did, it could not be extended into nearby buildings; and in Arundel Corporation v. Board, 255 Md. 78, the court affirmed a finding by the trial judge that no non-conforming use ever existed before adoption of a change in zoning and, therefore, could not continue. In these proceedings, Applicant demonstrated, without contradiction, that the club us before and after September 26, 1963, was identical, and that was continued down to the date of the hearing without substantial change so that the Knox and Arundel Corporation cases are hardly in print. McKemy v. Baltimore County, 39 Md. App. 257, attempted to resolve a confusing problem about a non-conforming parking use, requiring some distinction between: the parking and storage of vehicles: the parking or storage of commercial vehicles and the parking or storage of non-commercial vehicles; the business of renting parking spaces and parking as an accessory use; and parking qua parking and parking as part of a commercial enterprise. Here, no such confusion exists as to the operation of the Club as a social and recreational facility, continuously from May 1955 to the date
