OPINION

This case comes before this Board on an appeal from a decision of the Deputy Zoning Commissioner denying a request for a change of zoning from DR 5.5 to DR 16 on a 13.7 acre parcel of land in the second election district of Baltimore County. The subject property is located on the east side of Rolling Road and directly abuts Security Industrial Park to the north and lies wholly within a rather large parcel of land zoned

There was presented to the Board, lengthy testimony and many exhibits by both expert witnesses and local residents in favor of granting the proposed reclassification and opposed to the reclassification. There were also memorandums submitted by the petitioner's counsel and the People's Counsel of Baltimore County. In this Opinion, the Board will not attempt to recop all this testimony but will let the record speak for itself. The only question to be decided here is whether or not this particular parcel is now proper zoned or whether the Baltimore County Council erred on the Comprehensive Maps of 1976 In retaining its present DR 5.5 zoning. The Board is well aware that in reclassification hearings before it, that it is privy to much greater detail on all the circumstances and I was involved in the request on one particular parcel than would normally be afforded the County Council in its considerations during the Comprehensive Map process and weighs

Traffic problems in today's society seem to be universal but to grant this request on this parcel does not seem to be catastrophic to existing traffic problems but may in fact hasten their alleviation.

After consideration of all the testimony and all the exhibits offered, it is the opinion of this Board that the DR 5.5 zoning on the subject parcel is in fact it, error and will so order its reclassification into the requested DR 16 classification

In the present case, the applicant quite simply failed to meet the burden to present evidence that the Comprehensive Map ignored specific facts material to the zoning, failed to take undisputed facts into consideration, or caused a deprivation of all reasonable use of the property.

The applicant's claim, primarily through the testimony of Paul Lee, that the property can profitably be developed to the maximum number of units (75) permitted In D.R. 5.5 zoning parallels the claims of error and confiscation rejected by the courts in Boyce and Stratakis, both Baitimore County cases. In light of uncontradicted evidence of other D.R. 5.5 developments in process in the same neighborhood, including one engineered by Mr., Lee himself, the very credibility of the applicant's claim is reduced

Further analysis, moreover, shows the "strawman" nature of Lee's evidence. His amplysis was limited to a particular kind of townhouse-single family development. Thus, he did not consider the feasibility of garden apartments in the portion of the subject tract zoned D.R. 5.5 not affected by transition zone regulations.* The Lee study further failed to coraider the de elopment of the subject property in sequence, subsequent to or in connection with the development of other properties a med DaR. 5.5 to the south, with attendant reduction of sewer costs. Rather, Lie appeared to assume that the distance of the subject property from the sewer line, with attendant risks, difficulties, and costs acculsition for sewer connection through adjoining properties, was the basis for permitting higher density development. Finally, Lee assumed that the provision of a particular zoning classification is meant as a guarantee of maximum immediate development to the fullest density allowed. Such is not the law. See also Board of County Commissioners v. Gaster, _____ Md. _____, 401 A.2d 666 (1979).

As to traffic, there was simply no evidence presented by the applicant to contradict the evidence of severe traffic congestion in the area, particularly along Rolling Road. * Boltimore County Zoning Regulation 1801.18, regarding residential transition areas, does not permit multiple family dwellings within 300 feet of dwellings on adjacent properties in designated residential zones, including D.R. 5.5.

This evidence included expert testimony by Michael Flanigan, Assistant Traffic Engineer, regarding level of service at various intersections in the area, as well as testimony of neighboring property owners. Indeed, the applicant's sole thrust was the possible lengthening of Lord Baltimore Drive, in connection with further ent of Security Industrial Park, to provide a different access to Security Boulevard. This thrust, however, was ill targeted, both because of the speculative nature of the timing of any future construction of Lord Baltimore Drive and the abvice ation that such a route to Security Boulevard would be longer, more indirect, circultous, and therefore an inappropriate choice for residents seeking access to

MEMORANDUM OF PEOPLE'S COUNSEL

the subject 13,7 acre tract, presently in use for dwelling and farm purposes, lies in a quadrant of approximately 100 acres zoned D.R. J.S, in the area east of Rolling Road and north of Dogwood Road in western Baltimore County. The tract itself is in the northwestern portion of this quadrant, fronting on Rolling Road.

The area zoned D.R. 5.5 to the south is presently vacant, but evidence showed subdivision plans in process on the "Wallingford" development comprising 226.6 units, of which 31 are single family lots and 175 are townhouses, on 41,2 acres located near Rolling Road and Dogwood Road. Separately, official County records indicated another subdivision in process in the neighborhood, "Hanna Woods," involving twelve single family homes in D.R. 5.5 zoning on 3.03 acres located on Dogwood Road.

An inportant comideration relating to the area zoned D.R. 5.5 is that the neares sewer line runs along Dogwood Road, at a distance of approximately 2100 feet from the site. This means that development logically would occur sequentially, the area just north od Road being developed initially, followed by the area still further north, with the subject tract's development to follow, connecting to the sewer lines constructed under the adjacent tracts. It is noteworthy that the record showed the first stage of this sequential development already to be in process. West of Rolling Road and north of Dogwood Road lies a substantial area zoned D.R. 16, including the Kingswood Common Apartments. To the east of the quadrant zoned D.R. 5.5, and hooking irregularly around to the north, lies a portion of the Security Industrial Park, an industrial and office development located on land zoned M.L.-L.M.

Areas further to the north and south include a mix of townhouse, aparament, and single family development on land zoned residential. The area to the south, as one moves down Rolling Road to Security Boulevard, is marked by Security Square Mall, a regional chopping center on the south side of Security Boulevard.

The record indicated substantial traffic congestion on Rolling Road moving from the subject tract south to Security Boulevard, the standard route, with intersections at or about capacity at Dogwood and Rolling Ronds, and Security Boulevard and Rolling Road among others. To the north, by alternative route, the intersections at Windso Mill and Rolling Roads and Liber.y and Rolling Roads also have already indicated problems.

The evidence also indicated the existence of some rock underlying some of the previously developed residential properties in the area, but no soil or geology tests had been conducted to evaluate site conditions underlying the subject tract-

Turning to the important applicable zoning principles, "...perhaps none is more rudimentary than the strong presumption of the correctness of original zoning and of comprehensive rezoning." Otherwise stated, "...strong evidence of error is required to make the issum of mistake in comprehensive zoning fairly debatable and unless such strang evidence is presented by the applicant, the action of the Board in granting a realcasification is arbitrary and capricious." Boyce v. Sembly, 25 Md. App. 43, 334 A.2d

Moreover, as the issue of confiscation is often interrelated with mistake, it need be stated that.

"Applicant must show that he has been deprived of all reasonable use of his property and that it cannot be used for any of the permitted uses in the existing zone."
Stratakis v. Beauchamp, 268 Md. 643, 304 A.2d 244 (1973). 0

In the present case, the applicant quite simply failed to meet the burden to present evidence that the Comprehensive Map ignored specific facts material to the zoning, failed to take undisputed facts into consideration, or caused a deprivation of all reasonable use of the property.

The applicant's claim, primarily through the testimony of Paul Lee, that the property cannot profitably be developed to the maximum number of units (75) permitted in D.R. 5.5 zoning parallels the claims of error and confiscation rejected by the court in Boyce and Stratakis, both Baltimore County cases. In light of uncontradicted evidence of other D.R. 5.5 developments in process in the same neighborhood, including one engineered by Mr. Lee himself, the very credibility of the applicant's claim is reduced

Further analysis, moreover, shows the "strawman" nature of Lee's evidence. His analysis was limited to a particular kind of townhouse-single family development. Thus, he did not consider the feasibility of garden apartments in the portion of the subject tract zoned D.R. 5.5 not affected by transition zone regulations.* The Lee study further failed to consider the development of the subject property in sequence, subsequent to In connection with the development of other properties zoned D.R. 5.5 to the south, with attendant reduction of sewer costs. Rather, Lee appeared to assume that the distance of the subject property from the sewer line, with attendant risks, difficulties, and costs ent acquisition for sewer connection through adjoining properties, was the basis fix permitting nigher density development. Finally, Lee assumed that the provision of a particular zoning classification is meant as a guarantee of maximum immediate developmen to the fullest density allowed. Such is not the law. See also Board of County Commissioners v. Gaster, _____ Md. _____, 401 A.2d 666 (1979).

As to traffic, there was simply no evidence presented by the applicant to contradic the evidence of severe moffic congestion in the area, particularly along Rolling Road.

* Baltimore County Zoning Regulation 1801.18, regarding residential transition areas, does not permit multiple family dwellings within 300 feet of dwellings on adjacent properties in designated residential zones, including D.R. 5.5.

This evidence included expert testimony by Michael Flanigan, Assistant Traffic Engineer, regarding level of service at various intersections in the area, as well as testimony of neighboring property owners. Indeed, the applicant's sole thrust was the possible lengthening of Lord Baltimore Drive, in connection with further development of Security Industrial Park, to provide a different access to Security Boulevard. This thrust, however, was ill targeted, both because of the speculative nature of the timing of any tuture construction of Lord Baltimore Drive and the obvious consideration that such a route to Security Boulevard would be longer, more indirect, circuitous, and therefore an inappropriate choice for residents seeking access to Security Boulevard.

The applicant's next thoust in challenging the comprehensive zoning, primarily through the testimony of Frederick Klaus, was the need for apartments to serve future expansion of Security Industria! Park, Leaving aside the point that such future development may be taken in a consideration in the 1930 comprehensive zoning process, already under way, we note the evidence showing a mix of D.R. 5.5 and D.R. 16 zoning in the area, some developed but some still available for future construction

The testimony of James Hoswell, County Planner, in this context, is compelling. Hoswell concluded that the zoning of the subject property was appropriate, that substantial D.R. 16 zoning was already provided in the area, that the mix of variou levels of residential zoning, along with the industrial, constituted a reasonable approach, and that the critical traffic situation, as indicated by expert staff of the Department of Traffic Engineering, required his office to recommend against piecemeu reclassification

The applicant finally seeks to turn to his advantage the absence of the subject property as an issue in the 1976 comprehensive zoning as purported evidence of the Council's ignorance. The ingenuity of this concept is matched only by its misdirection. The presumption, of course, in the absence of strong evidence to the contrary, is that

the Council is completely familiar with the area and its characteristics material to zoning There was no specific evidence offered to rebut this presumption. In fact, one of the Protestants testified that the County Council did, in fact, visit the area as a group during the 1976 Comprehensive Map process and recalled that the bus in which the Council was traveling used her driveway to turn around. The neighborhood of Security Boulevard and Rolling Road, featuring as it does diversified residential development, the Security Industrial Park and the Security Square Mall, and well known traific problems, can hardly be thought to have escaped the Council's knowledge and understanding.

CONC ISION

To paraphrise the language of Judge Rith Davidson in Boyce, we can but conclude that when all is said and done, the record is devoid of any probative evidence to show that the County Council failed to take into account any facts or circumstance then exiting relevant to the subject property and its environs so that its initial assumptions and premises in determining the appropriate classification for the subject property were erroneous. The record is similarly devoid of any probative evidence to Indicate confiscation

Therefore, "[U]nder all of the circum, tances in this case the presumption of validity accorded to the comprehensive zoning was not overcome and the question of 'error' or 'mistake' in the comprehensive zoning of the subject property was not 'fairly debatable', " and this Petition for reclassification should be denied

PETITIONER'S MEMORANDUM OF LAW

STATEMENT OF CASE

This is an appeal from the September 21, 1978 decision of the Deputy Zoning Commissioner of Baltimore County, Joseph Martinak denying the Petitioner's request for change of zoning from D.R. 5.5 to D.R. 16. for a 13.7 agre tract in the Second Flection District of Baltimore County, located adjacent to a nearly fully developed 280 acre industrial park and directly opposite from a substantially completed 500 to 700 unit apartment complex in a D.R. 16 zone.

Questions Presented

I. Whether the County Council Committed Error in the Adoption of the 1976 Comprehensive Zoning Map When It Classified the Petitioner's Property D.R. 5.5 Instead of D.R. 16. II. Whether the County Council's Action in Zoning Petitioner's Property D.R. 5.5 was Confiscatory.

Statement of Pacts

The Petitioner's first witness, Mr. Paul Lee, whom the Board recognized as an eminently qualified engineering expert with considerable expertise in land planning, testified that for the past 30 years he has practiced his profession in Baltimore County and in particular in the neighborhood of the Petitioner's property. Mr. Lee cutlined the neighborhood of the property as bounded on the east by Interstate 695; the north by Windsor Mill Road; the west by the western boundary of the Heraldry Square Apartment complex and the south by the Security Mall Shopping Center.

Using Exhibit 2, an aerial photograph of the site and virons, Mr. Lee described the neighborhood in greater depth.

To the north and east of the site, photograph exhibits 2m. 2n. 2o. 20 20, 2r & 2u, keyed to the aerial photo, illustrated the intensity of development in the 280 acre Security Industrial Park, particularly Rutherford Plaza, a 90,000 sq. foot office building and numerous other industrial tenants. On the south, using Exhibits 2a through f the Board's Attention was called to the extensive development taking place on the north side of Security Boulevard, formerly a farm, but recently zoned MLR/BM, to wit: a 100,000 square foot office building the Ramada Inn, a Ford Motor Company automobile franchise, and other large warehousing facilities, all of which are bounded on the worth (just south of subject property) by the extensive apartment subdivision known as Quail Meadows. Using photographs 2G, 2H, 2J, 2K, 2S and Exhibits 4, 5 and 6, he showed the extensive apartment development on the west side of Rolling Road directly opposite the subject property consisting of Heraldry Square a proposed public school site and the commercial ceramic school owned by the prot "ant. Mrs. Kichas.

According to Mr. Lee the property was serviced by or had available to it, adequate utilities, roads, public transportation, schools and other public services to allow development of the site under the proposed zoning. With respect to the question of traffic on Rolling Road, he pointed out that if the property was developed for the proposed zone, persons using Rolling Road to travel to the Beltway (the predominate traffic magnet) would only use 1,000 feet of it, by traveling north to Windsor Boulevard and then proceeding to the Baltimore County Beltway via the industrial park and Belmont Avenue; or proceeding approximately 600 yards south to Dogwood Road where they could turn left and proceed to the Beltway through the industrial Park

of construction (which was estimated between \$20,000 and \$30,000 plus the cost of the land; plus marketing costs involved, i.e. commissions and advertising; and a reasonable profit. Based upon the selling price of townhouses immediately across the street, Exhibit No. 10 (showing sales prices in the range of \$32,006) the cost of lot development and construction alone, without even adding the cost of the land, would be higher than the market price of such homes and would thereby prohibit development for D.R. 5.5 residential. Mr. Lee explained that because of the high development costs, the property could not be developed for residential use for a density of less than 16 units (lots) per acre (D.R. 16), since under such development, the development costs would be spread over more lots or units. By way of illustration, he prepared Exhibit No. 9 showing

a lot price typical for D.R. 16 use of the property showing 212 lots

or units for a per lot development cost of about only \$1,000 00.

In support of Mr. Lee's testimony, Mr. Neal Meyerhoff, testified representing the contract purchaser, Crantrook Associates, an offshoot of the Meverhoff Building Company. According to Mr Meyerhoff, his company has been in business, constructing and developing residential housing since 1946. Based upon his knowledge of construction and the market in the area, he confirmed that the property could not be developed for residential use under the D.R. 5.5 zone. The major factor in his judgment was the high cost of development which was attributed to the current zoning and development regulations, building costs and the cost of providing utilities to the site. Based upon his experience and knowledge of the market, he said that it was not possible to build on this site, a D.R. 5.5 residential unit with a \$30,000 to \$40,000 selling price without incurring a substantial loss. He indicated that the plan suggested by Mr. Lee in Exhibit 9 would be the type of development his company would construct. Based on his analysis of the area, there was a

He indicated, however, that a major factor in the craffic problem was the intersections of Liberty Road and Rolling. Windsor Mill and Rolling on the North, and Rolling and Dogwoo Roads on the south. He testified that a federally funded program called T.O.P.I.C. had been in use by Baltimore County for the purpose of upgrading these particular intersections and that construction could begin at almost any time. He further indicated that it was reasonably predictable, that the County would require that road access be made from Rolling Road, through the property East to Lord Baltimore Boulevard. This would further reduce the use of Rolling Road for trips norths, south and east, the most frequently used traffic pattern, because residents of the site would most probably avoid Rolling Road and go through the industrial park. Mr. Lee was emphatic, however, that the County had no current or reasonably foreseeable intention to make any improvements whatscever to widen Rolling Road to ease the traffic problems, but that the only way Rolling Road would be improved, would be by development.

Mr. Lee was asked his opinion as to whether the subject site, was properly zoned D.R. 5.5. He testified that in his opinion D.R. 5.5 was an improper zone for the subject property because present zoning regulations, the topography and development costs rendered the land impossible for residential development of anything less than a D.R. 16 residential use. He pointed out that although other uses were permitted in the D.R. 5.5 zone such as farms, churches, hospitals, schools, boat vards, grave vards, etc.

substantial need for apartments in close proximity to the developing industrial park and the Social Security complex In his opinion, it was an error for the County Council to not consider these factors when it established D.R. 5.5 for this site.

Mr. Fredierick 3. Klaus, whose qualification as an expert realtor and appraiser was admitted, testified concerning the scope of the neighborhood and a general review of the zoning changes and physical changes therein. He testified that the County Council committed an error in not zoning the subject site D.R. 16 when it passed the last zoning map. Numbered among his re sons were:

(a) the particular site was never listed as an issue before the County Council and therefore was never actually considered by that body:

(b) The County Council failed to consider the rapid development of the Security Industrial Park and the great need for apartment housing in close proximity for persons who would work in the Park

(c) the Council failed to consider that Lord Bultimore Drive would be completed in such time as to facilitate the rapid movement of traffic through that Park to the Security Interchange of I-695;

(4) that the property cannot practically be developed for D.R. 5.5 residential because of the high development costs explained by Mr. Lee:

(2) that the property could not be used as a farm any longer for the reasons stated by Mr. Grabill.

He further pointed out that although other uses were permitted under DR zones as set forth in the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations, Section 1 BO 1.1 A-C, that it was not possible for this site to be used for those purposes. In his opinion the only sonable use was high density residential D.R. 16 and that the

under the provisions of section 1 BO 1.1 A-C, B.C. Z.R., such uses were not possible on this particular site.2

The basis of his opinion was a study he had made Exhibit 7, to determine and illustrate the maximum number of residential dwelling units that could be constructed under the current zone. He explained that this maximum number was theoretical, because various County agencies, would have to review such plans and would probably make modifications that would reduce this maximum number. However, if it could be shown, at least on a theoretical basis, that development under the current zone would be even remotely practical, it would tend to establish that the County Council did not commit an error in zoning the land D.R. 5.5.

In reviewing this plan, Mr. Lee stated that the northwest and the southwest corners of the property must be designed for single family dwellings because of the proximity of reighboring dwellings on the northwest and southwest corners. Under the current zoning regulations, only single family dwelling units could be constructed within a 300 foot "transition zone"; so that in an arc of 300 feet from the nearest corner of each neighboring dwelling tie theoretical maximum number of possible units of this was 30. The balance of the property he designed for 45 units of the townhouse type; a total of 75 units, at the maximum, that could be theoretically constructed under D.R. 16.

County Council erred when it failed to consider all of the above in adopting the current coming man.

Mr. Bernard Villerain whose qualifications as a land anner zoning expert, are not only legend, but stipulated by protestants and proponents, also agreed that the County Council committed an error by zoning this property D.R. 5.5

He pointed out that the subject site was an island of single-family residential-zoned land, sandwiched between extensive industrial use to the north and east and high density apartment me to the west. The effect of the present zoning on the subject site was to make it a buffer zone between high density residential and industrial -- erroneously poor planning and land use! He further stated it was error for the matter not to have been an issue before the County Council. The Council also erred in failing to consider the rapidly expanding employment market provided by the Social Security Complex, the rew industrial development at Security and Polling Road (Exhibits A-'), and the expansion of Social Security Complex and the need for nearby high density residential land use to supply she'ter for people working in these employment centers. Purthermore, Willemain concurred in the opinions of Klaus, Lee and Meyerhoff that perhaps the Council's most grievous error was itr failure to consider the extracrdinarily high development cost ratio for D.R. 5.5 residential development on this site. It was apparent that had the Council had the benefit of the cost analysis prepared by Mr. Lee, it would have concluded that no Cuture D.R. 5.5 residential development of this site could take place without the developer incurring substantial, if not crippling, losses. In the opinion of both experts, Klaus and Willemain, the action of the County Council in zoning the property D.k. 5.5 was an act of confiscation and, thereby, another error.

Using this theoretical maximum, he prepared an estimate or development costs, Exhibit No. 8, wherein he projected an overall development cost for the entire site of \$601,650.00 for paving, water, storm drain, sanitary sewer, clearing, grading, sedimentation and storm water management. The average per lot price was \$8,022.00. Mr. Lee pointed out, nowever, that this was a bare minimum per lot figure, which would probably go up for the following reasons:

- based upon his previous experience with the adjacent Security Industrial Park, excavation at that site indicated high amount of underground rock. It was reasonably anticipated that the subject site would have the same problems with rock and accordingly. the cost of excavation for san'tary sewer, storm drains as well as clearing and grading for roads would rise:
- that the cost of sedimentation control and storm water management was a minimum predicted cost. which would probably be higher, inasmuch as this was a new program for which it was difficult to obtain anything more than a minimum estimate.
- that it would be the developer's responsibility to pay for the acquisition of rights of way over the property of others through which the sanitary and storm drains servicing the property must be installed. The estimate of \$4.00 per lineal foot was a minimum estimate and in all probability the acquisition costs would be higher.

In order to arrive at an appropriate selling price for residential dwellings the developer would have to add the per lot

The Protestants' only expert witness, James G. Hoswell. from the Baltimore County Planning Staff, conceded that it was not good planning to place medium density residential such as D.P. 5.5 in between high density residential, D.R. 16, and industrial zones. He claimed that although this was not the best zoning.

It is significant, however, that no witness for the Protestants rebutted the Petitioner's proof that this particular site could not be used for D.R. 5.5 residential developm because of the high cost of its development. No witness for the Protestants rebutted the Petitioner's evidence that the subject site was not suitable for any other D.R. 5.5 use under the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations. It is also significant that the only testimony presented by the Protestants concerning rebuttal of the Petitioner's evidence of error, were the bald statements by various Protestant witnesses that "there was no

In Baltimore v. Cohn, 204 Md. 523, 162 A.2d 447 where property had been zoned residential but evidence established that the tract was adaptable only for commercial or industrial purposes, zoning was arbitrary and unreasonable and deprived owner of property without due process of law. Cf.

Dill v. Jobar Co., supra.

In this case Mr. Paul Lee, an acknowledged engineering and zoning expert gave unrobutted testimony that because of the current zoning regulations and development rules the site could only produce as a theoretical maximum 75 units or lots and that the cost of land development for them was \$601,650.30 or \$8,022.00 per lot; and when the cost of building along was added, it was clear that such a development would be a loss situation. More importantly, however, he allowed as how the development costs would probably be higher because of rocky terrain and additional costs for sewer easements. Dased on the current market for townhouses in the area, approximately \$33,000.00, all of the witnesses concluded, based on strong and substantial facts, that the property could not reasonable be developed at DR 5.5.

Not only was there urrebutted evidence that the property could not be developed for residential use under DR 3.5 but there was unrebutted testimony from experts that ancillary uses such as farming, funeral homes, etc. whether permitted by right or specific exception could not reasonably be made at this site. Cf., Coppolino v. Board, 23 Ad.App. 358, 328 A.2d

In light of this overwhelming testimony establishing the confiscatory nature of the zoning, based upon strong

additional apartments in the area; in failing to consider impact of development of Sheppard-Pratt Hospital complex; that in view of the opography, reasonable economic use of the property was decied by R-o zone, which testimony support a finding of error.

In Board v. Oak Hill Farms, Inc., 232 Md. 274, 192 A.2d 761 (1965), involving request to rezone 21 acre zoned medium density to high density apartment zone, the site was bounded on north and east by general commercially developed, the south by medium density residential, and the west by land zoned high density; the Court reversed a denial of rezoning because evidence showed there was error: in failing to consider the need for partments generated by the adjacent land used for commercial: in failing to consider that topography of land made it impractical if not impossible of developing the land at the current zone. The Court also pointed out that the Protestants' "rationalizations" failed to rebut factual testimony presented by Petitioner.

In Overton v. Board, 225 Md. 212, 170 A..d 172 (1961) where subject site of 40 acres was bounded by property zoned detached residential on east; commercial - south; rural residential on north and west, and the zoning request was to low density from rural residential, the Court found that there had been error in the original zoning because evidence showed that topography and drainage made land unsuitable for use as detached dwellings but that low density residential was the jest feasible use.

In Dill v. Jobar Corporation, 242 Md. 16, 217 A.2d 564, the Court affirmed a reclassification of a 5 acre tract from residential to business based upon error, where evidence showed: that the land on the north, south, and east of property was zoned commercial; that an expert land planner established that council errad in not recognizing ircompatibility of the current zone with surrounding land use; that the land was

unruitable for residential or office use.

Likewise, in the case at bar, the subject property is flanked by intensive and substantial high density residential development directly across the street (Exhibit 2) and a major 280 acre industrial office complex behind it. Recognized expert land planner, realtors, and engineers have established that there was error in the original zoning because:

A. The Council failed to consider the impact of The Security Square Mall, one of Baltimore County's largest regional shopping centers, the new industrial and business major development at Kalb property and The Security Industrial Park as creating a need for more apartment land.

B. The Council failed to consider that the developing road pattern through the industrial park would relieve Rolling Road traffic and that the subject site offered a con-

C. The Council did not consider that this site, because of high development costs, could not be used for current

D. The Council failed to consider the future impact of the Security Complex at Woodlawn, one of the largest single employers in the area, which is currently expanding to include a third office building thereby generating need for more apartment housing.

E. The Council failed to consider that plans for the ment of the intersection and adjacent roads at Rolling Road and Dogwood Road, Polling Road and Windsor Mill Road and Rolling Road at Liberty Poad have been approved by the County under the Federally-funded T.O.P.I.C. program and construction

This case comes before this Board on an appeal from a decision of the Deputy Zoning Commissioner danying a request for a change of zoning from DR 5.5 to DR 16 on a 13.7 acre parcel of land in the second election district of Baltimore County. The subject property is located on the east side of Rolling Road and directly abuts Security Industrial Park to the north and lies wholly within a rather large parcel of land zoned

There was presented to the Board, lengthy testimony and many exhibits by both expert witnesses and local residents in favor of granting the proposed reclassification and opposed to the reclassification. There were also memorandums submitted by the petitioner's counsel and the People's Counsel of Baltimore County. In this Opinion, the Board will not attempt to recap all this testimony but will let the record speak for itself. The only question to be decided here is whether or not this particular parcel is now properly zoned or whether the Baltimore County Council erred on the Comprehensive Maps of 1976 in re sining its present DR 5.5 zoning. The Board is well aware that in reclassification hearings before it, that it is privy to much greater detail on all the circumstances and issues involved in the request on one particular parcel than would normally be afforded the County Council in its considerations during the Comprehensive Map process and weight this fact carefully in its opinion

Several facts were introdu-ad into evidence at this hearing that were not in effect at the time of the Comprehensive Maps in 1976. There are now underway, two developments in this DR 5.5 zoned parcel. One known as "Wallingford" cc tains 38.3

Garden apartments would not be out of character in this area, since there is a large townhouse development directly across Rolling Road from this parcel and others in the general area.

There was much testimony presented on traffic conditions in the area There was much discussion of alternate access routes to this area recently opened and much discussion of proposed road improvements in this area. Traffic problems in today's society seem to be universal but to grant this request on this parcel does not seem to be catastrophic to existing traffic problems but may in fact hasten their alleviation

After consideration of all the testimony and all the exhibits offered, it is the opinion of this Board that the DR 5.5 zoning on the subject parcel is in fact in error and will so order its reclassification into the requested DR 16 classification
