In this case former Zoning Commissioner Arnold Jablon, on 5-7-86, granted the non-conforming use of a private hunting and fishing club, charitable organization, and community organization with special facilities, launching mooring and boat storage in a DR 5.5 zone. Pursuant to the advertisement, posting of property, and public hearing on the Petition and it appearing that by reason of the following finding of facts that to approve a nonconforming use for a private hunting and fishing club, charitable organization, and community organization with social facilities, launching, mooring, and boat storage would be in strict harmony with the spirit and intent of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations and would not be detrimental to the health, safety, and general welfare of the community, and therefore,

IT IS ORDERED by the Zoning Commissioner of Baltimore County, this 14th day of May, 1986, that the nonconforming use for a private hunting and fishing club, charitable organization, and community organization with social facilities, launching mooring, and boat storage be approved and, as such, the Petition for Special Hearing is hereby GRANTED, from and after the date of this Order, based on the following:

1. The subject property, presently zoned D.R.5.5, has been utilized as described above since the 1940's.
2. The use, as described, was permitted as of right in a R-6 Zone, and the property at issue here was so zoned between 1955 and 1971.
3. Testimony was uncontradicted that the use has never been abandoned.
4. Petitioner's Exhibit 1 is adopted as conclusive evidence as to the extent of the use, which has not been expanded since the existing buildings were constructed in 1957.
5. In 1963, an amendment to the BCZR required a special exception for such a use as described herein.
6. A nonconforming use exists for the use described on the subject Petition.

We have reviewed the referenced Public Notices describing applications for permits for work in navigable waters. We have considered the water pollution potential as well as the possible effects on the environment by construction of the facilities. 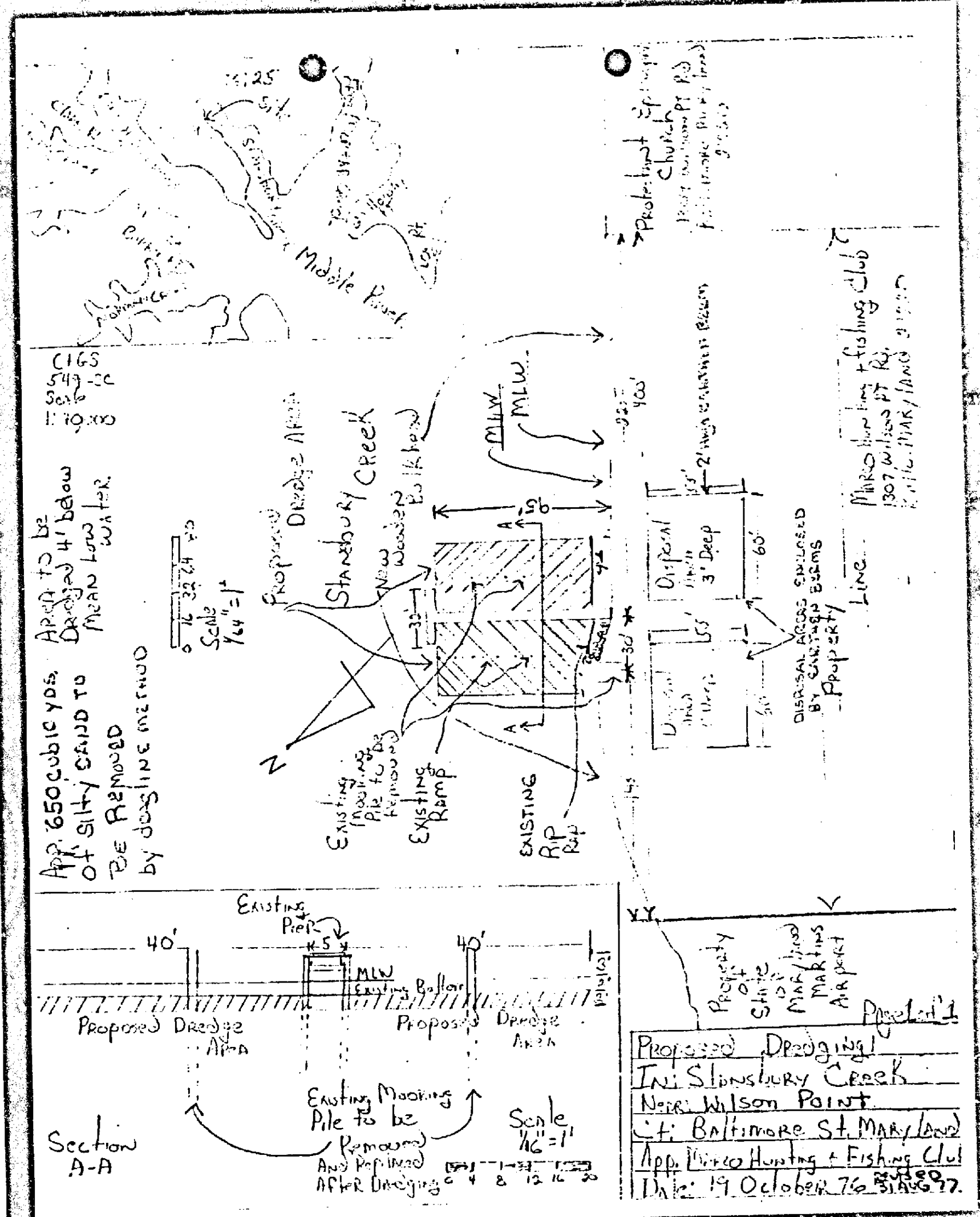

We have reviewed the referenced Public Notices describing applications for permits for work in navigable waters. We have considered the water pollution potential as well as the possible effects on the environment by construction of the facilities. We have no objection to the above permit requests provided the appropriate Water Quality Certifications are issued to the applicants. We do, however, recommend that the following conditions be attached to and made part of any permit issued for the proposed construction:

1. There will be no dredging or filling in marsh.
2. Dredging and/or filling will be done so as to minimize disturbance of the bottom or turbidity increases in the water which tend to degrade water quality and damage aquatic life.

3. Deposition of dredged or excavated materials on shore, and all earthwork operations on shore will be carried out in such a way as to minimize erosion of the material and preclude its entry into the waterway.

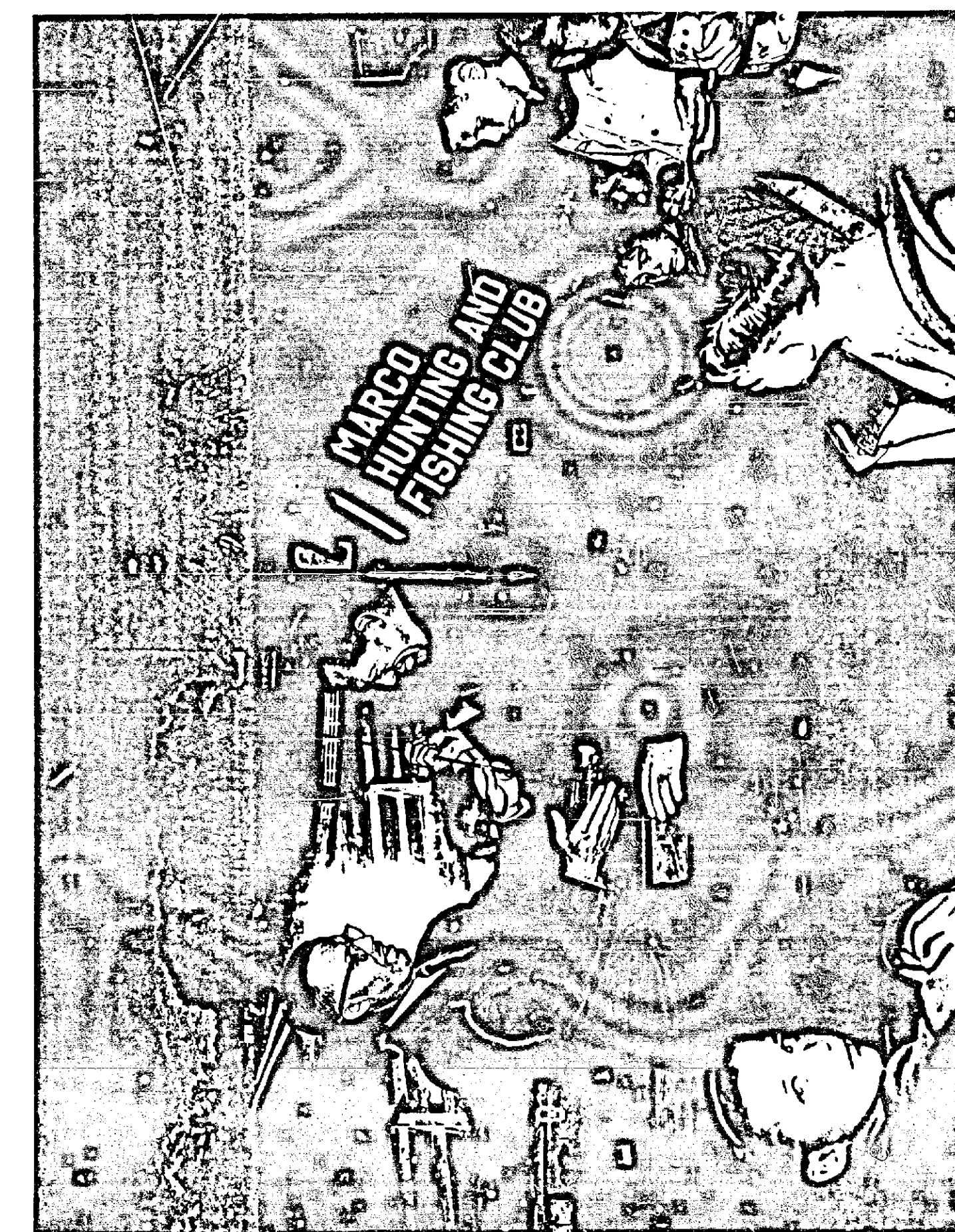

THE MARCO HUNTING AND FISHING CLUB, INCORPORATED, a Maryland Corporation having its principal office in P.O. Box 988, Baltimore 3, Maryland, (hereinafter called the Corporation) hereby certifies to the State Tax Commission of Maryland, that:

FIRST: The charter of the corporation is hereby amended by striking out: Paragraph Third of the Certificate of Incorporation and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

The purpose for which the Corporation is formed and the objects to be promoted by it are as follows:

To organize and operate a club exclusively for pleasure, recreation, education, to promote appreciation of hunting, fishing and conservation of game and fish among the members of the corporation and the general public, no part of the net earnings of which is to inure to the benefit of any member.

For the purposes aforesaid, the Corporation shall have the following powers:

To borrow or raise money for any of the purposes of the Corporation and to issue bonds, debentures, notes or other obligations of any nature, and in any manner permitted by law, for money so borrowed or payment for property purchased, or for any other lawful consideration, and to secure the payment thereof and of the interest thereon, assignment, in trust of the whole or any part of the property of the Corporation, real, personal or mixed, including contract rights, the then owned or thereafter acquired; and to sell, pledge, discount or otherwise dispose of such bonds, notes or other obligations, for any of the purposes of the Corporation.

The above mentioned letter states that our membership is 260 and our daily usage as 50 persons. - 2500 gallon septic tank;

MARYLAND FISHING

Writing for the League of Maryland Sportsman's Outdoor Show in 1946, Mr. J. Hammond Brown described Maryland as "America in Miniature" and it is doubtful if truer words were ever written, for Maryland truly is an "America in Miniature"; whether it be the monotonously flat "eastern ash" flanked by both ocean and bay, or the sandy, fertile hinterland that is climaxed finally by the towering mountain ridges to the west, for it is here that one finds the infinite topographical variations that are so definitive of the entire country and yet so typically naive of our very own Maryland.

To the outdoorsman who has the blood of the forests and stream instilled in his veins, Maryland offers the ultimate in pleasure and enjoyment. While the wildly fierce Atlantic Salmon spawn our waters and the huge northern bears and moose refuse our forests, still, we have a bountiful store of fish and game that ever beckon the hunter and fisherman.

The fishermen, in particular, will find the Maryland seems alluring since varying species of fish are "in season" during every month of the year and he will find fishing to his heart's content unless he is susceptible to the chilly winter or the shimmering summer. Starting off in January the snake-like pickered, fondly referred to as pike in Maryland, starts billiting spianling lura's and spocus on many rivers running into the bay. The Bush River and the Severa River are favorite spots and give up many fine catches of pickered along with the smaller, tasty yellow perch.

April brings showery, but even more important, trout. The scintillate boys, the dry and wet fly adepts start flitting their flyrods and rush to the country in droves. Such mountain spots as Frederick and Thurgate bear the trout almost to Baltimore and adjoining counties and their share of the trout fisheries. Trout fishing, unlike duck fishing, requires a seeking and finding process that requires a knowledge of insect life, water conditions and temperatures along with other factors that protect the wily, cagey trout. These fish, rainbows, brownies and brookies (or natives) are stocked by the State of Maryland from their hatcheries in Western Maryland.

As the waves ¹ rise, they prevail the bathed ones appear in the bay and many adolescents start kicking back to bring down the bay, catching bathed back by generally drawing the approaching time the rock will appear. Rock, or striped bass, sit in a cove of their own and are without a doubt the most popular. Fish in the bay is not as good. Finding fish, including the now famous Marro Fat, can take existence and trolling boats may be observed. All sides as they dig their way around the bay on rolling seas. Anything over fifteen pounds is out of bounds, and while the average is probably down around two to three pounds this limitation serves as an index to the size that rock will go. Fish's terrific taste, snappers, heavy kippers and hard fighers can command respect from any angler sufficiently inclined to have had a can. Bacteria serve as the basic lure for trolling while good shrimp are tops for chumming, a process of both methods are low to bring the fish close and subsequently landing them on artificial lure. Some baiting are popular and productive.

With the shad and troutlers wading the rivers and the bay fishermen trolling and chumming the large and small-mouth bass fishermen are quietly awaiting July for their lineings. Finally it arrives, and such spots as LMS managed Lake Roland, Luck River, and Prentiss along with many less rivers such as the Monocacy, Potomac, and Gunpowder are beaten to a frazzle. As the rock is the most popular small-water fish so the large-mouth black bass is the most popular fresh-water fish and his capture is sought by many. Casting rods and plugs are all-popular although spinning rods and lures are fast coming into popularity in this type of fishing. Small-mouths are generally found in the rivers and are considered to be the hardest fighters of all Maryland fresh-water species.

Along about this time surf fishing picks up along the Atlantic Coast especially in and around Ocean City. Marlin fishing too comes into being and presents the angler with probably the most spectacular and thrilling fishing of all, fresh or salt-water. Marlin are huge, comparatively speaking, and put up a fight that sees them walk on till as they come in surging, shaking leaps that are awe-inspiring. They are fish that are capable of running off with hundreds of yards of line, fish that can only be found twenty miles or so in the ocean and fish that are as beautiful in color and power as one can hope to find.

It's no wonder that some 50,000 anglers are licensed to fish in fresh-water at this time and probably a like-number in salt-water where no license is required) and one has little trouble finding a partner or organizing a trip. The fever reaches its peak in August and very few spots around the state are deserted although shad and trout are by now out of season. As the summer tapers off the seasons begin to close until finally the boxes go out in November and all that is left is the snake-like nickerler, fondly referred to as a nuke in Maryland.

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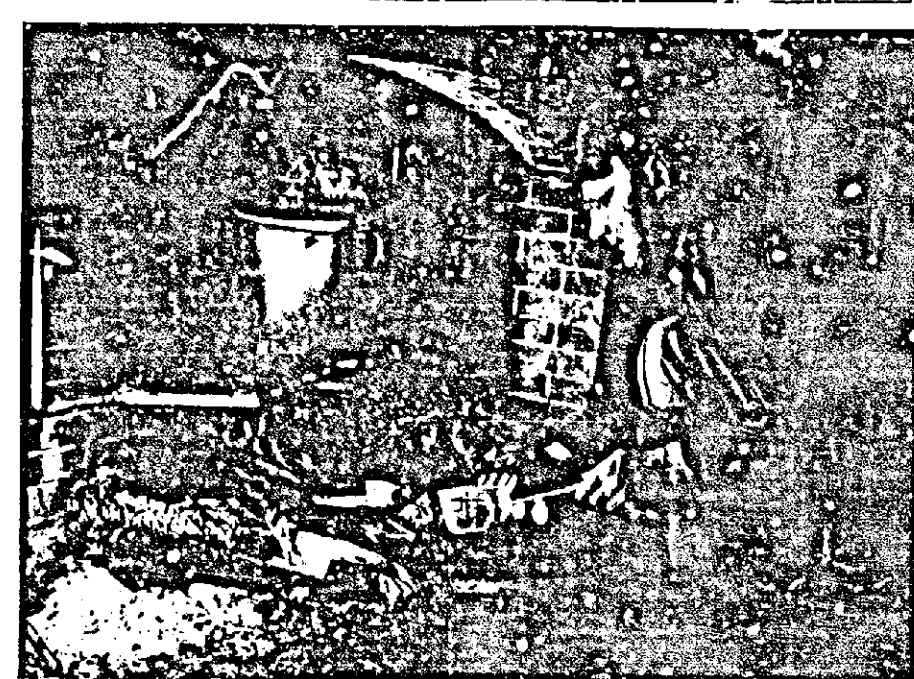


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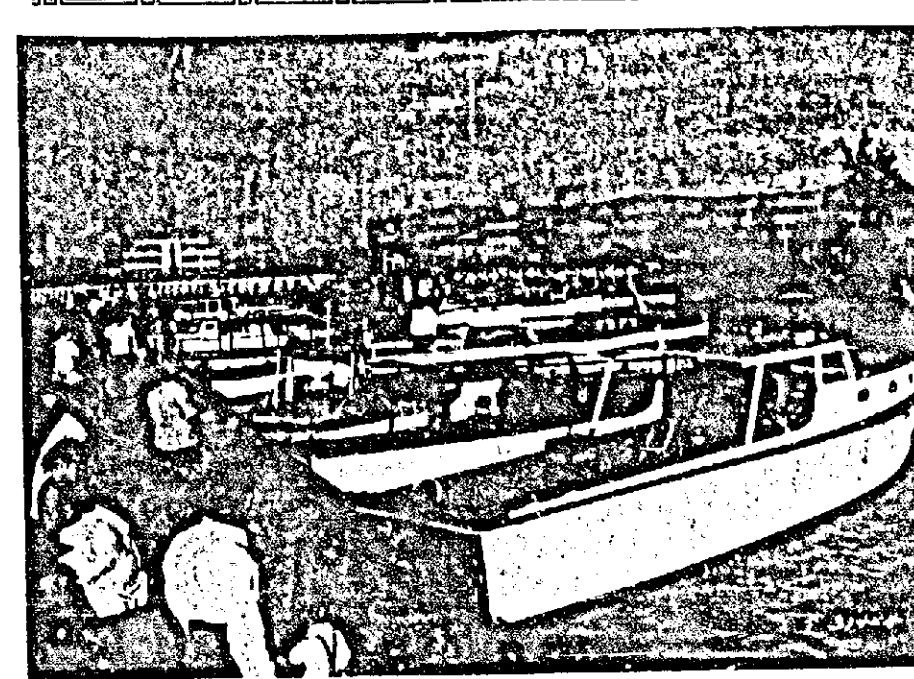
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CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

OF
THE MARCO HUNTING & FISHING CLUB, INCORPORATED

Approved February 2, 1947

ARTICLE NO. I — NAME AND PURPOSE

Section No. 1 — Name
The name of this organization shall be known as The Marco Hunting & Fishing Club, Incorporated.

Section No. 2 — Purpose
The purpose of this Club is to encourage the highest degree of sportsmanship among hunters and anglers employed by The Glenn L. Martin Company, and assist in the development of good sportsmanship among the young boys of the community.

Section No. 3 — Non-Profit Organization
Since the purpose for which the Club is formed and the objectives to be carried on are exclusively recreational and educational, no part of its net earnings shall inure to the benefit of any of its members.

ARTICLE NO. II — MEETINGS

Section No. 1 — Regular Meetings
The Club shall hold its regular meetings on the 2nd Tuesday and 4th Thursday of each month at 7:30 o'clock p.m. and four designated Saturday meetings a year for its club participation.

Section No. 2 — Special Meetings
Special meetings of the Club may be held at any time and place upon resolution of the Executive Council, and the President shall call special meetings of the Club if ten (10) percent of the members in good standing sign a written request for such a meeting. Such special meetings shall be called within fifteen (15) days from receipt of such request. Such request shall state the purpose for which such special meeting is to be called, and only the business stated in such request and notice can be considered and acted upon at such special meeting.

Section No. 3 — Executive Council Meetings
Meetings of the Executive Council may be held at such time and place as the President and Executive Council may from time to time determine, and not less than two days notice indicating time, place and purpose of such meetings shall be given each member thereof.

Section No. 4 — Notice of Meetings
The Club members shall be given at least four (4) days written notice by the Secretary before each regular meeting. The notice shall state the purpose of the meeting.

Section No. 5 — Meeting Quorums
The members present at any meeting of the Club shall constitute a quorum. The members of the Executive Council in attendance shall constitute a quorum at any meeting of the Executive Council.

Section No. 6 — Vote Required for Action upon Business and Resolutions
At the meeting of the Club any action shall take two-thirds (2/3) of the votes represented by the members and constituting a quorum.

Section No. 7 — Voting

Each member with dues paid in full for the current year shall be entitled to one (1) vote at any regular or special meeting of the Club. In event he cannot be present in person, he may permit another member to vote in his absence by providing him with a written and signed proxy.

ARTICLE NO. III — MEMBERSHIP

Section No. 1 — Classes

There shall be three classes of membership, namely: Regular, Sustaining, and Honorary Life.

Section No. 2 — Regular

Any person who is a citizen of the United States, has reached his eighteenth birthday and is employed by The Glenn L. Martin Company may become a regular member of this Club by making application for same, paying the dues as set forth in Section 5—Article III, and being accepted by a 2/3 majority vote at a regular meeting. Membership may be continued in the Club after leaving the employment of The Glenn L. Martin Company. Addition adopted November 11, 1947.

Section No. 3 — Sustaining

Any individual, whether or not a regular member of the Club may become a Sustaining member by making application for Sustaining membership, paying dues as set forth in Article III, Section No. 5, and being duly elected by the Executive Council. Sustaining members do not have the right to vote.

Section No. 4 — Honorary Life

All past presidents of this Club shall be Honorary Life members thereof, and for one year after vacating office shall be a member of the Executive Council. The Executive Council may, from time to time, elect persons who have performed outstanding service to conservation or achieved success in outdoor activity as Honorary Life members of the Club, provided, however, that not more than one such Honorary Life member shall be elected in any one calendar year. Honorary Life members elected from outside of the Club membership shall not be required to pay dues and shall have no vote.

Section No. 5 — Initiation Fee

The initiation fee shall be \$3.00 and this shall accompany application for membership.

Section No. 6 — Dues

The dues for a Regular member shall be \$1.00 per year, paid in advance. The dues for a Sustaining member shall be not less than \$25.00 per year.

Section No. 7 — Notification of Expiration

The Secretary shall notify each member thirty (30) days prior to the date on which membership expires, and if membership is not renewed thirty (30) days after expiration date the member may be dropped from the rolls and may not become a member again until he has paid the initiation fee and one (1) year's dues, the same as a new member.

ARTICLE NO. IV — OFFICERS

Section No. 1 — Officers

The officers shall consist of a President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer. All officers shall be members of the Executive Council.

Section No. 2 — Election

The Executive Council shall appoint a Nominating Committee one (1) month prior to the election meeting for the purpose of recommending suitable candidates for office. Prior to election a meeting will be set aside to accept from the floor, nominations for officers.

NOTE: This is an amendment to Article IV, Section 2, adopted April, 1947.
Officers shall be elected by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of members present at the last regular meeting prior to the end of the fiscal year. The President shall see that all persons voting at said meeting are members in good standing before receiving their ballots.

Officers shall be elected for a term commencing with the first meeting in September.

Section No. 3 — Vacancies

In case of vacancy by resignation or when an officer shall have been absent three consecutive meetings of the Club without an excuse satisfactory to the Executive Council, the President shall declare the office vacant. Such vacancy of office shall be filled by the Executive Council until the next annual election. Such appointment shall be ratified by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the Club before same shall be effective.

Section No. 4 — Duties of Officers

PRESIDENT—It shall be the duty of the President to conduct all regular and special meetings, appoint committees, temporary or standing, and preside at all meetings of the Executive Council. He shall be an ex-officio member of all committees and shall be notified of all meetings of all committees. He shall have a vote at all regular and special meetings of the Club and the Executive Council, but not of the committees. He shall, whenever possible represent the Club at conferences and other public gatherings, or may have the power to appoint any other member of the Club to represent him at said meeting. He shall receive no salary, but may be paid reasonable traveling expenses, when authorized and approved by the Executive Council.

VICE-PRESIDENT—It shall be the duty of the Vice-President to aid and assist the President at all regular and special meetings. He shall assume the duties of the President, in the absence of the President, and/or when requested to do so by the President. He shall have a vote at all regular and special meetings of the Club and Executive Council. He shall be the permanent chairman of the Membership Committee and may choose or appoint assistants as he desires. He shall appoint a subcommittee to handle legislative proposals, proposed by-law changes and the like. He shall be permitted to draw funds from the treasury to conduct membership drives, provided same is approved by the Executive Council.

SECRETARY—It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep all minutes of all meetings, regular, special or executive; he shall read the minutes of the past meeting at each current meeting. It shall be his duty to see that all members are

presented with a copy of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Club, and a record of any amendment or addition to same. He shall conduct all correspondence as directed and keep a file copy of same. He must also keep a record of all financial transactions, receive all funds from initiation fees, regular membership dues and any special credits. He shall transfer all funds received to the Treasurer of the Club and receive a receipt for same. He shall render a report of all transactions at each meeting of the Club and Executive Council. He may enlist any member as an assistant to aid him in these duties. He shall send written or printed notices to each Club member at least four (4) days before each meeting.

TREASURER—The Treasurer shall receive from the Secretary all funds belonging to the Club and shall deposit them in the Club account in a regular incorporated savings institution as soon thereafter as practical. He shall pay no money except upon an order drawn by the Secretary and countersigned by the President. All expenditures approved by the Club shall be paid by check, each check to bear the signature of the Treasurer and the President. It shall be the Treasurer's duty to render a report at each regular meeting of the Club, and/or when requested by the Executive Council. He shall be entitled to a vote at all regular and special meetings of the Club and the Executive Council.

Section No. 5 — Non-Political Standard

No elected or appointed natural resource conservation official of the State of Maryland, or the Nation, whether salaried or non-salaried, shall hold any office, or serve on any Committee of the Club. Upon acceptance of any political office by any officer of the Club, he shall automatically relinquish his office, and the vacancy shall be filled as provided in Section No. 3 of Article IV.

ARTICLE NO. V — EXECUTIVE COUNCIL

Section No. 1 — General Powers

All business and affairs of the Club shall be executed by its Executive Council. The Executive Council shall be composed of all officers and all Committee Chairmen. Members of the Executive Council shall hold office for the term of one year, or until a successor shall have been duly elected and qualified.

Section No. 2 — Powers

The Executive Council shall have the power and authority to supervise all activities of the Club, but shall at all times carry out any and all instructions of the Club as a whole. It shall have the authority to develop plans for cooperative with other organizations interested in the objectives of the Club, and take all steps it deems necessary, or advisable, to carry out any of these objectives.

ARTICLE NO. VI — COMMITTEES

Section No. 1 — Standing Committee
There shall be four (4) standing committees, namely: 1) Membership and Legislative; 2) Activities; 3) Conservation; and 4) Properties.

Section No. 2 — Duties of Standing Committees
1. Membership and Legislative Committee. Recruiting of new members. Drafting legislative proposals, etc.
2. Activities

The Activities Committee shall be divided into sub-committees, i.e., entertainment, shooting, fishing, publicity, etc. The Activities Committee shall

be granted a revolving fund for any special events, the amount of which shall be fixed from time to time by the Executive Council. It may receive sub-committee to present an account of such activities at each regular meeting and shall turn over all surplus funds to the Secretary of the Club.

2. Properties

It shall be the duty of the Properties Committee to supervise all property of the Club, seeing to the maintenance and improvement thereof.

4. Conservation

The Conservation Committee shall be divided into three sub-committees, i.e., game, fish and forests. It shall have full charge of the Club's efforts toward game and fish management and resource preservation. Its activities shall closely parallel all the recommendations of the League of Maryland Sportsmen, Inc.

ARTICLE NO. VII — CLUB FUNDS

Funds of the Club may be invested in such securities as two-thirds (2/3) of the members present may determine at any regular or special meeting of the Club.

ARTICLE NO. VIII — FISCAL YEAR

The Fiscal year of the Club shall begin with the first meeting in September.

ARTICLE NO. IX — ORDER OF BUSINESS

The order of business shall be:

1. Roll call of officers
2. Reading of Minutes
3. Secretary's Report on Communications
4. Committee's Reports
5. Treasurer's Report
6. Application for New Membership
7. Unfinished Business
8. New Business
9. Good of the Club
10. Adjournment

Roberts Rules of Order shall constitute authority for all matters pertaining to parliamentary law.

ARTICLE NO. X — UNSPORTSMANSHIP

Any member found guilty of unsportsmanship, or of violating any of the Club rules or regulations may be suspended by the Club in the following manner: The accuser, or accusers, shall make his complaint in writing and present same to the Executive Council. If accusations are worthy the Council shall notify both the accused and the accused to appear before the Council in a closed session. The Council may acquit or suspend him by a majority vote of the members present. The use of alcoholic beverages during any activity involving the use of firearms shall be considered as adequate grounds for suspension.

ARTICLE NO. XI — AMENDMENTS

Section No. 1 — Method

These By-laws may be altered, amended or repealed at any regular or special meeting provided such proposals are presented to the Executive Council for consideration, and read before the Club at least thirty (30) days before final action is taken. At least two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present is required before such action becomes final.

Hickories are found quite a few miles above tidewater in nearly all the small streams leading off of the bay. Snags favored spots are Winter's Run, Little Gunpowder, Deer Creek, Occotone and along the shore of the Susquehanna below Conowingo Dam. Although I have never fished to the south of Baltimore, I believe that good fishing could be had in the lower reaches of the Magothy, Severn, and Patuxent Rivers.

Shad have extremely small mouths for their size and the best hook size for a streamer fly appears to be about a No. 8 with a 3X or 4X shank. Although some conventional trout patterns will catch shad I have gotten better results with my own creations of white or yellow body, finel spiral, and wings of either white, yellow, or light blue hair or calthra.

A small red bead on the leader just ahead of the fly often does the trick when all other lures fail. When the water is muddy, as it frequently is during the spring, a small spoon similar to the Johnson Sprite, or Mellure—size 10, usually gets the best results. A fly with a body of tinsel and a short red wing also works well under these conditions.

Although a spinning cork seems to be the ideal method for shad—the majority of anglers use bait casting equipment, with a sprinkling of fly rods also present. If bait casting tackle is used, 3 ft. leader about 10 lb. test is used with ¼ oz. of lead at the junction of line and leader. The shad is cast across stream and retrieved slowly to the lure gets down to the bottom. The strike comes suddenly—the shad billing with a rush and usually it is not necessary to strike him as he will hook himself. The mouth is extremely sensitive to the hook. However, and the angler must resign himself to losing almost half of the fish he catches unless extreme care is used in playing the fish. The battle is full of excitement. Occasionally the shad will leave the water with a series of leaps in an effort to escape. The hook bait may often be carried on his light deep in the stream and continue

The best spot for hickories is a deep pool where they gather in large numbers. In clear water it is possible to watch hundreds of them lying on the bottom idle watching the lures dragged past. They are not very intelligent and are not very fast. They will come in and come by just their nose by the eager angler. Occasionally a particularly attractive lure will be presented and a shad will shoot forward and seize it quickly. Sometimes the same lure can be presented 20 or 30 times before the fish appear interested and at other times each cast seems to be a failure. I happily recall one occasion when a particular fly got 5 fish on 8 consecutive casts.

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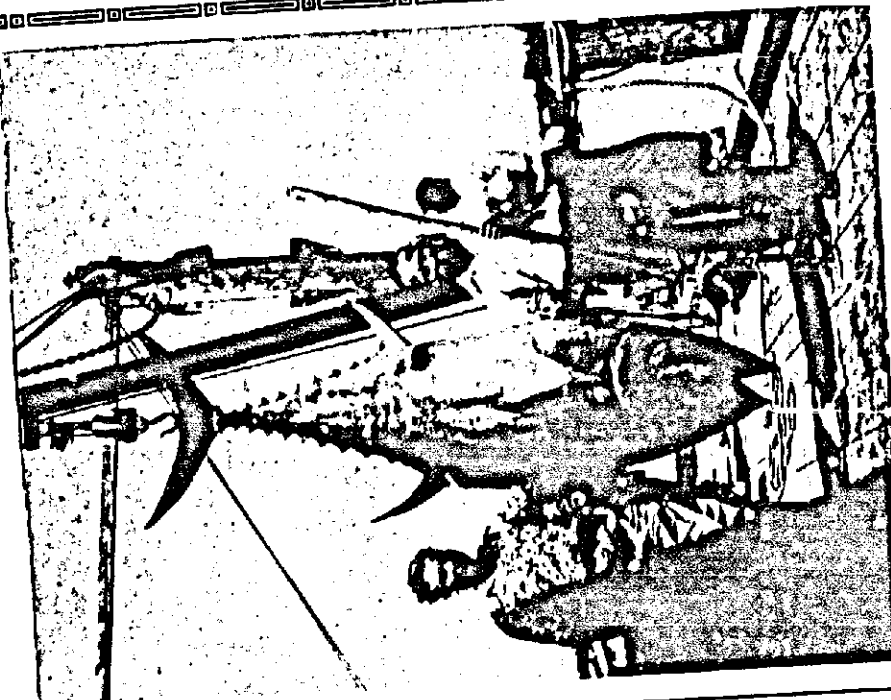

INSTRUCTIONS FOR FILLING OUT REPORT TO DETERMINE LIABILITY
FOR UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION

This report is required in accordance with the Maryland Unemployment Compensation Law. Read the following instructions carefully.

Item 1: Enter here the name by which your business (trade, occupation, or profession) is known to the public.

Item 2: Enter here the address to which forms for reporting should be sent. If address shown in this space is outside of Maryland please complete item 4 with reference to all operations in Maryland.

Item 3: Enter here the name and address of the proprietor, all partners, all officers, legal representatives, etc. This information is essential and must be furnished. Use separate sheet if necessary. Show full name as James A. Smith and J. A. Smith.

Item 4: State type of organization, such as partnership, association, trust, estate, joint-stock company, insurance company or co-partnership, whether domestic or foreign, or the receiver, trustee in bankruptcy, trustee or successor thereof, or the legal representative of a deceased person, etc.

Item 5: Enter the principal activity at each place of business in Maryland, such as manufacturing, wholesale trade, retail trade, mining and quarrying, construction, real estate, insurance, finance, transportation, communication, personal service, business service, or professional service. If engaged in a trade, state whether as a wholesaler, a retailer, or a commission dealer, a manufacturer, a wholesaler, a retailer, or a commission dealer, a wholesaler, a retailer, or a commission dealer.

Item 6: Enter the principal products produced or sold in, or the principal services performed at each place of business in Maryland, in order of their importance. If engaged in construction, state the type of construction work ordinarily performed. For example: highway construction, residential, building, electrical or plumbing installation, etc.

Item 7: Enter the date business operations began in Maryland and date first employee was hired in Maryland.

Item 8: If you did not take over the entire business of the predecessor, explain on a separate sheet the proportion or part of the business that you took over. The law provides, among other things, that the successor employer shall be liable for any contributions or interest due and unpaid by the predecessor employer.

Item 9: Enter the number of workers on your last payroll, including all employees performing services (whether receiving remuneration or not), Officers of Corporation, members of family 21 years or over (other than parents or spouse), and part-time workers. Individual owner or partner is not included. Do not include workers whose employment in Maryland is transitory or incidental to their employment in another state.

Item 10: An employer may elect to become liable, and extend the benefits of the law to workers in excluded occupations, for a period of not less than two calendar years upon approval of the Employment Security Board.

SIGNATURE—This report must be filed on or before the date stamped on the face hereof and must be dated and signed by (1) the individual, if the employing unit is an individual; (2) the president, treasurer, or other principal officer, if the employing unit is a corporation; or (3) a partner, if the employer is a partnership; (4) a duly authorized agent of an unincorporated organization.

** Note: An employing unit which for some portion of the year has had no more than one individual employed is liable under this Act.
