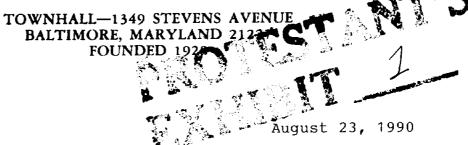

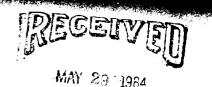

Mr. Benson began the meeting at 11:00 a.m. He stated that this was a Continued Meeting from March 22, 1984. The two issues to be resolved were: 1) more detailed information and a grading plan with reference to the Lowe property; 2) extend public water to serve the Lowe property and study the ressibility of extending public sewer.

Mr. Smith, developer's engineer, presented the plan. The grading plan has been revised as requested and the water main extended to serve the property. Sanitary sewer extension could be revised from private to public and an easement could be granted in order that the property could be served by pumping into the proposed public sewer should their system fail.

Mr. Bober summarized the written comments submitted from Planning, Traffic Engineeri Developers Engineering Division, Zoning, Fire. A copy of these comments was given to the developer and developer's engineer, and also have been made a part of these minutes.

Fire - Fire flow test is required. Three additional fire hydrants shall be added to the entrance driveways. On-site hydrants shall be shifted to the islands in the center of the buildings, away from the loading docks.

Developers Engineering Division - Sanitary sewer extension should be located closer

to Georgetown Road and provide an easement to the Lowe property. Revision to the sanitary, sewer to be shown on the plan.

The plan was approved by the Dept. of Public Works and Office of Planning.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:45 a.m.

WHEREAS, the party of the second part is the owner of all that tract of land designated as "Schmelyun Property" as shown on a plat attached hereto and made a part hereof, as "Exhibit 1", and referred thereon as Parcels 1, 2, 3, and 4; and in addition thereto, is the owner of a tract of land contained in a Deed recorded in Liber 5429, Folio 719, from the State Roads Commission of Maryland to the party of the second part, being a part of Old Sulphur Spring Road, as shown on a plat attached hereto and made a part hereof, as "Exhibit 2", and shown thereon as Parcel No. 5.

WHEREAS, the aforesaid party of the second part is desirous of developing a portion of said tract in an ML context. ((the said portion being referred to on "Exhibit No.1" as Parcel 1, and also referred to as Section A and Section B together with the areas shown as Potomac Avenue (proposed) of a Plat attached hereto and made a part hereof as "Exhibit No.3")) which development would require the existing zoning of the said portion of the Schmelyun property to be amended from its present DR 5.5 classification; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid WILLIAM G. SCHMELYUN, has undertaken certain rezoning proceedings in Baltimore County and these proceedings are presently before the Baltimore County Board of Appeals; and

WHEREAS, the parties of the first part are comprised of residents and property owners of the area who are affected by the use of the Schmelyun property and join together here for the purpose of implementing and protecting their property rights and by furthering the proper use and amenity of the area encompassed by and defined as the Schmelyun property, which includes Parcels 1, 2, 3, and 4 as shown on "Exhibit 1", and Parcel 5 as shown on "Exhibit 2" within the overall Baltimore County land use and zoning plans; and

WHEREAS, the said WILLIAM G. SCHMELYUN, owner of said land, desires to have Parcel No. 1 of Exhibit No. 1 reclassified from its DR 5.5 classification to that of an ML classification and that said classification become final and effective; and

WHEREAS, the property owner and parties of the first part desire to place certain restrictions upon the development of the tract; and

WHEREAS, the said WILLIAM G. SCHMELYUN is willing to place such restrictions on the development of the Schmelyun tract provided Parcel No. 1 shown on "Exhibit No. 1." is reclassified ML by the County Board of Appeals and no Appeal is taken within the appeal period whereby said portion of the land becomes finally and effectively zoned ML; and

WHEREAS, in order to have the covenants, restrictions and conditions contained in this Agreement binding and in full force and effect on the four parcels of land shown on said "Exhibit 1" and parcel number five shown on "Exhibit 2", and more particularly described in the body of this Agreement, containing 19.04 acres more or less, hereinbefore referred to, and upon the present and

future owners and occupants thereof, the parties have entered into this Agreement to the end and intent that the party of the second part, his successors, heirs and assigns, will hold, utilize and thereafter convey or foreclose that property subject to the covenants, restrictions and conditions herein contained.

· NOW, THEREFORE, THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSETH:

That in consideration of the mutual agreements, covenants, restrictions and conditions herein contained, and the sum of Five Dollars (\$5.00) paid by each party to the other, and for other good and valuable considerations, receipt of which is hereby mutually acknowledged, the parties hereby agree to enter into these presents and to have the same recorded among the Land Records of Baltimore County, and that the covenants, restrictions and conditions shall run with and be binding upon the aforesaid 14.68 acre tract and upon present and all future owners thereof and shall inure to the benefit of each of the parties hereto as respectively, their successors, heirs and assigns, as follows:

THE PARTY OF THE SECOND PART AGREES AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the parcels described as Parcels 2, 3, and 4 on the plat referred to as "Exhibit No. 1", and parcel 5 on the plat referred to as "Exhibit No. 2" of the Schmelyum property, with the metes and bounds calls for parcels 2, 3 and 4 as shown on "Exhibit No. 1" and with the dimensions and calls as shown on "Exhibit No. 2", shall be used for residential purposes only and for no other purpose. That in this connection said land will be developed in accordance with the zoning regulations of the Baltimore County as of the date of the filing of this Deed for DR 5.5 zoning without special exception or variance of any kind, and no commercial uses of any type shall be permitted on these four (4) tracts of land. It is the intention that Parcels 2, 3, 4 and 5 will be developed in conformance with the

residential zoning presently on the north and south sides of Sulphur Spring Road and immediately adjacent to the said property and presently zoned D.R. 5.5. In the event the latter mentioned parcels fronting on the south side and the north side of Sulphur Spring Road are rezoned to some other zone than that presently enjoyed, by persons other than the party of the second part, or members of his family, then the party of the second part is relieved from his obligation to develop Parcels 2, 3, 4, and 5 in the D.R. 5.5 zoning classification, and may be allowed to develop in accordance with the said reclassified property. If, however, the aforementioned parcels fronting on the south side and the north side of Sulphur Spring Road are not rezoned to some other zone other than that presently enjoyed, but, however, the "Snow property" is reclassified, such reclassification of the "Snow property" shall not be used by the party of the second part as a basis for seeking reclassification of parcel 2, 3, 4 and 5 so long as the parcels fronting on the south and north side of Sulphur Spring Road are not reclassified.

As to the remaining tract, referred to as Parcel No. 1 on "Exhibit No. 1", and more particularly described as follows:

"BEGINNING for the same on the southeast side of Waelchili Avenue at a point situate 260 feet more or less, southerly from the intersection of the south side of Sulphur Spring Road and the east side of Waelchili Avenue, thence leaving said place of beginning and running and binding on the south side of Waelchili Avenue the 2 following courses and distances viz: (1) South 56 degrees 23 minutes West 345.22 feet to a point of curve, thence (2) by a curve to the left with a chord bearing South 29 degrees 01 minutes West 116.09 feet to the end of said curve, thence binding along the east side of said Waelchili Avenue the 3 following courses and distances, viz: (3) South 01 degrees 57 minutes

West 30.61 feet, thence (4) North 88 degrees 03 minutes
West 3.77 feet and thence (5) South 00 degrees 50 minutes
West 182.03 feet, thence binding along the northeast side
of said Waelchili Avenue (6) South 48 degrees 18 minutes
East 598.22 feet, thence binding in part along the north
side of said Waelchili Avenue and continuing the same
course, in all. (7) North 39 degrees 30 minutes East 392.60
feet, thence (8) South 49 degrees 52 minutes 30 seconds
East 273 feet, more or less to the northwesternmost side
of Proposed Interstate 95 Right of Way, thence running
and binding along said northwesternmost side of Proposed
Interstate 95, the 4 following courses and distances,
viz: (9) Northeasterly 255 feet, more or less, thence
(10) Northeasterly 284 feet, more or less, thence (11)
Northeasterly 107 feet, more or less, thence binding along
the southwesternmost side of Interstate 95 Right of Way
the 8 following courses and distances, viz: (13) Northwesterly
315 feet, more or less, thence (14) Northwesterly 48 feet,
more or less, thence (15) Northwesterly 95 feet, more
or less, thence (16) Northwesterly 95 feet, more
or less, thence (16) Northwesterly 100 feet, more or less,
thence (17) Northwesterly 107 feet, more or less, thence
(18) Northwesterly 88 feet, more or less, thence (19)
Northwesterly 30 feet, more or less, and thence (20)
Southwesterly 30 feet, more or less, thence leaving the
southwesternmost right of way line of Interstate 95 Right
of Way and running thence (21) South 44 degrees 00 minutes
East 200 feet, more or less, thence (22) South 56 degrees
23 minutes West 407.46 feet and thence (23) North 33 degrees
37 minutes West 180.00 feet to the place of beginning.

Containing 14.45 acres of land, more or less.

Saving and excepting therefrom the Right of Way for proposed realignment of Potomac Street."

this above described land shall be reclassified ML, but can only be developed within the context and intent of Sections 247 through 252 of the existing Zoning Regulations of Baltimore County as apply to a MLR zone (Manufacturing Light, Restricted), with the intent and purpose to permit grouping of high types of industrial plants in industrial subdivisions in locations with convenient access to expressways or other primary motorways, so as to minimize the use of residential streets; to fill special local needs of certain types of light industry; to permit planned dispersal of industrial employment centers so as to be conveniently and satisfactorily related to the residential community; and as transitional bands between the residential or institutional areas.

2. Uses Prohibited.

Even though otherwise permitted in an MLR zone the following uses are forever prohibited:

A. Heliport of any kind or nature as well as a helistop airstrip; and the Owners will not utilize the land for any commercial use which requires a special exception or variance, and will develop the land within the context of regular permitted uses of MLR zoning as defined by the Zoning Laws of Baltimore County, on the day and date of execution of this Agreement, without special exception or variance.

3. Set Backs

1

All buildings placed on Parcel No. 1 as shown on

Exhibit No. 1 (also referred to as Parcels No. A and B of Exhibit

No.3) shall be set back a minimum of seventy-five (75) feet from

the property lines, with the exception of the property immediately

to the rear of the present boundaries of the United States Government

Post Office, or the future boundaries of the United States Government

Post Office in case said Government facility is to expand in the

future, described as the south 56° 23 West 407.46 foot line; and

there shall be no set back from this latter line required. In the

75 foot set back area there shall be located no structures of any nature;

the land shall be seeded and planted in such a manner as to effectively

screen the buildings placed on Parcel No. 1 from view from the

surrounding residential properties, however, the party of the second

part may apply for such variances from the Zoning Regulations as

are necessary in order to comply with the terms of this Agreement.

4. Construction.

The buildings constructed on Parcel No. 1 shall be built basically of block, stone, or brick, with appropriate decorative masonry facing above ground on all areas exposed to view from adjoining properties or highways. The exterior construction may also be of

prefab steel and/or aluminum, or a combination of both, and/or a combination of either, with masonary as previously described. However, all buildings howsoever constructed shall have appropriate decorative facing about ground on all areas exposed to view from adjoining properties or highways. As a guide to an explanation of the aforesaid language, the following presently existing buildings in the Baltimore Metropolitan area are typical of the design and character contemplated by the parties hereto:

- a. Baltimore County Police Headquarters 400 Kenilworth Drive
- b. Marbett, Inc. Building, Meadows Industrial Park, 6600 Whitestone Road
- c. George Rosen Building, Meadows Industrial Park 6700 Whitestone Road
- d. Duo Fast Building, Meadows Industrial Park 1719 Whitehead Road
- e. Excello Building, Meadows Industrial Park 1760 Whitehead Road
- Kodak Building, Security Industrial Park 7115 Ambassador Road
- C & P Telephone Building, Security Industrial Park, Dogwood & Ambassador Roads

And further, the buildings shall not exceed one story in height and the overall height of any building shall be no more than 20 feet.

5. Signs.

Any display signs shall be unobtrusive in nature, affixed to the building, non-illuminated and not designed to attract attention outside of the industrial park.

6. Lighting

Any lights which may be installed on the premises shall be of such types so shielded and so situated that they do not cause glare offensive to the neighbors, and shall be directed towards the innermost portion of the industrial park.

7. Uses of the Building.

The buildings will be used for MLR light manufacturing restricted uses only, as defined by the Zoning Regulations of Baltimore County; but, in this connection, there shall be no uses of this property which would result in offensive odors eminating from the property; and, further, any noises eminating from said property as a result of the uses of the buildings to be constructed thereon shall not exceed at the property line 80 decibels as measured on a general radio type number 1565B sound level meter using the A scale between hours of 8:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M.; or 50 decibels measured by a general radio type 1565B sound level meter using the A scale between hours of 5:00 P.M. and 8:00 A.M., but, in any event, it shall not exceed the sound levels as prescribed by the then current State and Federal standards.

8. Storage of the Materials.

All storage of materials shall be within the building and there shall be no storage or trash outside of the buildings, or temporary storage sheds of any kind.

- 9. The industrial park shall contain no truck terminal of any kind and all loading platforms shall be located towards the interior center of the lots and away from the exterior property lines. There shall be no open storage of vehicles on the property, other than overnight parking of vehicles used by the various businesses occupying the property; nor shall there be any exterior repairing of motor vehicles other than repairing of an emergency nature.
- 10. A road into the tract from Sulphur Spring Road, as contemplated by the plat filed with the zoning petition (shown thereon as Potomac Avenue-proposed) shall be built, provided approval can be obtained from Baltimore County, its exact route and terminus, however, to be fixed by the County. The party of the second part will

exert all efforts to insure that no secondary exit from this proposed road will enter onto Waelchili Avenue; and, further, will cooperate fully with the parties of the first part in securing from Baltimore County whatever traffic devices or signals that the parties of the first part feel are necessary at the intersection of the proposed Potomac Avenue and Sulphur Spring Road.

11. Open Space.

All open spaces shall be landscaped with grass and planted with trees and shrubbery in the 75 foot setback areas so as to blend harmoniously with the surrounding residential properties.

12. Recording.. The recording of this instrument and all of the aforegoing covenants, restrictions and conditions and the expenses of the title work and survey in connection therewith shall be at the sole cost and expense of WILLIAM G. SCHMELYUN, without any contribution on the part of the parties of the first part whatsoever.

VON.

13. Restrictive Covenants.

The parties of the second part hereby agrees that these covenants, restrictions and conditions shall run with and be binding upon the land and shall inure to the benefit of and shall be jointly and severally enforceable by The Arbutus Community Association, Inc., a body corporate, and The Halethorpe Improvement Association, Inc., a body corporate, their successors and assigns, and the other parties of the first part hereto, their heirs and assigns, the owners of the properties located in the vicinity of said tracts, their heirs, successors and assigns, for a period of twenty-six years from the date of recording hereof. The restrictions set forth in this Agreement may be terminated, altered, or amended, by a subsequent agreement signed by party of the second part, his heirs, successors and assigns, and all of the parties of the first part, their heirs, successors and assigns, and all of the parties of the first part, their heirs,

THE PARTIES OF THE FIRST PART AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. That an appeal presently filed before the Board of Appeals

for Ealtimore County pertaining to Parcel No. 1 on "Exhibit No.1" and also known as parcels numbers A and B on "Exhibit No.2" and more particularly described on page 4 of the within agreement, shall be dismissed with prejudice and the Order of Dismissal signed by all counsel of record for the Appellants in the proceeding now pending will be turned over subsequent to execution of this Agreement and prior to recording thereof.

- 2. This Agreement contains the entire understanding between the parties and each of the parties hereto warrant that it has carefully read and understands this Agreement and is cognizant of the terms thereof and has had ample time to have it fully explained by counsel of their own choosing of their respective rights and obligations with respect to all matters involved in this Agreement.
- 3. All the agreements, covenants, restrictions and conditions contained in this instrument shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the heirs, successors and assigns of the parties hereto, as well as all subordinate and successor mortgagees and all purchasers at foreclosure under any mortgage or deed of trust, and all persons claiming by or through them or any of them, shall run with the land and be binding upon the property hereinbefore described.
- 4. The failure to enforce any of the covenants, restrictions and conditions herein contained, in any instance, shall in no event constitute a waiver or estoppel of the right to enforce the same or any other covenant, restriction or conditions in the event of another violation occurring prior or subsequent thereto. Moreover, in the event any one or more of the covenants, restrictions, and conditions herein contained should for any reason be declared invalid, the remaining covenants, restrictions and conditions shall continue in full force and effect.

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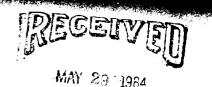

to Georgetown Road and provide an easement to the Lowe property. Revision to the sanitary, sewer to be shown on the plan.

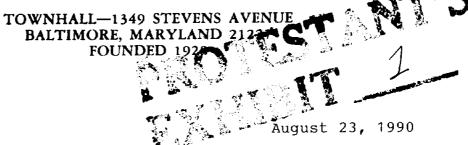

In the event the latter mentioned parcels fronting on the south side and the north side of Sulphur Spring Road are rezoned to some other zone than that presently enjoyed, by persons other than the party of the second part, or members of his family, then the party of the second part is relieved from his obligation to develop Parcels 2, 3, 4, and 5 in the D.R. 5.5 zoning classification, and may be allowed to develop in accordance with the said reclassified property. If, however, the aforementioned parcels fronting on the south side and the north side of Sulphur Spring Road are not rezoned to some other zone other than that presently enjoyed, but, however, the "Snow property" is reclassified, such reclassification of the "Snow property" shall not be used by the party of the second part as a basis for seeking reclassification of parcel 2, 3, 4 and 5 so long as the parcels fronting on the south and north side of Sulphur Spring Road are not reclassified.

As to the remaining tract, referred to as Parcel No. 1 on "Exhibit No. 1", and more particularly described as follows:

and binding along said northwesternmost side of Proposed
Interstate 95, the 4 following courses and distances,
viz: (9) Northeasterly 255 feet, more or less, thence
(10) Northeasterly 284 feet, more or less, thence (11)
Northeasterly 107 feet, more or less, thence binding along
the southwesternmost side of Interstate 95 Right of Way
the 8 following courses and distances, viz: (13) Northwesterly
315 feet, more or less, thence (14) Northwesterly 48 feet,

Saving and excepting therefrom the Right of Way for proposed realignment of Potomac Street."

this above described land shall be reclassified ML, but can only be developed within the context and intent of Sections 247 through 252 of the existing Zoning Regulations of Baltimore County as apply to a MLR zone (Manufacturing Light, Restricted), with the intent and purpose to permit grouping of high types of industrial plants in industrial subdivisions in locations with convenient access to expressways or other primary motorways, so as to minimize the use of residential streets; to fill special local needs of certain types of light industry; to permit planned dispersal of industrial employment centers so as to be conveniently and satisfactorily related to the residential community; and as transitional bands between the residential or institutional areas.

2. Uses Prohibited.

Even though otherwise permitted in an MLR zone the following uses are forever prohibited:

A. Heliport of any kind or nature as well as a helistop airstrip; and the Owners will not utilize the land for any commercial use which requires a special exception or variance, and will develop the land within the context of regular permitted uses of MLR zoning as defined by the Zoning Laws of Baltimore County, on the day and date of execution of this Agreement, without special exception or variance.

3. Set Backs

1

All buildings placed on Parcel No. 1 as shown on

Exhibit No. 1 (also referred to as Parcels No. A and B of Exhibit

No.3) shall be set back a minimum of seventy-five (75) feet from
the property lines, with the exception of the property immediately
to the rear of the present boundaries of the United States Government
Post Office, or the future boundaries of the United States Government
Post Office in case said Government facility is to expand in the
future, described as the south 56° 23 West 407.46 foot line; and
there shall be no set back from this latter line required. In the
75 foot set back area there shall be located no structures of any nature;
the land shall be seeded and planted in such a manner as to effectively
screen the buildings placed on Parcel No. 1 from view from the
surrounding residential properties, however, the party of the second
part may apply for such variances from the Zoning Regulations as
are necessary in order to comply with the terms of this Agreement.

4. Construction.

The buildings constructed on Parcel No. 1 shall be built basically of block, stone, or brick, with appropriate decorative masonry facing above ground on all areas exposed to view from adjoining properties or highways. The exterior construction may also be of

prefab steel and/or aluminum, or a combination of both, and/or a combination of either, with masonary as previously described. However, all buildings howsoever constructed shall have appropriate decorative facing about ground on all areas exposed to view from adjoining properties or highways. As a guide to an explanation of the aforesaid language, the following presently existing buildings in the Baltimore Metropolitan area are typical of the design and character contemplated by the parties hereto:

- a. Baltimore County Police Headquarters 400 Kenilworth Drive
- b. Marbett, Inc. Building, Meadows Industrial Park, 6600 Whitestone Road
- c. George Rosen Building, Meadows Industrial Park 6700 Whitestone Road
- d. Duo Fast Building, Meadows Industrial Park 1719 Whitehead Road
- e. Excello Building, Meadows Industrial Park 1760 Whitehead Road
- Kodak Building, Security Industrial Park 7115 Ambassador Road
- C & P Telephone Building, Security Industrial Park, Dogwood & Ambassador Roads

And further, the buildings shall not exceed one story in height and the overall height of any building shall be no more than 20 feet.

5. Signs.

Any display signs shall be unobtrusive in nature, affixed to the building, non-illuminated and not designed to attract attention outside of the industrial park.

6. Lighting

Any lights which may be installed on the premises shall be of such types so shielded and so situated that they do not cause glare offensive to the neighbors, and shall be directed towards the innermost portion of the industrial park.

7. Uses of the Building.

The buildings will be used for MLR light manufacturing restricted uses only, as defined by the Zoning Regulations of Baltimore County; but, in this connection, there shall be no uses of this property which would result in offensive odors eminating from the property; and, further, any noises eminating from said property as a result of the uses of the buildings to be constructed thereon shall not exceed at the property line 80 decibels as measured on a general radio type number 1565B sound level meter using the A scale between hours of 8:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M.; or 50 decibels measured by a general radio type 1565B sound level meter using the A scale between hours of 5:00 P.M. and 8:00 A.M., but, in any event, it shall not exceed the sound levels as prescribed by the then current State and Federal standards.

8. Storage of the Materials.

All storage of materials shall be within the building and there shall be no storage or trash outside of the buildings, or temporary storage sheds of any kind.

- 9. The industrial park shall contain no truck terminal of any kind and all loading platforms shall be located towards the interior center of the lots and away from the exterior property lines. There shall be no open storage of vehicles on the property, other than overnight parking of vehicles used by the various businesses occupying the property; nor shall there be any exterior repairing of motor vehicles other than repairing of an emergency nature.
- 10. A road into the tract from Sulphur Spring Road, as contemplated by the plat filed with the zoning petition (shown thereon as Potomac Avenue-proposed) shall be built, provided approval can be obtained from Baltimore County, its exact route and terminus, however, to be fixed by the County. The party of the second part will

exert all efforts to insure that no secondary exit from this proposed road will enter onto Waelchili Avenue; and, further, will cooperate fully with the parties of the first part in securing from Baltimore County whatever traffic devices or signals that the parties of the first part feel are necessary at the intersection of the proposed Potomac Avenue and Sulphur Spring Road.

11. Open Space.

All open spaces shall be landscaped with grass and planted with trees and shrubbery in the 75 foot setback areas so as to blend harmoniously with the surrounding residential properties.

12. Recording.. The recording of this instrument and all of the aforegoing covenants, restrictions and conditions and the expenses of the title work and survey in connection therewith shall be at the sole cost and expense of WILLIAM G. SCHMELYUN, without any contribution on the part of the parties of the first part whatsoever.

13. Restrictive Covenants.

The parties of the second part hereby agrees that these covenants, restrictions and conditions shall run with and be binding upon the land and shall inure to the benefit of and shall be jointly and severally enforceable by The Arbutus Community Association, Inc., a body corporate, and The Halethorpe Improvement Association, Inc., a body corporate, their successors and assigns, and the other parties of the first part hereto, their heirs and assigns, the owners of the properties located in the vicinity of said tracts, their heirs, successors and assigns, for a period of twenty-six years from the date of recording hereof. The restrictions set forth in this Agreement may be terminated, altered, or amended, by a subsequent agreement signed by party of the second part, his heirs, successors and assigns, and all of the parties of the first part, their heirs, successors and assigns, and all of the parties of the first part, their heirs,

THE PARTIES OF THE FIRST PART AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. That an appeal presently filed before the Board of Appeals

for Ealtimore County pertaining to Parcel No. 1 on "Exhibit No.1" and also known as parcels numbers A and B on "Exhibit No.2" and more particularly described on page 4 of the within agreement, shall be dismissed with prejudice and the Order of Dismissal signed by all counsel of record for the Appellants in the proceeding now pending will be turned over subsequent to execution of this Agreement and prior to recording thereof.

- 2. This Agreement contains the entire understanding between the parties and each of the parties hereto warrant that it has carefully read and understands this Agreement and is cognizant of the terms thereof and has had ample time to have it fully explained by counsel of their own choosing of their respective rights and obligations with respect to all matters involved in this Agreement.
- 3. All the agreements, covenants, restrictions and conditions contained in this instrument shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the heirs, successors and assigns of the parties hereto, as well as all subordinate and successor mortgagees and all purchasers at foreclosure under any mortgage or deed of trust, and all persons claiming by or through them or any of them, shall run with the land and be binding upon the property hereinbefore described.
- 4. The failure to enforce any of the covenants, restrictions and conditions herein contained, in any instance, shall in no event constitute a waiver or estoppel of the right to enforce the same or any other covenant, restriction or conditions in the event of another violation occurring prior or subsequent thereto. Moreover, in the event any one or more of the covenants, restrictions, and conditions herein contained should for any reason be declared invalid, the remaining covenants, restrictions and conditions shall continue in full force and effect.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Petitioner herein requests a special hearing to approve the use of the subject property for a service garage and determine the requirements of Section 253.2.B.3 as they relate to a "Planned Industrial Park"; a special exception to use the subject property as a service garage; and a variance to permit a service garage in a Planned Industrial Park of less than 25 acres, as more particularly described in Petitioner's Exhibit 1.

The Petitioner, by Anthony E. Julio, Vice President, appeared, testified and was represented by S. Eric DiNenna, Esquire. Also appearing on behalf of the Petitions were James Matis with George W. Stephens, Jr. & Associates, Inc., and Edward C. Thomas. Appearing as Protestants in the matter were Ron Barrett, Verna D. Miller, and Maurice F. Cavey.

Testimony indicated that the subject property, known as 1589 Sulphur Spring Road, is located within the Arbutus Business Center of which 19.34 acres are zoned M.L. and .56 acres are zoned D.R. 16. Said property, formerly known as the Sulphur Spring West Business Center, received CRG approval on May 24, 1984. The originally approved plan has since been modified and developed pursuant to County approval in accordance with Petitioner's Exhibit 1. Petitioners are desirous of leasing 20,887 sq.ft. of an Existing Building E to Fleet Services, Inc. for purposes of establishing a service garage on the property. Mr. Thomas testified that Fleet Services, Inc. has been in business since approximately 1972 and performs mechanical repairs on trucks owned by various companies. He testified that no body or fender work is done and that no services are provided for trucks owned by individuals. Mr. Thomas indicated that Fleet Services, Inc. has chosen the subject site due to the fact that it currently services many clients who have businesses in the Arbutus Business Center. He introduced as Petitioner's Exhibit 4 a list of the company's current clients. Mr. Thomas further testified that he has had discussions with numerous prospective clients in the Arbutus area to confirm the need for their services and to support its position that the services rendered by the garage will serve primarily the industrial uses and related activities in the surrounding industrial park. Mr. Thomas indicated that the company will continue its business operations out of 2848 Annapolis Road to serve its other clients not based in the Arbutus area. Mr. Thomas testified that there would has no outside storage of damaged or disabled vehicles. He testified that 80% of the business is the repair of medium and small delivery trucks on a daily business. Further, due to the nature of the need for the vehicles, the vehicles are usually picked up on the same day as serviced. In response to the Office of Planning's comments regarding restrictions to be imposed, Mr. Thomas indicated that all were acceptable except that the hours of operation needed by him would be 7:00 AM to 6:00

James Matis testified that the subject property is located directly across from Sulphur Spring Business Center East and is separated by Interstate 95. Testimony indicated that both business centers are controlled by common ownership. Petitioner argued that the requirements of Section 253.2.B. of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) are

Further, Mr. Matis contends the granting of the variance will not result in any detriment to the health. safety or general welfare of the surrounding community. Testimony indicated that there is no direct access to an arterial street, that access to the service garage will be the same as for the entire property through the interior parking lot off of Sulphur Spring Road, which is a Class I Commercial Motorway. In consideration of the testimony and evidence presented, it is clear that practical difficulty or unreasonable hardship would result if the relief requested in the special hearing were not granted. In the opinion of the Deputy Zoning Commissioner, all the requirements of Section 253.2B3 have been met, except for the acreage requirement, for which a variance has been requested and was addressed by Petitioner.

It is clear that the B.C.Z.R. permits the use proposed in an M.L. zone by special exception. It is equally clear that the proposed use would not be detrimental to the primary uses in the vicinity. Therefore, it must be determined if the conditions as delineated in Section 502.1 are

The Petitioner had the burden of adducing testimony and evidence which would show that the proposed use met the prescribed standards and requirements set forth in Section 502.1 of the B.C.Z.R. The Petitioner has shown that the proposed use would be conducted without real detriment to the neighborhood and would not adversely affect, the public interest. The facts and circumstances do not show that the proposed use at the particular location described by Petitioner's Exhibit 1 would have any adverse impact above and beyond that inherently associated with such a special excertion use, irrespective of its location within the zone. Schultz v. Pritts. 432 A.2d 1319 (1981).

The proposed use will not be detrimental to the health, safety, or general welfare of the locality, nor tend to create congestion in roads, streets, or alleys therein, nor be inconsistent with the purposes of the property's zoning classification, nor in any other way be inconsistent with the spirit and intent of the B.C.Z.R.

After reviewing all of the testimony and evidence presented, it appears that the special exception should be granted with certain restrictions as more fully described below.

An area variance may be granted where strict application of the zoning regulations would cause practical difficulty to the Petitioner and his property. McLean v. Soley, 270 Md. 208 (1973). To prove practical difficulty for an area variance, the Petitioner must meet the following:

> 1) whether strict compliance with requirement would unreasonably prevent the use of the property for a permitted purpose or render conformance unnecessarily burdensome:

> 2) whether the grant would do substantial injustice to applicant as well as other property owners in the district or whether a lesser relaxation than that applied for would give substantial relief; and

> 3) whether relief can be granted in such fashion that the spirit of the ordinance will be observed and public safety and welfare secured.

Anderson v. Bd. of Appeals, Town of Chesapeake Beach, 22 Md. App. 28

It is clear from the testimony that if the variance is granted, such use as proposed would not be contrary to the spirit of the B.C.Z.R. and general welfare.

4) There shall be no painting, or body and fender work performed on the premises.

5) There shall be no outside storage of damaged or

6) All lighting for the subject property shall be directed in such a manner as to deflect away from any adjoining residential properties.

7) Compliance with the comments submitted by the Department of Environmental Protection and Resource Management (DEPREM), dated May 17, 1990.

8) When applying for a building permit, the site plan filed must reference this case and set forth and address the restrictions of this Order.

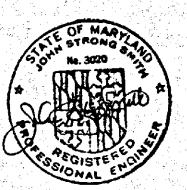

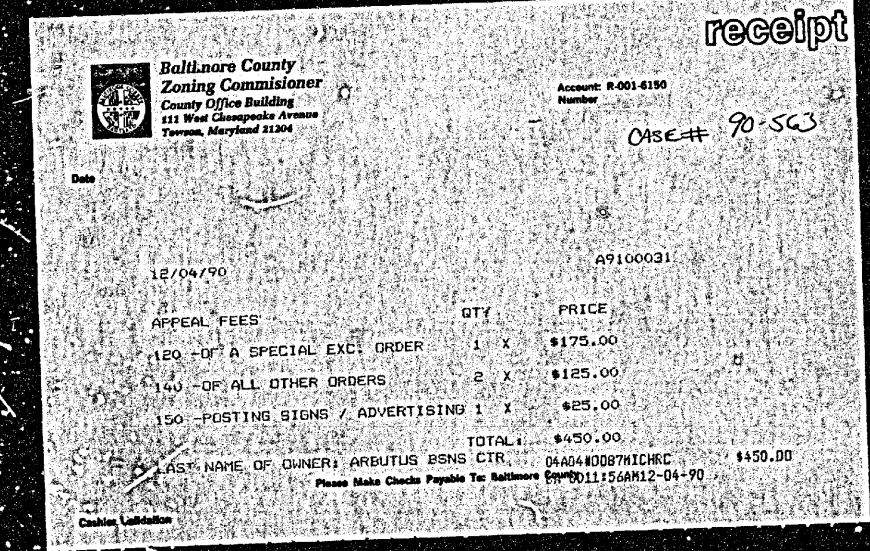

The Petitioner requests a special exception for a service garage. In reference to this request, staff offers the following

- The use is proposed to be located in a 10,800 sq. ft. leased area within the Arbutus Business Center, which is zoned M.L. and contains 19.9 acres of land, more or less. A service garage is permitted in an M.L. zone with a special exception provided that it is located "in a planned industrial park at least 25 acres in net area or in an I.M. district," and that the use "will serve primarily the industrial uses and related activities in the surrounding industrial area" (Section 253.2.B, BCZR). An "Industrial Park, Planned" is defined as "[a]n integral industrial development for which an overall plan has been approved by the Office of Planning and Zoning, and which is under common ownership or control" (Section 101,
- The tract upon which the Arbutus Business Center is located was the subject of Case No. 72-96-R, in which the Zoning Commissioner granted a reclassification from D.R.5.5 to M.L. zone on August 31, 1972. An appeal was filed on behalf of individual property owners and community associations. Prior to any hearing by the County Board of Appeals, the Appellants and the Petitioner entered into an agreement regarding the use of the site. The appeal was dismissed on April 24, 1974.

 As a part of the agreement, which was recorded in the Land Records of Baltimore County in Liber 5441, Folio 604, et seq. (attached), the Petitioner agreed to place restrictions on the development of the tract provided that a portion of it was zoned M.L. and no further appeals were taken. They agreed that the described portion "be reclassified M.L., but can only be developed within the context and intent of Sections 247 through 252 of the existing zoning regulations of Baltimore County as apply to a M.L.R. zone". They further agreed that the owners will not utilize the land for any commercial use which requires a special exception or variance..." (See 5441/609)

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Based upon the above information, this office believes that the filing of the special exception and the proposed use as a service garage are inappropriate and, therefore, the special exception should not be permitted.
