Dear Mr. Alderman:

Thank you for your very detailed letter dated November 11, 2008. You have requested my interpretation of both, the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations as well as my previous zoning decision in case No. 94-135A rendered when I was Deputy Zoning Commissioner.

In 1993, this office approved the use of this property, by your client, as "any other industrial or manufacturing use", as that use is listed and permitted in the MH zone pursuant to section 256.3 of the BCZR. At that time, I approved a variance to allow said use to be located within 150 feet of a residential zone and 0 feet from the street abutting a residential zone boundary. The use has continued on this property for the past 15 years.

On May 16, 1995, this office approved the introduction of "white goods" into the manufacturing process that was occurring on the property. This approval was given to your client by way of a spirit and intent letter written to this office and approved by Mr. John J. Lewis on behalf of Mr. Arnold Jablon, then Director. This approval was issued after consultation with me in my previous position as Deputy Zoning Commissioner.

At this time, your client is requesting approval to introduce into the manufacturing process, additional scrap metal in the form of stripped automobile bodies. You have described the manner by which these materials are processed in your letter dated November 11, 2008. I have also gained a better understanding of this scrap metal processing by my site visits to the property and through a meeting held in my office between members of my staff, yourself and representatives from Recovermat Mid-Atlantic, LLC.

It is my opinion, based on the aforementioned, that the introduction of additional scrap metal in the form of stripped automobile bodies, (as described in your letter) is within the spirit and intent of my previous zoning decision and falls within the category of "Any other industrial or manufacturing use", as specified in section 256.3 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations.

The introduction of this additional type of scrap material, given its size and bulk, causes me to impose additional conditions and restrictions upon this use. I shall require that all automobile bodies/hulks shall be processed within 48 hours from the time they arrive on site. Any scrap bodies/hulks not so processed within that time frame shall be removed from the premises. There shall also be a height limitation on the stockpiling of the scrap bodies/hulks. In no event shall the stacking of this material exceed 35 feet.

Finally, there needs to be additional landscaping and screening on the property, particularly in the area of the property where there once existed a row of mature willow trees. This area of the property, which is now devoid of natural vegetation, is the northern property line of the property and which has its common boundary line with property recently being developed into a new industrial park. Given the bulk and size of this new material, simple pine trees will not provide an appropriate screen. This applicant will have to provide a substantial landscape screen such as tall fencing in conjunction with evergreen trees. Over time, the trees will fill in to provide a nice visual barrier. However, at this time I believe it is appropriate to provide both a fence and evergreen plantings. Accordingly, the applicant shall meet with Avery Harden of my office to work out the details and timing for the installation of this screening.

In addition to the aforementioned, the applicant shall be required to obtain any and all other necessary Federal, State and local permits as are required to perform this function on their property. I represent Recovermat Mid-Atlantic, LLC, owner and operator of the above-referenced property which is presently zoned MH-IM. Recovernat is the continuing legal entity that grew out of Percontee, Inc. The purpose of this letter is to request an informal determination by your Department that the continuing manufacturing uses, including processing and recycling of materials, conform with prior approvals for this property and the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations as now adopted.

In 1993, when you were sitting as the Deputy Zoning Commissioner for Baltimore County. you approved a variance to permit a manufacturing use located on this property within 150 feet of a residential zone and 0 feet from the street abutting a residential zone boundary. Your Order, in Case No. 94-135-A, described the proposed use as taking construction and demolition debris earmarked for landfills and convert them into useable materials "thereby saving landfill space and preserving our environment." The issue in that case was whether or not a variance from otherwise applicable setback requirements from residential areas should be granted for a manufacturing use on the subject property. That variance was granted, was not appealed and runs with the land on which it was granted.

Several years later, the owner requested a similar informal determination that the stream of products to be processed and recycled include land clearing debris and metal, described as "white goods." A favorable determination was given, subject to the condition that white goods and/or debris not be stored on the property for more than five (5) days and that the condition be reflected on all future SWPF Permit Plans.

Since 1995 construction/demolition and land clearing debris, as well as a wide variety of metals have been processed at the subject property in accordance with the limited storage condition and all applicable permits. Those permits have included a Baltimore County Solid Waste Processing Facility Permit, a MDE Refuse Disposal Permit, and a MDE State Permit to Operate. MDE was the applicable State regulating authority as no automobiles were being processed.

All materials are delivered to the site by truck or individual automobile. The materials are processed by loading them onto a conveyor belt which leads to a super heavy duty wet system, hammermill shredder. After shredding the debris and metals, the ferrous metals are shipped by truck to mills that purchased the shredded metal and the shredder residue shipped by truck for daily cover at landfills. Materials that are not processed pursuant to specific MDE permit conditions included but were not limited to controlled dangerous substances, infectious or special medical wastes, radioactive materials and oil contaminated soil. Additionally, MDE did not permit the processing of automobiles as the processing of those materials is governed strictly by the Motor Vehicle Administration of the State Department of Transportation.

With the decreasing availability of construction/demolition and land clearing debris, the owner requested a modification of the existing permits for the processing of only scrap metals including automobiles. The MVA has strict controls in place for acceptance and processing of automobiles. Unless an automobile is more than eight years old, the person presenting the automobile must have evidence of title, satisfactory to the owner and the MVA. The automobiles must be free from gasoline tanks, refrigerant and batteries, etc.; in other words, a scrap automobile hulk.

The MDE Refuse Disposal Permit has been placed on hold due to the issuance of the Scrap Processor permit by the MVA. The MDE State Permit to Operate is being reviewed for compliance regarding air quality emissions associated with automobiles being introduced into the feedstock. The owner's experience has proved at its other processing facilities that associated noise and air emissions are far less when processing predominantly metal than with the processing of construction/demolition and land clearing debris.

The automobile hulks and acceptable metals are delivered to the property by individuals and corporate vendors, in exactly the same manner as the construction/demolition and land clearing debris and white metals. They are then loaded onto the conveyor and processed through the same hammermill shredder, with the shredder output separated into ferrous materials and the nonferrous materials. The nonferrous materials, from shredding predominantly metals and automobiles, will be trucked to another facility to extract the valuable nonferrous metals from the residue before taking it to landfills. At present, the ferrous materials are shipped via trucks or rail cars for delivery to steel mills. The owner is presently working with CSX Transportation to reactivate the pre-existing rail spur to the subject property. If those efforts are successful, railroad cars owned by Recovermat's parent company will be loaded with the ferrous materials for shipment from the property.

Mr. Kotroco, you have visited the property and viewed, first-hand, the existing processing

operations, other than the processing of automobile hulks. The surface of the property, specifically all areas of the storage/stacking of materials and the processing operations, is impervious, directing all water to an on-site collection area which is then used in the processing operation. Subsequently, in a meeting in your offices, our client described how the material processing operation would continue in the same manner, but including automobile hulks. Automobile hulks will not remain on the property for more than 48 hours. If, due to machine maintenance or repair that processing time cannot be maintained, those automobile hulks will be removed to the owner's other processing facility in Capitol Heights, Maryland.

It has been suggested by some of our client's competitors that a "junkyard" is being operated on the property. The property is not used for the storage or retail sale of scrap, junk or unlicensed/inoperative motor vehicles or parts. There is no dismantling of vehicles; our client receives the hulk of already dismantled vehicles for processing into reusable materials. No retail sales are conducted on the property. Rather, materials are purchased by our client for use in its processing operations. As noted above and described in our recent meeting, that purchasing is done selectively and excludes materials such as metal funeral urns, beer kegs, catalytic converters, etc. The scrap materials purchased by our client for use in its processing operations are specifically excluded from the BCZR definition of junkyard.

We are, therefore, requesting your informal determination that the long-term processing operations that have been employed on the property since 1994 and the proposed processing of automobile hulks and similar metals as permitted and approved by the State of Maryland conform with prior approvals for this property and the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations as now adopted.

In preparing your response to this request, should you or your staff need any additional information or further clarification of any aspect of the processing operations that have and will continue to occur on this property, please do not hesitate to contact me.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAN

This matter comes before the Deputy Zoning Commissioner as a Petition for Variance filed by the owner of the subject property, Iron City Sash and Door, by Paul T. Slaysman, and the Contract Purchaser, Percontee, Inc., by Medda Gudelsky. The Petitioners seek relief from Section 256.3 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) to permit a manufacturing use within 150 feet of a residential zone (said residential zone property being part of the Patapsco State Park) and extending to the centerline of the abutting Harbor Tunnel Thruway, in lieu of the required 1,000 feet; from Section 256.5 of the B.C.Z.R. to permit said manufacturing use to be located 0 feet from the street abutting a residential zone boundary, in lieu of the required 150 feet; and from Section 256.5 of the B.C.Z.R. to permit said manufacturing use to be located within 0 feet of the Harbor Tunnel Thruway right-of-way adjacent to the site and without the necessity of screening same from the motorway, all as more particularly described on Petitioner's Exhibit

Appearing on behalf of the Petition were Claude E. Vannoy and Jonathan Genn on behalf of Percontee, Inc., the Contract Purchaser. Also appearing on behalf of the Petitioner were Donald S. Hawkins, on behalf of the Halethorpe Civic Association, Mark Weber, Professional Engineer who prepared the site plan for the subject property, William Bukevicz with

Dewberry and Davis, Tom Sadowski on behalf of the Baltimore County Economic Development Commission (EDC), and Wes Guckert with The Traffic Group. The Petitioners were represented by Robert W. Cannon, Esquire. There were no Protestants present at the hearing; however, after the hearing, Mr. Hal Benson, a representative of the Maryland Citizens for the Environment (MCFTE), appeared to voice his opposition.

At the onset of the hearing, Counsel for the Petitioner amended the Petition to strike the third variance request as set forth above. Accordingly, the Petition was amended to eliminate the third request and the hearing proceeded on the remaining requests.

Testimony indicated that the subject property, known as 2202 Halethorpe Farm Road, consists of 8.54 acres zoned MH-IM and is unimproved. Said property is located in a heavy industrial area adjacent to the Harbor Tunnel Thruway. The Petitioner is desirous of developing the site with a recycling facility. Said facility would take demolition and construction materials and convert same into a useable product. On behalf of the Petitioners, Mr. Cannon proffered that the end product resulting from this recycling process would be utilized as a landfill cover. He stated that at the end of each day, State law requires that trash and debris which have been added to landfills be covered with a material. At the present time, landfill operations cover the daily deposit of trash and debris with dirt which often must be purchased. The recycling process at the proposed facility would take construction and demolition debris earmarked for landfills and convert same into a useable cover which can be utilized at the end of each day at the various landfills located around the Baltimore Metropolitan area. In essence, this process would take regular waste

products and convert same into a useable material thereby saving landfill space and preserving our environment

The proffered testimony further revealed that the nearest residence is actually over 1,000 feet from the subject site; however, the residential zone line runs along the Harbor Tunnel Thruway south of the subject site. While this residentially zoned land is part of the Patapaco State Park property and has no development associated therewith, it does remain zoned D.R.1 and therefore, the requested variance is necessary.

As noted previously, Mr. Hal Benson of the Maryland Citizens for the Environment, Inc., appeared to voice his objection to the proposed project. Mr. Benson was delayed in making an appearance at the hearing for traffic reasons and did not actually appear to offer testimony. I advised Mr. Benson to submit a letter outlining his concerns and that I would include his letter in the file. By letter dated December 9, 1993, Mr. Benson submitted a list of various environmental adjectives which he felt may be compromised by the use proposed. It should be noted that while Mr. Benson's letter was included in the file, I did not include the letter as evidence in the case since the hearing was concluded. Furthermore, Mr. Benson's concerns about this project were directed towards the recycling process iteself and not necessarily the grant of this variance request. In the opinion of this Deputy Zoning Commissioner, the testimony was clear that there would be no substantial impact upon the health, safety or general welfare of surrounding uses if the variances requested were granted. Furthermore, it should be noted that there were no adverse comments submitted by any County agency as to the use proposed, including the Department of Environmental Protection and Resource Management (DEPRM)

An area variance may be granted where strict application of the zoning regulations would cause practical difficulty to the Petitioner and his property. McLean v. Soley, 270 Md. 208 (1973). To prove practical difficulty for an area variance, the Petitioner must meet the following:

- whether strict compliance with requirement would unreasonably prevent the use of the property for a permitted purpose or render conformance unnecessarily burdensome;
- 2) whether the grant would do substantial injustice to applicant as well as other property owners in the district or whether a lesser relaxation than that applied for would give substantial relief; and
- 3) whether relief can be granted in such fashion that the spirit of the ordinance will be observed and public safety and welfare secured.

Anderson v. Bd. of Appeals, Town of Chesapeake Beach, 77 Md. App. 78

it is clear from the testimony that if the variance is granted, such use, as proposed, will not be contrary to the spirit of the R.C.Z.R. and will not result in any injury to the public good.

After due consideration of the testimony and evidence presented, it is clear that practical difficulty or unreasonable hardship will remain if the variance is not granted. It has been established that special circumstances or conditions exist that are peculiar to the land or stme ture which is the subject of this variance request and that the requirements from which the Petitioner seeks relief will undaily restrict. The use of the land due to the special conditions unique to this particular parcel addition, the variance requested will not cause any injury to the public health, safety or general welfare. Further, the granting of the Peti tioner's request is in strict harmony with the spirit and intent of the

Land Clearing Debris

The request to include land clearing debris arises because it has been used as an incoming product in the production of the Recovermat landfill cover. During the State Solid Waste Permit process from the application until its issuance, discussions took place with representatives of the State from time-to-time. At one time, Percontee representatives were advised that land clearing debris would not be included in the State Permit. 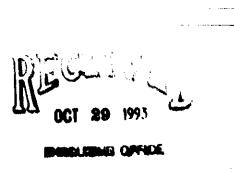

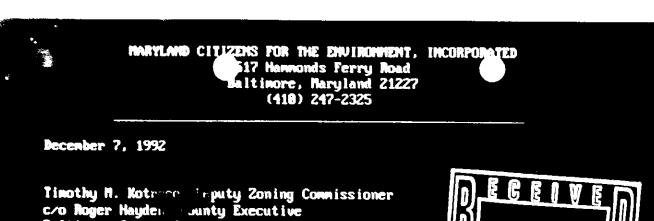

Currently, Baltimore County experiences and "clean-up" expenses associated with solid waste management include the Parkton Landfill and the Granite Stump Dump. Because of Baltimore County's past experiences, and the burden upon public funds for environmental "clean-up" and liability, we encourage you to apply appropriate and reasonable deed restrictions, special conditions, and dedicate performance bond fund requirements on any and all administration regulatory "approvals" provided to Percontee, Incorporated. The imposition of deed restrictions, special conditions, and a performance bond requirement will provide:

- Some level of health, safety and welfare protection for existing and future Baltimore County residents and government administrations.
- 2. Consistency with Baltimore County's Office of E to Development projections of monetary and employabenefits to the councilmanic First District.
- Dedicated private industrial funds to ensure environmental, administrative and criminal compliance for an experimental and "unregulated / unapproved" process and product.

- 4. A denonstration of environmental sensitivity commitment enforcement and compliance to the community by our elected, appointed and existing government officials.
- Am opportunity to Percontee, Incorporated to extend a "show of good faith and commitment" to the existing neighborhoods as well as the current Baltimore County administration.
- 6. An incentive to Percontee, INC. to initiate and execute long-term contracts with ultimate disposal sites willing to accept their solid waste product. Currently, Percontee and Baltimore County Economic Development is proposing transporting and processing 100 tons per day of solid waste into this community. Neither Percontee, Inc nor Baltimore County Economic Development have identified neither a municipal solid waste landfill or hazardous waste site to accept Percontee's product. If you bring 100 tons into this neighborhood every day, you need to export 100 tons every day, neither Percontee nor Economic Development have adequately addressed this issue.

Content in a Percontee's plea for a zoning variance to locate in a demonstration:

1. Although this request now appears a simple regulatory and administrative "housekeeping" effort, we MUST remind you that Baltimore County received federal disaster funds to purchase private residential properties and relocate families away for harms' way associated with flooding in the lower Patapsco River area. Percontee's intention to pave critical adsorption areas near the lower Patapsco River appears inconsistent with federal and state flood control efforts.
