FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter comes before this Deputy Zoning Commissioner as a Petition for Special Exception and Petition for Special Hearing filed by Crondall Corners Associates, LLC, legal owner of the subject property, ("Petitioner"), located at the northeast corner of Owings Mills Boulevard and Crondall Lane. This property is developed as an existing retail center known as Crondall Corner. The Petitioner has requested approval of a special exception for an interactive children's commercial recreational facility, to be known as Play Garden, under Section 253.2.D.4 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) and to confirm, in accordance with B.C.Z.R., Section 409.6, that the parking requirement for the proposed commercial recreational facility may be calculated at 5 spaces per 1,000 sq. ft. of gross floor area.

At the hearing before the Deputy Zoning Commissioner, Patricia A. Malone, Esquire appeared as the attorney for the Petitioner. Also appearing on behalf of the Petitioner were William Berman. representative of Crondall Corner Associates, LLC, owner of the subject property, Elaine Colletta. lessee, and Kenneth Colbert, professional engineer who prepared the site plan filed in this case accepted into evidence as Petitioner's Exhibit No. 1.

Testimony and evidence indicated that the property consists of a gross area of approximately 5.32 acres, zoned ML-IM. The property is improved with a 25,020 sq. ft. retail center containing a variety of commercial uses, including personal services and restaurant uses. The Petitions were filed by the Petitioner on behalf of Elaine Colletta, who is interested in leasing 4,800 sq. ft. of space

2000 ROSS TON ALING 2000 11/14/99 within the existing retail center on the subject property, as shown on the site plan. In this space, Ms. Colletta proposes to open an interactive children's recreation center, to be known as Play Garden, for children ages 1-7. The center will consist of designated areas for learning and play activities, including an area devoted to sand box play, a construction area with blocks, a play restaurant/food store area, and an art area. The center will also have a small café for coffee, soft drinks, and light snacks, and a room reserved for children's parties with a capacity of 30 persons. There will be no video or arcade games on the premises.

Ms. Colletta described the anticipated operation of the center with peak times being Saturday and Sunday when a majority of the children's parties can be expected to be scheduled coinciding with the center being open to the public. Ms. Colletta estimated that between 60-80 children could be expected during peak times. Ms. Colletta also testified that, based on her experience, on average, there is usually one adult driver for every two children. Therefore, at its busiest times, the center can expect to generate a need for 30-40 parking spaces. At non-peak times for Play Garden, weekdays and weekday nights, Ms. Colletta anticipated that approximately 30-40 children could be expected at the center at any given time, which would generate a need for 15-20 parking spaces. Ms. Colletta is proposing to provide 24 spaces or 5 spaces per 1,000 sq. ft. of gross floor area.

Ms. Colletta testified that, if approved, she believed that Play Garden would be an asset to the community and would serve a population (age 1 to 7) that, theretofore, has been underserved. There are limited opportunities, especially during the winter months, for children of this age to participate in such learning and play activities, and this facility would provide such an opportunity. Ms. Colletta further stated that the children's center would have no adverse impact on the surrounding community or the tenants or customers of Crondall corner. In fact, based upon her discussions with the tenants and members of the community who were polled, everyone has been supportive of the proposed use.

The proffered testimony of Mr. Berman, representative of Crondall Corner Associates, LLC, identified current makeup of tenants in the retail center and the usage of the parking spaces by those tenants and their customers. The peak times for the Play Garden are weekend days which are actually non-peak times for the retail center as a whole. The testimony confirmed that, at these peak times, many of the parking spaces at the center would be open and available for customers of the Play Garden. Therefore, it is his opinion that the parking provided at Crondall Corner is sufficient for all uses, including Play Garden, and that the addition of this use would have no adverse impact on Crondall Corner's other tenants and customers or the surrounding community.

The proffered testimony of Mr. Colbert, engineer, identified the existing site conditions and the parking requirements, based on the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations. Mr. Colbert is familiar with Crondall Corner both from personal experience and from former representation of the Petitioner. It was proffered that, even with the proposed use, the center had sufficient parking spaces to serve its tenants and customers and that 5 spaces per 1,000 sq. ft. of gross floor area would be a reasonable and sufficient requirement for this use. Furthermore, the proffered testimony of Mr. Colbert indicated that the special exception requirements contained in B.C.Z.R., Section 502.1 have, in fact, been satisfied.

With this testimony in mind, I have reviewed the criteria stated in B.C.Z.R., Section 502.1, and I find that the proposed use satisfies each of the criteria outlined in that section. Therefore, I will grant the Petition for Special Exception to approve the proposed use as a commercial recreational facility under B.C.Z.R., Section 253.2.D.4. Further, having reviewed B.C.Z.R., Section 409.6 and having heard the testimony from the Petitioner's witnesses, I will grant the Petition for Special Hearing and rule that the parking requirements for the proposed use (commercial recreational facility) may properly be calculated at 5 spaces per 1,000 sq. ft. of gross floor area.

Pursuant to the advertising, posting of the property, and public hearing on this Petition, and for the reasons set forth above, the requested variance should be granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED by the Deputy Zoning Commissioner for Baltimore County this 16th day of November, 1999 that:

- (1) the Petitioner for Special Exception to approve an interactive children's recreational center as a commercial recreational facility under Section 253.2.D.4 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.), be and is hereby GRANTED;
- (2) the Petition for Special Hearing to confirm, in accordance with B.C.Z.R., Section 409.6, that the parking requirement for the proposed commercial recreational facility may be calculated at 5 spaces per 1,000 sq. ft. of gross floor area, be and is hereby GRANTED, subject to the following restriction:

The Petitioner may apply for building permits and be granted same upon receipt of this Order; however, Petitioner is hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at its own risk until such time as the 30 day appellate process from this Order has expired. If, for whatever reason, this Order is reversed, the relief granted herein shall be rescinded.

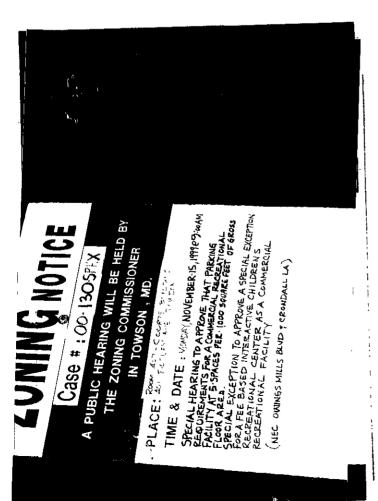

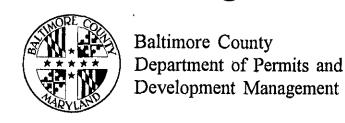

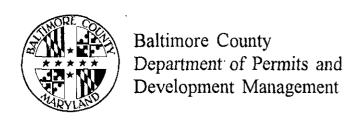
