#### FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter comes before this Zoning Commissioner for consideration of a Petition for Special Hearing filed by the owners of the subject property, Patrick and Susan Meadowcroft, through their attorney, Howard L. Alderman, Jr., Esquire. The Petitioners request a special hearing to approve the use of the building on the subject property as a legal, nonconforming two-apartment dwelling. The subject property and relief sought are more particularly described on the site plan submitted which was accepted into evidence and marked as Petitioner's Exhibit 1.

Appearing at the requisite public hearing in support of the request were Patrick Meadowcroft, property owner, his daughter, Lyda Swartz, Eugene F. Raphel, Professional Land Surveyor who prepared the site plan for this property, and Howard L. Alderman, Jr., Esquire, attorney for the Petitioners. In addition, Janice Staples appeared on behalf of the Maryland Line Area Association, Inc. in support of the request. Appearing as Protestants in the matter were Alphonse J. Wissman, Bonnie Herwig, George W. Lacey, and Robert E. Schatz, nearby residents of the area.

Testimony and evidence offered revealed that the subject property consists of a gross area of 4.458 acres, more or less, zoned R.C.5, and is improved with two structures, one a barn containing two apartments, and the other, a combined barn/shed building which is used for storage purposes. Testimony indicated that Mr. Meadowcroft has owned the subject property for the past 25 years. He indicated that he formerly resided on the property in one of the apartments and that

his nephew occupied the second apartment. Further testimony revealed that one apartment contains two bedrooms, a kitchen, a living room and a bath, while the other apartment contains a kitchen, a bath, and three bedrooms. Mr. Meadowcroft seeks approval of the two apartments as inlaw apartments.

In-law apartments in the R.C.5 zone are not specifically provided for in the B.C.Z.R. However, Section 1A04.2 thereof lists those uses which are permitted as of right in that zone. Among the uses so identified are, "dwellings, one-family attached." Additionally, "family" is defined in the B.C.Z.R. as "Any number of individuals <u>lawfully</u> living together as a single housekeeping unit and doing their cooking on the premises, as distinguished from a group occupying a boarding or rooming house or hotel." (emphasis added) The use of the word "lawfully" has been held to imply that the individuals are related by blood or marriage. Finally, Section 500.7 of the B.C.Z.R. empowers the Zoning Commissioner to conduct hearings as might be necessary to properly enforce or interpret the B.C.Z.R. From these Sections, it has been held that an "in-law apartment" is permitted in the R.C. zone. That is, two separate apartments within a single structure may exist for so long as the individuals residing therein are related by blood or marriage.

In this case, the Petitioners seek approval of the two apartments as in-law apartments. Mr. Meadowcroft testified that the property has been so used in the past. Although the prior use of the apartments is disputed by the neighbors, they apparently do not object to the approval of an in-law apartment. That is, for so long as the apartments are occupied by members of the same family, there is no objection.

Based upon the testimony and evidence presented, I am persuaded to grant relief so as to permit an in-law apartment on the subject property. That is, the Petitioners may maintain two apartments within the dwelling building; however, the occupants must be related to one another either by blood or marriage. A reasonable degree of relationship is required and to insure that the premises are used in that fashion, appropriate restrictions will be imposed hereinafter.

Pursuant to the advertisement, posting of the property, and public hearing on this Petition held, and for the reasons set forth above, the relief requested shall be granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED by the Zoning Commissioner for Baltimore County day of October, 2000 that the Petition for Special Hearing seeking approval of the use of the building on the subject property as a legal, nonconforming two-apartment dwelling (or, inlaw apartment), in accordance with Petitioner's Exhibit 1, be and is hereby GRANTED, subject to the following restrictions:

- 1) The Petitioners are hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at their own risk until the 30-day appeal period from the date of this Order has expired. If an appeal is filed and this Order is reversed, the relief granted herein shall be rescinded.
- 2) The relief granted herein is limited to the use of the existing dwelling structure as an in-law apartment containing two separate living units. The combination barn/shed structure cannot be used for residential purposes or as a dwelling. Moreover, the two apartments can only be occupied by related individuals.
- 3) The property owner and/or residents of the apartments shall permit access by a Zoning Inspector, upon request, to insure compliance with this Order.

4) When applying for any permits, the site plan filed must reference this case and set forth and address the restrictions of this Order.

Dear Zoning Commissioner of Baltimore County:

My family and I moved to Parkton four years ago after buying our land and building our dream house. When we bought our land we were told it was for a single family dwelling and the surrounding area the same way. Since this is what we wanted we invested a considerable amount of time and money into building our HOME. When we finally moved in we had to show proof of ownership at Hereford High School to get our children enrolled there because of the over crowding of the school system.

What the Meadowcrofts did was illegal when they moved out and rented to three families to make money. They knew it was illegal when they did it and if someone had not complained to the Zoning Commission. They would still be getting away with it.

Since these families had moved in there have been large parties outside with live bands, packing of over fifty cars on the property and on the small road (Kauffman), causing noise violations, parking violations, alcohol violations and numerous drunk drivers who left the party on more than one occasion. The Baltimore County Police had to be called to quieted the disturbance. Days after the party the property looks like the parking lot of Rayen's Stadium after the tail gate parties.

Beside this: if allowed other families may take this as a sign of weakness to our zoning rules and regulations and rent out their house to numerous families. Multi apartment dwelling will pose a burden on our already overcrowded schools, the water system, local roadways, trash collection and the very limited police and fire protection that we now have. Multi family homes have a negative effect on property value and most of us moved out here to get away from the city type of life.

Most apartment properties are run by absentee Landlords which is the case of this property. As usually shown by the run down condition of the building and property itself. County crime will increase with the influence of more rental property as it has in every other part of the county.

The foremost outrage of this hearing is that what was done was illegal and the owner knew it was illegal and now that he was caught he wants an exception to the rule.

I hope you do not give him this exception and allow us to live in peace as we are law abiding

The Maryland Area Association, Inc. wishes to go on record as favoring granting the relief requested in the four Special Hearing Cases referenced above.

All four of the cases involve buildings which have had apartments leased before the present owners acquired them twenty years ago.

The two buildings on York Road are in the village of Maryland Line and are on the Maryland Historic Trust Inventory of Historic Buildings. The building on Freeland Road is the former Post Office and General Store in the village of Freeland. The oldest residents in the area cannot remember when there were not three apartments in each of these buildings.

The Maryland Line Area Association is concerned with the preservation of historic sites and buildings, and we believe that having them in use as apartments assures their upkeep and preservation.

The building on Kaufman Road has had apartments that were originally used by the owner's parents for nearly twenty years. The Parents are now deceased, and the owner wants to turn it over to his son and nephew for two family accessory apartments.

It has been a long standing custom in rural Northern Baltimore County many years before the advent of zoning and occupancy permits to rent out space in the house or barn as apartments for young families, elderly former farm workers, elderly parents, or school teachers. The practice has been a good one in most cases and there is no compelling reason to stop it despite new regulations which should apply to new buildings.
