FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter comes before this Deputy Zoning Commissioner as a Petition for Special Hearing filed by the legal owners of the subject property, Merritt-002, LLC and the lessee of the property, The New Mark of Excellence School, Inc. The special hearing request involves property located at 2605 Rolling Road, which property is zoned ML-IM. This special hearing request is to approve the use of the subject property by The New Mark of Excellence School, Inc. as a non-public business or trade school.

Appearing at the hearing on behalf of the special hearing request were Beverly Davis, the proprietor of the school in question and Douglas N. Silber, attorney at law, representing the Petitioner. Appearing in support of the Petitioner's request for special hearing were several of the students who attend the school in question and their parents. Faculty of the school were also present. There were no protestants in attendance.

Testimony and evidence indicated that Ms. Davis founded "The New Mark of Excellence School" in 1994 Ms. Davis is a highly qualified and accredited school administrator, having obtained her Bachelor's Degree from Morgan State University and her Master's Degree from Johns Hopkins University. She has operated The New Mark of Excellence School since 1994 until the present time. As a result of the success of her school, Ms. Davis is in need of relocating this school to the property which is the subject of this special hearing request. The property itself

is identified on Petitioner's Exhibit A, the site plan submitted into evidence. At this time, the Petitioner proposes to lease 15,100 sq. ft. of space within Building #2 as depicted on the site plan. The subject property is located on the northeast corner of the intersection of Rolling Road and Tudsbury Road in Catonsville.

Ms. Davis testified extensively regarding the curriculum that is provided by her school. The testimony clearly evidenced that The New Mark of Excellence School prepares school age children for the business world by providing a strong emphasis on computer science and the understanding of computer hardware and software systems. Mr. Lance Lucas, an instructor at the school, who himself is accredited in computer technology, testified regarding the school's curriculum and the computer training and computer repair classes that are taught at this facility. After hearing the testimony and evidence provided by Mr. Lucas, as well as Ms. Davis, I was overwhelmingly convinced that The New Mark of Excellence School is, in fact, a business or trade school and, therefore, is an appropriate use for this particular property zoned ML-IM. It certainly falls under the category of a business or trade school, which is a permitted use in the ML-IM District.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, this 30 day of May, 2002, by the Deputy Zoning Commissioner for Baltimore County, that the Special Hearing Request to approve The New Mark of Excellence School, Inc. as a non-public business or trade school, be and is hereby APPROVED.

HISTORY

The Maryland Center for Arts and Technology (MCAT) emerged out of a two-year study initiated by the Hoffberger Foundation to address the skills gap between the needs of employers and the underemployed/unemployed residents of Baltimore City. The study found a significant lack of skilled workers and indicated that Baltimore would benefit substantially from a comprehensive, industry-driven initiative to fill this gap. Subsequently, MCAT was developed and began its first class in March, 1999. To date, MCAT has achieved a graduation rate of 66%, placement outcome rate of 76%, and a 90% retention rate in both financial services and health care administration programs.

PROGRAMS AND PARTNERS

MCAT currently has three program areas, or training "tracks". Each program is a customized course in a particular industry that includes not only comprehensive work skills education but also extensive supportive services for each student.

One of the many reasons why MCAT's mission is unique is that our curricula are developed in cooperation with local corporate partners. These partnerships benefit both the students and the corporate partners by providing students with real-world work experience and by training first-class entry-level employees ready to work for the partner corporations.

FINANCIAL SERVICES – CITIFINANCIAL

MCAT began its welfare-to-work Financial Services Training Program March 1999 with Commercial Credit Company (now "CitiFinancial"), a \$17.5 billion dollar consumer lending company based in Baltimore and a subsidiary of CitiGroup. In conjunction with CitiFinancial, MCAT developed a 32-week financial services training and employment program: 16-weeks of curriculum and externship training and, for those successful in training and interviewing, an additional 16-weeks of paid, full-time work experience ("internship") at the employer's offices. The first 16-weeks implement a 640 hour curriculum that is comprised of five parts: life and job readiness skills; academic skills (applied Business English and Math); computer and data management skills; financial service industry training; and a paid, work experience activity. Graduates of Financial Services have accepted positions as administrative assistants, title typists, customer service representatives, debt collectors, client advocates, bankruptcy representatives, and asset management specialists.

HEALTH CARE ADMINISTRATION—JOHNS HOPKINS HEALTH SYSTEM & MERCY MEDICAL CENTER

In partnership with Johns Hopkins Health System and Mercy Medical Center, MCAT offered its first Health Care Administration Training Program in August 1999. This training program implements a 480-hour curriculum that is comprised of five parts: life and job readiness skills; academic skills (applied Business English and Math); computer and data management skills; customized health care administration training and, for those successful in training, an additional 8-weeks of paid, full-time work experience ("internship") at Hopkins or Mercy. Johns Hopkins Health System and Mercy Medical Center are pioneers in health care throughout the region and nationally. Graduates of MCAT's Health Care Administration program have accepted positions as patient service representatives, patient service associates, registrars, and admission service coordinators.

MANUFACTURING TECHNOLOGY / YOUTH PROGRAM – ADCOR INDUSTRIES, INC.

In March 2001, MCAT offered its first training program for at-risk young adults (aged 16 – 21). Adoor Industries is a manufacturer of beverage filling equipment, and has partnered with MCAT by hiring our young students in paid internship positions as they train, with the possibility of permanent employment upon graduation. The Manufacturing Technology Program is a 20-week course made up of four month-long modules. Prior to entering the Module I, all students are required to attend a four-week skills enhancement session to strengthen both their academic and life skills. The four modules consist of over 500 hours of customized training in Computerized Numeric Control (CNC) Machining, paid internships, student-led community service projects, and case management support services. Students who complete the program accepted positions as solders, splicers, and de-burrers.

PREPARING PROFESSIONALS

MCAT recognizes that job placement and retention begin during our initial contact with each candidate. As a result, we administer policies to assure the successful selection and preparation of our candidates. Some of these policies include:

- stringent, two-day intake which includes a formal interview and standardized math and reading tests
- 90% attendance/lateness policy
- weekly post-testing in each of the training modules
- ♦ formal 4-week, 8-week, and 16-week evaluations
- master's level case management services

MCAT's curricula promote the integration and application of both essential

professional skills and life skills. Our instructors

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ensure that the core lessons of each training component are integrated across multiple disciplines. In this way, participants experience, directly and indirectly, the complimentary importance of these skills. MCAT's comprehensive training includes:

- Dressing for Success
- ♦ Interpersonal Communication
- Extensive Keyboard & Typing Training
- ♦ MS Windows Explorer/Data & File Management Training
- · Resume writing, internet job searches, and interview skills

- Phone Skills
- ♦ Customer Service
- Business English
- ♦ Office Etiquette

Through creative learning strategies, close partnerships with employers, and company-sponsored internships, MCAT prepares and trains our participants for full-time employment with family-supporting wages, benefits and career advancement opportunities. The starting salaries for positions offered through MCAT's training programs are between \$19,500 and \$23,000 plus health, education, pension, and life insurance benefits.

Finally, MCAT understands that once a student has successfully completed one of our programs and obtained full-time employment, the retention process is a critical piece of their career development. After each class' formal graduation ceremony, MCAT staff remain in continual contact with graduates for the first year of their employment. Career development staff track each graduate's progress, provide support services should they become necessary, and keep graduates up-to-date on MCAT events and programs with an alumni newsletter.



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MAPCS FACTS

Private career schools have a long and prestigious history in the State of Maryland, with some of our schools in continuous operation since the turn of the century. Their proven performance, evidenced by growth and job placement statistics, has enabled thousands of students to graduate and to take their place as productive, tax-paying members of society.

The Maryland Association of Private Career Schools (MAPCS) established in 1970, remains a voluntary organization composed of dedicated, independent post-secondary trade, technical and business schools which are committed to promoting professionalism and equal educational opportunity through private education.

MAPCS Schools Are

- Dedicated to the job placement of their students
- Innovative, with programs of study to meet labor requirements of employers

INSTRUCTION

Training for employment is the sole objective of most Private Career Schools.
