MEMORANDUM OPINION

This matter came before the Court regarding the Petition of David F. Albright, Sr., for judicial review of the decision of The County Board of Appeals ("Board"). Respondents answered the Petitioners request. A hearing was held before this Court on August 18, 2004, at which time arguments were presented by the parties' respective counsel. This Court has reviewed all pleadings and memorandums. For the reasons set forth below, this Court finds that the Judgement of the County Board of Appeals shall be AFFIRMED.

Background

Respondent/Legal Owner Nancy Wehr Niermann/Contract Purchaser, Kevin Michels/West Wind, LLC, filed a request that the Zoning Commissioner for Baltimore County determine that the Owner's real property located at 1210 Berwick Avenue is an "undersized" lot. The Zoning Commissioner granted the requested relief on December 20, 2002. The Petitioner, David F. Albright, et al., noted a timely appeal of the Commissioner's Order to the County Board of Appeals for Baltimore County. At the de novo hearing held by the Board, the Respondents presented one expert and two lay witnesses. The Petitioner presented no testimony or evidence.

The Board issued its written Opinion on December 8, 2003, approving the subject property as an undersized lot, subject to the same 3 conditions as were contained in the Commissioner's Order. Petitioner filed this timely appeal of the Board's Opinion with this Court.

Issues Presented for Review

1. Did the Board err in approving the subject property as an undersized lot?

Scope of Review

A final decision of a county zoning board must be upheld on review if it is not premised upon an error of law and if the agency's conclusions reasonably may be based on the facts proven. The reviewing court cannot substitute its own judgment for that of the zoning board and must accept the zoning board's factual conclusions if they are based on substantial evidence and if reasoning minds could reach the same conclusion on the record. *Columbia Road Citizens' Ass'n v. Montgomery County*, 98 Md. App. 695, 698 (1994).

For purposes of judicial review, substantial evidence means more than a "scintilla of evidence" such that a reasonable person could come to more than one conclusion in such a situation, the issue to be considered is "fairly debatable: and the reviewing court may not substitute its judgment for that of the agency. *Realty Improvement Ass'n v. Sycamore Realty Co., Inc.,* 105 Md. App. 701, 714, 661 A.2d 182 (1995).

Discussion

Respondents argued that the Board correctly determined that the subject property § 304, BCZR, empowers the Board of Appeals to approve an undersized lot as buildable if it meets the three tests set forth below. In addition he asserts that they do meet the tests as required and their evidence is uncontradicted. §304.1 stipulates that:

A one-family detached or semi-detached dwelling may be erected on a lot having an area or width at the building line less than that required by the area regulations contained in these regulations if:

- A. Such lot shall have been duly recorded either by deed or in a validly approved subdivision prior to March 30, 1955;
- B. All other requirements of the height and area regulations are complied with; and
- C. The owner of the lot does not own sufficient adjoining land to conform to the width and area requirements contained in these regulations.

Petitioner argued that the subject lot is too narrow and that the area requirement calculation must not include any of the paved portion of Berwick Road. Petitioner contends that § 304 is not the correct procedure and that a building permit filing is mandatory. In addition, he argues that the fact that the lot has been vacant for many years is proof in itself that it is unbuildable.

The Board found that the subject property met the requirements for an undersized lot as indicated in 304.1, (BCZR, 1955; Bill No. 47, 1992). See County Board of Appeals decision p. 5-6. The Board, in its Opinion, held that "the law provides that if all three tests are met, the Petitioners are permitted to develop an undersized or insufficient width lot in Baltimore County."

This Court finds that the Board had sufficient evidence to support its finding. Pursuant to §304.1, the Board found that the Respondents met the first test (A) in that the subject property was established by deed recorded in Baltimore County Land Records on May 27, 1943 as evidenced by Exhibits 3,4, and 5.

In addition, the Board also found that the Respondents met the second test (B) since testimony and evidence supported the facts that the lot in question met the designated front, rear and side yard setback requirements. In addition, the Board found that Mr. Doak's expert testimony that the Respondents own the centerline of Berwick Road was persuasive. The calculations of 21,216 square feet more than meet the requirement that the lot be no less than 20,000 square feet in total area.

Finally, the Board found that the testimony and evidence was uncontradicted by the fact that the Respondents do not own sufficient adjoining land to bring the undersized lot into compliance, thus satisfying test C.

As a result, since all three tests were met, the law provides that Respondents are permitted to develop an "undersized" or insufficient width" lot in Baltimore County.

This Court finds no error in the Board's determination that the subject property meets the requirements for an undersized lot as indicated in §304.1. The Board had substantial evidence as provided by the record, exhibits, and testimony. In addition, this Court finds that reasoning minds could reasonably reach the Board's conclusion from facts in the record before the agency, and by the evidence presented.

For the reasons set forth herein, the decision of County Board of Appeals of Baltimore

County shall be **AFFIRMED**.

RESPONDENTS' MEMORANDUM

Kevin Michels and West Wind LLC, a Maryland limited liability company ("Contract Purchaser"), and the Estate of Nancy Wehr Niermann¹, ("Owner") (Contract Purchaser and Owner are referred to collectively herein as "Respondents"), by and through their undersigned legal counsel and in accordance with Maryland Rule 7-207 hereby respond to the Memorandum filed by David F. Albright, Sr., *et al* (referred to collectively hereafter as the "Protestants") in the above-captioned matter.

STATEMENT OF THE CASE

This case concerns a request filed by the Respondents that the Zoning Commissioner for Baltimore County, pursuant to the broad authority granted to him under Section 500.7 of the *Baltimore County Zoning Regulations* ("BCZR"), determine that the Owner's real property located at 1210 Berwick Avenue (the "subject property") is an

Ms. Niermann passed away earlier this year, therefore her estate is the Owner of the subject property and the proper, substituted party to this appeal.

"undersized" lot. After a full day of testimony, the Zoning Commissioner granted the requested relief by written *Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law* dated December 20, 2002 (the "Commissioners's Order"). Apparently dissatisfied with the Commissioner's determination, the Protestants noted a timely appeal of the Commissioner's Order to the County Board of Appeals for Baltimore County (the "Board"). At the *de novo* hearing held by the Board² the Respondents presented one expert and two lay witnesses and the Protestants presented no testimony or evidence whatsoever.

Based on the uncontradicted testimony and evidence of the Respondents, the Board issued its written Opinion on December 8, 2003 (the "Board's Opinion") approving the subject property as an undersized lot, subject to the same 3 conditions as were contained in the Commissioner's Order. The Protestants, again apparently dissatisfied with the decision, filed a timely appeal of the Board's Opinion with this Court.

THE EVIDENCE

Bruce E. Doak, Licensed Property Line Surveyor

The Respondents called Bruce E. Doak, a Maryland licensed Property Line Surveyor and principal at the surveying and land planning firm of Gerhold, Cross and Etzel, who was accepted as a expert, without objection, in surveying, zoning and planning

Section 501.6 of the BCZR provides, in pertinent part, that "[a]ppeals from the Zoning Commissioner shall be heard by the board of zoning appeals *de novo*."

issues. (TR. 7)³ Mr. Doak, who has visited the property numerous times, prepared the Plan to Accompany the Petition for Special Hearing depicting the subject property in the graphical manner required by the BCZR, which plan was accepted as Petitioner's Exhibit 1.⁴ (TR. 8-9) Mr. Doak testified without contradiction that the subject property as described in the title deed to the Owner is 21, 216 square feet in size. (TR. 10) The deed for the subject property calls to the centerline of Berwick Avenue, a 14 to 15 foot wide (TR. 46; 48), paved roadway maintained by Baltimore County.⁵ (TR. 22) If the portion of the subject property occupied by the publicly maintained roadway is excluded from the overall area of the subject property, the remainder is 20, 573 square feet in size. (TR. 10)

The width of the subject property parallel to the paved area of Berwick Avenue is, according to the deed, 97.34 feet. (TR. 11) Based on a current survey of the subject property, its width parallel to Berwick Avenue is 97.15 feet. (TR. 29-30)

The Deeds

The current, title deed to the Owner is dated June 18, 1990 and recorded at Liber 8522, folio 589 [Petitioners' Ex. 3]. (TR. 14-15) The "BEINGs" clause in the title deed

References to a specific page of the transcript of the proceedings before the Board will be referred to herein as (TR #).

Although they are the Respondents at this level, the Owner and Contract Purchaser were the Petitioners at the *de novo* appeal hearing held by the Board.

Compare the property of Mr. Albright *et al*. The Albright property does <u>not</u> call to the centerline but binds on a dedicated 30 foot wide right of way for Berwick Avenue in front of the Albright Property. (TR. 43; 78)

makes reference to a prior deed, dated May 21, 1974 and recorded in Liber 5448, folio 224 [Petitioners' Ex. 4]. (TR. 15) This prior deed also contains a "BEINGs" clause which references a deed dated May 27, 1943 and recorded at Liber 1288, folio 464 (TR. 16), being the deed by which the subject property was created. [Petitioners' Ex. 5] (TR. 17).

The Minimum Requirements to Construct a Home

Mr. Doak testified that BCZR Section 1B02.3C.1 sets forth the minimum setback and area requirements for a lot of ground created before 1955 and zoned DR-2⁶ to be improved with a residential dwelling. According to Mr. Doak, those minimum requirements are as follows:

Net Lot Area per Dwelling Unit: 20,000 square feet Width of Lot at Front Property Line: 100 feet

Front Yard Depth: 40 feet Rear Yard Depth: 40 feet Side Yard Width: 15 feet

(TR. 12-13)

The subject property meets all of these standards other than the minimum lot width of 100 feet. (TR. 13) The Owner does not own sufficient adjoining land to add to the subject property to have it meet the 100 foot requirement. (TR. 18)

Gross - Net Lot Area

The Owner had no role in establishing the lot lines of the subject property. (TR.

Density Residential - 2: two residential lots can be created per acre.

and Net Lot Area with respect to the BCZR.⁷ (TR. 19) In Mr. Doak's experience, Net Area is calculated by excluding any portion of property that is subject to a recorded right of way. (TR. 20) With respect to the subject property, Mr. Doak's examination of the public/land records reveals that there has never been any dedication of any portion of the subject property as a right of way for Berwick Avenue. (TR. 21) Likewise there is no separate right of way plat to evidence dedication. (TR. 22) In Mr. Doak's experience, if there is no dedicated right of way or dedicated ownership to the County and the title deed calls to the centerline of any roadway adjoining the property, the net area of a property is the same as the gross area described in the deed. (TR. 22-23). Applying the net/gross area concepts to the subject property, Mr. Doak testified without contradiction that they are the same and that the area of the subject property is 21, 116 square feet. (TR. 23)

Anticipating an issue that would be raised by the Protestants, Mr. Doak testified that the area of Berwick Avenue (a publicly maintained street) located within the deed boundaries of the subject property [from the centerline to the edge of paving along the entire frontage] is 740 square feet. Even if the 740 square feet is subtracted from the land area of the subject property, the remaining size is 20,573 square feet, well in excess of

Section 101 - Definitions of the BCZR defines Net Area as "Land area not including area of land in public streets or other fee-simple public rights-of-way."

the minimum 20,000 square feet required. (TR. 24-5)

BCZR Section 304 & Zoning Commissioner's Policy Manual

BCZR Section 304.1A⁸ has relevance to the relief requested by the Respondents. The subject property was created before March 30, 1955. (TR. 31) Other than the 100 foot lot width, the subject property meets all other height and area requirements of the BCZR. (TR. 31) The Owner does not own sufficient, adjoining land to add to the subject property to make the lot width a minimum of 100 feet. (TR. 31; 36) The Owner has not owned within the past six (6) years any adjoining property that would have permitted her to increase the lot width of the subject property to 100 feet. (TR. 36)

Mr. Doak is familiar with the Zoning Commissioner's Policy Manual ("Policy Manual") adopted as part of the Code of County Regulations. In connection with the application of BCZR § 304 to various properties, Mr. Doak consults and utilizes the portion of that Policy Manual applicable to the "Use of Undersized Single Family Lots". (TR. 35) On cross-examination, Mr. Doak noted that the Owner's mother did own property adjacent to the subject property during the period from May 21, 1974 to December 7, 1976. (TR. 66; 68)

BCZR § 304 is included in the record as Petitioner's Ex. 8 (TR. 35)

The compilation of the policies, rules and regulations of the various agencies of Baltimore County, adopted as the *Code of County Regulations* pursuant to *Baltimore County Code*, Article VIII, Section 2-416 et seq.

The relevant portion of the Policy Manual is included in the record as Petitioners' Ex. 10.

Nancy Wehr Niermann, Owner

Ms. Niermann was the owner of the subject property at the time the Petition for Special Hearing was signed. (TR. 79-80) Ms. Nierman testified, without contradiction or objection, that the subject property is located in a Ruxton neighborhood where there exists improved, residential lots ranging in size from 15,000 square feet to 33,000 square feet. (TR. 84) Ms. Niermann testified and offered photographic evidence¹¹ of the types of homes that exist in the neighborhood where the subject property is located, many of which are larger than the home proposed on the subject property. (TR. 85-92)

Kevin Michels, Builder and Member of West Wind LLC, Contract Purchaser

Mr. Michels testified that he participated in the hearing before the Zoning Commissioner and identified the proposed house plans introduced before the Commissioner as Petitioners' Ex. 4. Without objection from Protestants, those house plans were accepted by the Board¹² as those of the home to be constructed on the subject property. (TR. 100-01) Mr. Michels testified further that the proposed home will be compatible with homes in the neighborhood of the subject property. (TR. 102)

LEGAL ARGUMENT

The Board Correctly Determined that the Subject Property Meets the Requirements of BCZR Section 304

The Baltimore County Council gave broad authority to the Zoning Commissioner and the Board to "determine any rights whatsoever of such person in any property in Baltimore County insofar as they are affected by these regulations." BCZR § 500.7 (Emphasis added.) This broad authority has been recognized most recently by the Maryland Court of Appeals in the case of *Marzullo v. Kahl*, 366 Md. 158, 165 (2001). The Owner and the Contract Purchaser in this case filed a zoning Petition for Special Hearing requesting that the Zoning Commissioner approve the subject property as an undersized lot pursuant to BCZR § 304¹³.

The current codification of Section 304.1 provides:

Except as provided in Section 4A03, a one-family detached or semidetached dwelling may be erected on a lot having an area or width at the building line less than that required by the area regulations contained in these regulations if:

- A. Such lot shall have been duly recorded either by deed or in a validly approved subdivision prior to March 30, 1955;
- B. All other requirements of the height and area regulations are complied with; and
- C. The owner of the lot does not own sufficient adjoining land to

It is important to note that the Respondents sought approval of the subject property as an undersized lot (as to lot width) only pursuant to BCZR § 304.1 and not pursuant to any other provision of BCZR § 304.

conform to the width and area requirements contained in these regulations.

(Emphases added.)

The evidence before the Board was substantial, overwhelming and uncontradicted:

- A: the deed for the subject property was recorded in 1947 eight years before 1955;
- B: all other BCZR requirements pertaining to height and area are met

 the subject property is greater than 20,000 square feet even if the
 land area occupied by the publicly maintained roadway is excluded
 from the area calculation; and
- C: the Owner does not own any adjoining land, although for a period of approximately two years, the Owner's predecessor in title did own adjoining land. However, that period was over twenty years ago, well beyond the adopted six year period adopted in the Code of County Regulations

The Board, in it written Opinion, held that "the law provides that, if all three tests above are met, the Petitioners are permitted to develop an 'undersized' or 'insufficient width' lot in Baltimore County." Board's Opinion at 6. The Protestants have failed, completely, to even attempt to argue that the Board's ruling is based on unsubstantial evidence. No doubt that is because the <u>only evidence</u> before the Board is that offered in support of the relief requested. A recent decision of the Maryland Court of Appeals has held that:

It is a clearly established rule in the law of zoning that a court may not substitute its judgment for that of the Zoning Board.' Dorsey Enterprises, Inc. v. Shpak, 219 Md. 16, 23, 147 A.2d 853, 857 (1959). Chief Judge Hammond wrote for the Court in State Ins. Comm'r v. National Bureau of

Casualty Underwriters, 248 Md. 292, 309, 236 A.2d 282, 292 (1967), that 'under ... [either] of the standards the judicial review essentially should be limited to whether a reasoning mind reasonably could have reached the factual conclusion the agency reached. (alteration added).'

Whether reasoning minds could reasonably reach a conclusion from facts in the record is the essential test. If such a conclusion is sufficiently supported by the evidence, then it is based upon substantial evidence. Forty years ago in *Snowden v. Mayor and City Council of Baltimore*, 224 Md. 443, 447-48, 168 A.2d 390, 392 (1961), we noted that:

The substantial evidence test "means that the reviewing court's inquiry is whether on the record the agency could reasonably make the finding." ... Substantial evidence is "such relevant evidence as a reasonable mind might accept as adequate to support a conclusion." The heart of the fact finding process often is the drawing of inferences from the facts. The administrative agency is the one to whom is committed the drawing of whatever inferences reasonably are to be drawn from the factual evidence. "The Court may not substitute its judgment on the question whether the inference drawn is the right one or whether a different inference would be better supported. The test is reasonableness, not rightness." [Citation omitted.]

Over twenty years later we opined, 'if the evidence makes the issue of harm fairly debatable, the matter is one for the Board's decision, and should not be second-guessed by an appellate court.' *Board of County Commissioners for Cecil County v. Holbrook*, 314 Md. 210, 218, 550 A.2d 664, 668 (1988). [Citations omitted.]

In White v. North, 356 Md. 31, 44, 736 A.2d 1072, 1079 (1999), we much more recently restated the general standard of review that:

In judicial review of zoning matters, including special exceptions and variances, "the correct test to be applied is whether the issue before the administrative body is 'fairly debatable,' that is, whether its determination is based upon evidence from which reasonable persons could come to different conclusions. [Citations omitted.] For its conclusion to be fairly debatable, the administrative agency overseeing the variance decision must have "substantial evidence" on the record supporting its decision. [Citations omitted.]

Lewis v. DNR, 377 Md. 382, 405-407 (2003).

The Protestants had no evidence to present in contradiction of the facts in this case. The Board conducted a thorough review of the facts and evidence before it, met in open, public deliberation as required by the State Open Meetings Act and rendered a decision containing the required findings and conclusions of law. Although it is less than clearly stated on appeal to this Court, apparently the Protestants suggest that the Board committed an error of law by failing to apply the holdings in Cromwell v. Ward and Friends of the Ridge v. BGE.14 It is clear from the Protestants' arguments before the Zoning Commissioner, the Board and now in their Memorandum filed with this Court, that the Protestants are unaware of the law applicable to this case. The "undue hardship" provision of Cromwell applies in the review of a use variance instead of an area variance - neither of which are relevant to the issues presented in this case - there is no variance relief even requested. This is Special Hearing case for determination of rights under the BCZR. Likewise, the doctrine of "merger" explained and applied in the Friends of the Ridge case is inapposite to the relief sought by the Respondents.

There was no error of law by the Board. There is no basis for this Court to substitute its judgment for that contained in Board's Opinion that is based on fairly debatable, overwhelming and substantial evidence.

Protestants' Memorandum to this Court at 4-5.

The Protestants Received Notice of the Relief Requested and Failed to Preserve for Review any Challenge of the County Initiated Notice

The Protestants participated in the hearing before the Zoning Commissioner and before the Board of Appeals. Obviously, the posting of the subject property with the required zoning sign and the legal advertising by Baltimore County of the relief requested was effective in providing notice. Baltimore County requires that all persons seeking any form of zoning relief to complete a form agreeing to pay the costs of legal advertising of the zoning hearing. That form¹⁵ provides in pertinent part as follows:

Zoning Review will ensure that the legal requirements for advertising are satisfied. However, the petitioner is responsible for the costs associated with these requirements. The newspaper will bill the person listed below for the advertising. This advertising is due upon receipt and should be remitted directly to the newspaper.

The <u>County advertised</u> the hearing held by the Zoning Commissioner and the Petitioners paid the cost thereof. The <u>only</u> evidence before the Board was that the subject property was posted properly. On re-direct examination, Mr. Doak noted that the subject property was posted as required under the BCZR. (TR. 75) There is absolutely <u>no testimony or evidence</u> offered by the Protestants before the Board that the advertising by Baltimore County of the Zoning Commissioner's hearing was in any way improper. The Protestants

failed to preserve any such allegation in the proceedings before the Board (no testimony or evidence) and, thus, before this Court. Even assuming, *arguendo*, that the alleged issue had been properly preserved, the Protestants cannot deny that they had actual notice of the proceedings and ample time to present whatever testimony and evidence in support of their position that they desired. The Court of Appeals has held:

While failure of an administrative board to give proper notice is jurisdictional and in some circumstances may be fatal, Cassidy v. Board of Appeals, 218 Md. 418, 421-422, 146 A.2d 896 (1958), the requirement of notification purposed to inform may be satisfied by actual knowledge, Clark v. Wolman, 243 Md. 597, 600, 221 A.2d 687 (1966), especially when it is acted upon.

McLay v. Maryland Assemblies, Inc., 269 Md. 465, 477 (1973) (Emphasis added.)

The Protestants had actual **notice** and knowledge of the proceedings and participated at each lower level. Do they now claim that they were not informed of the proceedings? Notice of the requested zoning relief was given by the County and the Protestants, in exercise of the rights afforded them by the County Council, challenged that relief. In two, separate forums the challenge of the Protestants has failed. In both challenges they failed to present any testimony or evidence of prejudice or of improper advertising notice. The decision of the Board should be affirmed.

CONCLUSION

The Protestants do not want a home built on the property next to their home. In their attempt to retain what is, no doubt, existing open space they attempt to deny the Owner the right to have the Zoning Commissioner and the Board determine whether or not the subject property meets the requirements of an undersized lot (lot width) pursuant

to BCZR § 304.1.

Being completely unable to refute deeds recorded in the Land Records of Baltimore County they attempt to argue that the regulations adopted by the County are improper or inapplicable. They failed before the Commissioner and, except for limited cross-examination of Respondent's witnesses, did not participate before the Board – no witnesses or other evidence of any nature was presented to the Board by the Protestants.

The Board's Opinion is legally sound, complies with the requirements of the County Charter, the County Code and the decisions of the appellate courts of this State.

The Board's Opinion is based on substantial evidence and is not to be disturbed on appeal.

For all of the foregoing reasons, the Respondents request that this Honorable Court affirm in every detail the Board's Opinion.

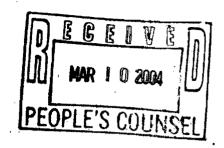

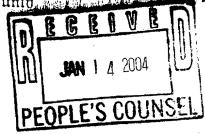

<u>OPINION</u>

This matter comes before the Baltimore County Board of Appeals on a timely appeal brought by the Appellants /Protestants Jody Albright, et al, resulting from a decision by the Zoning Commissioner dated December 24, 2002, to grant with restrictions a Petition for building application/undersized lot pursuant to § 304, *Baltimore County Zoning Regulations* (BCZR) at the subject site, 1210 Berwick Road, 9th Election District, 5th Councilmanic District.

The Appellants /Protestants were represented before the Board by David F. Albright,
Esquire. Howard L. Alderman, Jr., Esquire, appeared on behalf of Petitioner /Legal Owner
Nancy Wehr Niermann and Petitioner /Contract Purchaser, Kevin Michels /West Wind, LLC.

This case was heard *de novo* before the Board on October 16, 2003, and deliberated in open session on October 29, 2003.

The first witness for the Petitioners was Bruce Doak, Gerhold Cross & Etzel, 320 E.

Towsontowne Blvd., Baltimore, MD 21286. Mr. Doak was qualified and accepted by the Board as an expert in zoning, planning and development, and as a surveyor with planning and zoning expertise. There was no objection from Mr. Albright.

The witness offered the Plan to Accompany the Petition for Special Hearing as

Petitioners' Exhibit #1. Mr. Doak testified that he had visited the site four or five times and that
the plan, as sealed by him, reflects the title and deed of the subject property.

He described the location as the north side of Berwick Road in the neighborhood of Ruxton, an area of single family dwellings. The subject lot is roughly a rectangular shape containing .49 acre, more or less, with a depth of 228 feet on the west boundary, 214 feet on the east, 96.34 feet across the rear boundary, and a width of 97.34 feet fronting Berwick Road.

According to Mr. Doak's testimony, the area of the lot is 20,573 square feet outside of the paved portion of Berwick Road, but a total of 21,216 square feet in actuality because the deed extends the property line to the center of Berwick Road. The property is zoned D.R. 2.

As Petitioners' Exhibit #2 Mr. Doak submitted § 1B02 BCZR which, in pertinent part, sets out the area requirements for building a single-family dwelling in the D.R. 2 zone. Mr. Doak opined that the subject property meets all requirements except for the minimum lot width of 100 feet.

Mr. Doak then offered into evidence three deeds (Petitioners' Exhibits 3, 4 & 5) tracing the chain of ownership of the subject lot back to May 27, 1943. Mr. Doak opined that Ms. Niermann does not own any adjacent property nor had she altered the lot lines of the subject property at any time in her ownership.

He further noted that no dedicated right-of-way is reflected in any description found in the above mentioned deeds. It was Mr. Doak's expert opinion that, where no right-of-way is dedicated, the net area goes to the center of the road. Therefore, the gross area of the subject lot is 21,216 square feet, which includes 740 square feet maintained by the county as part of Berwick Road, a public road.

Mr. Doak submitted as Petitioners' Exhibit # 6 § 101 of the BCZR which defines "net area." He also offered the decision from below as Petitioners' Exhibit # 7. Petitioners' Exhibit # 8 was § 304 of the BCZR which sets forth the standards under which an undersized lot is buildable. Mr. Doak explained that this regulation is relevant here because the subject property

was recorded before March 30, 1955; it meets all pertinent height and area requirements except the frontage; and the owner does not own other property which would permit compliance with the regulations.

Mr. Doak also offered the interoffice correspondence of Arnold F. "Pat" Keller, III, Director of Planning, dated October 10, 2003 (Petitioners' Exhibit # 9) which supports the petition before the Board. He also submitted the Baltimore County Policy Manual section 304 which speaks to the use of undersized single family lots (Petitioners' Exhibit #10).

In his expert opinion, Mr. Doak testified that Ms. Niermann had not owned any adjacent property in the last 6 years which would have permitted her to bring the lot into compliance, nor would building on this lot result in any increase in density. The requested relief of 97.34 feet in lieu of the required 100 foot front lot width is a minimal request which cannot be obtained in any other way and falls within the spirit and intent of the BCZR.

On cross-examination by Mr. Albright, Mr. Doak testified that Berwick Road is a public road which does not qualify as a "road by prescription" in his expert opinion. Mr. Doak also stated that the Petitioners had not filed for a building permit to date and that they did need a positive ruling in this case in order to build the proposed single family dwelling.

He further agreed with Mr. Albright that the County holds a dedicated 30-foot right-of-way in front of the Albright property, and that the Albright property had been created out of several parcels which had belonged to the Wehr family. In fact, Mr. Doak testified, Nancy T. Wehr, Ms. Niermann's mother, currently lives on the opposite side of Berwick Road from the subject property as shown on Petitioners' Exhibit #1. On redirect from Mr. Alderman, Mr. Doak clarified that the Petitioners' deed differs from that of the Albright property in that the Niermann property is titled to the center of Berwick Road without a dedicated right-of-way.

The next witness was Nancy Wehr Niermann, 6511 Darnall Road, Baltimore, MD 21204. Ms. Niermann testified that she is the owner of the subject property. She first submitted into evidence (Petitioners' Exhibit # 12) public records from the Metropolitan Information Systems, Inc., showing undersized lots on Berwick Road which have been built on. She also submitted letters of support from neighbors (Petitioners' Exhibit #13) and photos (Petitioners' Exhibits 14 A-H) showing nearby houses. Ms. Niermann opined that the houses shown in the photographs were all larger than the house proposed for the subject lot. She also testified that she had never owned any property adjacent to the subject property.

Mr. Albright then cross-examined Ms. Niermann on the size of adjoining lots and some smaller houses in the area. Ms. Niermann agreed that there were some lots that are larger than the subject property and some houses that are smaller than what is proposed. On redirect by Mr. Alderman, Ms. Niermann testified that her photos were limited to those houses bordering the subject property.

Petitioner Kevin Michels was the next to testify. He is the principal in West Wind LLC, located at 213 Old Padonia Road, Cockeysville, MD 21030. He submitted as Petitioners' Exhibit #15 the plans for the house proposed for the subject property. He indicated that he has been in the building business since 1995 and it is his opinion that the house proposed is compatible with the neighborhood.

On cross-examination Mr. Michels testified that he met with Lynn Lanham of the Office of Planning to review the house plans. He said that he has not filed for a building permit.

Mr. Albright, counsel for the Appellants /Protestants, did not present any witnesses or evidence.

In closing Mr. Alderman argued that § 304, BCZR, empowers the Board of Appeals to approve an undersized lot as buildable if it meets the three tests set forth. It is the contention of

the Petitioners that they do meet the tests as required and that their evidence is uncontradicted by the Appellants. Further the posting was done properly and the Petitioners have met their burden.

Mr. Alderman noted that the Zoning Commissioner attached three conditions to his ruling and that the Petitioners will not object to the conditions imposed.

In opposition Mr. Albright argued that the subject lot is too narrow and that the area requirement calculation must not include any of the paved portion of Berwick Road. He also emphasized that § 304 is not the correct procedure in this case and that a building permit filing is mandatory. In addition, Mr. Albright contended, the fact that the lot has been vacant for many years is proof in itself that it is unbuildable.

Upon review the Board accepts unanimously the testimony and evidence presented and hereby finds that the subject property meets the requirements for an undersized lot as indicated in § 304.1, (BCZR, 1955; Bill No. 47, 1992). Section 304.1 stipulates that:

A one-family detached or semi-detached dwelling may be erected on a lot having an area or width at the building line less than that required by the are regulations contained in these regulations if:

- A. Such lot shall have been duly recorded either by deed or in a validly approved subdivision prior to March 30, 1955;
- B. All other requirements of the height and area regulations are complied with; and
- C. The owner of the lot does not own sufficient adjoining land to conform to the width and area requirements contained in these regulations.

It is clear to this Board that the Petitioners have met the first test (A) in that the subject property was established by deed recorded in Baltimore County Land Records on May 27, 1943. The testimony of Mr. Doak and Ms. Niermann was supported by the evidence of Petitioners' Exhibits #3, #4, and #5.

The second test (B) speaks to all other height and area requirements. Testimony and evidence support the facts that the lot in question meets the designated front, rear and side yard

setback requirements. Mr. Doak's expert testimony that the Petitioner owns to the centerline of Berwick Road was also persuasive. Therefore the calculation of 21,216 square feet more than meets that requirement that the lot be no less than 20,000 square feet in total area.

Finally the testimony and evidence is uncontradicted by fact that the Petitioners do not own sufficient adjoining land to bring the undersized lot into compliance. Therefore they satisfy test C.

As a result the law provides that, if all three tests above are met, the Petitioners are permitted to develop an "undersized" or "insufficient width" lot in Baltimore County.

The Board hereby GRANTS the special hearing request for approval of the subject property as an undersized lot under § 304, subject to the following restrictions:

- 1) The Petitioners may apply for their building permit and be granted same upon receipt of this Order; however, Petitioners are hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at their own risk until the 30-day appeal period from the date of this Order has expired. If an appeal is filed and this Order is reversed, the relief granted herein shall be rescinded.
- 2) Prior to the issuance of any building permits, the Petitioners shall submit building elevation drawings of the proposed dwelling and a landscape plan to the Office of Planning for review and approval. The landscape plan shall provide sufficient screening to buffer the proposed dwelling from the adjacent properties on both sides.
- 3) When applying for any permits, the site plan filed must reference these cases and set forth and address the restrictions of this Order.

<u>ORDER</u>

THEREFORE, IT IS THIS Std. day of Weem beld, 2003 by the County Board of Appeals of Baltimore County

ORDERED that the Petition for Special Hearing for building application /undersized lot at the subject site, 1210 Berwick Road, pursuant to § 304 of the *Baltimore County Zoning*Regulations (BCZR) be and the same is hereby GRANTED, subject to the following conditions:

- The Petitioners may apply for their building permit and be granted same upon receipt of this Order; however, Petitioners are hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at their own risk until the 30-day appeal period from the date of this Order has expired. If an appeal is filed and this Order is reversed, the relief granted herein shall be rescinded.
- Prior to the issuance of any building permits, the Petitioners shall submit building elevation drawings of the proposed dwelling and a landscape plan to the Office of Planning for review and approval. The landscape plan shall provide sufficient screening to buffer the proposed dwelling from the adjacent properties on both sides.
- When applying for any permits, the site plan filed must reference these cases and set forth and address the restrictions of this Order.

Any petition for judicial review from this decision must be made in accordance with Rule 7-

201 through Rule 7-210 of the Maryland Rules.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter comes before the Zoning Commissioner for consideration of a Petition for Special Hearing filed by the owner of the subject property, Nancy W. Niermann, and the Contract Purchasers, West Wind, LLC, by Kevin Michels. The Petitioners request a special hearing to approve the subject property as an undersized lot, pursuant to Section 304 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.). The subject property and requested relief are more particularly described on the site plan submitted which was accepted into evidence and marked as Petitioner's Exhibit 1.

Appearing at the requisite public hearing in support of the request were Nancy Niermann, property owner; Kevin Michels, a principal member of West Wind, LLC, Contract Purchasers; and Howard L. Alderman, Jr., Esquire, attorney for the Petitioners. Also present were Bruce E. Doak, the Registered Land Surveyor who prepared the site plan for this property, and Frederick T. Weir, who resides across the street from the subject site. Appearing in opposition to the request were several residents from the surrounding locale, including David and Josephine Albright, who own the adjacent property at 1214 Berwick Road, and their daughter, Felicia Albright and her husband, Doug Scrivener, who reside on that property. Also appearing in opposition were Leza Ebeling, and David and Margaret Owens, who reside across from the subject site at 1217 Berwick Road. In addition, Anne J. Malone, who owns the adjacent property known as

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1208 Berwick Road, appeared as an interested person, as did Peggy Squitieri, on behalf of the Ruxton-Riderwood-Lake Roland Area Improvement Association.

The subject property under consideration is an irregularly shaped parcel, located on the north side of Berwick Road, across from Wehr Road and just east of Rider Hill Road in Ruxton. The property contains 0.49 acres, more or less, zoned D.R.2 and is presently unimproved. The property is currently under contract of sale to Kevin Michels, a builder and principal in West Wind, LLC. Mr. Michels proposes to develop the property with a two-story single family dwelling as shown on Petitioner's Exhibit 1.

The standards for development of D.R. zoned land are set out in Section 1B02.3C of the B.C.Z.R. The minimum area required for a lot zoned D.R.2 is 20,000 sq.ft. The subject property is 21,216 sq.ft. in area. Thus, the lot meets that area requirement. Additionally, Section 1B02.3.C of the B.C.Z.R. establishes certain minimum setbacks. These are that any dwelling must be situated a minimum 40 feet from both the front/street and rear property lines. Again, an examination of the site plan shows that the proposed dwelling will be located 103 feet from the front property line and 66 feet from the rear property line. In this regard, there was some question raised about the location of the front property line insofar as same may be within the bed of Berwick Avenue. Whatever the dispute, it is clear that the proposed dwelling will be setback significantly more than the 40 feet required and thus easily meets those setback requirements. More importantly, the testimony of Bruce Doak, a licensed surveyor, was persuasive that the Petitioner owns property to the centerline of Berwick Road. Thus, I find that the lot area and setbacks as shown on the plan are accurate.

Section 1B02.3 of the B.C.Z.R. also sets out the side yard setback requirements. Each side yard setback must be a minimum 15 feet and when combined, the total side yards must total 40 feet. Thus, an applicant can submit building plans for a dwelling setback 20 feet from both sides, or 15 feet and 25 feet, etc. Compliance is determined for so long as each setback is a minimum of 15 feet and when added together the total setbacks equal 40 feet or more. In this case, the site plan shows a 15-foot setback will be provided to the east adjacent to 1208 Berwick

Avenue, and a 25-foot setback towards the west adjacent to 1214 Berwick Avenue. Thus, it is clear that the Petitioners' lot satisfies the area requirements and meets all property line setbacks. In addition to those standards, the lot must also be a minimum 100 feet wide. The site plan submitted shows a lot width of 97.34 feet across the front property line, and 96.34 feet across the rear. Thus, the lot fails to comply with this requirement.

Testimony and evidence offered also established that the instant case is not the first time that a Petition for zoning relief has been filed for this property. Specifically, Ms. Niermann and a different contract purchaser (Kristen F. and James R. Culp) filed a Petition seeking approval of an undersized lot under Case No. 02-223 (SPH) (see Petitioner's Exhibit 3) which was considered by Deputy Zoning Commissioner Timothy M. Kotroco. By his opinion and Order dated February 7, 2002, Commissioner Kotroco granted the Petitioners' request to construct a single family dwelling on the lot consistent with the site plan submitted in that case. Further evidence offered revealed that the Albrights filed an appeal of that matter to the Board of Appeals. Ultimately, the Petitioners withdrew their Petition in Case No. 02-223 (SPH) and the appeal was dismissed. The Board of Appeals issued an order on April 18, 2002 in which it ruled that any relief granted by Deputy Commissioner Kotroco was rendered null and void and provided that the Petition was withdrawn and dismissed without prejudice (emphasis added).

The Board's Order is of note in this case. The fact that the prior Petition was dismissed without prejudice is dispositive to a finding that the current Petition is properly filed and may be considered. Additionally, although the general principles of res judicata provide that an identical issue may not be relitigated, the fact that a different party is involved in this case (West Wind, LLC) renders the doctrine of res judicata inapplicable. (See <u>Davis v. Frederick Co. Board of County Commissioners</u>, 25 Md. App. 68 (1975)).

The relief requested in the instant case is filed under a Petition for Special Hearing. Indeed, a review of the Protestants' Post Trial Memorandum indicates that there is some confusion by the opponents as to the nature of the relief requested and applicable provisions of the B.C.Z.R. The Office of the Zoning Commissioner is authorized to grant variance relief from the regulations

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contained in the B.C.Z.R. by Section 26-127 of the Baltimore County Code. This variance authority allows the Zoning Commissioner to vary the strict application of the height and area requirements contained in the B.C.Z.R. Thus, the Zoning Commissioner could grant a variance from the building width requirements, pursuant to that authority. When a Petition for Variance is filed and considered, the standards set out in Section 307 of the B.C.Z.R. are applied. That Section requires that the Zoning Commissioner make certain findings in order to grant relief. Specifically, the Zoning Commissioner must determine that special circumstances or conditions exist that are peculiar to the land or structure that is the subject of the zoning request. Additionally, it must be shown that strict compliance with the regulation would result in a practical difficulty or unreasonable hardship upon the property owner. Finally, variances can only be granted if in strict harmony with the spirit and intent of the regulations and only in such a manner so as not to result in any injury to the public health, safety or general welfare of the locale. Section 307 of the B.C.Z.R. has been comprehensively considered by the appellate courts of this state, most notably in Cromwell v. Ward, 102 Md. App. 691 (1995) and Friends of the Ridge v. BG&E Co., 120 Md. App. 444 (1998).

In addition to the Zoning Commissioner's authority to grant variance relief, the Zoning Commissioner possesses other jurisdiction and authority pursuant to the Baltimore County Code and the B.C.Z.R. Among such authority is the consideration of Petitions for Special Hearing. Such Petitions are filed pursuant to Section 500.7 of the B.C.Z.R. Essentially, that Section authorizes the Zoning Commissioner to conduct such hearings as might be necessary for the proper enforcement and interpretation of the B.C.Z.R.

Relief sought under a Petition for Special Hearing is subject to a different standard than relief sought pursuant to a Petition for Variance. Whereas a Petition for Variance is considered pursuant to the requirements of Section 307 of the B.C.Z.R. as described above, a Petition for Special Hearing is not subject to those requirements. In this case, special hearing relief is sought pursuant to Section 304 of the B.C.Z.R. Section 304 of the B.C.Z.R. regulates the use of undersized single family dwelling lots in Baltimore County. The first zoning regulations were

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enacted in Baltimore County in 1945. Obviously, Baltimore County is an older jurisdiction and significant development existed in the County when the first zoning regulations were adopted. The drafters of the original version of the B.C.Z.R. recognized existing development and the fact that "lots of record" were recorded in the Land Records of Baltimore County prior to 1945.

The version of the B.C.Z.R. first enacted in 1945 was comprehensively amended and reenacted in 1955. The regulations promulgated in 1955 are essentially the same set of standards presently in effect, albeit the enactment of numerous amendments over the years. Section 304.1 of the B.C.Z.R. recognizes the existence of old lots of record and regulates same. That Section provides that a one family detached or semi-detached dwelling can be constructed on a lot having an area or width at the building line less than that required by the regulations, if three tests are met. First, such lot shall have been duly recorded either by deed or in a validly approved subdivision prior to March 30, 1955 thereby establishing that the lot existed in its current configuration prior to that date; second, that all other requirements of the height and area regulations have been complied with; and, third, that the lot owner does not own sufficient adjoining land to conform to the width and area requirements contained in the regulations. It is clear that this Section provides that if those three tests are met, a property owner can obtain a building permit for and develop an "undersized" or "insufficient width" lot in Baltimore County. Sections 304.2 through 304.7 of the B.C.Z.R. sets out the procedure under which requests filed pursuant to Section 304.1 shall be administered. Essentially, this Section requires the property owner to post a sign on the property for a period of 15 days advertising that the property owner is seeking relief, pursuant to Section 304. Within that 15-day period, any owner/occupant within 1,000 feet of the subject lot may request a public hearing. If a hearing is requested, same is heard by the Zoning Commissioner or Deputy Zoning Commissioner of Baltimore County. Pursuant to Section 304.4 of the B.C.Z.R., the Zoning Commissioner/Deputy Zoning Commissioner shall make a determination, "whether the proposed dwelling is appropriate." It is this standard which the Zoning Commissioner must apply in considering requests filed pursuant to Section 304.

In this case, it was indicated that the Petitioners were well aware of the opposition of the opponents who participated in the prior case (#02-223 (SPH)). These opponents included members of the Albright and Owens families who reside or own property within 1000 feet of the subject lot. The Petitioners recognized the futility of posting the property for a period of 15 days and thereby soliciting a request for a public hearing by an adjacent property owner. In that no doubt the opponents would exercise that right, the Petitioners filed the Petition for Special Hearing in the instant case, seeking relief pursuant to Section 304, so that a public hearing would immediately be scheduled.

As to the three-pronged test set forth above, it is clear that the Petitioners have met the first requirement in that the lot at issue was established by deed recorded in the Land Records of Baltimore County on May 28, 1943. At the hearing in the instant case, the Petitioners submitted a series of deeds (Petitioner's Exhibits 2A, 2B and 2C) which collectively establish that the subject property existed as a lot of record in its current configuration prior to 1955. Thus, I easily find that the first standard has been met.

The second standard to be considered is whether the property meets all other area and height requirements. As noted above, it is also easily found that the Petitioners have met this requirement. As detailed above, the proposed dwelling meets the lot area requirements as well as the required front, rear and side property line setback requirements. The only deficiency in this case relates to the width of the lot.

The final test is to determine whether the owner of the lot owns sufficient adjoining land to conform to the width and area requirements contained in these regulations. The intent of this requirement is to no doubt prevent a property owner from creating multiple insufficiently sized adjacent lots from a single parcel. If an individual owns multiple adjacent lots that could be combined to meet all area and width standards, he/she cannot be afforded relief under Section 304 of the B.C.Z.R.

In this case, the testimony and evidence offered was clear that Ms. Niermann and West Wind, LLC do not own any adjacent property. That is, they cannot effectively "borrow" acreage

from an adjacent property to cure the insufficient width of the subject property. The Protestants contend that within the chain of title, the prior owners did own adjacent properties and therefore, the Petitioners do not qualify for relief. Although, it indeed appears that a prior owner in the 1970s did own several lots, including the subject property, this prior ownership does not impact the subject case.

The Baltimore County Zoning Commissioner's Policy Manual (ZCPM) was enacted pursuant to Sections 2-416 through 2-422 and 26-135 of the Baltimore County Code. The ZCPM was last adopted and approved by the County Council in 1992. The Policy Manual contains policies and other information that assists the reader in interpreting the B.C.Z.R. On Page 3-3 thereof, the requirements of Section 304 of the B.C.Z.R. are discussed. Therein, it is indicated that the Zoning Commissioner has traditionally applied the "six year rule" in considering adjacent property ownership. That rule holds that if a single owner of an undersized lot contiguous to another parcel owned by him has transferred ownership of that lot to another person, Section 304.C would apply, if such conveyance was within six years of the date of the filing of the Petition.

In this case, Ms. Niermann has owned the subject lot without owning adjacent property for over 20 years. Thus, the six-year rule set forth in Section 304.C of the B.C.Z.R. has been met. Having determined that each of the requirements set forth in Section 304 of the B.C.Z.R. have been satisfied, I am persuaded to approve the relief requested in the Petition for Special Hearing.

There are several other factors that are of note. Although not dispositive on the instant request, the decision of Deputy Commissioner Kotroco was sound. I concur with his finding that the construction of a dwelling on the subject undersized lot is appropriate and should be approved. Likewise, I agree that certain conditions should be attached to the grant of any relief. Specifically, the Petitioners should submit to the Office of Planning a landscape plan for their review and approval, taking into consideration appropriate landscaping to buffer adjacent properties. Additionally, the Petitioners should be required to submit building elevation drawings of the proposed dwelling to the Office of Planning for their review and approval. Additionally, I easily find that a grant of the request will not be detrimental to adjacent properties and does not adversely

impact the health, safety and/or general welfare of the locale. I appreciate that some neighbors would like to continue to enjoy the open view afforded by this undeveloped lot. However, the owner should not be compelled to use this unimproved lot for her neighbors' benefit. More importantly, the lot and proposed house are consistent with other houses in the neighborhood. The lot is insufficiently wide by but a single yard, but is large enough in area that the proposed house will not inappropriately intrude upon adjacent dwellings. I easily find that the proposed dwelling is "appropriate" pursuant to Section 304.4 of the B.C.Z.R.

Also, the recently developed concept of smart growth deserves comment. That principle states that development should be geared toward existing communities with infrastructure in place, rather than the development of virgin and agriculturally used properties. Urban sprawl is a significant concern not only in Baltimore County but statewide. This is a typical smart growth-type case. The Ruxton community is a long-established subdivision with public improvements (sewer and water) in place. The lot is obviously not in agricultural use and is located in an existing residential community. This long-existing lot of record is appropriate for development.

In sum, I am persuaded that the Petition for Special Hearing should be granted. I will impose reasonable conditions and restrictions upon the grant of the relief to mitigate the impacts of this development on adjacent properties. The Protestants' objections, both legal and practical, are simply without merit. Their desire to enjoy the open view afforded by this undeveloped lot is understandable, but does not adequately support a denial of the instant Petition.

Pursuant to the advertisement, posting of the property and public hearing on this Petition held, and for the reasons set forth above, the relief requested shall be granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED by the Zoning Commissioner for Baltimore County this day of December, 2002 that the Petition for Special Hearing seeking approval of the subject property as an undersized lot, pursuant to Section 304 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.), in accordance with Petitioner's Exhibit 1, be and is hereby GRANTED, subject to the following restrictions:

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- 1) The Petitioners may apply for their building permit and be granted same upon receipt of this Order; however, Petitioners are hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at their own risk until the 30-day appeal period from the date of this Order has expired. If an appeal is filed and this Order is reversed, the relief granted herein shall be rescinded.
- 2) Prior to the issuance of any building permits, the Petitioners shall submit building elevation drawings of the proposed dwelling and a landscape plan to the Office of Planning for review and approval. The landscape plan shall provide sufficient screening to buffer the proposed dwelling from the adjacent properties on both sides.

3) When applying for any permits, the site plan filed must reference these cases and set forth and address the restrictions of this Order.

PETITIONERS' POST-HEARING STATEMENT IN LIEU OF CLOSING ARGUMENT

Nancy W. Niermann, ("Owner") and West Wind, LLC, ("Contract Purchaser") (through its Authorized Member, Kevin C. Michels) (referred to collectively herein as the "Petitioners") file this Post-Hearing Statement in Lieu of Closing Argument at the direction of the Hearing Officer for Baltimore County at the conclusion of the hearing held on November 12, 2002.

THE CASE

Nancy W. Niermann ("Owner") is the fee simple owner of the property located at 1210 Berwick Avenue (the "subject property"). As shown on the Plan which accompanied the *Petition for Special Hearing* ("Petitioner's Exhibit No. 1), the subject property is presently zoned DR 2 and is comprised of 21,216 square feet. The subject property has a width, at the front property line parallel to Berwick Avenue, of 97.34 feet. The Petitioners filed the *Petition for Special Hearing* requesting that the Zoning Commissioner approve the subject property as a buildable, undersized lot of record.

A prior contract purchaser of the subject property had been granted relief to construct a new home on the subject property pursuant to a *Petition for Variance* filed in Case No. 02-223-A (the "prior zoning case"). While the variance relief was granted in that case, an appeal of the decision was filed by certain neighbors and before the required *de novo* hearing was held by the County Board of Appeals, that *Petition for Variance* was withdrawn without prejudice by the petitioners.

The Baltimore County Zoning Regulations "(BCZR") set forth a procedure for posting of an undersized property in connection with a building permit sought thereon. If within the statutory period of time after posting no request for public hearing is made, the permit can be issued. BCZR §§ 304.4 & .5. However, if a proper request for a hearing is made or if the Director of Permits and Development Management determines unilaterally that a public hearing is necessary, the Zoning Commissioner is required to hold a public hearing to make a determination as to whether or not the proposed dwelling is appropriate. BCZR § 304.4 There is no procedure specified for obtaining that public hearing, either by way of Petition for Variance or Petition for Special Hearing.

Being aware of the prior request for public hearing (leading to the prior zoning case), the Petitioners in this case went directly to the public hearing stage by the filing of the *Petition for Special Hearing*. The Zoning Commissioner has broad authority under BCZR § 500.7 "to conduct such other hearings and pass such orders thereon as shall, in his discretion, be necessary for the proper enforcement of all zoning regulations

."

At the hearing held in this case, certain neighbors appeared and signed in as persons in opposition to the requested relief. Those individuals, including without limitation David F. Albright, Esq., et al (referred to collectively hereafter as the "Protestants"), suggested throughout the hearing [based on purported argument by Mr. Albright in his individual capacity] that the Petitioners were required to meet the standards of BCZR § 307.1, McClean, Cromwell (the "Protestants' Authorities") and their respective progeny when seeking a variance. However, apparently the Protestants were unaware that no variance relief is being sought by the Petitioners.

The Zoning Commissioner attempted to point out to the Protestants that the Petitioners had opted for relief by way of zoning special hearing, thereby subjecting the request to scrutiny under BCZR §§ 500.7 & 502.1. As such, the Protestants' Authorities are inapposite – they do not apply to the relief requested.

In support of the Petition, the Petitioners presented the expert testimony of Bruce

Doak who opined that the relief requested:

- would not be detrimental to the health, safety or general welfare of the community as the subject property is an existing lot of record, it is larger in size than many of the lots on Berwick Avenue that are already improved with single family dwellings and that any construction must meet all applicable county requirements
- would not tend to create congestion in roads, streets or alleys of the community as it involves the addition of only one, single-family detached home on a lot with just over 2 feet less frontage on a public roadway than required by the BCZR; if the width of the subject property at the roadway

was 100 feet (the minimum required), no more or less traffic would result

- would not create a potential hazard from fire, panic or other danger from a single-family dwelling on an existing lot of record
- would not overcrowd the land or cause an undue concentration of population there are existing homes on lots on the same street of smaller size
- would not interfere with adequate provisions for schools, parks or other public amenities and facilities
- would not, given the size of the subject property and the location of the proposed home, interfere with adequate light and air
- is not inconsistent with the DR 2 zoning classification or the spirit and intent of the BCZR the BCZR makes specific provisions for use of this type of pre-existing lot, a lot created before the inception of zoning in Baltimore County
- would not be inconsistent with the impermeable surface and vegetative retention provisions of the BCZR

The majority, if not all, of the testimony/evidence offered by the Protestants was concentrated around:

- whether or not the owner owned fee simple title of her lot of record to the centerline of Berwick Avenue
- whether or not the size of the lot of record was shown correctly on Petitioner's Exhibit No. 1
- how Petitioner's Exhibit No. 1 compared with an exhibit in the prior zoning case on the subject property and how it related to a drawing purportedly prepared for the Albright property to the west
- the incomprehensible difference between a "course" of one of the property lines shown on a prior, boundary survey and that stated in the deed to the owner and shown on Petitioner's Exhibit No. 1

- landscaping on the western, northern and eastern sides
- equalizing the distance of the building envelope in an east-west direction across the lot, recognizing that the proposed drive would be located on one side or the other
- the definition of certain of the exterior materials shown on the 15 sheets of building plans, elevations and drawings presented by the Contract Purchaser
- whether or not the proposed home would have a walk-out basement
- whether or not the Zoning Commissioner had the legal authority to hear the Petition as filed and/or grant the relief requested
- why the proposed dwelling and relief requested did not meet the standards applicable to the grant of a zoning variance
- at some point in time, many years ago, the subject property was in common ownership with a portion of one of the existing, adjoining parcels

The extent of ownership can be determined readily from the series of deeds entered into evidence on behalf of the Petitioners; the owner owns to the centerline of Berwick Avenue. *See* Petitioners' Exhibits No. 2A-C The size of the subject property is recited in each of the previous deeds and certified on the plan which accompanied the Petition and in expert testimony by a Maryland registered Property Line Surveyor – Mr. Doak. Moreover, Mr. Doak explained how current boundary line surveys often differ from old deed descriptions because of the advances made in the equipment used for surveying purposes. Mr. Doak also described how two surveyors could survey the same piece of property and describe it slightly different in a metes and bounds description. In

any event, Mr. Doak testified that in preparing Petitioners' Exhibit No. 1 he used the metes and bounds descriptions from the recorded deed instruments so that there could be no challenge to description shown – the description is as recorded in the Land Records of Baltimore County.

As testified to by Mr. Michels, the proposed home will not have a walk-out basement. With respect to landscaping and "centering" the home on the subject property, Mr. Michels had no objection to reasonable approaches to either issue, as long as the adjoining lot owners realized that moving the home would also move the driveway. Additionally, Mr. Michels (a recognized, quality builder) described how the *Southern Living* home proposed was completely appropriate with the neighborhood and how the proposed mix of exterior materials would complement and replicate materials used on many of the existing homes in the community.

As to the issue of prior common ownership of the subject property and a portion of one of the existing, adjoining parcels, Mr. Albright (a licensed attorney) and the rest of the Protestants are, apparently, unaware of the applicable provisions of the *Baltimore County Code of Maryland Regulations*. While the almost two year period of common ownership occurred in the mid-1970's, the uncontradicted testimony was that the current Owner had no common ownership interests during her period of ownership (i.e. since June 18, 1990; *see* Petitioners' Exhibit No. 2A.) Moreover, Baltimore County has developed and applied a "six year rule" when issues of commonality of ownership are

at issue. If the property was in common ownership within the six years prior to the hearing, the petitioner may be barred from relief for an undersized lot. (ZCMP § 304, Code of County Regulations). Clearly, the Owner's interest spans more than 12 years.

There are seven reported cases in Maryland which mention the Zoning Commissioner's authority pursuant to BCZR § 500.7:

In none of the cases listed have the appellate courts of this state ever challenged, criticized or negated the authority of the Baltimore County Zoning Commissioner to "to conduct such other hearings and pass such orders thereon as shall, in his discretion, be

necessary for the proper enforcement of all zoning regulations" BCZR § 500.7 As noted by the Zoning Commissioner in the instant case, the Petitioners have subjected themselves to a more stringent body of regulatory evaluation, that outlined in BCZR § 502.1.

Most of these cases merely mention the procedural use of what has been characterized as the Zoning Commissioner's Special Hearing authority. The County Council, acting pursuant to the authority conferred pursuant to Article 25A §5, Annotated Code of Maryland, has adopted the BCZR with the Special Hearing authority included. The Protestants may dislike the procedural posture of the instant relief, however, their recourse is with the legislative body of the County.

No credible testimony or other evidence was introduced to contradict or otherwise undermine the expert testimony of Mr. Doak regarding the BCZR § 502.1 standards. The only relevant testimony from the Protestants, if any there may be, pertained to the layout of the improvements on the subject property. In the prior zoning case, the requested relief granted approval for a single-family house with a **detached** garage; an issue that apparently caused much concern from adjoining and other neighbors. In the instant case, Mr. Michels has attempted to overcome that potential obstacle by the selection of a quality home design which incorporates the garage into the house footprint.

Zoning decisions, like planning decisions are not decided by neighborhood

plebiscite or mere numbers of people in support or opposition to requested relief. Rather, those decisions are based on the merits of the *relevant* testimony. A review of the relevant testimony in this case shows clearly that the applicable legal standards for granting the relief were met and that the proposed home is more than appropriate for the neighborhood.

For all of the foregoing reasons, the Special Hearing relief for approval of the subject property as a buildable, undersized lot should be approved.

Variance/Special Exception:

§ 32-3-302. SAME - HEARING REQUIRED: NOTICE.

- (a) In general. Except as provided in §32-3-303 of this subtitle, the Department of Permits and Development Management shall schedule a public hearing on a petition for a variance or special exception for a date not less than 21 days and not more than 90 days after the petition is accepted for filing.
- (b) Notice.
- (1) The Department of Permits and Development Management shall ensure that notice of the time and place of the hearing relating to the property under petition be provided:
- (i) By conspicuously posting the notice on the property for a period of at least 15 days before the date of the hearing; and
 - (ii) By a notice in at least one newspaper of general circulation at least 15 days before the hearing.

Special Hearing:

500.7 The said Zoning Commissioner shall have the power to conduct such other hearings and pass such orders thereon as shall, in his discretion, be necessary for the proper enforcement of all zoning regulations, subject to the right of appeal to the County Board of Appeals as hereinafter provided. The power given hereunder shall include the right of any interested person to petition the Zoning Commissioner for a public hearing after advertisement and notice to determine the existence of any purported nonconforming use on any premises or to determine any rights whatsoever of such person in any property in Baltimore County insofar as they are affected by these regulations. Dear Mr. Schmidt:

We reside at 1217 Boyce Avenue. Our house is located directly behind the undersized lot at 1210 Berwick. We are writing to oppose the plans for the proposed house at 1210 Berwick Road. Our concerns are as follows:

1. The Principle

We have rules governing our neighborhoods to protect overdevelopment. If this development is approved, with a lot size less than the required 100 feet road frontage, it will set a precedent. What then is the absolute minimum? Is it 95 feet road frontage? 90? Or could it be 85? There has to be a non-negotiable minimum lot size established and enforced. There must be consistancy in limits set and upheld in Baltimore County.

2. The size, height, and position of the proposed house

The homes directly surrounding the property are smaller in square footage and significantly shorter in height. In addition, two of the properties have much larger lots. This proposed house was not specifically designed for this lot. It will dwarf the other properties at 34 feet in height vs. the 27 feet height of the surrounding houses. It's square footage is 2,600 vs. 2,086 sf home on 1 1/2 acre property across the street and the 2050 sf. home on .84 acre beside.

No consideration was given to the Jones who will be only 22 feet away from the house in question. No thought was given to the Albrights whose 2 story house appears to be a one story because of the severe drop off (about 1 story) between their lot and the lot in question. Image a 34 foot house looming over their house!

3. Neighborhoood History

The Wehr parents had been staunch supporters of open space. They continually fought development in the area. It is ironic that their children (Nancy Niermann and Fred Wehr) have digressed from that position now that they reside elsewhere. A very healthy profit has been enjoyed by the Wehr family as they sell off lots that the family has owned on Berwick (#1214 and #1216) and soon the Mother's home at 1209 Berwick. It would provide no hardship for this one lot to remain undeveloped and sold to neighbors as an unbuildable lot. In fact, many believe that was the intent of the deceased Mr. Wehr.

4. Screening

No mention has been made about planting significant evergreen trees such as mature spruce trees to screen this property from the neighbors.

We live directly behind the property and have a pool behind our house. Our home was built with sliding glass doors on the entire back of our house with views of this lot. We purchased our home in May of 2001. We valued the privacy and beauty that this lot provided. The price we paid for our home was directly linked to the fact that 1210 Berwick was an undersized lot that could not be developed.

RELEVANCE OF THIS CASE

There is another current case on Berwick whereby a developer has bought 2 properties (1401 Berwick and an adjacent property on LaBelle Avenue) with intent to tear down one of the homes and develop 4 new homes on the remaining acre and a half. Of important interest is the fact that these two homes are listed with the Maryland Historic Trust.

This pattern of development will continue because of three reasons. First, Ruxton is a desirable location which commands high real estate values. Second, developers have the wealth necessary to hire an attorney and fight these cases in court. And, third, because of a pro development agenda on the part of Baltimore County.

Your rulings have a tremendous impact upon our neighborhood. Are you aware that, unlike many other established neighborhoods, Ruxton has no single governing body to approve development and review architectural changes? Thus, the integrity of our community rests solely on the Zoning Commision guidelines. If the Zoning Commision continues to grant variances for undersized lots, a precedent is set. We must uphold the guidelines established by law about property size and building restrictions.

Unfortunately, it is clear that wealthy developers are going to continue to push the limits and we need to count on your office to uphold the laws established.

This letter is in reference to case number 03-160-SPH for the property at 1210 Berwick Rd. There are several additional points that we, who oppose the building on this lot, request that you consider.

1. The Petitioner is clearly using the wrong procedure to seek approval for building on an undersized lot. The specific provisions (section 304, et seq.) govern and protect both the public and the adjacent property. The attempted run around by the Petitioner violates the zoning rules and violates the Maryland Constitution. We object to this, as the provisions of section 304 are being totally ignored. However, in addition, the problem was created by the Petitioner's grantor, and since for a period of time between May 21, 1974 and December 7, 1976, Nancy T. Wehr (with her husband, until his death on December 2, 1975 and thereafter, individually, until December 7, 1976) owned sufficient adjoining property to make the subject lot at 1210 Berwick a full-sized lot. The present owner of 1214 Berwick Road obtained their title to this immediately adjacent land to the subject property through a chain of title directly from the common owner. Thus, the grantor of the subject property created in both chains of title a self-inflicted damage to the subject property, as well as a substantial benefit to 1214 Berwick Road. And, of equal importance, indeed, the present and prior owner of 1214 Berwick Road paid more for their property because they obtained more land.

Furthermore, all factual proof infers that the common ownership always treated (until a recent time period) the subject property as open space, and would not be

developed. The testimony and evidence in the earlier and present proceedings supports this.

Maryland case law is right on point and supports our view. For example, in <u>Cromwell v. Ward</u>, 102 Md. App. 691 (1995), Judge Cathell stated (p.700): "The general rule is that variances and exceptions are to be granted sparingly, only in rare instances and under peculiar and exceptional circumstances...." These proceedings are in direct violation of the case law.

"(T)he hardship (must) not (be) the result of action taken by the appellant or a <u>prior owner</u>." (Emphasis added). (p.717). Under the circumstances in this case it is very difficult to see how the request or petition of the builder can be granted. The prior owner created the problem at 1210 Berwick Road, and under this clear legal pronouncement the petition should be denied.

Moreover, the case of Friends of the Ridge v. BG&E, 352 Md. 645 (1999), (Judge Cathell, delivered the opinion of the Court of Appeals, having been elevated to the highest court in Maryland between 1995 and 1999), explains an additional concept, that of merger which applies as well to this case (see p.654) and requires denial of the petition.

- 2. Mr. Doak does not possess the expertise to make the determinations that the requirements for 304 require.
- 3. As a result of the erroneous bypassing of 304, other measures that are in place to protect the property owners of existing houses were negated. The neighbors that surround the subject property, all of whom were present, who would be most affected by this proposed house, were unable to study the plans set forth before the Commissioner. Considerable effort to contact the builder before the hearing was done, without any cooperation from the builder.
- 4. There are many unsettling aspects to this house. First the width of 52 and one half feet is very large for the lot. If you go to Berwick Rd. and really study the surrounding properties, you will see how close the houses would appear as opposed to all the houses one sees as one approaches the subject property from the beginning of the DR2 zoning. DR2 zoning starts at the intersection of Berwick Rd., LaBelle, and Locust. The overall impression is one of spaciousness and grace.
- 5. The proposed height of 34' is unmatched in this area. 1214 Berwick is partially below grade, so that from the front it is two stories, but the bulk of the house extends beyond the second level, and is above grade. The portion of 1214 that is above grade is approximately 12-13 feet high. Even though this is above grade, 1214

Berwick still sits approximately 7 feet below the property at 1210. The result is that the proposed house would rise 41' above the grade of 1214. The difference is considerable, and oppressive. We can only suggest to you that in this instance a house that rises 41' above the adjacent house will have vantage points into all living areas of the adjacent house. In addition, the height further complicates any kind of landscaping barriers, as they would have to be quite mature when planted. If changes to place the driveway to Mrs. Jones's side, then the vantage points will be that much more exacerbated.

- 6. Cemplank is not shown on the picture that Kevin Michaels submitted to RRLRAIA, and perhaps to the Zoning Office as well. What the builder has shown is totally brick, with no siding evidenced. In the prior Hearing for 02-223-A, the previous contract purchasers had to be very explicit, and were held to the exact plans that they had proposed. The plans that Kevin Michaels submitted for review to the County Office of Planning are not the plans he will use. In the brief time we were able to look over the plans during the five or ten minutes before the Hearing started, we found two obvious errors to his plans, which he admitted he had to change. It was in violation of the zoning rules to seek permission to build on an undersized lot before completing all the preliminary work.
- 7. We are very concerned about the look of the total neighborhood, and are very upset that a neighborhood that has inherent qualities to continue to be an extremely beautiful neighborhood can be destroyed by this unorthodox procedure.

We hope that the Commission will deny the petition. Thank you.

Thank you for allowing some of the neighbors to present their feelings in the referenced case for a new house to be built on an undersized lot. Maintaining the open space and the rural character of Ruxton is an overriding concern of this neighborhood. I feel that the builder has not made enough effort to adapt this project to the location. He has simply taken the plans from a book instead of using an architect to try and work with the character of other houses in the neighborhood, and certainly no attempt has been made to creatively fit the house onto the topography of this site.

Even though the lot does not meet the required 100 foot frontage, the house has still been conveniently situated on the lot to take full advantage of minimum allowable 40 foot setbacks from the side yards of its neighbors. Also, no consideration has been made for the fact that the house to the east will only be 20 feet away from the proposed house. Furthermore, without the 15 feet along the front lot line that is in the county right of way for Berwick Road, the lot size would be under the required minimum lot size of 20,000 square feet for R-2 zoning.

In summary, I feel that the design of the house is not typical of the rural character of the neighborhood, and the massing of the structure on the lot is not appropriate especially considering the undersized nature of the property. Therefore, the plan should not be approved as presented. Thank you again for your consideration of this matter.

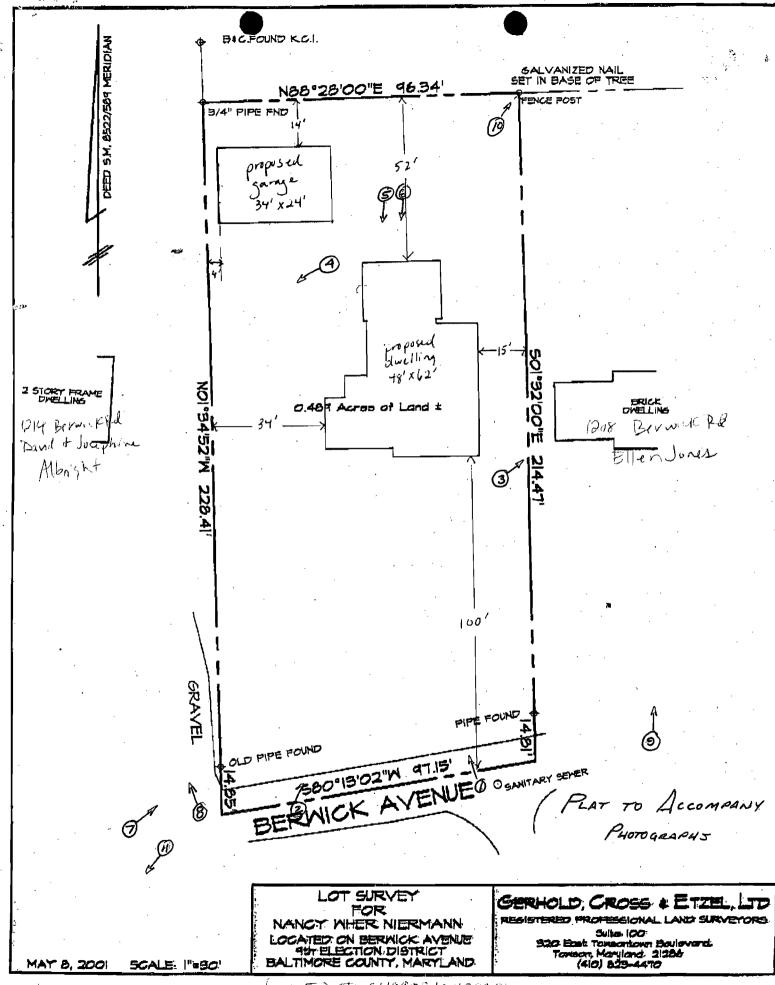

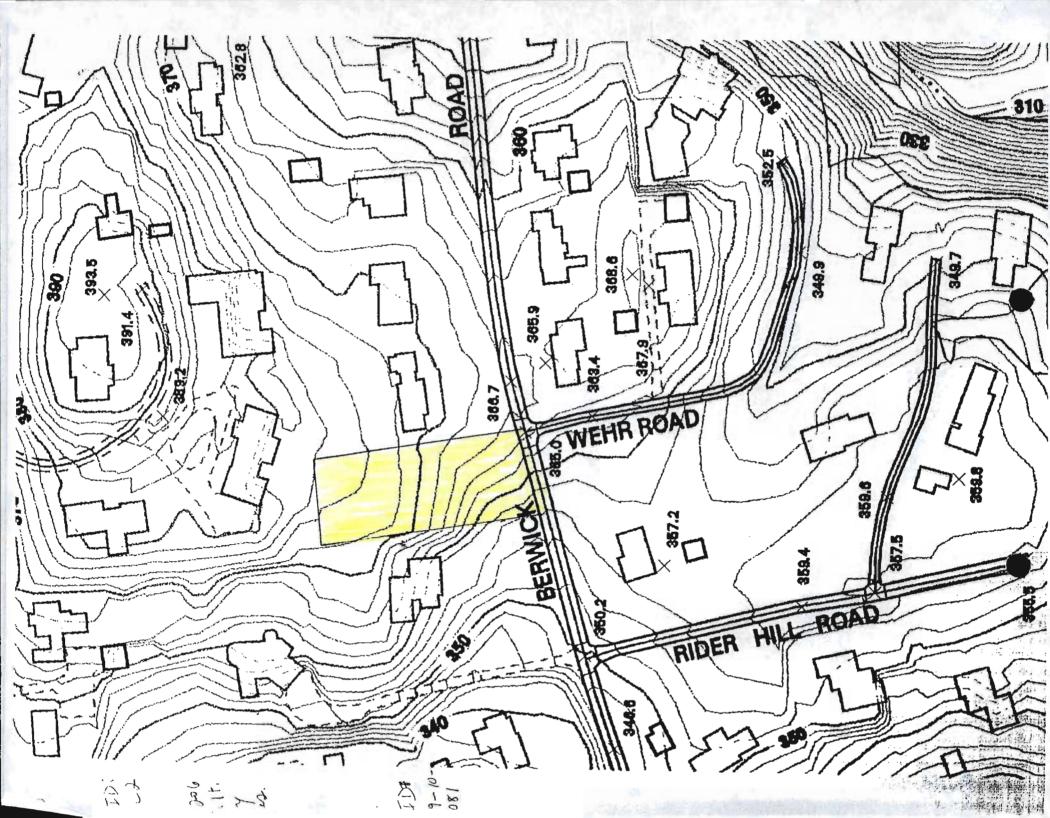

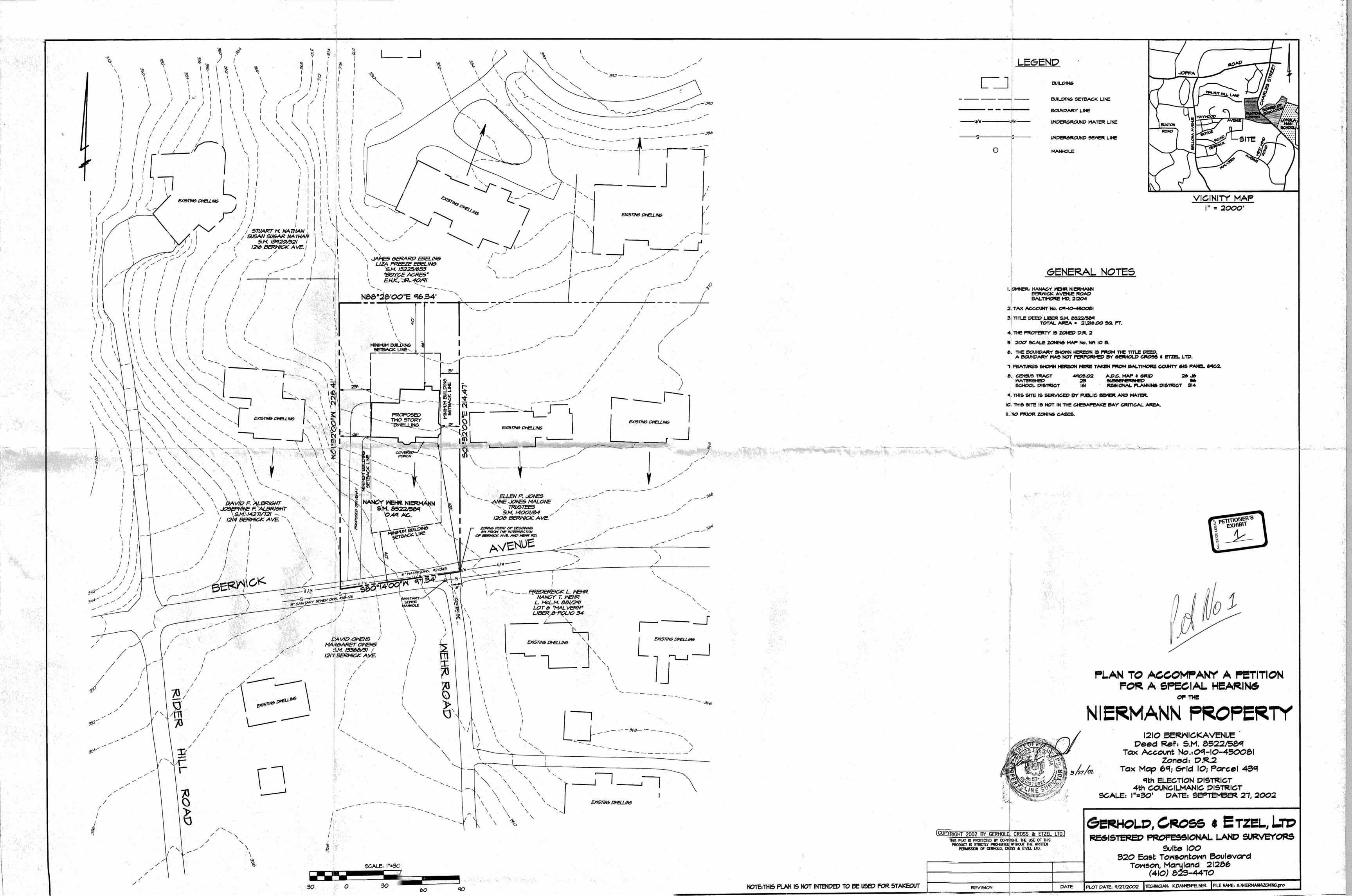

 - 5. Any lot or tract of lots in single ownership which is in a duly recorded subdivision plat not approved by the Baltimore County Planning Board or Planning Commission.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter comes before the Zoning Commissioner for consideration of a Petition for Special Hearing filed by the owner of the subject property, Nancy W. Niermann, and the Contract Purchasers, West Wind, LLC, by Kevin Michels. The Petitioners request a special hearing to approve the subject property as an undersized lot, pursuant to Section 304 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.). The subject property and requested relief are more particularly described on the site plan submitted which was accepted into evidence and marked as Petitioner's Exhibit 1.

Appearing at the requisite public hearing in support of the request were Nancy Niermann, property owner; Kevin Michels, a principal member of West Wind, LLC, Contract Purchasers; and Howard L. Alderman, Jr., Esquire, attorney for the Petitioners. Also present were Bruce E. Doak, the Registered Land Surveyor who prepared the site plan for this property, and Frederick T. Weir, who resides across the street from the subject site. Appearing in opposition to the request were several residents from the surrounding locale, including David and Josephine Albright, who own the adjacent property at 1214 Berwick Road, and their daughter, Felicia Albright and her husband, Doug Scrivener, who reside on that property.  - A. Such lot shall have been duly recorded either by deed or in a validly approved subdivision prior to March 30, 1955;
 - B. All other requirements of the height and area regulations are complied with; and
 - C. The owner of the lot does not own sufficient adjoining land to conform to the width and area requirements contained in these regulations.
- 304.2 Building permit application.
 - A. Any person desiring to erect a dwelling pursuant to the provisions of this section shall file with the Department of Permits and Development Management, at the time of application for a building permit, plans sufficient to allow the Office of Planning to prepare the guidelines provided in Subsection B below. Elevation drawings may be required in addition to plans and drawings otherwise required to be submitted as part of the application for a building permit. Photographs representative of the neighborhood where the lot or tract is situated may be required by the Office of Planning in order to determine appropriateness of the proposed new building in relation to existing structures in the neighborhood.
 - At the time of application for the building permit, as provided above, the Director of the Department of Permits and Development Management shall request comments from the Director of the Office of Planning (the "Director"). An appeal of the decision rendered by the Zoning Commissioner for the subject property will be heard before the Board of Appeals on October 16, 2003.

The Office of Planning supported the initial request and reaffirms support of the petitioner's request to approve the subject property as an undersized lot, pursuant to Section 304 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations.

The applicant has submitted a site plan and building elevations (all sides) of the proposed structure to this office. The Office of Planning finds that the elevations are appropriate and consistent with other houses in the neighborhood.

SECTION 304 -- USE OF UNDERSIZED SINGLE-FAMILY LOTS - Prior to the application for a building permit, the applicant must provide satisfactory documentation. The applicant may be required to furnish:

- a. a copy of the pre-1955 deed or subdivision plat;
- b. (no additions)
- c. contiguous ownership

It is obvious that Section 304 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations recognizes the existence of parcels of property that did not meet the minimum lot sizes mandated at the time the minimum lot size regulations were passed. To do otherwise would have the effect of rendering such undersized lots useless, and such legislation would be unconstitutional.

- Section 304 B.C.Z.R., however, is silent as to when contiguous ownership would serve as a bar to its implementation, i.e., contiguous ownership in existence only at the time this regulation was passed or contiguous ownership in existence at that time and at any time thereafter.
- It is therefore important to consider the intent of the owner who attempts to invoke the applicability of Section 304 BCZR. Each situation must be judged individually by the particular facts and circumstances presented. If the intent to avoid the regulations is obvious, Section 304c. cannot be invoked and variances must be required. An obvious method used is called "checkerboarding". The owner of a tract of land consisting of undersized lots makes conveyances of certain lots in order to create a pattern of ownership which qualifies each parcel as an undersized lot in a single and separate ownership, thereby avoiding the necessity of public hearing and notice for a variance. Often this is done by transferring title to members of the owner's family or to his business associates, e.g., to officers of the corporation which purchased the tract. Another method is to sell adjoining undersized lots which were recently purchased to individual, bona fide buyers. This would permit the new owner of a single undersized lot to build without a variance, where such permission would not have been granted to the owner of the entire tract.
- 1. If a single owner of contiguous undersized lots has purchased the property in good faith and without any intent to avoid the area requirements, 304c. may be used to allow the owner to huild pursuant thereto. Good faith also must be determined by the facts and circumstances of each situation, but such factors as dates of purchase of the purcels, the purpose of the purchase, the intent of the purchase, can be utilized to so determine. This office has traditionally applied the "six year rule" to determine good faith, and that rule shall be one criteria to be used. The rule holds that if the single owner of an undersized lot contiguous to another parcel owned by him has transferred ownership of one to another, 304c. would apply if such new ownership has been held for a period of at least six years. This rule shall not preclude exceptions where it is clear, and equitable, that single ownership of contiguous property was not intended to avoid area requirements.



- (i) a property tax computer printout for all adjacent properties, in addition to the subject property;
- (ii) copies of the deeds for all adjacent properties, in addition to the subject property; and
- (iii) a notorized affidavit stating that the applicant has had no financial interests for the prior six years in any adjacent properties.

Interpretation: The Zoning Commissioner retains the right Section 500.6 B.C.Z.R. to interpret whether the spirit and intent of these Regulations are being adhered to on a case-by-case basis (see Section 101 - Ownership Z.C.P.M., Page 1-23)

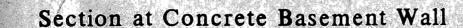




Typical Beam, Column and Footing Detail
