Dear Mr. Mudd:

Your request to Jeff Perlow, Baltimore County Zoning Supervisor, regarding the above referenced property was referred to me for reply. Based upon the contents submitted with your letter and the Orders and Site Plans within Zoning Case Nos. 2005-0300-SPHX and 2020-0190-SPHA, please be advised of the following.

You ask for written confirmation that a proposed two-story, 8,800 square foot addition, attached to the original approved two-story 17,000 square foot building by a covered breezeway, be considered as within the "spirit and intent" of the aforementioned Zoning Cases. You state that that the proposed addition (which will replace a longstanding tent) will be used for classrooms, multipurpose rooms and other facilities to accommodate Irvine's growing nature-based preschool/early education programs, their similar educational programming for people of all ages, and the other activities described in your letter. It is to be noted that the prior hearings were approved for a use serving the same function as for the purpose of the proposed addition, although the 2020 case was partly approved for the facility's property expansion.

The Zoning Review Office will consider the proposed addition as being with the spirit intent of the referenced Zoning Case and accompanying site plans conditioned upon all requirements (parking, height, setbacks), as set forth in the Baltimore County Zoning Requirements are met and that the Zoning Cases and Letters are referenced on future plans for County approval.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter comes before this Deputy Zoning Commissioner as a Petition for Special Exception filed by the legal owner of the subject property, Irvine Natural Science Center, Inc., by Lynn R. Jordan, President. The Petitioners are requesting a special exception for property located at 11201 Garrison Forest Road in the Stevenson area of Baltimore County. The special exception request is filed pursuant to Sections 1A01.2.C.4 and 1A01.2.C.23 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.), for a school and/or camp providing programs of environmental studies and natural science to children and adults.

The property was posted with Notice of Hearing on January 20, 2005, for 15 days prior to the hearing, in order to notify all interested citizens of the requested zoning relief. In addition, a Notice of Zoning hearing was published in "The Jeffersonian" newspaper on January 20, 2005 to notify any interested persons of the scheduled hearing date.

Applicable Law

Section 502.1 of the B.C.Z.R. - Special Exceptions

Before any special exception may be granted, it must appear that the use for which the special exception is requested will not:

- A. Be detrimental to the health, safety or general welfare of the locality involved;
- B. Tend to create congestion in roads, streets or alleys therein;
- C. Create a potential hazard from fire, panic or other danger;
- D. Tend to overcrowd land and cause undue concentration of population;

- E. Interfere with adequate provisions for schools, parks, water, sewerage, transportation or other public requirements, conveniences or improvements;
- F. Interfere with adequate light and air; [Bill No. 45-1982]
- G. Be inconsistent with the purposes of the property's zoning classification nor in any other way inconsistent with the sprit and intent of these Zoning Regulations; [Bill No. 45-1982]
- H. Be inconsistent with the impermeable surface and vegetative retention provisions of these Zoning Regulations; nor [Bill No. 45-1982]
- I. Be detrimental to the environmental and natural resources of the site and vicinity including forests, streams, wetlands, aquifers and floodplains in an R.C.2, R.C.4, R.C.5 or R.C.7 zone. [Bill No. 74-2000]

Uses permitted by special exception in RC 2 zones

The following uses, only, may be permitted by special exception in any R.C.2 Zone, provided that in each case the hearing authority empowered to hear the petition finds that the use would not be detrimental to the primary agricultural uses in its vicinity; and, in the case of any use permitted under Item 29, further provided that the hearing authority finds that the use would support the primary agricultural use in its vicinity and would not itself be situated on land more appropriately used for primary agricultural uses: [Bill No. 178-1979]

Zoning Advisory Committee Comments

The Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments are made part of the record of this case and contain the following highlights: A ZAC comment was received from the Department of Environmental Protection and Resource Management (DEPRM) dated January 19, 2005, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof. A ZAC comment was received from the Office of Planning dated February 4, 2005, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof indicating its support of the Petition with conditions.

Interested Persons

Appearing at the hearing in support of the request were Mary Hogan, James Matis, Glenn Cook, Zolna Russell, Charles Alexander, W. T. Dixon Gibbs, Jr., William Winstead, Erin Wisnieski, Tom Panzarella, Lynn Jordan and Stephen Barker. Robert A. Hoffman, Esquire represented the Petitioners. No protestants or citizens attended the hearing. Peter Max Zimmerman, entered the appearance of his office in this case.

Testimony and Evidence

The Petitioners operate a non-profit school, camp and nature center on leased space at the St. Timothy's School for Girls. Their programs include field trips for nature study for students from local private and public schools, classroom outreach programs and tailored nature programs such as making maple syrup, etc. These programs are conducted by staff and volunteers for children arriving by school bus and private vehicles during the week and on weekends. A recent needs assessment indicated that they had need to expand the facilities they now operate, in order to accommodate growing numbers of children and programs.

By chance, the Petitioners were able to acquire a 116-acre parcel of land owned by the State of Maryland. This parcel of land has been part of the State's Rosewood Center zoned RC-2 and was donated to the Center by the State. This property which is shown on Petitioner's Exhibit 1 is presently being farmed in part, has extensive forests/wetlands, and is located in the Caves Valley Historic District. In short, it is ideal for the kind and number of programs the Petitioners now present and will allow future growth opportunities.

The Petitioners raise most of their funds through donations and public grants except for a small shop, which sells nature products and supplies. However, since the operation is so dependent on fundraising, Ms. Jordan indicated that it would be prudent to request three years to utilize the special exception by which time the Petitioners would be able to fundraise, design and construct the main building. This building is approximately 20,000 sq. ft. and will contain offices, classrooms and exhibits.

Although the property is contiguous, the road connecting the main building and the satellite ranger station shown on the exhibit runs off the property across State property for some distance.

Ms. Jordan indicated that the Board considered building a road wholly on the subject site but this would require cutting many trees in the forested areas. Rather, the Petitioners have entered into an agreement with the State to allow them to use the existing road. The Petitioners indicated that this

road would be capable of supporting the weight of a fire truck and actually paved when the ranger station was ready for use.

Several neighbors of the proposed center testified personally in support of the petition. The Petitioner presented numerous letters of support as well. Mr. Hoffman proffered that the professional engineers, traffic experts, ecologists and architects, all of whom attended the hearing, would indicate that the proposed use would not adversely affect the surrounding community and would meet each criteria of Section 502.1 of the BCZR. In fact, the proposed use would not be detrimental to the primary agricultural uses in its vicinity.

Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law

I find that the requested special exception meets all the criteria of Section 502.1 of the BCZR and will not adversely affect the health, safety, or welfare of the community. I further find that the use would not be detrimental to the primary agricultural uses in its vicinity. In fact, this nature center will be a great asset to the area by providing children in area schools and visitors alike to experience nature in forests, streams and wetlands. This is a remarkable project conducted by staff and volunteers for the betterment of the community. I further find that the request to allow three years to utilize the special exception is most reasonable under the circumstances, that fundraising for non-profit organizations is always unpredictable even for the most cherished, publicly supported programs. It could take that long to raise the funds, design and construct the building.

Pursuant to the advertisement, posting of the property, and public hearing on this petition held, and after considering the testimony and evidence offered by the Petitioners, I find that the Petitioners' request for special exception should be granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, this <u>B</u> day of February, 2005, by the Deputy Zoning Commissioner, that the Petitioners' request for special exception filed pursuant to Sections 1A01.2.C.4 and 1A01.2.C.23 of the BCZR, for a school and/or camp providing programs of

environmental studies and natural science to children and adults, be and is hereby GRANTED, subject, however, to the following restrictions which are conditions precedent to the relief granted herein:

- 1. The Special Exception granted herein shall expire three (3) years from the date of this Order; and
- 2. The Petitioners may apply for their permit and be granted same upon receipt of this Order; however, Petitioners are hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at their own risk until such time as the 30 day appellate process from this Order has expired. If, for whatever reason, this Order is reversed, the Petitioners would be required to return, and be responsible for returning, said property to its original condition;
- 3. The Petitioners shall comply with the ZAC comments received from the Department of Environmental Protection and Resource Management (DEPRM) dated January 19, 2005;
- 4. The Petitioners shall comply with the ZAC comments received from the Office of Planning dated February 4, 2005;
- 5. When applying for a building permit, the site plan filed must reference this case and set forth and address the restrictions of this Order.

Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

ADVERTISING REQUIREMENTS AND PROCEDURES FOR ZONING HEARINGS

The <u>Baltimore County Zoning Regulations</u> (BCZR) require that notice be given to the general public/neighboring property owners relative to property which is the subject of an upcoming zoning hearing. For those petitions which require a public hearing, this notice is accomplished by posting a sign on the property (responsibility of the petitioner) and placement of a notice in a newspaper of general circulation in the County, both at least fifteen (15) days before the hearing

Zoning Review will ensure that the legal requirements for advertising are satisfied However, the petitioner is responsible for the costs associated with these requirements. I have received your Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law in the abovereferenced matter. I appreciate your prompt ruling in this matter, and I am happy that the ruling was in my client's favor. However, I have one concern regarding one of the restrictions in your order.

Restriction No. 4 indicates that "The Petitioners shall comply with the ZAC comments received from the Office of Planning dated February 4, 2005." Attached to your order was that comment from Planning, which ends with the following sentence: "As such, the Office of Planning does not oppose the petitioner's request provided it is constructed in accordance with the site plans and architectural elevations that were reviewed and approved by this office."

My concern is that, as we mentioned during the hearing, the architectural elevations that Irvine had shown to the Office of Planning and brought to the hearing before you are very preliminary and have, in no way, been finalized. Good Morning.

My name is Lynn Jordan, from Irvine Nature Center. I am the volunteer President of the Board. I've been a supporter and member of Irvine for over 15 years, and I live in Cockeysville with my husband and two children.

Irvine is 30 years old this year, and is currently located on the campus of St. Timothy's School for Girls, at 8400 Greenspring Avenue in Stevenson, where we operate out of two renovated barns that we rent. We teach environmental science to children, their families, and to adults. According to our Mission Statement, the nature center is:

"a non-profit educational organization offering programs of environmental studies and natural science to children and adults of the greater Baltimore area. The Center's mission is to inspire appreciation and respect for the natural world, to increase awareness of environmental issues, and to encourage individuals to sustain Earth's ecosystems."

Each year, we serve about 16,000 children and adults, of whom 2/3 come on-site. The rest of our programs are offered throughout the Baltimore area. We have always emphasized "quality" over "quantity", and we are proud that we were recognized last year in Baltimore Magazine's "Best of" issue as offering the best nature programs in the metropolitan region. Over 8,000 of our total attendance are schoolchildren who either attend field trips at the nature center, are taught in their own school's classrooms, or who participate in our nationally-recognized, hands-on *Natural Connections* program in

Baltimore City which takes place in the schoolyards of urban schools. Other children, adults and family members attend our public programs, which total several hundred public programs a year. All of our students enjoy the opportunity to be exposed to nature, to discover wildlife, and to learn environmental science in an outdoor setting. Many parents and teachers know us for, and admire, our Monday-through-Friday school field trips which primarily service Baltimore City and Baltimore County schools. We maintain a 10:1 naturalist/student ratio on our hikes, so each hiking group is small and quiet enough to see and hear the lessons being taught, and to appreciate nature's sounds and sights. The buses arrive on-site after 9AM and are usually gone by 3PM. We also have an environmental science summer camp for 25 children per week.

Our field trip topics for schoolchildren are linked to Baltimore County's Science Curriculum, which in turn reflect the mandated science curriculum set by the Maryland State's Department of Education. Thus we offer – and I'm just reading from one of our Environmental Education Program brochures here, – "Sensing Nature" for preschool or kindergarteners, "Seasonal Changes" for 1st graders, "Exploring Animals" for 2nd graders, and similar programs up through 8th grade. Field trips for middle schools, high schools and colleges are tailored to the needs of the specific class, as are field trips for home-schooled students and "special needs" students.

Our public programs, for varying ages, depending on the program, currently include "Maple Magic" (tapping maple trees to make maple syrup), "Winter Tree ID" (learning to identify trees without their leaves), and "Hand-Made Paper Valentines", using recycled paper. We have a monthly evening lecture series on topics such as western Maryland's Black Bears and astronomy. Nature book hours and puppets shows are offered to the younger children. So, as you can see, environmental education is our primary focus, and our curriculum is targeted for both children and adults.

We also have some popular special events, some off-site, and some on-site, which are a combination of educational events, fund-raisers and "friend-raisers". Please note that fun-raisers and "friend-raisers" are both very important to us, since we are a private organization that depends on donations; we are not a government agency, and must

raise the \$800,000 every year that makes it possible for our 20-some staffers to offer first class environmental education at a low cost for students and the public. Our school hikes and owl prowls and birdwatching courses are provided for reasonable, low-cost fees, which teachers appreciate when it comes time for them to pick their field trips.

So, to list our special events: our "signature event" is our fall festival, called Pumpkinfest, open to the public, which occurs on a Saturday each October. Our well-respected Native Plant Sale and Seminar, which also occurs on a Saturday, in August, has been awarded "Best of Baltimore" by Baltimore Magazine for the last two years. Our spring Bird-A-Thon is primarily off-site, as participants spread throughout central Maryland to the best birding sites over a three-week period. We also offer volunteer projects such as Project Clean Stream, the annual street-and-stream clean-up throughout the Baltimore area pioneered by Irvine, now run by the Alliance for the Chesapeake and a consortium of other environmental groups, which is usually scheduled early in April, also on a Saturday.

If you were to ask us to describe a typical week at Irvine, that might be difficult, because our programs follow both the school calendar and the seasons. But let me say that in the fall and spring - possibly our busiest seasons on-site --, we may have 2 or 3 school buses on any given weekday, or vans, bringing in schoolchildren for field trips between 9AM and 3PM. The approximately 20 staffers will arrive, at 8:30 or later, depending on their schedule. A few visitors may come to hike the trails or go through the exhibit area with their children; a few others may come to pick up nature books or materials at our nature store. Half a dozen volunteers may come in: one or two to run a field trip hike, the rest to help prepare mailings or stuffing envelopes. A few mothers with babies or small children may come in to attend a book-reading session. Some weeks some teachers may attend a teacher-training session. Our own trustees may come, perhaps 5 or 6 to attend a committee meeting, or, 5 times a year, over a dozen will come to attend a Board or Executive Committee meeting. Miscellaneous others may come, too - representatives from other environmental organizations, such as the Maryland Native Plant Society, to discuss environmental education with our staff, or day-today business visitors, such as an outside contractor to work on our phones or computers.

The same routine generally applies in the winter and summer, except that the field trips (& the buses) don't come during those periods. Our naturalist staff continues to be busy then, though, taking "Classroom Outreach" programs out to the schools in the winter months between Thanksgiving and March, and running the summer camp in the summer.

More complete numbers are provided in the traffic study we are presenting today, completed by The Traffic Group.

So we have grown beyond our humble beginnings, and matured into an important Maryland institution, while also becoming a strong partner for our local schools and universities, both public and private, supplementing and integrated with their science curriculum. Our natural science activities help schoolchildren learn how to make predictions, collect and compare data, describe observations, identify similarities and differences, and draw conclusions, -- all scientific and educational skills that will aid them throughout their studies and in adult life.

We have grown so much, though, that we have truly outgrown the 4,600 square foot barn where we began, despite several renovations over the years. In a couple years, we plan to be moving to our new, larger home, on the beautiful piece of property that was donated to us by the state of Maryland, that is the subject of today's hearing.

In 2007, we plan to move to the Caves Valley in Owings Mills, to a 116-acre site blessed with woods, wetlands and wildflowers. This gorgeous property was donated to us by the State of Maryland in August of 2000. This is a truly generous partnership with the state, and we thank everyone who made it possible. We also include Baltimore County on our "thank you" list, as Baltimore County and its local state legislators sponsored and supported a bill that resulted in our project being approved for \$200,000 in state funds for our new building.

In our new Caves Valley home, with the additional space we so desperately need, we will continue to operate the same super, firstrate regional nature center that generations of Baltimore County residents have come to love and depend upon. We think of it as "Baltimore's Big Backyard", -- offering the kind of rustic, low-key outdoor experiences many of us enjoyed as children but that are fast dwindling as suburban sprawl eats up the fields and woods where many of us found our first box turtle and ate our first wild raspberries. We are planning a 15,000 - 20,000 square foot environmentallysensitive "green" building (the "Barn"), as well as a support building of up to 5,000 square feet (the "Nature Center"), plus lots of programs for children and adults (like we do now), with land restoration and enhanced animal habitat. An entrance drive from Garrison Forest Road will provide access for our students and visitors, and connect the two buildings and their parking lots. It will be the best center that we can design.

Be assured we already have extensive community support, as indicated by the fact that we have raised, in pledges and donations, \$4.6 Million towards our goal of \$9M for the building, parking lots and entrance drive, as well as the related development of trails, teaching pavilions, wetland restoration and a boardwalk from which to view it, and more. The money already donated includes a \$1 Million "challenge grant" from the Weinberg Foundation, a generous local foundation that has pledged to give us \$1 for every \$2 we received. Obviously, we have a lot of work ahead of us, raising almost another \$4M, but we are confident we will reach our goal, to permit us to build the building on schedule, with the extra classroom and exhibit space our students and teachers need today.

Let me tell you a little bit about the main building, the "Barn". The building will be "a step above" the traditional nature center, which, like the old one-room schoolhouse, is limited to one classroom or one multi-purpose room. Our current facility has a single classroom which often doubles as a lecture hall, a meeting room, an exhibit area, a staging area, storage and more; it's much too small. To truly serve Maryland's population, we need the additional space that our proposed two-story building will provide. We are planning two classrooms, a multi-purpose auditorium, a hands-on exhibit area, a library and "discovery room" for our pre-schoolers. Having researched
