FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter comes before this Deputy Zoning Commissioner as a Petition for Administrative Variance filed by the legal owners of the subject property Charlene W. and James The administrative variance is requested for property located at 1304 Chesapeake Avenue in the eastern area of Baltimore County. The administrative variance request is from Section 400.3 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.), to allow an accessory building (detached garage) 20 ft. high in lieu of the maximum permitted 15 ft. The subject property and requested relief are more particularly described on Petitioners' Exhibit No. 1, the plat to accompany the Petition for Variance.

The Petitioners having filed a Petition for Administrative Variance and the subject property having been posted on January 18, 2005, and there being no request for a public hearing, a decision shall be rendered based upon the documentation presented.

Zoning Advisory Committee Comments

The Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments are made part of the record of this case and contain the following highlights: A ZAC comment was received from the Department of Environmental Protection & Resource Management (DEPRM) dated February 3, 2005, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof. In addition, a ZAC comment was received from the Office of Planning dated February 4, 2005, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

Series FOR

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Applicable Law

Section 307 of the B.C.Z.R. – Variances.

"The Zoning Commissioner of Baltimore County and the County Board of Appeals, upon appeal, shall have and they are hereby given the power to grant variances from height and area regulations, from off-street parking regulations, and from sign regulations only in cases where special circumstances or conditions exist that are peculiar to the land or structure which is the subject of the variance request and where strict compliance with the Zoning Regulations for Baltimore County would result in practical difficulty or unreasonable hardship. No increase in residential density beyond that otherwise allowable by the Zoning Regulations shall be permitted as a result of any such grant of a variance from height or area regulations. Furthermore, any such variance shall be granted only if in strict harmony with the spirit and intent of said height, area, off-street parking or sign regulations, and only in such manner as to grant relief without injury to the public health, safety and general welfare. They shall have no power to grant any other variances. Before granting any variance, the Zoning Commissioner shall require public notice to be given and shall hold a public hearing upon any application for a variance in the same manner as in the case of a petition for reclassification. Any order by the Zoning Commissioner or the County Board of Appeals granting a variance shall contain a finding of fact setting forth and specifying the reason or reasons for making such variance."

The Petitioners have filed the supporting affidavits as required by Section 26-127 (b)(1) of the Baltimore County Code. Based upon the information available, there is no evidence in the file to indicate that the requested variance would adversely affect the health, safety or general welfare of the public and should therefore be granted. In the opinion of the Deputy Zoning Commissioner, the information, photographs, and affidavits submitted provide sufficient facts that comply with the requirements of Section 307.1 of the B.C.Z.R. Furthermore, strict compliance with the B.C.Z.R. would result in practical difficulty and/or unreasonable hardship upon the Petitioners.

Pursuant to the posting of the property and the provisions of both the Baltimore County Code and the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations, and for the reasons given above, I find that the requested variance should be GRANTED.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, this <u>S</u> day of February, 2005, by this Deputy Zoning Commissioner, that the Petitioners' request for variance from Section 400.3 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.), to allow an accessory building (detached

garage) 20 ft. high in lieu of the maximum permitted 15 ft., be and is hereby GRANTED, subject, however, to the following restrictions which are conditions precedent to the relief granted herein:

- 1. The Petitioners may apply for their building permit and be granted same upon receipt of this Order; however, Petitioners are hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at their own risk until such time as the 30 day appellate process from this Order has expired. If, for whatever reason, this Order is reversed, the Petitioners would be required to return, and be responsible for returning, said property to its original condition;
- 2. Compliance with the ZAC comments submitted by the Department of Environmental Protection & Resource Management (DEPRM) dated February 3, 2005, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof;
- 3. Compliance with the ZAC comments submitted by the Office of Planning dated February 4, 2005, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- 4. The Petitioners or subsequent owners shall not allow or cause the accessory structure to be converted into a dwelling unit and/or apartment. There shall be no sleeping quarters, living area, kitchen or bathroom facilities in the structure. In addition, the accessory structure shall not be used for commercial purposes; and
- 5. When applying for a building permit, the site plan filed must reference this case and set forth and address the restrictions of this Order.

Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

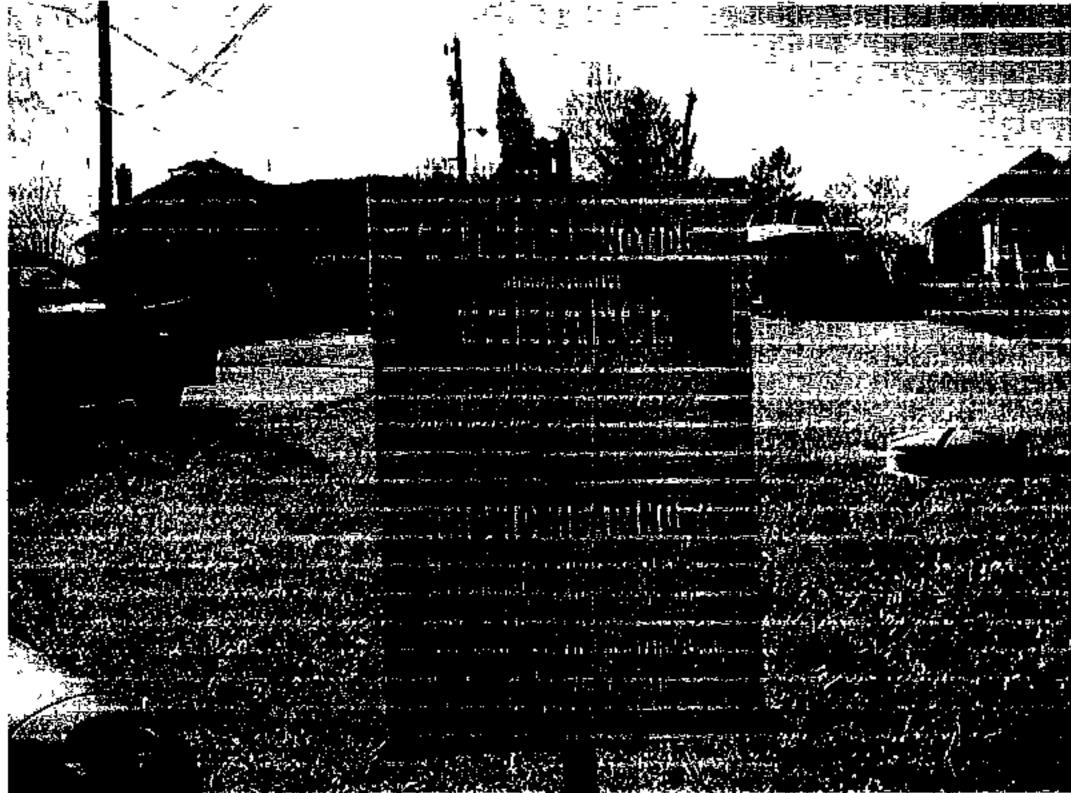

Zoning Review will ensure that the legal requirements for advertising are satisfied However, the petitioner is responsible for the costs associated with these requirements. The newspaper will bill the person listed below for the advertising. This advertising is due upon receipt and should be remitted directly to the newspaper.

The sign on the property must be changed giving notice of the hearing date, time and location. As when the sign was originally posted, certification of this change and a photograph of the altered sign must be forwarded to this office.

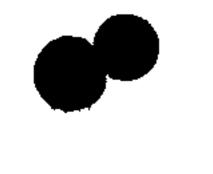

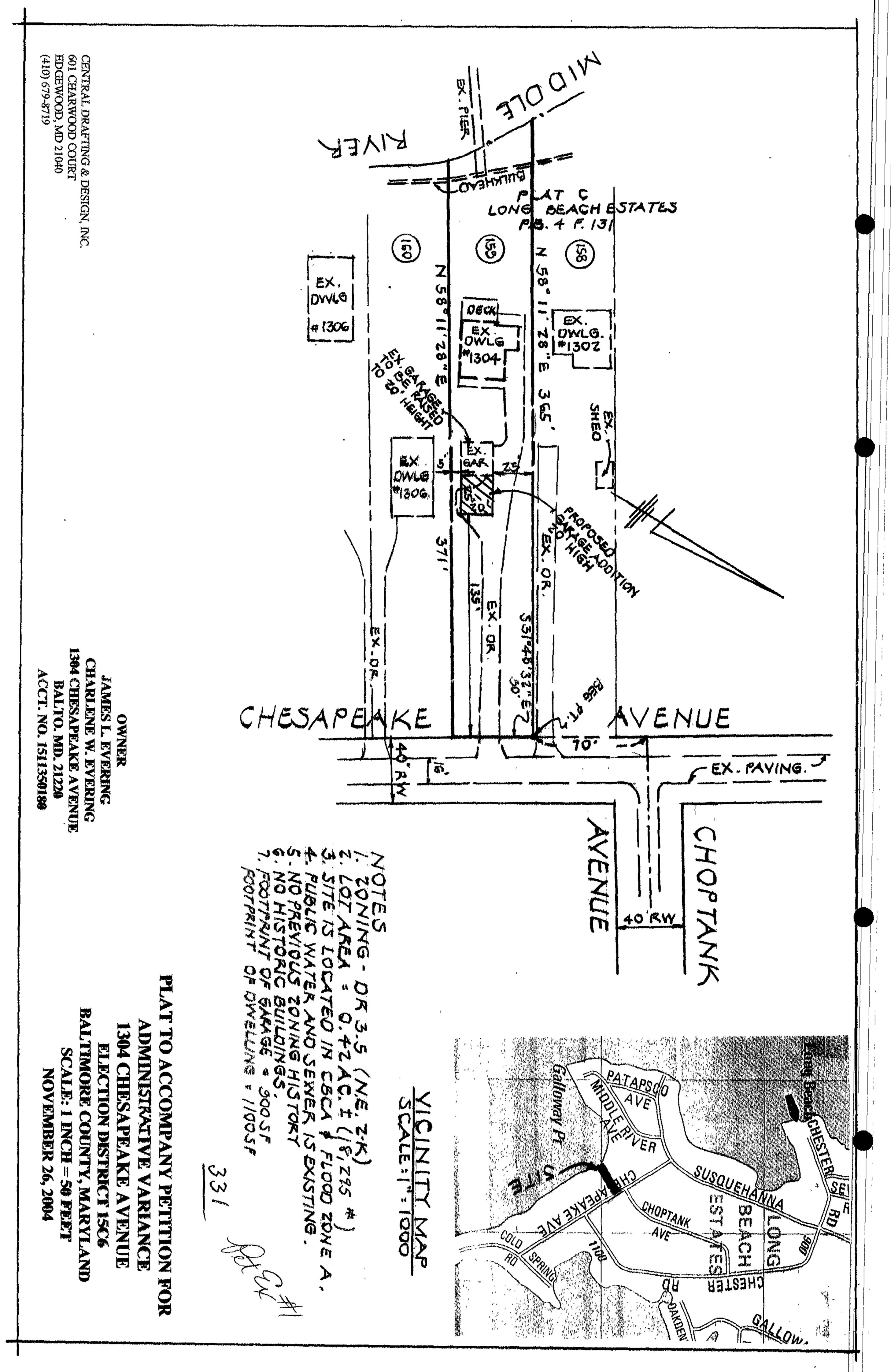

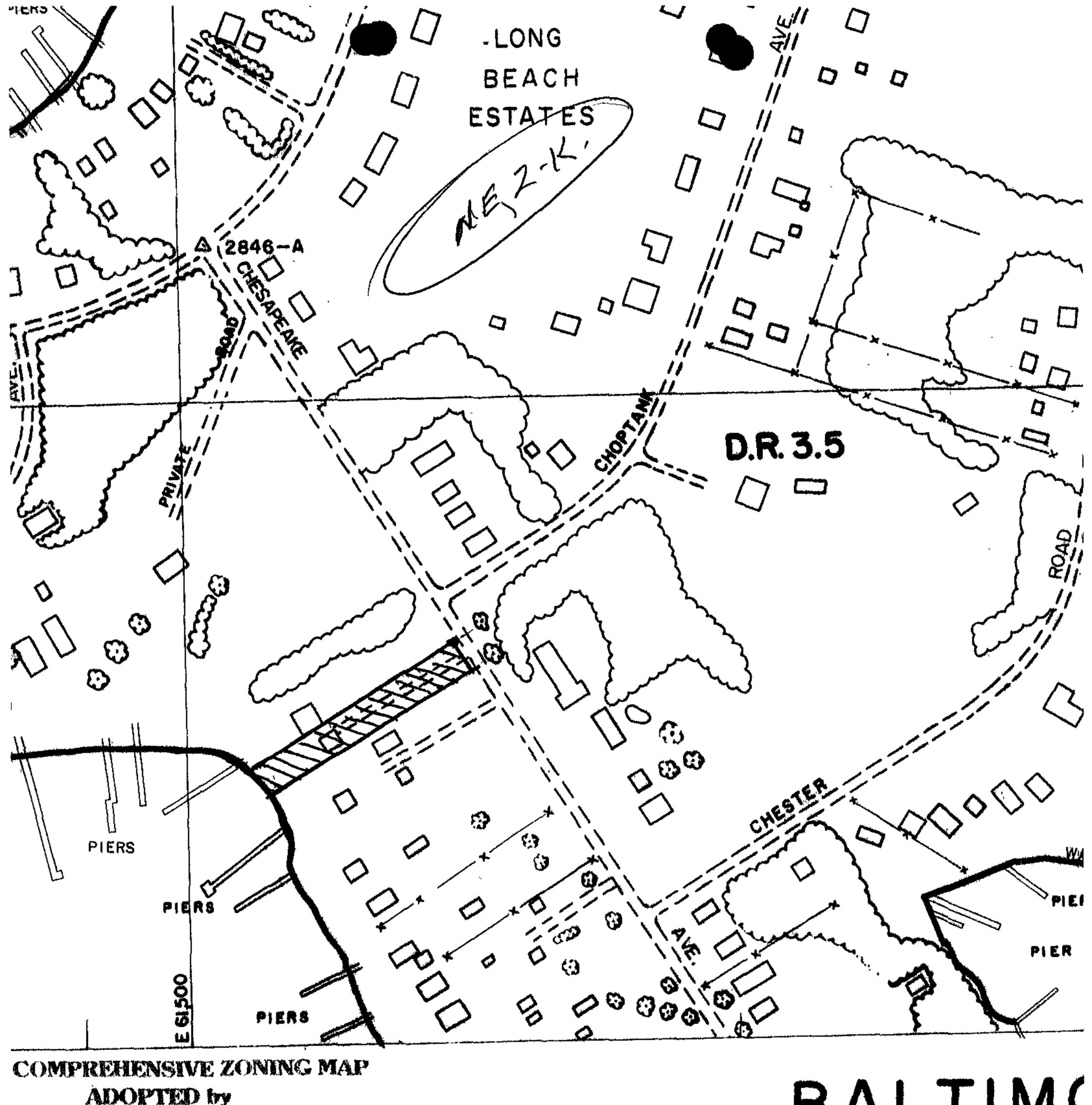
