ORDER

Petitioners, Paul and Linda Bonolis, are the legal owners of 1102 Back River Neck Road ("the property"). They petitioned for special hearing relief to approve the nonconforming use and continuation of truck storage in connection with a solid waste collection business at the property. The Zoning Commissioner for Baltimore County approved the petition for special hearing and issued an Order dated July 17, 2006 (Case 06-568-SPH). People's Counsel for Baltimore County appealed that decision to this County Board of Appeals.

Before that matter was heard by this Board, Petitioners filed, as an alternative, a petition for special exception per Baltimore County Zoning Regulation ("BCZR") Section 1A05.2.G to permit a garbage truck storage yard (where all work performed is that related to contracts with Baltimore County): as a use substantially similar in character and impact to a use permitted by special exception in the R.C. 20 zone (a public utility use not permitted by right per BCZR Section 1A05.2C.5). The Zoning Commissioner granted the special exception relief and issued an Order dated December 17, 2007 (Case 08-152-X). People's Counsel also appealed that decision to this Board.

In order to reach an amicable and reasonable resolution consistent with the law, Petitioners and People's Counsel reviewed the entire situation and arrived at a joint proposal to be presented to the Board for its review and approval. In addition, Petitioners have filed a rezoning request of the site in the 2008 CZMP. Petitioners agree in good faith to make known in writing to the County Council and the Planning Office that, in light of the resolution agreed to herein, they are not pursuing their request to rezone the site in the 2008 CZMP and in future CZMPs so long as the current trash hauling use exists. The parties set forth their proposed resolution in a letter dated February 20, 2008 from People's Counsel to the attorneys for Petitioners. Consistent with this resolution, they appeared before this Board on March 4, 2008, explained the background, submitted the February 20 letter as an exhibit, and orally made a Joint Motion requesting:

- 1) That this Board affirm the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law of the Zoning Commissioner in Case 08-152-X, Order dated December 17, 2007, approving the special exception relief, and incorporate into this Board's approval a red-lined Site Plan which lists the conditions and restrictions imposed by the Zoning Commissioner in his December 17, 2007 Order;
- 2) That Petitioner's special hearing petition (Case 06-658-SPH) be dismissed with prejudice, thus mooting People's Counsel's appeal of that case; and
- 3) That People's Counsel's appeal of the special exception case (Case No. 08-152-X) be dismissed with prejudice, in conjunction with the Order which follows.

Upon review of the record and the presentation made in open hearing, the County Board of Appeals is satisfied to enter the following order consistent with law,

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, by the County Board of Appeals for Baltimore County this 15th day of 1200, 2008 that the Petition for Special Exception, in Case No. 08-152-X pursuant to BCZR Section 1A05.2G to permit the use of the site for truck storage in connection with solid waste collection business, be and is hereby GRANTED, thereby reaffirming the Zoning Commissioner's Order and recognizing People's Counsel withdrawal of opposition, subject to the following restrictions,

- 1) The Petitioners may not expand the business to include private contract solid waste hauling.
- 2) The use shall cease at such time as the site ceases to be used under the contract with Baltimore County's Solid Waste Management Bureau or its successor.
- 3) The area to be utilized for the use shall be the area indicated on Petitioners' Exhibit 1 as the 1 1/2 story block and vinyl sided garage and the existing gravel drive area surrounding it between the grassed areas.
- 4) The existing truck trailer shall either be incorporated into a new permanent building approved by permit or shall be replaced by said building and removed from the property. In no event shall the existing truck trailer be allowed to remain as a free-standing storage structure or otherwise be permitted under the special exception use.
- 5) There shall be no major repairs to any of the commercial vehicles on the site, and no commercial vehicles shall be washed on site. Only minor repairs such as tires, hoses, belts, oil changes, windshield wipers, etc consistent with historic usage may be undertaken at the site.

6) At no time shall garbage, trash or debris associated with the business be permitted on the site.

7) The proposed storage area shall be screened and landscaped by fence or evergreen shrubs and trees in accord with a landscape plan to be approved by Baltimore County's Landscape Architect.

8) The Petitioners shall permit a representative of the Code Enforcement Division of the Department of Permits and Development Management (DPDM) reasonable access on the subject property to insure compliance with this Order.

9) A red-lined Site Plan listing the above restrictions be submitted and incorporated into the County's file.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that the Petition for Special Hearing in Case No. 06-658-SPH be and hereby is dismissed with prejudice, thereby also mooting People's Counsel's appeal.

Any appeal of this decision must be taken within thirty (30) days.

Thank you for meeting with us on January 29th regarding our appeals of the Zoning Commissioner's decisions in the above cases. Our office filed appeals of the approval of the use of the site, zoned R.C. 20, for a garbage truck storage yard in both of the above cases. They are now pending in the County Board of Appeals.

On July 17, 2006, the Zoning Commissioner approved Petitioners' Petition for Special Hearing for nonconforming use of truck storage in connection with a trash hauling business. (Case # 06-568-SPH). It is your position that the use began nearly 30 years ago when the site was zoned M.L.R. and continued through the rezoning to R.C. 20 in 1988, and that it then qualified as a "public utility" use. We disagreed.

In 2007, you filed a separate Petition for Special Exception for a garbage truck storage yard "similar" to a public utility use permitted by special exception in the R.C. 20 Zone (Case No. 8-152-X). Petitioners submitted they are under contract exclusively with Baltimore County and do not operate a private hauling business. The Zoning Commissioner granted the Petition for a Special Exception, subject to restrictions, finding that your client's trash hauling business is similar to a "public utility" use. Our office maintained the use is not a public utility *per se* and questioned the extent of similarity.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

*

This matter comes before the Zoning Commissioner for consideration of a Petition for a Special Exception filed by the owners of the subject property, Paul A. Bonolis and his wife, Linda D. Bonolis, by and through their attorneys, John B. Gontrum, Esquire, and Whiteford, Taylor & Preston, LLP. The Petitioners request approval of a special exception pursuant to Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) Section 1A05.2G for a garbage truck storage yard (where all work performed is that related to contracts with Baltimore County), as a use substantially similar in character and impact to a use permitted by special exception in the R.C.20 zone (a public utility use not permitted by right pursuant to B.C.Z.R. Section 1A05.2C.5). The subject property and requested relief are more particularly described on the site plan, which was accepted into evidence and marked as Petitioners' Exhibit 1.

Appearing at the requisite public hearing were Paul and Linda Bonolis, property owners, and J. Scott Dallas, property line surveyor, who prepared the site plan. Representing the Petitioners and owners was their attorney, John B. Gontrum, Esquire. There were no Protestants or other interested persons present.

The subject site under consideration was the subject of a prior zoning hearing in Case No. 06-568-SPH, wherein a non-conforming use of the site for truck storage in connection with a

solid waste collection business was granted, subject to conditions. That case is now on appeal to the County Board of Appeals. I am aware of the history of the site and the exhibits filed in that case (06-568-SPH) pertaining to the continued use of this site for garbage truck storage under a contract for trash hauling with Baltimore County.

The proffered testimony received from Petitioners' Counsel revealed that the subject site, which is comprised of two (2) parcels, totals approximately 0.715 acres, zoned R.C.20. The zoning was changed to R.C.20 as a result of the 1988 Comprehensive Zoning Map Process (C.Z.M.P.). Prior to December, 1988, and at the time of the commencement of the use, the property was zoned Manufacturing Light, Restricted (M.L.R.). The pertinent history of the existing use and improvements on the site for which the special exception is now sought is recited in my Order of July 17, 2006. As noted above, there have been no changes in either the use or improvements on the site since the issuance of those findings.

The evidence presented established that Mr. Bonolis has been a contract trash hauler for Baltimore County since 1979. He has stored his trucks, consisting of four (4) garbage trucks and two (2) pickup trucks on the gravel area situated along the side of the existing garage and between the garage and existing buildings since that time. The nature and extent of this use predates not only the change in zoning but also the enactment of the Chesapeake Bay Critical Area Regulations (CBCA).

In the instant case, as it was in the previous case, an understanding of the nature of the particular use is important. The garbage trucks are used strictly under the term of the county contract. The county regularly inspects the trucks for safety and utility. The two (2) pick-up trucks are used to navigate narrow alley ways to remove recyclable materials deposited in larger garbage trucks for disposition. The territory and dwellings served by Mr. Bonolis are

designated by the Bureau of Solid Waste Management within the Baltimore County Department of Public Works (DPW). DPW serves as the contractor with Mr. Bonolis and establishes his payment. The route is personal to Mr. Bonolis, and should he or his family cease to operate the business, the route would be available to others. DPW has been aware of Mr. Bonolis's operation and storage of trucks at the subject site since 1979.

Section 13-4-210 of the Baltimore County Code (B.C.C.) of 2003 states:

- (a) Authority of the Department of Public Works. "The Department of Public Works may:
 - (1) Contract for solid waste collection in such thickly populated places as it considers necessary;
 - (2) Have regulatory control of the persons employed as collectors of solid waste; and
 - (3) Report to the county any failure or delinquency of persons employed as collectors of solid waste.
- (b) Exempt from certain laws. In entering into contracts under this section, the Department of Public Works is exempt from the county purchasing laws and the requirement of competitive public bidding as authorized under Article 25A, Section 5A of the Annotated Code of Maryland." (Emphasis added.)

Section 103.5(C) of the B.C.Z.R. states:

"The county shall permit the continuation, but not necessarily the intensification or expansion, of any use in existence on June 13, 1988. If the existing use does not conform with the provisions of the local protection program, its intensification or expansion may be permitted only in accordance with Section 104.5 of these regulations and with the variance provisions and procedures outlined in Section 32-4-231, Section 33-2—205, or Section 33-2-603 of the Baltimore County Code, whichever is or are applicable."

It is clear from the record before me that the use proposed as a special exception at this location has not expanded or intensified since 1988. Mr. Bonolis has never been cited for a violation of the Chesapeake Bay Critical Area regulations at this location.

In Case No. 06-568-SPH I found that Mr. Bonolis was operating as a public utility at this location. The phrase "public utility" is not defined in the zoning regulations, and pursuant to Section 101 of the B.C.Z.R., the ordinarily accepted definition should be found in Webster's Third New International Dictionary of the English Language, Unabridged, where it is defined as follows: "a business organization deemed by law to be vested with public interest usually because of monopoly privileges and so subject to public regulation such as fixing of rates, standards of service and provision of facilities...." I found that Mr. Bonolis was providing a public service under the aegis of Baltimore County. The finding that his use constituted a public utility as well as the finding that the storage of vehicles used by the utility as a permitted use under the M.L.R. zone has been disputed on appeal.

In this case as presented, it is not necessary to make a finding that the use of the Bonolis property constitutes a public utility. B.C.Z.R. Section 1A05.2G allows by special exception in a R.C.20 zone: "Other uses substantially similar in character and impact to the uses ordinarily permitted by right or by special exception in the zone." Section 1A05.2C.3 allows the following uses by right without special exception: "Telephone, telegraph, electrical power or other similar lines or cables, all underground; underground gas, water or sewer mains or storm drains; other underground conduits, except underground interstate and intercontinental pipelines." Section 1A05.2C.5 then states that in a R.C.20 zone permitted by special exception are: "Public utility uses not permitted as of right, including underground or interstate pipelines." Since the only uses connected with public utilities otherwise mentioned in Section 1A05.2C are contained in Section 1A05.2C.3, it is reasonable to assume that "all other" means what it says, and that any other public utility uses not mentioned in Section 1A05.2C.3 require special exceptions.

Some indication of what these public utility uses might be is contained in B.C.Z.R. Section 1B01. Sections 1B01.1A.4 and 1B01.1A.5 list certain above and below ground utility systems permitted as of right in the D.R. zones. Section 1B01.1C.15 permits by special exception: "public utility uses other than those permitted as of right, but excluding steam power plants, service centers and storage yards." Both public utility service centers and public utility storage yards are permitted by special exception in subsections 16 and 17 of 1B01.1C.

The fact that public utility storage yards and service centers are explicitly excluded from the phrase "public utility uses other than those permitted as of right" for the purposes of the D.R. zones would indicate that such uses may generally be included as public utility uses but for an explicit exclusion. Consequently, I am led to conclude that when Section 1A05.2C.3 states that "all other" public utility uses require a special exception in the R.C.20 zone, public utility service centers and public utility service yards are permitted by special exception in the R.C.20 zone.

Based on Counsel's argument during the presentation and evidence produced, I do find that the use of the Bonolis property is sufficiently similar to a public utility use including the storage of trucks in character and impact as to permit a special exception for the use in a R.C.20 zone.

Section 502.1 of the B.C.Z.R. states the criteria under which a special exception may be evaluated. In this case it appears that this use at this location has not been injurious to the health, safety or general welfare of the community since its beginning nearly thirty (30) years ago. This track record of use at a site is unusual in a special exception request, but it is clear from the record in both cases pertaining to the use at this location that it has not caused any congestion to the roads, streets or alleys nor created a potential hazard. In addition, it is clear that the use has been confined to a relatively small area on the site consisting of approximately 8,000 square feet

on an already impervious area. No expansion or intensification of the use is sought. Accordingly, such use appears consistent with B.C.Z.R. Section 103.5C.

The property clearly falls within the Chesapeake Bay Critical Area boundaries as mapped in Baltimore County. The property, however, lies outside the 1,000 area required by state regulations. It contains no streams, forested area or wetlands. It presents no unique or special circumstances that would cause this use at this location to have more of a deleterious impact than at similarly zoned locations.

Additional landscaping or fencing of the site should be considered, however, in order to buffer the view from the adjoining Somogyi property, which has been before the County Council for county acquisition. I agree with DEPRM's comment on this issue. Mr. Bonolis has installed landscaping in the form of evergreen trees along the rear portion of the grassed area behind the house to screen the truck storage area from Back River Neck Road. That landscaping should be maintained. Mr. Bonolis has expressed interest in building a garage to house the trucks in the area on the site where they are now stored, and I would favor the construction of such building in the 8,000 square foot area, where storage now occurs over outside storage of the vehicles.

I am persuaded to grant the relief requested but in a very limited fashion. It is the limited use of this site for the storage of vehicles used under a county contract for trash hauling that persuades me that it is similar in character to public utility uses permitted by special exception in the zone. No trash storage should be allowed at the site nor should the site be considered a service garage for other than routine minor maintenance of the vehicles. Any cessation of the use of this property for trash hauling under the county contract shall effectively terminate the relief granted by this Order. In addition, any expansion of the use to other uses including private solid waste hauling even as an accessory use to the county residential contract would

require at the very least a special hearing to modify the special exception granted herein and may well not be permitted as a permitted use in the R.C.20 zone. Furthermore, any intensification of the use or expansion of the use to additional area may necessitate further review under both the zoning regulations and the Chesapeake Bay Critical Area Regulations.

Pursuant to the advertisement, posting of the property and public hearing on this Petition held, and for the reasons set forth above, the relief requested shall be granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, by the Zoning Commissioner for Baltimore County this _______ day of December, 2007 that the Petition for Special Exception filed pursuant to Section 1A05.2G of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.), to permit the use of the site for truck storage in connection with solid waste collection business, in accordance with Petitioners' Exhibit 1, be and is hereby GRANTED, subject to the following restrictions:

ORDER

Petitioners, Paul and Linda Bonolis, are the legal owners of 1102 Back River Neck Road ("the property"). They petitioned for special hearing relief to approve the nonconforming use and continuation of truck storage in connection with a solid waste collection business at the property. The Zoning Commissioner for Baltimore County approved the petition for special hearing and issued an Order dated July 17, 2006 (Case 06-568-SPH). People's Counsel for Baltimore County appealed that decision to this County Board of Appeals.

Before that matter was heard by this Board, Petitioners filed, as an alternative, a petition for special exception per Baltimore County Zoning Regulation ("BCZR") Section 1A05.2.G to permit a garbage truck storage yard (where all work performed is that related to contracts with Baltimore County): as a use substantially similar in character and impact to a use permitted by special exception in the R.C. 20 zone (a public utility use not permitted by right per BCZR Section 1A05.2C.5). The Zoning Commissioner granted the special exception relief and issued an Order dated December 17, 2007 (Case 08-152-X). People's Counsel also appealed that decision to this Board.

In order to reach an amicable and reasonable resolution consistent with the law, Petitioners and People's Counsel reviewed the entire situation and arrived at a joint proposal to be presented to the Board for its review and approval. In addition, Petitioners have filed a rezoning request of the site in the 2008 CZMP. Petitioners agree in good faith to make known in writing to the County Council and the Planning Office that, in light of the resolution agreed to herein, they are not pursuing their request to rezone the site in the 2008 CZMP and in future CZMPs so long as the current trash hauling use exists. The parties set forth their proposed resolution in a letter dated February 20, 2008 from People's Counsel to the attorneys for Petitioners. Consistent with this resolution, they appeared before this Board on March 4, 2008, explained the background, submitted the February 20 letter as an exhibit, and orally made a Joint Motion requesting:

- 1) That this Board affirm the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law of the Zoning Commissioner in Case 08-152-X, Order dated December 17, 2007, approving the special exception relief, and incorporate into this Board's approval a red-lined Site Plan which lists the conditions and restrictions imposed by the Zoning Commissioner in his December 17, 2007 Order;
- 2) That Petitioner's special hearing petition (Case 06-658-SPH) be dismissed with prejudice, thus mooting People's Counsel's appeal of that case; and
- 3) That People's Counsel's appeal of the special exception case (Case No. 08-152-X) be dismissed with prejudice, in conjunction with the Order which follows.

Upon review of the record and the presentation made in open hearing, the County Board of Appeals is satisfied to enter the following order consistent with law,

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, by the County Board of Appeals for Baltimore County this 15[†] day of 100, 2008 that the Petition for Special Exception, in Case No. 08-152-X pursuant to BCZR Section 1A05.2G to permit the use of the site for truck storage in connection with solid waste collection business, be and is hereby GRANTED, thereby reaffirming the Zoning Commissioner's Order and recognizing People's Counsel withdrawal of opposition, subject to the following restrictions,

- 1) The Petitioners may not expand the business to include private contract solid waste hauling.
- 2) The use shall cease at such time as the site ceases to be used under the contract with Baltimore County's Solid Waste Management Bureau or its successor.
- 3) The area to be utilized for the use shall be the area indicated on Petitioners' Exhibit 1 as the 1 1/2 story block and vinyl sided garage and the existing gravel drive area surrounding it between the grassed areas.
- 4) The existing truck trailer shall either be incorporated into a new permanent building approved by permit or shall be replaced by said building and removed from the property. In no event shall the existing truck trailer be allowed to remain as a free-standing storage structure or otherwise be permitted under the special exception use.
- 5) There shall be no major repairs to any of the commercial vehicles on the site, and no commercial vehicles shall be washed on site. Only minor repairs such as tires, hoses, belts, oil changes, windshield wipers, etc consistent with historic usage may be undertaken at the site.

6) At no time shall garbage, trash or debris associated with the business be permitted on the site.

7) The proposed storage area shall be screened and landscaped by fence or evergreen shrubs and trees in accord with a landscape plan to be approved by Baltimore

County's Landscape Architect.

8) The Petitioners shall permit a representative of the Code Enforcement Division of

the Department of Permits and Development Management (DPDM) reasonable access on

the subject property to insure compliance with this Order.

9) A red-lined Site Plan listing the above restrictions be submitted and incorporated

into the County's file.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that the Petition for Special Hearing in Case No. 06-

658-SPH be and hereby is dismissed with prejudice, thereby also mooting People's

Counsel's appeal.

Any appeal of this decision must be taken within thirty (30) days.
