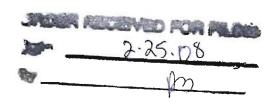

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter comes before this Deputy Zoning Commissioner for consideration of a Petition for Variance filed by the legal owner of the subject property, John Icenroad. Petitioner is requesting variance relief from Section 400.3 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) to permit an accessory building (existing garage) with a height of 20 feet in lieu of the maximum allowed 15 feet. The subject property and the requested relief are more fully described on the site plan which was marked and accepted into evidence as Petitioner's Exhibit 1.

Appearing at the requisite public hearing in support of the variance request was Petitioner John Icenroad and Timothy P. Knepp, Esquire, attorney for Petitioner. There were no Protestants or other interested persons in attendance at the hearing.

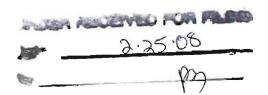
This matter is currently the subject of an active violation case (Case No. 07-8712) in the Division of Code Inspections and Enforcement. A citation for code violation was issued on July 23, 2007 for failure to obtain a building permit before building the garage. It should be noted that the fact that a code violation is issued is generally not considered in a zoning case. Zoning enforcement is conducted by the Department of Permits and Development Management, which has the authority to issue Correction Notices and Citations, and to impose fines and other penalties for violation of law. On the other hand, the role of this office in this matter is to decide the



discreet legal issue of whether Petitioner is entitled to the requested variance relief pertaining to the subject property.

Testimony and evidence offered revealed that the subject property is a rectangular-shaped property containing approximately .38 acre, more or less, zoned D.R.5.5. The property is located on the north side of Riverside Road west of Mace Avenue in the Back River Highlands subdivision in the Essex area of Baltimore County. The property is approximately 83 feet wide by 200 feet deep, and is improved with Petitioner's existing two-story single-family dwelling located at the southwest corner of the property, approximately 10 feet from the west and 40 feet from the south ends of the property. Petitioner has already performed substantial construction on the structure which is the subject of the petition -- an approximately 17 foot by 48 foot garage centered approximately 10 feet from the northern end of the property. The garage stands approximately 20 feet in height and has a front bump out in the middle of the second story of the structure. A photograph of the garage produced by Petitioner was marked and accepted into evidence as Petitioner's Exhibit 2.

Petitioner at one time lived at 144 Riverside Road for 35 years before moving approximately two years ago to the subject property. Petitioner's friends and family surround his property as his brother currently resides at 142 Riverside Road, and his close friend Jim Kaetzel lives at 140 Riverside Road. Petitioner indicated that the reason he decided to build the garage is that he needs space to store various large items that he owns, including a trailer with two jet skis, an antique speedboat, a Corvette convertible, and a Saab convertible. Without a large garage, it will be necessary to keep these possessions outside on Petitioner's property, which will not be visually appealing. Moreover, there is insufficient space to store items in Petitioner's house since the small storage area in the basement has repeatedly flooded after heavy rainstorms.



Further testimony revealed that attaching a garage of this magnitude to the existing dwelling is not practical or feasible. The separate location actually places the garage further from the surrounding dwellings, and does not detract from the structure and appearance of Petitioner's home or the surrounding locale. The evidence showed that there was a previous garage on approximately the same footprint as the proposed structure. The proposed structure, which is already under construction, while bigger than the garages of the surrounding homes, is being constructed in a manner that blends in with garages throughout the community. In addition, while a number of surrounding lots are 50 feet in width, Petitioner's lot is akin to a "double" lot, measuring 83 feet in width. Petitioner has spent approximately \$6,000.00 to construct the garage, and has improved the structure by building with a six inch layer of concrete instead of the one inch of concrete that was used in the old structure.

The Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were received and are contained within the case file. Comments were received from the Office of Planning dated December 11, 2007, which indicates that it does not oppose Petitioner's request. The comments indicate that the accessory structure may not be converted into a dwelling unit or apartment, may not contain any sleeping quarters, living area, kitchen or bathroom facilities, and may not be used for commercial purposes. In addition, the comments request installation of a dense evergreen screen along the rear wall of the garage adjacent to the neighboring residential lots.

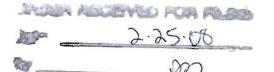
Considering all of the testimony and evidence presented, I find special circumstances or conditions exist that are peculiar to the land or structure which is the subject of this variance request. The area in question consists of a tight knit group of Petitioner's family and friends that have voiced no objection to the construction of the garage. Petitioner owns numerous large items that would be stored on the property in plain view if a sizeable garage were not constructed. Thus, the existing structure actually improves the appearance of the surrounding neighborhood by



storing Petitioner's possessions in an organized fashion, and the garage is more structurally sound since Petitioner used a thicker layer of concrete to form the foundation. If the garage cannot be built in excess of the 15-foot maximum imposed by Section 400.3 of the B.C.Z.R., then Petitioner will not be able to store his large possessions.

I also find that the imposition of zoning ordinances disproportionably impacts the subject property as compared to others in the zoning district. The layout of the existing home does not lend itself to an attached addition, and the only way for Petitioner to construct a storage space large enough for his possessions is to build a separate structure. I further find that strict compliance with the Zoning Regulations for Baltimore County would result in practical difficulty or unreasonable hardship since Petitioner would not be able to fit the trailers for his antique speedboat and jet skis in the garage if it is not built to a height greater than the 15-foot maximum specified in Section 400.3. Also, Petitioner has spent a considerable amount of money building a structurally sound garage that appears similar to surrounding structures and blends in with the existing neighborhood. Finally, I find this variance can be granted in strict harmony with the spirit and intent of said regulations, and in such manner as to grant relief without injury to the public health, safety and general welfare. The subject property is in an established neighborhood in Essex where Petitioner has lived for almost 40 years and is currently surrounded by friends and family. None of the adjacent property owners voiced any objection to the request and there was no evidence that the addition will have any detrimental impacts on the health, safety, or general welfare of the surrounding locale. Thus, I am persuaded that the request meets the requirements of Section 307 of the B.C.Z.R, as established in *Cromwell v. Ward*, 102 Md.App. 691 (1995).

Pursuant to the advertisement, posting of the property, and public hearing on this petition held, and after considering the testimony and evidence offered, I find that Petitioner's variance request should be granted.



THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED this 45day of February 2008, by this Deputy Zoning Commissioner, that Petitioner's variance request from Section 400.3 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) to permit an accessory building (existing garage) with a height of 20 feet in lieu of the maximum allowed 15 feet is hereby GRANTED subject to the following:

- 1. Petitioner is advised that he may apply for any required building permits and be granted same upon receipt of this Order; however, Petitioner is hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at his own risk until such time as the 30-day appellate process from this Order has expired. If, for whatever reason, this Order is reversed, Petitioner would be required to return, and be responsible for returning, said property to its original condition.
- 2. Petitioner or subsequent owners shall not convert the subject accessory structure into a dwelling unit or apartment. The structure shall not contain any sleeping quarters, living area, kitchen or bathroom facilities.
- 3. The accessory structure shall not be used for commercial purposes.
- 4. Petitioner shall provide a dense evergreen screen along the rear wall of the garage adjacent to the neighboring residential lots. This will reduce the impact of the mass of the rear wall on the homes on Poplar Road.
- 5. Petitioner shall install two operating windows side by side in the front bump out of the second floor of the garage to limit the visual impact of the bump out and the siding.

Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

I used to store personal items in the basement of my home; however, during the last major hurricane my basement flooded which damaged all of the items I stored in the basement. Also, whenever we have three hard days of rain my basement gets a lot of water in it so that I can no longer use it for storage. I want to move all of my storage items to the garage. There is not enough storage remaining in my house.

I made the pitch of the roof slightly steeper to keep out the water when it rains.

I own a trailer with two jet-skis on it and a trailer with a jet boat on it. I also have a show car which I keep on a trailer. These three items should be stored in the garage instead of outside on my lawn. I want to store these items in my garage by backing them in and leaving the jet-skies and jet boat and show car on the trailer. I need additional height for this. I also keep my personal car which is a SAAB Convertible in the garage. The doors of the garage are 10' tall and need a little extra height to open.

I like to put everything in my garage to make the yard and neighborhood look much better. The garage is built on existing footers which held an old garage which was in extremely poor shape.

Attaching this garage to the existing house is not practical because the garage is sitting 48 feet across the width of the property and would make the house appear most odd in shape. The house would become excessively long compared to the width of the property. It also would be poor use of space and design. The garage looks much better in appearance where it is presently built and fits better on the property site and complements the rest of the neighborhood.

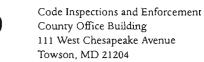

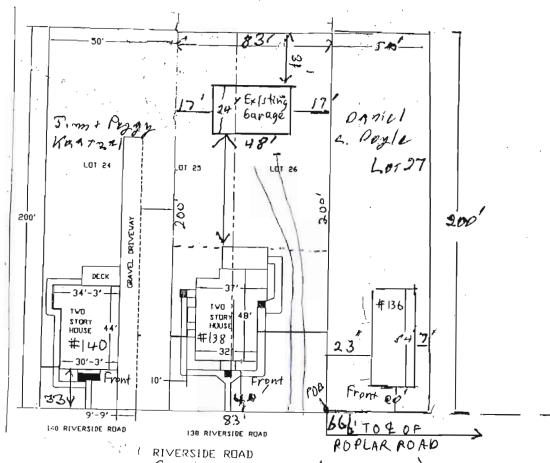

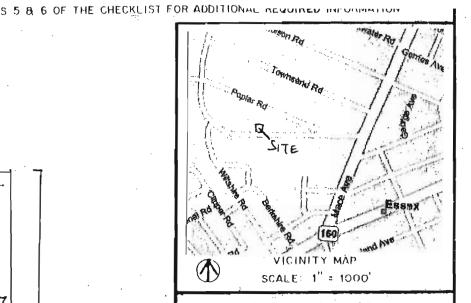
