OPINION

This case comes to the Board on appeal of the final decision of the Zoning Commissioner of Baltimore County under the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (BCZR)

Section 1A01.2.C(4), (6) & (23), for use of an existing building for religious worship, school and camp as a spiritual religious retreat center, which the Zoning Commissioner denied, as well as the final decision on the Petition for Special Hearing to approve a modified parking plan, pursuant to 409.12 of the BCZR, which was dismissed as moot.

A *de novo* public hearing was held before this Board on October 14, 2009. The Petitioner appeared before the Board *pro se*. The Protestants, Patricia R. Fallon and Barbara D. Ambrose, were represented by J. Carroll Holzer, Esquire. A Public Deliberation was held immediately after the hearing of the case by the Board.

Factual Background

At the outset, Petitioners, abandoned their request to use the subject property for worship, school, and a camp. They maintained however, their request for Special Exception approval of the religious retreat center and the Special Hearing request for the modified parking plan.

Testimony and Evidence

Robert L. Brantley, Petitioner, testified on his own behalf. He described the three (3) acres of the subject property as well as the services provided there by him and his wife. He

discussed their use of the internet as well as their general marketing plans and process. He described himself and his wife as "counselors"; he noted that he is a clergyman and financial advisor, while his wife is a clinical physiologist.

He related the services performed by them at the subject location, stating that although they were not a church, they nevertheless worked to bring "reconciliation" to couples and small groups. He further noted that they do in fact, hold occasional prayer meetings as part of these activities.

He described his wife's practice, relating her office hours of 9:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m., and observing that the maximum number of people seen by her each week was approximately twenty (20) in number.

He testified that he primarily traveled to his clients, but that there was parking at the subject site for approximately twenty (20) vehicles on a gravel lot. In conclusion, he explained that there functioning retreat center was a quiet, confidential place to escape the problems of life; and receive "quite professional" help and mediation services among the beauty of nature, primarily on walking pads and sitting areas throughout the property.

Astra Brantley testified briefly on her own behalf to confirm primarily the testimony of her husband. She described her practice and observed they often carried out their activities and counseling services while walking the property with her patience.

Decision

The Board will not address the relief originally requested by Petitioners relating to the use of the subject site for religious worship, a school and a camp, as these requests were withdrawn by Petitioners at the hearing before the Board.

The remaining Special Exception request for religious retreat center is governed by the rather lengthy and detailed requirements set out in Section 502.1 of the BCZR: That sections reads as follows:

§502.1—Before any Special Exception may be granted, it must appear that the use for which the Special Exception is requested will not:

- A. Be detrimental to the health, safety, or general welfare of the locality involved;
- B. Tend to create congestion in roads, streets or alleys therein;
- C. Create a potential hazard from fire, panic or other dangers;
- D. Tend to overcrowd land and cause undue concentration of population;
- E. Interfere with adequate provisions for schools, parks, water, sewerage, transportation or other public requirements, conveniences, or improvements;
- F. Interfere with adequate light and air;
- G. Be inconsistent with the purposes of the property's zoning classification nor in any other way inconsistent with the spirit and intent of these Zoning Regulations;
- H. Be inconsistent with the impermeable surface and vegetative retention provisions of these Zoning Regulations; nor
- I. Be detrimental to the environmental and natural resources of the site and vicinity including forests, streams, wetlands, aquifers and floodplains in an R.C. 2, R.C. 4, R.C. 5 or R.C. 7 Zone.

Petitioners failed to address any of the above requirements, either in their testimony or through one or more expert witnesses. Accordingly, there is no basis for the Board to grant the request Special Exception relief.

As a result of the failure to secure the requested Special Exception, the Special Hearing relief for a modified parking plan is rendered moot. It should be noted however, for the record, that Petitioners also failed to address in any way the requirements for a Special Hearing as to

parking set out in Section 409.12 of the BCZR, by way of the requirements of Section 409.8(a) and (b) of the BCZR.

Accordingly, the Board unanimously denies Petitioners request for Special Exception relief and determines that the Petition for Special Hearing for a modified parking plan is therefore rendered moot.

ORDER

THEREFORE, IT IS THIS 26th day of March, 2010, by the County Board of Appeals of Baltimore County

ORDERED that the Petition for Special Exception for use of an existing building for religious worship, school and camp as a spiritual religious retreat center per Baltimore County Zoning Regulations Section 1A01.2.C(4), (6) & (23), as amended at the hearing before the Board of Appeals on October 19, 2009 in case number 09-042-SPHX, be and the same is hereby **DENIED**; and it is further,

ORDERED that the Petitioner's request for Special Hearing to approve a modified parking plan pursuant to 409.12 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations, be and is hereby **DISMISSED AS MOOT**.

Any petition for judicial review from this decision must be made in accordance with Rule 7-201 through Rule 7-210 of the *Maryland Rules*.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter comes before the Zoning Commissioner for consideration of Petitions for Special Hearing and Special Exception filed by Robert Brantley, and his wife, Astra P. Brantley, legal owners, through their attorney, Sebastian A. Cross, Esquire. The Petitioners request a Special Hearing, pursuant to Section 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.), to approve a modified parking plan as provided for in Section 409.12 of the B.C.Z.R. In addition, special exception relief is requested pursuant to B.C.Z.R. Sections 1A01.2C(4), (6) and (23) in order to use an existing building for religious worship, school and camp as a spiritual religious retreat center. The subject property and requested relief are more particularly described on the site plan, which was accepted into evidence and marked as Petitioners' Exhibit 2.

Appearing at the requisite public hearing in support of the requests were Robert Brantley, property owner, and Matthew T. Allen, a Professional Engineer, with Bohler Engineering, P.C. As noted above, the Petitioners were represented by Sebastian A. Cross, Esquire of Gildea & Schmidt, LLC. The issues presented in this case generated significant public interest, and a number of individuals from the surrounding community appeared and/or testified in opposition to the request, namely S. Glenn Elseroad, George P. Neubeck, Jr., an officer of the Hanover Road Association, Carol D. Isaac, Sandra M. Brown, Robert Slaterbeck, Charlotte Coarts, Charlene L. Hughes, John R. Lorenz, Paul R. and Frances C. Joyce. J. Carroll Holzer, Esquire

appeared as attorney for the adjoining property owner, Patricia R. Fallon, and Barbara D. Ambrose.

By way of background, the property referred to as Near Haven at 14821 Hanover Pike in the Upperco area of northern Baltimore County has been the subject of Code Enforcement actions pursuant to Section 3-6-205 of the Baltimore County Code (B.C.C.). It is the activities generated by uses other than those normally associated with a single-family dwelling, which is the subject of the instant request. In this regard, the County Enforcement Hearing Officer, on June 24, 2008, ordered the Petitioners that "there shall be no activities allowed on the subject site except for those associated with single-family dwelling uses." Aggrieved by this decision, the Brantley's retained Counsel and now seek a determination that the uses they propose are permitted within the zone.

An extensive volume of testimony and evidence was offered by both sides over the two (2) hearing dates, namely September 24, 2008 and February 25, 2009. Due to limitations of time and space, it is impossible to repeat all of the testimony offered herein. Additionally, there were numerous documents, photographs, plats, written memoranda, and other exhibits entered into the record of this case. I shall summarize only the relevant evidence presented.

The subject property is a rectangular shaped parcel (147' wide x 871' deep) containing 2.95 acres on the east side of Hanover Pike (MD Route 30), just south of Old Hanover Road and zoned R.C.2. This lot, identified on Maryland Tax Map 31 as Parcel 353, was created in 1998 through a Minor Subdivision of a 6-acre tract by Joan Morgan. The subject property was purchased from Ms. Morgan by Craig Garrett, who built a two-story, cape code, single-family dwelling that was centrally located on the property. He took great pride in landscaping the lot

placing evergreen trees in the side yards, gardens in the rear yard and a fruit orchard between the front of the house and Hanover Pike. Due to the narrowness of the property, Mr. Garrett filed a Petition for Variance, Case No. 00-284-A. This was done to allow an addition (garage) to be built on the south side of the house. Then Deputy Zoning Commissioner Timothy M. Kotroco, by his Order dated February 4, 2000, granted the variance allowing a side yard setback of 3 feet in lieu of the minimum required 35 feet. Inherent in the relief granted was the Order's restriction that "the Petitioner or subsequent owners shall not allow or cause the garage to be converted to a second dwelling unit and/or apartment." The Petitioners, Robert and Dr. Astra Brantley, purchased the property from Mr. Garrett in September 2004. The property, which they would name "Near Haven", was bought in large part due to its "perfect setting" that they believed would provide an environment for psychological, spiritual and whole health services that they intended to offer to their clients. They advertise Near Haven as being fronted by fruit orchards; the 3-acres features a prayer garden, a meditative walking labyrinth, and an organic vegetable garden in the rear. Mr. Brantley described the property as being distinguished from others by virtue of its symphony of decorative flowers and shrubbery that are frequently visited by local birds and exotic butterflies. He plans for small groups (between two [2] and ten [10]) to use the home as a sanctuary for religious and spiritual retreats. He discussed the need to provide Christian counseling and guidance to clergy, church members and families on central issues in their lives, be it personal or financial. Testimony and evidence indicates that the "existing building for religious worship" referred to in the Petition for Special Exception is the accessory addition (garage) involved in Case No. 00-284-A and now referred to by the Petitioners and their engineer as the "in-law attachment/Living Well Suite" and shown on the site plan (Petitioners' Exhibit 2) as a "proposed church" (25 people).

Robert Brantley testified that he is an ordained Minister of the Gospel of Jesus Christ with 25 years of experience as a strategic planner in management and financial planning holding

a B.S. degree in Business and Economics from Illinois College and an M.B.A. degree from the Northwestern University. Astra Brantley, a licensed Clinical Psychologist, holds a B.A. degree in Psychology from DePaul University, an M.S. Ed. degree in Guidance and Counseling from Chicago State University and a Doctor of Psychology degree from Central Michigan University and a member of the American Association of Christian Counselors. The subject property (14821 Hanover Pike) functions as the Brantley's home and is listed by the Department of Assessments and Taxation's Charter Division as the business location for "The Brantley Group", providing Christian Management and Mental Health Services; "Bridge Point Ministries", providing Christian, Bible-based, Christ-centered, spirit-led ministry; "The Brantley Group, LLC" – to engage in any lawful activities permitted by a Limited Liability Company organized under the laws of the State of Maryland; the "Justice University Foundation, Inc." to fund global efforts, educating people toward transforming imperfect social systems into structures of justice; and "The Universal Peacemakers Foundation, Inc.".2 There was controversy between the Petitioners and Protestants over the extent of actual collaborative services being provided for at the site by the Petitioners (and their contract providers – i.e., acupuncture, massage therapy, etc.) and a lengthy list of *other* advertised services. Protestants Exhibits 1 through 16.

Mr. Allen, accepted as an expert in the field of civil engineering and zoning, testified that he was retained by the Brantleys to prepare the site plan, review the deed and zoning on the property, conduct a site visit, prepare an aerial overlay photographic exhibit (Petitioners' Exhibit 1) and determine, after talking with Mr. Brantley, Managing Director of the Brantley Group, what was being proposed at the site. He opined that what was being considered was a spiritual religious retreat or center that is not defined in the definitional section of the B.C.Z.R. He

testified that he broke down the activities conducted at this site over the past four (4) years and determined that they equate or share characteristics of a church or other building for religious worship, camps, including day camps and schools similar to what was allowed under B.C.Z.R. Section 1A01.2(C) by special exception in the Loyola College case that involved 53 acres of R.C.2 land in northern Baltimore County. See People's Counsel for Baltimore County v. Loyola College in Maryland, 406 Md. 54 (2008). In his opinion, the subject property is in a relatively rural area. Although residential homes and uses are located along Hanover Pike to the north and south of the subject property, it is otherwise surrounded to the east by Dale Trump's black angus cattle farm and the farm property of Glenn Elseroad. To the west, on the opposite side of Md. Route 30, is the 100-acre Brathuhn Farm. It was Mr. Allen's opinion that since the site is very open with significant vegetation along the property lines and no structural changes contemplated at the site, that the requested special exception use will not have a detrimental impact upon the health, safety, and general welfare of the locale. He then addressed drive aisle and parking requirements for religious worship (one space for every four [4] seats – 25 seats proposed equals seven [7]) plus two (2) required parking spaces for residential use. In Mr. Allen's opinion, seven (7) parking spaces were adequate as the B.C.Z.R. contains no parking requirements for the associated camp activities.

Special exception uses are regulated in the B.C.Z.R. under Section 502.1 thereof. Due to the importance of that Section, it will be recited here:

"Before any special exception may be granted, it must appear that the use for which the special exception is requested will not:

- A) be detrimental to the health, safety or general welfare of the locality involved;
- B) tend to create congestion in roads, streets or alleys therein;
- C) create a potential hazard from fire, panic or other danger;
- D) tend to overcrowd land and cause undue concentration of population;

- E) interfere with adequate provisions for schools, parks, water, sewerage, transportation or other public requirements, conveniences or improvements;
- F) interfere with adequate light and air (Bill No. 45-1982);
- G) be inconsistent with the purposes of the property's zoning classification nor in any other way inconsistent with the spirit and intent of these zoning regulations (Bill No. 45-1982);
- H) be inconsistent with the impermeable surface and vegetative retention provisions of these zoning regulations; nor (Bill No. 45-1982)
- I) be detrimental to the environmental and natural resources of the site and vicinity including forests, streams, wetlands, aquifers and floodplains in an R.C.2, R.C.4, R.C.5 or R.C.7 zone (Bill No. 74-2000)."

The highest courts of this State have reviewed the treatment of proposed special exception and conditional uses by various local zoning boards and commissions. The seminal case regarding special exceptions is *Shultz v. Pritts*, 291 Md. 1 432 A2d 1319 (1981). In that case, the Court noted that a special exception use is part of the comprehensive zoning plan and thus, shares the legal presumption that it is in the interest of the general welfare and therefore valid. The Court noted that a special exception use is a valid zoning mechanism that delegates to an administrative board or body a limited authority to allow certain enumerated uses which the legislature (in this case, the Baltimore County Council) has determined to be permissible, absent any facts or circumstances which negate that presumption.

The Court further noted that the applicant for a proposed special exception use does not have the burden of establishing affirmatively that the proposal would be of benefit to the community. Moreover, the test is not whether another use is more preferable or whether the property could be used for a higher or better purpose. Rather, the test to be considered by the local administrative body (Zoning Commissioner) is whether the neighboring properties in the general neighborhood would be adversely affected and whether the proposed use in this particular case is in harmony with the general purposes and intent of the underlying zoning scheme.

The Court of Appeals of Maryland further explained the special exception test in Mossberg v. Montgomery Co., 329 Md. 494, 620 A2d 886 (1993). In that case, an applicant sought approval for a solid waste transfer station in Montgomery County. That use was a conditional/special exception use under the relevant Montgomery County ordinance. In its written opinion, the Court noted that there were certain inherent negative uses associated with any solid waste transfer station. For example, such a station would be expected to produce traffic, noise, dust, etc. Moreover, it could be presumed that such impacts would negatively affect surrounding properties. However, although such presumptions are valid, the Court emphasized that the existence of these impacts did not provide a sufficient basis for the local administrative body to deny the Petition for Special Exception. Instead, the Court reasoned that the local body must show that those impacts are greater at the subject location than would normally be associated with such use. That is, the criteria is not whether the proposed use carries with it adverse impacts (such adverse impacts are assumed in the first instance by designating the use a special exception rather than by right). Rather, the test is whether that impact at the subject property will produce effects above and beyond those normally inherent with such a use if located anywhere else within the same zoning district. considering the present application, it is not enough to simply conclude that the proposed religious retreat center with its associated school and camp will produce noise, traffic and the site of additional cars parked around the Brantley residence that could adversely affect the neighborhood. It most certainly will, and such an effect is inherent in any religious worship activity as contemplated here. The real standard as recently explained by our highest Court in People's Counsel v. Loyola, supra is whether the mixed use of a church, school, camp, religious retreat, and other advertised private services within the Resource Conservation Zone at this location would cause adverse effects upon adjoining and surrounding properties that are unique and different, in kind or degree, than those inherently associated with such a use regardless of its location. In other words, would these adverse effects cause a real detriment to the neighborhood.

As noted above, numerous individuals appeared in opposition to the request. Testifying in Mr. Holzer's case against the requested relief were Barbara D. Ambrose, George P. Neubeck, Jr., S. Glenn Elseroad, Sandra M. Brown and Patricia R. Fallon. These witnesses each offered their own individual testimony, but the clear tenor and theme of their remarks was that the Petitioners should not be granted special exception or conditional use approval to operate a religious retreat and other private practices on such a narrow lot, as the operation would be clearly visible and a detriment to the general welfare of the community and adjacent residences. Ms. Ambrose utilized a power point presentation (Protestants Exhibit 3) to show a number of adverse affects upon adjoining property values including the following: impacts on septic field capacity, inadequate access for emergency response vehicles, parking of vehicles on neighboring land and lawn areas (traffic issues), documentation for internet advertisement of 20 services (See Protestants Exhibits 3 and 5), camping activities outside of Near Haven boundaries, placement of tents and spot-a-pots along adjacent property boundary lines, etc. She testified that these impacts are particularly severe here, due to the proximity of her home 35 feet away. Similarly, Mr. Neubeck stated that the proposed activities were considered by the Hanover Road Association membership and found to be incompatible and inconsistent with the Association's Community Plan and the Hanover Corridor Study. He thought the uses would exploit the area and would be difficult, if not impossible to control. Mr. Elseroad, a community leader and past-President of the Hanover Road Association, gave testimony that encompassed a broad overview as to the reasons he and the community are recommending against approval of this special exception. The proposed activities that would be repeated week after week, month after month, on a lot size and configuration that is 147 feet wide would certainly infringe upon the neighboring property values and affect the quality of life of those in close proximity. By way of example, he explained that

while on his farm, behind the Trump farm, he hears noise, sees lights, tents, and the spot-a-pots next to the Trumps beautifully maintained property. He also stated that based on his personal experience with religious faith-based groups and given the extent of advertisement generated by the Brantley Group, he projects rapid expansion of the Bridge Point Ministries that will lead to more problems. Finally, Sandra Brown and Patricia Fallon gave corroborating testimony and opinions that the advertised activities, are of a business nature rather than church counseling. Ms. Brown, a beautician, whose home, also on R.C.2 land a half mile away, finds it disturbing that she is prohibited from operating a beauty salon from her residence, while the Brantleys advertise a host of business activities, which she states are disguised as pastoral destinations.

In rebuttal, Mr. Cross questioned, to no avail, the witnesses as to the feasibility of entering into an agreement or formal covenants with the Hanover Road Association and neighbors that would limit Petitioners activities and use of the property. Mr. Elseroad stated that while the Hanover Road Association is usually amenable to an amicable resolution, he did not believe that it was possible or practical to enforce the number of people or activities allowed on private property. He stated normally what happens is the community ultimately ends up with the burden of being required to enforce the limitations imposed.

As noted in the discussion above regarding the law of special exceptions, the undersigned is required to focus upon the impacts of the proposed use and how they particularly affect the locality involved. The undersigned has reviewed the proposal in that light, and I find that the Special Exception request has failed to meet the test set out in B.C.Z.R. Section 502.1.A & I. There are two (2) factors that justify this conclusion. First, in this instance a religious business retreat with its accompanying indoor and outdoor activities at this location will be detrimental to the health, safety and general welfare of the locality involved based on the evidence received. The number of advertised services "holistic clinical services, acupuncture therapy, massage therapy, acoustic therapy, mediation training, personal fitness training, stress self defense,

financial and estate planning, annual Christian children's camps, spa days, pastoral counseling, holistic health training, labyrinth medication, conference center", etc. are clearly excessive for this narrowly configured 3-acre R.C.2 site. It is clear, based on the testimony received that the Community does not need an additional spiritual retreat which will not serve the local residents. The Hanover Road Association is convinced this type of activity will be detrimental to their Community Plan and the Hanover Corridor Study that have been prepared for this section of Maryland Route 30 and would negatively impact not only on the residential community but also the existing business community. Further, it would have contradictory impacts upon the Hanover Pike Streetscape as the activities with attendant automobile parking are visible from the public right-of-way and aesthetically not compatible with the single-family dwelling use in this resource conservation classification.

Second, Mr. Elseroad and others testified that the front or western portion of the property is impacted by the 100-year flood plain and the Department of Environmental Protection and Resource Management (DEPRM) has raised issues of impacts upon the existing well and septic systems on the property. Mr. Elseroad and Ms. Ambrose testified as to specific septic failures in the area and at the very least a letter outlining the worship center's proposed water supply usage is required so that DEPRM can evaluate these risks.

In sum, I find the proposed use(s) does not meet the applicable criteria set forth in Section 502.1 of the B.C.Z.R., pursuant to *Schultz* and *Loyola*, *infra*. Specifically, the applicant for a special exception bears both the burden of production and the burden of persuasion on the issue of whether the special exception should be granted. I have been presented with evidence that generates a genuine question of fact as to whether the grant of a special exception would violate applicable legislation and case law. The Petitioners have not produced by a preponderous of evidence that the special exception will conform to the requirements and not having an adverse or negative impact on the properties located nearby. Additionally, the number of

potential visitors and activities inherent in this type of use is one that lends itself to a larger and broader expansion not easily capable of control by the Division of Code Enforcement. These impacts are particularly severe here, due to the proximity of adjacent residential homes.

Pursuant to the advertisement, posting of the property and public hearing on these petitions held, and for the reasons set forth above, the relief requested shall be denied.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED by the Zoning Commissioner of Baltimore County, this day of March 2008, that the Petition for Special Exception to permit the use of the described property for religious worship, school and camp and as a spiritual religious retreat center, pursuant to Sections 1A01.2C(4), (6) and (23) of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.), in accordance with Petitioners' Exhibit 2, be and is hereby DENIED; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Petition for Special Hearing seeking relief from Section 409.12 of the B.C.Z.R., to approve a modified parking plan, be and is hereby DISMISSED AS MOOT.

Any appeal of this decision must be taken in accordance with Section 32-3-401 of the Baltimore County Code.

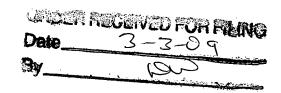

PANEL MEMBERS DISCUSSED THE FOLLOWING:

STANDING

- The Board discussed that the Petitioners had abandoned their request to use the property for religious worship, school, and camp. The Petitioners were only requesting the religious retreat center and the modified parking plan.
- The Board discussed, that the property is the Petitioners' residence and the Petitioners use the property as a psychology practice. After a lengthy discussion, the Board determined that since they are not here on the issue of the use of the property as a psychology practice, they are unable to determine if the practice is allowable by law.
- The Board discussed the Petition for Special Exception. The Baltimore County Code is strict in its list of things that have to be addressed and resolved prior to the granting of the Special Exception. The Petitioners did not address any of the points on the list, nor did they address how these issues had been resolved.
- The Board determined since the Petitioners do not qualify for the Special Exception, the Special Hearing relief to approve a modified parking plan is moot.

DECISION BY BOARD MEMBERS: The Baltimore County Code is clear with regard to the circumstances in which a Special Exception may be granted. The Petitioners did not provide any evidence to indicate that they had address and resolved the issues presented by the Baltimore County Code.

ROBERT AND ASTRA BRANTLEY 09-042-SPHX MINUTES OF DELIBERATION

<u>FINAL DECISION:</u> After thorough review of the facts, testimony, and law in the matter, the Board unanimously agreed to DENY the Petition for Special Exception and DISMISSED AS MOOT the Petition for Special Hearing.

People's Counsel is an interested party. Upon review of the file, it appears helpful to provide an introduction and overview prior to the County Board of Appeals (CBA) October 14, 2009 hearing.

Robert L. and Astra Brantley's August, 2008 petition for special exception requests permission "... for use of an existing building for religious worship, school and camp as spiritual religious retreat center." There is also a request for a special hearing for a modified parking plan. The petitions come in the wake of citizen complaints and enforcement proceedings.

Zoning Commissioner William J. Wiseman, III, identified the commercial nature of the activities on the site. He apparently assumed, without deciding, that the land uses at the site may qualify for special exception consideration. He denied the special exception on the merits in his March 3, 2009 opinion and order. He found petitioners failed to satisfy the BCZR § 502.1 special exception standards. On April 1, 2009, petitioners appealed to the CBA.

The CBA is very familiar with the special exception standards. What sets this case apart, however, are the threshold issues surrounding the accurate description and classification of the actual and proposed land uses at the site, and the determination of their eligibility or qualification among the enumerated uses permitted by special exception in the R.C. 2 (Agricultural) Zone. For the reasons set forth below, the uses do not qualify.

Should the CBA nevertheless undertake a special exception analysis, there is a particular issue which comes into play alongside the basic § 502.1 criteria. It concerns the major side yard setback variance granted in 2000 to the previous owner for a dwelling addition and garage. Special exceptions are conditional uses. It is one thing to grant a variance for a garage addition to a dwelling. It is another thing entirely to tack on a special exception for a new, more intrusive use. Moreover, a variance suitable for a residential garage may not be appropriate for the Brantleys' expanded office, commercial, clinical, and recreational uses.

The questions presented, therefore, are as follows:

- 1. Do the land uses at the site qualify as uses permitted by special exception?
- 2. a. If so, do the land uses at the site satisfy special exception standards?
 - b. How does the side yard setback variance affect the analysis?

14821 Hanover Pike is located in the northwestern part of the county, in a rural area north of Reisterstown zoned R.C. 2. The property occupies about 3 acres, and has a single-family dwelling. In 2000, the previous property owner, Craig Garrett, obtained a variance for a side yard setback of 3 feet instead of the required 35 feet to add a garage to the dwelling. There was no opposition. Deputy Zoning Commissioner Timothy Kotroco granted the variance on February 4, 2000. Case 00-284-A. In 2004, the present petitioners, Robert L. and Astra Brantley, acquired the site and began to put it to uses which sparked this controversy.

The CBA hearing is a *de novo* hearing. But the documentary exhibits in the file provide a detailed picture of the uses at the site. Unlike most special exception cases, the petitions here come in after the fact. Therefore, we need not guess at the nature of the uses.

The documents on file include Petitioners' website for The Brantley Group, with itemized links; a brochure for the Near Haven Executive Meeting and Business Retreat; internet advertisements; listings for retreat center, hotel, guest house, and bed and breakfast; advertisements for massage therapy, acupuncture, and fitness training; description of payment methods, and Valuecard accounts.

The website contains curricula vitae for Robert Brantley, the managing director, with his business as well as religious qualifications and experience; Astra Brantley, Psy. D. and Clinical Director, with her psychological, psychotherapy, counseling and preferred provider qualifications and experience, along with Christian supervision. The Brantleys have staff available for massage therapy, acupuncture, and fitness training. There is a reasonable inference that there may be staff who help with clerical, housekeeping, and food service, but these are details yet to be explored.

The website first lists eleven "christian management services," spanning virtually every personal and business financial subject: debt, insurance, real estate, investment counseling, strategic business planning, organizational development, church management, family planning, grants proposal development, conflict resolution, and clergy coaching. It goes on to list seven "Christian mental health services:" individual/couples family counseling and psychotherapy, psychological assessments, clinical supervision for students and practitioners, clergy services, corporate services, clinical and applied research, and professional training. There is then a list of six "whole health living well counseling:" debt free living, multigenerational financial and estate planning, organic gardening, acoustic relaxation and meditation, stress self defense training, and meditative walking on site. There follows a lengthy list of seminars, workshops, support groups, and clinical trainings, and of classes and events. In conjunction with the above list, there are the advertisements for conferences, meetings, spa services, overnight accommodations, vacation home rental, bed and breakfast, and/or hotel services.

There are also detailed descriptions about the method of payment. All of these services are on a fee-paid basis. There are hourly rates for services and daily rates for overnight accommodations. The petitioners will accept medicare and tricare, but otherwise leave it up to clients to deal with their insurance companies.

In this context, it must be kept in mind that BCZR § 102.1 permits only uses which are enumerated and listed in the particular zone. See <u>Kowalski v. Lamar</u> 25 Md. App. 493 (1975); <u>People's Counsel v. Surina</u> 400 Md. 662 (2007). Therefore, the threshold question is whether the aforesaid uses are permitted uses, by right or special exception, in the R.C. 2 Zone. Our preliminary answer is that they clearly are not permitted uses.

So far as our research discloses, this virtual smorgasbord of financial, business, management, psychological, health, fitness, and other services are not permitted uses in the R.C.2 Agricultural Zone, either by right or special exception.. BCZR § 1A01.1.A, C. Rather, these are uses which traditionally function are classified as office, medical office (defined to include psychologists' offices), commercial recreation, and bed and breakfast uses. Such uses are variously defined and listed as permitted uses in the office, business, and manufacturing zones. BCZR §§202, 204 (R-O-A, R-O,, offices and medical offices in converted residences as Class A office buildings); § 205 and 206 (OR-1 and OR-2, all types of office buildings); § 230 (B.L. offices, hotels); § 233, 236 (B.M. and B.R., Offices, hotels, commercial recreation enterprises); BCZR § 253, (M.L., offices); BCZR § 430.5, bed and breakfast PUDs.

To describe the petitioners' land use as a "retreat center" does not resolve the problem. There is no listed use for "retreat center." Moreover, it will not do to call the use a "retreat center" when the actual uses fit defined categories. See Smith v. Miller 249 Md. 900 (1968).

To be sure, the Loyola College "retreat center" passed muster as a "college." <u>People's Counsel for Baltimore County v. Loyola College</u> 406 Md. 54, 65 (2008). Loyola also called the use a "school" or "camp." Clearly, as a college or school use, it became eligible for a special exception.

The uses here are not comparable to the Loyola College use. Whether separately or in combination, the array of commercial uses do not qualify as college or school uses. In this connection, the petitioners' promotion of a justice university does not alter the realistic character of the principal uses on the site. Nor do the uses qualify as a day camp use.

Similarly, the listed uses do not qualify as "church or religious worship" uses. It may be that the petitioners are involved in Christian ministry and religious worship, and that spiritual activity occurs on the site. But this does not, from a zoning point of view, authorize the various office, business, financial, medical/psychological, commercial recreational and hotel/bed and breakfast/rental activities which predominate. Such uses as investment counseling, strategic business planning, financial and estate planning, and mental health services typically occur in office and institutional settings which may or may not have a religious component. The delineation of them as "Christian" management and mental health services does not alter the character and function of the land use activity.

Whether or not the spiritual dimension of the Brantley Group inspires or enhances the business, financial and mental health services, the land use activities must be treated as land use activities. For example, a hospital is still a hospital, an apartment building is still an apartment building, and a stadium is still a stadium, whether operated by a secular or religious organization. The same is true for investment firms, banks, medical offices, hotels, and bed and breakfasts. They are all subject to the same zoning laws, without favor or discrimination.

The English language can only be stretched so far before the words break. The threshold answer at this stage is that the land uses described and enumerated in petitioners' own documents do not fit within any of the permitted uses in the R.C. 2 Zone.

On the other hand, if the Petitioners' land uses were assumed to qualify for special exception review as a "building for religious worship, school and camp," then the established BCZR § 502.1 special exception standards would apply. The CBA would then consider whether the size, scale, and nature of the activities produce a particular adverse impacts on this neighborhood as interpreted in Loyola. Cf. People's Counsel v. Mangione 85 Md. App. 738 (1991). The Zoning Commissioner reviewed the relevant impacts at pages 9 and 10 of his opinion and found the cumulative impacts excessive in light of the size of the property, the location, and the character of the area. It will be up to the CBA to review these issues *de novo* should it decide that petitioners' land uses are eligible for special exception consideration.

There must also be considered the combination of the proposed special exception with the previously granted variance. Because special exceptions are conditional uses, the request to combine a variance with a special exception often connotes a failure to meet pertinent conditions. See <u>Chester Haven Partnership v. County Board of Appeals 104 Md. App. 324</u> (1995); <u>Umerley v. People's Counsel for Baltimore County 108 Md. App. 496</u>, cert denied. 342 Md. 584(1996).

In the same vein, a variance granted without opposition, for an addition to a dwelling, does not necessarily apply to new uses with different impacts, especially special exception uses. The BCZR § 307.1 "practical difficulty" criteria include a consideration of justice to area property owners and consistency with the spirit and intent of the zoning laws and the public safety, health and welfare. See McLean v. Soley 270 Md. 208, 213-14 (1973); Trinity Assembly of God v. People's Counsel for Baltimore County 407 Md. 54, 83-84 (2008). There is thus a serious question as to the relationship or survival of the 2000 variance with new uses.

Again, a significant aspect of this case is that the Petitioners' land uses are already active. Normally, a petition for special exception should precede the use. It is not in the proper order of things to engage in the use and then apply to determine if it is legitimate. As a result, the area citizens have had to take action to try to obtain a remedy. The only solace may be that there is a more accurate and well-defined description available with respect to the relevant land use activities. Here, it is much harder for petitioners to provide advantageous descriptions of the use which do not necessarily square with the facts on the ground.

OPENING STATEMENT

Thank you, Mr. Stahl, for this opportunity to make/submit this opening statement. Without the benefit of legal counsel, we appear before you with a determination that the truth be told regarding our case; and with full confidence that the rule of law and the proceedings of this hearing will provide us the protections that we seek under the law, which was and is our sole motivation for our requests and our appeal.

We desire only to be protected from lawless and dangerous neighbors who would lie to and attempt to manipulate Baltimore County authorities in their campaign to deny us the quiet enjoyment and legal use of our home. I am an ordained Christian clergyman, a Clergy Coach, a Pastoral Counselor, and a family financial and estate planner. My wife is a State Licensed Clinical Psychologist. We both are "professional persons" who work from our home. We have no employees, and we use less than 25% of the total floor area of our home for business purposes.

According to an official County document entitled: "RESOURCE CONSERVATION ZONES", SECTION 1A01, R.C.2 (Agricultural Zone), pages 1A-5 and 1A-6, dated 04-15-2005 (see copy attached), section 1A01.2 entitled Use Regulations, point B, "Uses permitted as of right" include, but are not limited to: "offices or studios of physicians, dentists, lawyers, architects, engineers, artists, musicians or other professional persons, provided that any such office or studio is established within the same building as that serving as the professional person's primary residence at the time of application; does not occupy more than 25% of the total floor area of that residence; and does not involve the employment of more than one nonresident employee. [Bill Nos. 78-1979; 105-1982; 65-19991

Through fraudulent claims and complaints, our neighbors to the north (Ms. Patti Fallon and Ms. Barbara Ambrose) have forced these proceedings in pursuit of their assaultive pledge to come after me and get me because they wrongfully imagine that I abused their cats; when in fact it is their relentless abuse of County law (limiting residents to 3 pets that must be collared and leased when outside the home) that results in a proliferation of feral cats that sometimes abuse domesticated pets. Please see attachments that document their dangerous lawlessness, from which we seek legal protection under the law.

PERSONAL STATEMENT FROM Astra P. Brantley Licensed Clinical Psychologist

I am writing this because I have never testified before these proceedings.

As this body is aware, I have been a licensed clinical psychologist in the state of Maryland for 23 years. I received a discount on my most recent malpractice insurance because I have never had a complaint!

My husband, Robert and I have been living not in Upperco, MD, but in the Twilight Zone of the past two years of our five years at 14821 Hanover Pike.

In June of 2004, we were looking for a place in order to move from downtown Baltimore. God led us to 14821 Hanover Pike one Saturday. We viewed and toured the house that Sunday and in 14 days, July 1st, we closed on the property! August 2004, we started moving in. That month Ms. Fallon and Ms. Ambrose came over (empty handed -- no bread or cookies) to check us out. The next time I spoke to either of them was June 2005 when I told Patti that Mr. Brantley had suffered a heart attack May 12, 2005. (This is noteworthy because the last three years of harassment that they have subjected my husband to is particularly insidious in light of their being aware of his heart condition).

July 2005, Camp Wesley was hosted at Near Haven for the first of three years. It was not a business enterprise for us. Sherie Hughes, who worked at Santoni's, shared with my husband that she coordinated a camp for her church. She stated further how she was in a bind because the new Pastor wanted to use the parsonage and so the camp could not be conducted from there. They did not have the money or time to get another place. Mr. Brantley suggested that she come and look at our property and see if she could use it. We had no input into how the camp was conducted; it was solely under the management of John Wesley United Methodist Church. WE RECEIVED NO PAYMENT FOR THE USE OF THE PROPERTY, THAT ONE WEEK IN JULY. I DID NOT SEE CLIENTS IN THE EVENINGS BECAUSE MR BRANTLEY AND I PARTICIPATED IN VESPERS. FINALLY AT THE END OF JULY, WE HAD A LARGER BGE BILL TO PAY! The camp was never a project of the Brantley Group and never advertised as such! The church had a all white congregation. The congregation had the experience of interacting with well educated Blacks who were not drug addicts, muggers or needing a hand out!

It is noteworthy that Ms. Fallon and Ms. Ambrose did not complain to Zoning until 2007! So what sparked their community protectionism?

By spring 2007, the population of feral cats roaming on our property had grown to 19! So what do law-abiding citizens do? We called the Animal Control Division. That decision was the beginning of our nightmare!

After one cat had been captured and picked up by ACD, we received a visit from Ms. Fallon. She explained how the cats were not feral, it was simply that they did not put collars on the cats because they might get caught up in trees, and how they had paid to have some of the cats get shots, so they were not carrying diseases. Finally, that she was trying to place the cats in homes. In the spirit of cooperation, my husband agreed to the following:

- 1. To call Ms Fallon whenever he caught a cat, so she could determine if it was one of hers:
- 2. To give her the phone number of a friend who had moved to PA on a farm, and loved cats.

Among our laundry list of services and qualifications is Christian conciliation; we were the first certified in the State of Maryland by Peacemaker Ministries! So embracing peaceful solutions is a part of our training and values!

Within days, Ms Fallon violated the agreement as follows:

- 1. She hounded our friend so much that he called complaining to Bob about giving her his number:
- 2. She trespassed on our property and removed a cat and the cage loaned to us by ACD. Our liability was over sixty dollars! She REFUSED to return the cage to us (demonstrating her growing impatience, contempt and disrespect). This was her first out of control behavior. She insisted upon returning the cage to ACD. In the Exhibits is a note from a clerk at ACD acknowledging when she returned the cage. This also establishes that she illegally took it! Further proof is her personal comments that are documented in the record.

When the cage was returned, cats would not go within seven feet of it. Mr. Brantley purchased a pellet rifle to frighten the now remaining 14 cats!

Further escalation of out of control behavior was in mid-May when Ms. Fallon verbally assaulted me by shouting over to me, "Have you killed any cats today? What kind of Christian are you?" I was appalled and caught completely off guard.

Sunday, June 3rd, we experienced further escalation of Ms. Fallon's out of control behavior. This date, my husband and I had been planting butterfly buses in the compost area and marigolds around the garden for about three to four hours. Ms. Fallon had to be stalking us because when my husband drove to the front of the house, she came up and startled him; he told her as much. She commented, "Good. You deserve it!" Ms. Fallon was ranting and raving uncontrollably. As attested to in his sworn affidavit, she refused to leave the property when he asked her to. Instead she followed him onto the front porch where she swore this vendetta, "If anything has happened to my cat, I am coming after you!" My husband left her screaming and called the police.

Ms. Fallon's vow that she would come after him is why we are all gathered here today.

In his paperwork, Bob requested the Ms. Fallon get counseling, but the court chose to minimized her escalating levels of threat to my husband and myself! So what happens when an out of control person is allowed to be out of control? She escalates.

Next escalation: Ms. Fallon filed a false sworn affidavit that my husband attacked her in the Hampstead Walmart. I was with my husband and it is my sworn testimony that we did not see Ms. Fallon and Ms. Ambrose until we were on the parking lot! Their attorney keeps alleging that Mr. Brantley did not defend against the charge. However, this is completely over looking his letter to the Court, pointing out how the false allegation was Ms. Fallow carrying out her threat! All our entreaties to the Court have been ignored. We have received no justice or protection!

If Ms. Fallon had been attacked in Walmart as she has falsely asserted, Mr. Brantley would have been removed from Walmart in handcuffs and takend to jail. He probably would have been barred from ever entering the store again. But Ms. Fallon did not alert management to call the police because they hatched the lie on the way home from the Walmart. Therefore there was no police report from the Walmarrt, and I am confident, if a 300 pound Black man attacked a handicapped elder white woman, there would have been several willing witnesses to testify in court. I was there, their attorney was not!

The nightmare continues. Ms. Fallon's next escalation: She went to the Hanover Road Association and told then that Mr. Brantley had a shotgun and was firing it all times of the night and day. And of course, she maintained that he had killed her cat! In the meeting in which Near Haven was the focus, they admitted having consulted an attorney. We do not own and have never owned a shotgun!

The next escalation came like a stab to my heart On August 15th 2007 we received a Code enforcement and Inspections Citation stating: "Failure to cease all use of property which exceeds that of a single family dwelling" The date on the citation was August, 2007 to present.

They had attacked my husband's reputation and now they were going after our livelihood -- my 23-year sterling reputation as a clinical practitioner, and my practice!

Why had all of the authorities let this out-of-control woman escalate to this point on the basis of her delusion that my husband killed her cat? Ms. Fallon's assertion and irrational idea (delusion) that my husband killed her cat is absolutely untrue, but delusional persons do not respond to the truth, facts or reason.

Our previous attorney asked Ms. Fallon and Ms. Ambrose about mediation to specify the limits of activity on our property at the last hearing. Of course, they refused. Why, because reasoned behavior is something beyond Ms. Fallon and Ms. Ambrose. Nothing will satisfy them but seeing either my husband have another heart attack and or squashing us like bugs under their feet.

Further acts of harassment over the last two years, include, but are not limited to:

- 1. taking pictures of clients and guests and friends and relatives; which violates our clients HIPPA rights and our privacy
- 2. numerous and frivolous complaints to Zoning. My husband left a zoning hearing that started at 10 am and by 1pm, a woman from zoning knocked at our door informing us that Ms. Fallon and Ms. Ambrose had complained about a fallen tree. I explained that we had contacted Barlett Tree Experts, but they had an enormous back log because so many trees had been downed by the recent storm.
- 3. The Thursday before Labor Day this year, the woman from Zoning came to inform us that Ms, Fallon and Ms. Ambrose called to allege that we were "doing something on Mondays." I do not know how they get away with it because they are prolific liars, but not skillful liars.

Mr. Brantley and I love the property at 14821 HANOVER PIKE. We love working the land, gardening and caring for the orchard. We have created healing spaces on the land in the form of labyrinths. We have expanded the organic garden. We are both in our 60's and have lots of skills and experience which enables us to offer a laundry list of services. I see brochures all the time with laundry lists of services. It seems a common practice. The original concern was Camp Wesley (which is gone) and our using the exterior of the house. Now it has escalated to denying two competent professionals the right to have a home office which is a growing trend today.

Please help us, and give us some protection from the nightmare of living next door to two delusional women.

CLOSING COMMENTS Robert L. & Astra P. Brantley

- 1. As trained, certified, and licensed "professional persons", the current use of part of our home as an office is a "use permitted as of right."
- 2. We have never violated this zoning rule.
- 3. All legitimate internet-based sharing of services and information is perfectly legal, even from a home-based setting; and is a growing trend across America.
- 4. Some of our internet-based marketing language was over-aggressive, and perhaps confusing; but internet marketing "copy" dies not equate to actual behavior. We have never actually conducted any activity in our home-based-business that violates Baltimore County zoning law (in spite of what might have been advertised online).
- 5. Objections to the current use of our home and home-office are either ill-informed or ill- motivated (and perhaps based upon old data or mis-allegations of wrong-doing).
- 6. Former legal counsel failed to appropriately represent our intentions; and failed to structure our original request in a manner best achieved under existing Baltimore County zoning law. We apologize for our choice of counsel.
- 7. Former legal counsel failed to adequately establish the actionable manner in which our neighboring "complaintants" have violated our privacy and the legally-protected privacy of our clinical and clergy clients, our guests, and our friends, by taking unwelcomed and unwarranted illegal photographs of people on our property.
- 8. We appreciate your patience, and seek your assistance in resolving our zoning issue.

Section 1A01 R.C.2 (Agricultural) Zone

1A01.1 General provisions.

- A. Legislative statement of findings.
 - 1. Declaration of findings. It is found:
 - That Baltimore County is fortunate in that it is endowed with a variety
 of very productive agricultural soil types which should not be lost
 unnecessarily to urbanized development;
 - b. That the agricultural industry is an integral part of the Baltimore economy and that a continued conversion of agricultural land will continue to undermine this basic industry:
 - c. That scattered development is occurring in a sporadic fashion in areas of Baltimore County containing productive agricultural land;
 - d. That continued urban intrusion into productive agricultural areas not only destroys the specific area upon which the development occurs but is incompatible with the agricultural use of the surrounding area;
 - e. That heretofore Baltimore County has been unable to effectively stem the tide of new residential subdivisions in productive agricultural areas of Baltimore County;
 - f. That Baltimore County has certain wetlands along Chesapeake Bay and its tributaries which serve as breeding grounds and nursery areas for the bay's biotic life; and
 - g. That Baltimore County possesses numerous areas which are highly suitable for urban development, including residential subdivisions which are not located in areas of productive agricultural land.
- B. Purposes. The R.C.2 zoning classification is established pursuant to the legislative findings above in order to foster conditions favorable to a continued agricultural use of the productive agricultural areas of Baltimore County by preventing incompatible forms and degrees of urban uses.

1A01.2 Use regulations.

- A. Preferred use permitted as of right. Agricultural operations, when conducted in accordance with good and reasonable husbandry practices, shall be afforded preferential treatment over and above all other permitted uses in R.C.2 Zones.
- B. Uses permitted as of right. The following uses only are permitted as of right in all R.C.2 Zones: [Bill No. 178-1979]
 - 1. Dwellings, one-family detached. [Bill No. 178-1979]

In light of my inexperience with the procedures of the Modification Hearing, I have prepared this brief statement (with attachments) for the consideration of the Court. Please find attached:

- 1. My 9/4/07 memo asking for a postponement/rescheduling of modification hearing
- 2. My 5/8/07 memo to Patti Fallon & Barbara Ambrose re "good neighbor policy..."
- 3. My 6/5/07 memo to the Court filing a complaint against my neighbor
- 4. My 6/25/07 memo to the Court requesting counseling for my neighbor
- 5. My 7/25/07 memo to the Court requesting help from the Court re my neighbor
- 6. My 8/10/07 memo to the Hanover Road Association re my neighbor

My request that the Court require counseling for my neighbor is based upon her persistent and escalating "mentally questionable" and illegal behavior that continues to put me at risk, and threaten the peace and tranquility of our community. My wife and I are apparently the targets of her public self-induced anger, growing out of her personal pain and bigoted beliefs concerning feral cats, and cats that she hoards for pets.

Ms. Fallon has also involved her house partner, Barbara Ambrose, in her misguided campaign to "come after me" (her words) for killing/hurting her cast of cats. In a 6/7/07 letter to me signed by Ms. Ambrose, she misrepresented Ms. Fallon's assault of me on my property as a "shouting match", when I never at any time raised my voice to Patti. (Later in that letter she described four of their cats; 3 is the legal limit in Baltimore County; and Patti had earlier disclosed to me that they have owned as many as 14 cats.) Neither Patti nor Barbara have apologized to me for Patti wrongfully assaulting me and accusing me of killing her cat that returned home with injuries of the nature that would have been inflicted by the feral black cat that I was trying to catch.

In an email to me on 5/8/07, Ms. Ambrose also misrepresented that "We couldn't figure out how to open the cage.." in her attempt to excuse their illegally removing property of the Baltimore County Animal Control Unit that was on loan to me. Unit officials told me later that they have never heard of someone illegally removing an animal cage from a neighbor's property in order to prevent that neighbor from catching unwanted cats. In that same email Ms. Ambrose stated "I am sure you think we are a little crazy with this and I am sure that we are being a pain but we mean well." I believe this to be untrue, and a sign of their imbalanced mental state, in need of counsel.

Confused and dangerous people often "mean well", but in her 5/12/07 letter to me Ms. Ambrose clarified her/their attitudes and beliefs that, in part, drive her/their illegal behavior toward me. She wrote: "It is a bit of a stretch to say that every cat and dog in this county or any other is either leashed or confined to its owner's property particularly in these farm-like environs." "... leashing a cat is nearly impossible and that law while enforceable is a bit unrealistic." She/they have a dangerous disregard for common courtesy and social law; and they need help. The totally false accusation by Ms. Ambrose that I stalked and assaulted her at the Hampstead Walmart is further evidence of the dangerous collaboration between Barbara and Patti that is worthy of Court-ordered counseling for both of them. Their vicious attempt to inflame members of the Hanover Road Association with lies and innuendo makes this an issue of broad community concern, and brings their biased and bigoted behavior within the jurisdiction of the County Court.

THANK YOU FOR THE NOTICE THAT I RECEIVED BY MAIL TODAY FOR THE MODIFICATION HEARING ON THE ABOVE-REFERENCED CASE, SCHEDULED FOR 9/7/2007.

I am particularly grateful for the Court's decision to revisit the Case, in that Patti Fallon has continued to escalate her dangerous and unwarranted mean-spirited behavior toward me. At a public meeting of the Hanover Road Association last month. Ms. Fallon made a viscous attempt to incite the community against me when she falsely accused me of firing guns in my back yard at night until she was afraid to come out of her home. She said that I was mutilating her cats and denying her the peaceful use of her property. I had to deny her allegations; and informed the twenty or so people in attendance that they may have to be called as witnesses in a law suit against Ms. Fallon for defamation of character. I do not own, and have never discharged a firearm on my property.

Ms. Fallon has also made another attempt to manipulate government authorities in support of her campaign to do me harm. She retained an attorney to file a zoning complaint against me for exceeding the zoning code use of my property (she publicly reported at the HRA meeting that she fully expected the zoning board to rule against me). However, the Code Enforcement Hearing Officer upheld our current use of the property.

Ms. Fallon's absolute intolerance of people who dare to not share her personal preferences and beliefs is, in my opinion, driving her dangerous and escalating behavior in such a manner as to put me at personal risk, and to endanger the community peace. It is my belief that such intolerance cannot be tolerated in an open and pluralistic society that thrives on the mutual commitment of residents to common courtesy and social law. I feel harassed and threatened daily by my neighbor who, in spite of her comments about her concern for my health (she is aware of my heart attack on the property and my ongoing heart condition), persists in her personal and public assaults on my safety. From her personal assault of me on my porch, to the potentially explosive false accusation that I stalked and pushed her female housemate in the Hampstead Walmart, to her viscous lies in an attempt to incite members of the HRA against me, to her manipulative attempts to use the zoning board in her campaign. I am forced to renew my request that the Court order mental health counseling for Ms. Fallon.

Unfortunately, I have been contracted to travel out of town on Thursday for a 2-day work assignment; and I humbly request a postponement and rescheduling of the Modification Hearing. Thank you again for your kind consideration. I sincerely appreciate your help.

I hope that this memorandum is received in the spirit with which it is written, that is, in the furtherance of good neighbor policy and practices regarding pets.

Out of respect for your privacy, and your right to enjoy your home without interruption, I have quietly endured the growing proliferation of cats entering onto and crossing my property on a daily basis and at all times of night. I know that you are a cat owner and a protector and provider of care for feline pets. However, due to my wife's allergies, and for other reasons, we consider cats to be a hazard to our health, and therefore do not desire their presence on our property. One of the reasons that we purchased property in Baltimore County was because of its legal prohibition with regards to pets roaming free without a leash.

When I was recently confronted by a large "bushy-tailed" black eat, on my property, and could not enter the front door of my home, I contacted the Baltimore County Animal Control Division to make arrangements for the capture and removal of unwanted and uncollared cats that were increasing in numbers each year. I have never fed, watered, or any way encouraged these animals to frequent my property; neither have I ever mistreated them in any way.

I successfully trapped two of the animals, and they were collected by the County. However, at your request, the animals were released to you, only to be seen again on my property. The large white cat was seen by me on my front porch 2 days after its capture.

The large black "bushy-tailed" cat, that you described as mean and vicious (even to other cats) is still roaming my property daily, and frightening my wife and guests. We agreed that the black cat needs to be removed; but I cannot catch the animal without the cat trap; which you apparently removed from my property today without my permission, in order

to protect a cat that you recognized. Yesterday, I trapped a cat that you did not recognize, and the county authorities promptly collected the animal. If I do not continue to trap and report the capture of un-collared animals to the authorities they will remove the trap from my property, and with it my ability to protect my family from a very real perceived threat. This is not acceptable to me.

One possible solution here would be for you to obey the law and leash your pets when they are not in your house.

Alternatively, I am willing to invest in safe measures to discourage your cats from entering onto and/or crossing my property, destructively playing in our flower beds and vegetable garden, sunning and/or shading on our front porch, hanging out on and under our rear deck, and killing or frightening away the birds that frequent our property (and which we much prefer and enjoy as natural visitors to our grounds). The playful cats have also been observed running across my Lincoln Town Car, and the cars of my guests, chasing birds, and leaving unsightly scratches in the paint that are expensive to repair.

For your information and comfort I have attached data describing some 100% natural and organic products that I intend to use to discourage unwanted "critter" visits to my property. These products are pet-safe, but will suggest to them, through instinctive smell, that a bigger more intimidating animal has taken over the area, and it is therefore not safe for them to trod.

It is my sincere hope that this will facilitate your uninterrupted enjoyment of your pets; but not at the expense of my wife's health and feeling of comfort when tending to her flowers or garden. She was severely frightened by a cat who jumped out of a bush that she was about to tend earlier this week. We have invested significantly in our grounds and in our vegetable garden, yesterday completing the planting of seventeen organic boxes. This investment of time and money can be destroyed in an afternoon by playful cats.

I trust that my efforts to discourage pet visits will work, so that your pets, and the pets of our neighbors, will not end up in the hands of County authorities. Your suggestion about checking the traps daily to see if your cats are captured, is in my estimation not feasible, in that it calls for your entering onto my property at times that may not be comfortable to me or my family; and I don't want to be viewed as being "responsible" for those visits, as the owner of this property.

PLEASE ENJOY YOUR CATS. I very much look forward to enjoying the natural visits of birds and butterflies that frequent and are welcomed to grace our property.

I thought it best that I communicate my thoughts to you in writing, for the sake of clarity and complete understanding. I am faxing a copy of this memo to the County, and I am mailing the original to you to make certain that you receive it, and to avoid disturbing you at your home, or entering your private mailbox. I am uncertain as to what might be a convenient time to call you, and I did not want to be insensitive to your schedules. Peace.

THIS MEMORANDUM IS INTENDED TO FILE A FORMAL ASSAULT COMPLAINT AGAINST MY NEIGHBOR, MS. PATTI FALLON, AND TO REQUEST A LEGAL RESTRAINING ORDER TO PREVENT HER FROM APPROACHING ME AND/OR TRESPASSING ON MY PROPERTY.

This complaint and request are made necessary due to the escalating illegal behavior of Ms. Fallon, as follows:

- 1. In early May of this year Ms. Fallon trespassed on my property and removed a cat cage that was loaned to me by the Baltimore County Department of Health Animal Control Division for the purpose of trapping non-collared (and therefore assumed to be wild) cats that were roaming my property in increasing numbers. (See attached my 5/8/2007 memo to Ms. Fallon and the Animal Control Division) Ms. Fallon did eventually return the cage to ACD; and I am scheduled to receive another cage from ACD this week, because non-collared cats are still roaming my property, and presenting a health threat to me and my family.
- 2. About mid-May of this year my wife was verbally assaulted by Ms. Fallon, who stood on her property and yelled unpleasant, demeaning, and insulting comments to my wife, accusing her, among other things, of being a "cat killer." My wife was frightened, hurt, and appalled by the behavior of Ms. Fallon, which at the very least violated my wife's right to the quiet enjoyment of our home and property.
- 3. On Sunday, June 3 of this year I was verbally assaulted by Ms. Fallon on my driveway and on my front porch. I was surprised by Ms. Fallon, who had come onto my property as I removed something from my car trunk. I was startled by her quiet unannounced appearance, and said to her that she frightened me. Her response was: "Good! You deserve it!" She then began to yell at me about her missing cat; and accused me of killing her cat. She yelled that she was going to come after me for hurting her cat. I asked her to leave my property, but she

persisted to yell at me, walking toward me. I turned away from her to enter my house, and she followed me onto the porch and continued to yell that she was coming after me. I told her that I would call the police; but this did not give her pause. At this point I was in reasonable fear for my personal safety. I did not know whether she was armed, but her hand was in her pocket as she yelled at me and followed me in spite of my asking her to leave my property. I entered my home and locked the door to more of her louder yells and accusations and threats, and called the Baltimore County police.

Officer Wilder (badge #4103) of Precinct 3 came to my house and took my report. He gave me an event # 071541171, and went next door to speak with Ms. Fallon. When my wife and I returned home from an evening church meeting we found a note from Officer Wilder stating: "Your neighbor Barb is going to contact you by letter to resolve the cat issue." I don't know whether Officer Wilder spoke with Ms. Fallon, or only with her housemate Barbara Ambrose; but I don't see how a letter is going to resolve the cat issue unless my neighbors obey the law in Baltimore County, which I am told by ACD requires that owners collar and lease their animals (which I suggested in my 5/8/2007 memo).

In any event, Ms. Ambrose did not assault me and my wife – Ms. Fallon did that. The issue is larger than a cat issue. It is the issue of the escalating illegal behavior of Ms. Fallon; and my concern that she is not in control of herself. I BELIEVE HER THREATS. I know from experience that she is capable of sneaking up on me. I assume that she is able to do harm to me. Women, and even school children are capable of using firearms – and they have access to them. Ms. Fallon told me that her brother is active military, and flies killer helicopters. She also told me that her father is willing to shoot and kill one of the cats that I am trying to catch (a large black cat with a bushy tail that chases and attacks her cats). Incidentally, as I sit at my laptop typing this memorandum at 10:45pm the bushy-tailed black cat just strolled across my porch. Earlier tonight (between 9:00pm and 9:30pm) there were gunshots fired on or near my property; and my wife and some visitors saw what appeared to be flashlight beams in the rear of our property.

It is the personal and professional opinion of me and my wife that the escalating behavior of Ms. Fallon should not be ignored or allowed to go unaddressed. My wife is a licensed clinical psychologist, and I am an experienced pastoral counselor. We help emotionally distressed people every day; and we are able to discern potentially dangerous behavior. Ms. Fallon is obviously intolerant of people who do not share her fondness for cats; she is willing to impose her desires on others, though she has no right to do so, and her imposition is in violation of the law; and her extreme language reflects a possible hidden hatred for people of certain religious preferences. The behavior of Ms. Fallon puts us both in reasonable fear for our personal safety.

It is my desire, and responsibility, to file a formal complaint against Ms. Fallon, and to request a legal restraining order to keep her from making contact with us or trespassing upon our property.

GREETINGS IN THE PRECIOUS NAME OF JESUS!

Glenn, thank you for the invitation to the Wednesday night meeting of the Hanover Road Association. I was encouraged by the warm reception of those in attendance; but I regret the unfortunate behavior of my neighbor near the end of the meeting. It is not my desire to involve the Association in any possible future legal conflict between me and my neighbor; though I welcome the opportunity to sit with them and members of the Association's Board to try to "keep the peace" between neighbors. We are strong proponents of "out of court" Bible-based mediation. In fact, we have been actively certified as professional Christian mediators for many years by PEACEMAKER MINISTRIES in Billings, Montana; and mediation is a vital part of our ministry.

However, as my neighbor reported at the Association meeting, she has already initiated action against me with the zoning authorities of Baltimore County. We have been issued a Correction Notice and a Citation that threaten the future of our ministry and ability to earn a living in this community. As President of the Association, you will receive other information relative to this process. In the meantime, I would very much appreciate the support of the Association with regards to what you know about us, our property, and what we do. Although, to my knowledge, neither you nor members of the Association who attended the last meeting have been the recipients of our services, you have visited our home and grounds (and reported your observations at the meeting), attendees heard my report and responses to questions, and many have observed from a distance (and are free to visit and observe up-close) our activity on the property that is consistent with the promotion of good agricultural operations, a major concern of the Zoning Board.

On Wednesday, 8/15/2007, at 9:00am there is a public hearing scheduled in Room 116 of the Baltimore County Office Building located at 111 Chesapeake Avenue in Towson, Maryland. I am told that the Hearing Officer will conduct the hearing and adjudicate the Citation. We have informed zoning authorities or our position that we do not and have not exceeded the permitted use of our home. We have already taken steps to correct the appearance of violations by amending our Internet advertising (which appears to have been a major source of concern for zoning representatives). I believe that zoning representatives were, in part, misled by our websites, but primarily were misled by the lies of our neighbor (as she attempted to mislead the Association with her vicious lies). I need, desire, and am formally requesting the support of members of the Association at the hearing, hopefully in person, but at the very least by way of written statements.

I look forward to becoming an active member of the Association, for the betterment of this community. I also look forward to visits to NEAR HAVEN by other members of the Association who have an interest in what we do, especially in the area of promoting best practices in home-based agricultural operations. Upon their visit they will see that the exterior of our property is without doubt a beautiful single family residence, with well maintained grounds, featuring agricultural elements covering half of our property (orchard, organic above-ground garden, sophisticated composting area, trees, shrubbery, flowers, and plants that attract large numbers to birds and butterflies). "property identification" sign that existed when we purchased the property; and we added a smaller sign near our mailbox because the original sign is set so far back into the property that visitors traveling on Hanover Pike could not see the sign in time to safely avoid traffic lanes in time to turn off to our property. The former owners identified the property as "Crossing Goose Acres" because of the geese that fly over the property (and sometimes walk on the property) daily. We identify the property as NEAR HAVEN because it captures the spirit of our home and our ministry. They will also notice on our larger sign names including the Universal Peacemakers Foundation, Bridge Point Ministries, and The Brantley Group. The Universal Peacemakers Foundation is our private foundation which promotes world peace, and is the sponsor and host of Bridge Point Ministries @ NEAR HAVEN. Bridge Point Ministries is our "private brand" for the ministry work that we do on behalf of individuals, couples, families, churches, clergy, and Christian clinicians. THE BRANTLEY GROUP is our private family business name. It involves me and my wife, Astra. It has no staff. It provides management, planning, and other services for the Foundation, the Ministry, and for NEAR HAVEN.

My wife and I are law abiding tax paying citizens who promote the preferred uses of private residential property in the RC-2 zones of this county, namely "Agricultural operations, when conducted in accordance with good and reasonable husbandry practices, shall be afforded preferential treatment over and above all other permitted uses in R.C.@ Zones". Half of our property qualifies for "Preferential treatment". We purchased this property, in part, because we wanted the opportunity to garden and to share with others the benefits of home gardening (even if on a micro scale). We more than doubled the size of the original above-ground organic garden that was a part of the property. We removed the old composting unit that had failed, and replaced it with an enlarged composting area using "best practices" of a blend of traditional techniques and higher technology. We also enclosed the garden to resist erosion, and we beautified the garden and compost area with flowers and butterfly bushes that discourage certain animals from damaging the garden beds. The garden beds are fertilized by organically produced "compost tea", and a method of soil tilling known as the "French Intensive" where a nutrient-rich ground cover is turned under to organically fertilize the soil. Other organic compost material is used to fertilize the fruit orchard, which is also organically protected by the spraying of a water and powdered clay emulsion that minimizes or eliminates the need to use pest-resisting chemicals, thus protecting our neighbors from exposure.

Our dreams involve visions of whole health living for the human mind, body, and spirit; and the ministry work that we do on the interior and exterior of NEAR HAVEN is being threatened by the disingenuous motivation of an emotionally disturbed neighbor whose

property does not reflect the preferred use of RC-2 zoned property. Her desire to own or care for more than a dozen cats is a matter of choice; but her refusal to obey county law (which requires the collaring and leashing of pets) promotes an unhealthy environment in an unfenced agricultural community; and it is the explosive growth of her cat colony that is at issue.

Her cats procreate without control (two litters, a total of nine cats, have been born on our property since we have been here); they will run amuck; they damage flower and garden beds; they chase away birds; they litter; and cause humans who suffer from allergens great distress. Such is the case with my wife who is extremely allergic to cats. Please be clear that our neighbor is Ms. Patti Fallon and Ms. Barbara Ambrose. We know that they live together; and that they share an affinity for cats; and that they have a serious disregard for law, and for the property rights, personal feelings, and preferences of others who do not share their feelings and preferences (this is a dictionary definition of a bigot).

The real problem with our neighbor is that she expects me to let her use my property in the care of her cats (and other cats who find their way to her property and mine) to the detriment of my quiet enjoyment of my property. Perhaps unknown to you, there are serious issues with the personal statements and actions of our neighbor, that reveal the root of her complaint, and the potentially devastating danger to a community that cannot survive without common courtesy and social law.

Serious questions demand an answer. Why would a woman publicly lie in a community meeting, falsely accusing her neighbor of firing guns in the back yard at night until she is afraid to come out? Why would she blame her cat's injuries on her neighbor, when she knows that there is still a dangerous wild cat in the area that consistently attacks and injures here cats; and that caused me to ask for help from the County Animal Control Unit to trap the animal, after he refused to let me enter my front door one day? I do not like or own guns or cats; but I respect and am tolerant of the rights of my neighbors to do so, within the boundaries of common courtesy and social law. Should I be harassed because of this? Should my ministry & livelihood be threatened as a result? Is this fair?

Please know, Brother Glenn, that in spite of the current conflict with our neighbor, we are not discouraged with regards to the appropriateness of our home-based ministry in this County or our livelihood in this community. We are here to stay! We will continue to be a blessing to the people whom the Lord gives us the privilege and opportunity to serve; and we will persist in our efforts to teach and demonstrate the efficacy of home-based gardening and other agricultural operations. We will not let "questions of zoning" mitigate the "answers of peacemaking" that we bring by virtue of our presence on Hanover Pike. We will meet every challenge, by the grace of God, and within the laws that reflect His Sovereignty over our lives. We are encouraged by your graciousness, and by the private comments of other members of this community and the Hanover Road Association. Finally, Brother Glenn, please join my wife and I, and our friends and supporters, in prayer for our neighbor who grieves the injuries to her pets, in part due to her failure to protect them by obeying County law. Often, when people are grieving, the anger that they feel seeks a target. We are apparently the undeserving targets of anger.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSION OF LAW FINAL ORDER OF THE CODE ENFORCEMENT HEARING OFFICER

This matter came before the Code Enforcement Hearing Officer for the Department of Permits and Development Management on June 18, 2008, for a hearing on a citation for violations under the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (BCZR) § 102.1 failure to cease use of property which exceeds that of a single-family dwelling on residential property zoned RC 2 known as 14821 Hanover Pike, 21155.

On May 22, 2008, pursuant to §3-6-205, Baltimore County Code, Code Enforcement Officer, issued a code enforcement citation. The citation was sent to the Respondent by 1st class mail to the last known address listed in the Maryland State Tax Assessment files.

The citation proposed a civil penalty of \$1,000.00 (one thousand dollars).

Mr. Brantley, Respondent appeared for the Hearing and testified.

Lavette Street, Code Enforcement Officer presented the case for Baltimore County.

Testimony and evidence shows the property to be in violation of operating a professional office without benefit of a special exception. Exhibits presented by Code Enforcement and neighbors clearly show something taking place outside the parameters of a home occupation. Even Mr. Brantley's exhibit marked "Respondent Exhibit #1" describes the use; which far exceeds the home occupation regulations. Contrary to Mr. Brantley's item #3 on Respondent's #1 the use of the home as a professional office was not upheld (see Order issued August 16, 2007).

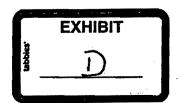

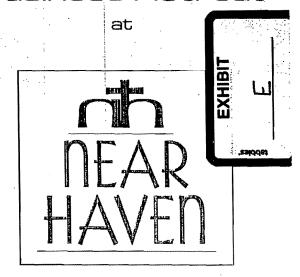

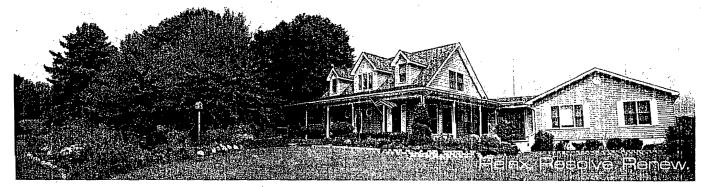

OPENING STATEMENT

Thank you, Mr. Stahl, for this opportunity to make/submit this opening statement. Without the benefit of legal counsel, we appear before you with a determination that the truth be told regarding our case; and with full confidence that the rule of law and the proceedings of this hearing will provide us the protections that we seek under the law, which was and is our sole motivation for our requests and our appeal.

We desire only to be protected from lawless and dangerous neighbors who would lie to and attempt to manipulate Baltimore County authorities in their campaign to deny us the quiet enjoyment and legal use of our home. I am an ordained Christian clergyman, a Clergy Coach, a Pastoral Counselor, and a family financial and estate planner. My wife is a State Licensed Clinical Psychologist. We both are "professional persons" who work from our home. We have no employees, and we use less than 25% of the total floor area of our home for business purposes.

According to an official County document entitled: "RESOURCE CONSERVATION ZONES", SECTION 1A01, R.C.2 (Agricultural Zone), pages 1A-5 and 1A-6, dated 04-15-2005 (see copy attached), section 1A01.2 entitled Use Regulations, point B, "Uses permitted as of right" include, but are not limited to: "offices or studios of physicians, dentists, lawyers, architects, engineers, artists, musicians or other professional persons, provided that any such office or studio is established within the same building as that serving as the professional person's primary residence at the time of application; does not occupy more than 25% of the total floor area of that residence; and does not involve the employment of more than one nonresident employee. [Bill Nos. 78-1979; 105-1982; 65-1999]

Through fraudulent claims and complaints, our neighbors to the north (Ms. Patti Fallon and Ms. Barbara Ambrose) have forced these proceedings in pursuit of their assaultive pledge to come after me and get me because they wrongfully imagine that I abused their cats; when in fact it is their relentless abuse of County law (limiting residents to 3 pets that must be collared and leased when outside the home) that results in a proliferation of feral cats that sometimes abuse domesticated pets. Please see attachments that document their dangerous lawlessness, from which we seek legal protection under the law.

There is an economic fault line running throughout America and the world which today's economic gurus seem unable to explain or remedy: the widening wealth and income gap between a tiny rich elite and multitudes of poor in every country (including the United States), and between developed and developing nations. Surrounded by global communications, the global economy, and our global environment, we cannot help but feel the tremors inside and outside our borders.

Seeing through the chaos of our rapidly changing world, one post-scarcity visionary of the 20th Century, lawyer-economist Louis Kelso, understood the power of technology either to liberate or dehumanize people. Popularly known as the inventor of the employee stock ownership plan (ESOP), Kelso observed that modern capital tools and their phenomenal power to "do more with less" have offered people an escape from scarcity to shared abundance.

As a lawyer Kelso also saw that the design of our "invisible" institutional environment and social tools determines the quality of people's relationship to technology. Intangibles, such as our laws and financial systems, determine which people will be included or excluded from sharing of access to equal economic opportunity, power and capital incomes.

Access to capital ownership, asserted Kelso, is as fundamental a human right as the right to the fruits of one's labor. Furthermore, Kelso argued, the democratization of capital credit is the "social key" to universalizing access to future ownership of productive wealth, so that every person, as an owner, could eventually gain income independence through the profits from one's capital.

The ultimate purpose of JBM is to create and sustain ownership cultures that enhance the dignity and development of every member of the company, and to economically empower each person as an owner and worker.

JBM promotes a company's long-term profitability within the global marketplace by enabling all worker-owners to serve and provide bigher value to the customer. JBM connects every worker's self-interest to the bottom-line and long-term success of the company.

The JBM process builds upon a written articulation of the philosophy and principles of the company's leader (typically the CEO or chairman of the board) and leadership core group, in terms of universal principles and core values of the company. JBM proceeds in stages to build a consensus upon these fundamental shared values and vision of the company within each work area of the company.

These articulated values provide the foundation for enbancing the productiveness of workers and company profitability, and include such structures as employee-monitored economic incentive programs, participation and governance structures, two-way communications and accountability systems, conflict management systems and future planning and renewal programs.

STRUCTURES OF JUSTICE promulgates the idea that everyone has direct responsibility for the common good, and for working with and through others to restructure defective or unjust economic and social institutions.

In a letter to the editor published by the Washington Post, CESJ President Norman Kurland challenged the Post's assertion that "there is in fact no 'third way to prosperity' ". "The basic moral problem that faces man as he moves into the age of automation, the age of accelerating conquest of nature, is whether he is really fit to live in an industrial society; whether his institutions will adjust rapidly enough; whether he will rivet himself with an absurd institution like full employment in the economic order when it is not only unnecessary but unadministratable in anything but a slave society; whether freed from the necessity to devote his brain and brawn to the production of goods and services, he can address himself to the work of civilization itself."

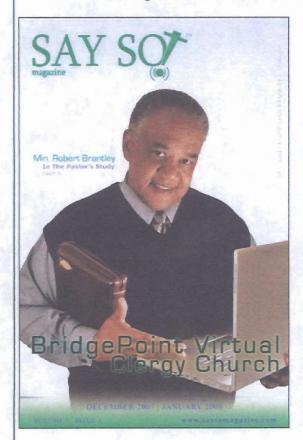

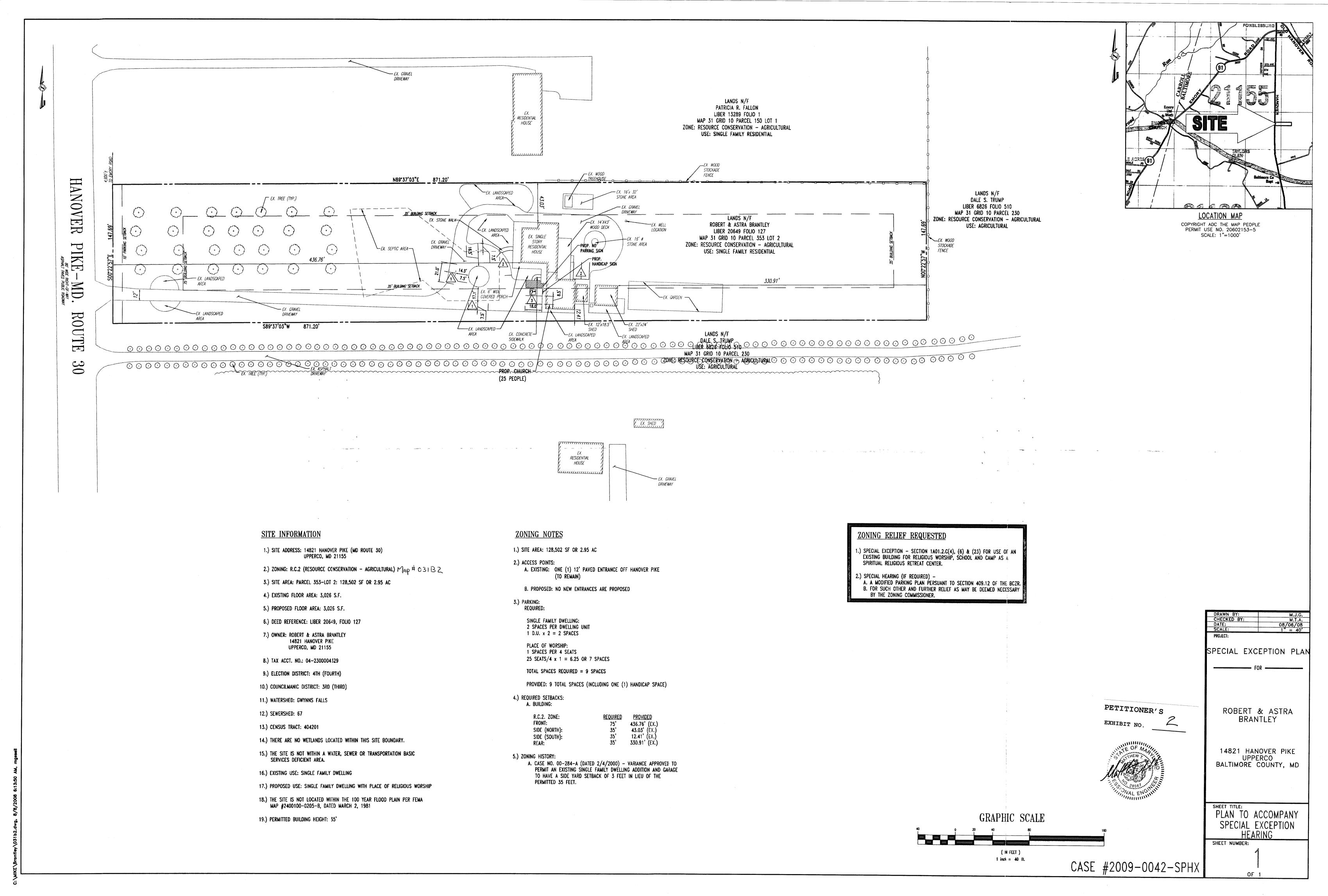
