#### OPINION AND ORDER

On April 8, 2009, Petitioner Boumi Temple Corporation ("BTC"), a nonprofit corporation, filed a petition for sign variances and to amend the site plan previously approved in Case No. 98-234-SPHXA for a temple at 5050 King Avenue. By way of introduction, the King Avenue site, also called a campus, is on 34 acres in the South Perry Hall residential area. It is now occupied by the completed Boumi Temple, a facility with 58,600 square feet divided between a main floor and a basement floor, and accessory storage buildings. There is a long driveway from the King Avenue entrance to the temple building. An existing freestanding sign is at the entrance. The zoning classification for the property has been and remains D.R. 5.5. (Density-Residential).

In the earlier case, on February 23, 1998, Deputy Zoning Commissioner (DZC) and Hearing Officer Timothy Kotroco approved a special exception for a community building devoted to civic and social use, variances from the Residential Transition Area standards, a determination of the adequacy of 406 parking spaces, a sign variance for a freestanding sign 10 feet height instead of the maximum 6 feet, and the accompanying development plan. The decision also reflects that BTC entered into a letter agreement with the South Perry Hall Boulevard Improvement Association (SPHBIA), which included various terms and conditions. SPHBIA was represented by counsel.

BTC did proceed to develop the site and build the temple. In 2009, after a decade in operation, BTC became concerned about the decline in membership. Believing this to

be due partly to difficulties in finding the site, BTC filed the present petition to add three (3) additional wall-mounted signs for increased visibility.

The Petition enumerates the sign variance relief now requested, as described in Zoning Commissioner ("ZC") William Wiseman's June 17, 2009 opinion, page 1,

"The Petitioner requests variance relief from Section 450.4.6 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) as follows: (1) to permit an existing freestanding ground-mounted identification sign (illuminated) with a sign face area of 18 square feet (Sign 4); (2) to allow three (3) illuminated wall-mounted building identification signs with a combined maximum sign face area of 213 square feet in lieu of the permitted one (1) wall-mounted identification sign (one per frontage) with a sign face of 25 square feet each (Signs 1,2 and 3), and (3) to amend the site plan approved in Case No. 98-234-SPHXA."

In his June 17, 2009 final order, entitled "Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law," ZC Wiseman approved the variances and the modified site plan.

The case then came to this County Board of Appeals ("CBA") *de novo* upon People's Counsel for Baltimore County's timely appeal. Baltimore County has a comprehensive sign ordinance. Bill 89-97 was enacted in 1997 and is codified in Baltimore County Zoning Regulation ("BCZR") § 450. In defending the comprehensive zoning maps, People's Counsel scrutinizes sign variances. From time to time, his office has found it necessary to raise challenges or ask for limitations on such variances.

On April 20, 2010, this CBA panel convened a public hearing to review a proposed resolution of the case, approving the sign variances with site and sign lighting conditions. Vernon Boozer, Esquire represented BTC. Peter Max Zimmerman, People's Counsel, represented his office. They described the proposal and its background.

After the filing of People's Counsel's appeal, Mr. Boozer became the attorney for BTC. Charles L. Johnston, Jr., BTC's Chief Rabban, who prepared the site plan, carried forward as consultant and representative. They met with Mr. Zimmerman to see whether there could be a satisfactory legal resolution which would address, resolve, or ameliorate People's Counsel's concerns. As a result, they came to an agreement to propose approval of the aforesaid variances, subject to several new site and sign lighting conditions.

Mr. Boozer and Mr. Zimmerman both outlined the proposal. Mr. Johnston then testified in detail and presented an amended site plan, Exhibit 1A; a description of the sign elevations and dimensions, Exhibit 1B; a descriptive letter from Mr. Johnston to Mr. Zimmerman, Exhibit 1C; and a revised DMW consulting firm redline drawing dated August 4, 1999, revised March 12, 2010, Exhibit 1D.

The conditions are listed on the amended site plan dated March 12, 2010 under the General Notes as Notes 31-35. There was already Note 30, which required that fixtures illuminating the parking area must reflect light away from adjacent residential sites and public streets. The additional Note 31 enumerates the three new wall-mounted signs: #1, 194 square feet (4.3' x 45') on the front wall at the second level; #2, 2.64 square feet ('0.66' x 4') on the door; and #3, 16 square feet (4' x 4') on the front of the canopy. Note 32 refers to the existing freestanding sign, #4, 18 square feet (3' x 6'), which will remain at the King Road entrance. Note 33 delineates that the variances, in combination, amount to 213 square feet for the three new wall-mounted signs, instead of the permitted 25 square feet, and 18 square feet for the existing sign, for a total of 231 square feet. Note 34 refers to the sign elevations and dimensions on Exhibit 1B. Note 35 refers to the site and sign lighting conditions described in Mr. Johnston's March 12, 2010 letter, Exhibit 1C, and drawn on the revised DMW plan, Exhibit 1D.

In the interest of brevity, we shall attach Mr. Johnston's letter to this opinion and order, and incorporate the site and sign lighting conditions as if fully set forth. Essentially, the conditions place time limits on the illumination, respectively, of the existing freestanding sign (#4), dusk to 10 PM; the nine (9) dual head light poles in the parking lot in the southeast part of the campus, dusk to 11:45PM; the furthest light pole on the southeast side of the parking area, dusk to daybreak; the light at the base of the eight (8) flag poles, dusk to 107M; the one flagpole which flies the American flag, dusk to dawn; and the building lettering. Mr. Johnston's letter noted that the back lit lighting is LED or "going green." Mr. Johnston also states that there must be lighting on during functions and gatherings, which typically place in the evenings, but are over by midnight, except for New Year's Eve.

Mr. Johnston testified to his opinion, based on a decade of experience, that the proposed additional signs would be important in providing some additional visibility on King Avenue. The property is not on a main arterial road, and is not in close proximity to any interstate highway exit. At the same time, the location and size of the signage do not appear to have any significant impact on the nearby residential community. Indeed, the site and sign lighting conditions will probably effectuate a measurable improvement.

BTC had hoped to provide visibility to motorists on I-95. This was one of People's Counsel's major concerns. The office has made it a priority to prevent or limit excessive signage oriented to interstate highways, both freestanding and wall-mounted. Such signs usually have detrimental aesthetic and traffic impacts. See <u>Trinity Assembly of God v. People's Counsel for Baltimore County</u> 407 Md. 53 (2008).

Upon further review here, Mr. Zimmerman made a site inspection and reviewed aerial photography, also introduced as an exhibit. It appears that the temple building is about 1000 from the interstate highway. This distance, the building angle, and a forested area on the east side of the campus situate the site so that BTC's new signs will not have a problematic or significant visual impact on I-95 or the traveling public.

Based upon the entire record, Mr. Johnston's testimony, the exhibits, and the agreed conditions, the County Board of Appeals finds that the petition for variances should be granted in accordance with the criteria of BCZR § 307.1 The singular location of the property does cause particular visibility issues and practical difficulty. The experience of BTC suggests that additional signage is warranted as a reasonable use which will do justice to BTC and will not cause any injustice to adjacent property owners or to the public, safety, health, and welfare. The main additional sign consists of wall-mounted sign letters fabricated from non-reflective brushed stainless steel installed on the second level façade on the front wall of the temple. While large, it will be at a substantial distance from King Avenue. As noted, because of the particular geography, it will likely not have any significant visible impact on I-95. The South Perry Hall Boulevard Improvement Association did not appear or register any objection. Indeed, the record reflects that BTC communicated with and obtained the approval of several area residents.

The addition of the new site and sign lighting conditions on the revised plans provides important support and reinforcement for this Board's grant of the variances. It should be underlined that BCZR Section 450.8.A.1 requires a strict construction of the law, unless the demonstrable effect is to reduce confusion and clutter. Under all the circumstances, the Board is satisfied that the proposed additional signage, combined with the lighting conditions imposed on the site as well as the signs, will serve this beneficial purpose. This finding is applicable to this case alone. Each case must be reviewed according to the circumstances.

To the extent that the sign variances modify the special exception plan and development plan approved in Case No. 98-234-SPHXA, the Board is also satisfied that the proposed signs will not have a particular adverse effect on the public safety, health, and welfare in the locality and otherwise meets the criteria of BCZR § 502.1 and the development law.

For the foregoing reasons, the Board hereby enters the following Order.

#### **ORDER**

Therefore, it is this 20 day of 100 day, 2010, ORDERED by the County Board of Appeals of Baltimore County, that the Amended Petition for Sign Variances, and for Modification of the Special Exception, Sign Variance and Site Plan approved in Case No. 98-234-SPHXA be, and hereby is GRANTED, subject to the following simultaneous approvals and conditions:

- 1. The approval is for three additional wall-mounted signs described in the revised site plan and other exhibits. (Exhibits 1A, 1B, 1C, and 1D). These are, respectively, 194 square feet (4.3' x 45') on the front wall façade, second level; 2.64 square feet (.66' x 4') on the front door; and 16 square feet (4' x 4') on the front of the canopy. The approval of the existing freestanding monument sign of 18 square feet (3' x 6') remains in force.
- 1. Petitioner Boumi Temple Corporation shall comply with the amended site plan, described above and identified as Exhibit 1A; the sign dimensions and elevation plan, Exhibit B; Charles Johnston's letter dated March 12, 2010, Exhibit 1C; and the revised DMW drawing, Exhibit 1D.

- 2. In particular, for the purpose of the present case, Petitioner shall comply with the site and sign lighting conditions on the revised site plan, Notes 30-35, as further elaborated in Charles Johnston's letter dated March 12, 2010. Mr. Johnston's letter is attached and incorporated in this Order as if fully set forth.
- 3. Except insofar as amended by this Order, Deputy Zoning Commissioner/Hearing Officer Timothy Kotroco's decision in Case No. 98-234-SPHXA remains in full force.

Any petition for judicial review shall be filed within 30 days of the date of this Order.

Dear Mr. Zimmerman,

In reference to your request concerning the parking lot lighting, flag pole lighting and the proposed building identification sign, I was able to find a final "Red Line Drawing" which I would like to identify as project number 97063-A1 which replaced project number 97036.0. With this drawing is a letter from the engineering company Daft, McCune. Walker, Inc. who did the final "Red Line Drawing" which was prepared on August 4, 1998. I propose the contents of this letter be made part of this now existing drawing which you have a copy of. The following changes which we discussed in your office on February 9, 2010, with Vernon Boozer, myself, and you, have been listed below for your final consideration regarding the lighting.

For reasons of clarification, we will call this revision 2-A and make it part of the "Red Line Drawing". By using the directional indicator on the drawing we will refer to the entrance off of King Avenue as being South. The now existing sign left of the driveway will come on at dusk and go off at ten o'clock (10:00pm). The driveway coming in from King Avenue referencing the parking lot to your right which would still be in the South East part of the complex, there are nine (9) dual head light poles. We propose to time them to come on at dusk and go off at eleven forty-five (11:45 pm). The furthest light pole on the South East side of that parking area will remain on until daybreak.

2-B. The lights now at the base of the eight (8) flag poles will come on at dusk and be timed out at ten o'clock (10:00pm). The one flag pole which fly's the American Flag will be lit from dusk to dawn.

2-C. Building identification lettering will be lit from dusk until eleven thirty (11:30pm). It should be noted that the back lit lighting is LED which is referred to in today's energy management as going green. It should also be noted that once this signage is installed, we will no longer burn the twelve halogen lights that are now installed on the building.

In order to justify the times mentioned our building is open for use seven days a week and most of the functions and gatherings take place in the evening hours, primarily from seven until twelve at night. Our insurance carrier has advised us that we have a responsibility for the safety of our patrons and members. They are telling us that we cannot darken the parking areas when functions are in process. We have a standing rule in the temple that all functions end at twelve o'clock (12:00pm), with the exclusion of New Year's Eve. I would hope the efforts put forth in the above statement would be satisfactory to all concerned.

#### FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter comes before the Zoning Commissioner for consideration of a Petition for Variance filed by the legal owner of the property, Boumi Temple Corporation, by and through its attorney, Jay Irwin Block, Esquire. The Petitioner requests variance relief from Section 450.4.6 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) as follows: (1) to permit an existing freestanding ground-mounted identification sign (illuminated) with a sign face area of 18 square feet (Sign 4); (2) to allow three (3) illuminated wall-mounted building identification signs with a combined maximum sign face area of 213 square feet in lieu of the permitted one (1) wall-mounted identification sign (one per frontage) with a sign face of 25 square feet each) (Signs 1, 2 and 3), and (3) to amend the site plan approved in Case No. 98-234-SPHXA. The property and requested relief are more particularly described on the site plan and signage detail<sup>1</sup>, marked and accepted into evidence as Petitioner's Exhibits 1A and 1B.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> It is important to note that Sign 2 is the word "Boumi" that is 2.64 square feet and will be placed over the main entrance doorway; Sign 3, a "Shrine Medallion" is to be placed on the canopy face of the portico that extends from the building front over the driveway entrance. Neither of these signs (2 or 3) are to be illuminated nor are they visible from any "highway". They are therefore exempt from the requirements of B.C.Z.R. Section 450 – See 450.2.C - Exemptions. Sign 4 is not being changed and has existed in its present state for ten (10) years having been previously approved in Case No. 98-234-SPHXA. In other words, at issue before this Commission is proposed Sign 4 – a 194 square foot LED backlighted "Boumi Shriners" wall-mounted identification sign and the legitimization of the other identification signs on the same frontage.

At the requisite public hearing, Jay Irwin Block, Esquire of Stahl & Block, LLC appeared as attorney for Petitioner. Appearing in support in support of the new signage were James L. Davis, III, Potentate, Charles L. Johnson, Jr., Assistant Rabbin, and Ronald F. Carlson, Chief Rabbin, with Boumi Temple, and Nicholas B. Commodari, a zoning consultant assisting the Petitioner through the building permitting process. There were no Protestants or other interested persons present at the hearing. The case proceeded informally with a proffer from Mr. Block which was supplemented by testimony of Messrs. Davis and Johnson and the Petitioner's consultant, Mr. Commodari.

By way of background, after many years at 4900 North Charles Street in Roland Park, the Boumi Temple moved to its current 34-acre site located on the east side of Babikow Road, not far from the John F. Kennedy Memorial Highway (I-95) and Essex Community College in the Rosedale/White Marsh area of the County. After receiving development plan approval on February 23, 1998, a new 58,600± square foot Temple with associated parking was constructed along with an 11,000± square foot accessory storage building. They relocated the 10-foot high freestanding identification sign (*See* Petitioner's Exhibit 2) from the Charles Street address to their new campus. To the extent applicable, the findings, conclusions and conditions set forth in this Commission's approved Order(s) (Case Nos. XIV-369 and 98-234-SPHXA) are adopted by reference and incorporated herein. On June 12, 2009, a new hearing was held before the undersigned on the instant petition and for the reasons set forth below, the relief requested will be granted.

This case arises from Petitioner's desire to now provide needed visibility, especially from I-95, to assist individuals interested in coming to the property by the placement of the building's name ("Boumi Shriners") on the second floor level of the building to help provide direction. In

this regard, Mr. Johnson testified that membership has declined from 8,000 to 3,600 members over the past ten (10) years since their moving to the County. The loss of members and decline in the number of people who use the facility for its various affairs have resulted in economic hardship. He attributes this to the inability of many people not being able to find their building. Despite the installation of twelve (12) halogen lights installed years ago to light the entire building frontage, complaints are continuously received from new members, visitors, and people intending to come to the property for specific purposes, i.e., weddings, formal dinners, bull roasts, meetings, etc. He explains that the previous Roland Park facility was within a residential area and easily seen from Charles Street compared to the subject rural setting with the new building set back some 700 feet from its entranceway at King Avenue. The only sign providing the public with information of the Temple's location is from King Avenue. The building is not readily apparent given the topography of the land and it is proving to be hard to use the property for its approved purpose. While recognition from King Avenue and Babikow Road exists (many people however drive past the existing signage), there is a greater difficulty in recognizing the building from I-95 and visitors coming to the site from White Marsh Boulevard (Md. Route 43), Philadelphia Road (Md. Route 7) or the Baltimore Beltway (I-695). These factors warrant signage that will serve as an identification that "we are here" and also to serve as recognition that the Shriners exist at this location rather than the public seeing a building that would otherwise appear to be a shoe factory or other industrial use. Messrs. Carlson and Davis discussed the Temple's need to continue in its mission in helping handicapped children and to raise money to take care of its hospital and burn center. The Boumi Temple Corporation allows the election board, community, and neighbors to use the facility for meetings and their parking lot for such

things as flea markets and a site for dumpsters to be located on during spring clean-up programs, etc.

As set forth above, the requested variance relief pertains primarily to signage for identification and directional purposes to the Boumi Temple campus. The exhibits made clear, the wall-mounted sign will help identify the Shriners location from the surrounding roadways. Details of each sign are shown on Petitioner's Exhibit 1B and on the color sign elevation submitted into evidence as Petitioner's Exhibit 4. The new sign letters (Sign 1) will be fabricated from non-reflective brushed stainless steel and installed into the building's block façade. The letters and Shrine Medallion will be 4'-3" high x 45' in length and are well designed and aesthetically pleasing. The letters will be backlighted by using light-emanating diodes (LED) from dusk to 11:00 PM. This will be an improvement to the residential community as was pointed out by Mr. Johnson. The backlighted LED sign will be less expensive to operate and will not be as stark and bright as the current twelve (12) halogen lights that illuminate the total building frontage. The use of these halogen lights will be discontinued when the new sign is installed.

There was an adverse Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comment received on the day of the hearing from the Office of Planning. The community planner, Laurie Hay, stated in pertinent part:

"The Office of Planning is of the opinion that the proposed signage is not appropriate for a residentially zoned community. The size and method of illumination exceeds that which was agreed upon at the time that the special exception was granted in case #98-234-SPHXA, such agreement was considered to be residential in character, the current freestanding identification sign is sufficient, and compatible with the residential community". (Emphasis Added)



Following the hearing, I discussed with Ms. Hay the testimony and evidence presented at the hearing. She was satisfied that the new LED lighted sign proposal at the second floor building level would be an improvement to existing conditions and is in no way in conflict with the special exception approval or imposed conditions found in Case No. 98-234-SPHXA.

It is clear that the signage, as shown on Petitioner's Exhibits 1 through 4, is appropriate in the locations proposed and, having met the standards set forth in B.C.Z.R. Section 307, should be granted. This 34±-acre campus is unique by virtue of its overall size, irregular shape, and topographic features. These unique features of the site, along with the relationship of the building to the public roadway on which it has frontage not only limit visibility into the property but also drives the need for the amount of signage requested in order to provide adequate guidance for members and visitors. It has been established that strict compliance with the B.C.Z.R. would result in a practical difficulty and unreasonable hardship for Petitioner. Requiring Petitioner to adhere to the number and size limitations for signage required under the B.C.Z.R. would make it quite difficult for visitors and users of the facility to utilize the Shriners' services in an efficient manner. This fact has been made painfully clear over the past ten (10) years of operation since relocating to Baltimore County.

Finally, there is no evidence that the grant of the relief would be detrimental to the surrounding area – the proposed signage is reasonable given the size of the Boumi Temple and campus, the number of visitors and services provided and the need to provide adequate guidance to those visitors. The neighboring community and the South Perry Hall Boulevard Improvement Association have expressed no objections to the proposal. Therefore, I am persuaded to grant the requested relief.

MINION OF THE

Pursuant to the advertisement, posting of the property, and public hearing on this Petition held, and for the reasons set forth above, the relief requested shall be granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED by the Zoning Commissioner for Baltimore County this

day of June 2009 that the Petition for Variance seeking relief from Section

450.4.6 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) to permit an existing 18 square foot freestanding, previously approved, monument sign 10 feet in height and to approve an additional wall-mounted identification sign of 194 square feet on the same frontage in lieu of the permitted one sign per frontage at 25 square feet, both to be illuminated, in accordance with Petitioner's Exhibits 1A and 1B, be and is hereby GRANTED subject to the following:

- 1. The Petitioner may apply for their building permit and be granted same upon receipt of this Order; however, the Petitioner is hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at its own risk until the thirty (30) day appeal period from the date of this Order has expired. If, for whatever reason this Order is reversed, the relief granted herein shall be rescinded.

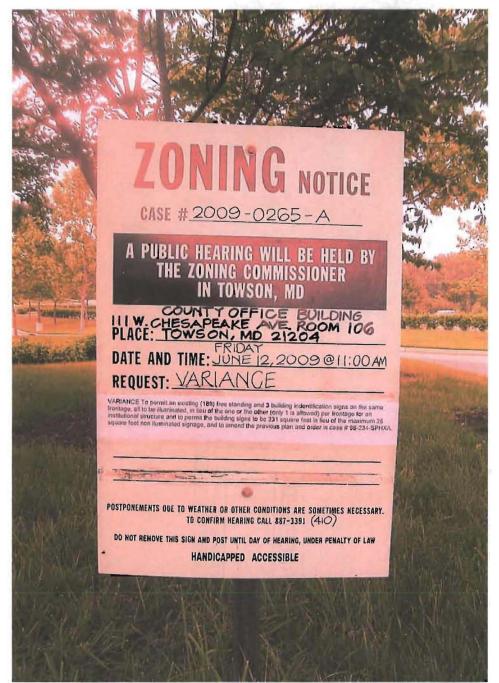

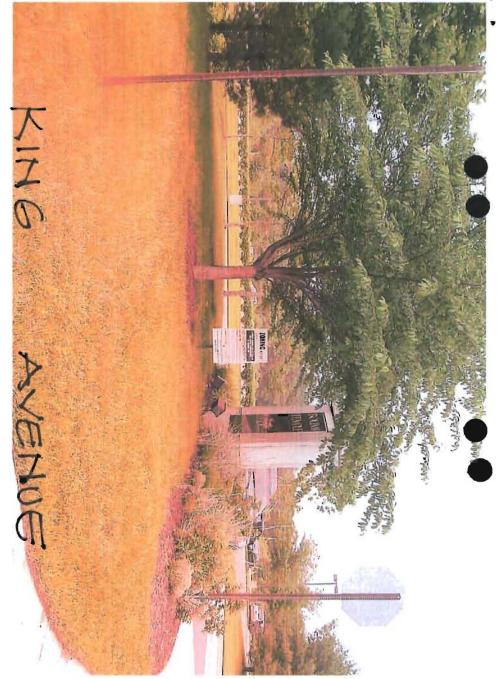

The size and method of illumination exceeds that which was agreed upon at the time that the special exception was granted in case #98-234SPXA, such agreement was considered to be residential in character, the current freestanding identification sign is sufficient, and compatible with the residential community.

However, this office would not object to installing ground-mounted up lighting to illuminate the existing entrance sign for evening functions.

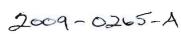

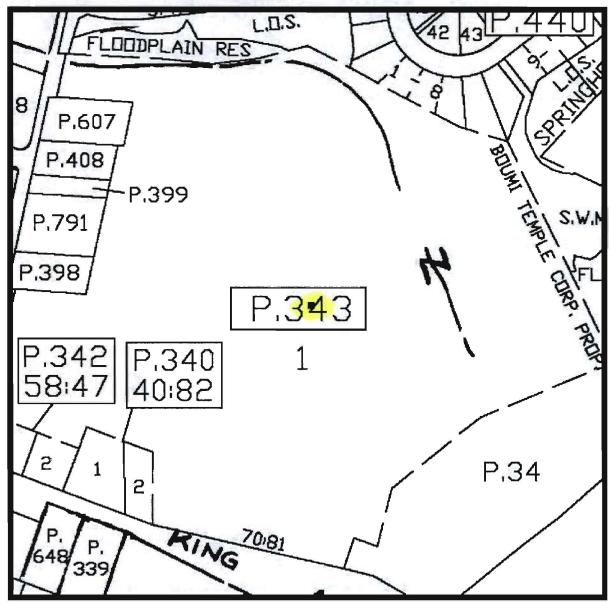

#### HEARING OFFICER'S OPINION AND DEVELOPMENT PLAN ORDER

This matter comes before this Hearing Officer for consideration of a development plan for the proposed development of the subject property by James William Bartenfelter, et al, Owners, and Boumi Temple, Developer, with a 58,600 sq.ft. temple and 11,760 sq.ft. storage building, with associated parking area. The development plan was prepared by Thomas M. Repsher, a Registered Landscape Architect with Daft-McCune-Walker, Inc. In addition to development plan approval, the Owner/Developer requests a special exception to permit a community building/structures devoted to a civil and social use to be located in a D.R.3.5 and D.R.5.5 zone and to approve compliance to the extent possible with the Residential Transition Area (RTA) restrictions under Section 1B01.1.B.1.g(10) of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.); a special hearing to approve that 406 parking spaces is sufficient for the proposed community building; variance relief from Section 450.4.G of the B.C.Z.R. to permit a sign height of as tall as 10 feet in lieu of the maximum allowed 6 feet. The subject property and proposed development are more particularly described on the development plan/site plan submitted into evidence as Developer's Exhibit 1/Petitioner's Exhibit 1.

As to the history of this project, a concept plan for this development was prepared and a conference held thereon on October 6, 1997.

required, a community input meeting was held on November 19, 1997 at the Perry Hall Elementary School. Subsequently, a development plan was submitted and a conference held thereon on January 21, 1998. Following the submission of that plan, development plan comments were submitted by the appropriate agencies of Baltimore County and a revised development plan incorporating those comments was submitted at the hearing held before me on February 17, 1998.

Appearing at the hearing on behalf of this project were John and James Bartenfelter, co-owners of the property, George Hunt, John Fink, Clifford A. Stevens, and Charles Irish, representatives of Boumi Temple, Developer, and Robert A. Hoffman, Esquire, attorney for the Owner/Developer. Also appearing in support of the development plan were Edmund Haile, George E. Gavrelis, Joe Fortino and Mitch Kellman, representatives of Daft-McCune-Walker, Inc., the consulting firm which prepared the development plan/site plan for this project, Richard Moore, a traffic engineering consultant with Wells and Associates, Neal Kitt, and Gary Murphy. Numerous representatives of the various Baltimore County agencies who reviewed the plan attended the hearing, including Ervin McDaniel with the Office of Planning (OP), Glenn Shaffer with the Department of Environmental Protection and Resource Management (DEPRM), Jun Fernando, Zoning Review, Robert W. Bowling, Development Plans Review, both divisions of the Department of Permits and Development Management (DPDM). Several residents from the surrounding locale appeared as interested citizens including Michael E. Brown, Arlene Roth, Bernadine D. Seymour, a representative of the South Perry Hall Boulevard Improvement Association, and Thomas Seymour. citizens were represented by Leslie Pittler, Esquire.

The subject property is an unimproved parcel of land containing 34.73 acres, more or less, split zoned D.R.3.5 and D.R.5.5. The property is located on the east side of Babikow Road, north of King Avenue not far from the Essex Community College. The property has been in the Bartenfelter family for many years and is currently under contract to be sold to the Boumi Temple, who is desirous of constructing a 58,600 sq.ft. temple and an 11,000 sq.ft. accessory storage building. In addition, a parking lot layout is also proposed for the subject site, as shown on the development plan submitted and accepted into evidence as Developer's Exhibit 1.

Section 26-206 of the Baltimore County Code sets forth the standards by which the Hearing Officer must follow when considering a development plan. At the public hearing, the Hearing Officer is required to determine what, if any, open issues or agency comments remain unresolved. Testimony and evidence received was that all issues raised within the comments submitted by the various County reviewing agencies have been resolved and incorporated within the revised development plan and that the plan complies with all County regulations. Furthermore, the citizens who attended the hearing and their Counsel indicated that they had no objections to the development plan. There being no open issues or concerns raised by either the Developer, any County agency representatives, or the citizens in attendance, it was not necessary to take any testimony, but a brief presentation of the development plan was provided by Mr. Edmund Haile, a principal with the firm of Daft-McCune-Walker, Inc.

In addition to development plan approval, the Owners/Developers also requested special hearing, special exception and variance relief.

Testimony was offered by Clifford A. Stevens, who holds the office of "Recorder" with the Boumi Temple. Mr. Stevens testified that the Boumi

Temple has been located at 4900 North Charles Street in Roland Park the past 30 years. That facility comprises approximately 85,000 sq.ft. of space and will soon be taken over by Loyola College. Therefore, the Boumi Temple is in need of relocating their facility and have selected the subject site as the new location for their temple. As shown on the development plan/site plan, the new facility will consist of two separate buildings, one of which will contain 58,600 sq.ft. and house the temple, and the other building will contain approximately 11,000 sq.ft. and will be used for storage purposes. The layout of the proposed facility has been carefully designed so as not to impose upon the surrounding residential community. The Owner/Developer and their engineers have done an excellent job of screening the property so that the least amount of impact on the surrounding neighborhood will occur. Due to the zoning of the property, the requested special exception is necessary in order to use the subject site as proposed. Furthermore, inasmuch as there is currently no formula for calculating the required number of parking spaces to be provided for the use proposed in the D.R.3.5 and D.R.5.5 zone, the Owner/Developer requested the special hearing to approve that the 406 spaces proposed are sufficient for this site. In addition, Mr. Stevens testified that the Boumi Temple wishes to relocate the identification sign from their Charles Street address to the subject site. That sign and the surrounding stone upon which is mounted is approximately 10 feet tall. Thus, the requested variance is necessary. Further testimony revealed that the Boumi Temple has entered into a letter agreement with Mr. Leslie Pittler, attorney at law, who represents the South Perry Hall Boulevard Improvement Association, which reflects certain terms and conditions agreed to by the Developer.

On behalf of the Developer, Mr. George Gavrelis testified to the landscaping proposed for this site. In addition, Mr. Gavrelis explained the two areas where the Owner/Developer is unable to meet the RTA requirements imposed by the B.C.Z.R. Those impositions into the RTA are fairly minor, and were, in fact, unavoidable by the Developer in the design and layout of this facility. Therefore, I find that they have complied to the extent possible with the RTA regulations.

Finally, the Petitioners have asked that the special hearing be granted to approve that 406 parking spaces are sufficient for the proposed facility. On behalf of the Developer, Mr. Stephens indicated that their facility on Charles Street operates with approximately 370 parking spaces. He indicated that this number has been sufficient to accommodate the needs of the Boumi Temple for the many years that they have been existed at the Charles Street location. The proposed facility, which is smaller than the Charles Street facility, will have 406 parking spaces, or, 36 more parking spaces than they currently have. Therefore, the Owner/Developer believes the parking proposed for this site will be sufficient to accommodate the new facility. Mr. Stevens further testified that the average age of many Boumi Temple members is approximately 70 years; thus, many of its members carpool when they attend services.

As noted above, many citizens from the surrounding community appeared out of interest. Mr. Pittler represented those citizens, as well as the South Perry Hall Boulevard Improvement Association. There was no testimony in opposition to the relief requested; however, Mr. Pittler did ask that the letter agreement, which was submitted into evidence as Developer's Exhibit 2, be incorporated into the Order.

In considering the special exception relief sought, it is clear that the B.C.Z.R. permits the use proposed in a D.R. 3.5/D.R.5.5 zone by special exception. Therefore, it must be determined if the conditions as delineated in Section 502.1 are satisfied.

The Petitioner had the burden of adducing testimony and evidence which would show that the proposed use met the prescribed standards and requirements set forth in Section 502.1 of the B.C.Z.R. The Petitioner has shown that the proposed use would be conducted without real detriment to the neighborhood and would not adversely affect the public interest. The facts and circumstances do not show that the proposed use at the particular location described by Petitioner's Exhibit 1 would have any adverse impact above and beyond that inherently associated with such a special exception use, irrespective of its location within the zone.

Schultz v. Pritts. 432 A.2d 1319 (1981).

The proposed use will not be detrimental to the health, safety, or general welfare of the locality, nor tend to create congestion in roads, streets, or alleys therein, nor be inconsistent with the purposes of the property's zoning classification, nor in any other way be inconsistent with the spirit and intent of the B.C.Z.R.

After reviewing all of the testimony and evidence presented, it appears that the special exception should be granted with certain restrictions as more fully described below.

An area variance may be granted where strict application of the zoning regulations would cause practical difficulty to the Petitioner and his property. McLean v. Soley, 270 Md. 208 (1973). To prove practical difficulty for an area variance, the Petitioner must meet the following:

1) whether strict compliance with requirement would unreasonably prevent the use of the property for a

permitted purpose or render conformance unnecessarily burdensome;

- 2) whether a grant of the variance would do a substantial justice to the applicant as well as other property owners in the district or whether a lesser relaxation than that applied for would give sufficient relief; and,
- 3) whether relief can be granted in such fashion that the spirit of the ordinance will be observed and public safety and welfare secured.

Anderson v. Bd. of Appeals, Town of Chesapeake Beach, 22 Md. App. 28 (1974).

After due consideration of the testimony and evidence presented, it is clear that practical difficulty or unreasonable hardship will result if the special hearing and variance relief are not granted. It has been established that special circumstances or conditions exist that are peculiar to the subject property and that the requirements from which the Owners/Developers seek relief will unduly restrict the use of the land due to the special conditions unique to this particular parcel. In addition, the relief requested will not cause any injury to the public health, safety or general welfare, and meets the spirit and intent of the B.C.Z.R.

Pursuant to the zoning and development plan regulations of Baltimore County as contained within the B.C.Z.R. and Subtitle 26 of the Baltimore County Code, the advertising of the property and public hearing held thereon, the development plan shall be approved and the Petitions for Special Hearing, Special Exception, and Variance shall be granted, consistent with the comments contained herein and the restrictions set forth below.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED by the Deputy Zoning Commissioner/Hearing Officer for Baltimore County this  $\frac{3}{2}$  day of February, 1998, that

the development plan for Boumi Temple, identified herein as Developer's Exhibit 1, be and is hereby APPROVED, subject to the following restriction:

1) The Letter Agreement entered into by and between the Cwner/Developer and the South Perry Hall Boulevard Improvement Association, a copy of which was submitted into evidence as Developer's Exhibit 2, shall be incorporated herein and is enforceable as if a part of this Order. A copy is attached for reference.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Petition for Special Exception to approve a community building/structures devoted to a civil and social use in a D.R.3.5 and D.R.5.5 zone, and compliance to the extent possible with RTA restrictions, pursuant to Section 1B01.1.B.1.g(10) of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.), and in accordance with Petitioner's Exhibit 1, be and is hereby GRANTED; and,

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that 406 parking spaces is sufficient for the proposed community building, in accordance with Petitioner's Exhibit 1, and as such, the Petition for Special Hearing is hereby GRANTED; and,

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Petition for Variance seeking relief from Section 450.4.G of the B.C.Z.R. to permit a sign height of as tall as 10 feet in lieu of the maximum allowed 6 feet, in accordance with Petitioner's Exhibit 1, be and is hereby GRANTED.

Any appeal of this decision must be taken in accordance with Section 26-209 of the Baltimore County Code.

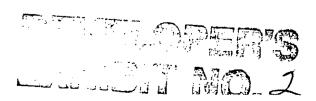
I am writing to respond to certain issues we discussed at our meeting on February 13, 1998. On behalf of the Boumi Temple, I would propose the following:

- 1. Trash pickup would be no earlier than 8:00 a.m. and no later than 6:00 p.m.
- 2. There will be a construction entrance for the Boumi Temple located along Babikov Road, but it will not serve as the permanent entrance to the facility. The construction entrance will be removed, graded and replanted prior to a use and occupancy permit being issued for the building.
- 3. Hours of construction would be between the hours of 6:30 a.m. to dusk during the site operations period. Site operations include grading, paving and foundation work. This will take approximately 10 weeks. One exception to the no work after dusk rule would be if there is a concrete pour that needs supervision after sunset.

Following the site operations, contractors would be working from 7:00 a.m. to dusk. A second exception to the "work after dusk" rule would be for work done inside the building.

During the site operation period, the contractor will provide dust control measures as needed and will see to it that "clots" of dirt are removed from Babikow Road.

4. The Community Association you represent (I need the "official name") is welcome to use the new facility twice a year at times to be mutually agreed upon. The Association would advise Boumi of two preferred dates prior to February 15 of each year.

I would also appreciate it if you could give us some idea of an approximate number of people expected for each of these functions. Of course, the Association would need to cover expenses specifically related to their function (no cost for the use of the facility itself) and follow the same rules and policies in effect for any Boumi Temple function.

5. In terms of the Boumi Temple use, we believe that it can be broken down into three categories each of which designates an approximate total number of people who will be using the Boumi Temple at any given time:

Affairs such as a formal dinner, dance or bull roast with 275 people or more occurs approximately 3 times per month.

Smaller affairs such as luncheons or meetings (or a combination) with between 125 and 275 people occurs approximately 5 times per month.

Less than 125 people in the facility could occur at any time.

For the larger events such as dinner, dinners and dances, a function of 350 people would generate about half the number of cars or 175. Smaller functions and meetings in terms of the number of cars are more of a one to one ratio. I am told that in the 40 years the Boumi Temple was located in Roland Park, the 320 parking spaces provided there never presented a parking problem or a complaint from the Roland Park neighbors.

Except for New Year's Eve which may end a little later, evening functions would end by 1:00 a.m. The norm would be more like 11:30 p.m. to 12:00 a.m., with cleanup to follow.
