OPINION

This case comes to the Board on appeal of the final decision of the Zoning Commissioner of Baltimore County in which the Zoning Commissioner denied a Petition for Variance seeking relief from Section §1B01.2.C.1 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R.") to permit a building separation of 14' in lieu of the required 16' and to amend the approved Final Development Plan for Woods of Winands lot #35 to all the side and rear of the dwelling to be located outside the building envelope as shown on the plan.

A public hearing was held on March 31, 2010. The Petitioner, Kevin J. Richardson (the "Petitioner") was represented by Amar S. Weisman, Esquire. The Protestant, Ollinger N. Connelly, (the "Protestant") was *pro se*. A Public Deliberation was held on April 22, 2010.

Factual Background

The Petitioner is the owner of the property located at 4220 Hanwell Road, Randallstown, MD 21133 in Baltimore County (the "Property"). The Property is improved with a two-story, split foyer, single family dwelling with an attached garage. The home was built in 1987. The Property contains 8,291 square feet, or 0.1903 acres, more or less, is pie-shaped and is located within a cul-de-sac. It is zoned D.R. 3.5.

At issue in this case is an addition to an attached garage which was added by the Petitioner on the southeast side of the home in 2008. The Petitioner widened the garage by approximately 2 ft. so that he could park one car inside the garage and have additional storage space. The garage was originally built in

1994. However, the enlargement necessitated a variance from BCZR §1B01.2.C.1 which requires a 16 foot separation distance between existing buildings. (Pet. Ex. 4). There is 10 square feet of area which does not comply with the 16' separation.

When the garage was initially constructed in 1994, his neighbor, Ollinger Connelly, who owns the property next door to the Petitioner at 4218 Hanwell Road, filed a complaint with the Department of Permits and Development Management ("DPDM"). According to Mr. Connelly who testified at the Board hearing, no action was taken by DPDM on his initial Complaint. Then, when Mr. Richardson enlarged the garage in 2008, Mr. Connelly filed another complaint with DPDM on the basis that the enlargement was expanded onto his property without a permit. On April 1, 2009, DPDM issued a Correction Notice to the Petitioner to amend the permit request to include all work being done on the garage. (Pet. Ex. 5). The inspector found that the existing garage was being made wider and longer. Apparently, the Petitioner's request for a permit was for a roof overhang only and did not request permission to widen or lengthen the garage. Unfortunately for the Petitioner, he had already completed the work, having paid substantial sums of money to a "Reverend Epps" who was not a licensed contractor and who misinformed the Petitioner that he did not need a building permit to enlarge the garage because the garage was already there.

In support of this Petition for Variance, the Petitioner hired J. Scott Dallas, a licensed property line surveyor to testify on the issues of uniqueness, practical difficulty and hardship. Mr. Dallas was admitted as an expert in zoning matters and property line surveying. He testified that the property was unique because it had the smallest building envelope which restricts additional construction on the lot. A site plan of the property which accompanied the Petition for Variance was admitted as Pet. Ex. 1. Mr. Dallas admitted that the house looked like all the other houses in the neighborhood.

Mr. Dallas also testified that the Petitioner suffered practical difficulty and/or hardship because the Petitioner could not comfortably park his car in the garage. Further, Mr. Dallas pointed out that there was already a 13' separation between the Petitioner's house and Mr. Connelly's house. Thus, the only part of the property that does not comply with BCZR §1B01.2.C.1 is the front northeast corner of the Petitioner's house, the area of which measures a total of 10 square feet. (Pet. Ex. 3). Mr. Dallas further

added that there was no increase in density and that the request was within the spirit and intent of the BCZR.

Also testifying on behalf of the Petitioner was Winford Shelton who resides next to the Petitioner on the side farthest from the garage enlargement. Mr. Shelton testified that 10 out of 14 houses had a garage. He further stated that the enlargement of the garage does not interfere with the use and enjoyment of his property.

Mr. Connelly testified in opposition to the variance. He stated that the enlargement makes the 2 houses even closer together. Notwithstanding the fact that Mr. Connelly no longer resides in his house, Mr. Connelly believes that the lack of distance depreciates the value of his property. Mr. Connelly admitted that he has not lost any contracts of sale due to the close proximity of the 2 houses.

Decision

In order for the Petitioner to obtain approval for the enlarged garage, this Board needs to be convinced that the Petitioner has satisfied §307.1 of the BCZR which states, in pertinent part, as follows:

"...(T)he County Board of Appeals, upon appeal, shall have and they are hereby given the power to grant variances from height and area regulations...only in cases where special circumstances or conditions exist that are peculiar to the land or structure which is the subject of the variance request and where strict compliance with the Zoning Regulations for Baltimore County would result in practical difficulty or unreasonable hardship.... Furthermore, any such variance shall be granted only if in strict harmony with the spirit and intent of said height, area...regulations, and only in such manner as to grant relief without injury to public health, safety, and general welfare...."

This Board is guided by the holding provided by the Court of Special Appeals in *Cromwell v. Ward*, 102 Md. App. 691, 698 (1995), wherein the Court writes:

...The Baltimore County ordinance requires "conditions ...peculiar to the land...and...practical difficulty...." Both must exist. ...However, as is clear from the language of the Baltimore County ordinance, the initial factor that must be established before the practical difficulties, if any, are addressed, is the abnormal impact the ordinance has on a specific piece of property because of the peculiarity and uniqueness of that piece of property, not the uniqueness or peculiarity of the practical difficulties alleged to exist. It is only when the uniqueness is first established that we then concern ourselves with the practical difficulties...."

In requiring a finding of "uniqueness", the Court of Special Appeals in Cromwell referred to the definition of "uniqueness" provided in North v. St. Mary's County, 99 Md. App. 502, 514 (1993):

> In the zoning context the "unique" aspect of a variance requirement does not refer to the extent of improvements upon the property, or upon neighboring property: "Uniqueness" of a property for zoning purposes requires that the subject property has an inherent characteristic not shared by other properties in the area, i.e., its shape, topography, subsurface condition, environmental factors, historical significance, access or non-access to navigable waters, practical restrictions imposed by abutting properties (such as obstructions) or other similar restrictions. In respect to structures, it would relate to such characteristics as unusual architectural aspects in bearing or parting walls....

Id. at 710.

If the Property is determined to be "unique," then the issue is whether practical difficulties also exist. Toward this end, the Board acknowledges that an area variance may be granted where strict application of the zoning regulations would cause practical difficulty to the Petitioner and his property. McLean v. Soley, 270 Md. 208 (1973). To prove practical difficulty for an area variance, the Petitioner must produce evidence to allow the following questions to be answered affirmatively:

- 1. Whether strict compliance with requirement would unreasonably prevent the use of the property for a permitted purpose or render conformance unnecessarily burdensome;
- 2. Whether the grant would do substantial injustice to applicant as well as other property owners in the district or whether a lesser relaxation than that applied for would give substantial relief; and
- 3. Whether relief can be granted in such fashion that the spirit of the ordinance will be observed and public safety and welfare secured.

Anderson v. Bd of Appeals, Town of Chesapeake Beach, 22 Md. App. 28 (1974).

However, the law is clear that self-inflicted hardship cannot form the basis for a claim of practical difficulty. Speaking for the Court in Cromwell, supra, Judge Cathell noted:

> Were we to hold that self-inflicted hardships in and of themselves justified variances, we would, effectively, not only generate a plethora of such hardships but we would also emasculate zoning ordinances. Zoning would become meaningless. We hold that practical difficulty or unnecessary hardship for zoning variance purposes cannot generally be self-inflicted.

Id., at 722.

The Petitioner argues that the Property is unique because it has the smallest building envelope. The Petitioner further argues that he will not be able to use the garage because he can not comfortably fit his vehicles in the garage. The Board notes that the house did not have a garage when the Petitioner purchased it. He then proceeded to not only build the garage but to enlarge it without the proper permit. The application for permit was for a roof overhang only, not an enlargement. But-for Mr. Connelly's complaint, the County would not have known that the garage was being widened and lengthened.

After reviewing all of the testimony and evidence presented, the Board has determined that the Petitioner has failed to prove that the Property is unique or that he has suffered any practical difficulty which is not a self imposed hardship. As a result, the variance is denied for the following reasons.

The Petitioner's house and lot are identical to other houses and lots in the neighborhood. Like the Petitioner's lot, the lots on Hanwell Road are pie shaped. The Petitioner's contention that the lot has the smallest building envelope does not satisfy the uniqueness requirement under *Cromwell* that there must be an inherent characteristic not shared by other properties in the area, i.e., its shape, topography, subsurface condition, environmental factors, historical significance, access or non-access to navigable waters, practical restrictions imposed by abutting properties (such as obstructions) or other similar restrictions. No measurements of this house in comparison to other houses in the area were presented at the hearing. No evidence was presented as to these factors affecting the land.

The Court in Cromwell, citing North v. St. Mary's, supra. held that the "extent of improvements on the property" can not be the reason for uniqueness unless there are architectural features associated with the structure which prove "unique." In respect to structures, it would relate to such characteristics as unusual architectural aspects in bearing or party walls.... <u>Id.</u> at 710. No evidence was presented as to any particular architectural features associated with this house built in 1987.

While the Board has determined that there is no uniqueness with regard to the Petitioner's land and therefore the issue of practical difficulty need not be addressed, if the Board did address the issue of practical difficulty, it would have found that the Petitioner's professed practical difficulty is based solely on the self imposed hardship of widening the garage without first obtaining the variance. Financial hardship incurred in enlarging a garage, or the cost incurred in pursuing a variance request, are not the

type of hardships envisioned by *Cromwell*. The Board finds that the Petitioner is not prevented from using his garage, notwithstanding the fact that 2 more feet may have been more comfortable.

ORDER

THEREFORE, IT IS THIS 19th day of 7, 2010, by the County

Board of Appeals of Baltimore County

ORDERED, that the Petition for Variance seeking relief from Section §1B01.2.C.1 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations to permit a building separation of 14' in lieu of the required 16' and to amend the approved Final Development Plan for Woods of Winands lot #35 to all the side and rear of the dwelling to be located outside the building envelope as shown on the plan be, and the same is hereby **DENIED**.

Any petition for judicial review from this decision must be made in accordance with Rule 7-201 through Rule 7-210 of the *Maryland Rules*.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter comes before the Zoning Commissioner for consideration of a Petition for Variance filed by the legal owner of the property, Kevin J. Richardson. Petitioner requests variance relief from Section 1B02.3.B [Section 1B01.2.C.1 - 1970 Zoning Regulations] of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) and Section V.B.3.b - 1970 Comprehensive Manual of Development Policy (CMDP) to permit a building-to-building separation (between detached dwellings on different lots) of 14 feet in lieu of the minimum required 16 feet, and to amend the Final Development Plan (FDP) for Woods of Winands, Lot 35, to allow the side and rear of the dwelling to be located outside of the building envelope as shown on the FDP. The property and requested relief are more particularly described on the two-page site plan submitted, which was accepted into evidence and marked as Petitioner's Exhibit 1.

Appearing at the requisite public hearing in support of the request was Kevin J. Richardson, property owner. Appearing as a Protestant in this matter was the adjacent neighbor at 4218 Hanwell Road, Ollinger N. Connolly.

Testimony and evidence offered disclosed that the subject property is a triangular shaped parcel located on the south side of a cul-de-sac at the end of Hanwell Road in Randallstown.

The property recognized as Lot 35 – Section II, in the subdivision known as the Woods of

Winands contains a gross area of 8,291 square feet, or 0.1903 acres, more or less, zoned D.R.3.5. The property is improved with a two-story, split-foyer, single-family dwelling built in 1987. At issue in this case is an attached garage constructed by the Petitioner on the southeast side of his home¹ measuring 12' x 35' in size. This addition built by a licensed contractor will allow the parking of one vehicle and provide additional needed storage space.

By way of background, after purchasing the property in May 1987, the Petitioner decided late in 2008 that he would construct a garage. In this regard, Mr. Richardson hired a contractor and questioned him whether there was a need for a property survey or for him (Richardson) to do anything in particular. As illustrated on Petitioner's photographic Exhibit 2, he desired to have his improvements look like the other homes across the street with their attached garages (4219 and 4221 Hanwell Road). The contractor assured him that everything would be fine and began construction. Little did the Petitioner realize, at that time, that the proposed garage would become complicated by Section 1B01.2.C.1 of the B.C.Z.R. which requires a 16 foot separation distance between existing buildings.

The Petitioner's nightmare began in April 2009 when the Department of Permits and Development Management (DPDM), the agency that issued him a Building Permit (B712597), received an inquiry questioning the structure's setback distance from the Connolly's two-story home and garage built in 1987. Code Enforcement Officer Bob Peters visited the site on April 1, 2009 and issued a "Correction Notice" informing Petitioner that he would need to bring the property in conformance with the zoning regulations. In any event, the work was finished at this time and the Petitioner had paid substantial sums of money. He asserts that the separation between buildings is 14 feet while Mr. Connolly, testified that he too measured the distance and

found it to be 13 feet. The Petitioner now comes before me seeking relief as set forth above to allow the existing structure with a separation of 14 feet (at the time of the hearing no survey had been completed). Mr. Richardson testified at length as the practical difficulty and unreasonable hardship he has endured since receiving the correction notice, which has left him in an untenable position. Despite discussions with Mr. Connolly who has been trying to sell his house over the past year, little has been done to appease the Connolly's who actually believe that the garage is at or over the common property line.

Mr. Richardson testified that he placed the garage in its present location for the reasons indicated above and was not aware of any County restriction that would prevent him from doing so. As indicated, he submitted photographs depicting a number of similarly constructed garages in the immediate area. To a certain extent, I am sympathetic to Mr. Richardson's plight. A search of the Zoning Commissioner's records fails to disclose any variances applied for or granted for similar relief in this area. If other garages in the Woods of Winands subdivision have been erected over time, they have done so in disregard of the zoning regulations. Variance relief can be granted only if the requirements contained in Section 307 of the B.C.Z.R. are met. This section states that the Zoning Commissioner may grant variances;

... only in cases where special circumstances or conditions exist that are peculiar to the land or structure which is the subject of the variance request and where strict compliance with the zoning regulations of Baltimore County would result in practical difficulty or unreasonable hardship.

Variances are not favored under the law and presumed to be in conflict with the regulations. As stated in *Cromwell v. Ward*, 102 Md. App. 691, 703 (1995):

The general rule is that the authority to grant a variance should be exercised sparingly and only under exceptional circumstances.

After due consideration of all of the testimony and evidence presented, I find that the Petitioner's property is substantially similar to other properties as to size, shape, and topography. As such, it does not meet the requirements for a finding of uniqueness as set forth in *Cromwell*. I cannot decide this case based on "extenuating circumstances." Having determined that no uniqueness exists as to the Petitioner's property, I must therefore deny the variance requested by the Petitioner.

Pursuant to the advertisement, posting of the property, and public hearing on this Petition held, and for the reasons set forth above, the relief requested shall be denied.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED by the Zoning Commissioner for Baltimore County this ______ day of July 2009 that the Petition for Variance seeking relief from Section 1B02.3.B [Section 1B01.2.C.1 - 1970 Zoning Regulations] of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) and Section V.B.3.b - 1970 Comprehensive Manual of Development Policy (CMDP) to permit a building-to-building separation (between detached dwellings on different lots) of 14 feet in lieu of the minimum required 16 feet, and to amend the Final Development Plan (FDP) for Woods of Winands, Lot 35, to allow the side and rear of the dwelling to be located outside of the building envelope as shown on the FDP, in accordance with Petitioner's Exhibit 1, be and is hereby DENIED; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Petitioner shall have one hundred twenty (120) days from the date of this Order to bring the garage in compliance with the zoning regulations.

Any appeal of this decision shall be taken in accordance with Baltimore County Code

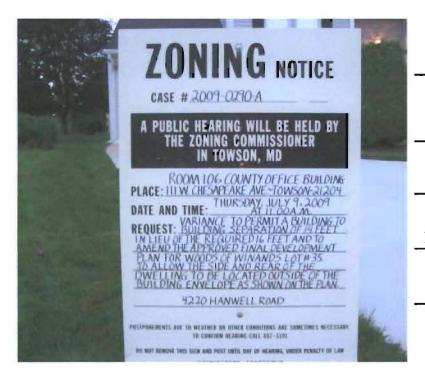

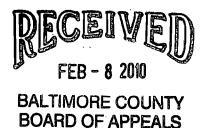

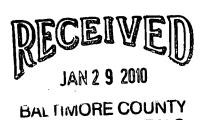

PANEL MEMBERS DISCUSSED THE FOLLOWING:

STANDING

- The Board reviewed the facts, evidence, testimony and law in this matter. The Petitioner had applied for and received a permit to extend the overhang of the existing garage. The Petitioner hired a builder and while extending the overhang, extended the garage. The Protestant/neighbor complained. The Board heard testimony which indicated that there is nothing unique about the subject property pursuant to Cromwell. The subject lot is pieshaped, as are several other lots in the development. Expert testimony stated that the subject lot has the smallest building envelope but measurements were not provided to the Board. The Board determined that the Petitioner did not meet the burden of proof required to grant the Variance.
- The Board reviewed that the statute states that the land or structure must be "unique" however, there is no case law which states that the structure alone can cause the property to be considered unique unless there is some extenuating circumstance with regard to the architecture. In this instance, the structure is not unique.
- The Board reviewed that the Petitioner extended his garage to provide enough room in his garage to permit two vehicles parked side by side. The Petitioner's hardship is self

imposed. The Board determined that the property is not unique and therefore the Variance cannot be granted. The Board also determined that the Petitioner does not need to remove the entire garage, he must only remove the portion which is in violation.

DECISION BY BOARD MEMBERS: The subject property is not unique pursuant to the conditions of <u>Cromwell v. Ward</u>. Any hardship is self imposed.

FINAL DECISION: After thorough review of the facts, testimony, and law in the matter, the Board unanimously agreed to DENY the Petition for Variance.

NOTE: These minutes, which will become part of the case file, are intended to indicate for the record that a public deliberation took place on the above date regarding this matter. The Board's final decision and the facts and findings thereto will be set out in the written Opinion and Order to be issued by the Board.

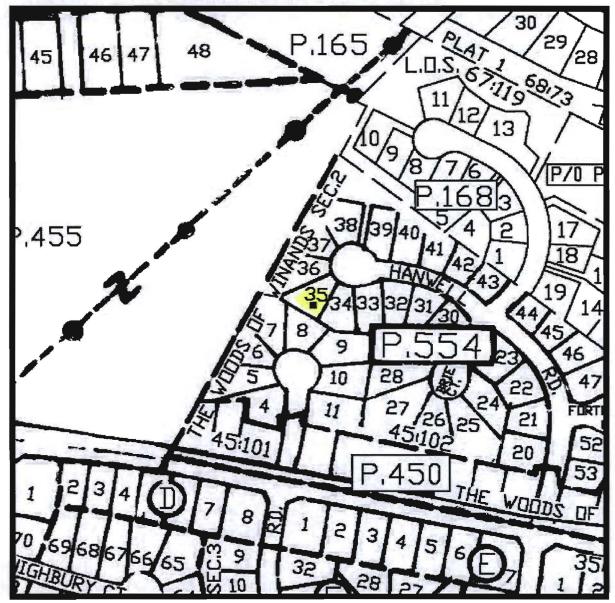

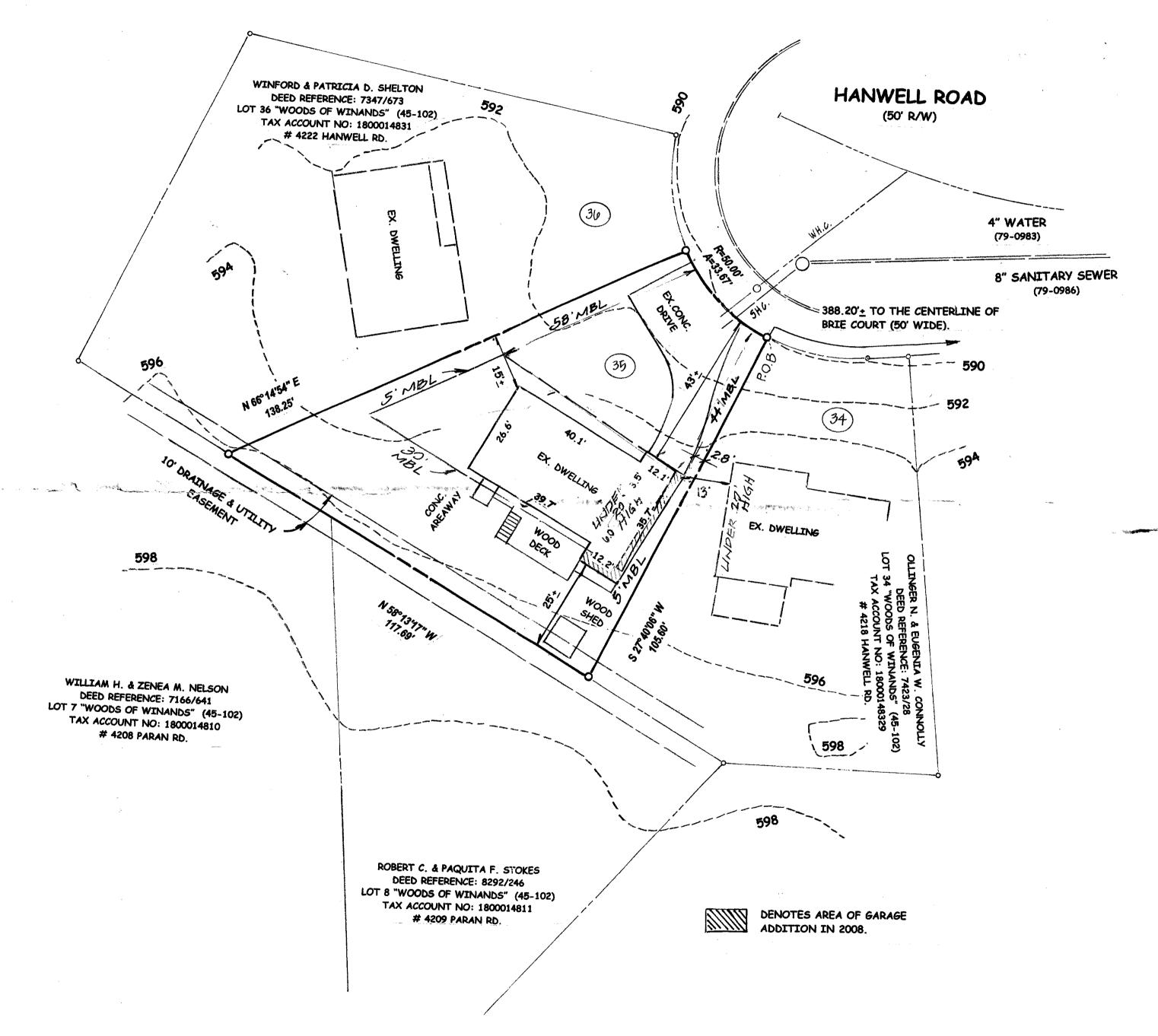
