FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter comes before the Zoning Commissioner for consideration of a Petition for Special Hearing filed by the owner of the subject property, WG Properties, LLC, by Mordehai Gur, managing member, through their attorney, Sebastian A. Cross, Esquire. The Petitioner requests Special Hearing relief as follows: (1) to allow business parking in a residential zone pursuant to the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) Section 409.8.B; (2) for an amendment to the previously approved Special Exception granted for a service garage in Case Nos. 05-552-X and 08-241-SPHX by amending the limits of the Special Exception area and amended building layout; (3) approval of a modified parking plan as per B.C.Z.R. Section 409.12.B, and (4) to permit accessory parking in adjoining O-3 zone. The subject property and requested relief are more particularly described on the three page colorized site plan submitted which was accepted into evidence and marked as Petitioner's Exhibit 3A-3C.

Appearing at the requisite public hearing in support of the requests were Mordehai Gur and Jay Weinberg on behalf of WG Properties, LLC, property owner, t/a Camden Body and Fender, Jared Barnhart and Mitch Kellman with Draft McCune Walker Inc., the zoning and land development consultants who prepared the site plan and other exhibits, and Sebastian A. Cross, Esquire, with Gildea & Schmidt, LLC, representing the Petitioner. Attending as

Protestants/interested community leaders were Mary Molinaro, past President of the Chartley Homeowners Association and current President of the Reisterstown-Owings Mills-Glyndon (ROG) Coordinating Council and George Harman, ROG's past President and that organization's current Zoning Committee Chairman. Also in attendance and participating in the proceedings was Rick Cobert, with the Baltimore County's Department of Economic Development.

Testimony and evidence offered revealed that the subject property is a rectangular-shaped assemblage of four (4) parcels (Tax Map 48 - Nos. 237, 238, 239 and 243) containing approximately 4.29 acres of land zoned primarily B.L. with a small strip of D.R.3.5 towards the rear of the property and R-O along the eastern boundary. As will be discussed below, a newly acquired unimproved lot (Parcel 238 - 1.457 acres) is zoned O-3 (Office Park)¹. The property is located along the northeast side of Reisterstown Road, between Walgrove Road and Chartley Drive and opposite from Berrymans Lane in Reisterstown. It is currently improved with an approximate 18,625 square foot structure that was approved by the undersigned Zoning Commissioner for use as an automobile service garage in Case Nos. 05-552-X. Petitioner submitted a copy of that Order as Petitioner's Exhibit 4A. Next, the Petitioner applied for and received approval to expand the service garage use with an approximate 3,136 square foot addition containing seven (7) new service bays. This proposal was approved in Case No. 08-241-SPHX by Deputy Zoning Commissioner Thomas H. Bostwick. A copy of his Order, dated March 12, 2008, was marked and accepted into evidence as Petitioner's Exhibit 4B. The current Petition is to modify this previous expansion with a currently proposed 12,457 square foot building containing 13 service bays, as illustrated on the site plan (Exhibit 3). Although the

special exception approval remains in place for this area of expansion, Petitioner believes the building dimensions and bays will be altered in such a manner as to warrant the requested hearing to amend the previous approval granted in Case No. 08-241-SPHX.

Additionally, Petitioner makes a request to allow business parking in a residential zone for the R-O portion of the property in the eastern corner of the site as well as to approve a modified parking plan for six (6) parking spaces which are 8 feet wide in lieu of the 8.5 feet. Similarly, approval is also sought for accessory parking on the northwestern portion of the O-3 property adjacent to Main Street. The building layout, as well as, the proposed parking plan are shown on the landscape plan (Exhibit 8A) and site plan (Exhibit 3).

The Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were received and are contained within the case file. Comments were received from the Office of Planning, dated January 4, 2010, and the Office does not oppose Petitioner's request. The recommendation is based on a review of the petition, landscape plan, architectural elevations and discussion with the community.

As referenced in the previous orders, this property generated significant public interest when it was first introduced through Case No. 05-552-X. This original request was approved and a Special Exception granted although representatives from the community expressed concerns over the operation. After this approval and upon operating onsite for approximately two (2) years, Petitioner received a second approval for expansion of the previous Special Exception through Case No. 08-241-SPHX. At this 2008 hearing, community opposition was no present and as noted in the decision there was no evidence the surrounding neighborhood was negatively affected by the operation onsite since 1997. The current case before me now seeks to modify previous orders by adding additional building and parking space areas.

Members of the community were present and expressed concerns mainly regarding the design treatments incorporated into the proposed front façade facing Reisterstown Road. As a result of these concerns, the undersigned held open the record of this case while negotiations were commenced between the Petitioner and the relevant community groups. As a result of these negotiations, a modified façade treatment has been agreed to by both Petitioner and members of the community. Submitted now as Petitioner's Exhibit 9 is the new design, which has been signed and sealed by Ford Greene a registered architect. Also, submitted and made a part of the record of this case is an agreement originally drafted after the 2005 decision outlining restrictions incorporated into the auto-body operation which was agreed to by Petitioner and presented as Exhibit 10.

Upon receipt of this agreement, letters received from the community withdrawing opposition, and the modified building elevations and in consideration of the testimony and evidence presented at the public hearing, the requests will be approved. As stated in the 2008 decision and reiterated here, the current existing use has operated without incident and this modification of the former approval as well as the proposed parking is proper for this site. The site plan is labeled to prevent placement of damaged or disabled vehicles in the O-3 and R-0 zoned portions of the site. I am convinced that the relief requested in the instant matter is proper and should be granted. The relief requested will not pose any danger nor create any adverse impacts normally inherit with a service garage. Furthermore, the expansion of parking will all eviate existing congestion and allow for car parking to be placed further away from Reisterstown Road allowing for substantial screening of the parking from all adjoining roads and the neighborhood. The proposed landscaping will further enhance this screening as demonstrated

on the landscaping plan submitted as Exhibit 3. Furthermore, granting this additional parking will increase circulation and capacity for cars.

Pursuant to the advertisement, posting of the property and public hearing on this Petition held, and for the reasons set forth herein, the relief requested shall be approved.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED by the Zoning Commissioner for Baltimore County this

day of March 2010 that the Petition for Special Hearing seeking relief as
follows: (1) to allow business parking in a residential zone pursuant to the Baltimore County
Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) Section 409.8.B; (2) for an amendment to the previously
approved Special Exception granted for a service garage in Case Nos. 05-552-X and 08-241SPHX by amending the limits of the Special Exception area and amended building layout; (3)
approval of a modified parking plan as per B.C.Z.R. Section 409.12.B, and (4) to permit
accessory parking in adjoining O-3 zone, in accordance with Petitioner's Exhibit 3A-3C, be and
is hereby GRANTED, subject to the following conditions:

- 1) The Petitioner may apply for any necessary permits in conjunction with the approval granted; however, Petitioner is hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at its own risk until the 30-day appeal period from the date of this Order has expired. If an appeal is filed and this Order is reversed, the relief granted herein shall be rescinded.
- The design elements submitted by Ford Greene marked as Exhibit 9 shall be incorporated into the design of the building.
- 3) The conditions outlined by Petitioner's agreement with the community marked as Exhibit 10 are incorporated by reference in this Order.
- 4) No repairs, including minor mechanical and body and fender work of any kind, shall be performed in the parking areas adjacent to Walgrove Road (R-O zone) or on Parcel 237 east of MD Rt. 140 (O-3 zone).
- 5) The property including compact dense evergreen screening shall be maintained in a neat and orderly condition at all times.

Any appeal of this decision shall be taken in accordance with the Baltimore County Code Section 32-3-401.

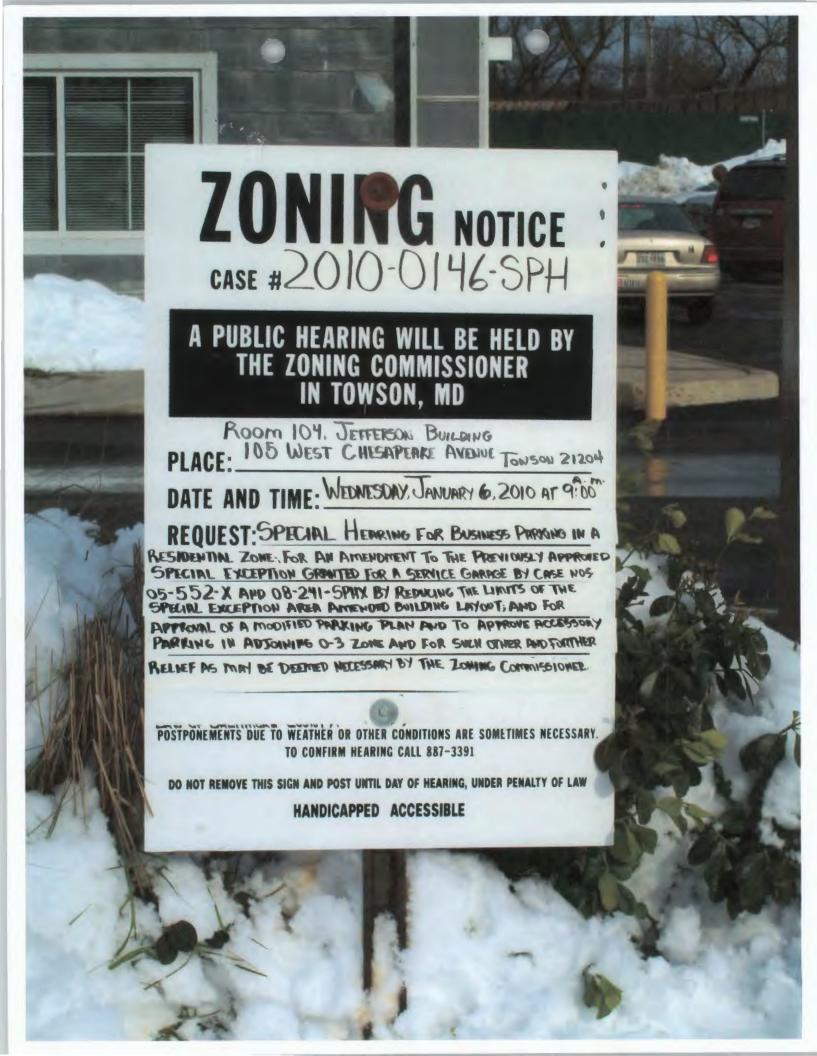

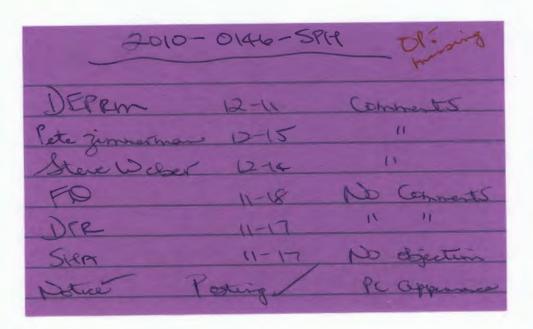

Please be advised that we had discussed this particular site plan with the engineer for the petitioner this past summer. From a traffic standpoint we have no objections to the plan. Because of access difficulties to the site from Main St, we actually find that providing the secondary access to Walgrove Rd would be beneficial. The property opposite the driveway is zoned RO.

While not a traffic comment, we did note the proximity of the parking lot to the R/W for Walgrove Rd but at the same time noted the unusually wide R/W for this street as well. There is about a 19-foot wide strip between the north edge of the sidewalk and the north R/W line. It is extremely doubtful that the County will ever make any use of this additional R/W. As such, we had recommended that the petitioner provide a nice wide landscaped buffer along the north side of Walgrove Rd within the County R/W to buffer his parking lot and commercial operations from view from drivers using Walgrove Rd. Given such a wide area in which to provide landscaping, we feel the commercial aspects of the site could really be visually hidden from those traveling on Walgrove Rd and going in and out of the adjacent community.

Please accept this letter as a Motion for Reconsideration, pursuant to Rule 4.K of the Zoning Commissioner's Rules of Practice and Procedure. On March 8, 2010 the order for Case No. 10-0146-SPH was issued regarding a Petition for Special Hearing. Of particular note to this motion was the granting of a modified parking plan to validate the parking layout as indicated on the submitted site plan. This relief was granted, however specific mention of the approval for the setback of the spaces adjoining Walgrove Road was not directly spelled out in the order.

On March 22, 2010, Aaron Tsui from Baltimore County Department of Permits and Development Management issued a comment that a Variance was necessary for this setback from Walgrove Avenue. This Motion for Reconsideration comes as a result of this comment and seeks to clarify the relief granted through the approval of a modified parking plan. Specifically, the setback of the spaces along Walgrove Road.

It should be noted the entire parking plan was presented and explained in detail at the hearing including direct evidence presented as to the subject setback. In particular, a comment was issued by Steven Weber, from the Bureau of Traffic Engineering, recommending approval of the petition while also discussing in detail the setback issue from Walgrove Road. As demonstrated in the comment submitted to the file, Mr. Weber makes reference to the right-of-way held by Baltimore County extending across Walgrove Road and approximately

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter comes before this Deputy Zoning Commissioner for consideration of Petitions for Special Hearing and Special Exception filed by Mordehai Gur, Member, on behalf of the legal owner of the subject property, Petitioner WG Properties, LLC. The Special Hearing was filed pursuant to Section 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) to approve an amendment to previously approved relief granted in Case No. 05-552-X for expansion of a service garage. The Special Exception is to allow a service garage, if necessary, pursuant to Section 230.13 of the B.C.Z.R. The subject property and requested relief are more fully described on the site plan which was marked and accepted into evdience as Petitioner's Exhibit 1.

Appearing at the requisite public hearing in support of the Special Hearing and Special Exception requests were Petitioner Mordehai Gur on behalf of WG Properties, LLC, and Sebastian A. Cross, attorney for the Petitioner. There were no Protestants or other interested persons present at the hearing.

Testimony and evidence offered revealed that the subject property is a rectangular-shaped property containing approximately 2.06 acres of land zoned primarily B.L. with a small strip of D.R.3.5 towards the rear of the property. The property is located along the east side of



Turning first to the Special Hearing request, I am persuaded by the testimony and evidence presented that the requested relief should be granted. While case number 05-552-X generated substantial public interest, there were no Protestants or other interested persons at the hearing in this case. Petitioners have been operating a service garage for over two years on the subject property, and there has been no evidence that the surrounding locale was negatively affected in any way. In fact, during the previous hearing in 2005, Protestants asserted a number of concerns, mostly revolving around safety issues, as well as concerns about broken-down cars stored on the property, dumpsters with automobile parts overflowing, traffic circulation problems, and concerns over the use of hazardous chemicals with potential runoff into the environment. However, as shown by the activities of the last two years and the lack of opposition at the hearing, those concerns have proven to be unfounded. In short, the relief requested in this case mirrors the relief requested and granted in 2005, and I am convinced that the relief requested in the instant matter should be granted. Further, it should be noted that the reason Petitioners waited two years from the prior hearing to request an amendment is that the abandoned restaurant had been leased by another tenant until recently. Otherwise, I believe the service garage could have been extended in the requested manner in the prior hearing without having any effect on the previous outcome.

Turning now to the petition for Special Exception, I am convinced that the request meets all of the customary special exception criteria contained in Section 502.1 of the B.C.Z.R. The larger existing structure on the property is already being used as a service garage, and I am persuaded that expanding the garage towards the area of the abandoned restaurant will not have any negative effect on the surrounding locale. Again, I believe that this relief could have been granted in the prior case if that portion of the property had not been leased by another tenant.

- b) The hours of operation shall be limited to Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and Saturdays, 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.
- c) A Landscape Plan and Lighting Plan, with lighting directed away from residential property, must receive approval from the Office of Planning prior to the issuance of any building permits.
- d) When applying for any permits, the site plan filed must reference this case and set forth and address the restrictions of this Order.

Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter comes before the Zoning Commissioner for consideration of a Petition for Special Exception filed by the owner of the property, Meisel Capital Properties 607, LLC, and W.G. Properties, LLC, Contract Purchaser through their attorney, Sebastian A. Cross. The Petitioner requested a Special Exception to permit a service garage on the subject site, pursuant to Section 230.13 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R."). The subject property and requested relief are more particularly described on the site plan which was accepted into evidence and marked as Petitioner's Exhibit No. 4.

Appearing at the requisite public hearing in support of the request on behalf of W. G. Properties, LLC were Mordehai Gur and Jay Weinberg, managing members and owners/operators of Camden Body and Fender, and their attorney, Sebastian A. Cross. Testimony was also offered in support of the Petition from expert witnesses. These included Mitchell Kellman, a planner/zoning consultant with Daft-McCune-Walker, and Gregory H. Reed, the Professional Engineer who prepared the site plan for this property. Additionally, a letter supporting Petitioners development of this property was received from the Reisterstown, Owings Mills and Glyndon Chamber of Commerce and accepted as Petitioners Exhibit No. 8.

as Petitioners Exhibit No. 7. These elevations revealed a brick and metal facade along the sides of the building and a brick facade with several decorative windows facing Reisterstown Road, as well as the rear of the property. The Petitioner stated these elevations were commissioned and employed into the design with the intent of keeping the proposed development within the character of the Reisterstown Road corridor.

This site exists along the commercial corridor of Reisterstown Road, primarily surrounded by other business and office zoning classifications incorporating retail and service operations. Behind this strip of commercial uses along the east side of Reisterstown Road exists residential property primarily zoned D.R.3.5.. This portion of the Reisterstown Road corridor contains several other automobile service establishments encompassing the types of uses generally permitted with the operation of a service garage.

Mr. Gur is the owner/operator of Camden Body and Fender Company which currently runs an operation in Baltimore City. This operation is part of a family business dating back 80 years with the first establishment existing on what currently is Camden Yards in Baltimore City. This body shop moved several times through the years and currently operates at 4113 Amos Avenue in Baltimore. He explained the family history of owning and operating this body shop, as well as testifying as to the amicable relationship they have shared with their surrounding neighbors. Evidence of this positive relationship is contained in 13 letters received from current Amos Avenue property owners and introduced as Petitioners Exhibit No. 1. These neighbors describe Camden Body & Fender as a good neighbor and offer support of the new proposed operation along Reisterstown Road.

Mr. Gur stated the proposed body and fender shop would operate Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and Saturday from 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. At his current operation

county and state agencies. Furthermore, all solvents and paints are stored inside the building in 55 gallon drums and located on container pallets in the event of a leak. Mr. Gur testified that the new modernized equipment is quiet and no longer produces air compressor noise. Also the air driven ratchets have been modernized and silenced. New technology coupled with modern automobile manufacturers trend to build light, thin-framed cars which no longer require the noisy processes, associated with body shops in the past. Most repair work is now spent removing replaceable damaged parts (panel units) without the need to pound and straighten.

Mr. Weinberg then testified as to the environmental licensing and monitoring needed to take place both for the paint booths, as well as other refuse from the body shop. He stated many of the unusable parts were to be disposed of in the dumpsters located towards the rear of the property and this dumpster would be hauled away approximately once per week. An additional dumpster for refuse traditionally encountered with any type of commercial operation would also be on-site and would be emptied from the site on a regular basis.

Mitchell Kellman accepted as an expert in the field of planning and zoning, then testified for the Petitioner stating the proposed building and outlying parking area met all applicable bulk regulations of Baltimore County. He pointed out this site had more buffer, both to the west of the building adjoining an O-3 zone, and towards the rear of the building adjoining residences in a D.R.3.5 zone than the county currently required. Mr. Kellman stated there is a required 20 ft. rear yard setback for the building under B.C.Z.R. and the proposed building contained 66 ft. of setback. Additionally, the fenced-in storage area contained a landscape buffering area of 12 ft. in conjunction with a 15 ft. vegetated, existing drainage and utility easement for a total of 27 ft. of screening adjoining the residential zone towards the rear of the property. Mr. Kellman also testified as to the mitigation of impacts incorporated with this development stating noise would

Mr. Kellman testified this type of operation within a B.L. zone was indeed very similar to not only the Reisterstown Road neighborhood but also to Baltimore County, in general, as many commercial corridors are made up of commercially zoned property immediately adjacent to roadways with residential zoning existing behind commercial strips, away from the road. He testified the impacts from this use would be less than normally encountered with similar service garages due to the modernized regulations, the buffering incorporated into the site, the loading bays facing away from the residential property and the characteristics of modern body shops.

PROTESTANTS ISSUES

Regarding the proposal and the development outlined by the Petitioner's consultants, most of the issues raised by the attending community members revolved around safety issues (traffic problems) and the idea that there was not need for another service garage in the area and that such a proposed use was not compatible with the revitalization of Reisterstown's main street. See Protestants Exhibits No. 1 thru 5 submitted and received into evidence.

George Vince of the Chartley Community Association cross-examined the Petitioner's witnesses focusing on the impacts this type of use would have on the neighboring community. Mr. Vince expressed concern about the storage of broken-down cars towards the rear of the property immediately adjoining the residential neighborhood, as well as dumpsters with automobile parts being located in this same area. He pointed to circulation problems that would be created when moving additional wrecked and inoperable vehicles into this area while contemporaneously trying to empty the dumpsters. He asked Mr. Gur whether these inoperable vehicles would leak noxious fluids in close proximity to the neighborhood. Mr. Vince also took issue with the proposed Landscape Plan (Petitioners Exhibit 5) and highlighted concern over the potential for Camden Body and Fender to eliminate the foliage currently existing on the 15 ft.

conducting this landscape plan, all vegetation was not slated to be cleared but, rather, a tree study would be made in order to save as many trees as possible while removing dead and undesirable trees. In concluding, he pointed out that none of the County agencies that undertook a review of the proposal, including the architectural elevations and landscape plan, submitted a negative Zoning Advisory Comment (ZAC). Additional comments were then taken from the community, which are summarized as a belief that this use was not proper for this area of Reisterstown and a desire to see other types of businesses at this location that could service the community regardless of the ZAC comments.

APPLICAB.L.E LAW

Governmental regulation of land use is largely a local function. In Baltimore County, zoning requirements are set out in the B.C.Z.R. The Baltimore County Council adopts zoning maps for Baltimore County every four years, pursuant to the Comprehensive Zoning Map Process, and under those Maps, every property in Baltimore County is assigned one of the nearly 40 zoning classifications listed in the B.C.Z.R. These classifications range from RC (Resource Conservation zones) to MH (Manufacture Heavy) zones. Each zone contains its own specific regulations governing use of a property so zoned. For example, the restrictive RC zones promote agricultural and low density residential use. At the other end of the spectrum, the MH (Manufacturing Heavy) zone encourages manufacturing and heavy industrial use. As noted above, the subject property is B.L., which means "Business, Local." Of the three business zones in Baltimore County, the B.L. permits the least intensive uses.

In all zones, the B.C.Z.R. lists uses that are permitted as-of-right and uses that are prohibited altogether. As a middle ground, the B.C.Z.R. also identifies special exception uses. The term "special exception" is a misnomer, as the uses listed thereafter are neither special nor

case, the Court noted that a special exception use is part of the comprehensive zoning plan and thus, shares the legal presumption that it is in the interest of the general welfare and therefore valid. The Court noted that a special exception use is a valid zoning mechanism that delegates to an administrative board or body a limited authority to allow certain enumerated uses, which the legislature (in this case, the Baltimore County Council) has determined to be permissible, absent any facts or circumstances, which negate that presumption.

The Court further noted the applicant for a proposed special exception use does not have the burden of establishing affirmatively that the proposal would be of benefit to the community. The test is not whether another use is more preferable or whether the property could be used for a higher or better purpose, rather the test to be considered by the local administrative body is whether the neighboring properties in the general neighborhood would be adversely affected and whether the use in the particular case is in harmony with the general purpose and intent of the underlying zoning scheme.

The Court of Appeals of Maryland further explained the special exception test in Mossberg vs., Montgomery Co., 29 Md. 494, 620 A.2d 886 (1993). In that case, an applicant sought approval for a solid waste transfer station in Montgomery County. That use was a conditional/special exception use under the Montgomery County Ordinance. In its written opinion, the Court noted there were certain inherent negative effects associated with any solid waste transfer station. For example, such a station would be expected to produce traffic, noise, dust, etc. Moreover, it could be presumed that such impacts would negatively affect surrounding properties. However, although such presumptions are valid, the Court emphasized the existence of these impacts did not provide a sufficient basis for the local administrative body to deny the Petition for Special Exception. Instead, the Court reasoned the local body must show those

Although some of these negative impacts may result from the proposed use upon this parcel, I am not convinced these negative effects would be above and beyond any of the other service garages in the area or services garages county wide located in a B.L. zone. In particular, substantial testimony was presented by Petitioner's experts that this service garage had mitigated potential adverse impacts through greater buffering and screening, compliance with heightened County review of storm water management, landscaping and environmental controls previously not required for older service garages. Also the Petitioners testified as to the modernized equipment and filtration systems that would be employed onsite. This equipment and these systems are monitored by County and State agencies, which formally had less stringent requirements for service garages. Testimony was received as to the planning involved in developing this site with the overall goal of providing a compatible but modern architecturally attractive building. The evidence presented relating to mitigating adverse factors for this development was substantial and convincing. Although the opposition in this case did raise concerns as to adverse impacts on the surrounding community, no evidence was presented proving these impacts would be greater then those generally encountered by service garages in the B.L. zone.

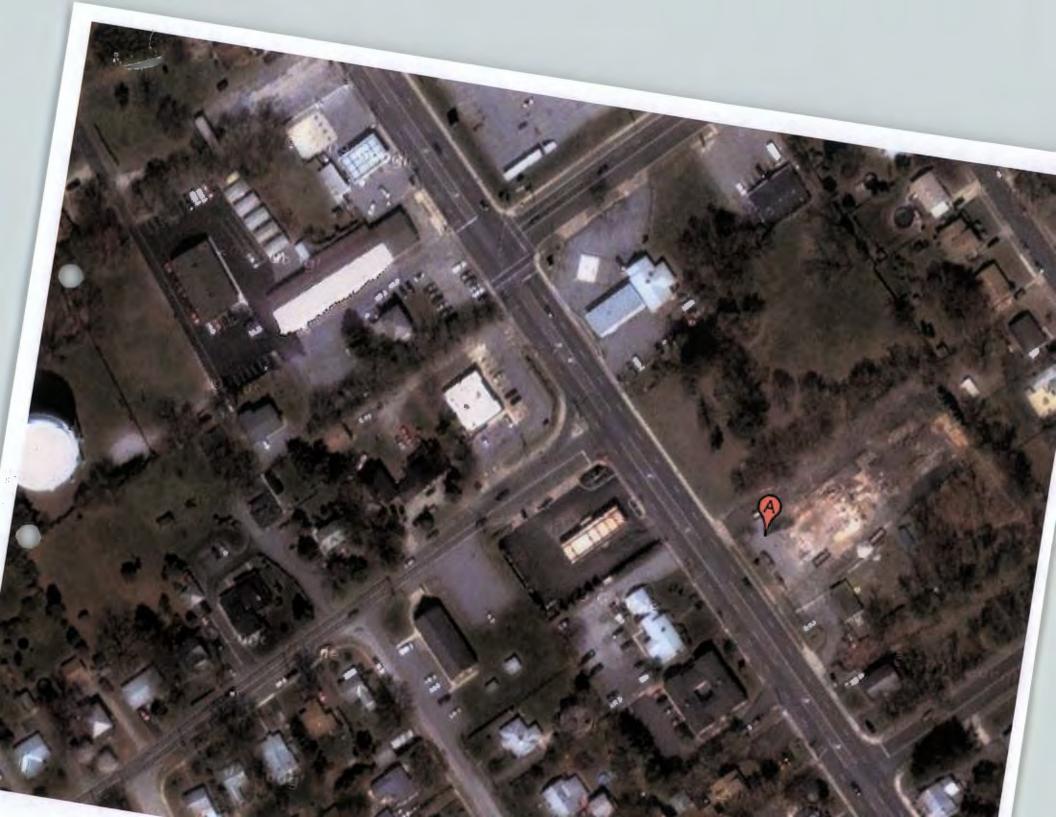
Similarly, much of the opposition stated their belief that too many of these automobile service uses existed in this neighborhood of Reisterstown and, as such, this use would not greatly benefit the community. This position, however, is in conflict with the Chamber of Commerce that supports the project and states that "it is in keeping with the commercial nature of Main Street... and, in fact, will improve upon the Canopy property in its current condition". Although these are genuine community concerns, as previously stated, the B.L. zoning allows for service garages as a special exception and these special exception uses have been deemed to be in the

This letter serves to memorialize the negotiations and agreement entered into by affected neighbors of Chartley Homeowner's Association and the proposed developers of Camden Auto Body. The following issues and action were discussed and agreed to by all parties as follows:

- Efforts will be made to maintain the current cedar tree screening towards
 the rear of Camden Auto Body's site also adjoining the rear yards of
 neighbors in the Chartley community. A tree study will be performed
 by Daft-McCune-Walker in order to remove only those trees to the rear
 of both properties that are determined to be dead, dying or
 unsalvageable.
- 2. In lieu of the 6 ft. board-on-board fence surrounding the auto storage and dumpster area, Camden Auto Body will erect a 10 ft. high wood board-on-board fence in order to further screen this area from adjoining neighbors.
- 3. The dumpster would be exchanged only during normal business hours, which currently are 8:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.
- The office will also be open 8:00 a.m. until 12:00 Noon on Saturday for drop off and pick up of cars, and administrative work. Dumpsters will not be exchanged during this time.

PETITIONER'S

- 5. There will be no car pick-up after the above referenced business hours.
- 6. All efforts will be made to prohibit car drop-off during off-business hours; however, there are circumstances beyond Camden Auto Body's control whereby tow trucks, on their own initiative, may drop off cars. Again, this independent action of towing companies will be discouraged.
- 7. Lighting will be shielded and directed away from any neighboring property.

Dear Commissioner,

At our January 4, 2010 meeting we voted unanimously to oppose the requested expansion of Camden Body. We feel that the owners did not honor their original commitment to design their building to blend with the other buildings in the area. Please refer to exhibit A which is an article written by Sebastian Cross, attorney for the owners Mota Gur and Jay Weinberg. This article was published in the Chartley Chatter, Spring 2006 prior to construction. I have highlighted the 2nd paragraph which started "Keeping a historical look was important to Camden Body and Fender..." In the 2nd column halfway through the first paragraph he wrote, "The façade will incorporate a brick and metal design..." The current building did not satisfy either of these comments and does not blend with neighborhood at all. They also suggested there will be a 2nd small building added to the right of the first building much smaller than the first. Now they are requesting a building that is actually 5 feet wider than the first. This is becoming an industrial complex fronting a residential neighborhood.

Camden Body is requesting a business parking lot in a residential zone with access to/from Walgrove Road which will increase traffic into the Chartley Community. Due to the difficulty entering Reisterstown Road from Walgrove Road, the cars are likely to exit, going left on Walgrove Road and cutting across Piper Road to Chartley Road so they can enter Reisterstown Road at a light bringing an increased traffic flow through the neighborhood. We feel it is a bad precedent to allow a commercial enterprise to push into a residential area and respectfully ask that you deny them the request.

While the first building was originally said to be 75' by 195' and measure less than 40' in height, the neighbors stated that from their back yards which slopes away from Reisterstown Road they are able to look over the 15' retaining wall topped by a 10' board on board fence and still see the top of the building. The plans are to extend the retaining wall and fence from it's current ending point to Walgrove Road essentially creating a huge wall for most of the block from Walgrove Road to Chartley Drive. Also, because of the slope down, which can be seen from their design of a two level building, they will most likely see the entire 2nd building.

We discussed the noise and lights affecting the neighbors who live so close to the property. While they say that the only noise that bothers them is the emptying of the dumpsters which occurs on Tuesday morning at 7am, there essentially isn't noise heard through the wall structure. Exhibit B is a document between George Vintz representing Chartley Homeowners Association and Sebastian Cross memorializing the negotiations and agreement entered into by affected neighbors. You will notice in item 3 that the dumpsters were not supposed to be emptied earlier than 8am.

The neighbors whose property abuts this wall actually said at the January 4th meeting that they like the lights illuminating their backyard which surprised me. However, they explained that it lets them now see the juveniles who loiter behind the wall and or walk across the top of the wall so the homeowners can call the police. One of the homeowners home was burglarized. The fact that they have now come to accept the situation of people hanging out drinking, doing drugs, and/ or generally causing problems is a concern for safety in the neighborhood.

Expanding their enterprise will only continue to impinge on the neighborhood and we have a concern for a "slippery slope" situation. The owners have also purchased the property north of the first building to the gas station on the corner. They are currently asking for another parking lot on that section since they are currently parking on the grass. Again, it is just the beginning of more extension of their business. They will most likely be back in another 2 to 3 years to discuss an additional building essentially having this industrial complex cover the entire block.

With the approval for WAWA from the zoning department and their construction in the n_{ext} ;2-5 years, the neighbors are actually expecting some of the older gas stations on the corner to close and the Camden Body owners could easily take over the entire block. This large enterprise is truly counter to desires of the neighborhood and inappropriate as an entrance to historic Reisterstown.

We respectfully request you deny the request to increase the size of their 2nd building and extend their parking lot into the residential area.

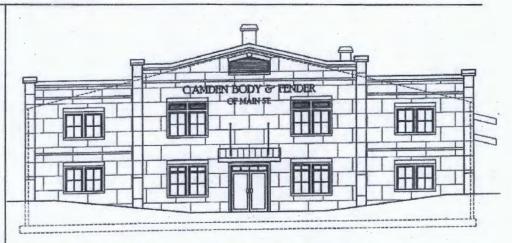

Future Site of Camden Body Shop at Main Street and Walgrove Road

There has been some controversy in Chartley since the announcement of Camden Body Shop moving into the space vacated by the Canopy Restaurant at Main Street and Walgrove Road. Some residents have been worried about the visual impact of an automotive body shop near our neighborhood and others have worried about the impact of potential light, noise, or air pollution. The following article was written by Sebastian Cross, legal counsel to Camden Body Shop in an attempt to reassure the community that the business will be very compatible with our neighborhood.

Camden Body Shop

There is a new business coming to the Reisterstown Road corridor in the automotive service business of Camden Body & Fender. But this isn't you father's auto body shop. That is because partners Mota Gur and Jay Weinberg have incorporated state of the art technology and hired Greene Architecture to develop the building producing a truly cutting edge development while incorporating the look of historic Reisterstown.

Keeping a historical look was important to Camden Body and Fender as this is a family business originally founded by David Weinberg in the 1920's. Camden Auto Body took its name from the location of the first shop which was located at Camden and Howard Streets in Baltimore City on the home of Oriole Park today. Jay and Mota moved the business to its current location in Baltimore City off Amos avenue in the 1960's. The Reisterstown location will mark their first expansion to operating two independent shops.

The proposed shop will be located at 607 Main Street on the site of the former Canopy Restaurant. This abandoned building will be torn down and replaced with an approximate 18,625 square foot facility. The building will be primarily a one story structure with a second story mezzanine and will measure less that 40 feet in height. The length and width of the structure will be approximately 75 feet by 195 feet. The façade will incorporate a brick and metal design and include many decorative windows facing Reisterstown Road. The building will incorporate an office closest to Reisterstown Road, service bays with access from the east portion of the property and two paint booths.

Initially the project received negative feedback from the immediate community out of concerns of possible noise and fumes emanating from the site. However, both Gur and Weinberg addressed these concerns at the required zoning hearing and followed up with the adjoining neighbors again after receiving county approval.

"This operation isn't like it used to be years ago", said Gur, "back then you had guys banging out dents and trying to bend and straighten pieces. Today the cars are so much more lightweight and body parts are easy to unscrew and replace, and not with the air pressured guns you find at tire shops. The noise from these shops will not be heard off the property."

Likewise advances made in painting technology now have produced totally enclosed paint booths inside the facility itself with its own air filtration system and disposal tanks which are monitored by local agencies and the EPA.

"When we first proposed this development, I think people had a misconception of how a modern body shop operates. I think that by inviting neighbors to come out and see our operation and explaining the business helped allay some of the community's fears." said Gur. "we have always been very cognizant of the community, and I think we demonstrated that by submitting a dozen or so letters of support from our current neighboring businesses and residents at our Amos Avenue location to the zoning commissioner."

Indeed, Camden went further than that as they meet with an adjoining neighbor after having received approvals in order to address any concerns they had. The result was an agreement between the neighbors and Camden to lessen any impact their new operation may have on the community. This agreement included limiting hours of operation, providing tree and landscaping screening along the resident's property and shielding the lighting to be contained onsite.

Gur went on, "we don't just want to open a shop in a community, we want to be part of that community."

Camden Body and Fender will employ approximately 20 full time employees and hopes to break ground by June 2006 and be opened for business by Feb-March 2007. In the meantime both Mota Gur and Jay Weinberg can be reached at their current location 4113 Amos Ave, Baltimore 21215.

In Re: Letter in opposition to Camden Body and Fender's proposed new building exterior:

Camden Body and Fender is located at 607 Main Street in Reisterstown, just a few yards before you get to the heart of the actual Historic District, although the blocks south of that are considered the Historic District, also. Travelers pass this building when entering Reisterstown. I mention this to set the picture for the person who is unaware of the layout of the town. This location was a done deal before any citizen in town was aware of the owner's intent.

As a result of the community learning of the owners' plans to build, they met with us in an attempt to mollify the fact that an auto body workshop was going up so close to town. If this establishment were on the outskirts of town nearer 795 or 140 heading to Westminster, there would be no problem with the building or the building's design.

They made certain promises to the community at ROG meetings and the Chartley Community Association meetings. One important promise made to the citizens was to have an historic look to the building's exterior, which they agreed to do. (see article, "Future Site of Camden Body Shop..."). This was not done, as the exterior of the building is not brick at all but a tin or metal coating that causes the building to look like a huge box.

Camden now wants to build a second building directly next to the existing one, this new one fronting 80 feet on Main Street with the same exterior tin-like décor. (see artist's rendering) Again, this is the problem, the exterior finish. It is not historic and does not blend in with the Historic District. One only has to look two blocks further south to see the new Wachovia Bank building in the shopping center to see how easy it is to look historic.

We would like to see them apply a real brick façade more in keeping with the historic nature of the town. I don't know if Zoning can do anything to help us with this, but I simply wanted my voice to be heard.

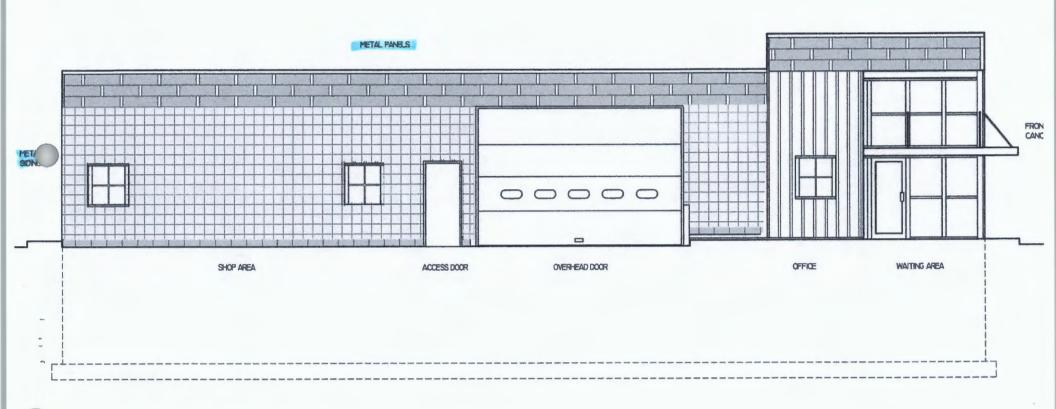

Mary,

Just wanted to give you an update on the Camden Auto Body case. Myself and two of my co-workers Lynn Lanham, Chief of Development Review and Shahid Rana, Community Design Team met with Sebastian Cross from Gildea & Schmidt and Jared Barnhart from DMW to discuss the new proposed building and parking.

In 2007 they had gotten approval for the building and some additional parking, but they are coming back this time to amend that site plan in order to change the position of the building on the lot as well as add more parking, with some being on the adjacent residential lot that the owner purchased recently. We spoke with them about the architecture and need for fences and landscaping to buffer the adjacent residential neighbors from the impending use and I believe that we have come up with an agreeable solution. The new building will be modern looking to match the current one and it will have the same facade treatment. It would not make sense from a planning standpoint to have them make the new building look historic when there is a modern one with the same use right next to it. We are awaiting new architectural drawings and a landscape plan from both the architect and engineer before issuing our final comments.
