ORDER AND OPINION

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings for consideration of a Petition for Variance filed by the legal owner of the subject property, New Plan Maryland Holdings, LLC. Petitioner is requesting Variance relief from Section 409.6 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R.") to permit 933 parking spaces in lieu of the required 1,102 parking spaces. The subject property and requested relief are more fully described on the site plan that was marked and accepted into evidence as Petitioner's Exhibit 1.

Appearing at the public hearing in support of the variance request were Bill Greimel, Vice President of Construction for Centro Properties Group Mid-Atlantic Regional Office for New Plan Maryland Holdings, LLC, Brian Conlon, P.E. with Langan Engineering & Environmental Services, the professional engineer who prepared the site plan, and Glenn Cook, Vice President with the Traffic Group, Inc. Patricia A. Malone, Esquire, with Venable, LLP, attended the hearing as attorney for the Petitioner. Also attending in support of the request was Peirce Macgill with the Baltimore County Office of Economic Development. There were no Protestants or other interested persons in attendance, and the file does not contain any letters of opposition or protest.

Testimony and evidence offered revealed that the property is irregularly shaped, contains 25.88 acres, and is zoned B.M.-C.C.C. The Petitioner testified, via proffer, that it had finalized a lease with Wal-Mart, and was going to open a 160,000 square feet supercenter on the premises.

The Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were received and are made part of the record of this case. There were no adverse comments received from any of the County reviewing agencies. The Office of Planning in a memorandum dated March 17, 2011, supports the requested relief. That Office opined that the parking, pedestrian and vehicular circulation have been designed to integrate with the Liberty Plaza Shopping Center and function efficiently. It noted Wal-Mart is a long awaited addition to the Randallstown business district, and will help continue the revitalization of the Liberty Road corridor. The Office of Planning requested that no truck traffic should be allowed to access the site off of Church Lane, and Counsel for Petitioner indicated her client was amenable to that condition. Peirce Macgill, for the County's Office of Economic Development, advised that Baltimore County was strongly supportive of the variance request.

Based upon the testimony and evidence presented, I am persuaded to grant the request for variance relief. I find special circumstances or conditions exist that are peculiar to the land or structure which is the subject of the variance request. I also find that strict compliance with the B.C.Z.R. would result in practical difficulty or unreasonable hardship upon Petitioner.

Under Cromwell and its progeny, to obtain variance relief requires a showing that:

(1) The property is unique; and

(2) If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or hardship.

Trinity Assembly of God v. People's Counsel, 407 Md 53, 80 (2008).

The Petitioner has met this test.

As for the first factor, the property is irregularly shaped and is bounded on all three sides by public roads. Its frontage on Liberty Road is also unusual, in that – as seen on Exhibit 1 – there are several carve out areas not owned by Petitioner that create a "jagged" property line on that side. In addition, as proffered by Petitioner's engineer, Brian Conlon, the property has steep

slopes and forest along its rear side. There are wetlands on the east side of the property, and the site will also comply with Maryland's new stormwater management regulations. The vast parking lot will be punctuated with bioretention devices that will improve water quality, but also will reduce the number of available parking spaces. Finally, the property is located in a County revitalization district (see Petitioner's Exhibit 2) and its redevelopment in the manner proposed also renders the site unique.

Turning to the second issue, the Petitioner would clearly experience a "practical difficulty" if variance relief was denied. Either the project would not receive County approval, or the developer would be obliged to enlarge the current parking area to create the 169 spaces. Neither option is palatable. Moreover, Petitioner's expert, Glenn Cook from the Traffic Group (his curriculum vitae was admitted as Exhibit 5) opined that the County parking regulations in the B.C.Z.R. overstated in this instance the number of parking spaces needed, since the proposed Wal-Mart will be served by a transit bus line, the schedule for which indicates a bus will stop at the site every 30 minutes or so, allowing customers and employees the option of public transportation instead of driving a car to the store.

Finally, Mr. Cook presented a study he conducted in connection with the expansion of the White Marsh Wal-Mart, which findings he advised were equally applicable to the proposed site, wherein his firm opined that a ratio 3.0 spaces per 1,000 square feet of gross floor area would be acceptable, even in peak holiday season. See Petitioner's Exhibit 6. Under the B.C.Z.R., parking must be provided at a ratio of 5.0 spaces per 1,000 square feet, which in Mr. Cook's opinion is excessive. As shown on the site plan, ("Zoning Summary," Exhibit 1) Petitioner proposes a ratio of 4.24 spaces in lieu of the required 5.0, and this is a comfortable margin above the ratio in the Traffic Group study discussed above.

Finally, I find that the variance can be granted in harmony with the spirit and intent of the B.C.Z.R., and in such manner as to grant relief without injury to the public health, safety, and general welfare. The proposal will provide a much-needed improvement to a moribund shopping center, and the grant of variance relief will eliminate the need for installing additional impervious surfaces, thereby yielding environmental benefits as well.

One final note is in order, concerning a cultural phenomenon that speaks to the abundance of parking provided nationwide at Wal-Mart stores. Specifically, and although no one at the hearing was aware of the fact, Wal-Mart invites (and even encourages) overnight parking on its lots for truck drivers and travelers. The practice has received such widespread acceptance and interest that there is an iPhone "app" available, known as the "Walmart Overnight Parking Locator" (by Allstays LLC), which "plots every Walmart store in the USA and Canada." http://itunes/apple.com/us/app/walmart-overnight-parking.

Pursuant to the advertisement, posting of the property, and public hearing on this petition held, and after considering the testimony and evidence offered, I find that Petitioner's variance request should be granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED this 28 day of March, 2011, by this Administrative Law Judge that Petitioner's Variance from Section 409.6 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R.") to permit 933 parking spaces in lieu of the required 1,102 parking spaces, be and is hereby GRANTED, subject to the following:

 Petitioner may apply for permits and be granted same upon receipt of this Order; however, Petitioner is hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at its own risk until such time as the 30-day appellate process from this Order has expired. If, for whatever reason, this Order is reversed, Petitioner would be required to return, and be responsible for returning, said property to its original condition.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter comes before this Deputy Zoning Commissioner as a Petition for Special Hearing filed by the legal owner of the subject property, New Plan Excel Realty Trust, Inc. and the lessee of the site, Poo-Poo Ltd., t/a Pimlico Check Cashing. The special hearing request involves property located at 8700 Liberty Road, which property is zoned BM-CCC. The Walmart Store (#2045-07) in White Marsh will be expanding by 16,706 square feet. The new Walmart will have a total of 152,790 square feet. The proposed site plan shows a parking ratio of 4.73 spaces per 1,000 square feet of gross floor area (722 Total Spaces) and is not in compliance with the County Requirement of 764 total spaces.

Therefore, a Parking Rate Modification is requested to reduce the amount of required spaces for Walmart.

The Traffic Group conducted a parking analysis for three local area Walmarts. There were two Supercenters (Frederick and Aberdeen) and a regular store in Ellicott City. These parking studies were conducted during the Friday Evening and Saturday Midday peak hours. The results can be found on Exhibit 1 and the data worksheets can be found in Appendix A. As shown on Exhibit 1, the typical parking peaks occur on Saturdays and the highest parking rate per 1,000 square feet was found at the Frederick Supercenter at a rate of 2.82 which is far below the Baltimore County Requirement of 5.0 per 1000 square feet.

We do understand that during the peak shopping seasons of Thanksgiving and Christmas there will be an increase in parking, however it is our opinion that parking demand will still be near or under capacity based on the "Evaluating Parking Deman and City Minimum Parking Requirements in College Station, Texas" which can be found in Appendix B. Based on this document, it was concluded that a 3.0 space per 1,000 square feet of gross floor area parking ratio would be acceptable even for the holiday peak season.
