Dear Sir:

We are requesting a minor change to the site plan that was approved for a Special Exception on January 11, 2012. A redline version of that plan is attached. Due to unforeseen circumstances, we are unable to build the two pole barn structures (noted as Phase II on the drawing) at this time. So that we may move our personal horses onto the property, we are requesting the addition of a 24' x 25' modular barn, with bump-out for a utility room/bathroom, to our plan. Also, after consulting with Kevin Koepenick at DEPS, we now know that we will be using Septic Site A, and must move the caretaker's trailer to a higher elevation. This revision has a positive outcome by allowing us to move the outdoor riding arena to a more desirable location that is farther away from our neighbor, Thel Moore.

In November 2011, a lien was placed on our property by the former attorney of Jim Jett — the one who represented him against the County in the Stump Dump trial. The lien is being handled by our title insurance company, but has prevented us from obtaining a loan to build. We unknowingly purchased this infamous property two-and-a-half years ago and have been struggling with the consequences ever since. Any assistance you can provide us in expediting this request would be most appreciated.

OPINION

This case comes before the Baltimore County Board of Appeals as an appeal of the Petitioners, Debbie Sharp and Joseph Campayno's request for Special Hearing and Special Exception that was granted on May 16, 2011 by Administrative Law Judge, Lawrence M. Stahl. The Special Hearing was filed pursuant to Section 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R.") to confirm an existing non-conforming unpaved access roadway of variable width pursuant to B.C.Z.R. Section 104.1 and to approve a modified parking plan for a riding stable without a durable and dustless surface and without striped parking places in lieu of the required durable and dustless surface and stripped spaces pursuant to B.C.Z.R. Section 409.8.2. Petitioner also filed a Petition for Special Exception request to approve a riding stable.

Appearing before the Board in support of this Petition was Debbie Sharp and Joseph Campayno, as well as their attorney Jason Vettori. Also appearing was the Appellant, Thel Moore of 8721 Dogwood Road.

The Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were received and are part of the case file. Comments were received from the Office of Planning dated April 8, 2011. The Office of Planning recommends denial of the proposed Special Hearing to confirm an existing non-

conforming unpaved access roadway of variable width. They also recommend denial of a modified parking plan for the riding stable without a durable and dustless surface and striped spaces. However, the Office has no opposition to Petitioners request for special exception itself to operate a riding stable, presuming their desires as to road surfaces are accepted. Comments were also received from the Bureau of Development Plans Review dated April 8, 2011. They are opposed to the surface structure of the road and driveways and have other concerns in conjunction with issues related to the issuance of building permits or requests for subdivision approval. The Agricultural Preservation Section of the Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability supports the proposal an appropriate agricultural use in an RC 2 zone, but likewise have a concern regarding the road and any future subdivision of the site.

Petitioner Debbie Sharp testified on behalf of the proposed relief. She provided a brief history of the property, including a description of the infamous "stump dump" that once occupied the property. Her position is that she believes few of concerns of the applicable County agencies regarding the "dump" are relevant to their requested use, which she maintains will have little impact on the property. She described the general area of the site as primarily agricultural, with some houses, a cemetery, forests and nearby Patapsco Park.

She reviewed her background as it relates to horse and rider training and her plan for the proposed project. She has been a riding instructor for ten years and hopes to have this project pay for itself and be a true "non-profit". She explained that the requested use was not going to be a traditional riding stable with horses rented for hire or for the boarding of other horses. The only horses used would be those owned by the Petitioners and outside activities on the property would cease by 7:00 pm. She testified that she has no immediate plans to make the property available to large school groups for lessons, and clarified that only one or two lessons could take

place at a time due to the limited amount of horses and personnel. She testified that she intends to shield the Moore property by setting back the fence between the two properties and putting in place additional trees as a buffer.

Keith Wills, President of the Baltimore County Farm Bureau, which promotes agricultural use in Baltimore County, testified briefly in support of the Petitioner's plan.

James Herman, of JV Herman and Associates testified as an expert on behalf of the Petitioners' project. He testified that he had prepared the plat to accompany the Petition for special hearing and special exception and had reviewed the comments by various County agencies. He stated that in his opinion, the comments submitted were mostly development issues and not applicable to the zoning requests present in the Petitioners' request. He stated that horses are permitted as of right in the RC 2 zone and that the Special Exception requested is solely for a riding stable in the RC 2 zone.

In regards to the request for special hearing relief, the witness illustrated that the panhandle access to Dogwood Road is already in use and functions appropriately. He further clarified that there are no plans for the additional subdivision of the site. He sated that it was his opinion that since the riding stable will use its own horses and not be boarding others, that the limited additional traffic of those taking lessons will not require any change in the roads' size or configuration. He believes that the current surface is practically and environmentally appropriate and that any increase in impervious surfacing on either the road or parking area is unnecessary and adverse to the environment.

Regarding the Petitioners' special exception request, he foresees that the impact of the requested use at this site is minimal. Regarding 502.1 of the BCZR, he stated that in his opinion the requested use would not be detrimental to the health, safety or general welfare of the locality

involved as it would only call for minimal construction and would otherwise be primarily grassland; that the request would not tend to create congestion in the roads, streets or alleys given the obvious nature of the use and the limited number of people who would be availing themselves of the riding services; that it would not create a potential hazard from fire, panic of other danger as the site is a 36 acre open area; that it would not tend to overcrowd land and cause undue concentration of population, due to the nature of the requested use; would not interfere with adequate provisions for schools, parks, water, sewage, transportation or other public requirements or conveniences or improvements as the use would clearly not add population and the site utilizes private well and septic facilities, that the request would not interfere with adequate light and air, as there would be minimal construction, all within code, and no vistas would be adversely affected; that he request would not be inconsistent with the purpose of the property's zoning classification nor in any other way inconsistent with the spirit and intent of these zoning regulations, as the requested use would be an agricultural use within an agricultural area; would not be inconsistent with the impermeable surface and vegetative retention provisions of these zoning regulation, especially based upon their requested special hearing relief granting crush and run surfacing and not imposing the additional impervious surface requirements on the site; and would not be detrimental to the environment and natural resources of the site and vicinity including forests, streams, wetlands, aquifers, and floodplains in an RC 2, RC4, RC5 or RC7 zone as the Petitioners request will leave undisturbed all environmental amenities already in place, including swales for rainfall and runoff, forests, etc.

Adjacent property owner, Thel Moore testified as to his concerns regarding the Petitioners' request. While Mr. Moore appreciates the efforts the Petitioners' have put forth in cleaning up the property, he is concerned that the granting of the special exception would clear

the way for the Petitioners to expand their horse riding operation in the future, causing an increased amount of traffic to be placed on the road that is already in extremely poor shape and which is vigilantly maintained by Mr. Moore. Mr. Moore was also concerned that there should be some natural buffer between his property and the Petitioners'.

In the instant matter, however, the Petitioners wish to put the property to an agriculturally related use that has minimal impact on the surrounding community in stark contrast to the property's prior use and troubles. Based on the testimony presented the little impact that will occur is of a positive nature. The testimony of Debbie Sharp was credible in that she stated that she had no future plans for further development of the property and only wishes to operate a very small non-profit horse riding facility. The Board notes the agency comments generated in conjunction with the proposed project deal primarily to future permit and development issues and do not cause concern for the Petitioner's proposed use.

Judging the Petitioner's request separate and apart from any future development issue, this Board finds that granting the proposed special hearing relief will have minor affect on the property and its neighbors. The Board is satisfied that only a small increase in the use of the panhandle access to Dogwood Road will occur, and the proposed use will not create a significant increase of vehicles used on the property itself. The Board also finds that any increase to impervious surface as a result of the Petitioner's Special Exception request would not be environmentally beneficial and is unnecessary.

Addressing the Special Exception for the riding stable itself, the Board finds that the proposed use is appropriate for the site and meets the requirements of subsection 502.1 of the B.C.Z.R.

In conclusion the Board finds the Petitioners request for Special Hearing relief and

Special Exception are GRANTED.

ORDER

THEREFORE, IT IS this 11th day of January, 2012 by the Board of Appeals for Baltimore County

ORDERED, that the Petition for Special Hearing relief filed pursuant to Section 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R.") to confirm an existing non-conforming unpaved access roadway of variable width pursuant to B.C.Z.R. Section 104.1, and to approve a modified parking plan for a riding stable without a durable and dustless surface and without striped parking spaces in lieu of the required durable and dustless surface and striped spaces pursuant to B.C.Z.R. Section 409.8.2; be and are hereby GRANTED; and it is further

ORDERED that the Petitioner's request for Special Exception to approve a riding stable be and is hereby GRANTED; subject to the following condition:

1. Petitioners shall landscape the fence line between their property and the driveway of the Moore property. The length of this additional landscaping will be approximately 150 linear feet and will consist of no less than 15 fast growing arborvitae evergreen trees, placed 10 feet apart.

OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings consideration of Petitions for Special Hearing and Special Exception filed by the legal property owners, Debbie Sharp and Joseph Campayno. The Special Hearing was filed pursuant to Section 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R.") as follows:

- To confirm an existing non-conforming unpaved access roadway of variable width pursuant to B.C.Z.R. Section 104.1; and
- To approve a modified parking plan for a riding stable without a durable and dustless surface and without stripped parking spaces in lieu of the required durable and dustless surface and stripped spaces pursuant to B.C.Z.R. Section 409.8.2; and
- For such other and further relief as the Administrative Law Judge may find necessary and appropriate.

The Special Exception request is as follows:

- To approve a riding stable; and
- For such other and further relief as the Administrative Law Judge may find necessary and appropriate.

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The subject property and requested relief are more fully described on the site plan that was marked and accepted into evdience as Petitioners' Exhibit 1.

Appearing at the requisite public hearing in support of the Special Hearing and Special Exception requests were Petitioners Debbie Sharp and Joseph Campayno, and Jason Vettori, Esquire, attorney for the Petitioners. Also attending regarding the request was Thel Moore, Jr. of 8721 Dogwood Road and Cathy Wolfson, President of the Greater Patapsco Community Association.

The Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were received and are contained within the case file. Comments were received from the Office of Planning dated April 8, 2011. The Office of Planning recommends denial of the proposed Special Hearing to confirm an existing non-conforming unpaved access roadway of variable width. They also recommend denial of a modified parking plan for the riding stable without a durable and dustless surface and stripped spaces. However, the Office has no opposition to Petitioners request for special exception itself to operate a riding stable, presuming their desires as to road surfaces are accepted. Comments were also received from the Bureau of Development Plans Review dated April 8, 2011. They likewise object to the surface structure of the road and driveways and have other concerns relative primarily to issues related to the issuance of building permits or requests for subdivision approval. The Agricultural Preservation Section of the Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability supports the proposal as an appropriate agricultural use in an RC 2 zone, but likewise have a concern regarding the road and any future subdivision of the site.

Petitioner Debbie Sharp testified on behalf of her Petition. She related a brief history of the property, including its infamous time as the "stump dump," the subject of much litigation in years past. She noted that neither she nor her husband knew of that part of the site's history until after

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they became its owners. Her position is that she believes little of concerns of several County agencies regarding the "dump" apply to their requested use, which she maintains will have little impact on the property. She described the general area of the site as primarily agricultural, with some houses, a cemetery, forests and nearby Patapsco State Park.

She described her background as it relates to horse and rider training and details of the proposed project. She is a 10 year experienced riding instructor and hopes to have this project pay for itself and thus be truly "non-profit." She testified that she had met with the local Councilman as well as the Greater Patapsco Community Association and separately with its President, Cathy Wolfson, to insure that the project would be as "community friendly" as it could be. She explained that the requested use was not going to be a traditional "riding stable," with horses rented for hire or for the boarding of customers' horses. The only horses used would be those owned by the Petitioners themselves and outside activities in that regard would end at approximately 7:00 pm. The Petitioners propose an 80 feet x 20 feet "pole" barn and a "run-in shed" (a place for horses to come off pasture to get under cover). They further envision the use of numbered pastures -- a good administrative routine to rotate their use and protect grasslands and pastures from over use and over grazing. She noted that more often used areas near the barn and shed would be covered with sand on top in order to protect the pasture surface underneath.

The witness described the maintenance details of the project. This includes regular "deharrowing," or breaking up of manure which will mitigate and significantly reduce odor and flies and added that manure from the stable stalls would be compacted in a concrete building "C" on the accompanying plat (and which is colloquially referred to by her as the "concrete bunker"). Turning her attention to the neighboring Moore property, she stated that they had spoken to Mr.

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Moore and intended to take specific steps to shield the Moore property by setting back the fence between the two properties and putting in place additional trees as a buffer.

As regards the various County agencies, the witness testified that they were receiving conflicting requests and instructions, but acknowledged that grading and building permits still to be obtained would require dealing with the various County required compliance issues. She noted, however, that the portion of the site amenable to development (shown in gray on the Plat to Accompany the Petition) would still need to be served by the already existing panhandle roadway; however, she stated that they have no plans for any further development.

Keith Wills, President of the Baltimore County Farm Bureau, which promotes agricultural use in Baltimore County and represents some 5,400 farm families, testified briefly in support of the Petitioners' plan for an equine facility.

James Herman, of JV Herman and Associates, testified on behalf of the Petitioners' project, and was accepted as an expert in land planning, landscape architecture, and interpretation of the Baltimore County Code as it relates to land use and the B.C.Z.R. He testified that he had prepared the plat to accompany the Petition for special hearing and variance in this matter and had reviewed the comments submitted by the various County agencies. He stated that, in his opinion, the comments submitted were, by and large, development and permit issues and not applicable to the purely zoning requests of the instant Petition. He noted that horses are permitted as of right in the RC 2 zone and that the special exception requested here is simply for a riding stable in that zone. He further confirmed that only the "gray area" of the plat to accompany is available for

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At the request of this Administrative Law Judge, the Petitioners, subsequent to the hearing, have agreed to landscape the fence line between their property and the driveway of the Moore property. The length of this additional landscaping will be approximately 150 linear feet and will consist of no less than 15 fast growing arborvitae evergreen trees, placed 10 feet apart. This specific buffer will be made a condition of any Order issued in this matter.

development and the "white area" is the subject of the special exception request. He also confirmed that no plans exist for any further development of the "gray area."

As regards the request for special hearing relief, the witness pointed out that the panhandle access to Dogwood Road is already in use and functions appropriately. He reiterated that there are no plans whatsoever for additional subdivision of the site. He believes that since the riding stable will use its own horses and not be boarding those of other owners, that the limited additional traffic of those taking lessons will not require any change in the road's size or configuration. He therefore believes that the previous special hearing allowing for access to Dogwood Road should be reconfirmed. Finally, he believes that the present surface is practically and environmentally appropriate and that any increase in impervious surfacing on either the road or a parking area is unnecessary and adverse to the environment.

The witness then turned his attention to the special exception request. He opined that the impact of the requested use at this site is minimal and offered that a number of the "of right" activities permitted in the zone are worse and would have a more negative impact than the requested use would. He further offered that, in his opinion, the establishment of the requested use at this location would be no worse than at any alternate site within the RC 2 zone.

Mr. Herman proceeded to address the inquiries contained in subsection 502.1 of the B.C.Z.R. He stated that in his opinion the requested use would not be detrimental to the health, safety or general welfare of the locality involved as it would only call for minimal construction and would otherwise be primarily grassland; that the request would not tend to create congestion in roads, streets or alleys, given the obvious nature of the use and the limited number of people who would be availing themselves of the riding stable services; that it would not create a potential hazard from fire, panic or other danger as the site is a 36 acre open area; that it would not tend to

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overcrowd land and cause undue concentration of population, again due to the nature of the requested use; would not interfere with adequate provisions for schools, parks, water, sewage, transportation or other public requirements or conveniences or improvements as the use would clearly not add population and the site utilizes private well and septic facilities; that the request would not interfere with adequate light and air, as there would be minimal construction, all within code, and no vistas would be adversely affected; that the request would not be inconsistent with the purpose of the property's zoning classification nor in any other way inconsistent with the spirit and intent of these zoning regulations, as the requested use would be a clearly agricultural use within an agricultural area; would not be inconsistent with the impermeable surface and vegetative retention provisions of these zoning regulations, especially based upon their requested special hearing relief granting crush and run surfacing and not imposing the additional impervious surface requirements on the site; and would not be detrimental to the environmental and natural resources of the site and vicinity including forests, streams, wetlands, aguifers, and floodplains in an RC 2, RC 4, RC 5 or RC 7 zone, as the Petitioners request will leave undisturbed all environmental amenities already in place, including swales for rainfall and runoff, forests, etc., resulting in better arrangements than most farms would normally have.

Cathy Wolfson, President of the Greater Patapsco Community Association, appeared and testified that she had personally met with the Petitioners regarding their intended plans and use of the site. She believes that the project will enhance the agricultural "feel" of the area in general; and specifically that the present crush and run "hard pack" road and proposed parking area is tough enough for Petitioners' intended use. She believes that the imposition of the road and parking requirements as recommended by the County in its comments to be excessive under the circumstances.

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Thel Moore, an adjacent property owner to the site, believes that the Petitioners have done a "yeoman's" job of cleaning up the site. His main concern is to maximize buffering by the placement of the fence and the use of trees to increase the buffer between the properties. Presuming steps are taken in that endeavor (which has occurred, as set out footnote 1), he looks forward to Petitioners' project coming to fruition.

Finally, letters of support for the project were also submitted by neighbor Michael Bagby and family of 8729 Dogwood Road, and by Victoria Dever, who assisted the Petitioners in their efforts to clean up the property after its purchase by them.

This site has been the scene of a sad chapter in this community's history. The "stump dump" and resulting damage are not a high point in the proper use of land and protection of the citizens of Baltimore County.

In the instant matter, however, the Petitioners, who apparently did not know of the site's checkered history before their purchase, wish to put the property to an agriculturally related use that is both creative and appropriate. It requires minimal construction and has little impact on the general area and its inhabitants. Whatever impact will occur is, by testimony of all concerned, positive in nature. I note the concerns generated in the agency comments that have been submitted and are part of the file in this matter. However, I agree with witness Herman that the nature and applicability of these comments relate primarily to future permit and development issues and other related tasks. The clear, uncontroverted and sworn testimony of Debbie Sharp and witnesses testifying on behalf of the Petitioners is that they have no plans for further development of the property and only wish to take the superficial steps necessary to allow their requested use to become reality.

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Therefore, I will address myself solely to the requested special hearing and special exception relief. As to the special hearing, the use requested by Petitioners will, I believe, have little affect on the property and its surrounding neighbors. I do not believe there will be other than a minor increase in the use of the panhandle access to Dogwood Road, nor will the requested use, based solely on horses owned by the Petitioners themselves, generate a significant change in the number of vehicles using the property. Moreover, and especially in light of the already checkered treatment of the site, I believe any increase to the impervious surfaces as a result of Petitioners' special exception use request, on the access road or parking area would not be environmentally appropriate and is unnecessary.

As to the special exception for the riding stable use itself, I agree with the Petitioners witnesses that, given the underlying agricultural basis of the site, the requested use is appropriate. The uncontroverted testimony of witness Herman clearly establishes that the Petition for special exception meets the requirements of case law and specifically of subsection 502.1 of the B.C.Z.R.

We sent a previous memo, dated March 31, 2011 in which we had no comment. That memo was in error. Below are our comments for this item.

The existing driveway that will be used by the petitioner is used by at least three other homes. For the existing use, the minimum width of pavement would be 16 feet. But since the riding stable is considered a commercial use, the minimum width would be 20 feet. And since horse trailers and other commercial vehicles will be using the driveway, we feel that it is very important for the petitioner to widen the driveway to 20 feet, so that two larger vehicles traveling in opposite directions may pass easily. Similarly, the proposed increased and changed use begs that the driveway be paved with a durable and dustless surface.

Furthermore, the petitioner's plan shows two proposed homes. Under the panhandle regulations, these homes would have to be provided with a durable and dustless surfaced, 16-foot-wide driveway. Since, as shown on the plan, that driveway will pass through the riding stable area, all proposed driveways and parking areas should be paved. Doing so would not only avoid tracking mud and other undesirable debris onto the onsite and offsite driveways, it would allow for smooth and efficient movement of horse trailers, delivery trucks, emergency vehicles and customers.

The Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability offers the following comments on the above-referenced zoning item:

1. From the Groundwater Management Section:

The development of this site raises serious environmental concerns due to the known history of the site as an unregulated dump. As documented in DEPS and MDE files, the site was used primarily as a natural wood waste processing facility in the 1980s, but there is also evidence that a significant quantity of non-permitted wastes were buried on the site including: farm equipment, a pressure tank, a furnace, drywall, scrap metal, tires, railroad ties, plastic, bricks, and concrete. In the late 1980's the site caught on fire and efforts to put out the fire took several years. The available information suggests that the material dumped on the site encompasses at least 5 acres and may be as deep as 22 feet, however, the full extent of the fill material nor its contents has not been adequately characterized.

Consequently, prior to issuance of any building permits or subdivision approval DEPS will require that further environmental investigation be performed to verify that the development of the site will not cause or further exacerbate human health or environmental impacts. At a minimum, the Department will require that a qualified environmental engineering / consulting firm prepare the following:

- <u>Document Review</u> The site history related to the landfilling activities and environmental monitoring data must be summarized and tabulated.
- <u>Delineation of Fill Areas</u> The full aerial extent and depth of the fill area must be delineated to determine where and how deep the fill is on the property.
 Evaluation of historical aerial photographs, topographic maps, and digging of test

pits is recommended as the best way to generate this information. Each test pit must be characterized as to the materials encountered and the depth natural soils.

- Hydrogeologic Asssessment of Ground Water Flow The area is served entirely
 by private drinking water supplies. In order to determine whether there may be
 potential impacts to neighboring or proposed on-site drinking water wells, the
 hydrogeologic conditions on the site must be evaluated to determine where
 contaminants (if present) will likely migrate in the subsurface.
- Evaluation of Ground Water Quality Based on the delineation of the fill
 material and the assessment of groundwater movement beneath the site, ground
 water samples must be collected at locations approved by the Department and
 analyzed for metals, VOCs, SVOCs. Results must be summarized and compared
 with USEPA drinking water standards. There are four monitoring wells known to
 be on the site. Depending on the condition of the wells and extent of fill areas
 determined, further monitoring wells may be required to characterize the ground
 water.
- Evaluation of Soil Gas Due to the large quantities of wood waste known to be
 present on the site, methane levels in the shallow subsurface must be evaluated
 within 50 feet of any of the existing or proposed structures to be used on the site.
 The soil gas survey should be consistent with USEPA methodologies.
- Risk Assessment Based upon the information gathered regarding the nature and extent of the fill material, an evaluation must be performed to assess whether the proposed use of the property will pose any significant environmental or human health risks. Any mitigation recommendations (i.e, soil gas venting, water treatment) should be included in the evaluation. In addition, the assessment should include whether there is any potential for impact to any off-site drinking water supplies.

It is unclear from the existing plan whether there will be any grading of the site as part of the development. It should be noted that any contaminated soils that are found or materials unearthed that are not suitable for pasture must be properly disposed of in manner and location approved by the Department.

2. From the Environmental Impact Review Section:

- _X Development of the property must comply with the Regulations for the Protection of Water Quality, Streams, Wetlands and Floodplains (Sections 33-3-101 through 33-3-120 of the Baltimore County Code).
- X Development of this property must comply with the Forest Conservation Regulations (Sections 33-6-101 through 33-6-122 of the Baltimore County Code).

As noted above development of this site must comply with Article 33. Title 3 Protection of Water Quality, Streams, Wetlands and Floodplains and Article 33. Title 6 Forest Conservation of the Baltimore County Code.

3. From the Agricultural Preservation Section:

The Agricultural Preservation Section of our Department supports the proposal for a horse farm and riding stable as these are agricultural uses that are appropriate in an RC 2 zone, however, there is concern that the proposed residential lot to be subdivided will cause problems down the road. Riding stables and horse farms are intensive uses and the location of a lot to be sold could lead to nuisance conflicts between the two in the future. It is recommended therefore, that the attached nuisance notice be placed in the deed for the new lot and on all subsequent deeds for the proposed lot.

The County shall not consider an agricultural operation to be a public or private nuisance, if the operation complies with these regulations and all Federal, State, or County health or environmental requirements.

SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Office of Planning has reviewed the petitioner's request, accompanying site plan and visited the site.

The Office of Planning recommends denial of the proposed Special Hearing to confirm an existing non-conforming unpaved access roadway of variable width. The addition of a commercial use (riding stables) to a gravel driveway that is currently in poor condition and that already serves 4 existing residential lots, would generate additional traffic, thus causing more damage to the existing unpaved driveway and the increased possibility of conflicts between opposing traffic on the existing driveway. Conflicting traffic on the private driveway could also impact traffic traveling on Dogwood Road.

The Office of Planning recommends denial of a modified parking plan for the riding stable without a durable and dustless surface and stripped spaces.

- 1. Provide a durable and dustless ingress/egress driveway built to public works standards from Dogwood Road to the subject of the proposal.
- 2. Provide a durable and dustless parking area for the riding stable.
- 3. The subject plan was reviewed for the purposes of the requested Special Exception and Special Hearing. Since a plan for subdivision has not been submitted nor reviewed by agencies the plan should be revised to show one lot and one house at this time. The Office of Planning reserves the right to comment on anything outside the scope of what has been requested on the subject petition when an appropriate submittal for subdivision has been submitted.

The Office of Planning does not oppose the petitioner's request for Special Exception to operate a riding stable subject to the aforementioned.

PANEL MEMBERS DISCUSSED THE FOLLOWING:

STANDING

- The Board discussed the history of this matter. The subject property was the site of the Stump Dump. The Petitioners purchased the property and have cleaned it up with the intention of opening a small scale riding stable. The Petitioners intend to stable a maximum of four (4) horses on the site and only provide one-on-one lessons. The Administrative Law Judge granted the Petitions with conditions regarding landscaping. The Protestant appealed that decision.
- The Board discussed the evidence and testimony presented at the hearing. The Protestant indicated that his main concern was with the condition of the access roadway and the increased use. The Board discussed that the property is zoned RC which allows for farms. As a farm use, the proposed riding stable is the most minor type of farm one could have. The Board discussed that as farm uses go, people don't always realize how intense the use can become by using farm equipment. The Board determined that the roadway does need some grading and crush but it held up to the traffic for the Stump Dump so it should hold up to the traffic for the stable. The Board determined that at this time and for the current use, the roadway is adequate and the Petitioners are not yet burdened with the requirement to improve the roadway. The Protestant expressed concern at the hearing about possible future development of the property and the improvement of the road. The Board determined that the concern is irrelevant at this time as the evidence and testimony provided by the Petitioners does not indicate future development of the site. If the site were to be developed in the future, those concerns would be addressed at that time.

Road

We have an unpaved access road to the properties back here. When it rains or the weather is bad it causes major problems like deep pot holes, uneven patterns and rough riding. Currently there are 6 people (Mike / Angela, Ed/ Wife, Thel / Lisa) who use the road daily. If each of us uses the road once a day for 365 days we will access the road 2,190 times with light trucks and regular motor vehicles. The proposed plan calls for 37 parking spaces at a minimum and if that amount of people access the road once a day for 365 days that will be 13,505 times the road will be accessed by heavy trucks, horse trailers, school buses, light trucks, regular motor vehicles, and other unknown equipment for the care of the stable. Therefore it is very important that the road be commercially paved to with stand all the extra traffic it will incur. If not it will be a nightmare trying to get home after the beating the road could take.

Proposed barn and manure storage area

The current location proposal for the barn and manure storage area is unacceptable. Debbie and Joseph have 35 acres of land to work with and I have just less than 2 acres of land. They have much more flexibility to work with their property than I do. The current location of the barn and manure storage area will allow for the smell stench and rodents to have direct access to my property. In addition the location is in the direct line of the wind direction that will cause the smells to come directly into my leisure area. Currently there are no trees or anything that can provide a valid barrier between the site and the barn and manure pit from my property.

As I review the site plan it amazes me that the barn and manure storage area is so far from the proposed location of the homes to be built. There are multiple places they can move the barn and manure storage area on their 35 acres that will allow for both of us to be smell free of the horse waste and other issues that come with the horses in the barn.

Hours of operation

Debbie and Joseph stated that they would not have a large scale business for riding lessons and plan on keeping the quiet and seclusion that currently exists. I am not familiar with the horse business but having 7 parking spaces for staff, 18 parking spaces for customers, plus 8 parking spaces for horse trailers seems like a fairly large amount of potential traffic for lessons over a long period of time. If the proposed exception is given then I would never have any peace in my backyard again. There is no buffer from their property to mine so I will hear and see all activities related to the horse training and riding. While I am open to hours that will allow them to train and ride, I am clearly not open to giving up all my peace. Especially when they have so much more space and room to operate and move where I would not be impacted.

So I would strongly request that the Zoning Commissioner put some parameters around the riding stable (hours of operation) to keep it from becoming a riding mill in the future because of a wide open decision.

Summary

I want to work with my new neighbors but I do not want to be inconvenienced or have my family inconvenienced. We were there prior to their purchase of the land they currently own and we chose that location for its peace and location to our family, friends, and work. We knew it would be a work in progress for years but we could work on it as we move into our next phase of our family legacy. I had no way of knowing that I would be smelling horse manure all the time or looking at a barn directly with multiple people constantly around. That means the peace and quiet I currently have will go away forever. I would like to minimize it as much as possible. I paid a lot of money for this property and would hate to lose it because I could not stand the smell or increased traffic, along with not being able to sell the home because of the same issues. Then it will make all the extremely hard work I have put in serving my country to afford to buy a property such as mine a waste. I could then lose it all. It is not fair to me and my family.

I hope the zoning commissioner will take all of my thoughts into consideration and not just Debbie and Joseph's thoughts into consideration. In addition, I would like to submit this email for the record. My intention is to attend the hearing, but due to the pending government shut down my attendance may be in jeopardy. I, Thel Moore, Jr., of 8721 Dogwood Road, Windsor Mill, MD. 21244, would like to submit an appeal to the decision rendered on, 16 April 2011, for case no. 2011-0279-SPHX.

There are many comments and concerns consistently discussing how the road is not ready for this new intended use and needs to be repaired to allow for safe travels. Below are comments from the Baltimore County Office of Planning, Mike Bagby (neighbor) and Myself (directly impacted neighbor):

-On 8 April 2011, Jeff Mayhew (Acting, Director, Office of Planning) recommended the following: The Office of Planning recommends denial of he proposed Special Hearing to confirm an existing non-conforming unpaved access roadway of variable width. The addition of a commercial use (riding stables) to a gravel driveway that is currently in poor condition and that already serves 4 existing residential lots, would generate additional traffic, thus causing more damage to the existing unpaved driveway and the increased possibility of conflicts between opposing traffic on the existing driveway. In October 2010, we purchased 37 ½ acres in Windsor Mill with the dream of creating a small, private horse farm. Unbeknownst to us, we purchased the infamous "stump dump," a piece of land that was used as a landfill for stumps, construction rubble, old trailers, tires and trash. You name it, we've found it. The past ten months of our lives have been spent removing tons of unwanted debris and separating it for recycling. And we've only scratched the surface.

Our short term goal for the property includes the addition of a barn, pastures, and corrals to house our personal horses, a few mares for breeding and riding, and the occasional rescued horse for retraining. We plan on building an eight-stall barn, have an 80' x 200' indoor riding ring to keep the horses exercised year round, and an attractive mobile home for a caretaker to live on the property.

Debbie will be teaching a few riding lessons each week to select students. With a belief in the classical training of horse and rider, not running groups of people through a "lesson mill" to make money, the instruction will be taught on a private or semi-private basis. This will keep traffic and parking to a minimum and maintain our secluded neighborhood as a peaceful retreat. We decided upon a fully-enclosed riding ring to keep down noise levels and to avoid the use of outdoor vapor lights during evening hours.

We are strong advocates of conservation, recycling, sustainability and green practices... which makes our property purchase extremely ironic. The Baltimore County Soil Conservation District is working closely with us to develop "best management practices" for water runoff, manure maintenance, and pasture upkeep. Water collection from our roofs will be used for irrigation to ease the burden on our wells and we hope to be "off-the-grid" in a few years by using alternative sources of energy. As remediation of the land continues, more pastures will be added, and trees planted. Invasive weeds will be replaced by native plants in the wetland areas to creative wildlife conservation zones, perhaps for the reintroduction of threatened species. We may also be purchasing some yaks and goats to work as environmentally friendly weed-whackers.

One of our greatest hopes is to offer our farm to the Windsor Mill school district as part of an educational outreach program. Through informal learning, our local children will have the opportunity to experience ecology, sustainable farming, animal husbandry and green practices in a real, hands-on environment.

In approximately five years, we would like to build our private home toward the back of the property. We are also talking with Baltimore County about Land Preservation to maintain our property's unique beauty for generations to come.

On behalf of our organization and it's over 400 members we submit the following comments regarding the above referenced case:

Ms. Sharp and Mr. Campayno submitted their proposal for our membership's review at our general meeting in June 2010. We did not oppose their plans for the property. In August 2010 Ms. Sharp submitted a letter to us outlining their plans for the property. Both that letter and the site data are consistent with each other.

We take exception with the office of Planning's review which requires an ingress/egress driveway built to public work standards.

I did visit the site this week. They have will have yoemen's work to restore the land on that property.

Locally we recall that Baltimore County was perfectly happy for the former property owner at this site, Mr. James Jett to run the now legendary stump dump there in the 1980's which generated dozens of daily tractor trailer trips in and out of that same right of way on the same surface and accessed by the same two lane ditched roads which we use today.

Further two homes have been built on an adjacent property zoned RC-2. That property owner requested upzoning to RC5 in the 2008 CZMP cycle. That request was denied. We anticipate that the request will be renewed in 2012. It is unreasonable to ask the Sharps/Campaynos to provide an upgrade which will benefit adjacent property owners and which was not required for heavy truck traffic. The cost will be a deal breaker for them.

We consider that a ballpark projection of 200,000 square feet (1/2 mile x 16', plus parking spaces) of impervious surface will have an egregiously negative impact on our local environment and Brice's Run which is at least ½ mile from the entrance.

We welcome the use of this riding stable as proposed in our community.

INTRODUCTION

Master Plan 2010 reinforces the goal of earlier master plans to protect agricultural and sensitive environmental areas of the rural county from development encroachment.

The urban-rural demarcation line (URDL) was established to provide a boundary between urban and rural areas. Land use and zoning reinforce this concept. Rural areas are defined as areas located outside the URDL that do not have public water or sewer service. The reliance on well and septic systems drastically limits options for development, and zoning and land use reflect the associated environmental constraints.

Rural areas receive only those levels of service necessary to protect the rural land management uses and to address basic public health, safety and welfare requirements of rural residents. Infrastructure is planned not to accommodate population expansion, but simply to address existing population levels and needs. In a rural area, it is expected that roads will be narrower and traffic slower, and that homes will be located further from schools. Medical facilities, stores, and other services and amenities will be located within urban areas, and to some extent, rural commercial centers. It is not cost-effective for the county to provide increased levels of service where population density does not justify them. Providing these services would also threaten the protection and preservation of important natural resources.

There are more than 66,000 residents living in the rural portion of the county. Residential development has proceeded at a fairly steady rate in recent years with an average of 443 residential occupancy permits issued annually since 1990. Land management areas that have been established for the rural portion of the county include agricultural preservation areas, resource preservation areas, rural residential areas and rural commercial centers. Each designated area has its own unique value, and will be discussed further in the section "Land Use in Rural Areas."

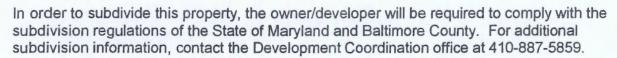

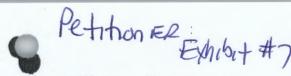

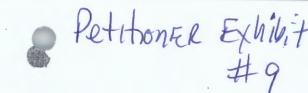

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter comes before the Zoning Commissioner for consideration of a Petition for Special Hearing filed by the owner of the subject property, Michael A. Bagby. As filed, the Petitioner requests a special hearing to approve a waiver of public works standards from Section 32-4-409(b) of the B.C.D.R.¹, to allow access to the proposed lots by way of a right-of-way in lieu of the required in fee ownership. The subject property and requested relief are more particularly described on the site plan submitted, which was accepted into evidence and marked as Petitioner's Exhibit 1.

Appearing at the requisite public hearing and testifying on behalf of the Petitioner was Bruce E. 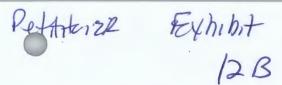

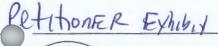

I have known Debbie and Joe since the summer of 2000 when Debbie became the riding instructor for my daughter Christine who was then the age of 12. What is significant to relate is at the age of 18 months all her development stopped and she was diagnosed as autistic with little chance of a "normal" life. To fast forward, Christine mainstreamed into public school, but still had severe fine and gross motor delays. In the summer of 2000, after much pleading on her part, and much trepidation on mine, I finally let her take riding lessons. Although her passion and drive surpassed most children, the instructors one by one chose not to teach Christine as they would rather work with more "gifted" riders. I looked one last time for someone to work with Christine so she didn't have to feel like a failure, and that's when I found Debbie.

Debbie worked patiently with Christine and always made it fun. She never made her feel less than her other students. She always gave her extra time and never asked for more money, as is the standard practice. Within a year, Christine had the confidence to work as a summer barn assistant and then weekend manger of a 40-horse stable while attending high school.

As a parent I had done all I could to build her self-esteem – little did I know that additional help would come in the form of a riding instructor. I totally give credit to Debbie for empowering my daughter; teaching her not just about horses, but about the perseverance needed to achieve one's goals. Today, Christine is a graduate from the University of Maryland and is now pursuing her Doctorate of Physical Therapy at Long Island University in New York. Debbie taught my daughter lessons well beyond riding.

When Joe and Debbie purchased their farm in 2009, I eagerly helped on weekends to clean up the trash and debris dumped by others. I, Thel Moore, Jr., of 8721 Dogwood Road, Windsor Mill, MD. 21244, would like to submit an appeal to the decision rendered on, 16 April 2011, for case no. 2011-0279-SPHX.

There are many comments and concerns consistently discussing how the road is not ready for this new intended use and needs to be repaired to allow for safe travels. Below are comments from the Baltimore County Office of Planning, Mike Bagby (neighbor) and Myself (directly impacted neighbor):

-On 8 April 2011, Jeff Mayhew (Acting, Director, Office of Planning) recommended the following: The Office of Planning recommends denial of he proposed Special Hearing to confirm an existing non-conforming unpaved access roadway of variable width. The addition of a commercial use (riding stables) to a gravel driveway that is currently in poor condition and that already serves 4 existing residential lots, would generate additional traffic, thus causing more damage to the existing unpaved driveway and the increased possibility of conflicts between opposing traffic on the existing driveway. It is my understanding, in your appeal; there are no plans to improve/upgrade the road. Per our recent conversation, you agreed the need for the road improvement.

Debbie and Joe have expressed time after time that they would be willing to contribute to improving the road. I understand your priority to put the barn and horse before the road.

-On 6 September 2011, I wrote the following comments to Debbie and Joe with no response: Access Road - Since heavy trucks, horses and clients for lessons will be coming to your property, possibly daily, that will increase traffic on the access road. Do you have any plans to fix or repair the road for this increase?

-On 7 April 2011, I wrote the following for the Special Hearing:

We have an unpaved access road to the properties back here. When it rains or the weather is bad it causes major problems like deep pot holes, uneven patterns and rough riding. Currently there are 6 people (Mike / Angela, Ed/ Wife, Thel / Lisa) who use the road daily. If each of us uses the road once a day for 365 days we will access the road 2,190 times with light trucks and regular motor vehicles. The proposed plan calls for 37 parking spaces at a minimum and if that amount of people access the road once a day for 365 days that will be 13,505 times the road will be accessed by heavy trucks, horse trailers, school buses, light trucks, regular motor vehicles, and other unknown equipment for the care of the stable. Therefore it is very important that the road be commercially paved to with stand all the extra traffic it will incur. If not it will be a nightmare trying to get home after the beating the road could take.

- -Access Road Since heavy trucks, horses and clients for lessons will be coming to your property, possibly daily, that will increase traffic on the access road. Do you have any plans to fix or repair the road for this increase?
- -Manure runoff I am not familiar with the county rules on run off and maintenance. I will defer to the county on that one. However, I want to make sure our well water will not be affected.
- -Seclusion I would like your property address to be seen easily from the access road. I want to maintain my seclusion as much as possible. This will also assist in allowing all of us back here to enjoy our investments to the maximum.

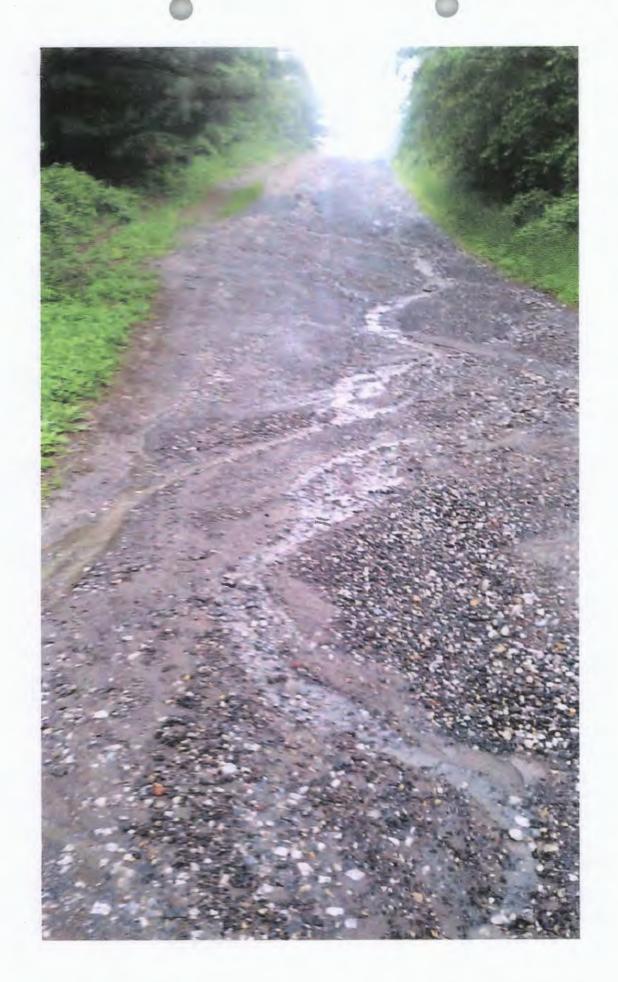

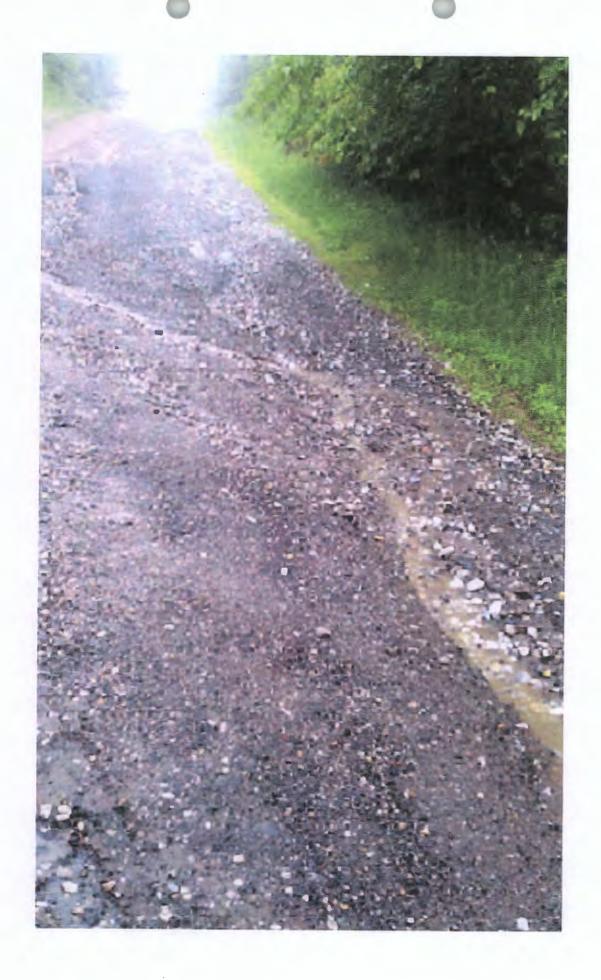
We have an unpaved access road to the properties back here. When it rains or the weather is bad it causes major problems like deep pot holes, uneven patterns and rough riding. Currently there are 6 people (Mike / Angela, Ed/ Wife, Thel / Lisa) who use the road daily. If each of us uses the road once a day for 365 days we will access the road 2,190 times with light trucks and regular motor vehicles. The proposed plan calls for 37 parking spaces at a minimum and if that amount of people access the road once a day for 365 days that will be 13,505 times the road will be accessed by heavy trucks, horse trailers, school buses, light trucks, regular motor vehicles, and other unknown equipment for the care of the stable. Therefore it is very important that the road be commercially paved to with stand all the extra traffic it will incur.  The planning office provides staffing for three volunteer citizen advisory boards/commissions.

Landmarks Preservation Commission (LPC) —reviews development plans involving historic properties, and approves sites for placement on the County's Preliminary Landmarks List.

<u>Design Review Panel</u> —reviews development plans for designated areas.

- Master Plan: The Department prepares a Master Plan every 10 years, monitors its implementation, and prepares progress reports.
- Community Planning: A community planner is assigned to each of the seven council districts. Among other duties, the planners prepare local community plans to be adopted by the County Council as amendments to the Master Plan.

Debbie Sharp & Joe Campayno "Yet To Be Named Farm" 8729 Dogwood Road Windsor Mill, MD 21244

In October 2010, we purchased 37 ½ acres in Windsor Mill with the dream of creating a small, private horse farm. Unbeknownst to us, we purchased the infamous "stump dump," a piece of land that was used as a landfill for stumps, construction rubble, old trailers, tires and trash. You name it, we've found it. The past ten months of our lives have been spent removing tons of unwanted debris and separating it for recycling. And we've only scratched the surface.

Our short term goal for the property includes the addition of a barn, pastures, and corrals to house our personal horses, a few mares for breeding and riding, and the occasional rescued horse for retraining. We plan on building an eight-stall barn, have an 80' x 200' indoor riding ring to keep the horses exercised year round, and an attractive mobile home for a caretaker to live on the property.

Debbie will be teaching a few riding lessons each week to select students. With a belief in the classical training of horse and rider, not running groups of people through a "lesson mill" to make money, the instruction will be taught on a private or semi-private basis. This will keep traffic and parking to a minimum and maintain our secluded neighborhood as a peaceful retreat. We decided upon a fully-enclosed riding ring to keep down noise levels and to avoid the use of outdoor vapor lights during evening hours.

We are strong advocates of conservation, recycling, sustainability and green practices... which makes our property purchase extremely ironic. The Baltimore County Soil Conservation District is working closely with us to develop "best management practices" for water runoff, manure maintenance, and pasture upkeep. Water collection from our roofs will be used for irrigation to ease the burden on our wells and we hope to be "off-the-grid" in a few years by using alternative sources of energy. As remediation of the land continues, more pastures will be added, and trees planted. Invasive weeds will be replaced by native plants in the wetland areas to creative wildlife conservation zones, perhaps for the reintroduction of threatened species. We may also be purchasing some yaks and goats to work as environmentally friendly weed-whackers.

One of our greatest hopes is to offer our farm to the Windsor Mill school district as part of an educational outreach program. Through informal learning, our local children will have the opportunity to experience ecology, sustainable farming, animal husbandry and green practices in a real, hands-on environment.

In approximately five years, we would like to build our private home toward the back of the property. We are also talking with Baltimore County about Land Preservation to maintain our property's unique beauty for generations to come.

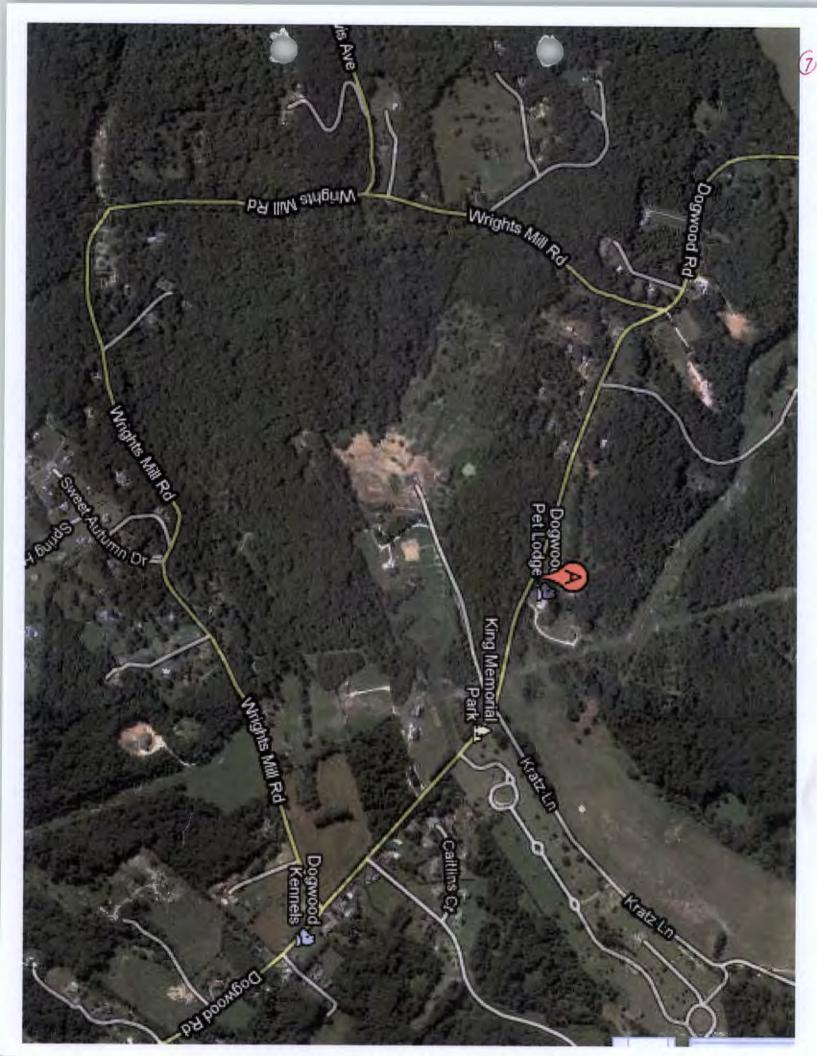

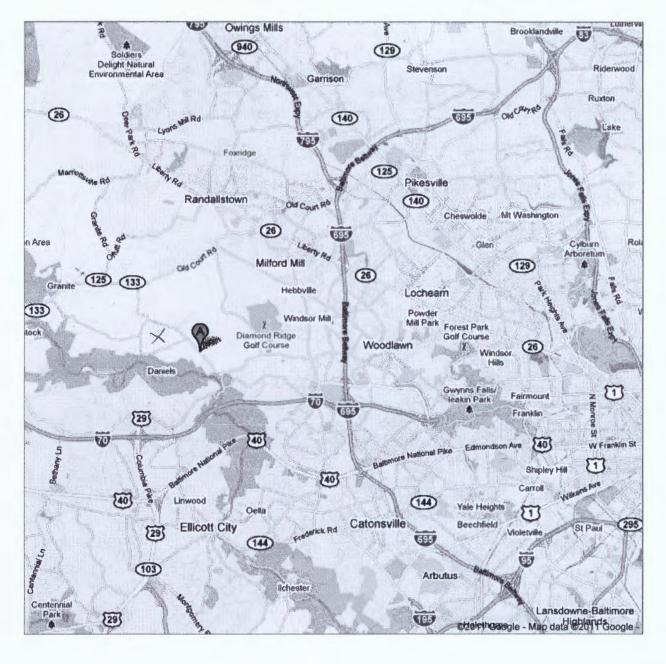

SATELLITE RECEIVING DISH — A device used or designed to receive electromagnetic signals from earth-orbiting satellites and other extraterrestrial sources and is external to or is attached to the ground or the exterior of any building. Let me first thank-you for being good neighbors by taking ownership and cleaning up what was the vacant property next to our home. That property was an eye sore and needed a lot of work.

Your proposal for the farm and land preservation for the property seems very admirable and should bring beauty to our secluded area back here in Baltimore County.

- I (Thel) have lived in Baltimore County since 1966. When I purchased the wooded lot we live on now I also had dreams of a nicely secluded home for my family and generations of my family to come. I figured this location would be safe for them environmentally and away from a lot of human traffic. It is for those reasons I offer the following comments/questions:
- -Hours of operations: Your letter spoke to evening hours, but it did not speak to hours of operations for these lessons. What are your plans for evening hours? Do you plan to have weekend lessons? Will lessons be seven days a week? When can we expect the last lesson to end? These answers will impact traffic and when we can expect quiet in the area.
- -Amount of clients: You mentioned a few riding lessons to select students. I am not familiar with horse lessons so what does a few mean (5 -15, 20 30, or more)?
- -Access Road Since heavy trucks, horses and clients for lessons will be coming to your property, possibly daily, that will increase traffic on the access road. Do you have any plans to fix or repair the road for this increase?
- -Manure runoff I am not familiar with the county rules on run off and maintenance. I will defer to the county on that one. However, I want to make sure our well water will not be affected.
- -Seclusion I would like your property address to be seen easily from the access road. I want to maintain my seclusion as much as possible. This will also assist in allowing all of us back here to enjoy our investments to the maximum.

Your Honor.

I am writing this letter in support of Debbie Sharp & Joe Campayno's request for a riding stable on their agricultural property in Baltimore County.

I have known Debbie and Joe since the summer of 2000 when Debbie became the riding instructor for my daughter Christine who was then the age of 12. What is significant to relate is at the age of 18 months all her development stopped and she was diagnosed as autistic with little chance of a "normal" life. To fast forward, Christine mainstreamed into public school, but still had severe fine and gross motor delays. In the summer of 2000, after much pleading on her part, and much trepidation on mine, I finally let her take riding lessons. Although her passion and drive surpassed most children, the instructors one by one chose not to teach Christine as they would rather work with more "gifted" riders. I looked one last time for someone to work with Christine so she didn't have to feel like a failure, and that's when I found Debbie.

Debbie worked patiently with Christine and always made it fun. She never made her feel less than her other students. She always gave her extra time and never asked for more money, as is the standard practice. Within a year, Christine had the confidence to work as a summer barn assistant and then weekend manger of a 40-horse stable while attending high school.

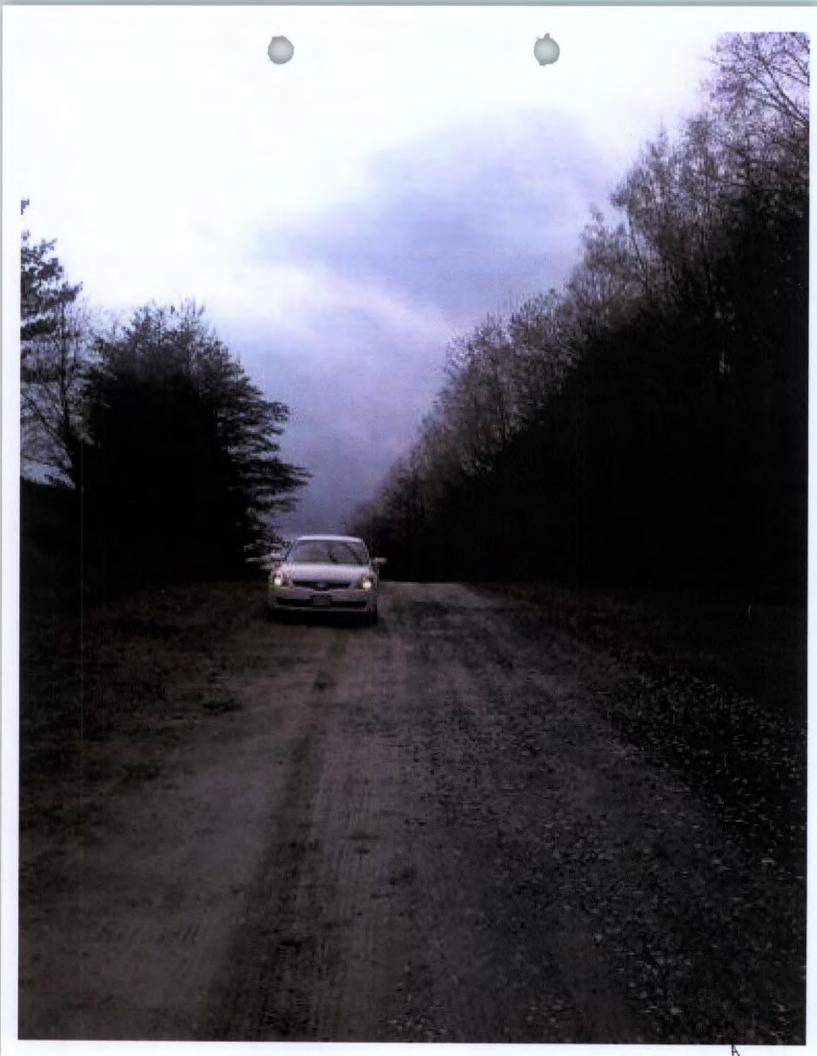
As a parent I had done all I could to build her self-esteem – little did I know that additional help would come in the form of a riding instructor. I totally give credit to Debbie for empowering my daughter; teaching her not just about horses, but about the perseverance needed to achieve one's goals. Today, Christine is a graduate from the University of Maryland and is now pursuing her Doctorate of Physical Therapy at Long Island University in New York. Debbie taught my daughter lessons well beyond riding.

When Joe and Debbie purchased their farm in 2009, I eagerly helped on weekends to clean up the trash and debris dumped by others. I don't know many people who would take on land that had been as abused as this site, and work many hours outside of their full time jobs, at their own expense, to personally clean it up. This property known as the "stump dump" today looks like a clean beautiful piece of property ready to become the farm it was meant to be. Every piece of the thousands of pounds of material that has been collected has been recycled, not just dumped into another landfill, which would have been the easy path to take. Debbie and Joe take "green practices" and preservation of the environment to heart.

I have met some of the best people this country has to offer while serving as a Special Forces officer in the US Air Force. Debbie and Joe are up there with the finest I have had the honor and privilege to know. I have never met people more committed to give back to their community and their fellow man.

§ 409.12 Other requirements.

A. The off-street parking requirements in Section 409 shall supersede any off-street parking requirements adopted pursuant to the authority of Section 504.

<u>B.</u>

If the requirements for parking space or loading space in Section 409 would create an undue hardship, the Zoning Commissioner may approve a modified plan upon petition and after a public hearing, the procedure for which is set forth in Section 409.8.B.1 above.

§ 409.8

Design standards.

A. Requirements for parking facilities in all zones. All off-street parking facilities shall be subject to the following requirements:

1. Design, screening and landscaping. Design, screening and landscaping shall be provided in accordance with the Landscape Manual and all other manuals adopted pursuant to § 32-4-404 of the Baltimore County Code.

[Bill No. 137-2004]

- Surface. A durable and dustless surface shall be provided and shall be properly drained so as not to create any undesirable conditions.
- 3. Lighting. Any fixture used to illuminate any parking facility shall be so arranged as to reflect the light away from residential lots and public streets. Light standards shall be protected from vehicular traffic by curbing or landscaping.
- Distance to street line. No parking space in a surface parking facility for a nonresidential use shall be closer than 10 feet to the right-of-way line of a public street, excluding vehicle overhang, except that in the C.T. District of Towson such setback is not required if the parking facility is screened from the street in accordance with the Landscape Manual.
- Dead ends. All dead-end aisles shall be designed to provide sufficient backup area for the end parking spaces.
- All parking spaces must be striped. Striping shall be maintained so as to remain visible.
- B. Business or industrial parking in residential zones.
- 1. Upon application, the Zoning Commissioner may issue a use permit for the use of land in a residential zone for parking facilities to meet the requirements of Section 409.6, under the following procedure:
- On the property in question, notice of the application for the use permit shall be conspicuously posted for a period of 15 days following the filing of the application.
- <u>b.</u>
 Within the fifteen-day posting period, any interested person may file a formal request for a public hearing with the Zoning Commissioner in accordance with Section 500.7.
- C.
 If a formal request for a public hearing is not filed, the Zoning Commissioner, without a public hearing, may grant a use permit for parking in a residential zone if the proposed use meets all the requirements of Section 409.8.B.2. The use permit may be issued with such conditions or restrictions as determined appropriate by the Zoning Commissioner to satisfy the provisions of Section 409.8.B.2 below and to ensure that the parking facility will not be detrimental to the health, safety or general welfare of the surrounding community.
- If a formal request for a public hearing is filed, the Zoning Commissioner shall schedule a date for the public hearing, such hearing to be held not less than 30 days and not more than 90 days from the date of filing of the

§ 409.4 Access to parking spaces.

Vehicular travelways in off-street parking facilities where the parking spaces are located in parking bays or parking lanes shall be divided into driveways, with no direct access to parking spaces, and aisles, providing direct access to adjoining parking spaces.

- A. Driveways shall be at least 12 feet in width for one-way movements and at least 20 feet in width for two-way movements.
- B. All parking spaces shall adjoin and have direct access to an aisle, except in the following cases:
- In cases where vehicles will be parked by an attendant, the Zoning Commissioner may approve a parking facility in which up to 50% of all parking spaces do not adjoin and have direct access to an aisle.
- 2. In office buildings less than 5,000 square feet, the Zoning Commissioner may approve a plan in which spaces designated for employee use only do not have direct access to an aisle.
- C. The permitted parking angles and the minimum required widths of aisles shall be as specified below. Parking angles and aisle widths which vary from those specified below may be approved by the Zoning Commissioner for any parking facility based upon the written findings of the Director of Public Works that the design of the particular parking facility involved will provide for the safe and efficient circulation and maneuvering of vehicles.

§ 1A01.5 <u>Inconveniences arising from agricultural operations.</u>

[Bill No. 34-2009]

Any dwelling, business or use in or near an R.C. 2 Zone may be subject to inconveniences or discomforts arising from agricultural operations, including but not limited to noise, odors, fumes, dust, the operations of machinery of any kind during any twenty-four-hour period (including aircraft), the storage and disposal of manure and the application, by spraying or otherwise, of chemical fertilizers, soil amendments, herbicides and pesticides. The County shall not consider an agricultural operation to be a public or private nuisance if the operation complies with these regulations and all federal, state or County health or environmental requirements.

§ 32-4-409. PANHANDLE DRIVEWAYS.

- (a) In general.
 - (1) The county may only allow a panhandle lot:
 - (i) To achieve better use of irregularly shaped parcels;
 - (ii) To avoid development in environmentally sensitive areas;
 - (iii) Where the lot will not be detrimental to adjacent properties; and
 - (iv) Were the lot will not conflict with efforts to provide for public safety and general welfare.
- (2) The county may only allow a panhandle driveway where necessary to provide access to interior lots where a public road is neither feasible nor desirable.
 - (b) In-fee strip; required.
- (1) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, the county may permit a panhandle lot if the lot includes an in-fee strip of land for access to the local street.
 - (2) Panhandle fee strips shall be a minimum of:
 - (i) 20 feet in width to serve one lot;
 - (ii) 12 feet in width per lot where two lots are involved;
 - (iii) 10 feet in width per lot where three or more lots are involved; or
- (iv) 12 feet in width per lot where there are two or more lots in a development that is within the metropolitan area where public water and sewer services are available, planned, or considered.
- (c) Same; exception. In cases where a right-of-way has been established before the submission of the Development Plan, the Hearing Officer may approve access to the local street or collector street through the existing right-of-way instead of an in-fee strip.
 - (d) Panhandle driveways.
- (1) A single panhandle driveway may serve up to five dwellings, three of which may be on internal lots not adjacent to the local street or collector street.
- (2) Panhandle driveways serving lots greater than 20,000 square feet may serve five internal lots plus two dwellings on the front lots adjacent to the panhandle driveway and the local street or collector street.
 - (3) Front lots are not required to be part of the panhandle driveway development.
 - (4) Notwithstanding the provisions of § of this title, the requirements of this subsection may not be waived.
 - (e) Length of panhandle in DR and RC zones.
 - (1) In a DR zone, the panhandle length may not exceed 500 feet.
 - (2) In an RC zone, the panhandle length may not exceed 1,000 feet.
 - (3) The maximum permitted length of a panhandle is subject to variance under § 307 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations.
 - (f) Panhandle driveways serving multiple lots.
- (1) For panhandle driveways serving more than one lot, the developer shall note on the record plat any covenants that provide for common use and maintenance of the panhandle driveway and culvert.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter comes before the Zoning Commissioner for consideration of a Petition for Special Hearing filed by the owner of the subject property, Michael A. Bagby. As filed, the Petitioner requests a special hearing to approve a waiver of public works standards from Section 32-4-409(b) of the B.C.D.R.¹, to allow access to the proposed lots by way of a right-of-way in lieu of the required in fee ownership. The subject property and requested relief are more particularly described on the site plan submitted, which was accepted into evidence and marked as Petitioner's Exhibit 1.

Appearing at the requisite public hearing and testifying on behalf of the Petitioner was Bruce E. Doak with Gerhold, Cross & Etzel, Ltd., the consultants who prepared the site plan for this property and Michael A. Bagby, owner and site developer. There were no Protestants or other interested citizens from the locale in attendance.

Testimony and evidence offered revealed that the subject property is an irregular shaped parcel located approximately 1,500 feet to the west of the right-of-way for Dogwood Road, north of Wrights Mill Road in the Granite/Woodstock area of the county. The property contains a gross area of 4.05 acres, more or less, zoned R.C.2 and currently undergoing a minor subdivision process (PDM 06-009-M). The Petitioner is desirous of subdividing his property to

At the outset of the hearing, the Petition was corrected by interlineation to correct the relief requested as follows: "to approve access to the local street (Dogwood Road) through the existing right-of-way, which is 16 feet wide and approximately 1,935 feet long, in lieu of the required in-fee strip, pursuant to Section 32-4-409(c) of the Baltimore County Code (B.C.C.), for proposed Lot(s) 1 and 2.

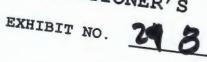
