#### **OPINION**

This case comes before the Board of Appeals as a result of Petitioners, John C. M. Angelos and his wife Irene N. Angelos seeking zoning approval in the form of a Variance to permit additions to an existing dwelling to allow a 35 foot (rear) setback and a 24 foot (front) setback in lieu of the required 50 foot for each for the property at 11905 Greenspring Avenue, Owings Mills, Maryland 21117. The Zoning request is from Section 1A04.3B.1.b(1) of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.).

A hearing was held before the Baltimore County Board of Appeals on November 21, 2012. Mr. John C. M. Angelos appeared at the hearing *pro se*. Petitioner's request was opposed by Mr. Stuart Caplan, Protestant, who also appeared *pro se*. A Public Deliberation was held on January 24, 2013.

#### BACKGROUND

The Petitioner requested a Special Hearing Petition on August 23, 2012. On October 19, 2012, Administrative Law Judge Kotroco granted relief from Section 1A04.3B.1.b(1) of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.). On August 2, 2012, Mr. Stuart Caplan, who did not appear at the Special Hearing but did submit evidence in the form of photographs,

properly appealed the decision by Administrative Law Judge Kotroco. The appeal was heard by the Board of Appeals for Baltimore County on November 21, 2012.

At the November 21, 2012, hearing, Mr. Angelos appeared *pro se* and testified that the proposed addition which was described as a stand- alone, diamond-shaped bedroom connected to the house by a glass walkway measuring approximately 10-12 ft., will improve an existing porch. He further testified that the addition would not create a burden on any neighboring property. Mr. Angelos testified that the house is unique because its shape "is long and narrow". He further testified that he will landscape to maintain the privacy between his home and that of Mr. Caplan and any intrusion would be minimal.

Mr. Stuart Caplan also appeared *pro se* to oppose the variance. Mr. Caplan testified that there are discrepancies between the two (2) plans which Mr. Angelos submitted. He also testified that he is concerned about additional run-off, loss of value of his property and losing the privacy and urban feel he desired when he purchased the property in 1988. Mr. Caplan submitted various exhibits demonstrating his concern about potential run-off issues and loss of privacy.

<u>LAW</u> Maryland jurisprudence is well established regarding the factors to be considered when contemplating variance relief.

Baltimore County Zoning Regulations, Section 307.1, in pertinent part, states as follows:

"...(T)he County Board of Appeals, upon appeal, shall have and they are hereby given the power to grant variances from height and area regulations...only in cases where special circumstances or conditions exist that are peculiar to the land or structure which is the subject of the variance request and where strict compliance with the Zoning Regulations for Baltimore County would result in practical difficulty or unreasonable hardship.... Furthermore, any such variance shall be granted only if in strict harmony with the spirit and intent of said height, area...regulations, and only in such manner as to grant relief without injury to public health, safety, and general welfare...."

In *McLean v. Soley*, 270 Md. 216 (1973) the court established the following criteria for determining practical difficulty or unreasonable hardship:

- "1) Whether compliance with the strict letter of the restrictions governing various variances would unreasonably prevent the owner from using the property for a permitted purpose or would render conformity with such restrictions unnecessarily burdensome.
- "2) Whether a grant of the variance applied for would do substantial justice to the applicant as well as to other property owners in the district, or whether a lesser relaxation than that applied for would give substantial relief to the owner of the property involved and be more consistent with justice to other property owners.
- "3) Whether relief can be granted in such fashion that the spirit of the ordinance will be observed and public safety and welfare secured."

Further, in North v. St. Mary's County, 99 Md.App. 502 (1994) the Court held that

"...the 'unique' aspect of a variance requirement does not refer to the extent of improvements on the property, or upon neighboring property. 'Uniqueness' of a property for zoning purposes requires that the subject property have an inherent characteristic not shared by other properties in the area, i.e., its shape, topography, subsurface condition, environmental factors, historical significance, access or non-access to navigable waters, practical restrictions imposed by abutting properties (such as obstructions) or other similar restrictions. In respect to structures, it would relate to such characteristics as unusual architectural aspects and bearing or party walls." Id at 514

In the Court of Special Appeals in *Cromwell v. Ward*, 102 Md.App. 691 (1995), wherein the Court writes:

...The Baltimore County ordinance requires "conditions ...peculiar to the land...and...practical difficulty...." Both must exist. ...However, as is clear from the language of the Baltimore County ordinance, the initial factor that must be established before the practical difficulties, if any, are addressed, is the abnormal impact the ordinance has on a specific piece of property because of the peculiarity and uniqueness of that piece of property, not the

uniqueness or peculiarity of the practical difficulties alleged to exist. It is only when the uniqueness is first established that we then concern ourselves with the practical difficulties...." <u>Id.</u> at 698.

In requiring a pre-requisite finding of "uniqueness", the Court defined the term and stated:

In the zoning context the "unique" aspect of a variance requirement does not refer to the extent of improvements upon the property, or upon neighboring property. "Uniqueness" of a property for zoning purposes requires that the subject property has an inherent characteristic not shared by other properties in the area, i.e., its shape, topography, subsurface condition, environmental factors, historical significance, access or non-access to navigable waters, practical restrictions imposed by abutting properties (such as obstructions) or other similar restrictions.... *Id.* at 710.

#### DECISION

The Petitioners argue that their property is unique because of the physical structure of the improvements and their need for a certain internal design which would maximize sun exposure and provide for their family. Petitioner further argues that he will plant additional tree vegetation to address Protestant's concerns.

While the Board still concedes that the Petitioners' family situation may be "unique", we are not satisfied that the subject property has unique physical characteristics that would satisfy the requirements found in *Cromwell*.

So that the record may be clear, we further find that, even assuming *arguendo* that the subject property was somehow determined to be unique, no showing of practical difficulty has been established. Moreover, the law is clear that self-inflicted hardship cannot form the basis for a claim of practical difficulty. Speaking for the Court in *Cromwell, supra*, Judge Cathell noted:

Were we to hold that self-inflicted hardships in and of themselves justified variances, we would, effectively, not only generate a plethora of such hardships but we would also emasculate zoning ordinances. Zoning would become meaningless. We hold that John C.M. and Irene N. Angelos /Petitioners-Legal Owners

practical difficulty or unnecessary hardship for zoning variance purposes cannot generally be self-inflicted. *Cromwell*, at 722

As applied here, the Petitioners selected the location of the addition into the rear setback area for personal reasons (desire to located children's' bedroom near parents and desire for sun exposure) and as such, this hardship is self-imposed. Moreover, the denial of this variance does not render this Property useless. To the contrary, the Petitioners have alternatives available which would not violate the front or rear setbacks including building upward (this is 1 level rancher) or extending the house toward the east end of their yard.

Moreover, while the evidence produced in this case centered on the request for a variance from the rear setback lines, our findings apply equally to the request for a 24' front yard setback in lieu of the required 50 feet. The lack of opposition at the hearing to the front yard setback does not persuade us that the requirements of *Cromwell* have been met for that request.

Finally, while the Petitioners requested Special Hearing relief under BCZR, §1A04.3B.1.b(1), the heart of the request, as argued by the Petitioners, was for variance relief and therefore, we are bound by the holding of *Cromwell*.

#### CONCLUSION

This Board is not persuaded that the Petitioners have illustrated uniqueness of its parcel to deviate from standard zoning requirements for their property. Consequently, Petitioners' requested Variance relief is DENIED.

To Whom It May Concern,

I am respectfully submitting this request to the Baltimore County Board of Appeals to enter an Appeal of the Denial Order to My Motion for Reconsideration (Dated July 6, 2012) and the Original Zoning Variance Order (Oct 19, 2011), both associated with Special Hearing Case No. 2012-0050-SPH. Copies of both documents are attached for reference purposes.

Because of the close proximity of both residence, which is unique to the area, our backyards are literally on top of one another. As my house is quite small, I utilize my backyard to entertain whenever I can, and although the rear of both residence are close, it still maintains some semblance of the rural nature of this area of the County that attracted me to purchase the property in 1988. If my neighbor is allowed to build the proposed stand alone structure within the 50' setback, as has been ruled, it will adversely impact the quality of my backyard, my quality of life, and the value of my property.

Not as paramount, but just as important, is my concern that if the addition is built, coupled with the reduced setback area, will increase the flow of storm water runoff onto my property. My backyard area already floods during periods of heavy rain. As the planed addition would not fall under Baltimore County Storm Water Management Review, as a requisite for permit approval, who will be responsible for rectifying the additional flooding if/when flooding occurs?

Dear Messrs. Angelos and Caplan:

I have received and reviewed the letters each of you submitted concerning the Motion for Reconsideration filed by Mr. Caplan. While the Zoning Commissioner's Rules do not expressly state that a copy of such motion must be served on each interested party in the case, that of course is a fundamental requirement in quasi-judicial proceedings. I don't believe Mr. Caplan is an attorney, and it is therefore understandable he would not be aware of such a requirement. In any event, we now have a scenario where zoning relief was granted nearly nine months ago, and the Motion for Reconsideration has been pending for almost that long, even though the Rules require the zoning commissioner to "rule on the motion within 30 days from the date which the motion is accepted for filing."

In these circumstances, I will dispense with the necessity of a hearing on the motion, as I am permitted to do under the Rules. The points raised in Mr. Caplan's Motion for Reconsideration are — in large part — the same ones he set forth in his letter of opposition that Judge Kotroco entered into the case file. As such, I will deny the Motion for Reconsideration filed by Mr. Caplan.

In Mr. Caplan's June 27, 2012 correspondence, he cites <u>Cromwell v. Ward</u> and correctly notes the stringent standards for variance relief. In this case, Judge Kotroco did not grant variance relief; rather, Mr. Angelos was granted special hearing relief pursuant to the regulations for R.C.5 zones. As such, <u>Cromwell</u> is not applicable in these circumstances.

This ruling shall be considered the final decision in the above case. Any party wishing to appeal this decision may do so by filing, within 30 days, an appeal to the Baltimore County Board of Appeals. #### Dear Judge Beverungen:

I am in receipt of your letter dated June 20, 2012, and Mr. Angelos' response letter dated June 25, 2012, which I will address later. Pursuant to the receipt of your letter, I contacted Ms. Kristen Lewis in the Department of Permits to let her know that I was available to meeting any time to resolve the above matters. She agreed to contact Mr. Angelos to get his input. I would have attempted to contact Mr. Angelos myself, but communications between us has been non-existent since I made him aware that I would oppose his request for zoning relief.

With regard to providing Mr. Angelos with a copy of my Motion To Reconsider request, I was not aware that it was mandatory for me to do so, trusting that he would receive official notification from the Office of Administration Hearings. I would have forward him a courtesy copy, via certified mail, but a previous attempt at sending him a certified letter was returned to me as "unclaimed".

In respond to Mr. Angelos' assertion that "the parties" consented to the hearing date, and eluding that my absence is indicative of my sincerity in the case, I would like to point out that since June 1, 2011 I have been helping out my cousin who started chemotherapy treatment for breast cancer. This treatment continued to late October. In addition to driving her to and from the hospital for treatment and blood work and to pick up her prescriptions, I remained "on-call" in case of emergencies (therapy would make her sick). As I was "on call" at a moments notice, and not knowing if I could make the hearing for certain, I inquired through the Office of Administration Hearings and was informed that I could send in my Letter of Opposition in lieu of attending the hearing, which I did to guarantee that my opposition to Mr. Angelos' request was presented.

I assure you that my absence at the original hearing in no way diminishes the importance of this matter to me. If Mr. Angelos is allowed to build his proposed addition, it will profoundly impact the value and desirability of my property, and as my backyard is prone to flooding during heavy rains the diminished set-back area, coupled with the additional drainage off the roof of this addition, could potentially exacerbate my flooding problem.

My Motion for Reconsideration included documents and correspondence supporting my claims that my property would be adversely impacted should Mr. Angelos proceed with his proposed plans to build within the County's original 50° set-back.

In addition, I referenced two set-back relief cases that cite specific guidelines that Baltimore County follows in determining the granting of such relief, which I claim were not followed in the granting of the relief in this case; (1) Case No. 2011-0302-A, with decision rendered on June 30, 2011; and (2) Cromwell v. Ward 102 Md. App. 691 (1995), which states the prevailing rule that "variances are to be granted sparingly, only in rare instances and under peculiar and exceptional circumstances....a variance should be strictly construed. Cromwell Id at 700. Section 307.1 of the zoning regulations permits variances to be granted "....only in cases where special circumstances or conditions exist that are peculiar to the land or structure which is the subject of the variance request and where strict compliance with the zoning regulations for Baltimore County would result in practical difficulty or unreasonable hardship. It further states, that in determining the granting of such relief that the injustice placed on other property owners in the district should be taken into consideration.

Mr. Angelos property encompasses 2 clear and mostly level acres. His residence is a rancher constructed in 1984. There are no peculiar and/or exceptional circumstances that would result in practical difficulty or unreasonable hardship in preventing Mr. Angelos from expanding onto his house if he complies with the 50' set-back regulation... other than preventing him from his architectural desires to build a stand alone structure.

On the other hand, due to the close proximity of the backs of our residence, which face each other, and are respectively within 80'+/- of our shared property line, the granting of the relief places Mr. Angelos house that much closer to our shared property line, thus diminishing the privacy value of my backyard, and hence the value and desirability of my property. In addition, through discussions with Mr. Robert Wirth, Head of Baltimore County Storm Water Management, the topography of our properties both slope slightly from West to East. He agreed with me that the diminished setback area, which would normally absorb run-off from Mr. Angelos' property, coupled with the additional run-off from his stand alone addition, could exacerbate the flooding that I experience. Furthermore, I learned from Mr. Wirth, that Baltimore County Dept of Permits only requires projects of a certain size (square footage) to undergo engineering examination and meet SWM requirements. Mr. Angelos stand alone addition, because of size, would not be exempt from any such examination, and thus would not be required to install any storm water management abatement to address my concerns.

In closing, I am asking for Judge Kotrocco's ruling to be overturned on the basis that the granting of the relief will unjustifiably impact my property, whereas if Mr. Angelos had to comply with Baltimore County's existing 50' setback regulation it would not prevent him from expanding onto his existing house for his intended purposes, it would only prevent him from pursuing his architectural desires to construct a stand alone addition.

#### ORDER AND OPINION

This matter comes before the Administrative Law Judge as Petition for Special Hearing filed by the legal owners of the property, John C.M. and Irene N. Angelos. The Petitioners are requesting Special Hearing relief pursuant to Section 1A04.3.B.1.b(1) of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) to permit additions to an existing dwelling to allow a 35 foot (rear) setback and a 24 foot (front) setback in lieu of the required 50 foot for each. The subject property and requested relief is more fully depicted on the site plan that was marked and accepted into evidence as Petitioners' Exhibit 1.

Appearing at the requisite public hearing held for this case was Petitioner John C.M. Angelos. There were no Protestants or other interested persons present. Prior to the hearing, it should be noted that letters and photographs were received from Stuart B. Caplan of 11913 Greenspring Avenue who opposes the variance request. Mr. Caplan did not appear in person at the hearing; however, his letter and photographs were discussed with the Petitioner.

The ZAC comments were received and made a part of the file. Comments were received from the Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability (DEPS), dated September 13, 2011, which indicate any future building permits (for additions) at the site will require review by Groundwater Management.

ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING

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Testimony and evidence offered at the hearing revealed that the subject property is 2.0 acres, zoned R.C.5. and located in the Owings Mills area of the County.

The property is improved with a one story stone rancher-type dwelling, wherein the Petitioner resides with his family. The proposal before me is to allow for additional living space to be added to the existing dwelling. The Petitioners intend to add some additional bedroom space for their children, a new family room and to relocate the existing garage. The design of these additions is shown on Petitioners' Exhibit 1, a schematic plan prepared by Architect Larry Link.

As stated earlier, adjacent property owner Stuart Caplan submitted a letter of opposition with various photos of his and surrounding properties. Mr. Caplan is concerned that his property value may go down if this Special Hearing is granted and is also concerned about additional stormwater run-off generated by the new additions.

Mr. Caplan's property is adjacent to the Petitioners' property. His rear yard backs up to and shares a common property line with the rear yard of the Petitioners' property. The requested setback relief in that area is for a 35' setback in lieu of the required 50' setback. The addition to be built on that side of the house sits at an angle to the property line so that only the corner of the one story addition sits 35' from the property line. The rest of the addition tapers away from the common property line. A review of the site plan submitted illustrates this point.

Given the testimony offered at the hearing, I believe it is appropriate to grant the relief requested in the Special Hearing Petition.

Pursuant to the advertisement, posting of the property and public hearing on this Petition held and for the reasons set forth above, the relief requested shall be granted.

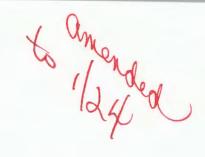

To Whom It May Concern,

Please accept this submission as backup to my opposition to the above variance request.

I am a neighbor of the above applicants, Mr. & Mrs. John Angelos. Our properties are adjacent, and our houses are parallel and directly across from one another (back of my house faces the back of their house). My property address is 11913 Greenspring Avenue (Owings Mills, 21117). [Reference: Photo #1]

It is my understanding, from my conversion with Mr. Angelos, that the referenced variance request was filed to accommodate two building additions. One addition would extend out from the east (garage) side of there house, and the other addition, which would impact me, would be a stand alone structure extending off the rear of there house. Pursuant to this meeting, Mr. Angelos sent me correspondence dated September 8, 2011, which I responded to on September 19, 2011. [Copies attached]

Reasons for my opposition to the granting of said variance are as follows:

- 1. <u>Runoff created by the addition</u>. My backyard becomes a huge lake during any strong storm event. Given the decrease in setback between the proposed stand alone structure and the property line, I am concerned that the additional runoff, created by the roof area of the addition, will not have sufficient surface area to be absorbed into the ground before crossing over to my property. [Reference: Photo #5]
- 2. <u>Devaluation of property value</u>. The backs of our houses are already closer than any other properties in the area. [Reference: Photos #2, 9, 10, 11] I estimate the distance from the rear of my house to the property line at being approximately 50°, maybe less. My house was constructed in 1960, and the Angelos' house was constructed in 1984. I purchased my house in May 1988 because of the privacy and openness of the location.

Because of the degree to which the proposed stand alone structure would encroach upon the standard setback, I asked a professional realtor to pay a site visit to my property and give me her input. She advised me that if the addition was build that close to the property line that it would impact not only the value of my property, but also the desirability. She noted that families value a backyard setting to gather. She also noted the awkwardness, of having the backs of both houses so close together when each had such a wide open field to the east. [Reference: Photos #3 through 8]

In conclusion, Mr. Angelos had informed me that the stand alone addition was to be used for his young children's bedroom, so there bedroom would not be that far away from his and his wife's. This is understandable, but the children will grow up and the stand alone structure will still be that close to the property line. In my correspondence to Mr. Angelos, I asked him to consider, in lieu of a stand alone structure, which takes up a great deal of space, an extension onto the back of the house which would not encroach so much into the setback, or to add the space to the addition planned for the east side of the house.

I like the Angelos, but the bottom line is that they have options where I have none. To build a stand alone structure in a limited amount of space, is one thing. But couple it with the close proximity of the backs of our houses and the impact to me is significant. As such, I respectfully request that the setback variance for this stand alone addition be denied.

Dear John,

I am in receipt of your September 8, 2011 letter regarding our discussion concerning your plans to build onto your current residence. I am also in receipt of the accompanying copy of Baltimore County's "Notice of Zoning Hearing" that you included.

As you stated in the letter, among other things, we discussed the reasons for, and the basic layout of the two additions to your house: the one large addition coming off, and replacing, the garage portion of the house, and the other being a "stand alone" extension coming off the rear of your house for the kids bedrooms, the latter of which requires the variance in the setback code. But, I do not recall you ever mentioning the specifics regarding the changes to the setback distances you were requesting, at the time of our discussion.

As you know, the backs of our houses are facing one another and are pretty much parallel. Although I would have to measure it to be accurate, I believe I only have 50' between the rear of my house and our joining property line. Where I would not be opposed to a small reduction in the setback requirement, I have major reservations when it comes to reducing the 50' setback requirement to 35 feet (30% reduction) and 24 feet (52% reduction).

Whenever it rains, not just during the last event, the area of my yard in back of my house, around the large maple tree, becomes a huge pool of water. During the last event, my basement flooded. I am concerned that the increase runoff from the roof of your new addition will not have enough ground surface area, between the footprint of the new addition and our property line, to absorb the runoff before it crosses over to my property.

In addition to the above concern, I discussed the situation with a realtor friend of mine who enlightened me to the fact that the desirability (value) of my property would be diminished because of the privacy issue with having another dwelling so closed to the back of my house. As she explained, in any other neighborhood, it might not be as much an issue, but given where we live and the fact that the rears of our houses would be closer than any other houses in the area, it would be a turn-off to a potential buyer. As the rear of a house is the typical gathering place for families, I can see her point.

#### SECTION 1A04. R.C.5 (Rural-Residential) Zone

## § 1A04.1. General provisions.

- A. Legislative statement of findings.
  - 1. Declaration of findings. It is found that:
    - a. The rural-residential development that has occurred in Baltimore County heretofore has been of a scattered and generally disorderly nature;
    - b. This form of development constitutes a wasteful use of land and is fiscally expensive to serve with respect to the provision of basic services;
    - c. In some cases lot sizes are inadequate to assure long-term adequacy of on-lot sewer and water systems;
    - d. That unless measures are implemented to assure more rational growth patterns, including adequate lot size, undue financial hardships will be placed on Baltimore County and the life, safety and general welfare of the citizens of the county will be adversely affected;
    - e. That specific areas which are highly suitable for rural-residential development do exist; and
    - f. That these areas are adequate to accommodate anticipated future growth in the rural area and that future growth should be directed to these areas.
- B. Purpose. The R.C.5 zoning classification is established, pursuant to the legislative findings above, in order to:
  - 1. Provide for rural-residential development in suitable areas in which basic services are not anticipated.
  - Eliminate scattered and generally disorderly patterns of future rural-residential development.
  - Assure that encroachments onto productive or critical natural resource areas will be minimized.

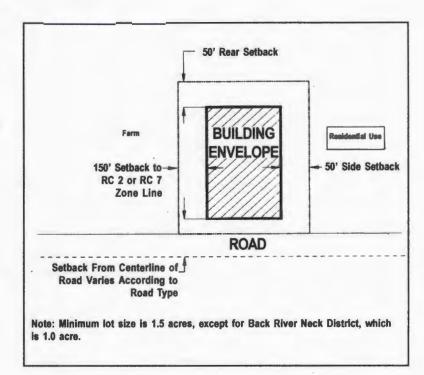

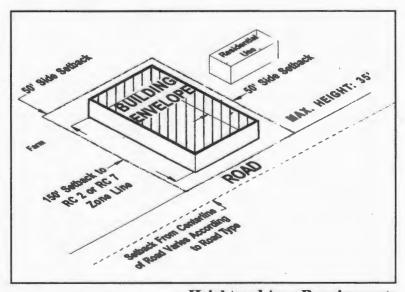

Height and Area Requirements



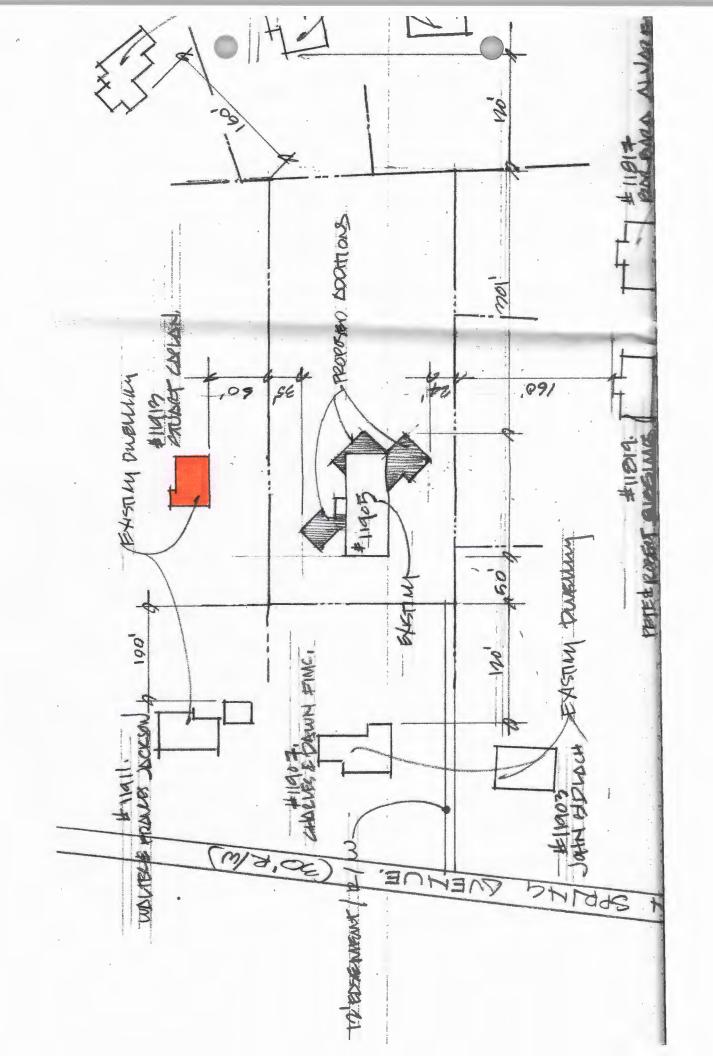


My Neighborhood Map

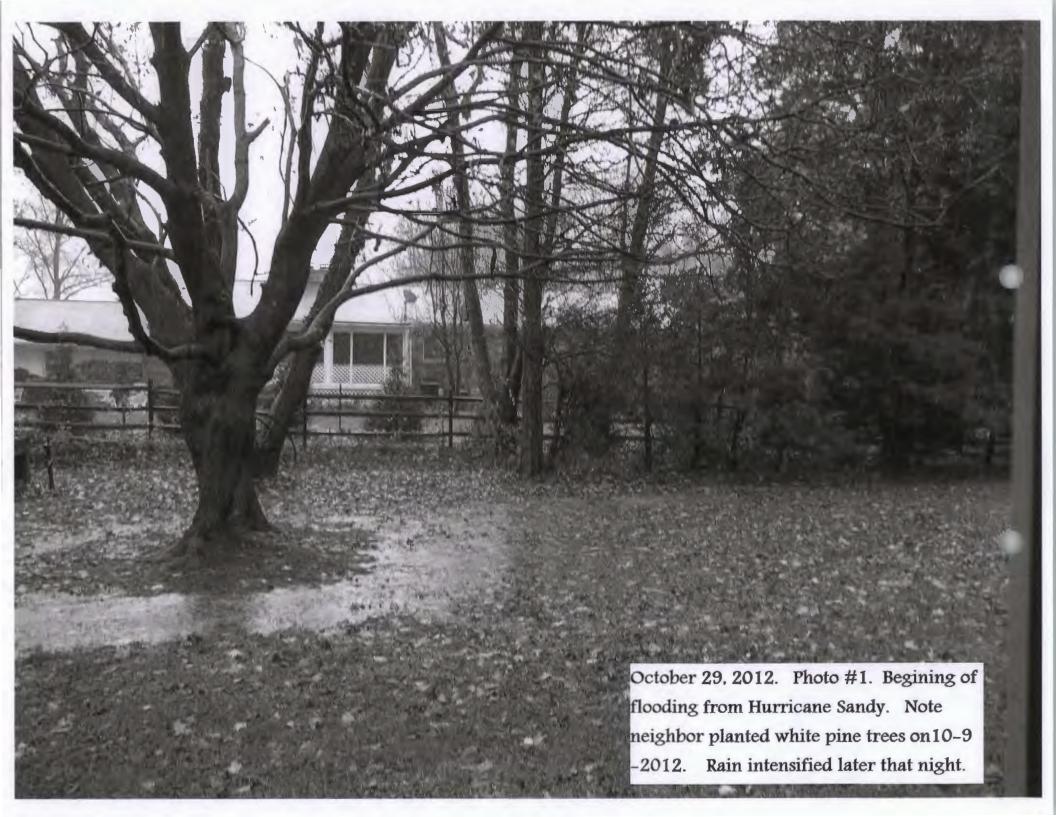
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## **SECTION 307. VARIANCES**

§ 307.1. Authority to grant variances; procedures and restrictions.

[BCZR 1955; Bill Nos. 107-1963; 32-1988; 2-1992; 9-1996]

# § 307.1. Authority to grant variances; procedures and restrictions.

The Zoning Commissioner of Baltimore County and the County Board of Appeals, upon appeal, shall have and they are hereby given the power to grant variances from height and area regulations, from off-street parking regulations, and from sign regulations only in cases where special circumstances or conditions exist that are peculiar to the land or structure which is the subject of the variance request and where strict compliance with the Zoning Regulations for Baltimore County would result in practical difficulty or unreasonable hardship. No increase in residential density beyond that otherwise allowable by the Zoning Regulations shall be permitted as a result of any such grant of a variance from height or area regulations. Furthermore, any such variance shall be granted only if in strict harmony with the spirit and intent of said height, area, offstreet parking or sign regulations, and only in such manner as to grant relief without injury to public health, safety and general welfare. They shall have no power to grant any other variances. Before granting any variance, the Zoning Commissioner shall require public notice to be given and shall hold a public hearing upon any application for a variance in the same manner as in the case of a petition for reclassification. Editor's Note: Apparently conflicts with certain provisions found in the Baltimore County Code, 2003, as revised, which prescribe requirements with respect to notice and hearing regarding conventional reclassification petitions that differ from those which it prescribes regarding variance petitions. See the Appendices of this volume for excerpts from the Baltimore County Code, 2003. See Section 32-3-301 for authority of the Zoning Commissioner to grant variances, and Section 32-3-103 for provision regarding conflicts between Article 32, Title 3 of the Baltimore County Code, 2003 and the Zoning Regulations. Any order by the Zoning Commissioner or the County Board of Appeals granting a variance shall contain a finding of fact setting forth and specifying the reason or reasons for making such variance. Dear Messrs. Angelos and Caplan:

I have received and reviewed the letters each of you submitted concerning the Motion for Reconsideration filed by Mr. Caplan. While the Zoning Commissioner's Rules do not expressly state that a copy of such motion must be served on each interested party in the case, that of course is a fundamental requirement in quasi-judicial proceedings. I don't believe Mr. Caplan is an attorney, and it is therefore understandable he would not be aware of such a requirement. In any event, we now have a scenario where zoning relief was granted nearly nine months ago, and the Motion for Reconsideration has been pending for almost that long, even though the Rules require the zoning commissioner to "rule on the motion within 30 days from the date which the motion is accepted for filing."

In these circumstances, I will dispense with the necessity of a hearing on the motion, as I am permitted to do under the Rules. The points raised in Mr. Caplan's Motion for Reconsideration are — in large part — the same ones he set forth in his letter of opposition that Judge Kotroco entered into the case file. As such, I will deny the Motion for Reconsideration filed by Mr. Caplan.

In Mr. Caplan's June 27, 2012 correspondence, he cites <u>Cromwell v. Ward</u> and correctly notes the stringent standards for variance relief. In this case, Judge Kotroco did not grant variance relief; rather, Mr. Angelos was granted special hearing relief pursuant to the regulations for R.C.5 zones. As such, <u>Cromwell</u> is not applicable in these circumstances.

This ruling shall be considered the final decision in the above case. Any party wishing to appeal this decision may do so by filing, within 30 days, an appeal to the Baltimore County Board of Appeals.
