OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) as Petitions for Special Exception and Variance filed for property located at 11510 Reisterstown Road. The Petitions were filed by David H. Karceski, Esq., on behalf of Two Farms, Inc., the legal owner of the subject property. The Special Exception Petition seeks relief per Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) to allow a fuel service station on an individual site and a convenience store having a sales area larger than 1,500 sq. ft., carry-out restaurant and roll-over car wash as uses in combination pursuant to B.C.Z.R. §§ 405.2.B.1, 405.4.E.1, 405.4.E.2 and 405.4.E.10. The Petition for Variance seeks relief under B.C.Z.R. § 419.4.B.1 to allow a car wash tunnel entrance to face an adjacent residentially zoned property. The subject property and requested relief are more fully described on the redlined site plan which was marked and accepted into evidence as Petitioner's Exhibit 1.

Appearing at the hearing in support of the Petitions were Jeff Bainbridge, Bill Monk, Mark Keeley, and Ken Schmid. David H. Karceski, Esq. and Justin Williams, Esq. represented the Petitioner. There were no Protestants or interested citizens in attendance and the file does not contain any letters of protest or opposition. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the B.C.Z.R.

Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were received and are made part of the record of this case. Substantive ZAC comments were received from the Department of Planning (DOP), Bureau of Development Plans Review (DPR) and State Highway Administration (SHA). None of the County agencies opposed the petition, and the plan was revised to comply with Mr. Kennedy's comments regarding the right of ways shown on the plan.

Testimony and evidence offered at the hearing revealed that the subject property is comprised of three (3) parcels totaling in the aggregate approximately 2.5 acres, and is zoned BL-AS. The site is improved with a restaurant and other structures used as offices. All improvements on site will be razed, and the Petitioner proposes to operate a Royal Farm Store at the location.

#### SPECIAL EXCEPTION

Under Maryland law, a special exception use enjoys a presumption that it is in the interest of the general welfare, and therefore, valid. Schultz v. Pritts, 291 Md. 1 (1981). The Schultz standard was revisited in People's Counsel v. Loyola College, 406 Md. 54 (2008), where the court emphasized that a special exception is properly denied only when there are facts and circumstances showing that the adverse impacts of the use at the particular location in question would be above and beyond those inherently associated with the special exception use. No such evidence was presented in this case. Mr. Monk testified, via proffer, that the proposal satisfies B.C.Z.R. § 502.1, and I concur.

# **VARIANCE**

To obtain variance relief requires a showing that:

- (1) The property is unique; and
- (2) If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or hardship.

Trinity Assembly of God v. People's Counsel, 407 Md. 53, 80 (2008).

Petitioner has met this test. As noted by Mr. Monk, the parcels are irregularly shaped, and the topography and points of ingress/egress dictate that the car wash facility (the orientation of which generates the need for variance relief) be located as shown on the plan. Exhibit 1. Thus, the property is unique.

If the B.C.Z.R. were strictly interpreted Petitioner would suffer a practical difficulty, in that it would be unable to construct the improvements shown on the plan. Finally, I find that the variance can be granted in harmony with the spirit and intent of the B.C.Z.R., and in such manner as to grant relief without injury to the public health, safety, and general welfare. This is demonstrated by the lack of County and/or community opposition.

Pursuant to the advertisement, posting of the property, and public hearing on these petitions, and after considering the testimony and evidence offered, I find that Petitioner's Special Exception and Variance requests should be granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED by the Administrative Law Judge for Baltimore County, this 17th day of December, 2013, that Petitioner's request for Special Exception relief under the B.C.Z.R. to allow a fuel service station on an individual site and a convenience store having a sales area larger than 1,500 sq. ft., carry-out restaurant and roll-over car wash as uses in combination pursuant to B.C.Z.R. §§ 405.2.B.1, 405.4.E.1, 405.4.E.2 and 405.4.E.10, be and is hereby GRANTED, and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Petitioner's request for Variance relief from B.C.Z.R. § 419.4.B.1 to allow a car wash tunnel entrance to face an adjacent residentially zoned property, be and is hereby GRANTED.

Thank you for the opportunity to review the Traffic Impact Study Report and Traffic Signal Warrant Study Report prepared by Traffic Concepts, Inc. dated July 2013 (received on August 5, 2013) that was prepared for the proposed Royal Farms Store in Baltimore County, Maryland. The Maryland State Highway Administration (SHA) review is complete and we are pleased to respond.

The review determined the major report findings and the SHA comments and conclusions as follows:

- Access to the 5,125 square foot Convenience Market with Gasoline Sales and a 1,407 square foot Car Wash is proposed from one (1) left-in/right-in/right-out access on MD 140 and one (1) full movement site access driveway on Delight Road. SHA will require acceleration/deceleration lanes at the proposed MD 140 site access point.
- The traffic report determined that the proposed development could be supported by the surrounding roadway network based upon the Critical Lane Volume analysis.
- A Traffic Signal Warrant Study was conducted at the MD 140 at Delight Road/Timber Grove Road intersection with the proposed development traffic. The results of the study revealed that the following traffic signal warrants would be satisfied:
  - Warrant 1B (Interruption of Continuous Traffic)
  - Warrant 1A/B (Combination Warrant)
  - Warrant 2 (Four Hour Vehicular Volume)

Based on the information provided, please address the following comments in a point-by-point response:

- A significant percentage of site generated traffic will traverse through the MD 140 at Dolfield Road and MD 140 at Franklin Boulevard intersections. Therefore, SHA recommends that these intersections be included in the Traffic Impact Study Report.
- 2) The study projected that 10% of the site generated traffic will utilize Timber Grove Road. Timber Grove Road is restricted beyond the Fuddruckers entrance, and therefore, no site generated traffic should be assumed from this roadway.
- 3) In order to determine the appropriateness of a traffic signal at the MD 140 at Delight Road/Timber Grove Road intersection, SHA will require the submission of Synchro/SimTraffic analysis along the MD 140 corridor. The MD 140 Synchro/SimTraffic corridor study area should extend from the MD 140 at Franklin Boulevard intersection to the north and to the MD 140 at Dolfield Boulevard intersection to the south. The analysis should also address the proximate Nicodemus Road at Delight Road intersection that is within 75 feet of MD 140 at Delight Road/Timber Grove Road under consideration for a traffic signal. The details of the signal timing plans along this section of MD 140 should be coordinated with the Office of Traffic and Safety.
- 4) The report proposes to utilize the center turn lane on MD 140 to access the proposed driveway on MD 140. The traffic report should include a queuing analysis along MD 140 to insure that operations at adjacent intersections are not detrimentally impacted.
- 5) Pedestrian and bicycle accommodations will be required along the property frontage on MD 140.

The SHA will require the submission of six (6) hard copies and one (1) electronic revised traffic impact study and point-by-point response. Please send this information to the SHA Access Management Division addressed to Mr. Steven D. Foster to the attention of Mr. Eric Waltman and reference the SHA Tracking Number on the submission. 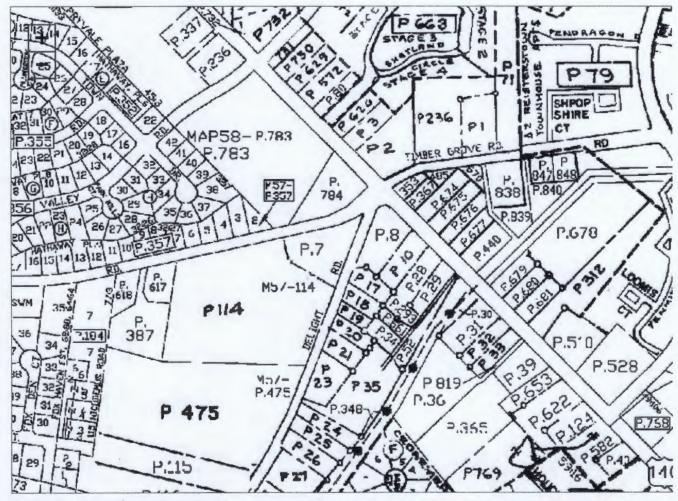

The individual holes blend with the sand hills and ponds of this environmental award winning reclamation project providing a truly unique golf experience unmatched in this region. The course, which will be open to the public, is designed to be challenging and playable for all skill levels. Emphasis is placed on strategic shot making skills rather than strength while the usage of multiple tees allows the course to play from over 6,700 yards to slightly less than 4,900 yards. The unique character of the course incorporates both grass bunkers and swales, waste bunkers, mounding, a system of ponds and streams and natural vegetation and grasses all of which reinforce the links style of golf course architecture. The natural setting for the course is further enhanced by broad vistas of Breton Bay from many locations on the course. A public driving range with lesson tee, practice putting and chipping greens, pro shop, and clubhouse will provide the necessary support facilities.

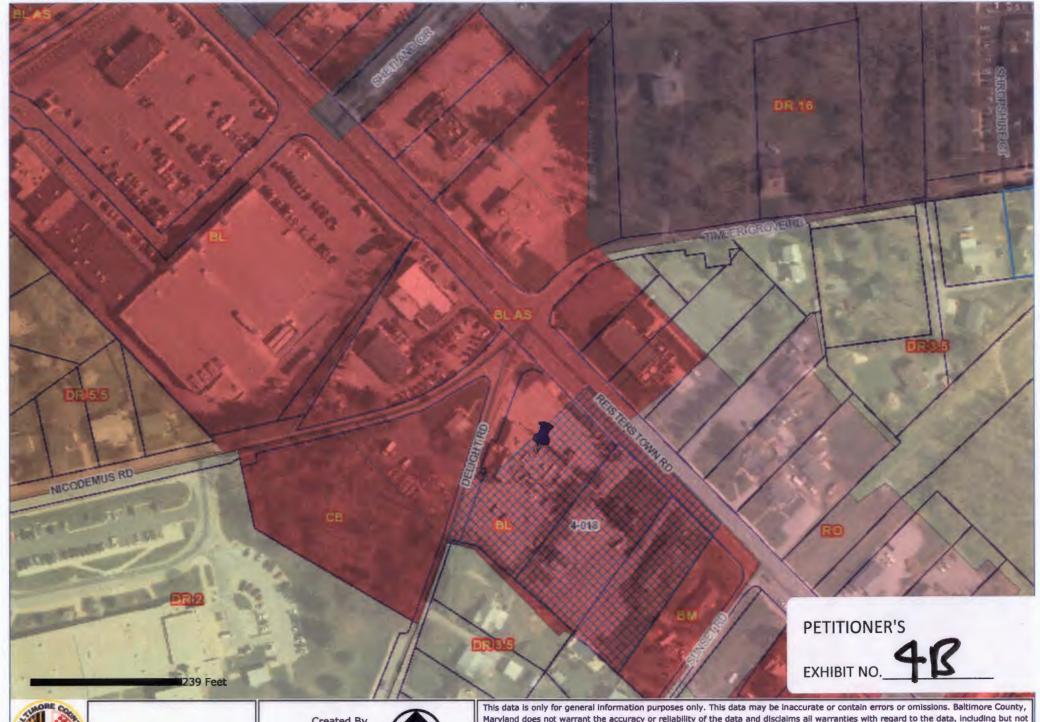

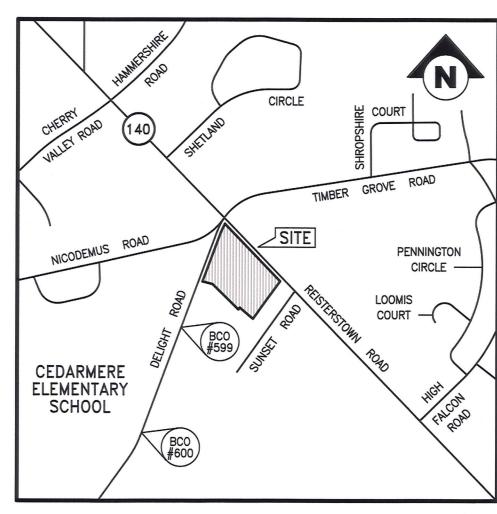

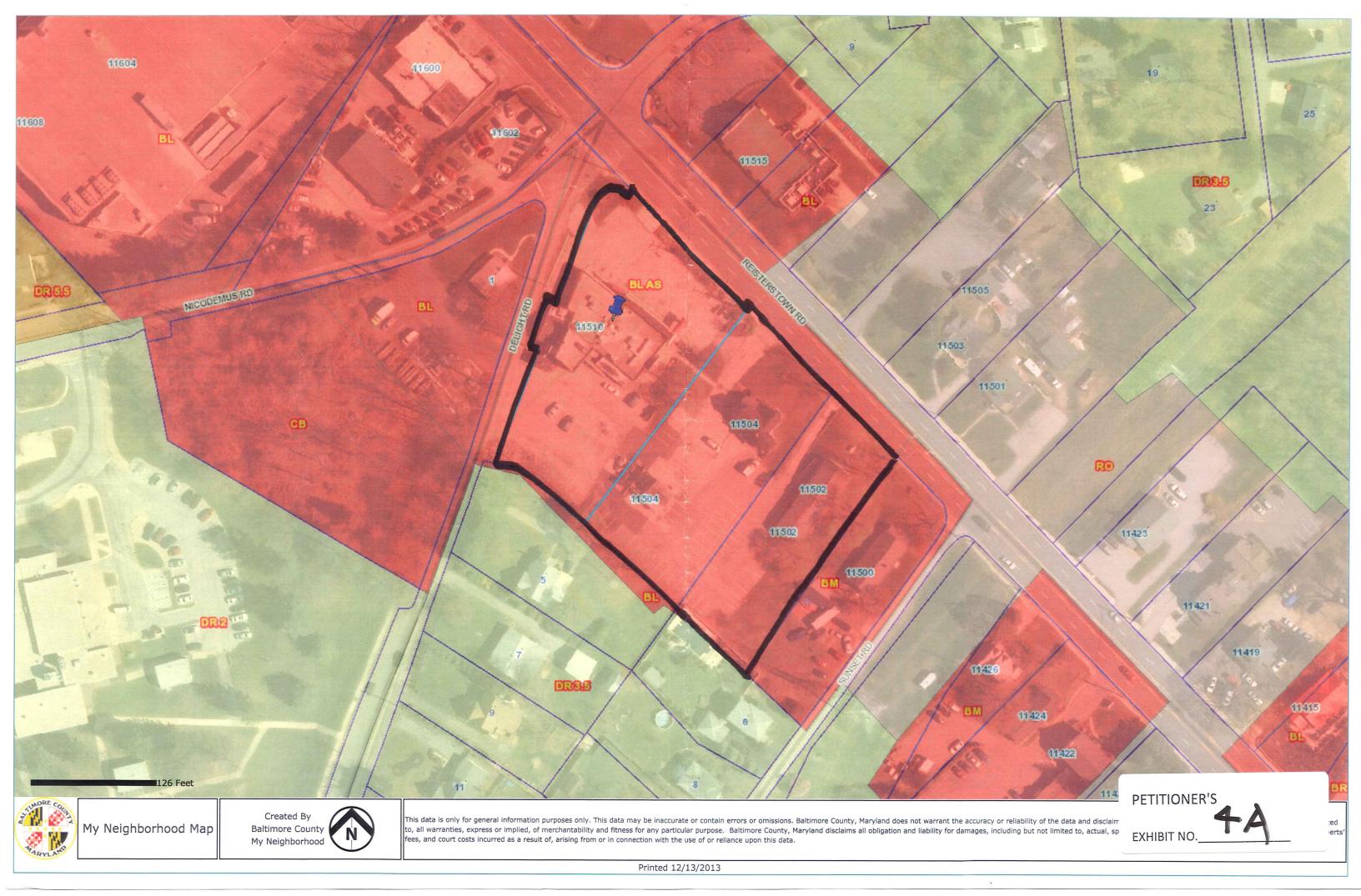
SCHEMATIC LANDSCAPE PLAN
