OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for consideration of a Petition for Variance filed by Caroline L. Hecker, Esquire, of Rosenberg, Martin, Greenberg, LLP, on behalf of McDonald's Corporation and Golden Arch Realty Corp. ("Petitioners"). The Variance was filed pursuant to Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R") as follows:

Off-Street Parking:

1. Section 409.6.A.2 to permit 58 parking spaces in lieu of the required 74 spaces.

Signage Regulations:

- 1. Section 405.4 Attachment 1, 5(a) (VI) to permit 6 wall-mounted enterprise signs on the building facades in lieu of the permitted 3 signs (Signs #3 and #4 on Plat to Accompany Zoning Petition).
- 2. Section 450.4 Attachment 1, 3(a) (VII) to permit a directional sign of 10.7 ft. in height in lieu of the permitted 6 ft. (Sign #1 on Plat to Accompany Zoning Petition).
- 3. Section 450.4 Attachment 1, 3(a) (VII) to permit two directional signs of 9.67 ft. in height in lieu of the permitted 6 ft. (Sign #2 on Plat to Accompany Zoning Petition).
- 4. Section 450.4 Attachment 1, 3(II) to permit a canopy-type directional sign in lieu of the permitted wall-mounted or freestanding signs (Sign #5 on Plat to Accompany Zoning Petition).

Appearing at the public hearing in support of the requests was Lee May, Christopher Mann and Iwona Zarska from Baltimore Land Design Group, Inc., the firm which prepared the site plan. Caroline Hecker, Esquire, and Eric Kunimoto, Esquire appeared as counsel and represented the Petitioners. The file reveals that the Petition was properly posted and advertised as required by the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations. There were no Protestants in attendance, and the file does not contain any letters of protest or opposition. In fact, the Wells-McComas community association submitted a letter of "unanimous support" for the project. Exhibit 10.

Substantive Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were received from State Highway Administration (SHA) dated November 15, 2013, Bureau of Development Plans Review (DPR) dated November 20, 2013, and the Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability (DEPS), dated January 17, 2014. The SHA noted an access permit will be required, while DPR will require a landscape plan. The DEPS indicated Petitioners must comply with the Critical Area regulations.

The subject property is approximately 1.398 acres and is zoned BR-AS and ML-IM. The Petitioners have operated a McDonald's restaurant at the premises for forty years. Petitioners proposes to raze the existing structure and construct in its place a modern facility, as shown in the elevation drawings marked as Exhibit 7. The zoning relief sought pertains to the sign package and off street parking, and counsel noted that similar requests have been granted for eighteen (18) other McDonald's locations in the County.

ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING

Date 131114 By 220 Based on the evidence presented, I find that the variance can be granted in such a manner as to meet the requirements of Section 307 of the B.C.Z.R., as established in *Cromwell v. Ward*, 102 Md. App. 691 (1995). As Ms. Zarska testified (via proffer), the property is irregularly shaped, and the site is also constrained by environmental features which dictate somewhat the available building envelope.

The Petitioners would experience a practical difficulty if relief were denied, given they would be unable to install the proposed signage, which is in place at 18 other McDonald's locations in the County.

Finally, I find that the variance can be granted in harmony with the spirit and intent of the B.C.Z.R., and in such manner as to grant relief without injury to the public health, safety, and general welfare. This is demonstrated by the lack of County and/or community opposition.

Pursuant to the posting of the property, public hearing, and after considering the testimony and evidence offered, I find that Petitioners' Variance request should be granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED this <u>27th</u> day of January, 2014, by the Administrative Law Judge that the Petition for Variance filed pursuant to B.C.Z.R. as follows:

Off-Street Parking:

1. Section 409.6.A.2 to permit 58 parking spaces in lieu of the required 74 spaces.

Signage Regulations:

- 1. Section 405.4 Attachment 1, 5(a) (VI) to permit 6 wall-mounted enterprise signs on the building facades in lieu of the permitted 3 signs (Signs #3 and #4 on Plat to Accompany Zoning Petition).

Petitioners may apply for appropriate permits and be granted same upon receipt of this Order; however, Petitioners are hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at their own risk until such time as the 30-day appellate process from this Order has expired. If, for whatever reason, this Order is reversed, Petitioners would be required to return, and be responsible for returning, said property to its original condition.
- 2. Petitioners must comply with the ZAC comments of the SHA (dated 11-15-2013), DPR (dated 11-20-2013) and DEPS (dated 1-17-2014).

Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The Petitioner herein requests a variance to permit 53 parking spaces in lieu of the required 88 spaces, a front setback of 32 feet in lieu of the required 50 feet, and a side setback of 24 feet in lieu of the required 30 feet, as more particularly described in Petitioner's Exhibit 1.

The Petitioner, by Peter Freitag, Construction Manager for McDonalds Corporation; and, R. Rodman Mann, President, and Clarence L. Combs. Operation Manager, with G & M Foods Corporation, Lessee of the subject property, appeared, testified and were represented by Robert W. Cannon, Esquire. Mr. Mann testified that one of the reasons for the proposed dining room addition is to provide a greater distinction between the smoking and non-



smoking sections and to provide additional space for upgrading the existing restroom facilities.

Testimony presented by the witnesses indicated that the operation at this site has a substantially high number of walk-in and drive-thru customers. Mr. Combs testified that as a result of studies performed by McDonalds, it appears that approximately 53% to 55% of their business is drive-thru. With the addition of the second drive-thru window, it is expected that their business will increase by 6% to 8%. Studies indicate that the walk-in business at this location is 5% to 2%. Both Mr. Combs and Mr. Mann are at the site on a regular basis at various hours of the day. They testified that currently during peak hours of the day, generally not more than 30 of the 53 parking spaces provided are used. The additional dining room area will increase the seating capacity by about 35%. As a result of the additional seating, it is expected that the eat-in business will increase by 5% to 8%, which the current number of parking spaces could easily accommodate. Testimony indicated that the peak hours of operation are during the lunch period between the hours of 11:45 AM to Mr. Mann testified that to require strict compliance with the zoning regulations would result in practical difficulty and unreasonable hardship upon the Petitioner. The Petitioner contends that the requested variance will not be detrimental to the health, safety, and general welfare of the public.

The Petitioner seeks relief from Sections 409.6A2 (formerly 409.2(b)(3)) and 238.1, pursuant to Section 307 of the B.C.Z.R. The subject parking regulations were amended by Baltimore County Council Bill No. 26-88 effective May 26, 1988. While the requirements in this case were not modified, the controlling provision has changed.

An area variance may be granted where strict application of the zoning regulations would cause practical difficulty to the Petitioner and his property. McLean v. Soley, 270 Md. 208 (1973). To prove practical difficulty for an area variance, the Petitioner must meet the following:

- whether strict compliance with requirement would unreasonably prevent the use of the property for a permitted purpose or render conformance unnecessarily burdensome;
- 2) whether the grant would do substantial injustice to applicant as well as other property owners in the district or whether a lesser relaxation than that applied for would give substantial relief; and
- 3) whether relief can be granted in such fashion that the spirit of the ordinance will be observed and public safety and welfare secured.

Anderson v. Bd. of Appeals, Town of Chesapeake Beach, 22 Md. App. 28 (1974).

It is clear from the testimony that if the variance is granted, such use as proposed would not be contrary to the spirit of the B.C.Z.R. and would not result in substantial detriment to the public health, safety, and general welfare.

Pursuant to the advertisement, posting of the property, and public hearing on this Petition held, and for the reasons given above, the variance requested should be granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED by the Deputy Zoning Commissioner for Baltimore County this day of August, 1988 that the Petition for Zoning Variance to permit 53 parking spaces in lieu of the required 88 spaces, a front setback of 32 feet in lieu of the required 50 feet, and a side setback of 24 feet in lieu of the required 30 feet, as more particularly described in Petitioner's Exhibit 1, be and is hereby GRANTED, subject, however, to the following restrictions:

- 1) The Petitioner may apply for his building permit and be granted same upon receipt of this Order; however, Petitioner is hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at his own risk until such time as the 30-day appellate process from this Order has expired. If, for whatever reason, this Order is reversed, the Petitioner would be required to return, and be responsible for returning, said property to its original condition.
- 2) The Petitioner shall comply with the Zoning Plans Advisory Committee comments of the Department of Traific Engineering as set forth in their letter dated May 19, 1988, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

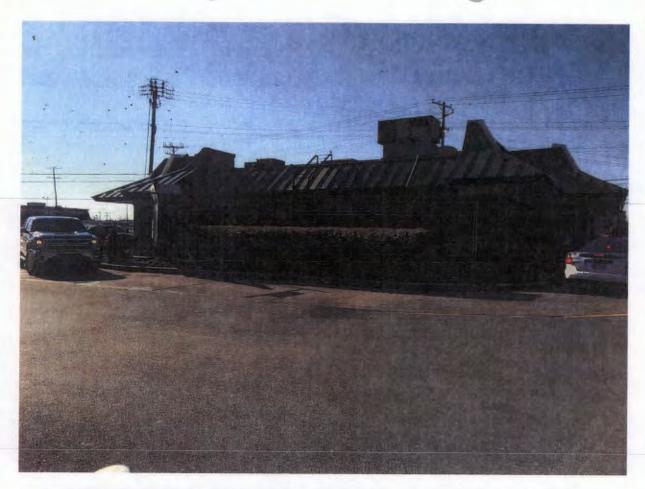










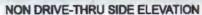

Traffic Concepts, Inc. is pleased to provide a parking survey for the McDonald's store located at 3950 & 3954 North Point Blvd. The purpose of the study is to determine the existing occupancy for this McDonald's store during the peak operating hours.

In order to complete the parking survey, we first identified the peak hours of operation for a fast food restaurant. The peak demand periods were determined with data contained in the <u>Institute of Transportation Engineers</u>; <u>Parking Generation</u>, 3rd <u>Edition</u>.

The survey dates and the peak hours of operation are described below:

The peak hour parking demand was determined by using the proposed number of parking spaces that is fifty-eight (58) and with a count of the actual occupied spaces in fifteen minute time intervals during the peak periods. The table on the following page shows the existing parking count and occupancy rates during the peak fifteen minute time period. The complete parking occupancy tables are included as an attachment.

The 3950 & 3954 North Point Blvd. McDonald's redevelopment and improvement plan will create 58 total on-site parking spaces. Using the existing parking occupancy counts with the 58 proposed parking spaces, the peak parking occupancy rate would be 69 percent. Generally, the parking supply is considered full when 90 percent of the spaces are occupied.

We believe that the parking reduction, which creates 58 on-site spaces, would continue to provide an effective parking supply where demand does not exceed 68 percent. Therefore, we conclude the site with the stated parking reduction is adequate.

Through affiliated entities, McDonald's controls 3954 North Point Blvd. (owned by Golden Arch Realty Corp.), which is situated on the corner of North Point Blvd. and Old Battle Grove Rd., and 3950 North Point Blvd. (owned by Mann Holding Company, LLC), which is the adjacent lot along North Point Blvd.

What is at this location currently?

There is an existing McDonald's restaurant at 3954 North Point Blvd.

3950 North Point Blvd. is improved with a surface parking lot used for McDonald's customer parking.

Describe the history of this McDonald's.

This McDonald's has been operating at this location since 1974 (40 years).

In 1986, the McDonald's constructed the single-lane drive-thru facility and related signs, which required a parking, signage, and setbacks variances.

Demolish the existing restaurant and rebuild a new McDonald's restaurant in its place.

The restaurant will be re-oriented so that the front of the restaurant faces west instead of south.

The parking lot located at 3950 North Point Blvd. will be connected to the parking lot on 3954 North Point Blvd., thereby creating one contiguous parking lot serving the McDonald's. As a result, McDonald's will be able to offer more convenient parking for customers.

The existing egress that is closest to the intersection of North Point Blvd. and Old Battle Grove Rd. will be replaced by a dedicated ingress to better prevent traffic congestion. Also, the other entrance to the parking lot on North Point Blvd. will have an island splitting the incoming and outgoing traffic to create better traffic flow. Similarly, the entrance closest to the intersection along Old Battle Grove Rd. will be removed to prevent traffic congestion. McDonald's will also landscape the site in compliance with the County's standards.

The rebuilt restaurant will also have a dual drive-thru to provide faster and more efficient service.

Why are you proposing these features?

The existing structure is 40 years old and is operationally inadequate. The proposed new restaurant will be a much more efficient building, both operationally and in terms of energy usage.

Landscaping will provide a more appealing setting and the changes to parking will lessen congestion and create better traffic flow.

The dual lane drive-thru feature also allows faster ordering and pick-up.

Finally, the "green building" items in our design will make the new building much more energy efficient than the existing one.

What is the square footage of the existing restaurant? 4,521 SF

What is the square footage of the new restaurant? 4,570 SF

How many seats are there in the existing restaurant? 90+/-

How many seats will there be in the proposed restaurant? 87

Explain the parking variance requested:

This project will reduce the number of parking spaces from 90 to 58. The Zoning Regulations require 74 spaces, so we are requesting a parking variance.

Note that the two prior zoning cases approved parking variances to permit 53 spaces for the McDonald's.

Why is McDonald's proposing a reduction in the number of parking spaces?

The reduction in parking spaces is a result of several factors. First, because the parking lots will be connected to form one contiguous parking area for more efficient parking, the parking spaces that border the line dividing the two existing parking lots will be lost. Also, expanding the drive-thru to two lanes, which McDonald's has done to meet today's demands on fast-food restaurants, has resulted in fewer parking spaces. Landscaping standards have also compelled McDonald's to dedicate areas for screening and green spaces.

The irregular shapes of these two lots make it difficult to retain a greater number of parking spaces. Old Battle Grove Road curves around the corner lot, making it difficult to maximize the area for parking. The second lot along North Point Blvd. is triangular and becomes narrower, truncating areas that could be used to increase the number of parking spaces.

Explain the sign package:

EXHIBIT – SIGNAGE PACKAGE

What is proposed?

In accordance with McDonald's new signage package, we are proposing the following signs for the new McDonald's restaurant:

- <u>6 wall-mounted enterprise signs</u>: 2 signs on the front of the building; 1 sign on the drive-thru side of the building; 2 signs on the non-drive-thru side of the building; and 1 sign on the rear of the building.
- <u>2 "canopy"-style directional signs</u> on the front and non-drive-thru sides of the building. These signs, one on each side, will have the word "Welcome" above the face of the canopy, rather than printed directly on the face of the canopy.
- 2 free-standing order boards, which are 6.75 ft. high in lieu of the permitted 6 ft., as well as 2 projecting directional signs (the "Pay Here" and "Pick Up Here" signs) in lieu of the permitted wall-mounted or free-standing directional signs.

Directional signs over each of the drive-thru lanes which, because they are intended to go over the drive-thru lanes, are higher than what would otherwise be permitted (the "Drive-Thru" and "Order Here" signs).

The existing free-standing enterprise sign along North Point Blvd. will remain. The face of the sign has an area of 83 SF and complies with Zoning Regulations.

Why are these signs proposed?

This is McDonald's standard signage plan for new restaurants, and will bring this restaurant up-to-date and into conformity with other new McDonald's restaurants. To date, 18 other McDonald's restaurants in Baltimore County have implemented this signage package.

What is the amount of capital investment for this project?

Approximately \$2.6 million, all privately funded.

If the petitions are approved, what is the plan for implementation?

If the petitions are approved, we will apply for permits and begin demolition as soon as possible. We expect to begin construction in July, which should take approximately four months to complete. We hope to open in October 2014.

Are the subject properties peculiar, unusual, or unique when compared to other properties in the neighborhood?

Yes. 3954 North Point Blvd. is improved with an existing structure, which McDonald's proposes to demolish and replace with a new restaurant in the same location as the existing one. However, the small size and irregular shape of the lot impose certain constraints on the proposed new construction. The lot located at 3950 North Point Blvd. is also irregular in shape. Taken together, the two properties create a unique and irregularly shaped parcel.

Since you have indicated that the properties are peculiar, unusual, or unique, would strict compliance with the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations result in a practical difficulty or unreasonable hardship to the Petitioner?

Yes.

<u>Parking</u>: The Zoning Regulations would require 74 parking spaces; however, the dimensions of the property, together with the landscaping standards, only permit 58 off-street parking spaces. Without the parking variance, McDonald's would not be able to reconstruct the restaurant on this property.

Also, because the site is surrounded by a grove of large trees, there is not any other place for customers to park if they cannot find a spot on site. As a result, McDonald's must provide enough parking to meet customer demand.

Signs:

- The Zoning Regulations permit 3 enterprise signs on the building facades; McDonald's, however, is proposing 6 enterprise signs on the building facades.
- The Zoning Regulations permit wall-mounted or free-standing directional signs; McDonald's, however, proposes a "canopy"-type directional sign and projected directional signs.
- The Zoning Regulations permit a sign to be erected on the face of a canopy; McDonald's, however, proposes to erect a sign above the face of the canopy.
- The Zoning Regulations permit a maximum height of 6 feet for directional signs; McDonald's, however, proposes to erect directional signs with heights of 9.67 feet and 10.7 feet.

The strict application of the Zoning Regulations would create practical difficulties for McDonald's, as this restaurant would deviate from the standard style of other McDonald's restaurants if the proposed signs were not permitted.

Also, visibility of the restaurant is also obstructed by large trees surrounding the properties, and without adequate and proper signage, the McDonald's would not be easily identifiable, creating a practical difficulty.

The lack of visibility caused by the trees is exacerbated by the configuration of North Point Blvd., a four-lane thoroughfare separated by a grass median. McDonald's would face a practical difficulty identifying the restaurant to motorists driving southbound on North Point Blvd. without adequate signage.

Would the granting of the variance be injurious to the use and enjoyment of the other property owners in the immediate vicinity, or substantially diminish and impair property values in the neighborhood?

The granting of the variance will likely improve property values in the neighborhood, as the new restaurant will be more modern and attractive than the existing one. As the requested variances will permit McDonald's to rebuild a new restaurant in the same location as the existing one, there will be no greater impact on the use and enjoyment of the neighboring properties than that created by the existing restaurant.

Would the granting of the variances impair an adequate supply of light and air to adjacent property, overcrowd the land, create an undue concentration of population, substantially increase the congestion of the streets, create hazardous

traffic conditions, increase the danger of fire, or otherwise endanger the public safety?

The granting of the variances will not impair the supply of light and air to the adjacent properties any more than the existing restaurant does, nor will these variances cause an overcrowding of the land. Similarly, the granting of the variances will have no affect on the concentration of population, congestion of the streets, traffic conditions, or the danger of fire, nor will they endanger the public safety in any manner.

In fact, McDonald's is proposing to change the exit closest to the intersection of North Point Blvd. and Old Battle Grove Rd. to an entrance only, which will improve traffic conditions. Also, McDonald's will install an island at the entrance/exit located at the 3950 North Point Blvd. lot to separate ingress and egress traffic to better direct traffic in and out of the parking lot.

The proposed signs will help direct vehicular and foot traffic safely in and around the site.

Would the granting of the variances adversely affect transportation or unduly burden water, sewers, school, park, or other public facilities?

The granting of the variances will not have any impact on transportation, nor will they burden water, sewers, school, park, or other public facilities.

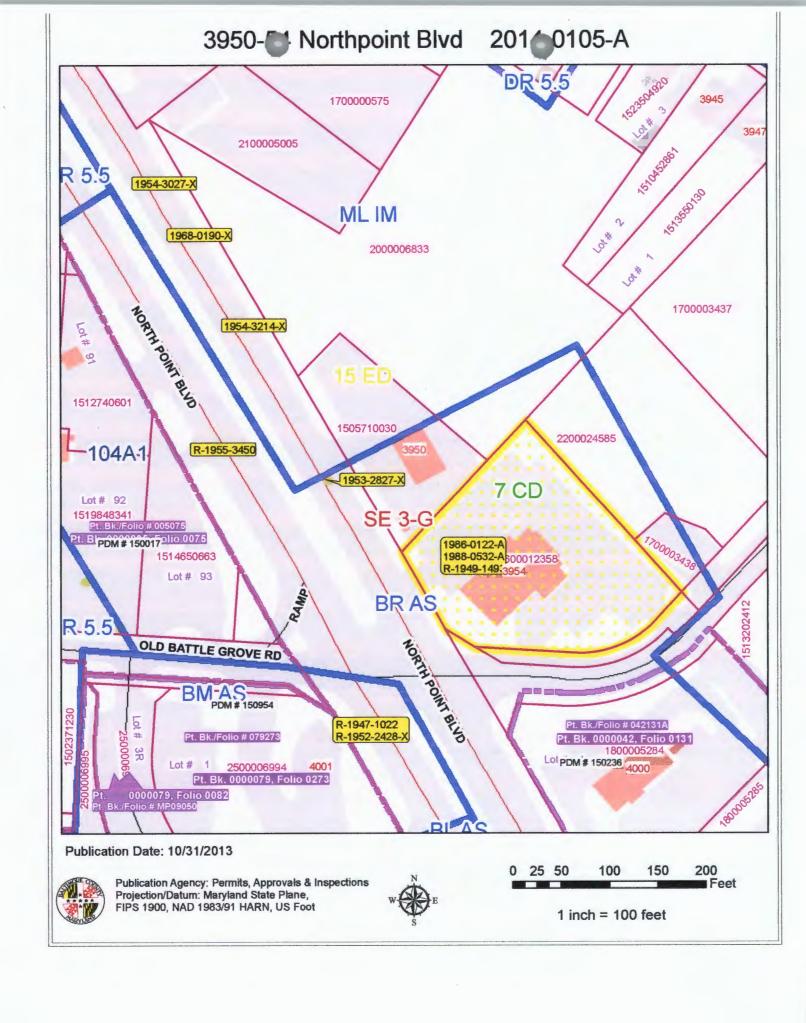
Would the granting of the variances be in strict harmony with the spirit and intent of the BCZR?

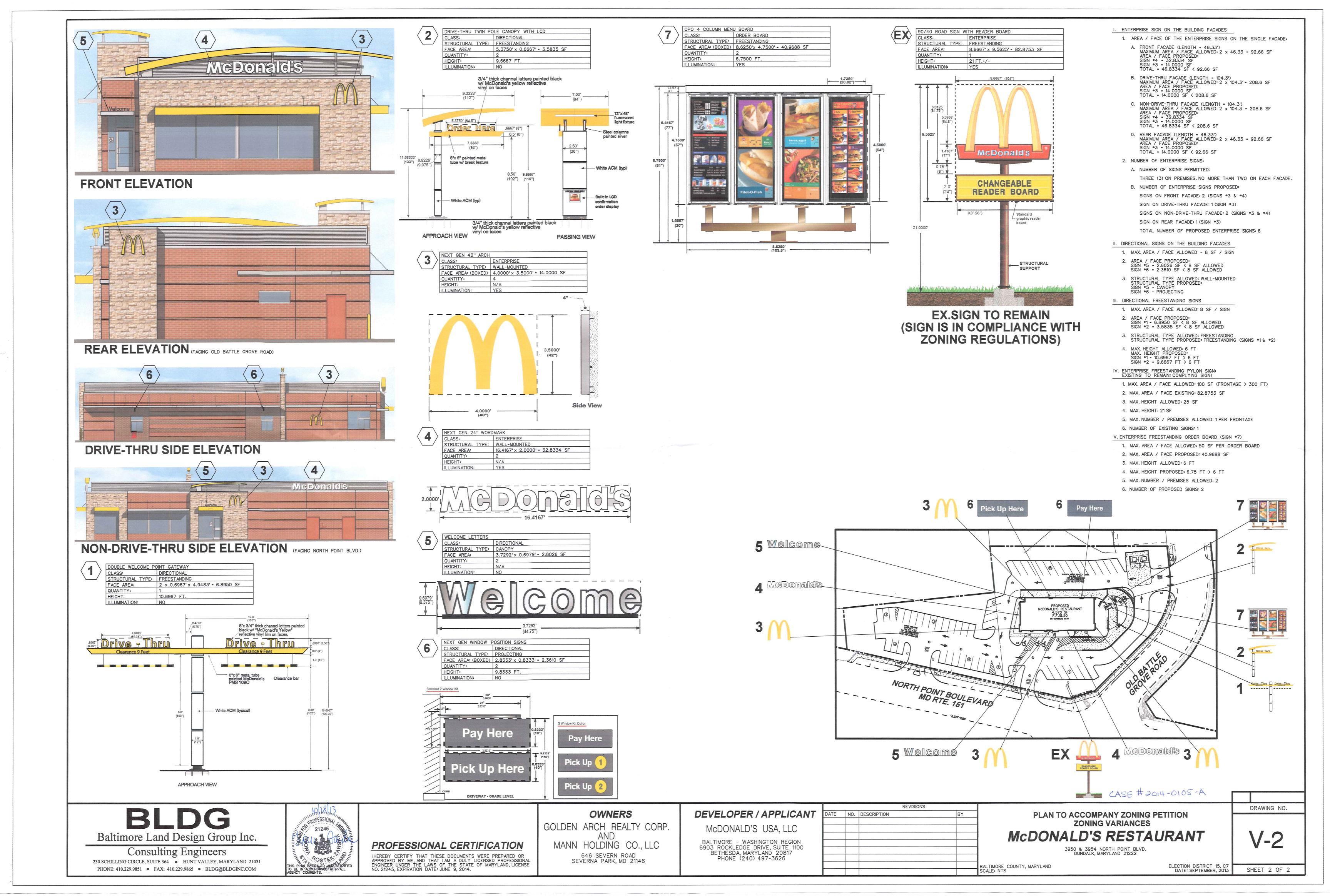
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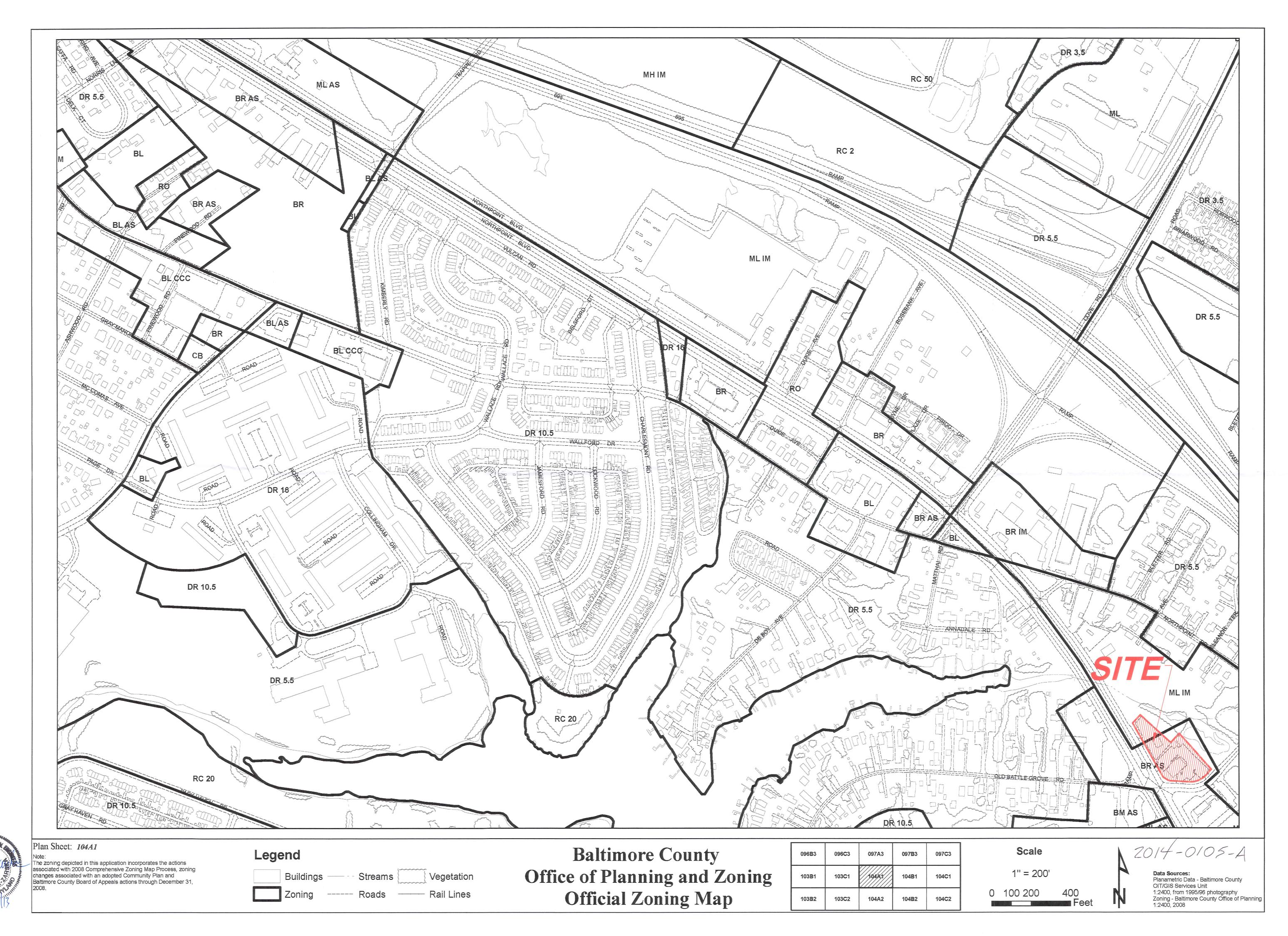


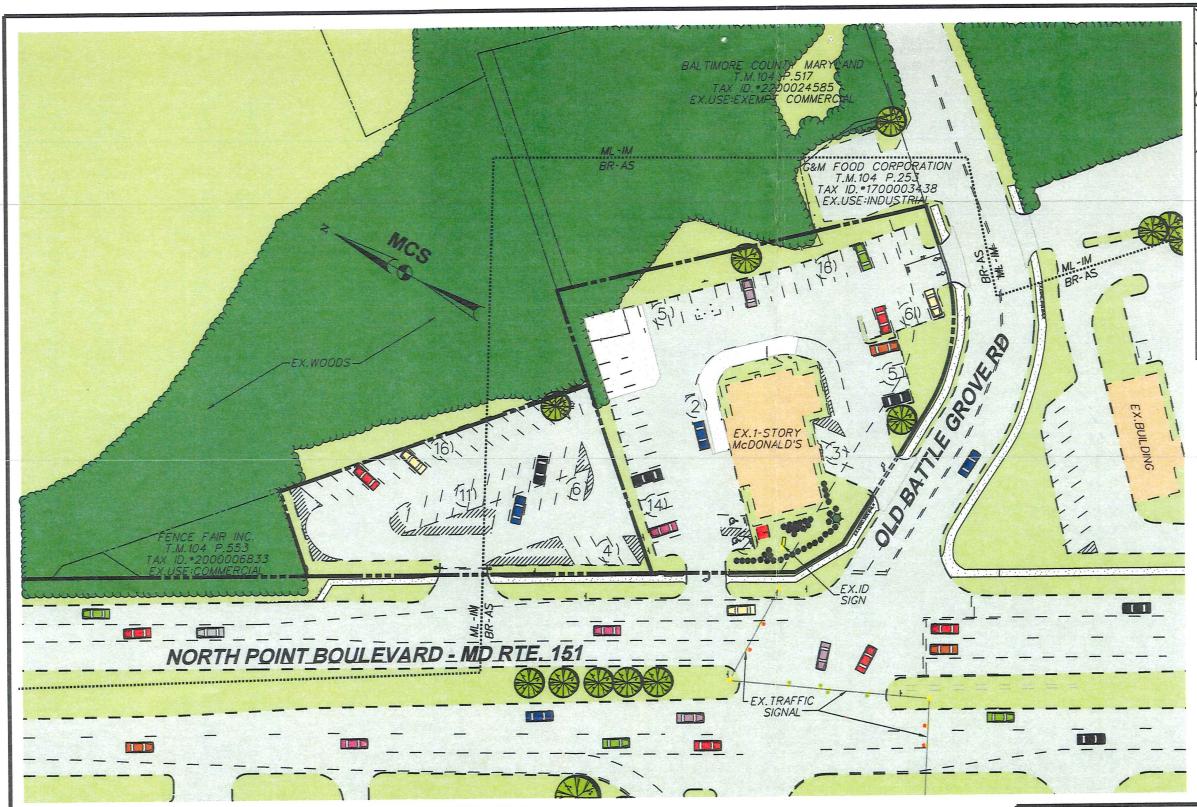
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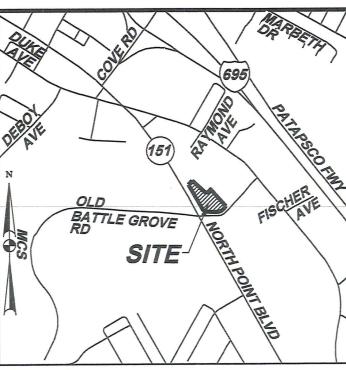












VICINITY MAP

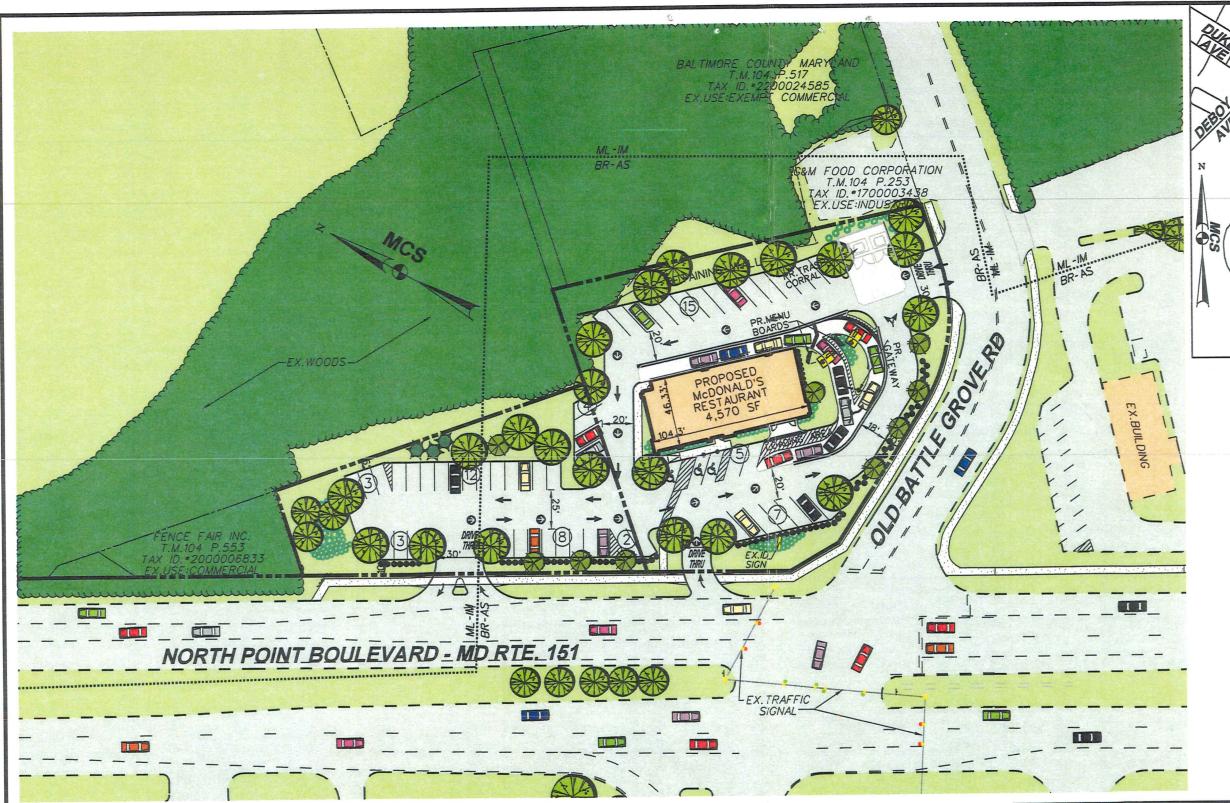

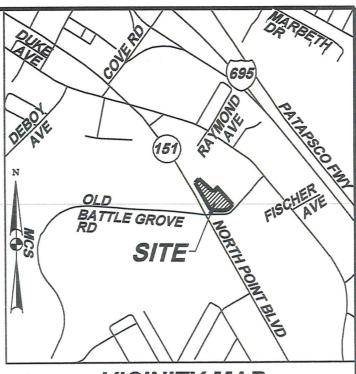

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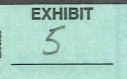
