Dear Ms. Malone:

I am in receipt of your July 25, 2025 letter to the Zoning Review Office, in which you request written spirit and intent confirmation for the Blakehurst Retirement Community, 1055 West Joppa Road. Based on the information provided with your letter and a review of the available zoning records, the following has been determined:

Use of the property for purposes of the continuing care facility is governed by the zoning relief granted in Case # 1989-1989-XA. In that case, a special exception and other zoning relief was granted under former BCZR Section 432. That relief was amended in Case # 2015-0126-SPH. The facility is currently approved for 280 independent living units and 79 health center (assisted living and nursing home) related beds with a maximum of 457 total residents permitted to occupy the Blakehurst property.

As was explained in your letter, the health center portion of Blakehurst is licensed for 35 assisted living beds and 44 nursing home beds (for a total of 79 beds) and all of these 79 beds are currently located in single-occupancy rooms. Your letter also explained that Blakehurst is seeking to increase the total number of beds in the health center portion by an additional 7 beds, resulting in a new total of 86 beds in the health center portion of Blakehurst (37 assisted living beds and 49 nursing home beds).

Your letter also stated that Blakehurst is not requesting an increase in the total number of residents beyond the maximum 457 residents. Your letter also stated that there would be no additional construction or physical changes made to the property or facility and stated that the facility has more than enough parking spaces to accommodate the extra beds per the required calculation in Section 409, BCZR.

As proposed, the requested increase in the number of beds within the health center by 7 beds would be considered as being in the Spirit and Intent of the BCZR and the prior granted zoning relief. However, the Blakehurst Retirement Community will be required to Administratively update the plan notes and calculations in a Second Amended Final Development Plan (1st Amended FDP is the latest on file) to reflect the relevant changes, and that updated Second Amended Final Development Plan must include a verbatim copy of this response letter on the plan. In addition, a copy of your request letter, this response and the Amended FDP will be made a permanent part of the two zoning case files referenced above.

This letter is strictly limited to the application of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations and Baltimore County Code and as applied to the inquiries presented in your letter, and does not represent confirmation for any other Local or State regulations that may apply to this property.

Dear Mr. Perlow:

I am writing on behalf of Chestnut Real Estate Partnership ("Chestnut"). Chestnut owns property located at 1055 West Joppa Road ("the Property"), which is home to Blakehurst Life Care Community ("Blakehurst"). Blakehurst is a continuing care (life care) facility that offers independent living, assisted living, and nursing care.

Use of the Property for purposes of the continuing care facility is governed by relief granted in Case No. 89-89-XA (special exception granted under former Baltimore County Zoning Regulation ("BCZR") Section 432). As reflected in the Consent Order issued by the Board of Appeals in 1988, the Board approved the "use of the property...for a continuing care facility having a density as agreed upon by the parties in the Restrictive Covenant Agreement." (The Consent Order incorporated a Restrictive Covenant Agreement, amended eight times between 1989 and 2014, which has since expired.)

Through execution of the Eight Addendum to Restrictive Covenant Agreement and relief granted in Case No. 2015-126-SPH (amending the prior zoning relief), the facility is currently approved for 280 independent living units and 79 health center beds (assisted living and nursing beds) with a maximum of 457 residents.

Within the Health Center, Blakehurst is currently licensed for 35 assisted living beds and 44 nursing home beds with one bed in each room (all single occupancy). Occasionally, Blakehurst has a resident in need of assisted living or nursing home level of care, but all existing Health Center rooms are full. In this situation, even if the resident would prefer to receive care at Blakehurst in a shared room, Blakehurst has had to arrange for services at another assisted living facility or nursing home. Blakehurst also occasionally has a couple who wants to occupy the same room but is not able to do so.

To reduce the need for outside placement (and to allow for the occasional couple to room together), Blakehurst is seeking to increase the total number of beds by an additional 7 beds for a total of 86 beds. Blakehurst has identified 2 assisted living rooms and 5 nursing home rooms that would meet the licensing requirements for double occupancy rooms. As proposed, these rooms would continue to be set up and used as single rooms until there is a need to use the room as a double occupancy room at which point a second bed would be brought in with the consent of both residents.

Blakehurst is not requesting an increase in the total number of residents beyond the maximum approved 457 residents. There would be no additional construction or physical changes made to the property or facility, and the facility currently has more than enough extra parking spaces to accommodate the extra beds per the required calculation in the BCZR. This request would have no impact on residents of the facility or the surrounding community.

Even though the Restrictive Covenant Agreement has expired, the facility continues to be governed by former Section 432 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations, which requires consultation with the Advisory Board established in accordance with Section 432.3.F. Blakehurst has shared this proposal with the Advisory Board. As indicated in the attached letter from William Meyers, the Advisory Board supports the proposal.

At this time, I am writing to seek written confirmation from you that the proposed increase in the number of beds within the Health Center is within the spirit and intent of the prior granted zoning relief and would not require any additional zoning relief. Based on our conversation, I understand that Blakehurst will be required to administratively update the zoning Final Development Plan to reflect this change.

Dear Patsy: I am writing as the attorney for the Section 432.3.F Advisory Board (established in conjunction with Zoning Case No. 1989-89-XA and CRG #8814IX-522) ("the Board"). The Board – and the immediate neighbors to Blakehurst – have reviewed your proposal as described below. In addition, Herb O'Conor and I toured the facility on July 10 and saw first-hand what you plan to do. After consultation, I can confirm that both the Board and the immediate neighbors support your proposal.

As you have explained, Blakehurst is currently licensed for 35 assisted living beds and 44 nursing home beds with one bed in each room (all single occupancy). Blakehurst is seeking the ability to have 37 assisted living beds and 49 nursing home beds.

This increase in the number of residents would be accomplished by allowing 7 rooms (2 assisted living beds and 5 nursing beds) to have two beds (double occupancy). The selected rooms meet the licensing requirements for double occupancy rooms.

As proposed, these rooms would continue to be set up and used as single rooms until there is a need to use the room as a double occupancy room at which point a second bed would be brought in with the consent of both residents. No additional construction or physical changes would be made to the property or facility to accommodate this change.

We understand that some amount of review of your proposal may be required by Baltimore County. In connection with any such process, you may use this letter as proof of support from the Board and the immediate neighbors for the proposal.

If it is necessary or helpful for me to attend any meetings with Baltimore County in order to confirm our support, please let me know. We appreciate the continued good relations with Blakehurst. Thank you

OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for consideration of a Petition for Special Hearing filed on behalf of the Chestnut Real Estate Partnership ("Petitioner"), which owns and operates the Blakehurst Life Care Community facility at 1055 W. Joppa Road, Towson, Maryland, 21204. The Special Hearing was filed pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R.") and Development Management Policy Manual Policy No. 1.e, and seeks the following relief:

- To amend the prior approved special exception and related zoning plan in Case No. 89-89-XA; and to amend the most recently approved Final Development Plan (FDP); and
- To approve a "material amendment" to the most recently approved Amended CRG Plan.

Appearing at the public hearing in support of the requests were Robert Perry, Roberta McMenomin, Glen Tipton, Curt Wagner, J. Ross Nichols, and Michael Pieranunizi, with Century Engineering, the firm that prepared the plan. Patricia A. Malone, Esquire, with Venable, LLP, appeared and represented the Petitioner. Several members of the community were in attendance at the hearing to obtain additional information concerning the project. The Petition was advertised

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and posted as required by the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations. There were no substantive Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments received from any of the County reviewing agencies.

The Blakehurst Life Care Community was first approved by Baltimore County on September 8, 1988. Since that time, there have been various additions and improvements to the facility, and the site plans have been amended on several occasions in the ensuing years.

In this case, Blakehurst does not actually seek any substantive zoning relief. In other words, the Petitioner is not seeking a variance or special exception, as is usually the case in a zoning hearing. Instead, the relief sought in the present case is in the nature of a "housekeeping" measure. That is, Blakehurst merely seeks to amend the special exception and zoning plan approved in 1989 in Case No. 89-89-XA, and to amend the most recently approved Final Development Plan (FDP).

In terms of substantive relief, Blakehurst filed simultaneously with this zoning petition a request to amend the County Review Group (CRG) Plan for the retirement community, which would involve the construction of a building addition to provide (among other things) an additional eight (8) patient beds for memory care treatment. That request was approved by separate Order in PAI Case No. 09-0522.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED this <u>29th</u> day of April, 2015, by this Administrative Law Judge, that the Petition for Special Hearing pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R) seeking the following relief:

 To amend the prior approved special exception and related zoning plan in Case No. 89-89-XA, in accordance with the terms of the Order and 6th Amended CRG Plan approved in PAI Case NO. 09-0522, dated April 29,

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 To amend the most recently approved Final Development Plan (FDP), in accordance with the terms of the Order and 6th Amended CRG Plan approved in PAI Case No. 09-0522, dated April 29, 2015,

be and is hereby GRANTED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Petition for Special Hearing pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R), to approve a "material amendment" to the most recently approved Amended CRG Plan, be and is hereby DISMISSED WITHOUT PREJUDICE. The 6th Amended CRG Plan for the Blakehurst Life Care Community was approved by separate Order in PAI Case No. 09-0522, dated April 29, 2015.

The relief granted herein shall be subject to the following:

- Petitioner may apply for necessary permits and/or licenses upon receipt
 of this Order. However, Petitioner is hereby made aware that
 proceeding at this time is at its own risk until 30 days from the date
 hereof, during which time an appeal can be filed by any party. If for
 whatever reason this Order is reversed, Petitioner would be required to
 return the subject property to its original condition.
- 2. Petitioner must provide notice to both the West Towson Community Association and those community members in attendance at the hearing (a list of the citizens' names and addresses will be provided to Petitioner's counsel) in the same fashion and at the same time as the notice provided to those parties identified in the Eighth Addendum to Restrictive Covenant Agreement, Petitioner's Exhibit 3, at pp. 2-3.

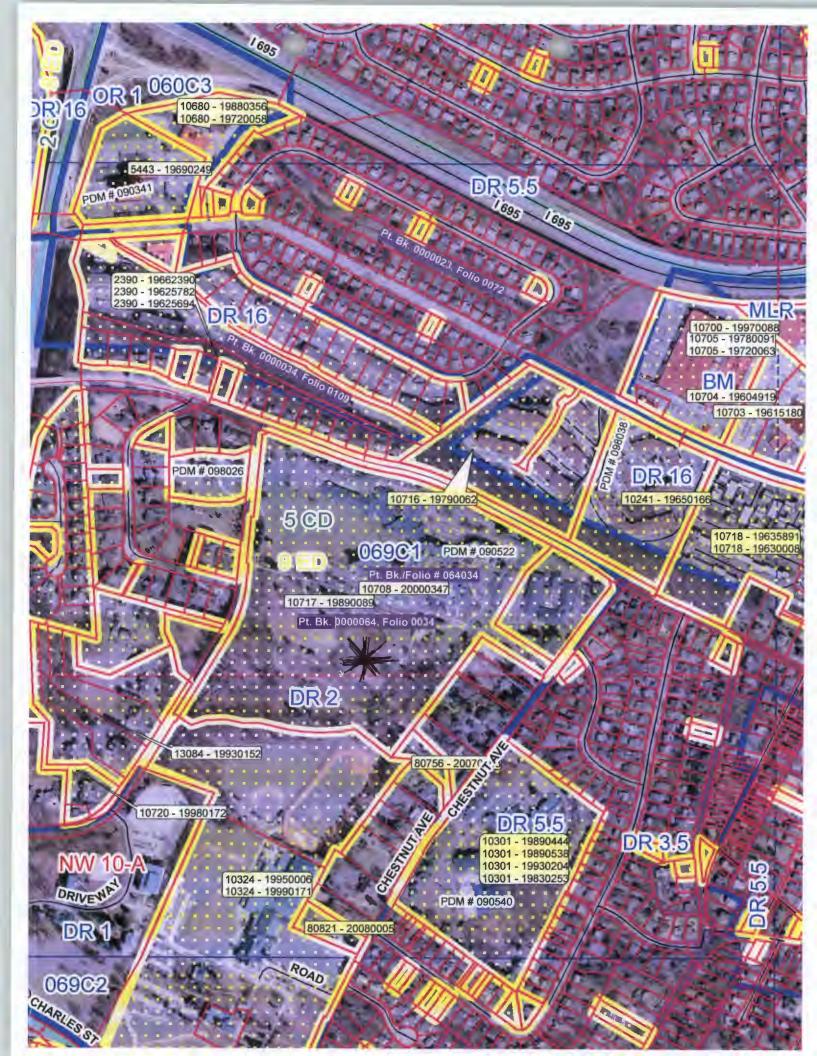

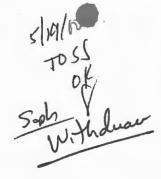

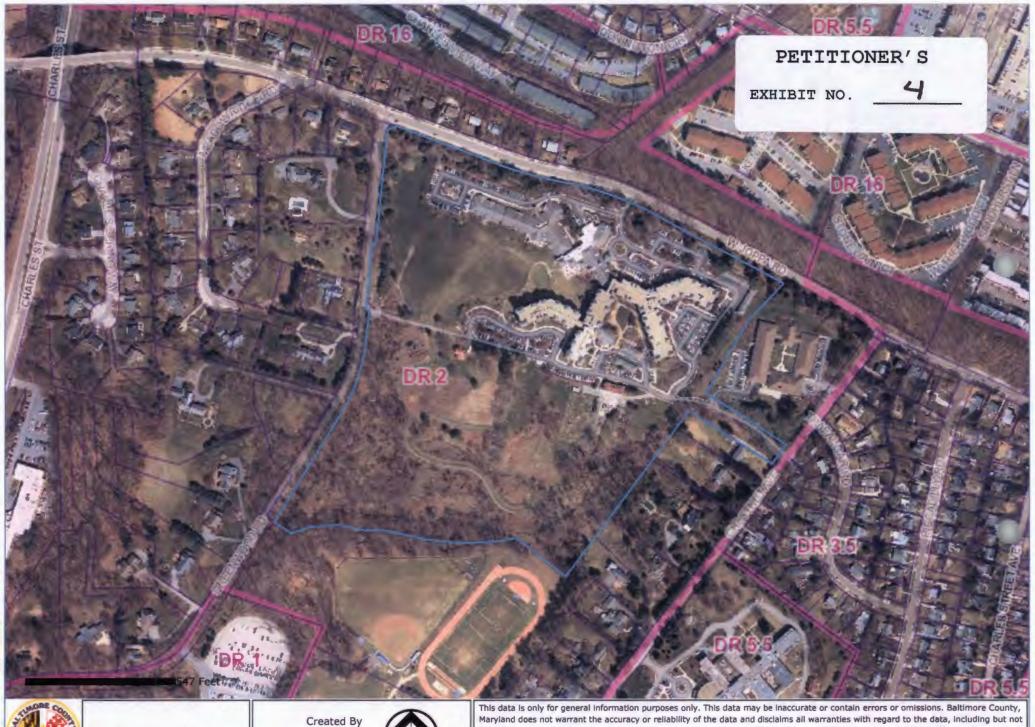

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into, as of the day of September, 2014 by and between THE CHESTNUT REAL ESTATE PARTNERSHIP ("Chestnut"), the legal owner of Blakehurst Senior Living Community and LESLIE B. TUNNEY and JOHN B. TUNNEY of 606 Greenwood Road, LISSEN T. TUTRONE and RONALD F. TUTRONE of 616 Greenwood Road, and CHARLES O'DONOVAN, 5TH and MOLLESON W. O'DONOVAN of 600 Greenwood Road (collectively referred to as the "Neighbors.")

- 1. Chestnut intends perform the following improvements to the Blakehurst campus, including: (1) expanding the health care center to create a specialized memory care nursing unit with rooms for fifteen (15) memory care nursing beds, separate living and dining areas, and a memory care garden; (2) upgrading the remaining forty-four (44) nursing beds from double-occupancy rooms to single-occupancy rooms; (3) constructing a new assisted living wing to create new rooms for twenty (20) assisted living beds; and (4) creating a state-of-the-art resident healthy living addition. With this addition, Chestnut Partnership would expand the footprint of the existing Community, increase the total number of beds in the health care center, and increase the total number of residents permitted at Blakehurst.

- 2. Chestnut will engage a reputable landscaping company to install and maintain the plantings. Chestnut agrees to replace promptly any landscaping material installed in accordance with Exhibit 1 that dies within a twenty-year period of its initial installation. Any such replacement materials shall be consistent with the type and size indicated in the preceding paragraph and the quantity and location indicated on Exhibit 1.
