OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for consideration of a Petition for Special Hearing filed on behalf of Middle River Business Center LLC and St. John Properties, Inc., legal owners ("Petitioners"). The Special Hearing was filed pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R.") to allow waivers and modifications of applicable laws and regulations governing development through the approval of a pattern book in accordance with B.C.Z.R. §259.11.D.

Appearing at the public hearing in support of the requests were Tom Pilon and Mike Caruthers. Robert A. Hoffman, Esquire, and Patricia Malone, Esquire, represented the Petitioners. Robert Bendler, President of the Essex Middle River Civic Council (EMRCC), attended the hearing and expressed support for the requests, noting Petitioners had met several times with community members to discuss the project. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations. Substantive Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were received from the Department of Planning (DOP) and the Department of Public Works (DPW).

This case (and a related case, 2015-0165-SPH) concerns the ambitious Baltimore Crossroads project adjacent to Rt. 43 in Eastern Baltimore County. The overall Crossroads site is ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING

approximately 1,000 acres, while this and the related case concern a proposed mixed-use development on 200+/- of those acres to be known as "Greenleigh at Crossroads." The development will include warehouse, commercial/office and retail uses, with multi-family and single family dwellings as well. This special hearing request relates only to a 29.4 acre portion of those 200+/- acres, which is to be improved with a hotel, office, retail and 500 multi-family units. For convenience sake, this case is referred to as the "commercial and multi-family" portion of the Greenleigh project, while Case No. 2015-0165-SPH (the order for which contains a more in-depth discussion of the entire project) is referred to as the "residential" portion of the project and encompasses the remainder of the 200 acres.

Petitioners submitted a pattern book (Exhibit 2) which provides extensive details regarding the nature and design of the planned improvements. Amidst all this detail, the Petitioners in this case seek just a single modification of the otherwise applicable regulations. Specifically, Petitioners submitted for approval an open space plan (Exhibit 1D) on which are depicted green spaces of varying size that will be spread throughout this planned community. Additional details on the proposed open spaces are contained in the Pattern Book. Under the applicable regulations, Petitioners would be required to provide 11.48 acres of open space for the proposed multi-family housing units. Petitioners are proposing to provide 16.54 acres, well in excess of the total amount required. See Open Space chart, Exhibit 1A. Even so, the open space parcels will be configured and distributed throughout the project in a manner that is unlike the typical open space layout envisioned by the open space manual. As such, petitioners seek a waiver or modification of the requirements set forth in the County Code, and instead propose to provide open space for the community in accordance with the plan submitted as Exhibit 1D.

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The DOP submitted a ZAC comment expressing support for the open space waiver. Tom Pilon with St. John Properties and Cecily Bedwell, a land planner accepted as an expert, both provided testimony as well as a Power Point presentation outlining the project. Ms. Bedwell explained that the open space parcels will be evenly distributed throughout the site so that residents would have open space within a block or two of their homes. As she explained, this proposal provides for "useable open space" that encourages spontaneous use by residents and helps to provide community cohesion. She also explained that the community would have a central hub for activities (i.e., a "Community Center Green" with meeting space, pavilions, swimming pool, open fields, etc...). Ms. Bedwell talked at length about the attention to detail provided in the design of the open space areas. She opined that the grant of the open space waiver or modification would in no way be detrimental to the health, safety and welfare of the community, and would in other respects satisfy the requirements of B.C.Z.R. § 502.1. I agree, and the Petition for Special Hearing will be granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED this <u>26th</u> day of March, 2015, by this Administrative Law Judge, that the Petition for Special Hearing pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R") to allow waivers and modifications of applicable laws and regulations governing development through the approval of a pattern book in accordance with B.C.Z.R. §259.11.D (such that open space shall be provided in accordance with the open space plan admitted as exhibit 1D in lieu of the requirements of B.C.Z.R. §235B.4, BCC §32-6-108 and the Baltimore County Open Space Manual), be and is hereby GRANTED.

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The relief granted herein shall be subject to the following:

Petitioners may apply for necessary permits and/or licenses upon receipt
of this Order. However, Petitioners are hereby made aware that
proceeding at this time is at their own risk until 30 days from the date
hereof, during which time an appeal can be filed by any party. If for
whatever reason this Order is reversed, Petitioners would be required to
return the subject property to its original condition.

Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

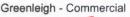

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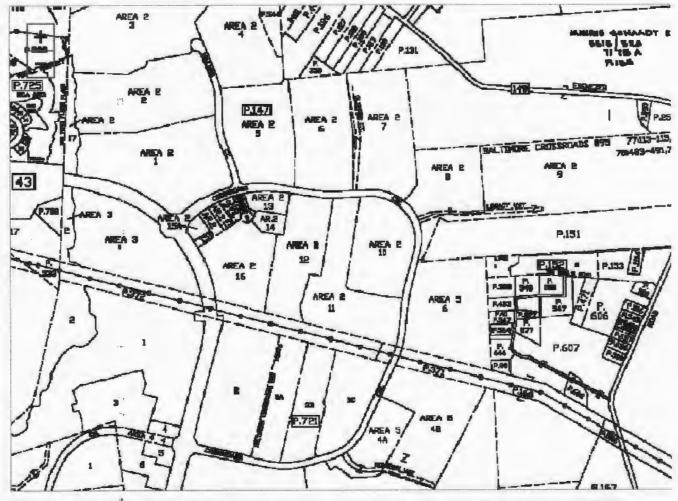

It is envisioned as a Traditional Neighborhood Development (TND) comprising compact blocks, a network of pedestrian-friendly streets, a mix of uses a variety of building types and a network and variety of open spaces.

The commercial & multi-family area, 76 acres of which 29.4 acres is subject of this special hearing, proposes a hotel, office, retail and 500 multi-family residential units.

History:

The MD 43 Overlay District was established to implement the *Middle River Employment Center Area Plan, Part One*, which was adopted on August 5 and September 3, 2002. The purpose of the MD 43 Overlay District was to encourage the industrially zoned land to be developed or redeveloped with

export-type businesses that generate family-supporting wages and certain retail, commercial, service, and semi-industrial uses were allowed.

In 2012, Area 2 of Baltimore Crossroads was re-envisioned to create a live/work/ play environment by adding retail, office and housing within a TND. Subsequent Bill 5-2013 revised BCZR Section 259.11.A.3 to permit residential uses to be built on a maximum 30% of the overall tract of a least 800 acres that, as of February 19, 2013, was under common ownership or control or part of a common scheme of development. The Crossroads @ 95 development (under common control by St John Properties) consists of 936.296 acres of which 30% or 280.89 acres may be developed as residential. The Arbors, a multi-family residential building, was built on lot 3 of area 4 and consists of 7.48 acres. The area for the 500 multi-family units of Greenleigh is 11.81 acres and the area for the single-family detached and attached is 140.02 acres. The total gross residential area of 159.31 acres does not exceed 30% of the total tract.

The original pattern book for Baltimore Crossroads @ 95 was approved in October 2005 to establish development standards for the entire Baltimore Crossroads @ 95 Property. The pattern book was revised in September 2009 (Revision 1) to include apartment elevations and building materials and most recently in January 2015 (Revision 2) for minor text and formatting revisions.

Master Plan:

Greenleigh is consistent with the Master Plan 2020 community design vision described on page ii (4): "Community design: compact, mixed-use, walkable design consistent with existing community character and located near available or planned transit options is encouraged to ensure efficient use of land and transportation resources and preservation and enhancement of natural systems, open spaces, recreational areas, and historical, cultural, and archeological resources."

The Master Plan 2020 Land Management Area Plan designation for the subject area is Middle River Redevelopment Area (MRRA). It is a stated principal within the Baltimore County Master Plan that the MRRA is "among the largest employment centers in the Baltimore region and presents great potential for future growth" (MP 2020 pg. 71). MP 2020 divides the MRRA into 9 sub-areas and recommends detailed land use analysis to provide a vision and development pattern for each sub-area.

Greenleigh falls within the Route 43 sub-area of the Middle River Redevelopment Area. MP 2020 recommends the implementation of the area's master plan, the Middle River Employment Center Area Plan, Part One (MRECAP) adopted by County Council on Aug 5 and September 3, 2002. At the time of drafting of the MRECAP, engineering of MD 43 was 90% complete with anticipated contract award in 2002 and road opening in 2005. This plan recommended that all development be in conformance with Division III of the CMDP (commercial, office and mixed-use) and that alternate land design scenarios may be permitted subject to the approval of a pattern book by the hearing officer or the Director of the Department of Planning in cases where no hearing is required.

Within the MRRA the land use map codes the project site as T-5, Urban Center (Map 18, pg. 73). The T-5 Urban Center transect is characterized by high density mixed use that accommodates retail, offices and residential with a tight network of streets, shallow setbacks and buildings oriented to the street. Civic space consists of parks, plazas and squares and steady street tree plantings. Neighborhood greens are located at the core of the westside and eastside neighborhoods. They consist of trees and lawn areas and will include minimally a pavilion and tot lot. The business district is anchored by a commercial plaza. Attached greens range in size and are distributed throughout Greenleigh. The open spaces are linked via the side walk system, pedestrian pathways, trails and a shared use path which connects to the existing county bike path.

The Department of Planning recommends that the open space plan and pattern book provide sufficient open space area and amenities to serve the needs of the community and are consistent with the Traditional Neighborhood Development concept and as such will not be detrimental to the health, safety and welfare of the locality involved. The office, retail, hotel, multi-family buildings, single-family attached and detached dwellings and open space plan are integral to the overall concept of mixed-use and TND. The Department recommends that to achieve a site layout that positively reflects accepted design principles for traditional neighborhood development while responding appropriately to the accepted standards unique to this type of development, the requested modification is reasonable and necessary.

In conclusion, the Department recommends the ALJ grant the amendments to allow open space to be provided in accordance with the attached open space plan (exhibit 1) in lieu of the requirements of BCZR Section 235B.4 and BCC Section 32-6-108 and approve the pattern book for Baltimore Crossroads @ 95, Revision 3, February 2015, last revised March 17, 2015. The open space plan and amenities will provide adequate space for the resident and commercial population and will not tend to overcrowd the land or result in an undue concentration of population. The Department of Planning recommends that the proposal is in conformance with Division III of the CMDP and the alternate land design scenario proposed.

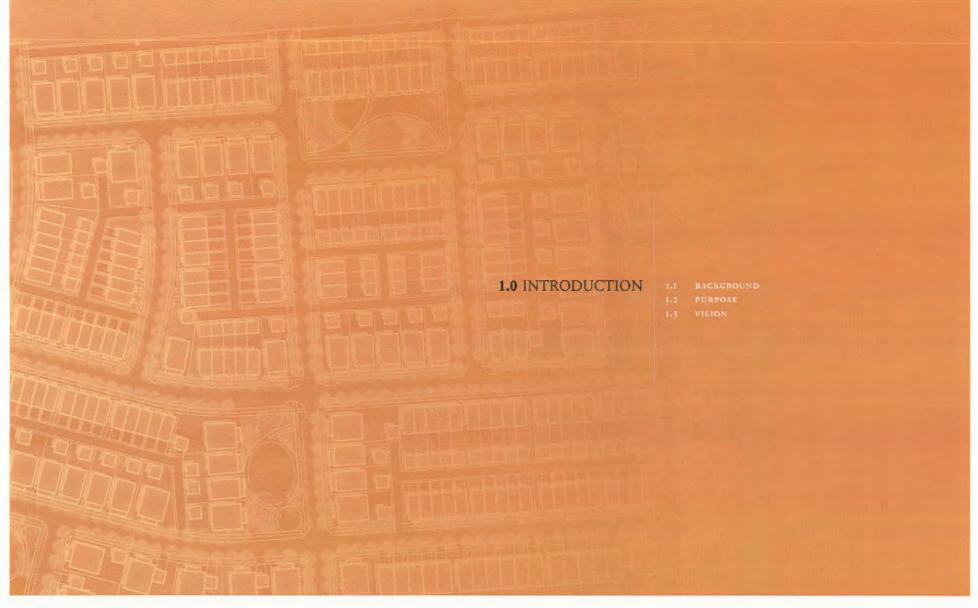

1.3 VISION

Within Baltimore Crossroads, Greenleigh is envisioned as a Traditional Neighborhood Development (TND) comprising compact blocks, a network of pedestrian-friendly streets, a mix of uses, a variety of building types, and a network and variety of open spaces.

In order to re-envision Baltimore Crossroads and create the community of Greenleigh, the existing loop road named Crossroads Circle that links the commercial in Areas 2 and 5 was reconfigured. In place of the broad arching road, a new spine road named Greenleigh Avenue was established running east-west and connecting White Marsh Boulevard/Md. Route 43 to Earls Road. This new spine road provides the framework for the three residential neighborhoods and the Business District comprising Greenleigh. The three neighborhoods include Midtown, the central neighborhood with the Community Center Green as a focal point, Westside, north of the commercial Business District and White Marsh Boulevard; and Eastside, located towards Earls Road.

VISION DIAGRAM A

Vision Diagram A depicts the community's major streets, a combination of existing and proposed roadways, that establish the primary structure of Greenleigh Greenleigh Avenue, running east-west, serves as the main spine connecting White Marsh Boulevard and Earls Road. Williams Court, an existing roadway, connects the Business District to the Westside Neighborhood. Heritage Street, which extends from the midpoint of Greenleigh Avenue, connects Greenleigh to the existing business park in Area 5 of Baltimore Crossroads.

VISION DIAGRAM B

Vision Diagram B locates the primary open spaces throughout Greenleigh and illustrates their relationship to the major streets. This relationship establishes the neighborhood framework and the foundation for the open space network. Each neighborhood is formed by and generally contained within a 5-minute walk radius, or sized approximately a quarter mile from center to edge. Each neighborhood

has at its core a large neighborhood green. This structure helps to create a walkable, active, and civic community. In addition to these central neighborhood greens, smaller greens, plazas, pedestrian passages, and trails are distributed throughout Greenleigh (see Section 4.0 Open Space for additional information).

VISION DIAGRAM C

Vision Diagram C illustrates the conceptual neighborhood and district boundaries for Greenleigh, as well as establishes the primary use of each. The Business District shown in red is commercial with a mix of office and retail, while the three neighborhoods shown in yellow are residential. Vision Diagram C shows how each neighborhood is anchored around a primary open space. At the center of Greenleigh, Midtown has a community center green as its focal point, with the community center, pool, playground, gardens, and multi-purpose field. Westside and Eastside have neighborhood greens at their cores; while the Business District has a commercial plaza with hardscaped areas for outdoor dining and events.

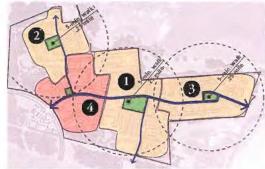

2.1 OVERVIEW

PURPOSE

The Urban Design Criteria describe how buildings and the street interface to create the physical character of the public realm, including such bulk regulations as building orientation and setbacks. The Urban Design Criteria include general provisions for all areas of single-family residential as well as specific design standards for individual singlefamily building types.

Greenleigh is envisioned as a compact, pedestrian-friendly, mixed-use community where offices, shops, restaurants, residences, and recreation are integrated in a well-planned development. These Urban Design Criteria include general standards to ensure this vision and specific criteria for the single-family residential to support this vision.

The following design principles inform these criteria:

- 1. Blocks are short and walkable;
- 2. A network of streets enables an efficient dispersion of traffic,
- 3. Streets are designed for pedestrians, bicycles, and vehicles;
- 4. Buildings are continuously aligned along all streets,
- 5. A network of open spaces links and enriches the community. The variety of types, amenities, and design, as well as the frequency of open spaces shown in the Illustrative Plan are important to the plan; and
- 6. A variety and mix of residential lot types create a diversity of residential options.

COMPONENTS

The Urban Design Criteria comprise the following sections: Lot Standards, Prominent and Semi-Prominent Lot Requirements, and Lot Landscape Plans.

- Lot Standards provide setbacks and other dimensional requirements for the single-family attached and detached lot types.
- Prominent and Semi-Prominent Lot requirements indicate additional provisions for single-family lots located on street corners, along open spaces, on alley ends, and adjacent to pedestrian
- Lot Landscape Plans provide criteria for the landscape design of single-family lots, as well as typical illustrative examples of lot landscape plans.

MASTER PLAN

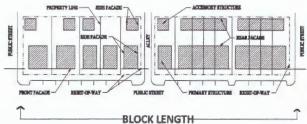
The master plan for Greenleigh has been designed as a pedestrianfriendly environment. Blocks are short and walkable. Streets typically have sidewalks on both sides and are continuously lined and shaded with trees. Traffic calming devices, such as bump outs and on-street parking, help to calm traffic and protect pedestrians from moving vehicles. With the exception of the peripheral residential lots, garages are generally accessed from a rear lane or alley, relegating cars to the backs of lots and preserving front yards for porches and stoops, not garage doors and driveways.

The master plan achieves several important goals specific to residential lots. Residential lot types are mixed and integrated throughout the community. Lots are intentionally not clustered by type. This approach adds variety to the streetscape, increases the diversity, and provides a variety of residential options throughout Greenleigh.

The master plan also includes a variety of open spaces types. Types include a large community center green, neighborhood greens as the focal point of the Westside and Eastside neighborhoods, a variety of smaller attached and detached greens, as well as pedestrian passages that provide mid-block access. The open space mix provides for a variety of active and passive recreation.

BLOCK STANDARDS

- Block length is measured from curb to curb, excluding alleys and service drives. Open spaces may be subtracted from the block length. Streets and pedestrian passages divide blocks.
- Blocks should be designed to be a maximum of 500' in length; blocks along the property boundary or natural areas are excluded from this requirement.

SINGLE-FAMILY ATTACHED

TOWNHOUSE REAR-LOAD DETACHED GARAGE

A Single-Family Attached (SFA) residential unit or townhouse that shares at least one adjoining side wall with an adjacent unit and is typically at least two stories. This unit typically has a detached garage and a small rear yard. A link, up to 12' wide, may be added between the main house and the garage. This link may be open (e.g., as a breezeway) or may be fully enclosed (e.g., as a laundry/mud room).

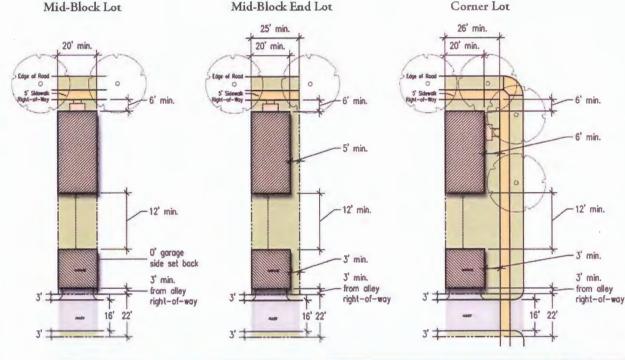
Mid-Block lots: For SFA lots, these units are adjoined on either side by other townhouses.

Mid-Block End lots: These lots occur mid-block at a break between buildings, at an alley entrance, or mid-block adjacent to a pedestrian passage (see pages 52-68 for additional information on passages). Mid-Block End lots adjoining a pedestrian passage or alley entrance are considered Semi-Prominent Lots (see criteria on page 22).

Corner Lots: These lots have two frontages (i.e., two of the lot lines front either a street, a central open space, or a combination of both). These lots are considered Prominent Lots and require special attention see criteria on page 22).

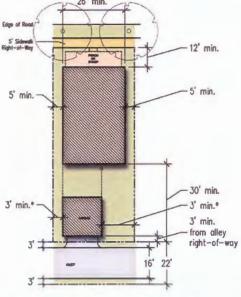




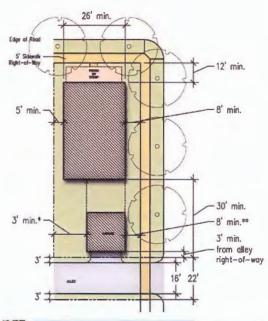

COTTAGE

3.3 STREET TYPES

The Street Type criteria address the roadway and streetscape characteristics and materials, including vehicular lane widths, number of lanes, medians, sidewalks, and crosswalks.

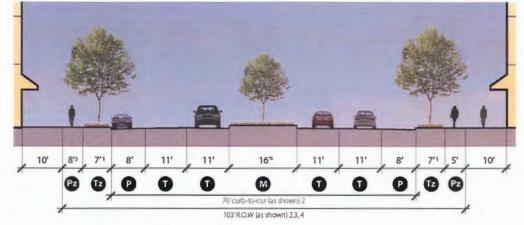

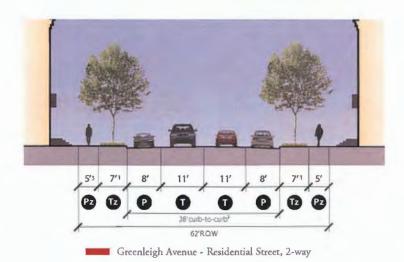

STREET FURNISHINGS - PALETTE

Neighborhood Greens are smaller than the Community Center Green and are typically defined by building frontages and/or streets. Neighborhood Greens typically consist of more planted landscape areas than paved hardscape areas, but include paths or sidewalks for pedestrian crossings. One main green is located at the core of each neighborhood and shall serve as the focal point. Other smaller attached and detached greens shall be distributed through the neighborhoods (see additional, specific information on attached greens on pages 58-59). Greens are typically informal in their design and help create an identity for the surrounding area.

Size: Typically at least 2,400 square feet but not more than 2 acres in size.

Character. The design consists primarily of trees and lawn areas, informally or formally disposed, and should not include excessive amounts of hardscape that will generally appear unoccupied and uninviting. Neighborhood Greens are available for unstructured recreation and passive and reflective open space. Greens may be fully detached (surrounded by streets) or attached on one or two sides. Minimally, the main Neighborhood Greens, one in each of the three neighborhoods, shall have a pavilion to provide shade and/or mailbox shelter and shall provide a tot lot.

Two greens are depicted to the right, showing illustrative, conceptual plans of the Westside and Eastside Neighborhood Greens.

ATTACHED GREEN

Attached Greens range in size throughout Greenleigh, but are generally smaller than the Community Center and Neighborhood Greens. Beyond size, they are distinguished by the fact that lots directly adjoin the open space on one or more sides. As with Neighborhood Greens, Attached Greens, typically consist of more planted landscape areas than paved hardscape areas, but may include paths or sidewalks for pedestrian crossings and other small areas of hardscape. Attached Greens occur throughout Greenleigh and are distributed among the neighborhoods Generally, but not always, these greens are located at the ends of blocks. Each should have a unique character or feature to help create an identity for the surrounding area.

Size: Typically at least 2,400 square feet but not more than 2 acre in size.

Character: The design consists primarily of trees and lawn areas, informally or formally disposed, and should not include excessive amounts of hardscape that will generally appear unoccupied and uninviting. Minimally, Attached Greens shall include pathway, landscaping, and benches. Attached Greens are available for unstructured recreation and passive and reflective open space. By definition, these greens shall be attached, with lots directly adjoining the open space, on one or more sides.

The two Attached Greens depicted to the right are examples of the many attached greens planned throughout Greenleigh. They are representative of two different sizes of attached greens and show illustrative, conceptual plans of one small green in Midtown and one large green in Eastside.

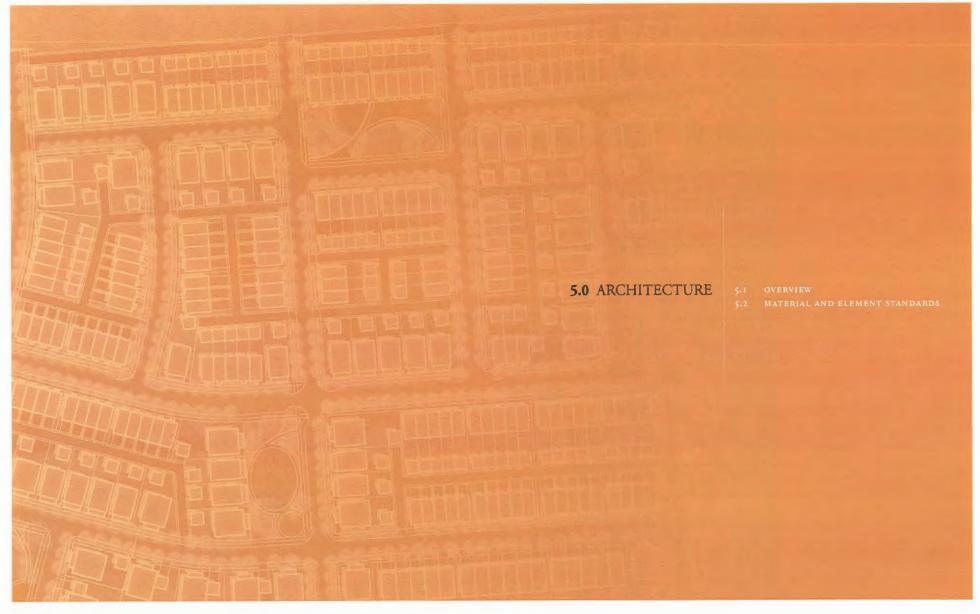

EXTERIOR WALLS

Construction Materials:

- Foundation walls shall be brick, stone, or poured concrete with a brick pattern and painted to match or be one shade darker than the main facade material.
- Walls shall be brick, stone, or cementitious siding in a smooth finish (no vinyl siding is permitted).
 Stucco (true stucco, not EIFS) may be approved, if appropriate to the architectural character, by the BCOC.
- Trim shall be cementitious, solid cellular PVC, or other simulated wood as approved by the BCOC.

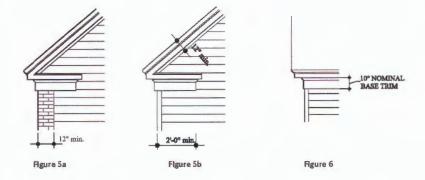
Configurations:

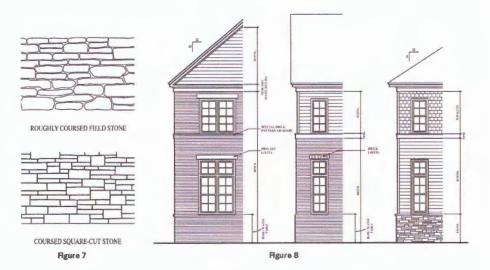
- All houses shall have a masonry watertable on the front façade. A masonry watertable or full masonry façade shall also be required on sides designated as Prominent (see Prominent/Semi-Prominent on pages 22-23 for additional information).
- Masonry shall return a minimum of 12" on nonfrontage side elevations or at an inside corner of a protruding element on the main/entry facade. Masonry returns are encouraged, but not required on rear elevations. See Figure 52.
- An expression of the base or watertable through a change in plane, brick shape, color, and/or pattern is required on frontage façades. See Figure 8.
- Building walls between the foundation and the eave shall be no more than two primary materials. Material changes shall occur along a horizontal line. Additionally, the lighter (or lighter appearing) material shall be used above the heavier (or heavier appearing) material. See Figure 8.
- Wall materials shall be oriented horizontally, unless approved as appropriate to the architectural character by the BCOC.
- Walls of siding shall have all openings trimmed in vertical/jamb boards with a 4" minimum nominal width unless otherwise noted. Windows with installed shutters may omit the 4" jamb boards. Subject to approval by the BCOC, trim boards on rear windows may be a minimum of 2" wide. On frontage elevations, head trim shall be 8" minimum nominal in height and may incorporate

- a special head feature. On non-frontage side elevations, head trim shall be 4" minimum nominal in height. Sill trim shall project and be differentiated from apron trim.
- A minimum 10" nominal skirt/band trim board is required where siding meets a foundation wall or a watertable.
- Corners of siding elevations shall be trimmed in boards of 6" minimum nominal width. Nonfrontage side and rear corners may be trimmed in boards of 4" minimum nominal width, subject to BCOC approval.
- Doors in siding elevations shall be trimmed in boards of 4" minimum nominal width; wider trim is encouraged.
- Keystones are not permitted in non-masonry head features.
- Walls of masonry shall have all openings trimmed in simulated wood brick mould. Lintels and sills shall be made of brick, stone, or precast.
- Cornices are required with a minimum 10" nominal base trim. Decorative trim may be applied within the frieze of the cornice as approved by the BCOC. See Figure 6.
- Cornice returns at gable ends shall be a minimum of 2'. See Figure 5b.

Construction Techniques:

- Cementitious siding shall be pre-finished or painted.
- Butt joints may be caulked or covered and shall be painted to match the siding color.
- Brick shall be in a horizontal running or Flemish bond pattern with weathered, concave, V-shaped or grapevine mortar joints not greater than 5/8" in height.
- Mortar shall be glazed, beige, warm grey, or similar.
- Stucco shall be sand finished or steel trowelled.
- Stone shall be set in a regularly coursed or roughly coursed pattern. See Figure 7.
- Trim is required where there is a change in material or a change in plane.

FRONTAGE AND YARD

Construction Materials:

- Frontage (front-yard) fences adjacent to a street or central open space are not required at Greenleigh; however, if used, fences shall be steel, wrought iron, or ESP (electrostatically painted) aluminum.
- Privacy (rear-yard) fences shall be almond/beige vinyl.
- Frontage dooryard walls and garden walls shall be brick or stone.
- Retaining walls shall be brick, stone, or architectural grade, straight-face block.
- Hedges, when installed along a frontage, shall be planted and maintained to be a continuous mass.
 See additional Landscape Criteria on pages 28-30.
- Leadwalks on lots may be brick, stone (flagstone or slate), concrete pavers, or concrete.
- Steps attached to stoops or porches shall be brick or flagstone on walking surfaces, risers, and sides.
 Concrete or simulated wood may be used at secondary entrances on non-frontage elevations.
- Front-load driveways may be asphalt, brick pavers, or concrete pavers. Aprons shall be concrete. See Figure 23.

Configurations:

- Terminal posts in fences (at corners, openings, ends, and similar) shall be wider and taller in proportion than other posts (maximum heights per type follow below). Fence posts shall be spaced evenly along a run with 8' maximum spacing.
- Frontage fences shall be between 32" and 42" in height, with posts up to 48" in height. Frontage fences on neighboring lots shall be of different designs.
- Privacy fences in rear yards shall be a maximum of 6' in height, including any top lattice or spaced picket portion. See Figure 25.
- Along non-frontage lot lines, privacy fences shall not extend forward of the primary structure.

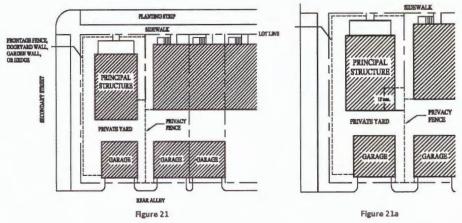
Subject to BCOC approval, privacy fences may be permitted to extend up to 12' forward of the primary structure. See Figure 21a.

- Brick or stone piers or metal picket gates may mark the pedestrian entrance to a private yard.
- Frontage dooryard, garden, or retaining walls shall be between 18" and 42" in height, with piers up to 48" in height.
- Lot leadwalks shall connect with street sidewalks and/or driveways.
- Posts of fences and garden walls shall be set 12" minimum and 24" maximum off street or open space sidewalks. See Figures 21 and 22.

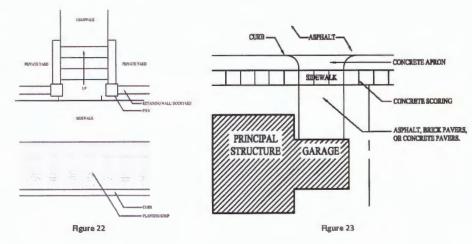
Techniques:

- Fences of steel or aluminium shall be pre-finished in black.
- Brick walls shall be capped with coping stone or shaped brick. The cap shall overhang the wall between 1/2* and 1-1/2* to provide an appropriate drip edge.
- Dooryard, garden, or retaining walls of brick or stone shall be no less than 8" wide and capped in a rowlock course of brick, cut brick, or dressed coping stone 1-1/2" to 3" thick. See Figure 24.
 Dooryard or garden walls are encouraged where sidewalk grade is 5' or more lower than the stoop or porch walking surface.
- Poured concrete shall have a smooth finish.
- Vinyl fences shall have a smooth finish (i.e., no wood grain).

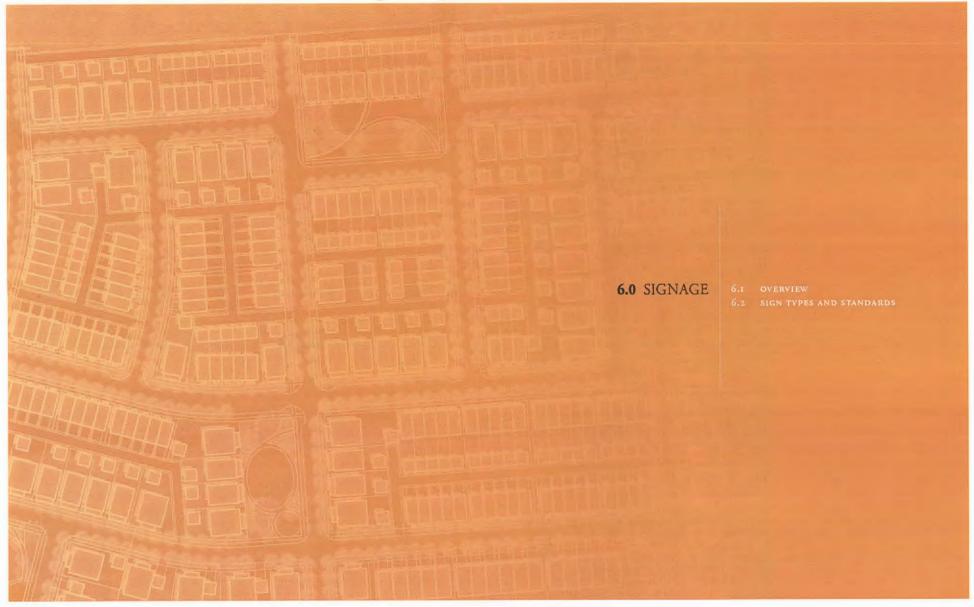

6.2 SIGN TYPES AND STANDARDS

While the General Provisions apply to all single-family residential and community signs in Greenleigh, the following sign types require particular attention as the identification and directional signage for the community. In this important role of building the community character, further provisions specific to each of the following sign types apply.

PERMANENT IDENTIFICATION SIGNS

Located at key perimeter locations, these signs announce the primary entry points (or gateways) to Greenkigh. This sign type should be part of a coordinated family of signs and should be integrated within an overall way finding plan.

DIRECTIONAL SIGNS

These signs promote convenient wayfinding within the Greenleigh neighborhood and include the following types: Vehicular Directional Signs and Pedestrian Directional Signs.

STREET SIGNS

These signs, attached to poles, offer an opportunity for customization. Including the Greenleigh logo and/ or typeface along with the street name can add to the sense of place and distinguish Greenleigh.

BANNERS

Banner signs are permanent or temporary signs that add visual interest and color to the streetscape. They are vertically oriented and should be compatible with the overall character and color of the community's graphic identity. Banner signs along the streetscape may be attached to light poles to provide a simple means of displaying the community's identity and/or promoting special community events, holidays, or







PERMANENT IDENTIFICATION SIGNS

Permanent Identification Signs announce Greenleigh, highlighting the entry points and/or major gateways to the community. These signs play an important role in establishing an identity for Greenleigh that welcomes visitors to the community.

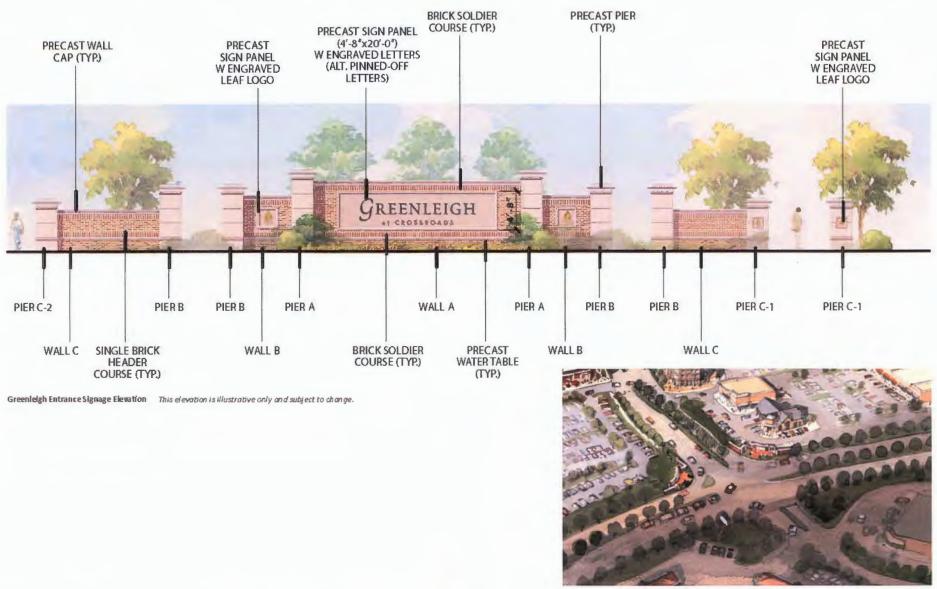
Materials and Standards:

- Shall be designed as an integral part of the community's hardscaping and landscaping.
- Shall be compatible with the architecture of Greenleigh.
- Sign materials may include fabricated aluminum, natural metals, stone, masonry, and/or glass.
- Messages on Greenleigh Identification Signs shall be limited to the name, "Greenleigh at Crossroads", but may also include "Welcome to" or similar supporting text.
- Signs may contain internal and/or remote illumination.

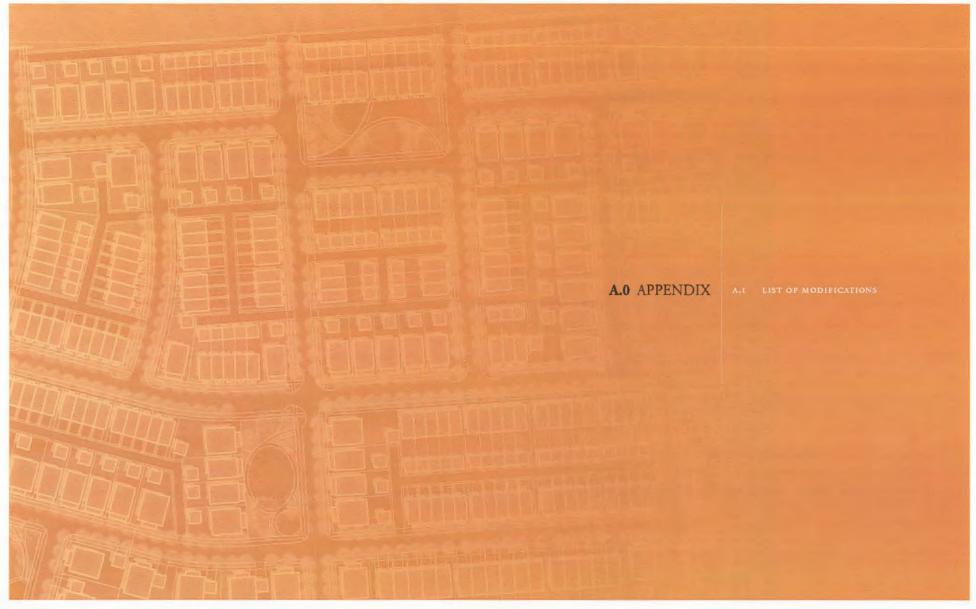

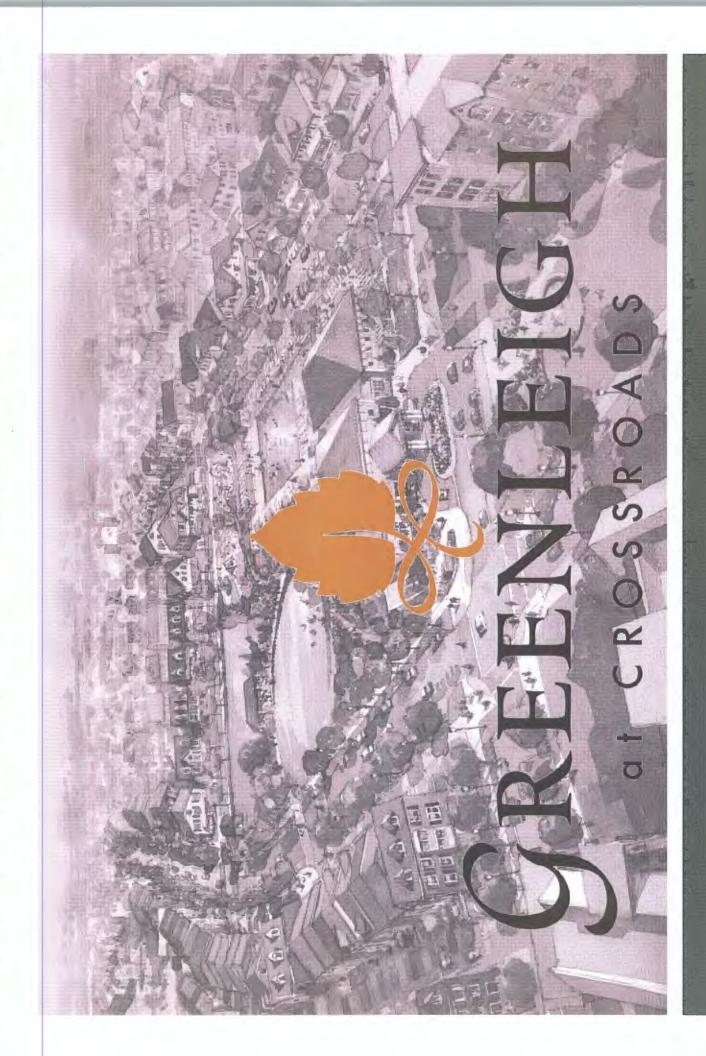

2.2 LOT STANDARDS

The Lot Standards section addresses criteria for the single-family residential lot types throughout Greenleigh. The Lot Type Plan diagram is an illustrative example of the various types and placements of the lots. The Lot Standards criteria provides requirements for building setbacks for each lot type and lot condition, such as corner lot versus mid-block. Every lot, however, may not be in strict compliance with these criteria. The Modifications of Standards listed in Appendix A.1 allow for different lot standards for these non-compliant lots. It is anticipated that the non-compliant lots will be few. Additional requirements are included for Prominent and Semi-Prominent Lots (see pages 22-23).

LOT TYPES

Lot types within Greenleigh fall into two unit categories, Single-Family Attached (SFA) and Single-Family Detached (SFD). SFA are residential units that share at least one adjoining side wall with an adjacent unit. SFD are residential units that do not share walls with an adjacent unit. These two categories each include three unit variations:

Single-Family Attached:

Townhouse, Rear-Load Detached Garage Townhouse, Rear-Load Integral Garage Townhouse, Front-Load

Single-Family Detached:

Cottage Manor Villa

For Single-Family Attached lots, each unit type includes criteria for three lot conditions: mid-block lots, mid-block end lots, and corner lots. For Single-Family Detached lots, each unit variation includes criteria for mid-block lots and corner lots. The following pages provide specific criteria for these lots that include required setbacks, minimum unit widths, garage placement and access, porch and stoop placement, and similar.

General provisions for all lot types include:

- All setbacks listed in the Lot Standards shall be measured from lot lines.
- The minimum distance between principal structures shall not be less than 10 feet; detached garages, links, and other secondary accessory structures are exempt from this criteria.
- Encroachments into the right-of-way shall <u>not</u> be allowed. The following building elements may extend into the lot front and side setbacks up to 1 foot from the lot line: stoops, steps, bays, porte-

cocheres, and similar elements; porches may extend into the lot front and side setbacks up to 2 feet from the lot line. Masonry veneers may encroach a maximum of six inches into any required setback.

- The distance between garage doors facing each other across an alley shall be 28 feet minimum.
- Where alleys are provided, garages shall be accessed from the alley, unless approved otherwise by the BCOC.
- Garages shall be placed to help block views down the alley.
- On lots where the garage is accessed from the front of the lot, the garage door shall not constitute more than 45% of the façade for single-family detached units and 70% of the façade for single-family attached units. Further, the front-load garage for a single-family detached unit shall be set back a minimum of 6 feet from the front façade.

LOT TYPE PLAN

The Lot Type Plan diagram on the following page provides an illustrative example of the locations of the six lot types within Greenleigh. The plan also illustrates one of the primary principles of a TND, which is to distribute the unit types throughout each neighborhood to avoid clustering of a particular unit type. This approach creates a more dynamic community, in keeping with the vision for Greenleigh.

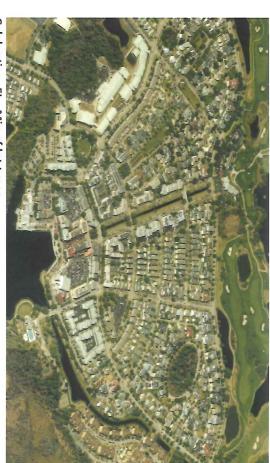
The objective of distributing unit types evenly throughout each neighborhood is reinforced by varying the unit mix along streets and fronting recreational open spaces. All recreational open spaces have a minimum of two unit types fronting the space, while a majority of the open spaces have at least three unit types. The mix and number of units, along with the variety of unit elevations, will create a collection of unique open spaces of individual character within Greenleigh.

Greenleigh Avenue is the primary street in the community and is fronted by a majority of the unit types, but shall not be fronted by units with front-load garages. The goal for Greenleigh Avenue, the longest, uninterrupted street in the community, is to establish visual interest for the entire length of the avenue.

Front-loaded units, including Villas and Townhouses, are typically located along the perimeter of the community, backing up to natural areas or property boundaries where alleys are impractical. Rear-loaded units, Manors, Cottages, and Townhouses, comprise the internal blocks of the community. Rear-loaded units strengthen the goal of a pedestrian-oriented community by relegating the majority of garage access to an alley, and thereby freeing up the majority of block faces for uninterrupted planting zones and sidewalks.
