ORDER ON MOTION FOR RECONSIDERATION

Now pending is a request for clarification filed by Petitioner, which will be treated as a motion for reconsideration. The community has filed an opposition to that request. Having reviewed both papers, I will deny the motion.

In seeking special hearing relief, the Petitioner made only one request: "confirmation of continued use as a residential parsonage, with accessory use for religious worship and religious education." The June 26, 2015 Order denied the Petition, which of necessity was a determination that the property was not used as a parsonage. Petitioner now requests a finding that the property is "being used as a residence," and not as a religious institution or community building. I am unfortunately not able to answer that inquiry, since it is beyond the scope of the zoning request filed with the County.

Petitioner's correspondence indicates the County will not withdraw the zoning citation issued with respect to the subject property. Again, I have no authority to insist that the Code Enforcement Bureau rescind a citation or correction notice issued by one of its inspectors. I would note that Petitioner's larger concern is that the County will not "process Rabbi Rivkin's building application." Under the County Code, the building engineer is required in writing to explain the basis for his denial of a building permit application. It is unclear whether that has occurred, or even ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING

if the Petitioner has in fact formally made application for a building permit. In any event, if a building permit is denied the Petitioner is entitled to file an appeal with the County Board of Appeals (CBA) pursuant to B.C.C. §35-2-302. As such, it may be that the CBA, rather than the OAH, is the correct forum in which to resolve this ongoing dispute.

WHEREFORE, for the foregoing reasons, IT IS ORDERED this <u>10th</u> day of August, 2015 that the Motion for Reconsideration filed by Petitioner be and is hereby DENIED.

Any appeal of this decision must be filed within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

AMAT'S RESPONSE TO PETITIONER'S REQUEST FOR CLARIFICATION

The Aigburth Manor Association of Towson, Inc. ("AMAT" or "Community"), and David Zoll, Devin Leary and Paul Hartman, individually, by *J. Carroll Holzer*, *Esquire*, submit this Response to Petitioner's Request for Clarification on its Petition for Zoning Relief seeking special hearing relief in the above referenced matter.

As a preliminary matter, the Rules of Practice and Procedure Before the Zoning Commissioner/Hearing Officer of Baltimore County does <u>not</u> provide for such relief.

Rule 4.K provides, in pertinent part, that:

A party may file a motion for reconsideration of an order issued by the Zoning Commissioner. Such a motion must be made in writing, within thirty (30) days of the date of the original order. The motion must state, with specificity, the grounds and reasons for the request.

(410) 825-6961 FAX: (410) 825-4923 The Request was filed within 30 days of the date of the original order. However, Petitioner's request is not technically a Motion for Reconsideration. If anything, it's more of a Md. Rule 2-535 request for the Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ") to exercise revisory power over the decision. Rule 10 of the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the Board of Appeals gives the Board of Appeals the authority to revise decisions based upon "fraud, mistake or irregularity" but the Rules of Practice and Procedure Before the Zoning Commissioner/Hearing Officer of Baltimore County does not give the ALJ this authority.

A Motion for Reconsideration "is a request for extraordinary relief that may be granted only upon a showing of exceptional circumstances." *Sanders v. Clemco Indus.*, 862 F.2d 161, 169 n. 14 (8th Cir. 1998). The decision to grant or deny a motion for reconsideration is committed to the court's discretion, *Renfro v. City of Emporia*, 732 F.Supp. 1116, 1117-1118 (D. Kan. 1990), and is reviewed by an appellate court on the basis of an abuse of discretion. *Id*.

While on the one hand, Petitioner's Request should be dismissed as not constituting a motion for reconsideration, we think it is important for ALJ Beverungen to clarify certain points. This is necessary because Petitioner seems to be indicating that it intends to have the use determined by ALJ Stahl as part of the hearing on the code enforcement citation, as opposed to this hearing on the petition for zoning relief. For this

reason, AMAT suggests that ALJ Beverungen review a similar case (No.: 2014-0147-SPHA), with respect to the procedural irregularity of Petitioner's request.

The Petitioner sought special hearing relief to confirm the "continued use as a residential parsonage, with accessory use for religious worship and religious education." It is noteworthy that the Petitioner did not seek to confirm, even in the alternative, that the principal use was a single-family dwelling or church, three (3) uses expressly permitted by right in the underlying zone. In the alternative, Petitioner similarly neglected to seek approval of the use as a community building, a use permitted by special exception in the underlying zone. The reason for this oversight is that being categorized as any of these three (3) uses would not allow them to achieve their goal of operating and, more importantly, expanding the Chabad without additional zoning relief. The use is most appropriately categorized as a church and the ALJ lacks the authority to approve a change in occupancy based upon the instant request for relief. The request fails to provide sufficient notice because Petitioner has neglected to seek variances from the Residential Transition Area ("RTA") and bulk regulations. In order to obtain an occupancy permit under B.C.Z.R. §500.4 to change the use from a single-family detached dwelling to a church would necessitate variances from the RTA regulations, as provided in B.C.Z.R. 1B01.1.B.1.d(1), and other zoning relief including but not limited to bulk

regulation setbacks and parking variances. It is important to note that no change in occupancy was ever sought (including in the instant petition for zoning relief0 because an addition to an existing "church or other building of religious worship" is a listed exception to the RTA conditions, as noted in B.C.Z.R. §1B01.1.B.1.g(4).

Petitioners request that ALJ Beverungen determine that the only use of the property as residential is preposterous. The issue of whether the church/community building or residential use is the principal use (which would require additional zoning relief besides the special hearing relief requested) or the accessory use (which must be customarily incident and subordinate to and serve the principal use) must be determined. However, the Petitioner did not request that the ALJ determine the principal, and if necessary, accessory use(s) of the property. This failure was the Petitioner's alone. Protestants find it rather hard to believe that the Petitioner was instructed by county staff to ask for the use to be categorized as a residential parsonage, a use which is not permitted by right or by special exception in the zoning regulations. The Petitioner shouldn't have put all of its eggs in one basket. They chose the relief to be requested (special hearing only versus special hearing, variance and special exception). It is the Petitioner's job to ask for all of the relief necessary for approval in their petition for zoning relief.

The Petitioner appears to be intimating that a hearing before the other ALJ,

Lawrence M. Stahl, would be the appropriate forum to resolve the ultimate question of
how to define the use. One can only assume the Petitioner thinks it will fare better before

ALJ Stahl for some reason. ALJ Stahl's review will be to determine whether or not the code enforcement citation was properly issued. As you recall, the citation alleged that the Petitioner was using the property as a church (which would require RTA variances) or a community building (which would require a special exception and RTA variances).

It is very evident that the Petitioners want to get a permit to build their addition under the guise that it is principally a residence so they can expand the Chabad.

ALJ Beverungen properly found that they've been getting a tax exemption for the property for years that they're not entitled to receive if the principal use of the property is residential. As the ALJ indicated in his decision, there's:

...evidence establishing that the property at 14 Aigburth Road has been granted by the State of Maryland an exemption from real property taxes. See, Petitioner's Exhibit 7. Such an exemption is provided for by §7-204 of the Maryland Tax-Property Code Annotated, which provides as follows:

Property that is owned by a religious group or organization is not subject to property tax if the property is actually used exclusively for:

- (1) public religious worship;
- (2) a parsonage or convent; or
- (3) educational purposes.

The Petitioner has, in effect, <u>already admitted</u> that the property cannot be considered as being used as a dwelling. ALJ Beverungen properly responded to the relief requested in the petition. He did not decide whether the use was a church or community building, as he was not asked to do so.

The testimony and evidence indicates that the Petitioner, the Friends of Lubavitch, Inc., purchased the property from Jackson Y. Dott for \$525,000¹ in 2006. Mr. Dott's principal use of the property was a single-family detached dwelling.

Rabbi Menachem Rivkin and his family presently reside on the subject property. There is no testimony or evidence that the Petitioner, or anyone else for that matter, ever sought a change in occupancy permit. Nevertheless, the record makes it clear that Rabbi Rivkin is operating a Chabad, a use which most closely resembles a church, out of the subject property. There is a sign in the front lawn which reads "Chabad 14 Aigburth".

At some point, Rabbi Menachem Rivkin endeavored to construct additional improvements on the subject property to serve additional persons. This desire to construct these additional improvements led to articles being written about the proposal and Code Enforcement issuing a citation. The citation indicates that the use of the subject property was in violation of the County's rules and regulations. The County attorney agreed, in effect, that the fine would be stayed if the property owner filed a request for zoning relief within a reasonable period of time and ultimately received approval.

The testimony and evidence makes it overwhelmingly clear that Rabbi Rivkin intends to use the property as a church. This is supported by the fact that the Rabbi and his wife own neighboring properties but the subject site is owned by the Petitioner. As

¹According to SDAT the assessed value of the land and improvements is \$336,400. No doubt he Petitioner is under pressure to find a way to raise the value of its property. Unfortunately for he Petitioner, the Master Plan 2020 and the applicable zoning provisions do not enable it to dispatch with he applicable provisions. A ruling to this effect would rewrite how churches would seek to change the fabic of residential neighborhoods throughout the county.

noted above, ALJ Beverungen previously found that property owned by a religious group or organization is not subject to property tax if it is used EXCLUSIVELY for: (1) public religious worship; (2) a parsonage or convent; or (3) educational purposes. Since none of these options is a "residence", the exempt property at issue in the code enforcement case cannot be deemed a residence. The character of this neighborhood and similarly zoned residential neighborhoods throughout the county are at risk of uses which were not intended to be permitted being approved if the Petitioner is allowed to proceed with his plan to build a 37-foot tall building in addition to the existing structure. In the unlikely event the ALJ deems the principal use to be a single-family dwelling as opposed to a church or community building, there is no evidence in the record that the Chabad is a permissible accessory use. The fact that the Petitioner is even contending that the principal use of the property is residential is essentially an admission that they have been cheating the State out of property taxes.

For all of these reasons stated herein, the Protestants respectfully request that the ALJ deny the instant request for clarification.

Dear Judge Beverungen:

We write to ask for clarification of your Order dated June 26, 2015, which denied Petitioner's request that the use of the Property be confirmed as a residential parsonage with an accessory use for religious worship and religious education. Although your Order and Opinion was clear as to what the Property is not, there remains uncertainty as to what the Property is. As such, we ask that you clarify that the Property is being used neither as a House of Worship/Religious Institution nor as a Community Building; rather, it is being used as the residence of Rabbi and Mrs. Rivkin and their four children. As discussed below, such a clarification would avoid the necessity of having the very same hearing on the open citation that is pending with the County.

As you know, this matter arose as a result of a dispute between the County Code Inspections and Enforcement Division and Rabbi Mendy Rivkin concerning the Rabbi and his family's use of the Property. The dispute arose after Rabbi and Mrs. Rivkin had resided together with their children continuously at the Property for seven years. Upon Rabbi and Mrs. Rivkin's decision to seek the County's approval of expansion plans for their home, a County Zoning and Code Enforcement officer issued a use citation (the "Citation"), without ever stepping foot in the home or interviewing Rabbi Rivkin or his wife, on the grounds that the Property allegedly was being used as either a House of Worship or a Community Building. As a result of the Citation, the County strongly urged that Rabbi Rivkin submit the matter as a Petition for Special Hearing prior to its acceptance and consideration of the proposed building plans.

Accordingly, the Petition was filed primarily to clarify the use of the Property as being residential rather than a commercial, public or other type of use. After all of the evidence was

presented at the two-day hearing before Your Honor, there can be no doubt that the Property is not being used as either a Religious House of Worship or as a Community Building. Indeed, the continued reference to the Property as a "home" and "single family dwelling," throughout your Opinion and Order, as well as your statements made during the course of the hearing that the Property was not being used as a House of Worship/Religious Institution or as a Community Building, make this clear. Moreover, one of the principal holdings of the Opinion and Order is that the Property does not meet the definition of a parsonage because there is no synagogue (i.e., Religious Institution/House of Worship) to which the building is appurtenant.

Unfortunately, the County refuses to accept or to process Rabbi Rivkin's building application while the Citation remains open. Moreover, notwithstanding Your Honor's Opinion and Order, as well as the abundant evidence now before it, the County refuses to withdraw the Citation. Petitioners could, of course, move forward with a hearing on the Citation. After proceeding on the Petition at the County's urging, however, it would be an incredible waste of time and resources to require the Rivkins, as well as the County, to now proceed on the Citation. To do so would require Rabbi Rivkin and his wife to repeat before another Administrative Law Judge virtually the exact same testimony about the private details of their life and their exercise of their religion within their home.

Accordingly, we respectfully request that Your Honor clarify the Opinion and Order to state additionally that, although the Property in your opinion does not qualify as a parsonage, it is being used as a residence, and not a House of Worship/Religious Institution or a Community Building.

OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for consideration of a Petition for Special Hearing filed on behalf of Friends of Lubavitch Inc., legal owner. The Special Hearing was filed pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R.") to confirm continued use of the subject property as a residential parsonage with an accessory use for religious worship and religious education.

Appearing at the public hearing in support of the requests was Rabbi Manachem Rivken and his wife Sheina. Alan Betten, Esq. represented the Petitioner. Several neighbors objected to the request, and the protestants were represented by J. Carroll Holzer, Esq. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations. Substantive Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were received from The Department of Planning (DOP) and the Bureau of Development Plans Review (DPR). While DPR noted a landscape plan was required, the DOP recommended denial of the petition. That agency believed the Petitioner was operating a "community building," which would require a special exception.

The subject property is 17,000 square feet and is improved with a single family dwelling constructed in 1952. The property is zoned DR 5.5. Rabbi Rivken and his wife moved to the

property in 2008, and they propose to enlarge the home to accommodate their growing family and certain religious activities as noted below.

Several witnesses provided testimony in the case concerning the nature of the use and activities at the subject property. Rabbi Rivken lives at the home with his wife and four (4) children. The Rabbi and his wife also host at their home certain meetings or gatherings throughout the week, where they meet with primarily college-aged students to discuss Jewish social and educational issues. In addition, the Rabbi and his wife host a weekly Sabbath (Shabbat) dinner on Friday evening, which can be attended by 50 or more people. Rabbi Rivken testified that the property is not used as a synagogue or community building, and that he on Saturday morning walks 6+ miles each way to a synagogue on Pimlico Road to attend religious services.

The sole legal issue is whether the property is used as a "parsonage" with accessory religious uses. Based upon the available legal precedent, I do not believe the property at 14 Aigburth Road qualifies as a "parsonage," and the Petition for Special Hearing will therefore be denied. As a general matter, and as discussed in greater detail below, I believe the Petitioners have it backwards; i.e., a parsonage is in fact an adjunct or accessory structure near or on the same grounds as a church, synagogue or other house of worship. The fundamental problem here is that there is no synagogue to which the parsonage would be appurtenant. The term "parsonage" does not appear in the B.C.Z.R., although it has been defined in Maryland case law.

Petitioner submitted evidence establishing that the property at 14 Aigburth Road has been granted by the State of Maryland an exemption from real property taxes. <u>See</u>, Petitioner's Exhibit 7. Such an exemption is provided for by § 7-204 of the Maryland Tax-Property Code Annotated, which provides as follows:

Property that is owned by a religious group or organization is not subject to property tax if the property is actually used exclusively for:

- (1) public religious worship;
- (2) a parsonage or convent; or
- (3) educational purposes.

The only potentially applicable portion of the statute would be subsection (2), given that the Rabbi and his wife testified that the property is not used exclusively for "educational" or "worship" purposes, which would exclude subsections (1) and (3) from consideration.

In <u>East Coast Conference of Evangelical Covenant Church of America</u>, Inc. v. Prince <u>George's County</u>, 40 Md. App. 213 (1978), the Court of Special Appeals considered a case involving subsection (2) of the tax exemption statute, and I believe that precedent is dispositive of the issue in this case. The Court noted that there is "no dispute that the subject property is owned by a religious group or organization," and that is also true in the present matter. <u>Id.</u> at 215. The question "is whether the subject property is a parsonage as used in [§ 7-204(2)]." <u>Id</u>.

After reviewing several definitions provided in well-known dictionaries, the Evangelical Covenant court noted that a parsonage is "in general, a house supplied to a parish minister by the parish congregation or church." Id. at 216. The court noted that the "disputed point," which is also the disputed issue in this matter, is "whether or not there must be an existing local church or congregation, to which the parsonage is adjunct." Id. at 216. Ultimately, the Court of Special Appeals concluded that the property in that case did not qualify as a parsonage, and in support of that conclusion held as follows:

To qualify as a parsonage there must be a minister with an identifiable parish and congregation and, of course, a building furnished to him by the church or congregation for his residence. The record clearly demonstrates that Reverend Njaa, although an ordained minister, accepted a "call" as a nucleus builder for the Washington, D.C. area, not as a traditional minister for an identifiable congregation.

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[The Court also noted that the Reverend in that case "did not hold regular services or serve a parish as such". <u>Id.</u> at 219.] <u>Id.</u> at 218.

In my opinion, the facts in the present case are strikingly similar to those in Evangelical Covenant, and for that reason I do not believe the property at 14 Aigburth Road qualifies as a "parsonage." While the property is owned by a religious organization, and Rabbi Rivken is clergy, there is missing from the equation a congregation or parish to which the parsonage would be adjunct. It is simply not sufficient that the home be owned by a religious organization and lived in by a clergy member and his family. Rabbi Rivken testified that he attends service on Saturday mornings at a synagogue on Pimlico Road, which is located 6+ miles from the subject property. No evidence was presented to establish that Rabbi Rivken is formally affiliated with or is in charge of that synagogue and congregation. In these circumstances, the property fails to qualify as a parsonage for the same reasons as those articulated by the Court of Special Appeals in Evangelical Covenant. See also, Ballard v. Balto. Co., 269 Md. 397, 406 (1973) (minister's home qualifies for exemption only if it is a "parsonage for a house of public worship").

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED this <u>26th</u> day of **June**, **2015** by this Administrative Law Judge, that the Petition for Special Hearing pursuant to B.C.Z.R. § 500.7 to confirm continued use of the subject property as a residential parsonage with an accessory use for religious worship and religious education, be and is hereby DENIED.

Any appeal of this decision must be filed within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

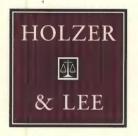

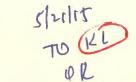

SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Department of Planning has reviewed the Petition for Special Hearing to determine whether or not the property should be approved for the continued use as a residential parsonage with accessory use for religious worship and religious education.

There are several open code violations against the property as indicated in Case # CC1500406. Particularly, the address has been cited by Baltimore County Code Enforcement for the illegal use of the property as a "community building" without the benefit of a special exception and for not providing the required residential transition area buffers. Upon a site visit and consideration of the site plan, the code violations and information available on-line at

http://www.chabad.org/centers/default cdo/aid/704078/jewish/Chabad-Lubavitch-of-Towson.htm,

this Department agrees that the principal use of the property as a community building devoted to civic, social and educational activities (Jewish Community Center) and that the residential use on the property is ancillary. The property address is listed as being a Chabad House affiliated with Towson University.

So defined, the proposed use requires special exception approval pursuant to BCZR Section 1B01.1.C.4. The Department of Planning contends that the submitted site plan does not successfully address the conditions enumerated in BCZR Section 502.1. Further, by more than doubling the size of the structure while providing no additional parking or buffering, the Department determines that the proposed improvements are not planned in such a way that compliance with RTA use requirements, to the extent possible, will be maintained or that the special exception can otherwise be expected to be compatible with the character and general welfare of the surrounding residential premises.

It is for the reason cited above that the Department of Planning recommends denial of the petitioned zoning request.

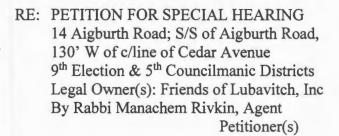

Mr. Carl Richard, Zoning Office Supervisor, commented that the proposed use of the subject property now designated as a 'Residential Parsonage' is, de facto, a house of worship, or a community building. Other factors considered include:

The Code Enforcement Division has issued citation and correction notices pertinent to various County code violations, more specifically, to the illegal use of the subject property as a house of worship or community building. A printout of the violation notices attached for reference.

In numerous meetings with the Director of PAI and the Zoning Supervisor, the owner/petitioner failed to prove that the current and proposed use will remain as a single family dwelling use. In fact, the attachment to the petition form by the petitioner clearly indicated that the proposed use will be a residential parsonage with an accessory use for religious worship and religious education. A religious worship and education is a church use.

Section 101 of BCZR does not define religious worship, parsonage, or residential parsonage. Section 407.1 of BCZR refers churches, synagogues and other houses of worship as "church". A church or house of worship use in a DR zone is permitted by right subject to meeting the RTA (Residential Transition Area - BCZR -1B 1.1.B.1.g.4) and non-residential principal building setbacks (BCZR -1B1.2.C.1.a) regulations. A community building in the DR zone is permitted by Special Exception. A church or community building must also comply with the parking requirements per Section 409 of BCZR. The proposed use does not comply any of the RTA, non-residential building setbacks, and parking requirements.

The petitioner reasoned that the proposed use is a 'Residential Parsonage' which does not require variances for RTA, the non-residential building setbacks, the parking requirements, or a special exception for a community building. The Zoning Office disagrees. The Zoning Office always looks at the history of the violations and the intended use other than the designation of the property.

Further, a parsonage is a building, which is accessory to an existing parish property as a clergymen's residence or for congregation for its pastor's use. To wit, there is an absence of a principal use, a church or house of worship, on the subject property, for the proposed parsonage building to subordinate to and serve a principal use.

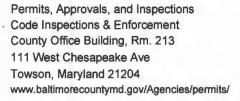

Rabbi Rivkin who resides at 14 Aigburth Rd., Towson MD 21286, is requesting a large building as an addition.

We think that this proposed building would be out of place compared to the other set back residences on Aigburth Rd. The proposed building/addition is too large and much closer to the road than any other property nearby.

Rabbi Rivkin has not maintained his property well as far as lawn and yard care, often letting the grass and weeds become unsightly (grass and weeds up to 2 feet high) — again in comparison to a surrounding neighborhood where lawns are mowed regularly and bushes/trees trimmed. Unfortunately, Rabbi Rivkin (or those aligned with him) have purchased two other properties (rentals) on the road (12 Aigburth Rd. and 202 Aigburth Rd.) not keeping those yards up to the standards of the other neighboring properties. The neighborhood now has three eyesore properties owned by him or his sponsors.

Besides lawn care, Rabbi Rivkin's trash cans frequently spill over and the cans are w/out lids for trash collection. Sometimes the cans have tipped over before and after trash pick- up days. There have been multiple times when the emptied cans have not been returned to his house for days after the trash has been picked up. We remember last July when the trash cans stayed on the sidewalk for 9 days before they were returned to his house. Unfortunately, again, his two other rental properties also have overfilled trash cans w/out lids and the cans stay on the sidewalk for multiple days.

We request that you deny Rabbi Rivkin's request for a large building addition.

Dear Judge Beverungen,

Because we both will be at work during the time of the hearing of the above case, we would like to make our feelings known to you by letter.

We live four houses from 14 Aighurth and three houses from 202 Aighurth Road, between the two properties. We have lived in our house 19 years and raised our children here.

Since both # 14 and #202 have changed hands, we have noticed a clear deterioration in the way they have been maintained, and a large increase in the noise levels coming from #202. Re: noise, the previous owner, who was the first to rent that house (where he used to live) to others, was very concerned about the impact of tenants there on the neighbors, and chose them accordingly. I am not aware of anyone ever complaining in the years he owned it. The new owner has moved to different renters. The noise levels have been high enough that neighbors have complained and the owner or police have been called to intervene. We have heard the tenants walking past the house after 2 am, very loud, on several occasions.

Our neighborhood organization has striven to keep the neighborhood a place where families can raise children in a safe and pleasant environment, as it has been for almost a hundred years. This has meant trying to restrain unnecessary encroachment from commercial and Towson University-related projects. Putting a large building in front of an old home so that it almost reaches the curb (when all other homes on this street have significant set-backs) would further diminish the atmosphere of our neighborhood.

Parking has also been an issue as we are close to Towson University. Despite signs that limit parking on Aigburth Road to 30 minutes, students often park there illegally for extended periods. This will likely worsen if this new structure is built.

Towson has many buildings in its commercial districts. I think we all understand that organizations like the one Rabbi Rivkin represents are an important part of any university campus. We would like to see this organization move to a place which has appropriate zoning for the uses intended. This would be good for the university, good for the organization, and good for our neighborhood.

Thank you for your consideration of this most important matter.

My name is Wanda Coombs I reside at 76 Cedar Avenue Towson, Maryland 21286. My family and I have resided here in our custom built single family home since 2007. My home is currently being used as our principal residence. My home sits back off the road which is in line with the other properties in the community that sit back off the road as well. What is being proposed will not be in line with the existing setbacks and style of the other homes in this community. An addition as such to Rabbi Rivkin's parcel situated that close to the street will be a total eyesore.

I am personally asking you to please think hard and fair about your decision that will ultimately affect the lives and property values of all the existing home owners in this community. The long time residences of this community young and elderly work very hard at keeping their properties up and are very mindful and respectful of one another's property value, peace, tranquility and safety. I am unable to attend the hearing on the Petition for Zoning Relief and my position on the petition is to oppose Rabbi Rivkin's proposed project at 14 Aigburth Avenue Towson, Maryland 21286 for the following reasons:

- Loud noises resulting from parties with alcohol and profanity during the day and late at night that would last beyond midnight at 12 Aigburth Avenue and 14 Aigburth Avenue.
- The noise would disturb my family and prevent us from getting to sleep at night.
- The parties are held on the weekends quite often.
- The backyards of Rabbi Rivkins properties 12 and 14 Aigburth Avenue backs up to my house where my bedroom, 2 daughters who have separate bedrooms and granddaughter bedroom is on that side of my house.
- The 3 properties that Rabbi Rivkin presently own on Aigburth Avenue are always overgrown with grass and shrubs due to lack of yard maintenance/upkeep.
- Rabbi Rivkin has 2 houses which are multi-rental units located at 12 and 202 Aigburth Avenue
 and 1 home that his family resides in at 14 Aigburth Avenue. So, even if he doesn't feel like
 cutting the grass himself he could hire a lawn service for regular maintenance of his properties
 which he hasn't done either.
- Prior to him taking over ownership of these properties the upkeep was never a problem with Mr. Battista the previous owner.

- Ever since Rabbi Rivkin purchased these 3 properties his concern for the outside appearance and unkeep of his properties has proven to be of no importance to him.
- His lack of concern for keeping his properties up will eventually take its toll on the property value of all the surrounding neighbors' property.
- My greatest concern is if he cannot take care of what he has now what other issues will arise if
 he's allowed to move forward with this project that will drastically affect our community and
 property value as a whole with MORE parties, MORE people, MORE noise, MORE trash strewn
 over lawn, and MORE overgrown grass/ shrubs.
- Overall it's not fair to the existing neighbors as a whole to have to deal with these frustrations as
 is and if he's given this opportunity for expansion it's only going to get worse.

Dear Judge Beverungen:

I am Brenda Ames-Ledbetter, a 20 year resident at 9 Maryland Ave., Towson, MD 21286. I am active in my community assoiciation and love our neighbrhood. I am unable to attend the hearing scheduled for June 19, but would like to submit this letter for your consideration.

My concerns regarding the Chabad property include the following:

- While our neighborhood is diverse (townhomes, individual homes, large and small, a church, and a school) it retains a 'residental feel'. What Rabbi Rivkin is proposing for his property, which is now a house very similar in nature the the surrounding homes, will convert the property into a much more commercial use. Could this set a precident for other property owners to convert their properties into larger, more commercial properties?
- While the Christian Scientist Church and school (THS) have parking lots to accommodate attendees, 14
 Aigburth does not. How will guests be accommodated? How will large numbers of 'attenders' impact
 neighbors? Some will walk, many will not.
- Rabbi Rivkin and/or his employer own serveral properties on Aigburth Road: 202 Aigburth, 14 Aigburth, and 12 Aigburth. Under Rivkin's management, all of the properties have turned into eyesores at times: lawns aren't mowed, lots of items collecting in the yard, trees growing up in beds around the houses, houses not well maintained. We have concerns about the maintence of yet another property.
- There seems to be some confusion about the real size and purpose of the proposed property. The Towson Times ran an article with a schematic drawing of the proposed building and did an interview with Rivkin. When the Community Association asked Rivkin for details about the article, concerned about what had been reported, he said the Towson Times article was incorrect. Given his history with the Community Association, we do have concerns about what the actual size and purpose of the building will be. Frankly, I feel his has been misleading in the past.
- Rabbi Rivkin has already installed electricty for the new addition, without permit and zoning approval.
 Will he abide by County regulations?
- He has stated the new addition will be, I believe, a 'residential parsonage'. What he is living in is a house, if he were to build something to accommodate worship services and religious meetings, that would be a worship center, not a parsonage. A parsonage is a residence for a cleric to reside in with his family. A worhip center is a just that a building to gather groups of people for religious services and meetings. I believe he wants to build a worship center which will have multiple functions. Does he have space for his on his residential property?

- We live in close proximity to Towson University. Prior to Rabbi Rivkin taking over the management of his
 properties, in my 20 year experience in the community assoication, we never had a compliant about the
 renters or the maintenance of the properties. The Rabbi immediately had complaints regarding his
 tenants, mostly students. Will this new purposed property bring in more students, noise, trash, traffic,
 etc.
- At onr point the Rabbi said he would host religious holiday meals in the new property, perhaps for 60 or more people. As one neighbor stated, 'that is a venue, not a residence'. Again concerns about trash removal, late hours, and noise are concerns.

I do not believe the proposed use of the property fits with the current residental nature of the neighborhood.

Dear Judge Beverungen:

My name is Amy Christopher, and my husband and two children and I live at 18 Maryland Avenue, Towson, MD 21286. We have called Aigburth Manor - our neighborhood - home for nearly seven years, and have made **significant capital improvements to our property**, including an addition of nearly 1,100 square feet, planting more than 25 native trees on our property, and landscaping the entire property. This is our forever home, and we have formed bonds with our neighbors that will last a lifetime.

When we first moved to the neighborhood, I initiated an annual summer block party to build community engagement, and I petitioned our entire block to secure speed bumps and sidewalk installation. Our neighborhood not only is home to many resident children, but serves as a pass-through neighborhood for thousands of Towson University and Towson High School students each day during the school year.

The bottom line is that my husband and I want a safe, well-kept, highly engaged community, and we commit significant dollars and time to cultivate that environment.

While I am unable to attend the hearing on the Petition for Zoning Relief, I strongly urge you to take my concerns and those of my neighbors into consideration as you review this petition. Your consideration is much appreciated.

We vehemently oppose the petition for zoning relief for Case No. 2015-0223-SPH due to the following reasons:

Rabbi Rivkin has expressed - through his actions - no interest in maintaining his properties. He
has ownership or other interest in three properties; 14 Aigburth, 12 Aigburth, and 202
Aigburth. These houses are <u>very regularly</u> (more often than not, in fact) in significant
disrepair, with piles of trash strewn about, unkempt lawns, far too many cars parked in
driveways and on lawns. These properties are not only an eyesore to our community, but also
send a signal to Towson University students (of which there are many in our neighborhood

that our community association are constantly monitoring and keeping in check) that this kind of misbehavior and neglect of property is acceptable. It is not.

- Due to the fact that the property at 202 Aigburth is on my regular walking route, I am
 confronted with the reality of its poor upkeep at least once daily. It's despicable that what
 could be a stunning example of a historic home in our otherwise lovely, quiet neighborhood,
 has essentially been lowered to "frat house" status overrun with too many tenants, trash
 cans overflowing, random interior furniture on exterior surfaces, and overgrown weeds. All of
 these symptoms are an invitation for rats and rodents, and send a signal to potential buyers in
 our neighborhood that this may not be a safe, secure neighborhood where they want to live.
- The property at 202 Aighburth is juxtaposed to a lovely cedar shake home where a Towson
 University Physics professor is an avid gardener. His property is lovingly cared for and
 maintained. Rabbi Rivkin's neglect just next door is a tragedy that neither the professor nor
 the neighborhood deserves.

Actions speak louder than words. I urge you to consider Rabbi Rivkin's actions (or lack thereof) as a strong indicator of future performance should he be allowed this zoning relief.

Dear Judge Beverungen,

Thank you for your consideration of this most important matter. My name is Florence Newman. I live at 8 Maryland Avenue, one of the older homes on the street, with a set-back of about 24 feet. My husband and I have lived here for almost 20 years. Although I am unable to attend the hearing on the Petition for Zoning Relief, I would like to express my opposition to the petition. Mr. Rivkin has not been a conscientious homeowner and landlord of the properties he owns in the neighborhood. Not only does he regularly allow grass to become overgrown at 12, 14, and 202 Aigburth Road, but he has frequently allowed litter and rubbish to accumulate at 202 Aigburth, a property that he rents out to students. During the winter, no one—neither Mr. Rivkin nor his tenants—shovels the snow and ice from the sidewalk in front of that residence, although every other homeowner in the area obeys the law concerning shoveling snow from sidewalks adjacent to their properties. Walking on the ice- and snow-covered sidewalk has been virtually impossible during the prolonged cold spells of the last couple of winters, and students on their way to Towson High School have been forced out into Aigburth Road, which is dangerous for them and for drivers.

It is not in the best interest of the community to extend Mr. Rivkin's zoning rights, given how little responsibility and concern for his neighbors he has shown up to this point.

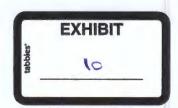

The Chabad Jewish Center at Towson and Goucher is expanding and getting a new name. The facility at 14 Aigburth Road will nearly triple its size. Its new name, Chabad of Towson, reflects the goal of the Chabad rabbi, Mendy Rivkin, to serve not only the students in those two universities but the growing Jewish community of Towson as well.

"We want to meet the demand that wants to reach us," said Rivkin, the Towson Chabad rabbi since the facility opened in 2008. Ground was broken for the new center June 1. "Now, our lack of space limits the programs we can offer. There is talk about building apartments in downtown Towson, and we need to grow to meet the needs" of anticipated Jewish residents."

The Chabad facility is part of Chabad-Lubavitch, an international Jewish outreach movement. The Towson facility is situated in a 2,200-square foot, two-story house that is set back on the lot. The addition will be built onto the front of the center, increasing its size from 3,500- to 6,000-square feet and two- to three-stories high, depending on the final architectural design.

Rivkin has talked to Baltimore County officials about the plan but is awaiting the final design before completing the permit process. He is hoping to start construction this summer and finish in one year. The addition is budgeted at \$2 million, to be funded by the national Chabad organization and local Jewish donors.

The existing Chabad facility is used for programs and as the Rivkin family's home. "With the addition, we will use it as our residence and do all the programming in the new space," he said.

SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Department of Planning has reviewed the Petition for Special Hearing to determine whether or not the property should be approved for the continued use as a residential parsonage with accessory use for religious worship and religious education.

There are several open code violations against the property as indicated in Case # CC1500406. Particularly, the address has been cited by Baltimore County Code Enforcement for the illegal use of the property as a "community building" without the benefit of a special exception and for not providing the required residential transition area buffers. Upon a site visit and consideration of the site plan, the code violations and information available on-line at

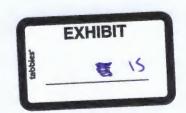

this Department agrees that the principal use of the property as a community building devoted to civic, social and educational activities (Jewish Community Center) and that the residential use on the property is ancillary. The property address is listed as being a Chabad House affiliated with Towson University.

So defined, the proposed use requires special exception approval pursuant to BCZR Section 1B01.1.C.4. The Department of Planning contends that the submitted site plan does not successfully address the conditions enumerated in BCZR Section 502.1. Further, by more than doubling the size of the structure while providing no additional parking or buffering, the Department determines that the proposed improvements are not planned in such a way that compliance with RTA use requirements, to the extent possible, will be maintained or that the special exception can otherwise be expected to be compatible with the character and general welfare of the surrounding residential premises.

It is for the reason cited above that the Department of Planning recommends denial of the petitioned zoning request.

Mr. Carl Richard, Zoning Office Supervisor, commented that the proposed use of the subject property now designated as a 'Residential Parsonage' is, de facto, a house of worship, or a community building. Other factors considered include:

The Code Enforcement Division has issued citation and correction notices pertinent to various County code violations, more specifically, to the illegal use of the subject property as a house of worship or community building. A printout of the violation notices attached for reference.

In numerous meetings with the Director of PAI and the Zoning Supervisor, the owner/petitioner failed to prove that the current and proposed use will remain as a single family dwelling use. In fact, the attachment to the petition form by the petitioner clearly indicated that the proposed use will be a residential parsonage with an accessory use for religious worship and religious education. A religious worship and education is a church use.

Section 101 of BCZR does not define religious worship, parsonage, or residential parsonage. Section 407.1 of BCZR refers churches, synagogues and other houses of worship as "church". A church or house of worship use in a DR zone is permitted by right subject to meeting the RTA (Residential Transition Area - BCZR -1B 1.1.B.1.g.4) and non-residential principal building setbacks (BCZR -1B1.2.C.1.a) regulations. A community building in the DR zone is permitted by Special Exception. A church or community building must also comply with the parking requirements per Section 409 of BCZR. The proposed use does not comply any of the RTA, non-residential building setbacks, and parking requirements.

The petitioner reasoned that the proposed use is a 'Residential Parsonage' which does not require variances for RTA, the non-residential building setbacks, the parking requirements, or a special exception for a community building. The Zoning Office disagrees. The Zoning Office always looks at the history of the violations and the intended use other than the designation of the property.

Further, a parsonage is a building, which is accessory to an existing parish property as a clergymen's residence or for congregation for its pastor's use. To wit, there is an absence of a principal use, a church or house of worship, on the subject property, for the proposed parsonage building to subordinate to and serve a principal use.

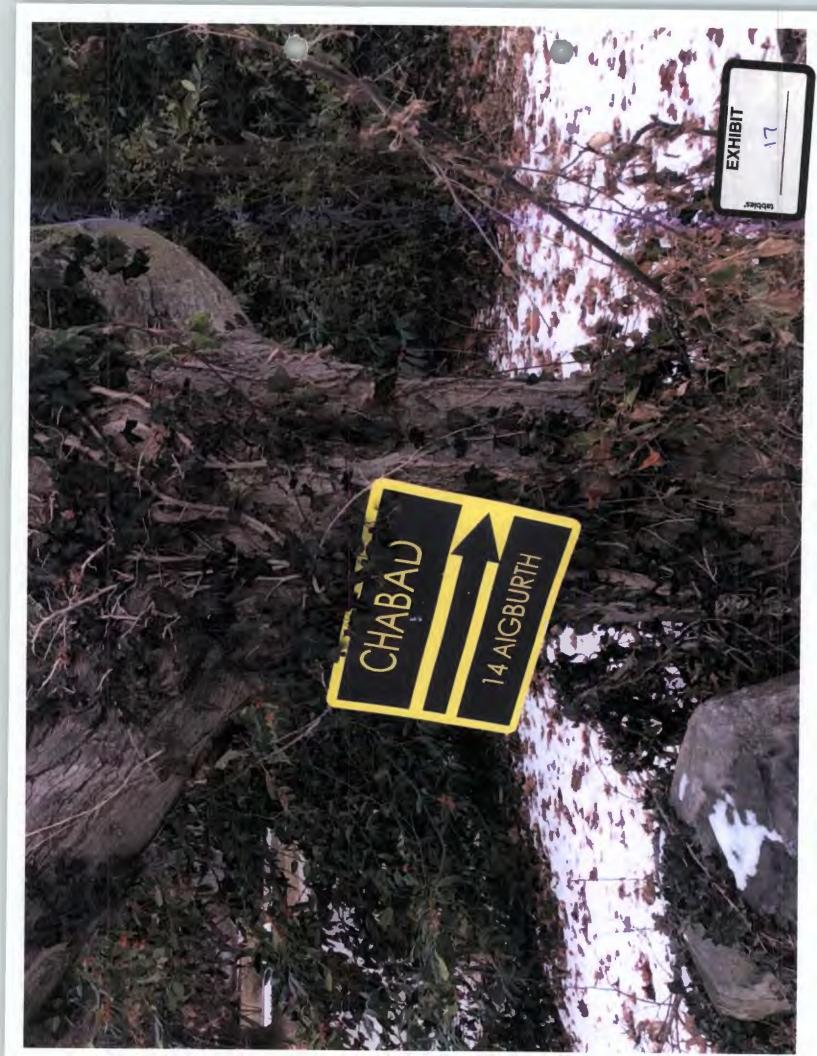

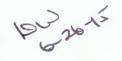

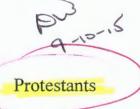

Towson University expands; Honeighbors feel growing pains

Influx of students offers benefits and challenges

As Towson University celebrates its 150th anniversary, the former teachers college continues to grow, adding programs and students.

But that growth is sparking conflict in surrounding Baltimore County neighborhoods. Even as campus leaders finetune a campus master plan and determine where to house and teach students — including an extra 2,700 expected

over the next 10 years — neighbors are complaining about problems with traffic, parking and rowdy students.

"As the university gets larger and larger, every year there are one or two or three issues that come up," said Jerry Truelove, who heads a university relations committee for Rodgers Forge, a



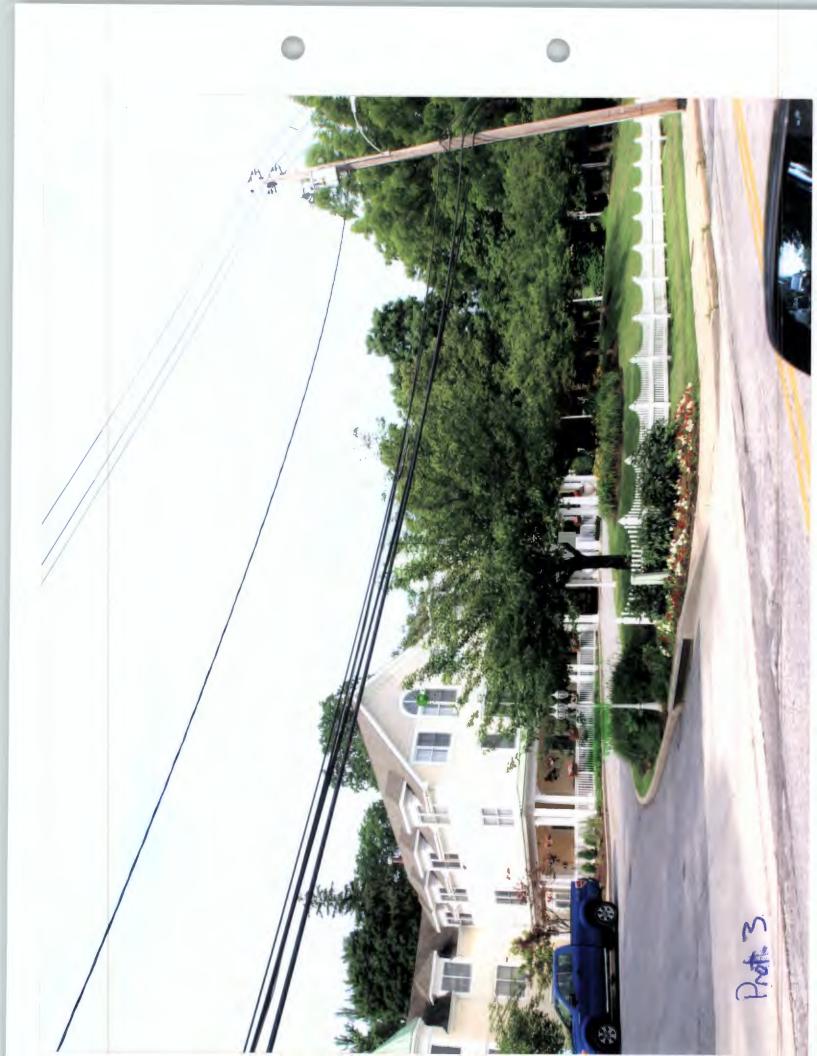

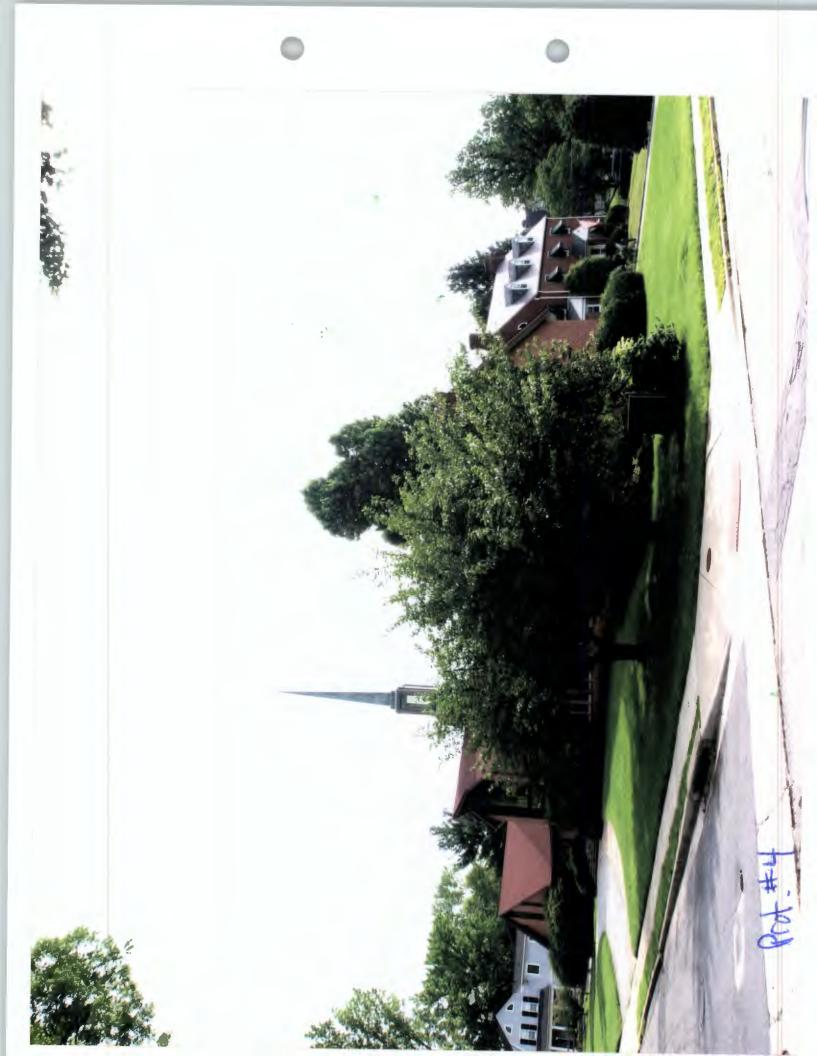

ARTICLE 1. General Provisions

SECTION 101. Definitions

§ 101.1. Word usage; definitions.

[Bill No. 149-1987]

Words used in the present tense include the future; words in the singular number include the plural number; the word "shall" is mandatory. For the purposes of these regulations, certain terms and words are defined below.

ACCESSORY APARTMENT

A second living quarters within a principal single-family detached dwelling or within an accessory building situated on the same lot as the principal single-family detached dwelling and in compliance with Section 400, with dedicated bathing and cooking facilities, and located on owner-occupied property, subject to the following:

- A. The owner may occupy either the principal dwelling or the accessory apartment;
