OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for consideration of Petitions for Special Hearing and Variance filed on behalf of the legal owners. The Special Hearing was filed pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R.") as follows: (1) to approve a modified parking plan and modified parking requirements for these contiguous uses and parcels; and (2) to approve a modification of the relief granted, certain floor areas of the listed uses and the site plat which accompanied the Petition in Case No. 2011-0209-SPH, consistent with the parking area and floor area of listed uses, all as shown on the plat which accompanies this Petition. In addition (and as an alternative to the modified parking plan special hearing request) a Petition for Variance was filed pursuant to B.C.Z.R. § 409.6.A.2 to permit 163 parking spaces in lieu of the 239 parking spaces required.

A two-sheet site plan was marked and accepted into evidence as Petitioners' Exhibit 1A & 1B. As shown thereon, the subject property is comprised of several individual parcels (Parcels 1A-1E & Parcel 2) owned by various corporate entities. Several uses are conducted on the property, including retail, restaurant, service garage and offices. Petitioners have presented a comprehensive site plan which proposes to satisfy the off-street parking requirements on an aggregate basis by way of a modified parking agreement.

Appearing at the public hearing in support of the requests was John Koutrakos, Geoffrey Schultz and Andy McIlvaine. Howard L. Alderman, Jr., Esq. appeared and represented the Petitioners. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations. No protestants or interested citizens attended. Substantive Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were submitted by the Department of Planning (DOP) and the Bureau of Development Plans Review (DPR).

PETITION FOR SPECIAL HEARING

The petition for special hearing seeks approval of a modified parking plan, as provided in B.C.Z.R. §§ 409.13 and 409.8. Mr. Schultz testified (via proffer) the Petitioners satisfied the standards set forth in the above sections, and I concur. No evidence was presented to suggest that parking at this site has been problematic or deficient in any respect. Counsel for Petitioners correctly noted that the current site plan (the approval of which is sought in the second special hearing request) in effect creates a "campus" with the various buildings and uses shown thereon, and a modified parking plan (rather than a variance) seems to be the appropriate mechanism to address a unique site such as this.

The Bureau of DPR noted in its ZAC comment a landscape plan is required, and the Order below includes such a condition. The DOP expressed concern that the State of Maryland did not sign the petition, though it is the legal owner of a small portion of the site (Parcel 2) leased by Petitioners. Counsel noted the State, while it did not support or oppose the zoning requests, did not object to the filing of the petition, and a letter from the Maryland Transit Administration (MTA) (Exhibit 3) to that effect was submitted by Petitioners. In addition, while in an ordinary case every owner must sign the petition, this case is unusual in that the State of Maryland is one of the owners. The State is not subject to county zoning laws, and for that reason also it is not necessary for that entity to sign the zoning petition.

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The other concern raised by the DOP related to a proposed shared-use bicycle path that would traverse a portion of the property owned by the MTA. The State leases that property to Petitioners, and the area in question is identified on the plan as Parcel 2, 0.34 acres. According to the documents submitted at the hearing, the "License Agreement" permits Petitioners to use the space for the sole purpose of customer parking. That agreement began on May 25, 2006, and the initial term expired on May 25, 2011. The agreement, absent a notice of termination, renews for "successive one-year periods." Exhibit 2. Should the plans for the bicycle path come to fruition, the State would have the ability as owner to terminate the agreement with Petitioners, assuming of course it was inclined to do so and was supportive of the bike path project.

By letter dated July 16, 2015, Michael Pierce asserts that Petitioners failed to satisfy the posting and notice requirements set forth in the County Code. Having reviewed Mr. Pierce's correspondence, I believe he has a point. The petition, sign, advertisement and all case notices provide an address of 10810 Cockeysville Road, which is incorrect. That address is in fact on York Road and Mr. Pierce notes that a sign was not placed on that road. Even so, the subject property was posted (at 18 Cockeysville Road, which is among the properties for which relief was sought) and it is not clear that the regulations would require a second sign to be posted on York Road. In these circumstances I believe Petitioners "substantially complied" with the notice requirements of the County Code, which is all the law requires. Cassidy v. Balto. Co., 218 Md. 418, 425 (1958). The caption on this Order was changed to reflect the York Road address, and Petitioners will be required to submit an amended zoning petition with the correct address.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED this <u>23rd</u> day of **July**, **2015**, by this Administrative Law Judge, that the Petition for Special Hearing pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R) as follows: (1) to approve a modified parking plan and modified parking requirements for these contiguous uses and parcels; and (2) to approve a modification of the relief ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING

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granted, certain floor areas of the listed uses and the site plat which accompanied the Petition in Case No. 2011-0209-SPH, consistent with the parking area and floor area of listed uses, all as shown on the plat (Exhibits 1A & 1B) which accompanies this Petition, be and is hereby GRANTED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Petition for Variance pursuant to B.C.Z.R. § 409.6.A.2 to permit 163 parking spaces in lieu of the 239 parking spaces required, be and is hereby DISMISSED without PREJUDICE (as unnecessary).

The relief granted herein shall be subject to and conditioned upon the following:

- 1. Petitioners may apply for necessary permits and/or licenses upon receipt of this Order. However, Petitioners are hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at their own risk until 30 days from the date hereof, during which time an appeal can be filed by any party. If for whatever reason this Order is reversed, Petitioners would be required to return the subject property to its original condition.
- 2. Petitioners must submit for approval by Baltimore County a landscape plan for the site.
- 3. Petitioners must within 15 days of the date hereof submit an amended zoning petition (face page only) with the correct address for the parcel owned by SS&H II, LLC.

Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter comes before this Deputy Zoning Commissioner for consideration of Petitions for Special Hearing and Variance filed by John Koutrakos on behalf of SS&H II, LLC (Parcel 1B), Spartan Foods, Inc. (Parcels 1A and 1C), and the Maryland Department of Transportation, Mass Transit Administration (MTA) (Parcel 2), the legal owners of the subject properties. The Special Hearing request was filed in accordance with Section 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.), utilizing all previously granted zoning relief, to permit a modified parking plan and modified parking requirements for these contiguous uses and parcels pursuant to Sections 409.12.B and 409.8.B.1 of the B.C.Z.R.; and to approve an amendment to the site plan in Case No. 99-301-X consistent with the relief requested and site plan to accompany this Petition. The Variance is in the alternative in the event the modified parking plan is not approved as part of the Special Hearing request, and requests relief from Section 409.6.A.2 of the B.C.Z.R. to permit the existing configuration and total of 85 parking spaces as depicted on the mixed-use, adjusted parking requirements shown on the site plan in lieu of the 131 parking spaces required. The subject property and requested relief are more fully described on the site plan which was marked and accepted into evidence as Petitioner's Exhibit 1.

Appearing at the requisite public hearing in support of the requested special hearing and variance relief was Petitioner John Koutrakos on behalf of SS&H II, LLC and Spartan Foods, Inc., and his attorney, Howard L. Alderman, Jr., Esquire. Also appearing in support of the requested relief was Geoffrey C. Schultz with McKee & Associates, Inc., the professional land surveyor who prepared the site plan. There were no Protestants or other interested persons in attendance at the hearing.

Testimony and evidence offered revealed that the subject properties (Parcels 1A, 1B, 1C, and 2) are irregular-shaped and consist of approximately 1.12 acres, more or less. The property owned by Petitioner (Parcels 1A, 1B, and 1C) consists of approximately .93 acre and is zoned B.L.-A.S. The property owned by the MTA (Parcel 2) consists of approximately .19 acre and is zoned B.L.-A.S. and B.M.-A.S. The property at issue in this case primarily involves Petitioner's property (Parcels 1A, 1B, and 1C) and is located at the northwest corner of York Road and Cockeysville Road in the Cockeysville area of Baltimore County. The MTA's property (Parcel 2) has peripheral relevance because the MTA and Petitioner have a long term lease and licensure agreement for Petitioner to use parking on the property.

Petitioner's property is improved with three buildings labeled on the site plan as Buildings A, B, and C. Building A is a one-story masonry building with a basement and is located primarily on Parcel 1B at the southeast corner facing York Road, with a very small portion of the building on Parcel 1A. The first floor (with an area of 2,700 square feet) is currently used as a restaurant and the basement (with an area of 2,592 square feet) is used for storage. Building B is also a one-story masonry building with a basement and is located on the east side of Parcel 1B facing York Road. The first floor (with an area of 8,167 square feet) is currently used for retail and the basement (with an area of 8,264 square feet) is used as a warehouse. There is a small area of open

space between Buildings A and B. Building C is a three-story frame building located on Parcel 1C. The first floor (with an area of 1,381 square feet) is used for retail and the second floor (with an area of 869 square feet) is used as an apartment.

Petitioner desires to expand the restaurant use on the property beyond Building A and into part of Building B. In particular, Petitioner wishes to utilize 3,190 square feet of the first floor of Building B for restaurant use. This is a permitted use in the B.L.-A.S. zone; however, the proposed restaurant use changes the overall parking requirements for the site and necessitates special hearing relief for approval of a modified parking plan. In the alternative, Petitioner requests a variance in the number of parking spaces required. In addition, Petitioner requests an amendment of the site plan in previous zoning Case No. 99-301-X in order to specifically abandon the special exception use that was granted in that case for an automotive service garage. A copy of that decision was marked and accepted into evidence as Petitioner's Exhibit 3.

As to the modified parking plan, further evidence revealed that for the current mixed uses on the property, there are 68 parking spaces on the subject property and 17 spaces on the adjacent property owned by the MTA and leased by Petitioner, for a total of 85 spaces. The 17 spaces on the MTA property are within 500 feet walking distance of the building entrance to the use that such spaces serve in accordance with Section 409.7.B.1 of the B.C.Z.R. As indicated by Petitioner and reviewed and verified by Petitioner's consultant, Mr. Schultz, the current parking configuration and allotment of spaces is more than adequate to support the current restaurant, retail, and storage uses. As indicated on the Site Tabulation of the site plan, the expansion of the current restaurant use from 2,700 square feet to 5,890 square feet (and the attendant reduction in retail use from 9,548 square feet to 6,358 square feet) requires a total of 131 spaces, with the existing 85 parking spaces provided. Mr. Schultz indicated he is very familiar with the site and

has visited the site on numerous occasions. The uses will be a mix of primarily restaurant and retail (antiques) and based on his expertise, he sees this as an overlapping of uses for parking purposes. Specifically, he indicated that although some customers will patronize the restaurant and shopping area separately, very often, customers that visit the property will patronize both the retail area and the restaurant all at once. As a practical matter, this overlapping of uses will reduce the actual number of parking spaces required to support these uses. In addition, there is available street parking on York Road along the front of Buildings A and B. In his opinion, Mr. Schultz believes the number of parking spaces provided will be sufficient to meet the needs of the uses and the modified parking plan as shown on the site plan meets the prescribed standards and requirements set forth in Section 502.1 of the B.C.Z.R.

As to the alternative request for variance, the evidence revealed that the property has a number of unusual characteristics, including that it is irregular-shaped and has existing topographical constraints as shown on the site plan. In addition, the buildings located on the property are existing and have been so for a number of years, and Petitioner emphasizes that there are no new uses proposed for the property that are not permitted by the zoning regulations. Moreover, the area where the subject property is located is a heavily commercial corridor with mixed uses of retail, fast-food, carryout, and dine-in restaurants, banks, fuel service stations, carwashes, and automotive service garages. Finally, the relief requested is completely internal to the subject property and has no effect or impact on adjacent or nearby properties.

The Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were received and are made part of the record of this case. Comments were received from the Department of Environmental Protection and Resource Management dated March 25, 2008 which indicates that the property must comply with the Forest Conservation Regulations.

In regard to the requested special hearing, based on the testimony and evidence, I am persuaded to grant the relief and permit a modified parking plan and modified parking requirements for the planned uses on these contiguous parcels. It is evident that the current parking configuration is sufficient to meet the needs of the primarily restaurant and retail uses of the property. In my judgment, the additional restaurant use and reduced retail use will have no appreciable effect on the parking needs for these uses, and having heard no evidence to the contrary, I shall grant the special hearing relief. I shall also grant the special hearing relief to approve an amendment to the site plan in Case No. 99-301-X to specifically abandon the special exception use in Building C for an automotive service garage previously granted in that case. According to Petitioner, after obtaining the special exception, the relief was never utilized and remained as first floor retail and a second floor apartment. Although the ability to utilize the special exception from the previous case has likely expired in any event, I shall nonetheless grant the special hearing to amend the site plan in Case No. 99-301-X.

In regard to the request for variance, in granting the special hearing relief, the variance is now rendered moot; however, in assessing this request and the testimony and evidence presented, if I were to consider this case under the variance standard, I would find that special circumstances or conditions exist that are peculiar to the land or structure which is the subject of the variance request. In particular, the irregular shape, the topographical constraints on the property, and the fact that the relief requested is to legitimize existing conditions leads me to find the property unique in a zoning sense. I also find that the imposition of zoning on this property would disproportionately impact the subject property as compared with other properties in the area, and that strict compliance with the Zoning Regulations for Baltimore County would result in practical difficulty or unreasonable hardship. Finally, I am persuaded that the variance relief could be

granted in strict harmony with the spirit and intent of said regulations and in a manner so as to grant relief without injury to the public health, safety and general welfare. Hence, I would grant the variance relief if not for the granting of the special hearing relief.

Pursuant to the advertisement, posting of the property, and public hearing on this petition held, and after considering the testimony and evidence offered by Petitioner, I find that Petitioner's special hearing requests should be granted with conditions and that the variance request should be dismissed as moot.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED by the Deputy Zoning Commissioner for Baltimore County, this 27th day of June, 2008 that Petitioner's request for Special Hearing relief filed pursuant to Section 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.), utilizing all previously granted zoning relief, to permit a modified parking plan and modified parking requirements for these contiguous uses and parcels pursuant to Sections 409.12.B and 409.8.B.1 of the B.C.Z.R.; and to approve an amendment to the site plan in Case No. 99-301-X consistent with the relief requested and site plan to accompany this Petition be and is hereby GRANTED; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Petitioner's alternative request for Variance from Section 409.6.A.2 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) to permit the existing configuration and total of 85 parking spaces as depicted on the mixed-use, adjusted parking requirements shown on the Plat to Accompany these Petitions in lieu of the 131 parking spaces required is hereby DISMISSED as moot.

The relief granted herein is subject to the following:

 Petitioner may apply for permits and be granted same upon receipt of this Order; however, Petitioner is hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at its own risk until such time as the 30-day appellate process from this Order has expired. If, for whatever reason, this Order is reversed, Petitioner will be required to return, and be responsible for returning, said property to its original condition. 2. Development of this property must comply with the Forest Conservation Regulations (Sections 33-6-101 through 33-6-122 of the Baltimore County Code).

Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

The Department of Planning has reviewed the Petition for a Special Hearing to determine whether the Administrative Law Judge should approve 1) a modified parking plan and modified parking requirements for the contiguous uses and parcels subject to the request, and 2) approve the modification of the relief granted, certain floor areas of the listed uses and the site plat which accompanied the Petition in Case No. 2011-0209-SPH, consistent with parking area and floor area of listed uses as shown on the plat accompanying the petition. The Department has also reviewed the Petition for Variance to permit the existing configuration and total of 163 parking spaces in lieu of the 239 parking spaces required submitted in the alternative. No authorized person representing the MTA, Maryland Department of Transportation, a named Petitioner, has signed the petition.

The Department reserves specific comment until such time that it is satisfied the petition is properly acknowledged and signed by all legal owners. If the case goes forward, the Department respectfully requests the file remain open to afford the Department the opportunity to comment prior to the Administrative Law Judge's issuing a decision and order. The following is advisory.

The subject area accommodates multiple commercial enterprises employing a sizeable workforce. The site is within the Hunt Valley/Timonium Master Plan Area but will have no impact on the York Road frontage. Further, the proposal raises no issues with the "Cockeysville Historic Area" as identified in the Plan. Said Plan identifies connecting and creating more opportunities to utilize the Light Rail as a goal. The Baltimore County Pedestrian and Bicycle Access Plan envisions the potential use of the abandoned rail corridor now owned by the MTA for a bicycle connection between the Light Rail and the

North Central Trail (Proposed Shared Use Path Improvement List, Item No. 876, Pln. Pg. 15). This connection is also identified as a "missing link" in the Statewide Trails Plan, "A Greener Way to Go".

The proposed project involves the "Cockeysville Freight Depot" {MIHP # BA-0886}. The applicant is responsible for satisfying any requirements under Federal Section 106 Regulations. It is advised that the applicant contact the Maryland Historical Trust's Compliance & Review section to coordinate any necessary review in the event improvements are made. http://mht.maryland.gov/projectreview.shtml

Any plan for improvements to the property should include a landscape plan showing the location of dumpsters, submitted to the Baltimore County Landscape Architect for approval.

I am in receipt of your letter dated June 11, 2009 and attachments concerning the above-referenced matter. In this matter, your client had originally requested special hearing relief (and alternatively variance relief) to essentially permit a modified parking plan and modified parking requirements for the uses and parcels that comprise the subject property. In particular, your client requested approval of a plan for 85 parking spaces in lieu of the 131 spaces required. The special hearing relief was granted pursuant to my Order dated June 27, 2008.

In your letter, you indicate that at this juncture, some of the uses on the subject property have changed slightly. The warehouse, storage, and apartment uses and square footage have remained the same; however, the restaurant and retail areas have been altered. Rather than utilizing a portion of Building "B" for restaurant use, your client has found the open patio area between Buildings "A" and "B" to be attractive to patrons dining there. As a result, the overall restaurant area, including the use of the patio, has been reduced from a planned 6,358 square feet to 4,887 square feet, and the retail area has been increased from 8,264 square feet to 9,548 square feet. According to your letter and the redlined site plan, these changes in use have not altered the 131 space parking requirement, nor the 85 available parking spaces approved in my Order. As such, you have requested a determination that the reconfigured uses are within the spirit and intent of my Order.

After reviewing your letter, the accompanying redlined site plan showing the changes, my June 27, 2008 Order, and the Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments, in my judgment the reconfigured uses are within the spirit and intent of my previous Order. While some of the square footage has changed vis-à-vis the restaurant and retail uses, the overall parking requirements and parking allocations have not. Hence, I believe the redlined site plan is within the spirit and intent of my Order.

Dear Judge Beverungen:

Imagine my complete surprise when my secretary handed me a copy of a letter, dated July 16, 2015, addressed to you from Michael Pierce. Mr. Pierce, who lives between 16 and 18 miles from the subject property (depending on which route is chosen in Google Maps) claims he was denied the chance to appear at the hearing that you conducted on Tuesday, July 14th relative to the above-referenced property.

As you will recall, the evidence in the file reviewed at the outset of the hearing was sufficient for you to determine and declare that the posting and advertising requirements had been met. The Petitioners posted the sign as directed by the County requirements for the required period of time. The Petitioners paid for the legal advertising in the newspaper, which the County arranged. The addresses on the Petition (and attachment) as prepared and filed by the Petitioner were, in no particular order: 10800, 10810 and 10850 Cockeysville Road, and 14 and 16 Cockeysville Road.

Notwithstanding actual notice having been given by posting and publication, Mr. Pierce claims that the notice was not added to the County website pursuant to Baltimore County Code ("Code"). Such notice, if required, is the responsibility of the County pursuant to Code § 32-3-302(b)(1)(iii). Whether or not the hearing notice was included on the County website we will never know other than with reference to Mr. Pierce's allegations.

The Petitioner hereby requests that Mr. Pierce's request for 're-hearing' be denied. Mr. Pierce does not have standing to make the request or to even participate in the original hearing. Mr. Pierce's letter identifies his address as "7448 Bradshaw Road, Kingsville, Maryland 21087". As noted above, that address is well over 16 miles from the subject properties. As such, Mr Pierce does not meet the minimum threshold test of living "within the sight and sound" of the subject properties. Moreover, based on information and belief, Mr. Pierce is unable to allege any special effect or distinct impact the requested relief would have on him to qualify as "plus factors" supporting specific injury that would confer standing on him as an interested person. See Benn Ray v. Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, 430 Md. 74, 85 (2013); Committee for Responsible Dev. On 25th

Street v. Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, 137 Md. App. 60, 86 (2001); Bryniarski v. Montgomery County Board of Appeals, 247 Md. 137 (1967). In fact, Mr. Pierce would have to leave his home and drive for approximately 20 minutes before he would be within either sight or sound of the subject properties.

Every hearing that has been held on these properties over the years has been properly advertised and posted. In the three or four hearings where the undersigned has represented the Petitioners there have never been any Protestants or other interested persons.

Please consider this letter Petitioners' request that your decision and order be issued and that the request for re-hearing be denied.

- 1. The posting of the property showed the address as 10810 Cockeysville Rd and was placed in front of 18 Cockeysville Rd. I believe the posting requirements would also require a sign on the York Rd frontage. (photo of sign in file)
- 2. The announcement in the Jeffersonian on June 23 listed the case as 10810 Cockeysville Rd (clipping of ad in file)
- 3. It was never posted on the Baltimore County website as required by Council Bill 15-12 which added this requirement to §32-3-302 of the County Code. See attached screen shot of County online schedule for July 14 taken at 4PM July 14. (After being updated on July 16 with other cases, this one is still not listed.) In addition, it was not added to the County's MyNeighborhood website as cases regularly are well in advance of a hearing.

There were apparently no protestants at the hearing. It is unknown how many citizens besides myself may have been denied the chance to appear at this hearing because of these mistakes.

I request that this hearing be re-scheduled and reheard.
