OPINION

The case comes to the Board as a *de novo* appeal of the decision of Administrative Law Judge John Beverungen ("ALJ") dated October 28, 2015 granting in part and denying in part a Petition for Special Hearing filed on behalf of William and Karen Chandler, Legal Owners of the subject property, and Anitra and Jerome Schorr, Contract Purchasers (together, "Petitioners"). The Petition requested the following relief: 1) a determination of the number of lots of record and rights of subdivision (density) for the subject tract, and 2) approval of a lot line adjustment and/or density configuration to facilitate the appropriate and permitted residential development of the subject tract.

The Board held an evidentiary hearing on this matter on April 26, 2016. Lawrence E. Schmidt, Esquire, appeared on behalf of the Petitioners' and Carole S. Demilio, Esquire, Deputy People's Counsel appeared on behalf of People's Counsel for Baltimore County. At the hearing before the Board, Assistant County Attorney, R. Brady Locher, Esquire, for the first time, entered an appearance on behalf of Baltimore County.

BACKGROUND

The subject property at issue is more particularly described on the site plan submitted and marked into evidence as Petitioners' Exhibit 1. The property is a large tract of land, split zoned

RC 7 and RC 2 and located in the White Hall community of Baltimore County. In a Deed dated February 1977, the tract was described as containing approximately 110 acres (Pet. Ex. 2). Out of this approximately 110-acre tract, BGE acquired, by fee simple deed, two parcels totaling 19.7 acres in June and July 1968. The BGE property bisects Petitioners' tract into north and south properties. (Pet. Ex. 2).

Petitioners contend that the subject property now contains eight (8) density lots. They also note that a single family dwelling currently exists on site so that there remains seven (7) density rights on the property. People's Counsel disagrees, arguing that the property contains only six (6) density rights.

As to the second aspect of the Petition, the lot line adjustment, Petitioners contend that the this Board is permitted to create a lot on the 20.5-acre RC 2-zoned portion of the property where a proposed dwelling would be located and which contains two density rights.

People's Counsel filed a timely appeal of this decision and the Board held a hearing on this matter on April 26, 2016. Counsel submitted briefs in lieu of closing arguments. The Board held a Public Deliberation on June 1, 2016.

DISCUSSION

I. Standard of Review

The Petition for Special Hearing was filed pursuant to BCZR § 500.7. That provision permits an interested party to petition for a hearing to, *inter alia*, "determine any rights whatsoever of such person in any property in Baltimore County insofar as they are affected by these regulations." According to the Court of Special Appeals, "[a] request for special hearing is, in legal effect, a request for a declaratory judgment." Antwerpen v. Baltimore County, 163 Md. App. 194, 209 (2005).

II. Density Units for the Subject Property

Petitioners and People's Counsel agree that two density units exist in the 6.1-acre RC 2 lot of record north of the BGE property. As to the remaining property, they disagree as to whether the BGE strip resulted in two separate RC 7 parcels, or one large combined RC 7 acreage, and whether the acreage to the south of the BGE parcel should be considered one or two lots of record.

Petitioners argue that the BGE property, being a fee simple parcel that bisects the RC 7 land, created two separate RC 7 lots of record, north and south of the BGE property. People's Counsel maintains to the contrary that the BGE fee simple property is akin to a road, easement, or right of way, and that the portions to the north and south of the BGE land should not be considered separate parcels. Whether the RC 7 land is viewed as a single parcel, or two distinct lots, the parties agree that the RC 7 portion(s) of the subject property would yield two density rights per parcel. The Board finds that the BGE land, acquired by fee simple deed, created two distinct parcels for purposes of density calculations.

The remaining area of disagreement lies in the southern portion of the property, below the BGE land. People's Counsel maintains that the southern RC 2 property, shown on Petitioners' Ex. 1 in dark and light green, should be considered one lot of record totaling 27 acres, and thus entitled to two density units. According to People's Counsel, a prior owner merged a prior 5-acre lot and a 22-acre area into a single RC 2 zoned area of 27 acres. In support of this position, People's Counsel points to a 2002 Deed and argues that this Deed described the entire site in a single description, saving and excepting only the BGE land. People's Counsel further maintains that any prior lot line between the two parcels was thereby extinguished and that the resulting single 27-

acre parcel would support two density units. People's Counsel did not offer any expert testimony in support of their argument.

Petitioners argue to the contrary. They assert that the southern property remains two separate RC 2 lots of record, each of which yields two density rights. Petitioners offered the testimony of Land Surveyor Kenneth Wells, who was accepted as an expert in land surveying, development and zoning, to establish that there are two rather than one lot of record. According to Mr. Wells, the focus is on November 1979, when RC 2 zoning was initiated.² He testified that at that time, the approximate 6-acre parcel shown in light green on the site plan was considered a separate piece of land. Mr. Wells stated that this lot was separately identified by a metes and bounds description by a deed recorded in the Baltimore County land records in February 1977. His testimony is uncontroverted by any other testimony.

Based on his evaluation of the property and its history, Mr. Wells concluded that the southern portion of the property yielded two separate RC 2 "lots of record" as defined in BCZR §101.1, each of which provided two density rights for a total of four density units. Mr. Wells further opined that in total, the subject property has eight density units. We agree with Mr. Wells' opinion that the subject property contains eight density rights.

III. Lot Line Adjustment

Petitioners also have requested that the Board approve a lot line adjustment and/or density reconfiguration to facilitate permitted residential development of the subject property. Petitioners emphasize that they are not creating a subdivision, not creating an additional lot, and not increasing the density. Instead, they state they seek reconfiguration of the existing lots so that the contract

² The BCZR defines a lot of record" as a "parcel of land with boundaries as recorded in the land records of Baltimore County" on the same date as of the effective zoning regulation – here, 1979. See BCZR §101.1.

purchasers can build one house on the portion of the property shown in dark green on the site plan.

Mr. Wells testified that such an adjustment was appropriate, and People's Counsel did not offer any testimony to the contrary.

Section 32-4-106 of the Baltimore County Code identifies proposed development plans that are exempt from the general development review process. Subdivision (a)(viii) provides an exemption for:

Lot line adjustments in residential zones for lots that are not part of an approved Development Plan under this title or an approved Development Plan under Article 1B of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations. For purposes of this subsection, "lot line adjustment" means one or more alterations of a divisional property line or lines between two or more lots in common ownership or by agreement of the owners, provided that the alteration does not result in an increase or decrease in the number of lots and there is no increase in total residential density available to the lots considered as a whole. . . .

BCC § 32-4-106(a)(viii). Petitioner has acknowledged that they "will need to file an application to the County's Development Review Committee ("DRC") to obtain [this] exemption." (Petitioners' Memorandum at 17.) The Board agrees and declines to issue a declaration as to the propriety of whether or not the requested zoning relief should be granted.

ORDER

THEREFORE, IT IS THIS 25 day of August _____, 2016 by the Board of Appeals of Baltimore County

ORDERED that the Petition for Special Hearing pursuant to B.C.Z.R. §500.7: (1) to determine the number of lots of record and rights of subdivision (density) for the subject tract, split zoned RC2 and RC7; and (2) to approve a lot line adjustment and/or density reconfiguration to facilitate the appropriate and permitted residential development of the subject tract, be and is hereby GRANTED in part and DENIED in part, as follows:

- A. The subject property owned by Petitioners contains eight (8) density rights, although a single family dwelling exists on site. As such, there remain seven (7) density rights on the overall tract, as set forth herein.
- B. The proposed single family building lot in the southwest corner of the property, outlined on the site plan in blue is permitted under the RC 2 density and use regulations, although that lot must be created through the Baltimore County subdivision and development process.

Any petition for judicial review from this decision must be made in accordance with Rule 7-201 through Rule 7-210 of the *Maryland Rules*.

PURPOSE:

To deliberate a Petition for Special Hearing to:

1) determine the number of lots of record and rights of subdivision

(density) for the subject tract, split zoned RC2 and RC7;

2) to approve a lot line adjustment and/or density reconfiguration to facilitate the appropriate and permitted residential development of the

subject tract.

PANEL MEMBERS DISCUSSED THE FOLLOWING:

STANDING

• The Board reviewed the history of this matter.

- The Board held a de novo hearing at which time the parties presented their case. Kenneth Wells
 testified as an expert witness on behalf of the Petitioners. It was noted that although there was
 contradictory testimony, there was no contradictory expert testimony presented.
- The Board discussed the number of lots of record. Petitioner presented evidence of 8 lots of record, and with an existing dwelling, there would be 7. People's Counsel argued that there are only 6 lots. The Board determined that regardless of how they calculate the number of lots, they agree that there are 8 lots.
- The Board then discussed the lot line adjustment. The Petitioners are asking for the lot line adjustment in order for their child, the Contract Purchaser, to construct a house. There will be no increase in density.
- The Board noted that it is unusual for the County to be involved in this type of case. The County
 argued that the Petitioner must go through the subdivision process to create the lot. The
 Petitioner argues that a lot was already created by the 2002 Deed, but which Deed also created an
 illegal subdivision.
- The Board noted there was some confusion as to the lot lines which were left on the illegal Deeds. Mr. Wells testified that the Petitioners are not requesting anything as a result of the illegal Deeds and that the lines were for reference only. The Board finds that by moving the lines no additional density is created. It was also noted that the Petitioner has agreed to go through the subdivision process for the lot on which the new house will be constructed.
- The Board then discussed the Standing issue of the County, as the County did not participate at the hearing below. BCC § 32-3-401, Appeals to the Board of Appeals by County Agencies, states that if a County agency feels aggrieved by a decision of the Zoning Commissioner (k/n/a Administrative Law Judge), they cannot appeal without the prior approval of the County Administrative Officer and the County Attorney. There was no evidence presented that prior approval was given.

WILLIAM AND KAREN CHANDLER – LEGAL OWNER ANITRA AND JEROME SCHORR – CONTRACT PURCHASER 16-025-SPH MINUTES OF DELIBERATION

DECISION BY THE BOARD MEMBERS:

The Board determined that there are 8 lots of record; finds that the lot line adjustment will not add density to the property; and finds that the County does not have standing to participate in the case.

<u>FINAL DECISION:</u> After thorough review of the facts, testimony, and law in the matter, the Board unanimously agreed to GRANT the requested relief.

OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for consideration of a Petition for Special Hearing filed on behalf of William M.B., Jr., and Karen Chandler, legal owners of the subject property, and Anitra and Jerome Schorr, contract purchasers ("Petitioners"). The Special Hearing was filed pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R."): (1) to determine the number of lots of record and rights of subdivision (density) for the subject tract, split zoned RC 2 and RC 7; and (2) to approve a lot line adjustment and/or density reconfiguration to facilitate the appropriate and permitted residential development of the subject tract.

Appearing at the public hearing in support of the request was William and Karen Chandler and surveyor Ken Wells. Lawrence E. Schmidt, Esq. represented the Petitioners. Petitioners' immediate neighbors attended the hearing to obtain additional information about the requests. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations. Substantive Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were received from the Department of Planning (DOP). That agency did not opposed the request, but provided suggested conditions for inclusion in the final Order.

This case involves a large tract of land that is split zoned RC-7 and RC-2. Counsel presented the facts by proffer, and as is frequently the case in matters involving large parcels of rural land, the devolution of title and determination of development/density rights can be quite difficult and convoluted.

The tract of land at issue in this case was originally described as containing "110.897 acres of land more or less." *See* Deed dated February 1977 (Liber 5731, folio 762). This 1977 deed reflects that a portion of the overall acreage was conveyed to the grantor in October 1975 (5580/311) by Baltimore County, as discussed in more detail below. The 1977 deed also contained two "saving and excepting" clauses, wherein it was recited that in June and July 1968 BGE acquired two parcels totaling 19.7 acres +/-, which were out-conveyed from the original 110.897 acre tract. The utility acquired these parcels by fee simple deed, and the tract owned by Petitioners is in fact bisected into north and south portions by the BGE property. This is a crucial and pivotal fact, and counsel argues it creates separate parcels for determination of density. I agree, based upon the circuit court's holding in the case of HZ Properties, LLC, (No. 03-C-13-006824). In that case, the court held that a conveyance to BGE (which like this case also occurred in 1968) was a grant of ownership in fee simple "as opposed to a conveyance of an 'easement' or 'right of way,'" for purposes of B.C.Z.R. §1A01.3.B.1.

I believe cases from other jurisdictions support this interpretation. A fee simple conveyance, according to fundamental principles of real property law, creates "separate ownership" and therefore noncontiguous parcels. See, e.g., Lovinger v. Lane County, 138 P.3d 51, 54-56 (Or. 2006). As such, the BGE property creates separate north and south parcels at the site for purposes of density calculations. Accounting for the BGE conveyances noted above, Petitioners currently own approximately 91.5 acres of land, which was acquired by deed in

December 2002 (17566/385, totaling 58.7 acres) and April 2011 (30828/179, containing 32.8 acres).

Density Calculations

The site plan in this case was revised (as requested by the DOP) to depict each parcel or lot individually, along with its zoning classification and density. Petitioners contend (as shown on the plan) they are entitled to eight (8) total lots or density units throughout the entire tract. Having reviewed the deeds, site plan and other exhibits, I concur. The property is presently improved with a single family dwelling (Petitioners' residence) which would constitute one (1) density unit, and thus seven (7) additional lots would be permitted as discussed in detail below.

A "lot of record" is defined under the B.C.Z.R. as a "parcel of land with boundaries as recorded in the land records of Baltimore County..." as of [in this case] 1979. B.C.Z.R. §101.1. Employing this definition, the northern portion of the site contains two (2) "lots of record." One was created by deed and one by virtue of HZ Properties, LLC, which supports Petitioners' claim that the conveyances to BGE in 1968 created a separate lot. One of the lots is located in the northeast corner of the tract. It is 6.1 acres and was created by deed (referenced above) dated October 1975 (5580/311). This lot is zoned RC 2, and would therefore yield two (2) density rights per B.C.Z.R. §1A01.3.B.1. The other parcel is (according to the site plan) approximately 26.2 acres, and is located to the north of the BGE property which creates a "separate parcel for the purpose of calculating the number of lots of record." B.C.Z.R. §1A01.3.B.1. This land is zoned RC 7 and would yield one (1) lot or density right. Thus, three (3) density rights exist on the northern tract.

The southern portion of the site, like the northern tract, contains two (2) "lots of record." One (6.0 acres in size) was created by deed as referenced above in October 1975 (5580/311). This

property is split zoned RC 2/RC 7. It is located in the southeastern portion of the tract, and its boundaries are outlined in red on the plan. The RC 2 portion, which exceeds two acres, provides two (2) density rights. Petitioners' dwelling is located in this portion of the lot. Thus, only one (1) density right remains in the RC 2 zoned portion of this lot. The RC 7 portion of this lot is too small to provide any density.

The other lot is (according to the site plan) approximately 61.9 acres and is split-zoned RC 2/RC 7. Petitioners acquired this property by deeds dated December 2002 and April 2011, as referenced above. This lot was created by virtue of the fact that it is bound on the north by the BGE property which bifurcates the overall tract. The RC 2 portion of the lot is 20.5 acres and yields two (2) density rights. The RC 7 portion is 41.4 acres and therefore contains one (1) density unit. Thus, five (5) density rights exist on the southern tract, although one has been used for Petitioners' home.

Though I hesitate to do so for fear of injecting further confusion into an already complicated scenario, I believe for sake of an accurate assessment I am required to identify an issue concerning the illegal subdivision by deed of this property. In December 2002, K & B Homes, LLC conveyed by deed (17566/385, identified earlier) to Petitioners 58.72 acres of land. K & B purported in that conveyance to create two lots designated therein as "Part A" and "Part B." This was an illegal subdivision, and counsel noted that the principals of that entity and their attorney were convicted and sentenced to prison for their role in the deception. Unfortunately, this deed is filed in the land records, and the SDAT created separate tax parcels (Parcels 260-41.42 acres & 261—17.297 acres) based thereon. While as a legal matter the ALJ is not authorized to strike from the record that illegal conveyance, County law (B.C.C. §32-4-108 et. seq.) provides

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that the subdivision is invalid and for purposes of the density calculations above I disregarded the December 2002 conveyance.

Density Reconfiguration

The second aspect of the special hearing petition requests that the density be reconfigured as shown on the site plan. Mr. Wells highlighted in blue on the site plan a "lot" Petitioners would like to create for their daughter and her husband. As it happens, this approval would in essence "legitimize" the illegal subdivision in 2002 discussed earlier, and state tax records already identify this unimproved parcel as "Parcel 261."

The children would construct a dwelling on the lot, as reflected on the site plan by the notation "approximate building area." Petitioners contend the ALJ is permitted to create the lot, citing an unreported court of special appeals opinion. Kehoe v. Arthur, (Sept. Term, 2013, No. 1448). In Kehoe, the court held the ALJ was authorized under BCZR §500.7 to determine whether a proposed reconfiguration of parcels would violate County zoning regulations. As determined above, the 20.5 acre RC 2 zoned portion of the lot where the proposed dwelling would be located contains two (2) density rights, and thus I believe the Petitioners would be entitled to create such a lot.

Even so, the <u>Kehoe</u> court noted that such a special hearing determination would leave the petitioner with "the obligation to obtain whatever subdivision approvals, and obtain whatever other permits their proposed uses would require." <u>Id.</u> at p. 14. In the end, while that case would allow the ALJ to determine the purely legal question of whether a proposed and reconfigured lot is in compliance with the B.C.Z.R., I do not believe it entitles the ALJ to create that lot or to effect a "lot line adjustment," as also requested in the Petition. Zoning regulations do not create lots, <u>Friends of the Ridge v. BGE</u>, 352 Md. 645, 651 (1999), and a "lot line adjustment" is a

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development or subdivision matter for the Development Review Committee, per B.C.C. §32-4-106(b)(1).

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED this <u>28th</u> day of October, <u>2015</u> by this Administrative Law Judge, that the Petition for Special Hearing pursuant to B.C.Z.R. § 500.7: (1) to determine the number of lots of record and rights of subdivision (density) for the subject tract, split zoned RC 2 and RC 7; and (2) to approve a lot line adjustment and/or density reconfiguration to facilitate the appropriate and permitted residential development of the subject tract, be and is hereby GRANTED in part and DENIED in part, as follows:

- A. The subject property owned by Petitioners contains eight (8) density rights, although a single family dwelling exists on site. As such, there remain seven (7) density rights on the overall tract, as detailed above.
- B. The proposed single family building lot in the southwest corner of the property, outlined on the site plan in blue, is permitted under the RC 2 density and use regulations, although that lot must be created through the Baltimore County subdivision and development process.

The relief granted herein shall be subject to the following:

Petitioners may apply for necessary permits and/or licenses upon receipt
of this Order. However, Petitioners are hereby made aware that
proceeding at this time is at their own risk until 30 days from the date
hereof, during which time an appeal can be filed by any party. If for
whatever reason this Order is reversed, Petitioners would be required to
return the subject property to its original condition.

Baltimore County's Memorandum in Lieu of Closing Argument

Introduction

The Chandlers filed a Petition for Special Hearing before the Office of Administrative Hearings to 1) determine the number of lots of record and rights of subdivision (density) for the subject tract, split zoned RC2 and RC7; and 2) to approve a lot line adjustment and/or density reconfiguration to facilitate the appropriate and permitted residential development of the subject tract. Baltimore County objects to the latter, not the former.

Specifically, Baltimore County respectfully requests this Board to affirm Judge Beverungen's decision and to deny the Chandlers' petition to move any lot line among the subject tract for the following reasons:

Baltimore County Has Standing to Participate

As a threshold matter at the hearing, Baltimore County was requested to assert the basis for its standing. The County has standing for three reasons: it appeared before the Board of Appeals, the undersigned entered his appearance for the County, and the undersigned offered legal argument in support of the County's objection to the Chandlers' request to this Board to move a lot line on their property.

The Court of Appeals has held that the standard for standing before an administrative tribunal is low. See eg. Hertelendy v. Montgomery Cty., 245 Md. 554, 567 (1967) (personal appearance and testimony at the hearing are not even required). Indeed, in DuBay v. Crane, the Court of Appeals found a party had standing merely because the party self-identified on the record. DuBay, 240 Md. 180, 184 (1965). See also, Wright v. McCubbin, 260 Md. 11, 14 (1970); Baxter v. Montgomery Co., 248 Md. 111, 113 (1967) (submitting name in writing as a protestant is sufficient); Bryniarski v. Montgomery Co., 247 Md. 137, 143, (1967).

In the case at bar, Baltimore County employee, Mr. Jeffery Livingston, was present at the hearing before the Board of Appeals, and was acknowledged on the record during the same hearing. Moreover, the undersigned entered his appearance in writing to the Board of Appeals. (County's Exhibit #1) And finally, the undersigned offered legal argument in support of the County's objection to a central element of the relief requested in the petition. Because any one of these elements on their own would satisfy the commonlaw standing standard set forth by the Court of Appeals in administrative proceedings, the County has standing to participate in the instant case.

The Chandlers Seek Development Relief in a Zoning Matter

The Chandlers seek approval of a development request, not a zoning issue. As Judge Beverungen noted in his opinion, when a person wants a lot line adjustment, she goes to the Development Review Committee (DRC). The DCR then examines the proposal to determine if the request is entitled to limited exemption under a Section 32-4-106 of the Baltimore County Code. The Chandlers know this.

As Judge Beverungen noted in his opinion, when a person wants a lot line adjustment, she goes to the Development Review Committee (DRC). The DCR then examines the proposal to determine if the request is entitled to limited exemption under a Section 32-4-106 of the Baltimore County Code. The Chandlers know this.

In lieu of engaging in the development process, however, the Chandlers have elected to file a Petition for Special Hearing pursuant to the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations. Their petition, pursuant to BCZR 500.7, asks this Board "to determine any rights whatsoever of such person in any property in Baltimore County insofar as they are affected by these regulations."

Zoning Regulations Do Not Create Lots

The term "lot line adjustment" does not even appear in BCZR. It appears in Article 32 of the Baltimore County Code: Planning, Zoning and Subdivision Control Article under Title 4, Subsection 4-106, entitled "Development, Limited Exceptions."

The Chandlers lot line adjustment request must be denied because moving lot lines is beyond the confines of this Board's statutory jurisdiction. See BALTO. CO. CHARTER, ART. VI § 605, MD. CODE ANN., LOCAL GOV'T § 10-305. Nowhere among its many powers, is the Board of Appeals empowered to create, adjust, move, or even nudge lot lines.

It is in this vacuum that the Chandlers claim that the statutory jurisdiction of this Board was expanded by the unreported opinion issued by the Court of Special Appeals in Kehoe v. Arthur. (Sept. Term, 2013, No. 1448). Even if the opinion was reported, Kehoe would not support Chandlers' efforts to embolden the Board with these development powers.

In Kehoe, an administrative law judge issued a zoning decision based upon a proposed lot reconfiguration. The key word was proposed. The lot reconfiguration had not already gone through the development process. The Court of Special Appeals, limiting

the effect of its decision only to the parties before the court, determined that the ALJ was permitted to rule upon the limited question of whether a use, as applied to the proposed lot reconfiguration, complied with zoning regulations. What the *Kehoe* Court did not say however, is that the zoning determination constituted an approval of the lot reconfiguration itself. On this point, the Court noted that the petitioner still had "the obligation to obtain whatever subdivision approvals, and obtain whatever other permits their proposed uses would require." *Kehoe* at p.14. So too must the Chandlers.

The limited result in Kehoe is not surprising actually. As the Court of Appeals noted in a reported opinion, "zoning ordinances do not create lots." Friends of the Ridge v. MEMORANDUM OF PEOPLE'S COUNSEL FOR BALTIMORE COUNTY

This Memorandum addresses People's Counsel's position in this case as discussed at the hearing on April 26, 2016. There is no dispute of the facts unless pointed out in conjunction with the Argument herein.

Statement of the Case

Mr. and Mrs Chandler, the owners of the subject site, and Mr. and Mrs. Schorr, their daughter and son-in-law, purchasers, ("Petitioners") filed a Petition for Special Hearing requesting the following relief:

- "1. To determine the number of lots of record and rights of subdivision (density) for the subject tract, split zoned RC 2 and RC 7;
- 2. To approve a lot line adjustment and/or density reconfiguration to facilitate the appropriate and permitted residential development of the subject tract;"

People's Counsel entered its appearance on August 6, 2015. Following a hearing, the Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) issued an Opinion and Order on October 28, 2015, in which the relief was Granted in part and Denied in part:

- "A. The subject property owned by Petitioners contains eight (8) density rights, although a single family dwelling exists on site. As such, there remain seven (7) density rights on the overall tract, as detailed above.
- B. The proposed single family building lot in the southwest corner of the property, outlines on the site plan in blue, is permitted under the RC 2 density and use regulations, although that lot must be created through the Baltimore County subdivision and development process."

People's Counsel filed an appeal on November 16, 2015. Our office's concerns involved the density established, particularly under the following statement in the ALJ's Order:

"The utility acquired these parcels by fee simple deed, and the tract owned by Petitioners is in face bisected into north and south portions by the BGE property. This is a crucial and pivotal fact, and counsel argues it creates separate parcels for determination of density. I agree, based upon the circuit court's holding in the case of <u>HZ Properties, LLC</u>, (No. 03-C-13-006824). In that case, the court held that a conveyance to BGE (which like this case also occurred in 1968) was a granted of ownership in fee simple "as opposed to a conveyance of an 'easement' or 'right of way'" for purposes of B.C.Z.R. § 1A01.3.B.1

A "lot of record" is defined under the B.C.Z.R. as a "parcel of land with boundaries as recorded in the land records of Baltimore County..." as of [in this case] 1979. B.C.Z.R. §101.1. Employing this definition, the northern portion of the site contains two (2) "lots of record." One was created by deed and one by virtue of HZ Properties, LLC, which supports Petitioners' claim that the conveyances to BGE in 1968 created a separate lot."

Our concern is rooted in our office's consistent position that roads, easements, rights of way, and, by extension, fee simple utility strips of land, do not create separate lots under BCZR 1A01.3.B.1. Area Regulations: "In cases where land in single ownership is crossed by existing or proposed roads, rights-of-way or easements, the portions of land on either side of the road, right-of-way or easement shall not be considered separate parcels for the purpose of calculating the number of lots of record." As noted at the hearing, this issue was litigated in <u>Freeland Community Association</u>, et al v. H.Z. <u>Properties</u>, <u>LLC</u> pending before the Court of Special Appeals.

Thereafter, counsel for Petitioners requested a meeting with our office to discuss the case. As sometimes happens, our office and attorney for Petitioners found common ground on the issue of the BGE fee simple utility strip, with the result that the Petitioners agreed to drop that argument in this case. Separately, on the issue of a lot line adjustment, we agree that under the statute in Baltimore County Code32-4-106 (a) (1) (viii) and (b) (1), a lot line adjustment cannot increase density; it appears to our office that there exists sufficient density in the RC 2 area on the southern portion of the site (the areas in two shades of green on Petitioner's Exhibit 1) to support the existing dwelling and the proposed dwelling.

A hearing on the appeal was scheduled before the CBA on March 2, 2016. People's Counsel and Petitioners' attorney appeared and agreed to postpone the hearing to allow, among other reasons, for necessary adjustments to the site plan to reflect the requested relief following discussions between the attorneys. Also, a representative of the Department of Environment and Sustainability (DES) was present on March 2, 2016.

The matter was rescheduled for April 26, 2016. Appearing before the CBA was Larry Schmidt, Esquire on behalf of the Petitioners, Carole S. Demilio, Deputy People's Counsel, and Brady Locher, Assistant County Attorney on behalf of DES, along with Mr. Jeffrey Livingston from DES.

Position of People's Counsel

Following meetings with the attorney for Petitioners, as noted above, and upon further review of the relief requested, People's Counsel states in this Memorandum the positions where we <u>agree with Petitioners regarding density</u>, referencing here the areas on the site as depicted on Petitioners' Exhibit #1:

- 1. Two density units are attributed to the aqua colored R.C. 2 area shown north of the BGE utility strip, (this strip being depicted in white), on the eastern portion of the site. This area is between 2-100 acres. BCZR 1A01.3.B.1. "No such lot having a gross area between two and 100 acres may be subdivided into more than two lots (total), and such a lot having a gross area of more than 100 acres may be subdivided only at the rate of one lot for each 50 acres of gross area." Petitioners could conceivably establish an R.C. 2 lot here with two density units. Whether it could actually be further subdivided and comply with other zoning and development regulations is not an issue at this time.
- 2. Two density units are attributed on the R.C. 7 tract north and south of the BGE utility strip. Both areas are considered as a single tract under BCZR 1A08.6.B.1.:
 - "B. Area regulations.
 - 1. Maximum lot density. A tract may be developed in an R.C.7 Zone at a maximum density of 0.04 lot per acre of gross tract area (an average of one lot per 25 acres). No lot lying within an R.C.7 Zone and having a gross area of less than 50 acres may be subdivided. Any lot having a gross area of 50 acres or more may be subdivided at the rate of one lot for each 25 acres of gross area. In cases where single ownership is crossed by existing or proposed roads, rights-of-way or easements, the portions of land

on either side of the road, right-of-way or easement may not be considered separate parcels for the purpose of calculating the number of lots of record."

This density in the R.C. 7 zone here is calculated on the 56 acres in the single tract. This issue arose in <u>CR Golf Club</u>, <u>LLC</u> Development Plan Hearing. Our office presented our position in a letter to the Administrative Law Judge in that case:

"We became familiar with the word "tract" in reference to the R.C. 4 Zone lot density standard. The Webster's Third New International Dictionary definition portion most relevant is:

"Tract $n \dots 2$ an area either large or small: as a(1) a region or stretch (as of land) that is usu. Indefinitely described or without precise boundaries (a few large -s for settlement) (the wooded -s between two rivers) (a great -s of unexplored sea (2) a precisely defined or definable area of land (an 80 acre -s) (an urban census -s)"

Here, the R.C. 7 contrasting linguistic use of "tract," "lot", and "gross area" plainly mean, in context that the word "tract" refers to the entire area under consideration, i.e. the gross area, and that the word lot refers to the proposed subdivision lot or lots. The use of the word "average" reinforces this point. Everything in this language points to integration rather than segregation. Indeed, this is consistent with the R.C. 7 Zone legislative purposes. BCZR Sec. 1A08.6.1.B."

Judge Beverungen agreed and held the entire area zoned R.C. 7 must be considered a single tract for purposes of calculating density:

"In light of the above, the two parcels shown on the Development Plan, in my opinion, constitute a 229.43 Ac. +/- "tract" of land. In these circumstances, this acreage will provide density for nine (9) single family dwellings under the existing RC 7 zoning, which permits one (1) residential lot per 25 acres. B.C.Z.R.§1A08.6.B.1. Though the Development Plan will be approved, the Order which follows will require a redlined amendment clarifying that Parcel 551 is included within the overall Castanea subdivision for purposes of residential density calculations."

- 3. The BG&E utility strip that is depicted in white, consisting of approximately 20 acres split zoned R.C.2 and R.C. 7 has no density.
- 4. The .7 acres depicted in white and located just south of and adjacent to the BG&E utility strip and north of the R.C. 7 area on Petitioners' Exhibit #1 has no density.
- 5. The area depicted in white on Petitioners' Exhibit #1 adjacent to the Chandler dwelling labeled "non-density area" has no density.

6. The access to Anderson Road on the southern portion of the site labeled on the site plan as conveyed in a Deed dated December, 1976, in Liber 5707, page 380 has no density.

People's Counsel **disagrees** with Petitioners' calculation of density on the lime green and light green areas on the southern portion of the site zoned R.C. 2. That total area is approximately 27 acres – our position it that it is entitled to two density units because it is between 2-100 acres. However, Petitioners contend there are four density units – two on the 5 acre lot existing in 1975 on which the existing dwelling was constructed because it was a lot of record when the R.C. 2 zone was effective on November 24, 1979, and two density units on the remaining 22 acres. People's Counsel disagrees because the title history indicates a prior owner merged this 5 acre lot and this 22 acre area when the entire 110 acre site was singularly described in deed conveying the site to Petitioners' predecessor in title. The effect was to eliminate the lot line between the 5 acre lot and the 22 acre area for *zoning purposes*, resulting in a single R.C. 2 zoned area of 27 acres, which is limited to 2 density units under BCZR above.

The Deed that merged this area is dated April 9, 2002 and shown as #9 in Petitioners' Exhibit 2. The Deed described the entire site in a single description consisting of approximately 110 acres, saving and accepting ONLY the two BG&E parcels, and the access area to Anderson Road. This indicates the lot line between the R.C.2 green areas was extinguished, merging the two areas into a single parcel consisting of 27 acres. This area between 2-100 acres would support two density units and not four as Petitioners contend.

The two significant cases involving zoning merger are Remes v. Montgomery, 387 Md. 52 (2005), and Friends of the Ridge v. Baltimore Gas & Elec. Co., 352 Md. 645 (1999). In Ridge, the utility company acquired several lots adjoining its substation lot in order to expand its operation. The Court first distinguished zoning and subdivision development on pages 650-651:

"[1] Zoning ordinances, including Baltimore County's ordinances, do not create lots. Zoning does not create parcels of real property. What zoning ordinances normally do,

with respect to residential districts, is establish dimensional minimums, such as minimal lot, parcel or tract size, yard sizes (the distance between buildings and property lines), and the height of structures. In addition, such ordinances specify the number of residential units that may be placed upon the area of a tract or parcel (density), (emphasis added) ancillary requirements such as parking minimums, bathroom minimums, and square footage minimums of buildings. Additionally, zoning ordinances can, to some extent, regulate uses of property, as distinct from dimensional requirements.⁶"

In <u>Ridge</u>, BG&E maintained the combination of the lots for a single use, without a formal subdivision process, served to eliminate the internal lot lines for setback and variance purposes, that is for the zoning issues, and thus no variances were required.

It should be noted that subdivision in Baltimore County includes the combination of lots as well as the creation of separate lots. BCC 32-4-101(yy). We maintain in the instant case that the combination of the entire site into a single description in 2002, without separating out by "saving and excepting" language, or by recording a new description omitting the two R.C. 2 lots created in 1975 from the description, served to merge or combine the entire site, (except the BG&E lots specifically excluded in the Deed), into a single lot. The areas of this single lot that are separately zoned can hold their own as to density based on the acreage, but the two green areas discussed are now one area of 27 acres for density (i.e. zoning) purposes.

The Ridge Court supports our position: "We shall hold that a landowner who clearly desires to combine or merge several parcels or lots of land into one larger panel may do so." *Id.*. 658. The Court pointed out that "One way he or she may do so is to integrate or utilize the lots in a single structure or project, as respondent proposes in the instant case. Although this is not the general application of the doctrine of merger as it relates to zoning, we perceive no rational objection to applying the same principles to the circumstances of this case, resulting in a larger parcel." *Id.* (emphasis added).

First, it is clear the <u>Ridge</u> Court recognized that a larger lot can be created from smaller lots, and, second, the Court is not limiting a merger, and the concomitant extinguishment of lot lines, to the construction of a structure on the site as proposed in <u>Ridge</u>. Rather, a merger can create a larger lot and eliminate internal lot lines for purposes

of zoning – in <u>Ridge</u> the zoning issue was setbacks and variances; here it is density. The Court discussed when a merger would occur:

"Some cases discuss automatic merger, but most require that the intent of the owner to merge the parcels be expressed, though little evidence of that intent is required." *Id* .653. While the Court did not state an automatic merger <u>must</u> occur, it referred on page 659 to a Connecticut decision that "An intent on the part of the owner to do so may be inferred from his conduct with respect to the land and the use which he makes of it. . . Intent is a question of fact."

"As far as we can discern, the zoning doctrine of lot merger has never been applied in any jurisdiction to limit the creation of parcels that exceed minimum dimensional requirements; merger has been applied only to prohibit the later creation of undersized parcels. This, perhaps, is due to the general lack of objection to large parcels. A discussion, however, of how the doctrine of merger applies conversely to the present case [merging small parcels into a larger parcel] may help emphasize that, in the context described above, merger occurs without the need for official subdivision or conveyancing. It is accepted automatically in some jurisdictions or, most often, with minimum proof of the owner's intent in other jurisdictions and always without the necessity of official action." Id. 653-654.

In the instant case, the owner intended in the 2002 Deed to create and convey all the land not owned by BG&E in a single parcel by virtue of the single description in the deed. There is no other way to interpret the document since clearly the 1975 lots could have been excluded from the entirety as the BG&E lots were. Furthermore, under Ridge, there was no need for the Grantor in that Deed to subdivide the site in order to merge the lots.

Significantly, the <u>Ridge</u> Court stated even in a zoning merger, the lot lines remain for title purposes, "... but by operation of law a single parcel emerges for zoning purposes." <u>Ridge</u>, p.658. The <u>Ridge</u> Court also recognized that a merger of lots for zoning purposes does not conflict with subdivision regulations. "We are especially cognizant that in those jurisdictions that have expressly or impliedly recognized the doctrine of merger in zoning cases, none has required a formal re-subdivision as an element of merger. In fact, they generally reject both attempts to re-subdivide into substandard parcels after a merger into a larger parcel has occurred and attempts to obtain variances from the nonconformity of the original parcels after a merger has created a larger conforming parcel. . . Those courts generally assume that it is permissible and not in violation of zoning principles." <u>Ridge</u> pp. 660-661.

The Court emphasized the lot lines were not affected. In the instant case, if the lot lines remain, the merger of the green 1975 lot with the adjoining lime green 22 acres may not affect a lot line adjustment but does affect the zoning density issue.

Six years later, the Court revisited merger in Remes v. Montgomery County, supra. Again the Court differentiated zoning and subdivision processes and regulations, noting that that in Ridge, the Court found no "official action or conveyancing" was required to effectuate a merger for zoning purposes. *Id.* 65. Likewise on p. 66-67, the Remes Court stated, "That is indeed a correct articulation of the thrust of zoning merger: zoning merger does not cause a nullification of any subdivision that has previously occurred. It merely consolidates lots insofar as the determination of what can be constructed on that land, . . . For title purposes, the platted lot lines may remain, but by operation of law a single parcel emerges for zoning purposes."" Furthermore, on page 78, the Remes Court reinforced that Ridge, and now Remes, upholding zoning merger in Maryland, confirms the common law applicable in the State: "Moreover as we perceive it, Ridge was a statement of the common law, not a change. The issue had not theretofore arisen, or been specified or articulated in our prior cases. Ridge was merely the first case to determine that zoning merger existed in Maryland."

In the instant case, the merger of the site into a single parcel by deed in 2002 effectively eliminated the lot line between the 22 acre area and 5 acre lot zoned R.C. 2. A single R.C. 2 area of 27 acres remained. For zoning purposes, the 27 acres has two density units. Since the lot lines are not affected by a merger, there does remain a lot line to adjust, if warranted, and sufficient density to support the existing dwelling and the proposed dwelling. (As we stated above, the other R.C. 2 parcel to the north, whether it is a separate parcel or not, is between 2-100 acres, is not contiguous to other R.C. 2 land, and thus has two density units. We do not recognize it as a separate lot because of the merger doctrine, but the acreage is there to support two density units under the R.C. 2 zone).

CLOSING MEMORANDUM

Karen and William M.B., Jr. Chandler, owners of the subject property, and Anitra and Jerome Schorr, contract purchasers (collectively "Petitioners"), by and through their attorneys, Lawrence E. Schmidt, Christopher W. Corey, and Smith, Gildea & Schmidt, LLC, submits this Closing Memorandum and respectfully states as follows:

I. STATEMENT OF THE CASE

This matter comes before the Board as a *de novo* appeal of the Opinion and Order of Administrative Law Judge John E. Beverungen ("ALJ"), dated October 28, 2015, granting in part and denying in part the Petition for Special Hearing submitted by the above captioned Petitioners. The Special Hearing was filed pursuant to Section 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR"), and the relief requested was specified as follows: (1) to determine the number of lots of record and rights of subdivision (density) for the subject tract, split zoned RC 2 and RC 7; (2) to approve a lot line adjustment and/or density reconfiguration to facilitate the appropriate and permitted residential development of the subject tract; and (3) for such other and further relief as may be required by the Administrative Law Judge for Baltimore County.

ALJ Beverungen agreed with the Petitioners as to the density determination, finding that "[t]he subject property owned by the Petitioners contains eight (8) density rights, although a single family dwelling exists on site. As such, there remain seven (7) density rights on the overall tract, as detailed above." (ALJ Opinion, p. 6). As to the lot line adjustment issue, ALJ Beverungen found that the "...RC 2 zoned portion of the lot where the proposed dwelling would be located contains two (2) density rights, and thus I believe the Petitioners would be entitled to create such a lot." (ALJ Opinion, p. 5). However, while ALJ Beverungen determined that the proposed reconfigured lot is in compliance with the BCZR, and specifically is permitted under the RC 2 density and use regulations, ALJ Beverungen also found that the "...lot must be created through the Baltimore County subdivision and development process." (ALJ Opinion, p. 5-6).

On November 20, 2015, the Office of People's Counsel for Baltimore County ("People's Counsel") entered an appeal of ALJ Beverungen's decision to the Board of Appeals for Baltimore County (the "Board"), and the aforementioned issues are now the subject of *de novo* review by this Board.

Thereafter, the Board scheduled a hearing for March 2, 2016. As a preliminary matter, upon entering the hearing on March 2, 2016, counsel for the Petitioners believed that an agreement had been reached with People's Counsel, which resolved the issues that were subject to the Board's review on appeal. However, despite not participating at the proceedings before the ALJ and likewise not filing an appeal of ALJ Beverungen's decision, a representative of the Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability ("EPS") (Jeff Livingston) appeared at the hearing. He was not subpoenaed by either of the parties (Petitioners nor People's Counsel). In light of this unexpected participation by EPS and Mr. Livingston's concerns as expressed to Counsel, the matter was postponed and rescheduled for hearing on April 26, 2015 at

10:00 a.m. On that date, at 10:07 a.m., Assistant County Attorney Brady Locher entered his appearance via email with the Board on behalf of Baltimore County. Mr. Livingston and Mr. Locher appeared at the Board's hearing, as did Carole DeMilio, Deputy People's Counsel.

The Petitioners also appeared at the public hearing on April 26, 2016. Specifically, property owners Karen and William M.B., Jr. Chandler were in attendance, along with the Chandler's daughter and son-in-law, the contract purchasers, Anitra and Jerome Schorr. Testifying in support of the request was Kenneth J. Wells, the Land Surveyor who prepared the site plan and who was accepted by the Board as an expert in land surveying and in the interpretation and application of the Baltimore County Zoning and Development Regulations. The Petitioners were represented at the hearing by Lawrence E. Schmidt and Christopher W. Corey of Smith, Gildea and Schmidt, LLC.

At the conclusion of Petitioners' case to the Board, neither People's Counsel nor Baltimore County elected to call any witnesses; thus, the expert testimony submitted by Kenneth J. Wells is uncontroverted. In lieu of Closing Argument, the Board requested that the parties submit legal Memorandums due on Friday May 27, 2016.

II. STATEMENT OF FACTS

The testimony and evidence provided by Kenneth J. Wells established the following facts. The property at issue is now a large tract of land which is split zoned RC 2/RC 7, encompassing approximately 91.5+/- acres of land within the White Hall community of Baltimore County and being part of the overall parcel that is identified with the address 2890 Anderson Road. The Petitioners acquired the approximately 91.5+/- acres of land by two separate deeds; the first conveyance occurred in December of 2002 (58.7+/- acres) (Liber 17566, Folio 385) and the second took place in April of 2011 (32.8+/- acres) (Liber 30828, Folio 179).

The property is irregularly shaped and features a stream, areas of steep slopes, and is largely wooded. These environmental constraints clearly limit the development potential of the property. The property is presently improved with one single family dwelling, which is resided in by Mr. and Mrs. Chandler. This dwelling is located near the front of the Property adjacent to Anderson Road. The balance of the property is unimproved.

The chain of title for the tract of land at issue dates to February of 1917 when the property was acquired by Chauncey and Imogene Grove by Deed recorded in the Baltimore County Land Records at Liber 474, Folio 499. This is the same parcel described as containing 110.897 acres within a Deed dated February of 1977 (Liber 5731, Folio 762). After acquisition by Chauncey and Imogene Grove in 1917, the property was held intact until the 1940s. At that time, three parcels from the original tract were taken by Baltimore County as the result of unpaid property taxes. The Treasurer of Baltimore County took possession of these three parcels and conveyed them to the County Commissioners as follows: June of 1940 (6+/- acres) (Liber 1110, Folio 499), October of 1941 (5.1+/- acres) (Liber 1188, Folio 545), and November of 1942 (5.9+/- acres) (Liber 1259, Folio 516).

The next conveyance which impacted the overall 110.897 acre tract occurred in the summer of 1968. At that time, BGE was seeking to expand its power network in northern Baltimore County and acquired lands on which to construct electric transmission towers. BGE acquired two parcels totaling 19.7+/- acres which were from the original 110.897 acre tract. However, these two parcels were conveyed by different owners. In June 1968 (15.3+/- acres) (Liber 4884, Folio 096) were conveyed to BGE from Mr. and Mrs. Grove. In July 1968 (4.4+/- acres) (Liber 4905, Folio 329) were conveyed from the County Commissioners.

As the result of these transactions, the overall tract was bifurcated into two separate sections by the BGE fee simple strip which contains electric transmission towers. The BGE strip divides the property into a "north piece" which is vacant and approximately 26 acres and a "south piece" which is approximately 66 acres and improved with the Chandler dwelling. The resulting bifurcated tract separated by a BGE strip is mindful of a previous case considered by the Board (*In Re: HZ Properties, LLC*; BOA Case No.09-039-M, Circuit Court Case No. 03-C-13-006824). In that case, the Board held that the fee simple BGE strip effectively subdivided the overall tract. This decision was appealed by People's Counsel to the Circuit Court, which affirmed the Board. The *HZ* matter is now pending at the Court of Special Appeals in Annapolis. (Case No. 656, September Term 2014). By agreement of the Petitioner and People's Counsel in the instant matter, the Board is not being requested to rely upon the *HZ* holding to compute density herein. As will be explained hereinafter, the overall density requested is not impacted by the *HZ* holding. Thus, People's Counsel and Petitioner have agreed to ignore the impact of the *HZ* holding as it might apply to this case.

The next transaction occurred when the Estate of Imogene Grove reacquired the property that had been forfeited as the result of the tax sale (less that acreage conveyed to BGE). By Deed dated October of 1975 (Liber 5580, Folio 311), the Baltimore County Commissioners conveyed the remaining lands they still held from the unpaid taxes in the 1940's, to the Estate of Imogene Grove (shortly after her passing). The property conveyed consisted of three areas: 5.9 acres of RC 2 zoned land on the north side of the BGE strip, which is identified with a light blue hue on the Site Plan; .7 acres of RC 7 zoned land located just to the south of the BGE strip, and colored white on the Site Plan (noting non-density areas of the property); and 6 acres of land located at the southeast corner of the overall tract, which is split zoned RC 2/RC 7, with 5 acres zoned RC

2 and colored yellow on the Site Plan, and 1 acre zoned RC 7 and colored white. Notably, the consolidation of the aforementioned lots of record was never approved through the Baltimore County development review process, as is required to legally consolidate lots under the Baltimore County Development Regulations. Pursuant to Baltimore County Code ("BCC") § 32-4-101(p)(3), the definition of 'Development' includes "The combination of any two or more lots, tracts, or parcels of property for any purpose."

In February of 1977 (Liber 5731, Folio 762), the Estate of Imogene Grove conveyed to Keith Garman all of its interest in the underlying tract, which was described as containing 110.897 acres of land, but "saving and excepting" the two parcels totaling 19.7+/- acres, which were conveyed to BGE in June and July of 1968 out from the original 110.897 acre tract. Significantly, within the Deed description provided in February 1977 Deed, the following language is provided in the "Being Clause":

"BEING a part of all that parcel of land which by deed dated February 23, 1917 and recorded among the Land Records of Baltimore County in Liber W.P.C. 474. Folio 499, which was granted and conveyed by Wesley M. Cordery unto Chauncey B. Grove and Imogen W. Grove, his wife.

ALSO SEE Deed dated October 24, 1975, and recorded among the Land Records of Baltimore County in Liber E.H.K., Jr. No. 5580, folio 311, which was granted and conveyed by Baltimore County, Maryland, unto Thelma G. Almony and J. Donald Grove, Personal Representatives for the estate of Imogene W. Grove." (Emphasis added).

The lots conveyed by the Baltimore County Commissioners were explicitly referenced within the 1977 Deed, and the boundaries of each were recorded in the Land Records of Baltimore County on February 9, 1977. The next conveyance did not take place until a Deed dated September 9, 1982 (Liber 6488, Folio 220), was recorded transferring all of the presently existing 91.5 acres of the tract from the Estate of Keith Garman to Charles & Gretchen Edwards.

For ease of review, the following spreadsheet is offered to graphically illustrate the chain of title for the Anderson Road property:

The issues generated as to the total density attributed to this property arise from two factors; to wit, the split zoning of the tract and that the property is comprised of individual

parcels which collectively make up the whole. These separate "lots of record" which comprise the whole are shown on the plan. As defined in BCZR § 101.1, a "lot of record" is a "parcel of land with boundaries as recorded in the Land Records of Baltimore County on the same date as the effective date of the zoning regulation which governs the use, subdivision or other condition thereof." Significantly, the effective date establishing rights of subdivision for RC 2 zoned properties is November 25, 1979, when the Baltimore County Council passed Bill No. 178-1979.

Additionally, it is significant that the Chandlers acquired the property through two separate conveyances from the prior owner (i.e. Patrick Belzner and/or entities in which he had an interest). During Mr. Belzner's period of ownership, he submitted various subdivision plans to Baltimore County for the property. None of the plans were approved. Nonetheless, Mr. Belzner conveyed certain "lots" by deeds, which were carved out from the property, even though these lots were not approved via the County's subdivision process. The boundaries for these lots are shown on the site plan as Divisional Property/Title Lines and are illegal pursuant to BCC § 32-4-108. In view of this history of the property, its split zoning and unusual features, the following issues are presented for consideration.

III. QUESTIONS PRESENTED

- 1. Whether the Subject Property Contains Eight (8) Density Units?
- 2. Whether the Proposed Lot Line Adjustment/Density Reconfiguration Shall be Approved, Which will Facilitate Residential Development of the Single Lot Being Conveyed to the Schorrs' Only?
- 3. Whether only the Reconfigured Schorr lot will be Required to Obtain Approval through the Development/Subdivision process, Consistent with the Court of Special Appeals' Decision in *Kehoe*, or Whether, as Contended by Baltimore County, the Entire Tract Becomes Subject to Development/Subdivision Review as a Result of the Reconfiguration and Planned Development of only the Schorr Lot?

IV. ARGUMENT

1. As Determined by ALJ Beverungen, the Subject Property Maintains a Total of Eight (8) Density Units.

When the property was previously proposed for subdivision by Mr. Belzner, the Department of Permits, Approvals and Inspections recommended (in its subdivision review comment) that the Property owner file for special hearing relief to establish the residential density available to the tract as a whole. This recommendation was made to determine the overall density of the tract, in view of the split zoning and the different lawful lots of record which comprised the tract. This recommendation was never followed up on by Mr. Belzner, but is made in the instant petition.

As previously mentioned, the property is split zoned RC 2 and RC 7. Pursuant to BCZR § 1A00.5, each separately zoned portion of the property must be calculated under the density multiplier set out for that particular zone. That is, RC 7 zoned property may be subdivided at a rate of 1 density unit for each 25 acres. BCZR § 1A08.6.B.1. For RC 2 zoned property, any lot between 2 and 100 acres may be subdivided into two building lots. BCZR § 1A01.3.B.1. For properties zoned RC 2 in excess of 100 acres, such property may be developed at a rate of one density unit per each 50 acres. BCZR § 1A01.3.B.1. Moreover, the tract must be considered (density wise) based upon the number of separate parcels that comprised the property as of November 25, 1979. This is the date when the regulations governing subdivision in the RC zone came into being in Baltimore County. Applying these requirements to the subject property (and as shown on the density chart on the plan), the property (in its entirety) yields eight density units. This calculation is determined as follows.

First, to the north of the fee simple BGE strip there lies 5.6 acres of RC 2 zoned land, identified on the Site Plan in light blue, which is afforded two (2) density units. Also to the north

of the fee simple BGE strip, there lies 19.8 acres of RC 7 zoned land identified on the Site Plan in pink. Arguably, under HZ, this would be a separate parcel with one (1) density unit pursuant to BCZR § 1A00.5. To the south of the fee simple BGE strip there lies 36 acres of RC 7 zoned land, identified on the Site Plan in orange. Again, under HZ, this could be a separate parcel with one (1) density unit. However, if these areas (pink and orange) are combined, they total 55.8 acres of RC 7 land, which yields two (2) density units (i.e. one density per 25 acres). Finally, the remaining acreage to the south of the fee simple BGE strip is zoned entirely RC 2; however, as testified to by Land Surveyor Ken Wells, this area of the subject property is divided into two separate lots of record, and each of which is afforded two (2) units from the total. Thus, there are eight (8) total density units, one of which has been utilized by the Chandler dwelling.

The existence of these separate lots of record is recognized by documentation in the Land Records of Baltimore County. Specifically, by Deed dated October 24, 1975 (Liber 5580, Folio 311), among the properties conveyed by the County Commissioners was the 6 acres of land located at the southeast corner of the overall tract, which is split zoned RC 2/RC 7, with 5 acres zoned RC 2 and colored yellow on the Site Plan, and 1 acre zoned RC 7 and colored white. Pursuant to the testimony of Land Surveyor Ken Wells, this lot is a separate lot of record under the BCZR for two separate reasons.

First, as referenced above, within the description of the Deed dated February 9, 1977, the boundaries of the aforementioned lot were separately identified and recorded in the Land Records of Baltimore County on February 9, 1977. Considering that November 25, 1979 is the determinative date for establishing subdivision rights, the Deed description provided within the February 9, 1977 Deed establishes this lot as a separate lot of record, given that the next

¹ Thus, whether it is one density to the north and one density to the south; or two densities based on the combined acreage, makes no matter. The result is two density units under either approach.

description of this lot did not occur until 1982, which was after the determinative November 25, 1979 date.

Second, to this day, this lot has never been consolidated with the remainder of the tract via the Baltimore County Development Review process, as is required for a consolidation to even be recognized by Baltimore County. Pursuant to BCC § 32-4-101(p)(3), the definition of 'Development' includes "The combination of any two or more lots, tracts, or parcels of property for any purpose." (Emphasis added). For example, when Patrick Belzner illegally subdivided the underlying property through Deed conveyance, Baltimore County refused to recognize this illegal subdivision for purposes of applying its Development and Zoning Regulations to the property, and instead treated the property as if the illegal subdivision never happened. Undoubtedly, the same standard applies when lots are illegally consolidated and/or consolidated without obtaining the required County approvals. Either way, for purposes of applying the Baltimore County Zoning and Development Regulations, the unapproved subdivision (by consolidating lots) cannot be recognized by Baltimore County. Thus, the boundaries of the previously existing County Commissioners lot, which were recorded in the Land Records prior to 1979, remain the determinative boundaries for purposes of establishing whether or not a given parcel is a separate lot of record under the BCZR. As this lot was illegally subdivided when it was consolidated with the rest of the tract, it is a separate lot of record that maintains its own independent density rights.

As such, for the RC zoned portion of the tract located south of the fee simple BGE strip, one lot of record encompasses 5 acres of RC 2 zoned land, which is colored yellow on the Site and is provided with two (2) rights of density. In addition, the remaining RC zoned portion of the tract located south of the fee simple BGE strip, amounts to another separate lot of record,

encompassing 22.3 acres of land, shown on the Site Plan in green, and is also permitted two (2) rights of density. In summary, as shown on the Site Plan, the amount of permitted density on the subject tract is allocated as follows:

•	5 Acres of RC 2; (identified in yellow):	2 density units
•	22.3 acres of RC 2; (identified in green):	2 density units
•	55.9 acres of RC 7, (identified in orange and pink):	2 density units
•	5.6 acres of RC 2; (identified in blue):	2 density units
	Total =	8 density units

Additionally, at the hearing before the Board, Ken Wells, in his capacity as the Petitioner's Land Surveyor, offered testimony in support of the above referenced density calculations and also in support of the density calculation delineated on the Site Plan prepared by him. While Baltimore County agreed with Mr. Wells' determination that the subject property maintains a total of eight (8) density units, with seven (7) units remaining since one has been used, People's Counsel on the other hand raised some speculative concerns regarding the density calculations, without offering any substantive evidence in support this speculation.

In fact, at the hearing before the Board, People's Counsel baldly asserted that there "could" be as few as six (6) permitted density units allowed on the subject tract, and unequivocally stated that there needs to be further investigation of this issue. Respectfully however, Petitioners and Mr. Wells, in his capacity as a Land Surveyor, have conducted a detailed analysis of this density issue, and if People's Counsel feels that further investigation of the issue is necessary, it is frankly People's Counsel's obligation to present counter evidence in rebut of Mr. Wells' testimony and analysis. No evidence was presented by People's Counsel on this issue.

Additionally, in cross examining Mr. Wells in response to his testimony regarding his density calculations, People's Counsel inferred that Mr. Wells was not qualified to evaluate and

calculate permitted density, because doing so requires a chain of title analysis. People's Counsel also noted that Mr. Wells is not a Title Attorney, and further asserted that title expertise does not fall under the umbrella of Mr. Wells' expertise. However, People's Counsel's assertion in this regard is simply not accurate. Specifically, within Baltimore County's Development Management Policy Manual, there is a Minor Subdivision Submittal Checklist on page 16, which explicitly requires that a devolution of title be submitted by a land surveyor only. (Appendix 1). Similarly, on page 1A-3 of the Zoning Commissioner's Policy Manual, it is provided that where a deed contains multiple parcels or a subdivision needs further clarification, "...a property plat should be prepared listing and color coding each parcel according to the description in the deed... [and] should be prepared and certified by either a *land surveyor*, a registered professional engineer, or title attorney." (Emphasis added) (Appendix 2). As such, conducting title evaluations clearly falls within a land surveyor's purview of expertise.

In short, the expert testimony submitted by Ken Wells concerning the density calculation issue in uncontroverted, and for the reasons discussed herein, Petitioners request this Board to determine that the subject property is permitted a total of eight (8) density units.

2. The Proposed Lot Line Adjustment/Density Reconfiguration Should be Approved in order to Facilitate Residential Development on the Single Lot Being Conveyed to the Schorrs'

The next issue for the Board's consideration relates to a proposed and requested lot line adjustment. As more particularly shown on the plan, the southern piece of the tract is actually comprised of two lots of record. One lot is that acreage which was previously created in 1975 when it was conveyed from Baltimore County to Almony/Grove. The second lot is the remaining acreage of the overall tract, exclusive of the separate lot of record to the north of the BGE strip.

Mr. Belzner conveyed this acreage to the Chandlers in two conveyances (as if it were two lots), notwithstanding that the subdivision had never been approved by Baltimore County. The Chandler dwelling is located on the Baltimore County to Almony/Grove lot and because that parcel is a separate lot of record, there is an established and legal property line between it and the remaining property. The remaining property is vacant. The Petitioner seeks a "lot line adjustment/density reconfiguration" in order to relocate that current validly existing lot line which divides these two existing lots. As more particularly shown on the plan, a relocated lot line would adjust the acreage of these two lots. But, it need be emphasized; the number of lots (two) will not be altered and will remain the same. Moreover, there will be no increase in overall density. The intent of the owner is to adjust the lot lines so that the lots are reconfigured. After this lot line adjustment, there will be a lot of approximately 20 acres to be conveyed to Mr. and Mrs. Schorr and the Chandlers will retain the balance of the property.

Testimony and evidence proffered was that this adjustment is appropriate. Specifically, it will result in lots which respect the split zoning of the property and the environmental constraints and features of the overall tract. Lot line adjustments are warranted when proposed to promote appropriate utilization of residential density while respecting the agricultural use and/or environmental constraints and features of a property.

Based upon comments made by counsel for Baltimore County at the hearing, it is anticipated that Baltimore County will address (in its closing memorandum) the difference between the development/subdivision regulations and the County's zoning regulations.

Land use regulation in Baltimore County is governed through two laws/regulations, the zoning law (as contained in the BCZR and BCC §§ 32-3-101 – 32-3-607) and subdivision law (as

² The second conveyance occurred after a foreclosure and the property was thereafter transferred to the Chandlers from Kapman Enterprises, LLC, by Deed dated April 14, 2011 (30828/179).

contained throughout the remaining subsections within Article 32 of the BCC). See People's Counsel v. Surina, 400 Md. 662, 688-89 (2007) (finding that "[i]t is well-settled that zoning regulations and subdivision controls regulate different aspects of the land use regulatory continuum"). The subject case is primarily a part of the zoning process. Specifically, the County density regulations are characterized as zoning law and are set forth in the BCZR. See BCZR § 1A01.3. Also, the authority to conduct Special Hearings is likewise provided in the BCZR, and the scope of such Hearings is limited to zoning law. See BCZR § 500.7 (stating that the Zoning Commissioner has the power to conduct hearings and "to determine any rights whatsoever of [an interested person] in any property in Baltimore County insofar as they are affected by these regulations"). Through the Special Hearing filed herein, Chandler is confirming the densities attributable to the overall tract and individual parcels which comprise it. Chandler is also reconfiguring those densities to serve the purposes of the R.C. zoning classification (i.e. the protection of natural resources). However, while the specific issue that is currently before this Court is primarily a zoning issue, the proposed reconfiguration also triggers application of the subdivision law.

Significantly, this very issue was considered by this Board, and ultimately the Court of Special Appeals, in the case of *Kehoe v. Arthur* (Board of Appeals Case No. 11-061-SPH; Court of Special Appeals No. 1448, September 2013). In that case, a Special hearing was filed pursuant to § 500.7 of the BCZR, where the Applicants sought the reconfiguration of density among multiple parcels and an adjustment of lots lines between those parcels. On consideration by this Board, the requested lot line adjustment and density reconfiguration were granted in the *Kehoe* case.

On appeal to the Court of Special Appeals, that Court in the *Kehoe* case characterized the issue as follows: "This appeal turns on the scope of the Board's authority to grant the relief the Kehoes sought, i.e. an order declaring that a reconfiguration of the three parcels and the allocation of the remaining density units to the reconfigured parcels would not exceed the uses allowed in R.C. 2 zones." The Court concluded that the Zoning Commissioner (ALJ) and, on appeal, the Board, had the authority to approve the proposed density reconfiguration and lot line adjustment for so long that the same is consistent with purposes of the zoning classification and regulations which govern the same.

Although the Zoning Regulations and subdivision regulations are different regulations in the land use continuum, they must be administered consistent with one another. *Surina*, 400 Md. 689-90. Within the subdivision regulations, the process by which development is approved is fully set out. For "full" or "major" subdivisions of land (creating four lots or more from a single parcel), compliance with the process set forth in Article 32, Title 4 is required. This includes public input, community meetings and a hearing before the County's Office of Administrative Hearings. However, the regulations further set forth "exemptions" from the process; identified in Code Section 32-4-106. Code Section 32-4-106 (a)(viii) establishes an exemption for lot line adjustments, specifically providing as follows:

"Lot line adjustments in residential zones for lots that are not part of an approved Development Plan under this title or an approved Development Plan under Article 1B of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations. For purposes of this subsection, "lot line adjustment" means one or more alterations of a divisional property line or lines between two or more lots in common ownership or by agreement of the owners, provided that the alteration does not result in an increase or decrease in the number of lots and there is no increase in total residential density available to the lots considered as a whole..."

The criteria listed for a lot line adjustment exemption under 32-4-106(a)(viii) is much the same as that identified by the Court of Special Appeals in Kehoe, that is, that the individual lots

must be under common ownership, that there is no increase in overall density, that there is no increase in the number of lots, etc.

In this case, the petitioner recognizes that, as a matter of process, they will need file an application to the County's Development Review Committee ("DRC") to obtain the § 32-4-106 (a)(viii) exemption. The DRC is that body that accepts and considers requests for exemption. See Baltimore County Department of Permits and Development Management Policy Manual, p. 4-6. The DRC then recommends if (and which) exemption should be granted. This recommendation is then forwarded to the Director of PAI for review and to make the ultimate decision, although the recommendation of the DRC is typically followed. The ultimate decision of the Director of PAI can be appealed to the Board.

As the Board is already considering this issue in the instant matter, and might ultimately have jurisdiction via a DRC appeal, it makes sense as a matter of judicial economy that the Board make clear its determination that the zoning relief should be granted and that the limited exemption pursuant to BCC § 32-4-106(a)(viii) should be granted. Moreover, the requirements of collateral estoppel will indeed compel an identical determination. See *Chestnut Real Estate Partnership v. Huber*, 148 Md. App. 190, 212 (2002) ("[w]hen an issue of fact *or law* is actually litigated and determined by a valid and final judgment, and the determination is essential to the judgment, the determination is conclusive in a subsequent action between the parties, whether on the same or a different claim"). It is appropriate that the Board address this decision in its written order to clarify the future proceedings in this case. Moreover, it is appropriate that this issue be resolved through the public hearing process afforded in the instant case by the Board, where a full opportunity is afforded all parties and interested persons to participate, rather than through the DRC's proceedings, which are not conducted via a public hearing.

3. Only the Reconfigured Schorr lot will be Required to Obtain Approval Through the Development Review/Subdivision Process, and the remaining portion of the Underlying Tract is not Subject to Development Review at this time

If the proposed lot line adjustment is approved by this Board, that will leave one remaining question; what happens next? When the Court of Special Appeals decided the *Kehoe* case, the Court made clear that its decision was limited to a determination that the reconfiguration would not violate County zoning laws, and that the Kehoe's would still be required to obtain whatever development approvals and/or permits required under the County development Regulations. (*Kehoe*, CSA Opinion, p. 14-15.) The question that then follows is after zoning approval is granted for a lot line adjustment, then what Baltimore County development approval(s) will be required? The answer, of course, lies within the Baltimore County Development Regulations.

Specifically, development in Baltimore County is regulated pursuant to Article 32, Title 4, of the BCC. Pursuant to BCC § 32-4-104, it is established that "[t]his title shall apply to the process of review for approval of all *development*." Further, 'Development' is defined within BCC § 32-4-101(p) as:

- (1) The improvement of property for any purpose involving building;
- (2) The subdivision of property;
- (3) The combination of any two or more lots, tracts, or parcels of property for any purpose;
- (4) Subjecting property to the provisions of the Maryland Condominium Act; or
- (5) The preparation of land for any of the purposes listed in this subsection.

Accordingly, when 'development' is proposed in Baltimore County, as that term is defined within BCC § 32-4-101, only then will Baltimore County's Development Review process be triggered.

In the present case, it has been brought to the attention of the Petitioners (and the presence of Mr. Livingston and Mr. Locher at the Board's hearing indicates the same), that EPS is seeking to require that all of the acreage south of the BGE strip of the Chandler property be made to go though the development review process. More particularly, EPS desires to impose various conservation and buffer easements across this entire 66 acres, purportedly, as a means of penalizing the Chandlers for the previous wrongs committed by Mr. Belzner. Completing the requisite studies and submittals to Baltimore County for approval for this large amount of acreage would be a significant expense and hardship upon the Chandlers. Moreover, it is unnecessary, as only the 20 acres to be conveyed to the Schorr's will be "developed." There are no plans to do anything on the property to be retained by the Chandlers.

There are currently three separate lots of record in existence on the Chandler property, and after the lot line adjustment there will still be three lots; but, as a result of the instant lot line adjustment, only one of those three lots is planned for development (that lot is currently identified in green on the Site Plan submitted by the Petitioners and is the reconfigured lot).

Therefore, while the Petitioners acknowledge that they will be required to obtain development approval, through the development review process, when they apply for a permit to construct a house on the Schorr lot, the remainder of the Chandler property should not be subject to development review at that time. At the present time, no portion of the remaining portion of the Chandler tract is being prepared for any improvement involving building, nor is any subdivision or combination of lots either planned or proposed. The remainder portion of the Chandler tract is thus not proposed for 'development' as that term is defined within the BCC, and accordingly, the development regulations set forth in Article 32, Title 4, cannot be applied to that portion of the property. Petitioners hereby request this Board to confirm the same within its

Opinion; that is, when the newly reconfigured Schorr lot is proposed for development and the Petitioners appear before the DRC which the remaining portion of the Chandler property will not be subject to development review at that time.

If, in the future, the owner of the remainder portion of the Chandler property (or its successors) decides to subdivide and/or develop this property (or any lot therein), then compliance with the County's subdivision regulations will be required and the easements which EPS seeks may be required and conveyed. But that is not required in the context of this case. The review of the proposed construction on the Schorr lot is restricted to the four corners of that property and shall be treated no differently than when any owner seeks to build one dwelling on an existing and unimproved lot of record.

CONCLUSION

For the foregoing reason, Petitioners respectfully request this Board grant the relief requested herein as follows:

- 1. Determine and confirm that the subject property has eight (8) density units, based upon the existing lots of record which collectively comprise the entire tract and the split zoning of the tract;
- 2. Approve a lot line adjustment and density reconfiguration so as to relocate the lot line adjustment currently dividing the property shown on the plan as conveyed from the County Commissioners to Almoney/Grove in October 1975 (Liber 5580, Folio 311) from the property conveyed to the Petitioners Chandler in Liber 17566, Folio 385 and Liber 3828, Folio 179; so as to reconfigure and establish a lot of 20.05 acres intended to be conveyed by William and Karen Chandler to Anitra and Jerome

Schorr, subject to the approval of the Development Review Committee as a limited exemption pursuant to BCC § 32-4-106(a)(viii);

3. Determine that there is no proposed subdivision of the property, in that the number of lots existing and proposed is the same (three) and that the overall density will remain unchanged. Further, that upon the development of the 20.05 acre parcel to be acquired by Anitra and Jerome Schorr that said parcel (upon application of a building permit for a single family detached dwelling) shall be subject to all applicable subdivision, zoning and environmental regulations and that the balance of the tract shall not be subject to the imposition of those regulations unless and until it is developed/subdivided.

If the property is recorded by multiple deeds or the deed contains multiple parcels, or the subdivision needs further clairification, the following may be required:

- A. To properly identify the parcels, a property plat should be prepared listing and color coding each parcel according to the description in the deed.
- B. The plats, deeds, and other supporting documentation should be prepared and certified by either a land surveyor, registered professional engineer or title attorney.
- C. All of the above information and documents should be submitted for review at least two weeks prior to zoning approval or CRG.

When legally existing parcels or deeds qualify to be subdivided or resubdivided, each separate parcel must be subdivided individually. The right to divide or the density cannot be transferred from one lot to another, accumulated, or clustered in an R.C.2 zone, unless a public hearing is held by the Zoning Commissioner.
