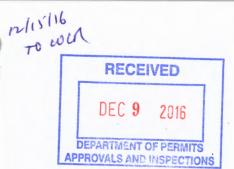

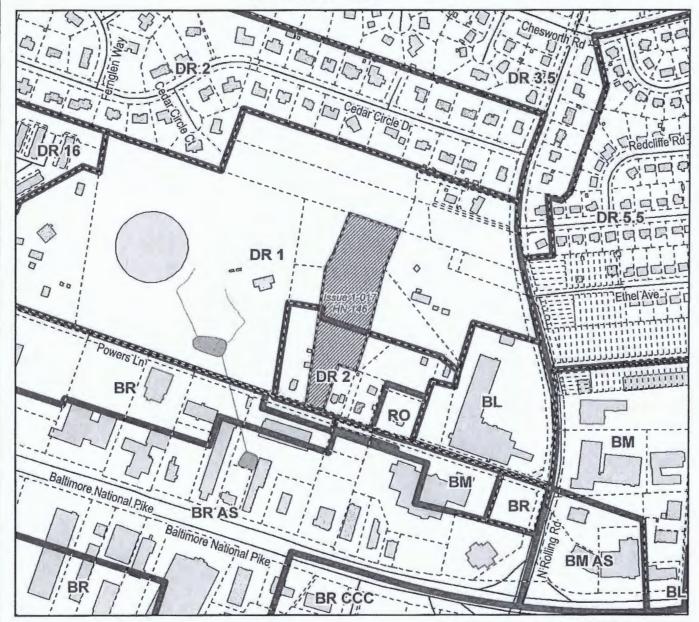

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for consideration of Petitions for Special Hearing and Variance filed on behalf of John A. and Bernadette S. Hoffman, legal owners and A & I Realty, LLLP, contract purchaser ("Petitioners"). The Special Hearing was filed pursuant to §409.8.B of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R."), for approval of business parking in a residential zone. In addition, an amended Petition for Variance seeks: (1) to allow off-street parking spaces to be located a minimum of 19, 14 and 12 ft. from the west, southeast and northeast tract boundaries, respectively in lieu of the required 75 ft.; and (2) to allow a minimum RTA buffer of 19, 14, and 12 ft. along the west, southeast and northeast tract boundaries, respectively in lieu of the required 50 ft. buffer. A redline site plan was marked and accepted into evidence as Petitioners' Exhibit 1.

Appearing at the public hearing in support of the requests was Julie Webb, Elaine Hoffman, Bernadette Hoffman, Stanford Hess, Bernadette Hoffman-Wild, Lawrence Wild, Chris Traczyk, Richard Matz and Sally Molena. David H. Karceski, Esq., and Adam Rosenblatt, Esq., represented the contract purchaser. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations. Substantive Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were received from the Bureau of Development Plans Review (DPR) and the

Department of Planning (DOP). Several members of the community, represented by Michael McCann, Esq., opposed the requests.

The subject property is 3.91 acres and is split-zoned DR 1 (2.59 acres) and DR 2 (1.32 acres). The unimproved lot is located on Powers Lane, which parallels Baltimore National Pike (Rt. 40) in Catonsville. The contract purchaser operates the Antwerpen Hyundai dealership, which is located at 6440 Baltimore National Pike, approximately 910 feet from the subject property. Antwerpen proposes to store new vehicle inventory on the site, and would take vehicles from the lot approximately three times a day to replace vehicles sold from the dealership property.

Petitioners' expert planner Maxwell Vidaver opined that the use would be compatible with surrounding uses and would not have a detrimental impact upon the community. I concur, and also believe that the storage lot would be a low intensity "transition use" (separating the residential community to the north of the site from the Rt. 40 commercial corridor) as described by Mr. Vidaver. While there are two single family dwellings near the subject property, it appears based on photographs submitted that one of the homes is vacant and/or in deplorable condition. As such, the other single-family home (shown in photos marked as Protestants' Ex. 3) would in my opinion be the only property impacted in any substantial way by this use, and I believe the landscaping and screening proposed (Petitioners' Ex. 11) would reduce any negative impacts.

Even so, I do not believe the parking regulations permit the use proposed herein. The petition for special hearing seeks approval for business parking in a residential zone. Under B.C.Z.R. §409.8.B the Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) may issue a use permit for these purposes to enable the petitioner "to meet the requirements of Section 409.6." That section of the regulations provides a list of uses along with the requisite number of parking spaces which must be provided as an adjunct thereto. Here, the Antwerpen dealership proposes to utilize the lot for

storage of new vehicle inventory, not to satisfy B.C.Z.R. §409.6. As such, I believe the petition must be denied.

This firm represents A & I Realty, LLC ("A & I"), contract purchaser of the above-referenced property located on Powers Lane in the Catonsville area of Baltimore County (the "Property"). A review of the attached 2015 Baltimore County Basic Services Map – Transportation Zones, reveals that the Property is within a traffic zone that is rated at an "F" level of service. According to Section 4A02.4.D.1 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR"), the transportation standards of BCZR Section 4A02.4.D and the associated Basic Services Map are intended to regulate and restrict "development" in areas with roads operating at deficient levels, which includes those designated with an "F" level of service.

A & I intends to use the Property for storage of automobile inventory for the nearby Hyundai dealership located at 6440 Baltimore National Pike (the "Dealership"). I have attached an aerial photograph from Baltimore County's My Neighborhood system showing the Dealership and its location in relation to the Property. 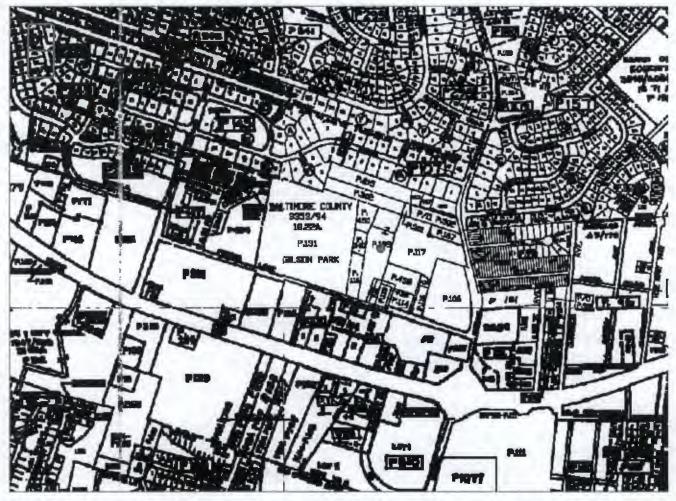

The Bureau of Development Plans Review has reviewed the subject zoning item and we have the following comments.

This property and the business located at 6440 Baltimore National Pike are in an "F" level of service for traffic on the Basic Services Map. Before a grading permit is issued for this site, a traffic engineer must provide a study which details any increase in peak hour trips that may impact the surrounding intersection. If there will be an increase, it is possible that another Special Hearing may be required.

The property is located in the DR1and 2 zones and is adjacent to owner occupied residences and County Local Open Space, among other owners and uses. As such, parking setbacks adjacent to residences and LOS should be respected. If variances are granted, Landscape Planting should be as approved by the County Landscape Architect and fencing added along all boundaries adjoining County owned properties. As well, parking bays as shown are excessively long (up to 590 linear feet) and should meet Section 409.8.b.2.a and have bays after every 12 spaces.

  Department has no objection to a chain-link type fence enclosing the balance of the property
  provided no concertina or barbed wire is used.
- Submit a landscaping and lighting plan to the Baltimore County Landscape Architect for approval
  prior to the issuance of permits. Lighting shall be directional so as to not spill onto the residential
  properties. Said plan shall include details on the proposed retaining wall.
- No loudspeaker or other fixed intercom system shall be permitted.
- There shall be no sales directly from the site or clientele permitted to browse on-site.

As a resident of the Westerlee community I am strongly opposed to the proposed business parking in a residential area at 1936 Powers Lane and demand that the requested use and variances for setback not be approved.

- Powers Lane is a border which curbs commercial and business use along US 40 from intruding into the residential communities to the north of Powers Lane. It sets a bad precedent to cross this line and put a commercial use north of Powers Lane.
- The proposed 389 vehicle inventory lot for Antwerpen will bring noise, fumes, pavement, lighting and unsightliness to a currently undisturbed meadow on a hill which is an excellent quiet area between the US 40 business zone and the residences of Westerlee. The proposed lot would drastically impact the residences directly adjacent to the meadow and would change the character of the entire area.
- The hillside would make the proposed huge parking lot especially exposed and unpleasant to look at. The higher elevations of the lot would be higher than the residences along Cedar Circle and would be visible during the winter months when trees have no leaves. Fumes from cars being moved in and out would seep downwards towards the residences. Overall the proposed parking lot would reduce the quality of our community and the value of our homes.

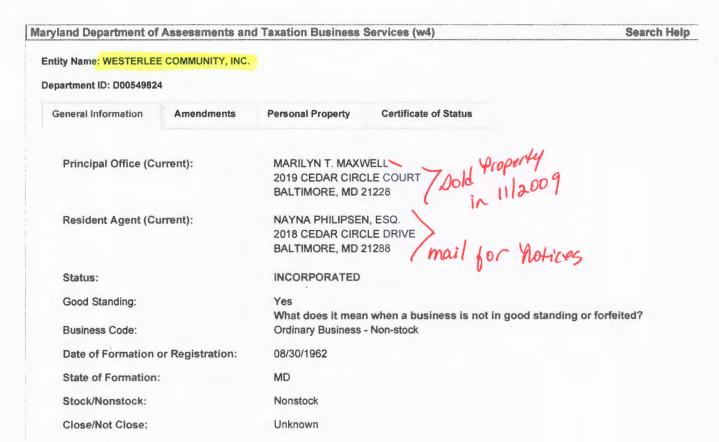

# ARTICLE 1B. Density Residential (D.R.) Zones

# SECTION 1B01. Regulations With Respect to D.R. Zones in General

#### § 1B01.1. General use regulations in D.R. Zones.

- B. Dwelling-type and other supplementary use restrictions based on existing subdivision and development characteristics.

  [Bill No. 124-1981]
  - Residential transition areas and uses permitted therein.
     [Bill No. 2-1992]
    - a. Definitions and purpose.[Bill No. 2-1992]
      - (1) The residential transition area (RTA) is a one-hundred-foot area, including any public road or public right-of-way, extending from a D.R. zoned tract boundary into the site to be developed.
      - (2) The purpose of an RTA is to assure that similar housing types are built adjacent to one another or that adequate buffers and screening are provided between dissimilar housing types.
    - b. Generation of residential transition area. An RTA is generated if the property to be developed is zoned D.R. and lies adjacent to land zoned D.R.1, D.R.2, D.R.3.5, D.R.5.5 or R.C. which:

[Bill Nos. 2-1992; 8-2004]

- (1) Contains a single-family detached, semi-detached or duplex dwelling within 150 feet of the tract boundary; or
- (2) Is vacant, less than two acres in size, and contains a buildable area at least 20 feet by 30 feet on which a dwelling meeting all required setbacks can be erected.
- c. Variance of RTA.
  [Bill No. 2-1992]

It shall not contain cleared drainage areas, stormwater management ponds or accessory structures, but it may be bisected by roads, paths and trails that are designed to connect to adjoining developments.
  - (4) The maximum height of any lighting fixtures in an RTA buffer area shall be 16 feet, except for public utility uses which must be of reasonable height. The fixtures shall be designed and placed so as to prevent the spillage of light into any adjoining dwelling or lot. The intensity of the fixture shall not exceed 0.2 candle at the tract boundary.
  - (5) Parking lots or structures, either as principal or accessory use, whether permitted by right, special exception or pursuant to Section 409.8.B, shall provide a fifty-foot buffer and seventy-five-foot setback, and a height not to exceed 35 feet within the one-hundred-foot transition area.



- Any subdivision of land or PUD that has received CRG approval or reclamation plan approval or has been accepted for filing prior to the date of adoption of Bill No. 2-92 or 3-92 is subject to the laws in effect at the time of the approval or filing. [Bill No. 2-1992]

In any case the use is conducted by a disabled person whose domicile is the dwelling to which the use is accessory and whom the hearing authority finds is so severely disabled as to be unable to engage in this occupation away from the premises of his home. Any provision of Subsection 502.2 to the contrary notwithstanding, any special exception granted pursuant to this item shall expire upon the first to occur of the following:
  - (1) Five years after the issuance of the permit;
  - (2) The death of the disabled person;
  - (3) The termination of the disability; or
  - (4) The failure of the disabled person to permanently reside at the premises.

    A new special exception for the use may be granted when the previous special exception expires but only upon the completion of the entire application and hearing process in the same manner as if it were the initial application for this special exception. It is the purpose of this provision to prevent the use of residential property for business purposes by an occupant other than a disabled person and to ensure that any occupation permitted pursuant to this item will be conducted in a manner appropriate to its surroundings.

# **ARTICLE 4. Special Regulations**

# SECTION 409. Off-Street Parking and Loading

### § 409.1. Applicability.

- A. All structures built and all uses established hereafter shall provide accessory off-street parking and loading in accordance with the following regulations. When an existing structure or use is enlarged, accessory off-street parking and loading shall be provided in accordance with the following regulations for the area or capacity of such enlargement.
- B. Those projects which have County Review Group (CRG) approval prior to the effective date of these regulations may modify their plans to satisfy these regulations or may proceed under the regulations in effect at the time of said approval.
- C. Those projects for which a building permit has been submitted but not approved may modify their plans to satisfy these regulations or proceed under the regulations in effect at the time of said submittal.

#### § 409.2. Plan.

At the time of application for a building permit for the erection or enlargement of any building for which off-street parking or loading spaces are required, a plan shall be provided at an appropriate level of detail showing such parking or loading spaces, including the means of access and interior circulation both from the standpoint of the project itself and in relation to its surroundings.

#### § 409.3. Parking space dimensions.

Minimum off-street parking space dimensions shall be as follows:

### § 409.4. Access to parking spaces.

Vehicular travelways in off-street parking facilities where the parking spaces are located in parking bays or parking lanes shall be divided into driveways, with no direct access to parking spaces, and aisles, providing direct access to adjoining parking spaces.

- A. Driveways shall be at least 12 feet in width for one-way movements and at least 20 feet in width for two-way movements.
- B. All parking spaces shall adjoin and have direct access to an aisle, except in the following cases:
  - In cases where vehicles will be parked by an attendant, the Zoning Commissioner may approve a parking facility in which up to 50% of all parking spaces do not adjoin and have direct access to an aisle.
  - 2. In office buildings less than 5,000 square feet, the Zoning Commissioner may approve a plan in which spaces designated for employee use only do not have direct access to an aisle.
- C. The permitted parking angles and the minimum required widths of aisles shall be as specified below. Parking angles and aisle widths which vary from those specified below may be approved by the Zoning Commissioner for any parking facility based upon the written findings of the Director of Public Works that the design of the particular parking facility involved will provide for the safe and efficient circulation and maneuvering of vehicles.

D. Historic structures. For an existing structure within the Oella National Register District or the Ellicott Mills National Register District, the width of driveways and aisles with two-way movement in an interior private parking facility may be modified up to 25% of the minimum required width specified in Section 409.4.A and 409.4.C. Residential dwelling unit parking spaces that do not have access to aisles are permitted, and these spaces may count towards the number of spaces required under Section 409.6. Any parking spaces without direct access to a drive aisle and the space blocking access to that drive aisle shall be reserved for an individual unit.

# § 409.5. Number of small car spaces.

- A. In off-street parking facilities where more than 50 parking spaces are provided, small car spaces shall be permitted as specified below.
  - In facilities serving office or industrial uses: up to 40% of the number of spaces required for such uses.
  - In parking structures serving residential or lodging uses: up to 40% of the number of spaces
    required for such uses. In surface parking facilities serving residential or lodging uses: no small
    car spaces permitted.
  - In structured parking facilities serving a state-designated transit-oriented development: up to 40% of the number of spaces required for any uses within the boundaries of the plan of development.

Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 409.5.A., for any nonresidential development, all parking spaces provided which exceed the requirements of Section 409.6 may be small car spaces at the discretion of the developer.

# § 409.6. Required number of parking spaces.

A. General requirements. The standards set forth below shall apply in all zones unless otherwise noted. If the required number of off-street parking spaces is not set forth for a particular type of use, the Director of Permits, Approvals and Inspections shall determine the basis of the number of spaces to be provided. If the number of spaces calculated in accordance with this section results in a number containing a fraction, the required number of spaces shall be the next highest whole number.

#### B. Adjustments to general requirements.

- Transit adjustment.

The required number of off-street parking spaces for any office or industrial use may be reduced by 5% if a pedestrian entrance to the building is located within 1,000 feet walking distance of a transit stop on a Mass Transit Administration route with scheduled peak-period headway of 20 minutes or better. The number of spaces may be reduced by an additional 10% if the office or industrial use is located in a Commercial Revitalization District, subject to the approval of the Director of Permits, Approvals and Inspections pursuant to the procedure specified in Section 409.13 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations.

  - a. Conditions for approval. To qualify for a 10% reduction, the owner or lesser shall meet the following requirements:
    - (1) Actively participate in the regional ridesharing program, as administered by the State of Maryland or Baltimore County.

- (2) Assign an on-site ridesharing coordinator to periodically interact with the regional ride-sharing program and promote the program internally to employees.
- (3) Establish an in-house carpool promotion and matching program and provide such maps, displays and materials as are necessary to inform employees of its availability.
- (4) Reserve a minimum of 10% of all parking spaces for carpools or vanpools and have those spaces so designated by appropriate signage.
- (5) Demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Zoning Commissioner that, in the event of future noncompliance, it will be feasible to either construct or lease the additional required parking spaces.
- (6) Certify annually to the Zoning Commissioner that these criteria are being met.
- b. Penalties for noncompliance. If the criteria for the reduction in the required number of off-street parking spaces are no longer being met, the owner or lessee shall be required to construct or lease additional parking spaces equal in number to the reduction granted. Failure to construct or lease the required additional parking spaces is a violation of these Zoning Regulations.
- 3. Shared parking adjustment. Two or more uses shall be permitted to share their off-street parking spaces in a common parking facility if the hours or days of peak parking for the uses are so different that a lower total will provide adequately for all uses served by the facility, without conflict or encroachment. To assure that no conflict or encroachment occur, shared parking spaces for such uses shall be provided according to the following table. The shared parking adjustment shall not apply to uses in the C.T. District of Towson, except for theater uses and office or industrial uses.

  - (1) Reserved or otherwise restricted spaces shall not be shared.
  - (2) The land uses served by the shared parking facility shall be in single ownership or permitted for multiple ownership by the Director of Permits, Approvals and Inspections upon satisfactory guarantees of the continued operation and proper maintenance of the shared parking facility. ## § 409.7. Location of parking.

All required off-street parking spaces shall be located either on the same lot as the structure or use to which they are accessory or off-site as provided for below.

- A. Off-street parking spaces for residential uses and lodging uses shall be located within 300 feet walking distance of a building entrance to the use that such spaces serve. Off-street parking spaces for residential uses located within a state-designated transit-oriented development in the C.T. District of Owings Mills shall be located within the boundaries of the plan of development. [Bill No. 16-2015]
- B. Uses other than residential.
  - 1. Except in C.T. Districts and R-O-A and R-O Zones, off-site parking spaces for uses other than residential and lodging shall be located within 500 feet walking distance of a building entrance to the use that such spaces serve. In C.T. Districts, such spaces shall be permitted within 1,000 feet walking distance of the building entrance. In the C.T. District of Towson, such spaces shall be permitted within 1,500 feet walking distance of the building entrance, provided that they are located within the town center boundary. For a state-designated transit-oriented development in the C.T. District of Owings Mills, such spaces shall be located within the boundaries of the plan of development.

Prior to the approval of any building permit involving an off-site parking facility, the Director of Permits, Approvals and Inspections shall require guarantees of the continued future availability and proper maintenance of the facility, including, but not limited to, a grant of an easement, a deed restriction, a restrictive covenant or a binding contractual agreement, including a lease. Any plans approved are conditioned upon and subject to periodic review by the Director to ensure that adequate parking arrangements continue to exist.

  [Bill Nos. 144-1997; 122-2010]

## § 409.8. Design standards.

- A. Requirements for parking facilities in all zones. All off-street parking facilities shall be subject to the following requirements:
  - Design, screening and landscaping. Design, screening and landscaping shall be provided in accordance with the Landscape Manual and all other manuals adopted pursuant to § 32-4-404 of the Baltimore County Code.
     [Bill No. 137-2004]
  - 2. Surface. A durable and dustless surface shall be provided and shall be properly drained so as not to create any undesirable conditions.
  - Lighting. Any fixture used to illuminate any parking facility shall be so arranged as to reflect
    the light away from residential lots and public streets. Light standards shall be protected from
    vehicular traffic by curbing or landscaping.
  - 4. Distance to street line. No parking space in a surface parking facility for a nonresidential use shall be closer than 10 feet to the right-of-way line of a public street, excluding vehicle overhang, except that in the C.T. District of Towson such setback is not required if the parking facility is screened from the street in accordance with the Landscape Manual.
  - 5. Dead ends. All dead-end aisles shall be designed to provide sufficient backup area for the end parking spaces.
  - 6. All parking spaces must be striped. Striping shall be maintained so as to remain visible.
- B. Business or industrial parking in residential zones.
  - 1. Upon application, the Zoning Commissioner may issue a use permit for the use of land in a residential zone for parking facilities to meet the requirements of Section 409.6, under the following procedure:
    - On the property in question, notice of the application for the use permit shall be conspicuously posted for a period of 15 days following the filing of the application.
    - b. Within the fifteen-day posting period, any interested person may file a formal request for a public hearing with the Zoning Commissioner in accordance with Section 500.7.
    - c. If a formal request for a public hearing is not filed, the Zoning Commissioner, without a public hearing, may grant a use permit for parking in a residential zone if the proposed use meets all the requirements of Section 409.8.B.2. The use permit may be issued with such conditions or restrictions as determined appropriate by the Zoning Commissioner to satisfy the provisions of Section 409.8.B.2 below and to ensure that the parking facility will not be detrimental to the health, safety or general welfare of the surrounding community.
    - d. If a formal request for a public hearing is filed, the Zoning Commissioner shall schedule a date for the public hearing, such hearing to be held not less than 30 days and not more than 90 days from the date of filing of the request for public hearing.
    - e. Following the public hearing, the Zoning Commissioner may either deny or grant a use permit conditioned upon:
      - (1) His findings following the public hearing;
      - (2)

The character of the surrounding community and the anticipated impact of the proposed use on that community;

- (3) The manner in which the requirements of Section 409.8.B.2 and other applicable requirements are met; and
- (4) Any additional requirements as deemed necessary by the Zoning Commissioner in order to ensure that the parking facility will not be detrimental to the health, safety or general welfare of the surrounding community and as are deemed necessary to satisfy the objectives of Section 502.1 of these regulations.
- 2. In addition to all other applicable requirements, such parking facilities shall be subject to the following conditions:
  - a. The land so used must adjoin or be across an alley or street from the business or industry involved.
  - b. Only passenger vehicles, excluding buses, may use the parking facility.
  - c. No loading, service or any use other than parking shall be permitted.
  - Lighting shall be regulated as to location, direction, hours of illumination, glare and intensity, as required.
  - e. A satisfactory plan showing parking arrangement and vehicular access must be provided.
  - f. Method and area of operation, provision for maintenance and permitted hours of use shall be specified and regulated as required.
  - g. Any conditions not listed above which, in the judgment of the Zoning Commissioner, are necessary to ensure that the parking facility will not be detrimental to adjacent properties.
- Notwithstanding the provisions contained in Subsections B.1 and B.2, in a Commercial Revitalization District, business parking in residential zones is permitted by right if there is an existing parking facility.
   [Bill No. 36-2013]
- C. Requirements for parking bays on a street. Parking bays on a street are subject to the following requirements and all applicable requirements of the Department of Public Works:
  - 1. The length of any parking bay (measured along the right-of-way) shall not exceed 180 feet. All bays must be separated by a divider which is at least 10 feet in width.
  - 2. Parking bays may not be located on any street where the average daily traffic exceeds 800 vehicles.
- D. Paving standards for trucking facility sites.
  - 1. Applicability. The provisions set forth below are adopted to regulate paving on the sites of both Class I and Class II trucking facilities.
  - 2. Standard. All parking, loading, maneuvering and aisle areas and all areas for the storage of empty containers and empty trailers must be paved and maintained with:
    - a. A bituminous concrete surface over a suitable base;
    - A portland-cement concrete surface over a suitable base; or

- . Two or more applications of bituminous surface treatment over a suitable base.
- Access to storage areas. All trucking facilities must be designed to provide access to storage areas via paved access aisles.
- 4. Engineering certification. A registered engineer of appropriate qualifications must certify that the paving, base and soil of all parking, loading, maneuvering, aisle and storage areas will withstand the loads imposed by expected truck traffic and storage activities.

## § 409.9. Provisions for physically handicapped.

Parking spaces for handicapped persons shall be provided in accordance with the standards specified in the Maryland Building Code for the Handicapped, as contained in the Code of Maryland Regulations, Section 05.01.07.

## § 409.10. Requirements for drive-through facilities.

A. For uses with drive-through facilities, stacking spaces for vehicles waiting to complete a transaction shall be provided in addition to the parking spaces required by Section 409.6. Each stacking space shall be at least 20 feet in length. The stacking space requirement shall not include the space next to the transaction station. The following are the minimum number of required stacking spaces by type use:

Use	Required Stacking Spaces
Automotive service station	As required in Section 405
Bank	5 for the first station, plus 2 for each additional station
Car wash	As required in Section 419
Restaurant, fast food	7 per station, 5 of which must be behind the order board [Bill No. 110-1993]
Restaurant, fast food, drive-through only	Single drive-through lane: 10 if walkup window is provided; 12 if there is no walkup window [Bill No. 110-1993]
	Double drive-through lane: 16 with no less than 5 stacking spaces per lane if walkup window is provided; 20 with no less than 5 per lane if there is no walkup window.  [Bill No. 110-1993]
Other uses	As determined by the Zoning Commissioner

B. The drive-through lane shall be distinctly marked by special striping or pavement markings and shall not block entry to or exit from off-street parking spaces otherwise required on the site. The drive-through lane may not cross the principal pedestrian access to the facility, except that, in the case of a drive-through only restaurant with two drive-through lanes, the drive-through lanes are permitted to cross the pedestrian access if a painted crosswalk in association with warning signs for pedestrians and motorists is provided. The crosswalk may not be located between vehicle stacking spaces.
[Bill No. 110-1993]

## § 409.11. Off-street loading.

For any building used for commercial or industrial purposes, adequate space for off-street parking to accommodate the loading and unloading of materials shall be provided, consistent with the size and

proposed use of the building. Such space, whether inside or outside a building, shall be in addition to the parking spaces required by Subsection 409.6 and shall be located and designed so as not to impede normal vehicular circulation.

## § 409.12. Other requirements.

- A. The off-street parking requirements in Section 409 shall supersede any off-street parking requirements adopted pursuant to the authority of Section 504.
- B. If the requirements for parking space or loading space in Section 409 would create an undue hardship, the Zoning Commissioner may approve a modified plan upon petition and after a public hearing, the procedure for which is set forth in Section 409.8.B.1 above.

## § 409.13. Reduction of parking requirements for large shopping centers.

#### [Bill No. 45-2012]

In order to prevent the establishment of a greater number of parking spaces than is actually required to serve the needs of shopping centers with 100,000 square feet or more of gross leasable area, a reduction of the number of required off-street parking spaces is permitted. On application, the Director of Permits, Approvals and Inspections may reduce the number of required parking spaces by up to 40% if the following procedures and conditions are satisfied:

- A. The applicant shall submit a certified site plan and documentary evidence of reduced parking needs to the Director. The site plan shall show all existing site improvements and proposed changes. The applicant's submittal shall be distributed to the Department of Planning and the Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability for review and recommendations.
- B. In determining whether to grant any parking reduction, the Director may prescribe any site improvements that are appropriate for the proper function of the shopping center or that are in the public interest. Site improvements may include:
  - Changes that will create a more attractive and pleasing appearance, such as additional or enhanced screening and landscaping, enhancement of building elevations, elimination or replacement of excessive or unsightly signage, and creation of an attractive cohesive architectural design.
  - Modification of existing vehicular access arrangements, such as changing the location or design of a vehicular entrance or changes to internal circulation design to provide safer conditions for motorists.
  - Creation of a safe and pedestrian-friendly environment, including the provision of bicycle amenities such as bike racks, and connections to adjacent neighborhoods.
  - 4. Enhancement of accessibility for the disabled.
  - 5. Replacement of existing outdoor lighting fixtures to eliminate or reduce the impacts of glare, light trespass, and excessive illumination.
  - Provision of amenity open space that is designed and intended to be used by the general public.
  - 7. Incorporation of sustainable practices that will reduce the environmental impact of buildings or associated site improvements. Sustainable practices include:

- Application of best management practices, such as the use of bioswales, stormwater management tree planters, structural soils and porous paving.
- b. Proper installation of shade trees to mitigate the heat island effect from paved surfaces.
- C. After consideration of agency recommendations, the Director may grant a parking reduction. The parking space reduction may not exceed 40% of the number of parking spaces otherwise required by Section 409. Any prior reduction of parking space requirements through the grant of a variance (if still applicable) shall be considered the required amount of parking for the purpose of calculating the requested reduction.
- D. If a parking space reduction is approved by the Director, with any required changes to existing or proposed site improvements, the site plan shall be revised to be consistent with the approval by the Director.
- E. If a parking reduction is granted, the shopping center may not be enlarged or increased in intensity unless application is made and approved for a new or revised parking space reduction.

## § 409.14. Bicycle parking.

[Bill No. 38-2013<sup>[1]</sup>]

A. General requirements. Bicycle parking shall be provided and installed as part of all new construction projects (excluding single-family detached residential) and remodeling projects of over 50% expansion in the C.T. District of Towson, the Loch Raven Commercial Revitalization District, the Perry Hall Commercial Revitalization District, the Catonsville Commercial Revitalization District, the Arbutus Commercial Revitalization District, the Lansdowne Commercial Revitalization District, the Baltimore National Pike Commercial Revitalization District, and in the Honeygo Area as follows:

[Bill Nos. 48-2013; 53-2014]

- The minimum amount of bicycle parking required shall be determined by multiplying the total number of off-street parking spaces required for the applicable use set forth in Section 409.6 by .04 (4%).
- 2. If the calculation is determined to be a number less than .5 space, then providing and installing bicycle parking is optional.
- In all other cases, the amount of bicycle parking required shall be the next highest whole number.
- B. Location. Bicycle parking shall be located:
  - On the same lot as the principal use;
  - 2. In a manner that prevents damage to bicycles by motor vehicles;
  - In a convenient, highly visible, active, well-lit area;
  - 4. In a manner that does not interfere with pedestrian movements; and
  - 5. As near the principal entrance of the building as practical.
- C. Design features. Bicycle parking racks or facilities shall be permanent fixtures on the property, and shall be consistent with the surroundings in color and design, and shall whenever possible be incorporated into building or street furniture design. Bicycle parking shall also be designed to:

- Allow each bicycle to be supported by its frame;
- 2. Allow the frame and wheels of each bicycle to be secured against theft and to avoid damage to the bicycles;
- 3. Be anchored in a manner that resists rust or corrosion, or removal by vandalism; and
- 4. Facilitate easy locking without interfering with adjacent bicycles.
- D. The provisions of this section may not be waived, except that a variance may be granted, consistent with the provisions of Section 307.1, only upon a finding that the bicycle parking rack or facility cannot be located on the same lot as the principal use and must be located on a property within at least 300 feet of the principal use lot or on publicly owned land by agreement with the property owner.

#### OPINION

These cases are before the Baltimore County Board of Appeals on appeals of the decisions of the Zoning Commissioner, in Case No. 06-109-SPH, in which the Zoning Commissioner granted special hearing relief, and in Case No. 03-360-SPHA of a decision from the Deputy Zoning Commissioner in which petitions for special hearing and variance relief were granted with restrictions. The Petitioner was represented by Arnold Jablon, Esquire. People's Counsel appealed both the Zoning Commissioner's and the Deputy Zoning Commissioner's decisions and various individuals, as well as the Greater Parkville Community Council and the Carey Improvement Association, also appeared to protest the decisions.

Hearings were held on January 25, 2005, June 21, 2006, November 2, 2006 and November 14, 2006. A public deliberation was held on January 23, 2007.

#### Background

Auto Properties, LLC, hereinafter referred to as "Petitioner," owns the unimproved parcel located at the intersection of East Avenue relocated and East Avenue in Carney. This rectangular parcel is approximately 148 feet wide and 287 feet deep and contains a gross area of 38,250 square feet, or 0.8781 acre, more or less. It is predominately zoned D.R.5.5 with a small sliver of B.M. property along the north and western boundaries. The property is surrounded on

March 14, 1968, was valid and that the subject property may be utilized pursuant to the use permit.

On November 9, 2005, the Zoning Commissioner found that the use permit granted for off-street parking, in Case No. 68-177-RX, on March 16, 1968, was valid and that the subject property could be utilized pursuant to that use permit in accordance with the Petitioner's site plan.

#### Case No. 06-109-SPH

People's Counsel argues several points with respect to the use permit granted by the Zonin-G Commissioner in the 1968 case. First, he argues that Harford Warehouse Corporation, the Petitioner in the 1968 case, did not fulfill the requirements of the decision rendered by the Zoning Commissioner in that the site plan was never approved by the Bureau of Public Services and the Office of Planning and Zoning, and there was no evidence that the requirements of § 409 of the BCZR (as the regulation stood at that time) were met. In any event, People's Counsel contends that Harford Warehouse Corporation and subsequent owners, including the Petitioner herein, never acquired vested rights in the use permit for parking on the subject property. In support of its position, People's Counsel cites Mayor & City Council v. Shapiro 187 Md. 623, 51 A.2d, 273 (1947). In that case the court stated:

The mere issuance of a permit, where the permittee has not commenced the work or incurred substantial expense on the faith of it, does not create a vested right or stop the municipal authorities from revoking it.

People's Counsel contends that the subsequent Rural Transition Area (RTA) legislation passed by the Baltimore County Council, as well as subsequent amendments to § 409 of the BCZR,

invalidated the 1968 decision granting the use permit for parking in the D.R. Zone, because the use was never utilized.

The Petitioner presented six affidavits, five from employees and one from a person who had nived in the neighborhood, stating that they witnessed cars being parked on the property for storage and knew that these cars were moved to the sales lot for sale when needed.

Petitioner presented James Abbott who was employed by the previous owner, Doug-Griffith Chrysler Plymouth, since 1970 and employed by Heritage, the present owner, since 1999. He stated that they used to park wrecked cars on the lot and also stored some used cars there. He stated that in 1986 the company opened a Saturn store in Glen Burnie and stored Saturn automobiles on the lot. He also stated that since the 1980's the company has not stored cars on the lot.

Several witnesses presented by the Protestants indicated that they could not remember cars ever being stored on the lot except possibly during the construction phase of one of the buildings, when some of the employee parking was disrupted. Other than that, they could not remember seeing cars stored on the lot at any time. One witness, who lived in the area for 47 years, stated that nothing had been done with the lot since Doug Griffith had owned the lot. One of the individuals presented photographs of tractor-trailer car carriers unloading on East Avenue in the neighborhood and a trailer unhitched being parked on East Avenue in the neighborhood. In addition, the neighbors complained that cars would be test driven on their street, East Avenue, by prospective buyers thereby increasing the traffic on the road.

Auto Croperties, LLC Case No.: 03-360-SPHA and Case No.: 06-109-SPH

The Board feels that a vested right for parking has not been obtained by the Petitioner.

The Board cites the case of *Sunrise Development*, 330 Md. 307, 410-411 in which the court stated:

Generally in order to obtain a vested right in an existing use that will be protected against a subsequent change in a zoning ordinance prohibiting that use, the owner must initially obtain a valid permit. Additionally, in reliance upon the valid permit, the owner must make a substantial beginning and construction and committing the land to the permitted use before the change in the zoning ordinance has occurred.

...in Maryland it is established that in order to obtain a "vested right" in the existing zoning use which will be constitutionally protected against a subsequent change in the zoning ordinance prohibiting or limiting that use, the owner must (1) obtain a permit or occupancy certificate where required by the applicable ordinance; (2) must proceed under that permit or certificate to exercise it on the land involved so that the neighborhood may be advised that the land is being devoted to that use. See *Feldstein v. LaVale Zoning Board*, 246 Md. 204, 211, 227 A.2d 731,734 (1967), indicating that [*Mayor and\_City County v. Shapiro*], 187 Md. 623, 51 A.2d, 273 (1947) as well as *Chayt v. Board of Zoning Appeals* 177 Md., 426, 9 A.2d 747 (1939) established as one of the test for determining the existence of a nonconforming use "is whether such use was known in the neighborhood." 254 Md. 255-56, 255 A.2d 404.

It seems clear to this Board that the parking use was not vested in that, while cars may have been parked on the lot during several occasions in the 1970's, the lot has not been used for parking since the 1980's. Moreover, the County Council enacted new off-street parking controls in Bill 26-88 in 1988. Section 409.1.A of the BCZR indicates that parking is for accessory use for buildings to accommodate the persons using the buildings.

The housing of inventory is central to the principal use of a car dealership. It is distinguishable from the accessory use by employees and customers for parking.

Section 409.8 states as follows:

- B. Business or Industrial Parking in Residential Zones.
  - Upon application, the Zoning Commissioner may issue

a use permit for the use of land in a residential zone for parking facilities to meet the requirements of Section 409.6 under the following procedure:

Section 409.6 sets forth the number of parking spaces that should be available for buildings or homes depending upon their size. It does not contemplate the parking of inventory of new or used car dealers. New car dealerships are dealt with in § 233 of the BCZR. Since § 409 of the BCZR was amended or rewritten in 1988, to more strictly curtail parking in residential zones, the unvested parking use granted in the 1968 Zoning Commissioner's decision did not survive.

#### Case No.: 03-360-SPHA

In this case, the Petitioner filed a request for special hearing to permit business parking in a residential zone to include storage of unlicensed passenger vehicles. It also requested a variance to permit a 25-foot buffer and 25-foot set back in lieu of the required 50-foot RTA buffer and 75-foot RTA set back.

The Zoning Commissioner granted the use permit and the variances without even considering § 409 of the BCZR. As stated above, it is the position of this Board that § 409 pertains only to accessory parking provided for employees and customers. To reiterate, § 409.8.B.1 allows the Zoning Commissioner to issue a permit for the use of land in a residential zone for parking facilities to meet the requirements of § 409.6 of the BCZR. There has been no evidence presented that the Petitioner could not meet the requirements under § 409.6 since there is ample parking for employees and customers. The sole purpose of the request for special hearing is to park inventory of automobiles on the lot. The Board feels that this is not warranted in this situation.

Auto noperties, LLC

Since the Board has found that an inventory of new cars could not be parked on the lot in accordance with § 409 of the BCZR, the Board sees no reason to discuss the RTA questions regarding variances to the buffers.

THEREFORE, IT IS THIS 6th day of Opul

ORDERED, that the Petition for Special Hearing filed in Case No. 06-109-SPH, seeking approval that the use permit granted for off street parking in Case No. 68-177-RX on March 14, 1968 : valid and that the subject property may be utilized pursuant to the use permit and in accordance with the Petitioner's request, be and the same is hereby DENIED; and it is further

ORDERED that the special hearing relief requested in Case No. 03-630-SPHA, to allow business parking in a residential zone to include the storage of new unlicensed passenger vehicles, be and is hereby DENIED.

Any petition for judicial review from this decision must be made in accordance with Rule 7-201 through Rule 7-210 of the Maryland Rules.

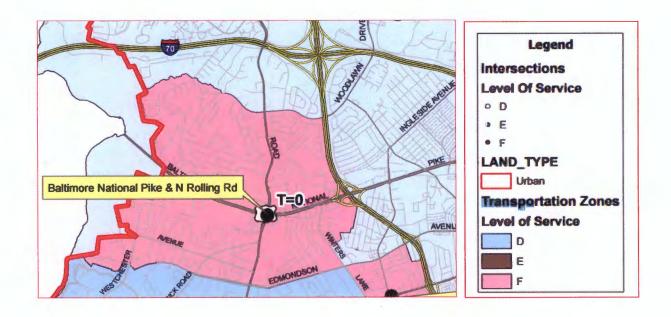

#### SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Department of Planning has reviewed the Petition for a Special Hearing to determine whether or not the Administrative Law Judge should approve business parking in a residential zone and also the Petition for a Variance to allow off-street parking spaces to be located a minimum of 12, 14 and 12 feet from the west, southeast and northeast tract boundaries, respectively, and to allow a minimum RTA buffer of 12, 14 and 12 feet from the west, southeast and northeast tract boundaries, respectively, in lieu of the required 75 feet and 50 foot RTA buffer, respectively.

Should the requested relief be granted for business parking in a residential zone, the following conditions are required as a prerequisite for the Department to concur with the requested RTA variance:

- Eliminate the 15 parking spaces along the west side of the proposed access adjacent to #1942
   Powers Lane and the 6 proposed parking spaces adjacent to the rear of #1934 Powers Lane
   pursuant to the red-lined plan received by this Department on 10/30/2015 from the Petitioners
   legal counsel.

   Powers Lane pursuant to the fence detail shown on the aforementioned red-lined plan. The
   Department has no objection to a chain-link type fence enclosing the balance of the property
   provided no concertina or barbed wire is used.
- Submit a landscaping and lighting plan to the Baltimore County Landscape Architect for approval
  prior to the issuance of permits. Lighting shall be directional so as to not spill onto the residential
  properties. Said plan shall include details on the proposed retaining wall.
- No loudspeaker or other fixed intercom system shall be permitted.
- There shall be no sales directly from the site or clientele permitted to browse on-site.

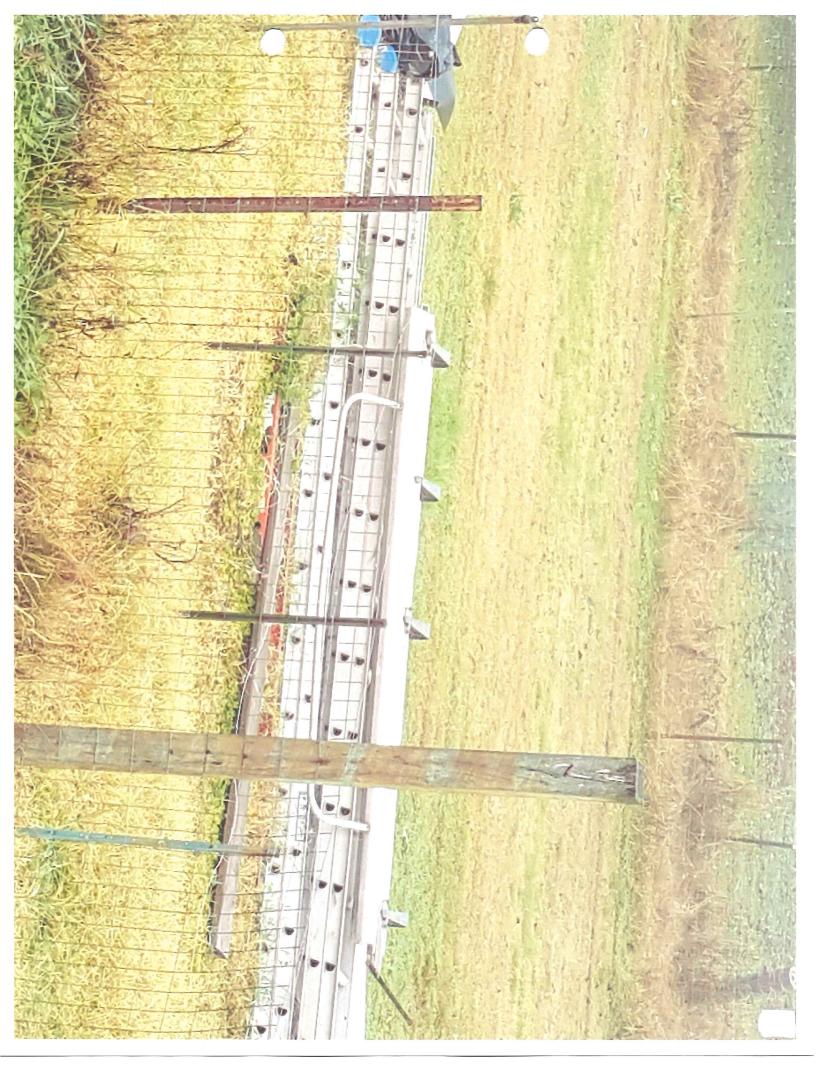






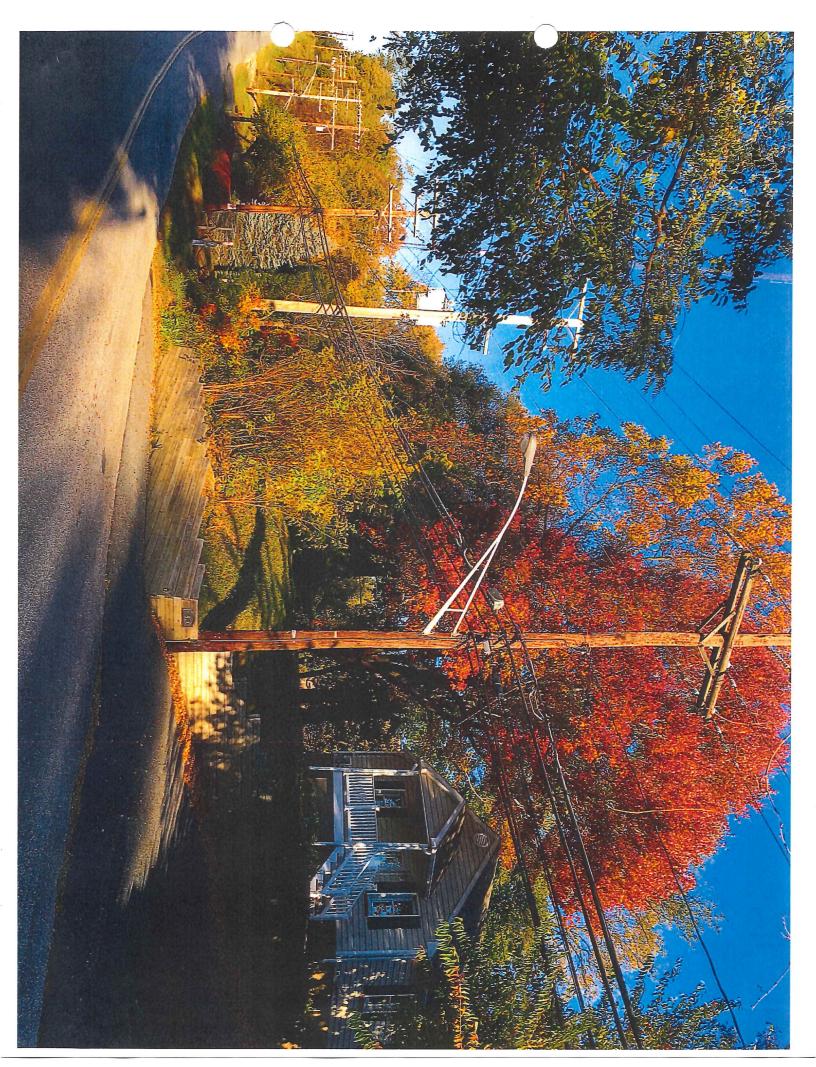


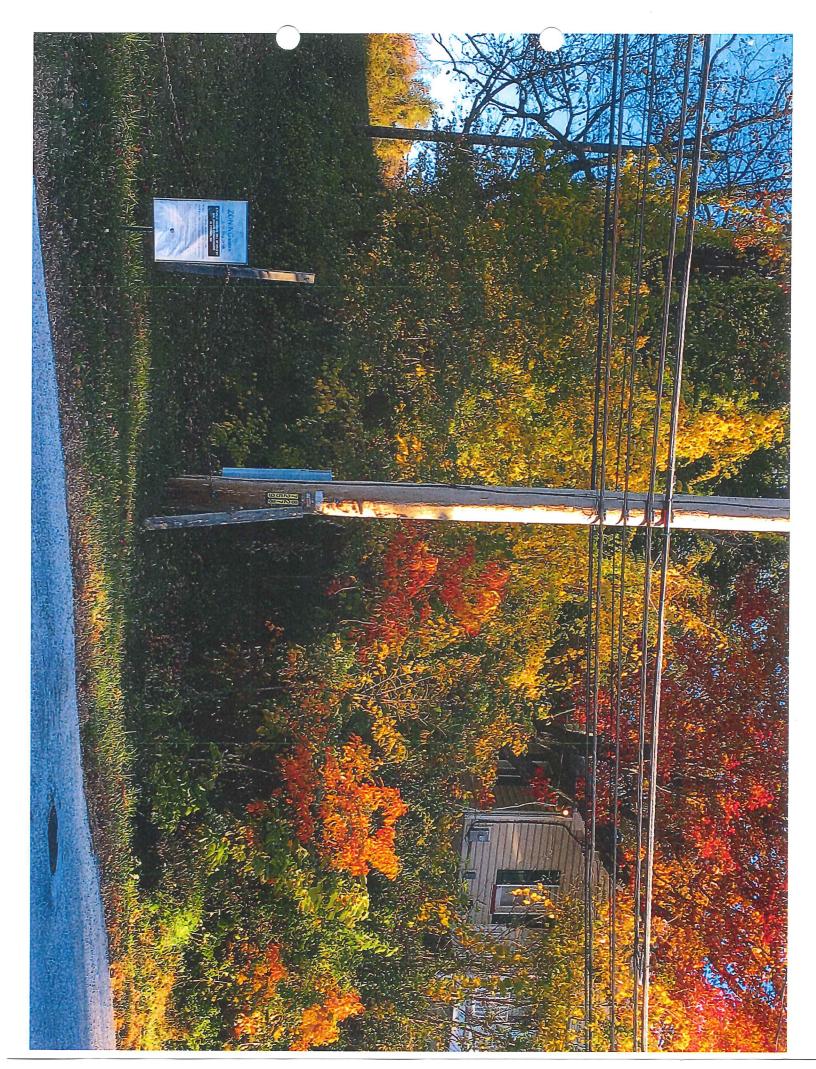




















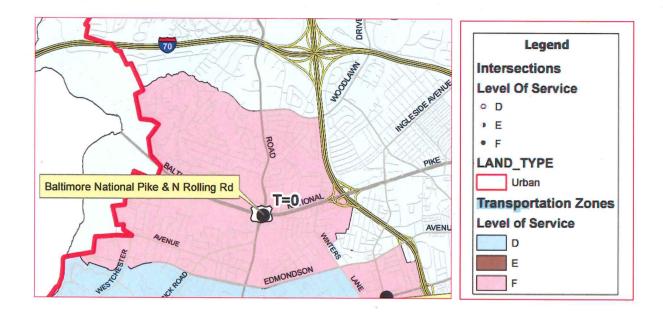




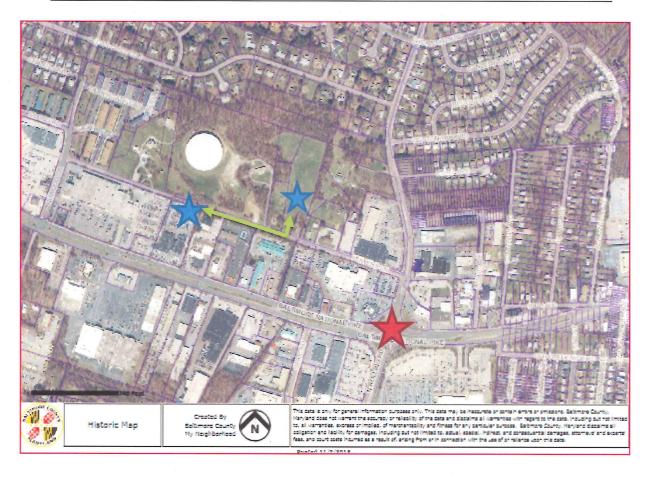




# 2015 Basic Services Map Transportation Zones

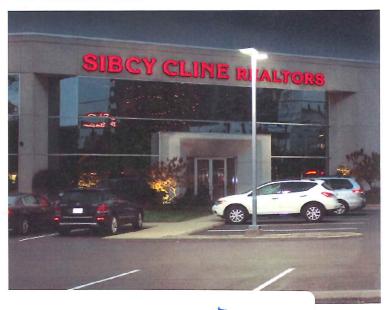

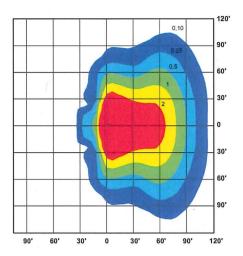

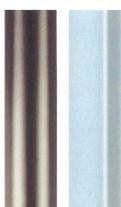

### SUMMARY OF RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Department of Planning has reviewed the Petition for a Special Hearing to determine whether or not the Administrative Law Judge should approve business parking in a residential zone and also the Petition for a Variance to allow off-street parking spaces to be located a minimum of 12, 14 and 12 feet from the west, southeast and northeast tract boundaries, respectively, and to allow a minimum RTA buffer of 12, 14 and 12 feet from the west, southeast and northeast tract boundaries, respectively, in lieu of the required 75 feet and 50 foot RTA buffer, respectively.

Should the requested relief be granted for business parking in a residential zone, the following conditions are required as a prerequisite for the Department to concur with the requested RTA variance:

- Eliminate the 15 parking spaces along the west side of the proposed access adjacent to #1942 Powers Lane and the 6 proposed parking spaces adjacent to the rear of #1934 Powers Lane pursuant to the red-lined plan received by this Department on 10/30/2015 from the Petitioners legal counsel.
- Provide attractive residential-style fencing along the property lines shared with #1934 and #1942
   Powers Lane pursuant to the fence detail shown on the aforementioned red-lined plan. The
   Department has no objection to a chain-link type fence enclosing the balance of the property
   provided no concertina or barbed wire is used.
- Submit a landscaping and lighting plan to the Baltimore County Landscape Architect for approval prior to the issuance of permits. Lighting shall be directional so as to not spill onto the residential properties. Said plan shall include details on the proposed retaining wall.
- No loudspeaker or other fixed intercom system shall be permitted.
- There shall be no sales directly from the site or clientele permitted to browse on-site.
