OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for consideration of Petitions for Special Hearing and Variance filed on behalf of Robert M. & Sherry Nally, legal owners ("Petitioners"). The Special Hearing was filed pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R."): (1) to clarify the definition of trailer versus recreational vehicle; and (2) to allow three (3) utility trailers in lieu of the allowed one (1). In addition, a Petition for Variance seeks: (1) to approve a setback of five (5) feet for a utility trailer in lieu of the required twenty-five (25) ft.; (2) to allow utility trailer parking in the front half of the lot in lieu of the required rear half of the lot; (3) to allow three (3) utility trailers in the rear lot in lieu of one (1) utility trailer; and (4) to allow an existing shed to be located in the side yard in lieu of the rear yard. A site plan was marked and accepted into evidence as Petitioners' Exhibit 1.

Appearing at the public hearing in support of the requests were owners Robert & Sherry Nally and surveyor Bruce Doak. Francis X. Borgerding, Jr., Esq. represented the Petitioners. Two neighbors attended the hearing to obtain additional information regarding the requests. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations. A

substantive Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comment was received from the Department of Planning (DOP).

SPECIAL HEARING

The first special hearing request seeks to "clarify the definition of trailer versus recreational vehicle." Both of these terms are defined in B.C.Z.R. §101.1, and to that extent I am hesitant to provide any clarification, which just might have the opposite effect. The issue apparently arose after the Bureau of Code Enforcement issued Petitioners a citation for having three (3) recreational vehicles on the property. The B.C.Z.R. provides a fairly specific definition of "recreational vehicle," and lists six different species of this genus.

Having reviewed that definition and the photographs (Ex. 2) submitted at the hearing, I do not believe the vehicles in question are recreational vehicles. They are commonly referred to as "utility trailers," although the B.C.Z.R. does not distinguish between a trailer and utility trailer. In any event, it might not matter much in the end, since the Regulations limit to one the number of recreational vehicles (RVs) and trailers which may be kept on residential property for non-commercial purposes. And though the wording used is slightly different, both trailers and RVs must be parked/stored in the rear yard.

The second special hearing request seeks to allow three utility trailers in lieu of the one permitted under the Regulations. Petitioners stated they have owned the trailers for nearly 14 years, and use them to transport ATVs, motorcycles and a compact tractor. They indicated they have never received a complaint regarding the trailers, and received a code citation concerning them only when a county inspector was investigating a complaint of an illegal service garage being operated at the property. Petitioners stated a service garage is not being operated at the premises, and they testified that aspect of the complaint has been dismissed.

VARIANCE

A variance request involves a two-step process, summarized as follows:

- (1) It must be shown the property is unique in a manner which makes it unlike surrounding properties, and that uniqueness or peculiarity must necessitate variance relief; and
- (2) If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or hardship.

Cromwell v. Ward, 102 Md. App. 691 (1995).

With regard to variance request number 4, Petitioners have met this test. The lot has irregular dimensions and is therefore unique. Petitioners would experience practical difficulty if the regulations were strictly interpreted because they would be required to raze the existing shed, which was constructed approximately 14 years ago when they purchased the property. Finally, I find that this variance can be granted in harmony with the spirit and intent of the B.C.Z.R., and in such manner as to grant relief without injury to the public health, safety, and general welfare.

But I do not believe the same can be said for variance request numbers 1-3, pertaining to storing the three trailers in the front yard. While Petitioners' property and trailers appear to be well-maintained, the neighbors in attendance expressed concern (which I believe is well-founded) that others in the community own trailers and equipment in poor condition which would be an eyesore if stored in the front yard. They fear that granting the variance could set a dangerous precedent. The DOP also noted in its ZAC comment that storing trailers in the front yard does not promote "orderly development and general welfare of the community." Finally, Mr. Nally testified that one reason for parking the trailers in the front is that it is convenient. In these circumstances I do not believe Petitioners would experience a practical difficulty or hardship if variance request numbers 1-3 were not granted.

Judge, that the Petition for Special Hearing filed pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R."): (1) to clarify the definition of trailer versus recreational vehicle; and (2) to allow three (3) utility trailers in lieu of the allowed one (1), be and is hereby GRANTED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Petition for Variance which seeks as follows (1) to approve a setback of five (5) feet for a utility trailer in lieu of the required twenty-five (25) ft.; (2) to allow utility trailer parking in the front half of the lot in lieu of the required rear half of the lot; and (3) to permit (3) utility trailers in the rear lot in lieu of one (1) utility trailer, be and is hereby DENIED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED the petition for variance to allow an existing shed to be located in the side yard in lieu of the rear yard, be and is hereby GRANTED.

The relief granted herein shall be subject to and conditioned upon the following:

- 1. Petitioners may apply for necessary permits and/or licenses upon receipt of this Order. However, Petitioners are hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at their own risk until 30 days from the date hereof, during which time an appeal can be filed by any party. If for whatever reason this Order is reversed, Petitioners would be required to return the subject property to its original condition.
- 2. The utility trailers shall be used only for household and/or recreational purposes. No commercial use of the trailers shall be permitted.
- 3. No recreational equipment (i.e., ATVs, motorcycles, jet skis) shall be stored on the trailers for a period in excess of 6 months.
- 4. The special hearing relief granted herein authorizes Petitioners to keep on their premises the three (3) utility trailers as shown in the photographs marked as Ex. #2. This relief is considered personal to Petitioners and does not "run with the land." If Petitioners sell or otherwise dispose of one or two of the current trailers, they shall not be permitted to replace such trailer(s), and may in that event only keep one such trailer on their property in accordance with the Regulations.

The Department of Planning has reviewed the petition for special hearing to determine whether or not the Administrative Law Judge should approve three utility trailers in lieu of the allowed one utility trailer and to clarify the definition of trailer versus recreational vehicle. The Department also reviewed the petition for variance to approve a setback of five feet, allow utility trailer parking in the front half of the lot, allow three utility trailers in the rear lot and to allow an existing shed to be located in the side yard in lieu of the permitted twenty-five feet setback, rear half of the lot, one utility trailer in the rear lot and rear yard respectively.

A site visit was conducted on May 5, 2016. This matter is the subject of Code Violation Case # CC16519. In that case, Baltimore County Code Enforcement identified the trailers as recreational.

The Department objects to granting the petitioned zoning relief save for the requested three utility trailers in the rear lot. The variance condition of having the trailers in the front yard is self-imposed. The situation appears to be readily solved by locating said trailers in the side yard 8' to the rear of a lateral projection of the front foundation line of the dwelling or in the rear yard. The petitioners offer no reasoning as to why this would be an undue hardship or create a safety issue.

The Department does not object to allowing three utility trailers in the rear lot conditioned upon the following:

- The trailers may be used only for recreational purposes ancillary to the principal residential use of the residents. No commercial use of the trailers shall be permitted.
- There shall be no permanent or long term (longer than 6 months) storage of recreational equipment on any trailer.

The Department recommends that the storage of trailers of any type in the front yard does not promote the orderly development and general welfare of the community as set forth in BCZR§100.1.A. In the event a case is made such that relief is granted allowing the trailers to be located within the front yard, the Department strongly recommends the following condition be imposed within the Order:

 Install vegetative screening along Stockton Road sufficient to screen any trailer from being visible from said road. A plan showing the proposed landscape screening should be submitted and approved by the Baltimore County Landscape Architect.

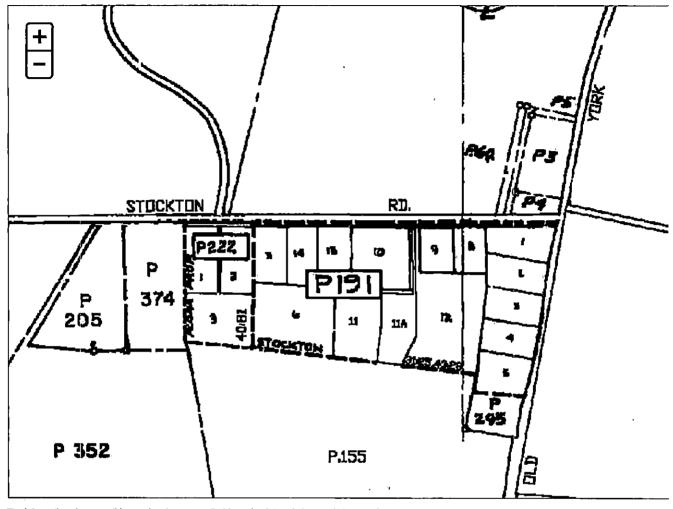

Section 414 Trailer Parks [BCZR 1955]

- The area of the lot on which such park is to be located shall be not less than five acres.
- An area of not less than 3,000 square feet shall be allocated to each trailer, which must be connected to sewer, water and electricity.
- Each trailer space shall abut or face on a driveway or unobstructed space of not less than 30 feet in width, which space shall have unobstructed access to a public highway. It shall be hard-surfaced and adequately lighted.
- No trailer or service building or structure used in connection therewith shall be placed or permitted within 100 feet of the road or street upon which the lot or area so used for such park fronts or within 75 feet of any other boundary line of such lot or area.
- There shall be a space of not less than 25 feet between each trailer and also a space of not less than 25 feet between any trailer and any service building or structure used in connection with such park.
- No such trailer park nor any service building or structure used in connection therewith shall be established or operated without the approval of and subject to the regulations and requirements of the Baltimore County Health Department. Written approval shall be a required condition prior to issuance of a permit.

Section 415 Trailers [Bill No. 109-1964 ¹⁶]

- Residential use of trailers. No person shall occupy a trailer for residential use except as follows and subject to the provisions of Section 415.6:
 - A. In an approved trailer park, in those zones where permitted as a special exception.
 - B. On a farm comprising 25 acres or more, in those zones where permitted and subject to Section 415.4.
 - C. On a tract comprising 25 acres or more, outside the Metropolitan District of Baltimore County, but any trailer so used must be located not less than 1,000 feet from any other trailer used for residence.
 - On a tract of from one to 25 acres, outside the Metropolitan District of Baltimore County, in those zones where permitted as a special exception.

¹⁶ Editor's Note: This bill also repealed former Section 415. That section was part of BCZR 1955 as amended by Bill No. 145-1959. The provision added as Section 415.5 by Bill No. 145-1965 was substantially reenacted as part of the definition of "Trailer (or Mobile Home)" in Section 101 by Bill No. 109-1964.

- E. On a type or significant covered by Section 415.1.B or the trailer was being used as a residence prior to the date of October 26, 19 day and subject to the provisions of Section 415.3.B.
- F. By a nonpaying guest of the owner of land using a trailer belonging to the guest for not more than a total of 90 days in any calendar year.
- G. For temporary living purposes as provided for in Section 415.2.B.1.
- Business or industrial use of trailers. No person shall occupy, store or park a trailer for business or industrial purposes except as follows and subject to the provisions of Section 415.6:

A. In a residential zone:

- For temporary office and accessory purposes incidental to construction on
 or development of the premises on which the trailer(s) is located, and in
 compliance with Section 415.3.A below, but not closer than 50 feet to any
 adjoining residential lot if such is occupied by a residence within 50 feet of
 the joint property line.
- 2. For purposes noted in Subsection 415.2.A.1, but where too small a lot is involved to permit fifty-foot setbacks from adjoining lots, the Zoning Commissioner may approve issuance of a temporary permit for one trailer for such nonresidential use for a period not to exceed 90 days, subject to the same minimum yard requirements as are applicable to a permanent dwelling in that zone.

B. In a business or industrial zone:

- As a temporary use for living, business or industrial purposes during a construction period, subject to the same minimum yard requirements as are applicable to permanent structures in that zone.
- As a continuing use for a sales office in connection with the following types
 of outdoor retail sales areas, subject to the requirements of the zone where
 located and to the provisions of Section 415.6:

Farm products
Garden supplies and plants
Trailer sales and storage
Used motor vehicles, separated from sales agency buildings

415.3 General provisions.

A. In any cases covered by Sections 415.1.B, C, D, E and F and 415.2.A.1, the trailer must be located so as to meet all minimum yard requirements for a dwelling, but in no case may the trailer be located closer to a street than any existing dwelling located on an adjoining lot and fronting on such street, except that such setback need not exceed 200 feet.

- B. In any cases covered by Subsection 415.1E, the owner must apply for a permit, as required in Section 415.4, within 90 days after adoption of this amended Section 415.17
- C. Storage or parking of trailers.
 - In a residential zone, a trailer may be stored or parked by the owner in a
 garage or other accessory building, or in the rear half of a lot, subject to the
 applicable side and rear setbacks, but in no case less than 25 feet from the
 property line. In no such case is residential occupancy permitted, nor is
 more than one trailer permitted to be stored or parked on a residential lot.
 - 2. In a business or industrial zone, trailers for sale in connection with a commercial sales office may be stored or parked in a garage, or in a sales lot area subject to the applicable side and rear yard setbacks and other requirements of the zone where located, but in no case less than 25 feet from a residential zone boundary, and in no such case is residential occupancy permitted.

415.4 Requirements of permits.

- A. For any uses of a trailer covered by Section 415 other than Sections-415.1.A and 415.1.F, application must be made to the Department of Permits and Development Management for issuance of a temporary or extended-occupancy permit, as the case may be. The granting of such permit may be subject to the ultimate approval of the Zoning Commissioner, who shall have the power to order the denial of the same if such granting or renewal would be detrimental to the health, safety or general welfare of the locality involved. Where a special exception has been granted for a use under Section 415, it shall be deemed that such use will not be detrimental to the health, safety or general welfare of the locality involved.
- B. A temporary permit must be procured from the Department of Permits and Development Management in cases covered by Sections 415.2.A and 415.2.B.1. Temporary permits shall be renewable annually.
- C. In cases covered by Sections 415.1.B, C, D and E and 415.2.B.2, extended-occupancy permits shall be subject to renewal every two years.

¹⁷ Editor's Note: Amended Section 415 was adopted under Bill No. 109-1964, which was passed by the County Council on December 7, 1964, enacted on December 11, 1964, and became effective on January 25, 1965.

The Department of Planning has reviewed the petition for special hearing to determine whether or not the Administrative Law Judge should approve three utility trailers in lieu of the allowed one utility trailer and to clarify the definition of trailer versus recreational vehicle. The Department also reviewed the petition for variance to approve a setback of five feet, allow utility trailer parking in the front half of the lot, allow three utility trailers in the rear lot and to allow an existing shed to be located in the side yard in lieu of the permitted twenty-five feet setback, rear half of the lot, one utility trailer in the rear lot and rear yard respectively.

A site visit was conducted on May 5, 2016. This matter is the subject of Code Violation Case # CC16519. In that case, Baltimore County Code Enforcement identified the trailers as recreational.

The Department objects to granting the petitioned zoning relief save for the requested three utility trailers in the rear lot. The variance condition of having the trailers in the front yard is self-imposed. The situation appears to be readily solved by locating said trailers in the side yard 8' to the rear of a lateral projection of the front foundation line of the dwelling or in the rear yard. The petitioners offer no reasoning as to why this would be an undue hardship or create a safety issue.

The Department does not object to allowing three utility trailers in the rear lot conditioned upon the following:

- The trailers may be used only for recreational purposes ancillary to the principal residential use of the residents. No commercial use of the trailers shall be permitted.
- There shall be no permanent or long term (longer than 6 months) storage of recreational equipment on any trailer.
