OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for consideration of a Petition for Special Hearing filed on behalf of Owings Mills Transit, LLC, legal owner. The Special Hearing was filed pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R.") to approve a waiver of the Department of Public Works Standards (Design Plate DR-1) to allow a 13 ft. setback in lieu of the required 20 ft. from the line which is created by adding the required freeboard to the 100 year water surface elevation.

Professional engineer Stephen Warfield, whose firm prepared the site plan appeared in support of the petition. David H. Karceski, Esq. represented the Petitioner. There were no protestants or interested citizens in attendance. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations. Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were received from the Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability (DEPS) and the Department of Public Works (DPW). The comments submitted by those agencies will be attached to the Order which follows.

The subject property is 33.847 acres and zoned BM-CT. The Metro Center at Owings Mills is located at the site. This project is known as a transit-oriented development and features offices, retail, apartments and a branch of the Baltimore County Public Library (BCPL) and ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING

Community College of Baltimore County (CCBC). At present, the Petitioner is proposing to construct a full-service hotel at the site, and the waiver is sought in connection with that project.

Mr. Warfield prepared an Exhibit (Petitioner's 1B) which shows in green the location of the 100 year riverine floodplain at the subject property. That exhibit also shows in yellow a line representing the 20 ft. setback from the floodplain, as dictated by County regulations. No portion of the hotel will be constructed within the floodplain. As such, strictly speaking this is not a floodplain waiver, as described in various sections of the County Code. B.C.C. §32-8-301 et. seq.; §32-4-414.

Instead, it is only a portion of a cantilevered second floor of the hotel which would encroach upon the 20 ft. setback. Mr. Warfield opined that granting the request would not result in the increase in flood levels and would be consistent with sound floodplain management. In addition, the DPW indicated it had no objection to granting the request. Based on this testimony and the evidence in the record, I believe granting the request would not result in an increased risk to life and/or property.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED this <u>15th</u> day of **July**, **2016** by this Administrative Law Judge, that the Petition for Special Hearing pursuant to B.C.Z.R. § 500.7 to approve a waiver of the Department of Public Works Standards (Design Plate DR-1) to allow a 13 ft. setback in lieu of the required 20 ft. from the line which is created by adding the required freeboard to the 100 year water surface elevation, be and is hereby GRANTED.

The relief granted herein shall be subject to the following:

1. Petitioner may apply for necessary permits and/or licenses upon receipt of this Order. However, Petitioner is hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at its own risk until 30 days from the date hereof, during which time an appeal can be filed by any party. If for whatever reason this Order is reversed, Petitioner would be required to return the subject property to its original condition.

2. Petitioner must comply with the ZAC comments of DPW and DEPS, copies of which are attached.

Any appeal of this decision must be filed within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

HEARING OFFICER'S OPINION AND DEVELOPMENT PLAN ORDER

This matter comes before the Hearing Officer/Zoning Commissioner of Baltimore County for a combined public hearing, pursuant to Section 32-4-230 of the Baltimore County Code (B.C.C.), for development plan approval and approval of a Petition for Variance and Petition for Special Hearing filed by Owings Mills Transit, LLC ("Developer"). The subject property, a total of 47.5± acres, comprised of two separate lots of record, is located on the west side of Painters Mills Road, north and south of I-795. Currently owned by the State of Maryland (Maryland Transit Administration), it is the site of the Owings Mills Metro station and related parking lots. The property is zoned BM-CT with a small amount of ML-IM zoning. On this site, Developer proposes a mixed-use, transit-oriented development containing a 40,000 square foot public library, 60,000 square foot community college center, 1.2 million square feet of office, 227,500 square feet of retail, 75,000 square feet of restaurants, a hotel, and 495 residential units.

In addition to development plan approval, Developer has requested approval of a Petition for Variance, seeking a variance related to building height and certain building setback variances. Specifically, Developer sought the following variances: (1) variance

from Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R.") Sections 231, 234, and 235B.5 to permit Building MS-RPGA-1, as shown on the accompanying site plan, to have a building height along the Public Road A facade of 115 feet measured at the vertical measure plane; (2) variance from B.C.Z.R. Section 235.1 to permit front building setbacks as close as 8 feet and 28 feet along Public Roads A and B in lieu of the minimum permitted 15 feet and 40 feet; and (3) variance from B.C.Z.R Section 235B.2 to permit a minimum distance between centers of facing windows of different apartments on the same lot to be as close as 40 feet for Building MS-RPGA-1, as shown on the accompanying site plan, in lieu of the minimum permitted 50 feet.

Developer also filed a Petition for Special Hearing, pursuant to B.C.Z.R. Section 500.6; Section 517.2 (510.2), Building Code; and B.C.C. Sections 32-4-107, 32-4-414, and 32-8-301, for a waiver to allow grading, installation of utilities, and construction (corner of Building NS-PG-1) within a riverine floodplain.

The proposed development and requested zoning relief are more particularly described on the red-lined Development Plan submitted and marked into evidence as Developer's Exhibit 2A-E and the red-lined Plan to Accompany Variance and Special Hearing submitted and marked into evidence as Developer's Exhibit 3A-3E.

As to the history of the project, after a Concept Plan was filed, a Concept Plan Conference was held on March 21, 2005. A Community Input Meeting was held on April 13, 2005. The Development Plan was then filed, and a Development Plan Conference was held on June 8, 2005. Following the Development Plan Conference, a Hearing Officer's Hearing for this development was scheduled and held on June 30, 2005. Certifications contained within the case file indicate that the property was properly posted with a sign providing public notice of the hearing and that the matter was also advertised in *The*

Jeffersonian newspaper. Having met these requirements, I find that proper public notice was provided.

At the hearing, attorneys Robert A. Hoffman and Patricia A. Malone appeared on behalf of the Developer. Also appearing were Arthur Adler and Skip Antonucci on behalf of Owings Mills Transit, LLC; Stephen Warfield, professional engineer with Matis Warfield, Inc., who prepared the Development Plan; John Canoles, an environmental consultant with Eco-Science Professionals, Inc.; Charlie Bailey, landscape architect and land planner with Mahan Rykiel Associates, Inc.; Robert Berry, architect with RTKL Associates, Inc.; and Wes Guckert, traffic engineer and President of The Traffic Group, Inc.

Numerous representatives of the various Baltimore County agencies who reviewed the Development Plan attended the hearing, including the following individuals: Colleen Kelly (Development Management); Mark Cunningham (Office of Planning); John Lewis and Jeffrey Perlow (Zoning Review); Bruce Seeley (DEPRM); Rahee Famili (Development Plans Review); David Thomas (Public Works); Eric Rockel (Land Acquisition); and Jan Cook (Recreation and Parks). Susan Dubin, Assistant County Attorney, also appeared. The Fire Department submitted only written comments.

The following individuals appeared on behalf of the State of Maryland's Department of Transportation: Del Adams (Maryland Transit Administration), Steven Foster (State Highway Administration), Larry Gredlein (State Highway Administration), and Mary Deitz (State Highway Administration).

Two area residents attended the hearing and expressed some concerns about the development: Calvin Reter and Michael Collins.

At the Hearing Officer's Hearing, I attempted to determine what, if any, issues or comments remain unresolved as of the date of the hearing before me. Initially, Mr.

Hoffman, on behalf of Developer, identified three issues, each of which could be described as a difference of opinion between Developer and the County or the State agency with regard to the interpretation of certain County or State requirements. The first related to Zoning's conclusion that handicapped parking spaces could not be counted for purposes of the Shared Parking Analysis. The second related to DEPRM's conclusion that the "North Parcel" and the "South Parcel" should be considered as one property for purposes of the application of the Forest Conservation Act. Lastly, Mr. Hoffman expressed some concern over SHA's comment of June 6, 2005, regarding "offsite improvements." None of these "issues," however, would impact the approvability of the Development Plan as presented to the Hearing Officer. As Mr. Hoffman explained, Developer had prepared the plan in satisfaction of the applicable requirements based on the particular agency's interpretation rather than Mr. Hoffman's interpretation, and, thus, the plan was in compliance with all County and State requirements.

After hearing from Mr. Hoffman, I questioned the representatives of each of the County agencies regarding the existence of any outstanding issues. Having reviewed the red-lined modifications made to the Development Plan (Developer's Exhibit 2A-2E), each of the representatives from the reviewing County agencies identified no outstanding or unresolved issues and reported that his or her agency recommended plan approval.

Del Adams (Maryland Transit Administration), with Mr. Foster and Mr. Gredlein (State Highway Administration) also in attendance, spoke on behalf of the Maryland Department of Transportation and indicated that the SHA and MTA had no objection to approval of the Development Plan. With regard to the State Highway Administration's June 6, 2005, comment, Mr. Adams confirmed that Developer's responsibility for any "offsite improvements" would be limited to those State roads that provide direct access to the site.

Mr. Adams confirmed that only the ramps directly connecting the site to I-795 would be subject to further possible improvement.

Following confirmation from the various County and State agencies that there were no outstanding issues and that the plan was acceptable as presented, Mr. Hoffman informed this Hearing Officer that he was withdrawing his request for an interpretation by the Hearing Officer on the three issues outlined above and would not object to approval of the plan as submitted.¹

As for the citizens who appeared, Mr. Reter described his participation in a focus group organized to ensure that the site would be developed in a "community-oriented" manner. Over the last several years, he and other community members spent many hours working towards this goal. Although Mr. Reter is, apparently, happy about the library and community college, he would liked to have seen more community-oriented uses including, as he mentioned, a skating rink. He offered an exhibit related to this issue as Protestants' Exhibit 1. Mr. Reter also expressed a concern over the additional traffic that would be created from this development, and he questioned whether the development would put more pressure on emergency services. A second citizen, Mr. Collins, appeared and expressed generalized concerns over the impact that the 495 residential units would have on schools and on traffic.

In response, Susan Dubin, Assistant County Attorney, attempted to reassure Mr.

Reter that the community's desires had, in fact, been considered, and Baltimore County fully

and community college would have "community space" for the community to gather and meet. She, further, confirmed that the issue of emergency services had been considered and, for example, the County was in discussions with the State regarding sharing the responsibility for policing. On the issue of traffic, Ms. Dubin stated that discussions were ongoing and that Baltimore County would continue to monitor the situation. Mr. Adams also offered additional comment on traffic and stated that the SHA and MTA, along with Baltimore County, would, indeed, continue to monitor the status of the roads surrounding the site, and he stated that he did not anticipate any problems.

On the issue of school overcrowding, Mr. Cunningham of the Office of Planning explained that Developer had prepared and submitted a School Impact Analysis as part of the development plan review and approval process. Mr. Cunningham confirmed that Planning had reviewed the analysis and had determined the proposed development to be in compliance with Title 26, Article IX of the Baltimore County Code. The issue of school capacity is more fully explained in Planning's Comment of June 8, 2005, but, in short, despite overcrowding at New Town Elementary School, because adjacent schools have extra capacity, this development meets the adequate public facility requirement for schools.

In addition to the County and State agencies that reviewed the Development Plan and found it acceptable, Developer also presented the testimony of Stephen Warfield, the professional engineer responsible for the preparation of the plan. Mr. Warfield, first, gave a brief introduction of the plan and, then, confirmed that, with the zoning relief sought, the plan meets all County, State, and Federal requirements. On the issue of impacts to schools, Mr. Warfield stated that his firm prepared the School Impact Analysis to which Mr.

Cunningham referred, and he confirmed that the development meets the requirements of the County Code with regard to schools.

On the issues of traffic, Mr. Warfield also testified that, according to Baltimore County's Basic Services Transportation Area Map, there are no failing intersections in the surrounding vicinity and the property does not lie within a failing traffic shed. Therefore, the County's growth management legislation (B.C.Z.R. Section 4A02) would not restrict development in the area. Although it was deemed not necessary for him to testify, I would note that Mr. Guckert, a noted traffic expert, was available to provide additional testimony on behalf of Developer on the issue of traffic.

Having concluded testimony and evidence on the Development Plan, the hearing moved on to the relevant zoning issues. As previously noted, in addition to development plan approval, Developer has also requested zoning relief in the form of a Petition for Variance and Petition for Special Hearing. This relief was detailed in the petitions that were filed and also on the Plan to Accompany Variance and Special Hearing, which I accepted into evidence as Developer's Exhibit 3A-3E. Specifically, Developer sought the following variances: (1) variance from B.C.Z.R. Sections 231, 234, and 235B.5 to permit Building MS-RPGA-1 to have a building height along the Public Road A façade of 115 feet measured at the vertical measure plane; (2) variance from B.C.Z.R. Section 235.1 to permit front building setbacks as close as 8 feet and 28 feet along Public Roads A and B in lieu of the minimum permitted 15 feet and 40 feet; and (3) variance from B.C.Z.R Section 235B.2 to permit a minimum distance between centers of facing windows of different apartments on the same lot to be as close as 40 feet for Building MS-RPGA-1 in lieu of the minimum permitted 50 feet.

It should be noted that the variance requests are confined to the South Parcel. Mr. Warfield testified regarding the variances and explained where the variances occur. As Mr. Warfield explained, each of the buildings has been located close to Public Roads A and B in order to create a "Main Street" atmosphere with some on-street parking provided. This concept is evident from the architectural renderings found in the Pattern Book submitted by Developer and approved by the Planning Office. Pushing the buildings closer to the public roads has generated the need for the first two variances.

The first variance relates to the height of Building MS-RPGA-1 along Public Road A. *See* Developer's Exhibit 3E. Because of the way building height is calculated in the BM zone, based on a flexible height "tent," the further a building is from the building line, the taller the building is permitted to be. This statement is an oversimplification of the concept of "height tent," which is more completely outlined in B.C.Z.R. Sections 231, 234. Building MS-RPGA-1 contains retail on the first story and residential units above the first story with related parking and is proposed to have a building height along the Public Road A facade of 115 feet measured at the vertical measure plane. This measurement is not a maximum building height because the building gets taller as it moves away from Public Road A.

The second variance relates to the spatial relationship of certain buildings to Public Roads A and B. This request is to allow certain buildings, as shown on Developer's 3A-3E, to have reduced front building setbacks along Public Roads A and B, again to create that "Main Street" feel. *See* Developer's Exhibit 3C.

The third variance, once more for Building MS-RPGA-1, is to allow apartments facing each other to have windows located closer together than would otherwise be permitted. The design of this mixed-use, multi-level building has created situations where

the centers of facing windows of different apartments will be 40 feet apart instead of the required 50 feet apart. See Developer's Exhibit 3C.

The Zoning Commissioner is permitted to grant variances, pursuant to B.C.Z.R. Section 307, upon finding that special circumstances exist and that requiring strict compliance with the regulations would result in a practical difficulty for the petitioner. Having heard the testimony and considered the requests, I find that sufficient evidence and justification exists to grant the requested variances. The "Main Street" concept envisioned for this development would not be possible without the granting of the variances. This site, with the existing Metro station, presents a unique opportunity to create a truly special project with its mix of private and public uses. This transit-oriented development will not only encourage the use of public transportation, but also will become a gathering place for the community to work, live, shop, and learn. I find the design of this project to be superior, and I find that a practical difficulty will result if the variances are not granted. Therefore, I will grant the requested variances.

Lastly, Developer filed a Petition for Special Hearing, seeking a waiver to allow grading, installation of utilities, and construction within a riverine floodplain. As Mr. Warfield explained, there are two areas on the North Parcel that require such relief, and these areas are identified on Developer's Exhibit 3B. The Gwynns Falls and the resulting 100 year riverine floodplain impacts the North Parcel at the northeast corner of the site and along its eastern boundary. In the area identified as Floodplain Area #1 on Developer's Exhibit 3B, Developer proposes to perform grading and construction within the riverine floodplain. Due to various site limitations and other constraints related to the design and layout of this transit-oriented development, a corner of Building NS-PG-1, a parking garage on the North Site, will be constructed within the floodplain. Mr. Warfield testified that, at

its widest point, the encroachment will be 20 feet wide, tapering down from that point on either side, with a total encroachment of approximately 1,000 square feet.

In the area identified Floodplain Area #2, on Developer's Exhibit 3B, Developer proposes to perform work related to the installation of a proposed sewer line in the existing paving of Painters Mill Road. Although encompassed in the relief requested, Mr. Warfield also pointed out that both the North Parcel and the South Parcel will have reduced setbacks to floodplain areas (of as little as 2 feet). Finally, Mr. Warfield explained that Developer will be performing grading and the installation of Building NS-RPG-1 and a new entrance to Painters Mill Road within the freeboard area, which work requires no special relief.

On the issue of the waiver request, David Thomas appeared on behalf of the Department of Public Works and presented a Zoning Advisory Committee comment from Mr. Edward Adams, Director, dated June 28, 2005. In this comment, Mr. Adams suggests that, if I grant the requested waiver, the relief should be conditioned on the addition of certain notes to the plan to ensure that there will be no adverse impact from the work and/or construction in the floodplain. At the hearing, Mr. Warfield and Mr. Thomas confirmed that the red-lined Development Plan addresses Notes 1, 3, and 4 of Public Works' comment. Mr. Warfield, during the hearing, placed Note 2 on the red-lined Development Plan and, subsequent to the hearing, conformed the Plan to Accompany Variance and Special Hearing to the Development Plan on this issue. With the addition of these notes, the Department of Public Works, although not advocating approval, has no objection to the granting of the waiver.

Having considered all of the evidence and testimony on this issue, I am persuaded to grant the Petition for Special Hearing and the requested waiver. In my judgment, Developer has satisfied the requirements for such relief as set out in Section 32-4-107 of the Baltimore

County Code. The waiver is justified in light of the circumstances involved in this case, the waiver is within the scope, purpose, and intent of Title 4 of the B.C.C., and I find that all other county laws and regulations have been met.

With the granting of the zoning petitions, based on the cumulative testimony and evidence presented by Developer, with no evidence to the contrary being offered, I find that the Development Plan is in compliance with all applicable County, State, and Federal Regulations. Therefore, having identified no unresolved or outstanding issues, the Development Plan shall be approved.

Pursuant to the Zoning and Development Regulations of Baltimore County as contained within the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations and in Article 32, Title 4 of the Baltimore County Code, the advertising and posting of the property, and public hearing held thereon, the Development Plan shall be approved consistent with the comments contained herein and the restrictions set forth hereinafter, if any, and, for the reasons set forth above, the Petition for Variance and the Petition for Special Hearing shall be granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED by this Zoning Commissioner/Hearing Officer for Baltimore County this _____ day of July, 2005, that the five-page, revised redlined development plan for the Metro Center at Owings Mills, identified herein as Developer's Exhibit 2A-2E, be and is hereby APPROVED; and,

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that the Petition for Variance, seeking relief, as shown on the redlined Plan to Accompany Variance and Special Hearing, entered into evidence as Developer's Exhibit 3A-3E, from: 1) B.C.Z.R. Sections 231, 234, and 235B.5 to permit Building MS-RPGA-1 to have a building height along the Public Road A façade of 115 feet measured at the vertical measure plane; (2) B.C.Z.R. Section 235.1 to permit front building setbacks as close as 8 feet and 28 feet along Public Roads A and B in lieu of the minimum

permitted 15 feet and 40 feet; and (3) B.C.Z.R Section 235B.2 to permit a minimum distance between centers of facing windows of different apartments on the same lot to be as close as 40 feet for Building MS-RPGA-1 in lieu of the minimum permitted 50 feet, is hereby GRANTED; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that the Petition for Special Hearing seeking relief from B.C.Z.R. Section 500.6; Section 517.2 (510.2), Building Code; and B.C.C. Sections 32-4-107, 32-4-414, and 32-8-301, for a waiver to allow grading, installation of utilities, and construction within a riverine floodplain, is hereby GRANTED.

Any appeal of this decision must be taken in accordance with Section 32-4-281 of the Baltimore County Code.

Judge Beverungen,

Thank you for the opportunity to respond. I am addressing your questions in the order listed below.

- 1. You are correct. The sections you reference below relate to development within the floodplain. The request in this case relates solely to improvements within the 20 foot setback from a floodplain. As such, the standards and burden of proof for a waiver contained in Sections 32-8-301 and 303 are not applicable.
- 2. Steve Warfield, the professional engineer who signed and sealed the site plan in this case, and I are not aware of any reference in the County Code, Building Code or other County regulations to the Department of Public Works Design Plate (DF-1). The design plate is contained in the Department of Public Works Baltimore County Design Manual, adopted in August in 2010 by the County Council (County Resolution 63-10). My understanding from conversations with Mr. Warfield is that Dave Thomas with the Department of Public Works concurs.
- 3. These provisions are not inconsistent. The County Code does not permit basements in the floodplain area. All of the proposed work associated with the hotel building is located outside of the floodplain area, including the basement of the hotel. The elevation of the basement is allowed to be built below the floodplain elevation, per Design Plate DF-1, as long as the requirements of the Building Code are met. The final design and construction of the proposed hotel will, therefore, conform to the requirements contained in the Building Code.
- 4. Thank you for alerting us to the typo. We will correct it on future submissions to the County.

Please let me know if I can provide any additional information.

Mr. Karceski,

I am preparing the order in the above case and wanted your input on a few questions I had after reviewing the exhibits. As discussed at the hearing, floodplain cases are out of the ordinary in the context of a zoning hearing, and I just wanted to be sure I understood the issues.

- 1. As a general matter, your request seeks a "waiver," but this is not strictly speaking the same type of "waiver" envisioned in BCC 32-8-301 and 303, where one needs to show "exceptional hardship," etc.? Is it correct that in those cases the petitioner is seeking to develop within the floodplain while in the above case the petitioner seeks a relaxation (or "waiver") of the 20 ft. setback from the floodplain?
- 2. Mr. Warfield described the 20 ft. setback shown on Ex. 5 submitted at the hearing. Other than that drawing, is the 20 ft. setback specified in the County Code, Building Code or other regulation?
- 3. Ex. 1B contains a note stating the basement area would be below the floodplain elevation, but cites note #4 on the DPW drawing (Ex. 5) which permits that condition provided certain building code standards are met. But BCC 32-8-207(d)(3) states "basements are not permitted in the floodplain area." Are these provisions inconsistent? Or does the drawing refer to elevation while the Code section is applicable to the floodplain proper; i.e., inside the green line shown on Ex. 1B?
- 4. FYI, Ex. 1B contains a typo where it shows the second story overhang to the floodplain....the plan says "flooplain." No need to correct that for purposes of this hearing, but wanted to let you know in case Mr. Warfield wants to make the change on his plans.
