OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for consideration of a Petition for Special Hearing filed on behalf of Katrina & Wilmington Grewe, legal owners ("Petitioners"). The Special Hearing was filed pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R) for approval of: (1) the third amendment of the Final Development Plan for "Worthington Valley Estates Addition" for the: (a) subdivision of the Storm Water Management Reservation; (B) creation of Lot 34; and (C) to increase the total lots from 33 to 34; (2) any other permission deemed necessary by the Administrative Law Judge; and (3) amend the tract boundary for the property of "Worthington Valley Estates Additions."

Katrina & Wilmington Grewe and surveyor Bruce Doak appeared in support of the petition. Gary Eidelman, who lives next door to Petitioners, opposed the requests. Mr. Eidelman was represented by Gregory Rapisarda, Esq. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations. Substantive Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were received from the Department of Public Works (DPW), the Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability (DEPS) and the Bureau of Development Plans Review (DPR).

This case involves a subdivision known as Worthington Valley Estates Addition, which was created by plat recorded in 1981. (Plat Book 47, page 8). The subject property is zoned R.C.5. Petitioners propose to amend the second amended Final Development Plan (FDP) for this subdivision (Petitioners' Ex. No. 1) which would have the effect of increasing from 33 to 34 the number of building lots proposed. Petitioners propose to create the new lot (at least in part) by utilizing approximately one acre of the four acre stormwater management (SWM) reservation parcel shown on the aforementioned plat.

Though shown on the plat, it is undisputed the four acre SWM parcel was never formally conveyed to Baltimore County. Petitioners purchased the four acre SWM parcel in 2006 from Helen Chellis, designated on the 1981 Worthington Valley Estates plat (along with her now deceased husband) as "Owner & Developer." Petitioners' Ex. No. 4A. Petitioners would combine the one acre portion of the SWM pond with another small parcel they currently own (which is contiguous to but not part of the Worthington Valley Estates subdivision) to create a 1.85 +/- acre R.C. 5 parcel known as Lot 34, on which they would construct a single-family dwelling.

As noted above, the FDP for Worthington Valley Estates shows a 4.10 acre +/"Stormwater Management Reservation" along the eastern boundary of the subdivision. Petitioners
would subdivide this lot as shown on the redline FDP (Petitioners' Ex. No. 1), which would result
in a 3.22 +/- acre SWM reservation area which would be conveyed to Baltimore County. The
applicable regulation is B.C.Z.R. §1B01.3, which permits (as applicable in this case) amendment
of an FDP following a public hearing, provided the amendment is "consistent with the spirit and
intent of the original plan." B.C.Z.R. §1B01.3.A.7. This then is the pivotal question to be answered
in this case.

Devin Leary, a registered landscape architect accepted as an expert, testified he has been involved with this project since 2006. He noted the project was "complicated" and testified the "intent was for the previous developer to convey this storm water pond to Baltimore County." Based on this testimony alone (which was not contradicted) I do not believe the proposed amendment would be "consistent with the spirit and intent of the original plan." *Id.* While Petitioners propose to convey a 3.22+/- acre pond to the County, the "original plan" specified the parcel was 4.10 +/- acres. In an email dated December 7, 2015 James A. Markle, P.E. (on behalf of DEPS) informed Petitioners the "existing stormwater management pond must be conveyed infee to Baltimore County in a Stormwater Management Reservation. The reservation must include the entire pond and provide access to Missi Court." See Petitioners' Ex. No. 10.

In addition, the County Code specifies that subdivision plats must be accompanied by "irrevocable offers of dedication to the public of all public improvements." BCC §32-4-271(b). This was also the law in 1981 when the Worthington Valley Estates plat was recorded. BCC §§ 26-214(a) (1988) & 22-66 (1978). As such, I do not believe the 2006 Chellis-Grewe conveyance was lawful, and I believe the County would now be entitled to insist upon the conveyance of the entire 4.10 +/- acre SWM parcel. Indeed, an analogous scenario was addressed by Maryland's highest court in Hackerman v. City of Baltimore, 212 Md. 618 (1957). In that case, the court held the city can accept an offer of dedication (shown on a plat) of real property to be used for a street fifteen years after the same property was purportedly conveyed by deed to a third party.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED this <u>30th</u> day of December, <u>2016</u> by this Administrative Law Judge, that the Petition for Special Hearing to approve: (1) the third amendment of the Final Development Plan for "Worthington Valley Estates Addition" for the: (a) subdivision of the Storm Water Management Reservation; (B) creation of Lot 34; and (C) to increase the total lots from 33 ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING

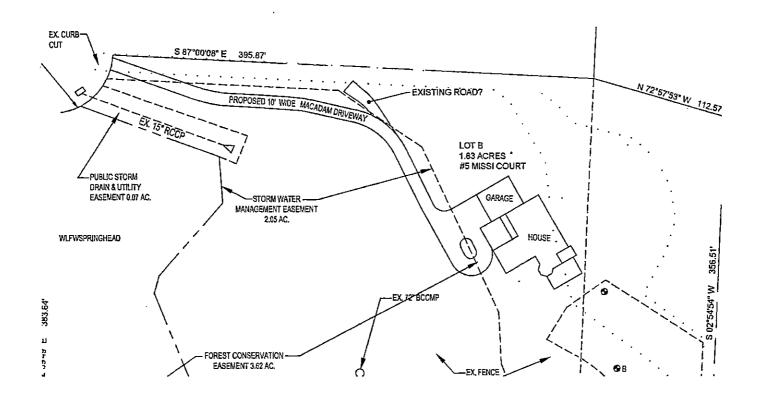

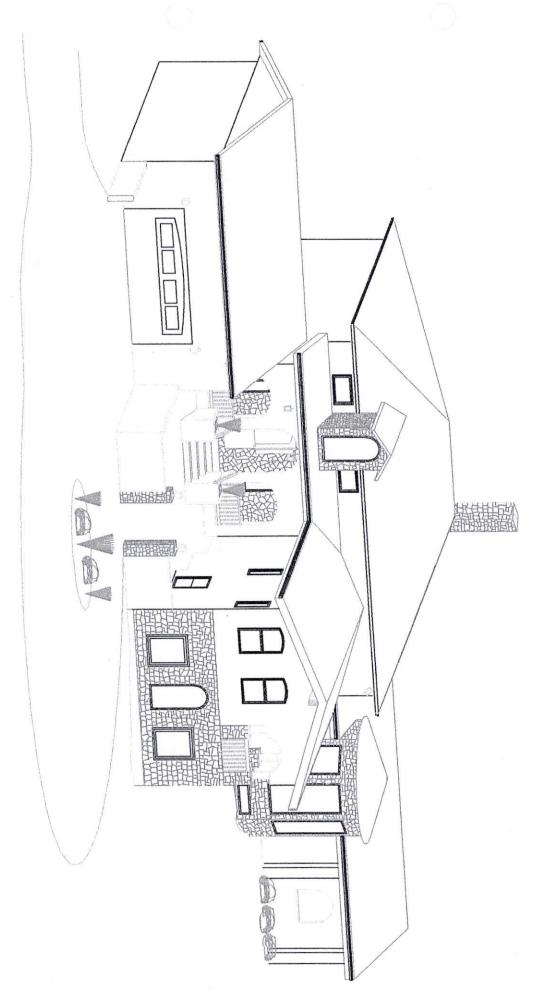
Project History

- -July 2006: Bill & Carmenza purchased the 4 acre Storm Water Management Area with intent to try and subdivide to build a home. The Minor subdivision would create a total of two lots, & the SWM parcel. One lot being the existing house, the other being the lot to build the new house on.
- -Feb, 2008: DRC review determines that project meets requirements needed to proceed with Minor Subdivision Plan.
- -2008: Bill visited all neighbors on Missi crt and gets verbal agreement from all to proceed with project.
- -May 2009: Bill passed away due to cancer, and the project was put on hold.
- -Spring 2013: Project was re-started. Perc tests successfully completed, and environmental studies restarted.
- -Sept 2015: 1st Minor Subdivision Plan was submitted to county.
- -Nov 2015: Went door to door to each of the neighbors on Missi Crt to discuss our intentions with a lot of very positive feedback. One neighbor mentioned some concerns, and we assured him we would accommodate his wishes (driveway location, & privacy screening).
- -Dec 2015 Jim Markle agreed to accept to have SWM pond conveyed in fee, with certain conditions met. Detail design of house was started, and topo survey was done to verify various elevations.
- -Jan 2016: Project once again was put on temporary hold due to a car accident that we were involved with.
- -Dec 2016: Hearing was held in regards to the changes that would impact Worthington Valley subdivision.

Note: Maintenance/upkeep of the pond and it's functionality has been required for close to 10 years. This involved coating of the piping, as well as continuous clearing & trimming of trees, and removing debri. All taxes have been paid as well.

- There will be forest clearing in order to build the house. Payment for forest clearing must made prior to issuance of grading or building permits. 1.2 acres of reforestation for clearing below the Forest Conservation Threshold. Purchasing into a forest retention bank will be required. Estimated cost 0.29¢/sf x 1.2 acre x 43,560 sf/acre = \$15,158.88
- Forest Buffer (FB) impacts total 6,150 sf for proposed lot. 2:1 mitigation is typically required and we would propose using a forest buffer planting bank. Estimated cost 0.42¢/sf x 2 x 6,150 sf = \$5,166.00

The last submission of the minor subdivision plan that we saw was in September. My reviewer, Ed Schmaus, had made comments dated October 16, 2015. I am modifying those comments with this email.

- 1. Stormwater management must be provided for the new house and driveway using Environmental Site Design as required by the current stormwater management regulations. A stormwater management plan, grading plan and sediment control plans will be required.

After our meeting on Tuesday, I had a meeting with Scott Porter, who is my Operations

Manager. He runs two county crews that maintain public stormwater management ponds (approx.. 1300 ponds). I asked him to take a look at the pond on your property and he informed me that he was familiar with the pond and had previously performed some maintenance work on the facility. Apparently, some years ago, the County assumed maintenance responsibility for the pond even though the County had never received asbuilt plans and the property (Stormwater Management Reservation) had never been deeded to the County.

The good news is since the County has already taken over maintenance of the pond, we will no longer be requiring you to do that work. We will however, still need a Stormwater Management Reservation that covers the pond and access out to Missi Court deeded to Baltimore County as part of the minor subdivision process. We will be forced to either discard the parcel, unless we can come up with some sort of compromise. Maybe we simply contribute a one time fee towards improvements, etc...I don't know.

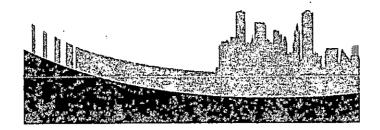

I wanted to bring you up to date on the project.

Human and Rohde has received approval from Baltimore County for the wetlands delineation and the forest conservation determination. There computations have determined that you can meet the county's requirements but some of the protected area must come from the storm water management area that will be conveyed to Baltimore County. Human & Rohde will still need to acquire variances from the county for the crossing of the wetlands with the driveway. They will also need to review the final submission of the Forest Buffer Easement and the Forest Conservation Easement.

Tesseract has done a site visit and determined the area that would need to go along with the storm water management pond. They met with Baltimore County on this. They also did the storm water quantity calculations and determined that you can meet the requirements by using the existing pond and did some preliminary storm water quality calculations and determined that you should pay as feed in lieu as the cheapest alternative to meeting the county is requirements. They will need to perform additional services concerning this.

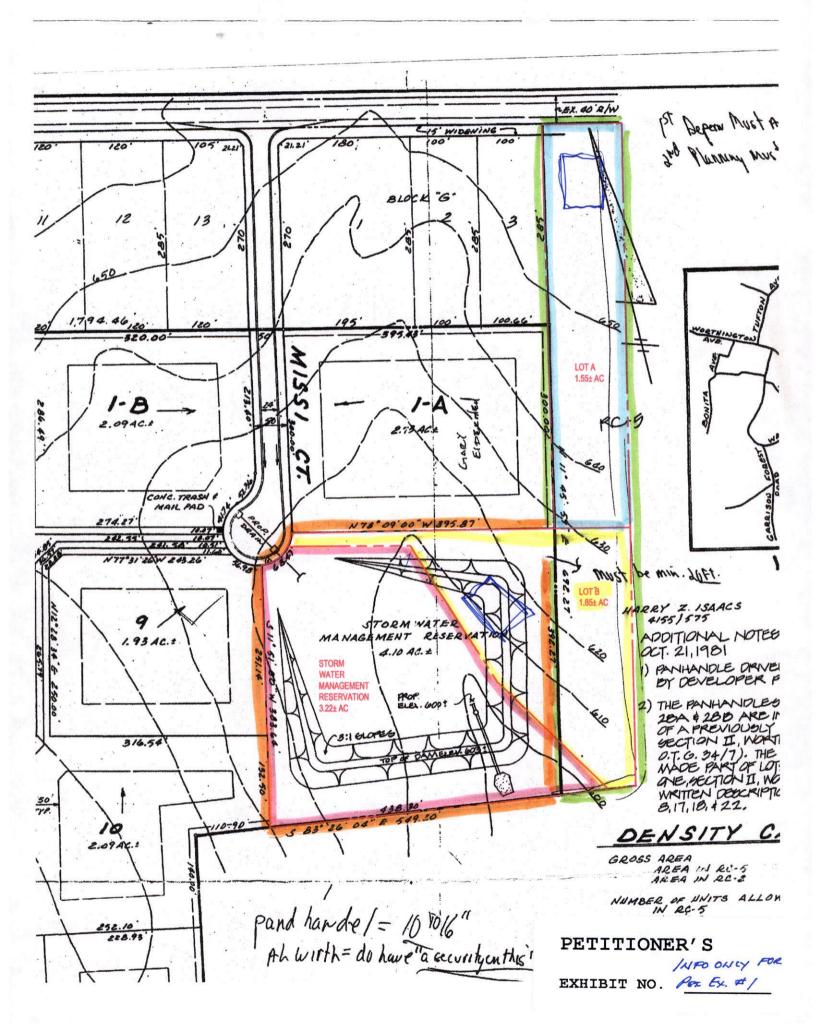

Project History

- -July 2006: Bill & Carmenza purchased the 4 acre Storm Water Management Area with intent to try and subdivide to build a home. The Minor subdivision would create a total of two lots, & the SWM parcel. One lot being the existing house, the other being the lot to build the new house on.
- -Feb, 2008: DRC review determines that project meets requirements needed to proceed with Minor Subdivision Plan.
- -2008: Bill visited all neighbors on Missi crt and gets verbal agreement from all to proceed with project.
- -May 2009: Bill passed away due to cancer, and the project was put on hold.
- -Spring 2013: Project was re-started. Perc tests successfully completed, and environmental studies restarted.
- -Sept 2015: 1st Minor Subdivision Plan was submitted to county.
- -Nov 2015: Went door to door to each of the neighbors on Missi Crt to discuss our intentions with a lot of very positive feedback. One neighbor mentioned some concerns, and we assured him we would accommodate his wishes (driveway location, & privacy screening).

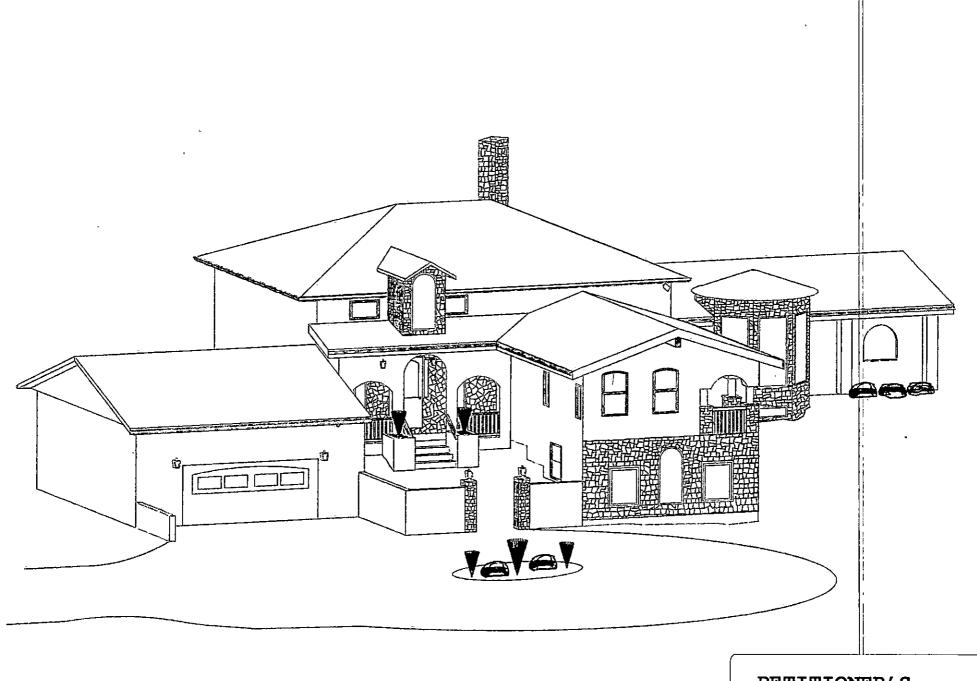

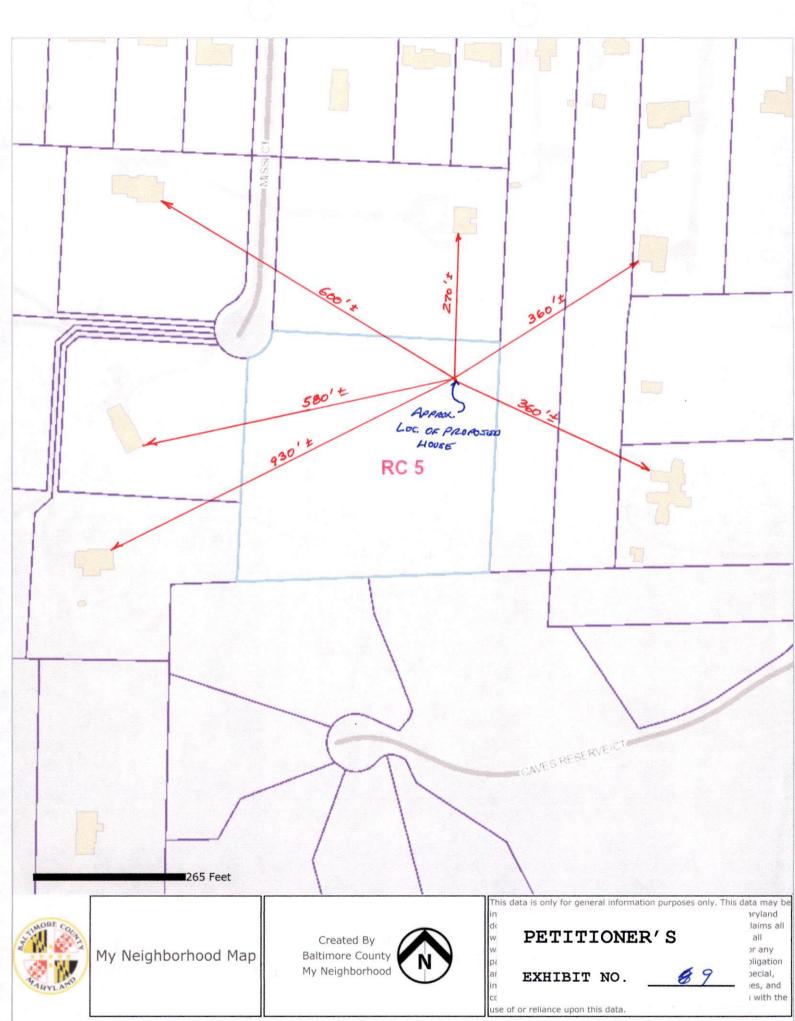

We'll try to keep the meeting as short as possible as I'm sure you're busy, but I wanted to let you know our position in advance in case that you might want others there.

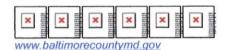

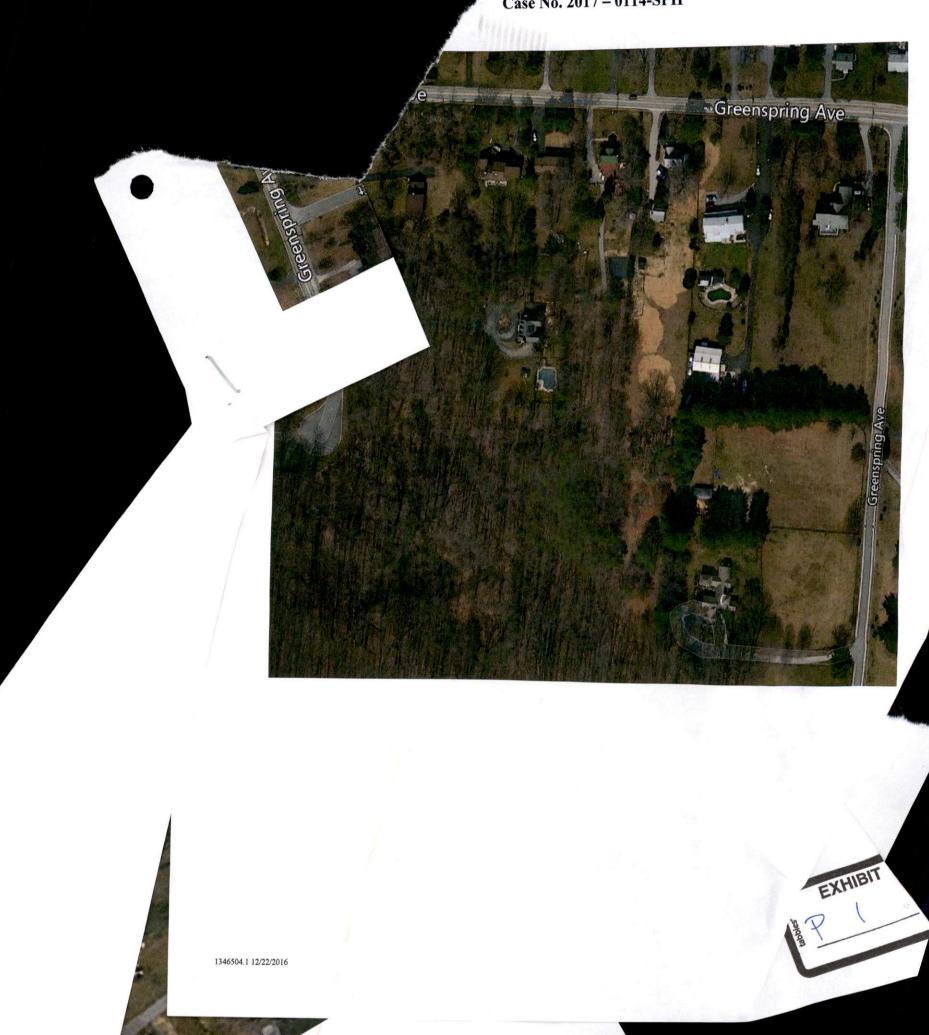

OPINION

This case comes to the Board on appeal of the Administrative Law Judge's Opinion and Order dated December 30, 2016, denying Petitioners request, pursuant to Baltimore County Zoning Regulation ("BCZR") §500.7, for approval of: (1) the third amendment of the Final Development Plan for "Worthington Valley Estates Addition" for the: (a) subdivision of the Storm Water Management Reservation; (b) creation of Lot 34; and (c) to increase the total lots from 33 to 34; (2) any other permission deemed necessary by the Administrative Law Judge; and (3) amend the tract boundary for the property of "Worthington Valley Estates Additions."

A public hearing was held, *de novo*, before this Board on June 1, 2017. Petitioners, joined by David and Carmenza Heimbach, appeared *pro se*. Protestant Gary Eidelman was represented by Gregory Rapisarda. A Public Deliberation, originally scheduled for August 8, 2017, was ultimately held on October 3, 2017.

Background

Worthington Valley Estates Addition was created by plat recorded in 1981 and is zoned R.C. 5. There are 33 lots within Worthington Valley Estates Addition, with a four acre stormwater management parcel, intended to be conveyed, but not actually conveyed, to the County. Petitioners' predecessor in interest (Bill Grewe, and his wife, Carmenza) purchased the stormwater

management parcel in 2006. Petitioners seek to combine one acre of the stormwater management parcel with a contiguous parcel outside of the Worthington Valley Estates subdivision in order to create Lot 34 for a single-family dwelling to be within Worthington Valley Estates. The remaining 3+ acres of the stormwater management parcel would then be conveyed to the County as intended.

Petitioners started on this project in 2006 and received tentative approval from the Development Review Committee to proceed in 2008. In 2009, Bill Grewe encountered health issues and passed away. The project lingered until 2013. Petitioners then undertook the work and environmental studies necessary, spending significant amounts of money. In September 2015, the First Minor Subdivision Plan was submitted to the County. In December 2015, James Markle, manager of Stormwater Management of Baltimore County Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability ("DEPS"), informed Mr. Heimbach that the County agreed to take over maintenance of the stormwater management pond, which was to be conveyed in fee to the County, along with other conditions. Unfortunately, a car accident in January 2016 derailed the project once again. Later that year, Petitioners pushed the project forward, resulting in the hearing below.

Mr. Eidelman, along with his wife Jill, owns and resides at the property located at 3 Missi Court. Mr. Eidelman purchased the property in June 2002. He testified that he did his due diligence when researching the property. He particularly liked that the property he ultimately purchased was part of a wooded area and was set aside for stormwater management, understanding that it would not be developed, and moreover, would be transferred to the County. Mr. Eidelman concluded that the adjacent parcel's reservation for stormwater management would enhance the value of the property he purchased. He would not have purchased his property if the adjacent parcel could be developed. In short, Mr. Eidelman testified he relied on the development plan when he and his

wife made their decision to purchase the property. Mr. Eidelman also testified when there is heavy rain, water moves past his property into the stormwater management pond. Mr. Eidelman raised concerns about the stormwater management area if a portion of the existing stormwater management area is developed.

No expert witnesses were presented by either party at the hearing in front of the Board.

Final Development Plan Regulations

A final development plan serves a notice function to prospective buyers and acts as a shield for those who have made a decision to purchase property located within the final development plan from certain changes. Regulations concerning development plans, as is relevant, are found in BCZR §1B01.3. As set forth in BCZR §1B01.3(A)(1), the regulations are intended:

- a. To provide for the disclosure of development plans to prospective residents and to protect those who have made decisions based on such plans from inappropriate changes therein; and
- b. To provide for review of residential development plans to determine whether they comply with these regulations and with standards and policies adopted pursuant to the authority of Section 504."

Amendments to a previously approved final development plan are governed by BCZR §1B01.3(A)(7), which states that such a plan may only be amended as follows (as is relevant, as the amendment sought occurs after nearby property, the Eidelmans', has been sold):

- b. Amendment after sale of interest in nearby property or upon demand for hearing. In the case of an amendment not allowed under Subparagraph a, by reason of sale of property within the area, or in case of a demand for hearing by an eligible individual or group, the plans may be amended through special exception procedures, in the manner provided under Section 502 and subject to the following provisions:
 - (1) The amendment must be in accord with the provisions of the Comprehensive Manual of Development Policies and with the specific standards and requirements of this article, as determined by the Department of Planning. The Director, on behalf of the Planning Board, shall notify the Zoning Commissioner accordingly.

- (2) Only an owner of a lot abutting or lying directly across a street or other right-of-way from the property in question, an owner of a structure on such a lot, or a homes association (as may be defined under the subdivision regulations or under provisions adopted pursuant to the authority of Section 504) having members who own or reside on property lying wholly or partially within 300 feet of the lot in question are eligible to file a demand for hearing.
- (3) It must be determined in the course of the hearing procedure that the amendment would be consistent with the spirit and intent of the original plan and of this article.

Discussion

As noted above, BCZR §1B01.3(A)(7)(b) requires proposed amendments to go through the special exception procedures found in Section 502. Section 502, entitled "Special Exceptions," contains ten sections. Only one of those ten sections appear to have applicability in this case, notably, §502.1, which itself has nine factors for consideration. Before a special exception may be granted, it must appear that the proposed use will not:

- A. Be detrimental to the health, safety or general welfare of the locality involved;
- B. Tend to create congestion in roads, streets or alleys therein:
- C. Create a potential hazard from fire, panic or other danger;
- D. Tend to overcrowd land and cause undue concentration of population;
- E. Interfere with adequate provisions for schools, parks, water, sewerage, transportation or other public requirements, conveniences or improvements;
- F. Interfere with adequate light and air;
- G. Be inconsistent with the purposes of the property's zoning classification nor in any other way inconsistent with the spirit and intent of these Zoning Regulations;
- H. Be inconsistent with the impermeable surface and vegetative retention provisions of these Zoning Regulations; nor
- I. Be detrimental to the environmental and natural resources of the site and vicinity including forests, streams, wetlands, aquifers and floodplains in an R.C.2, R.C.4, R.C.5 or R.C.7 Zone.

Baltimore County Code ("BCC") Section 33, Title 4, entitled "Stormwater Management," identifies the purpose for the stormwater management Code provisions as follows: "The purpose of this title is to protect, maintain, and enhance the public health, safety, and general welfare by

establishing minimum requirements and procedures to control the adverse impacts associated with increased stormwater runoff." BCC §33-4-102. In doing so, this County expressly recognizes the potential danger presented to public health, safety and the general welfare by stormwater runoff. Baltimore County in general requires properly managed stormwater runoff in connection with residential, commercial, and other development and redevelopment projects.

Petitioners did not offer any expert witness testimony regarding the impact or effects of changing the existing stormwater management area. Therefore, there is no expert witness testimony in the record to permit the Board to have a fully-informed assessment on what effect, if any: (1) the proposed loss of area will have on the existing stormwater management area, runoff and drainage; (2) the proposed house to be built in the subtracted area will have on the stormwater management area, runoff, and drainage, as the house would be at a higher elevation and would have impervious surfaces for parking and walkways; and (3) the combination of subtracting from the existing stormwater management area in conjunction with the building of the proposed house will have upon the adjacent area, including the Eidelman's property.

The failure to present evidence regarding the effects of the proposed change, reduction of the stormwater management area, and intended building of a house on the proposed newly-created lot precludes the Board from finding that that Petitioners have met their burden with respect to the special exception factors set forth in BCZR §502.1, particularly factors (A), (D), (E), (H) and (I).

Moreover, the proposed amendment is required to be consistent with the spirit and intent of the original plan. BCZR §1B01.3(A)(7). The intent, as reflected on the original plan, was to have the subject parcel containing the stormwater management pond conveyed to the County, preserving the area from development. As noted above, the inclusion of a stormwater management area serves multiple purposes, including protection of the adjacent properties in the development.

The Eidelmans purchased their adjacent property relying on those representations and understandings. It is reasonable for the Eidelmans to have relied on the "original plan," which reflects that the 4.10 acres of stormwater management area would be conveyed to the County and reasonable for them to have understood that there would be no future development on that 4.10 acres. Leaving aside whether *any change* would be within the spirit and intent of the original plan, in the absence of evidence that the proposed change to the stormwater management area will have minimal, if any, impact upon the adjacent properties and the Eidelmans' property in particular, Petitioners cannot prove that that the proposed amendment is consistent with the spirit and intent of the original plan. The purpose for the regulations regarding amendments to final development plans, namely, the consumer protection aspects for purchasers such as the Eidelmans, cannot be ignored or taken lightly.

Conclusion

Based on our review of the evidence presented, the Board of Appeals unanimously concludes that Petitioners have failed to satisfy their burden of proof with respect to the proposed amendment and therefore, Petitioners' Petition shall be denied.

ORDER

THEREFORE, IT IS THIS <u>29th</u> day of <u>fovenber</u>, 2017, by the Baltimore County Board of Appeals,

ORDERED that Petitioners' Petition to approve: (1) the third amendment of the Final Development Plan for "Worthington Valley Estates Addition" for the: (a) subdivision of the Storm Water Management Reservation; (b) creation of Lot 34; and (c) to increase the total lots from 33 to 34; (2) any other permission deemed necessary by the Administrative Law Judge; and (3) amend the tract boundary for the property of "Worthington Valley Estates Additions" is hereby DENIED.

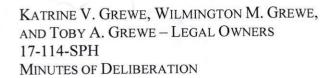

PANEL MEMBERS DISCUSSED THE FOLLOWING:

STANDING

- The Board discussed the Petitioners' Petition for Special Hearing. Final Development Plan Amendments are addressed in the BCZR (§1B01.3(A)(7)(b)), which further directs review of the proposed amendment under the special exception procedures in Section 502, including Section 502.1.
- The Board discussed Petitioners' request to add Lot 34 which would be used by family members. The Board noted there appears to be sufficient land for the lot. However, the Board must determine what, if any, effect the proposed Lot 34 would have on the Storm Water Management ("SWM") facility, and the other lots in the community.
- The Board noted that Petitioners presented no expert testimony on impact to the SWM facility, or on potential impact to the other 33 lots, or the proposed Lot 34.
- The Board discussed Final Development Plans acting as notice to the consumer. There was testimony by the Protestant that prior to purchasing their lot, they reviewed the Final Development Plan which showed the SWM facility parcel was to remain undeveloped. The Protestant purchased their lot in reliance upon the SWM parcel remaining undeveloped.



CONCLUSION: After thorough review of the facts, testimony, and law in the matter, the Board unanimously agreed to DENY the requested relief.

NOTE: These minutes, which will become part of the case file, are intended to indicate for the record that a public deliberation took place on the above date regarding this matter. The Board's final decision and the facts and findings thereto will be set out in the written Opinion and Order to be issued by the Board.

EIDELMAN CLOSING BRIEF

Gary and Jill Eidelman, by their undersigned counsel, submit this brief in support of their opposition to the Petition for Special Hearing request to (1) Permit the 3rd Amendment of the Final Development Plan for "Worthington Valley Estates Additions" for the: (a) subdivision of the storm water management reservation; (b) creation of lot 34; and (c) to increase the total lots from 33 to 34; and (2) Any other permission deemed necessary by the ALJ; and to (3) Amend the tract boundary for the Property of Worthington Valley Estates to add a new parcel known as 5 Missi Court, Owings Mills MD 21117.

I. Background

In 2002, the Eidelmans purchased 3 Missi Court for \$499,000, 2.73 acres shown as Lot 1-A on the Second Amended Final Development Plan for the Worthington Valley Estates subdivision (Eidelman Parcel). *See* Second Amended Final Development Plan. The Eidelman Parcel abuts and is directly north of the 4.10 acres identified as a stormwater management (SWM) preservation parcel. (SWM Parcel) *Id.* The Worthington Valley Development Plan was approved with the condition that the SWM Parcel would be conveyed to the County. For an unexplained and still unknown reason, the SWM Parcel was never conveyed by the developer to the County.

William E. Grewe (now deceased) and Carmenza L. Grewe are the record owners of a 2.5 acre property at 12330 Greenspring Avenue, Owings Mills MD 21009, which is not part of Worthington Valley Estates (Greenspring Parcel). In 2006, Mr. Grewe "purchased" the SWM Parcel from Helen Chellis, the original developer, for \$0. *See* Deed dated 8/17/2006 at Liber 27498 / folio 359. A portion of the SWM Parcel abuts a portion of the Greenspring Parcel. In 2016, after Mr. Grewe passed away, title to the SWM Parcel was conveyed to Katrina, Wilmington, and Toby Grewe (the Petitioners). See Deed dated 8/2/2016 at Liber 37823 / Folio 70. The Petitioners now seek approval to use the 4.1 acre SWM Parcel they own, to create a 1.85 acre RC 5 residential lot that will use a portion of the Greenspring Parcel owned by Carmenza Grewe, and create a 3.22 acre stormwater management parcel in Worthington Valley Estates. Carmenza Grewe, the record owner of the Greenspring Parcel, is not a party in this action.

II. Legal Standards

The Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (BCZR) control the Petitioners' Special Hearing requests. The SWM Parcel is zoned RC 5, which requires all final development plans in the RC zone to follow the same procedure for those in the DR zone. BCZR § 1A00.4.

The purpose of Development Plans are to (a) disclose development plans to prospective residents and protect those who have made decisions based on such plans from inappropriate changes therein; and (b) to require residential development plans to comply with County's regulations, standards, and policies. BCZR § 1B01.3.1(a) & (b).

¹ On information and belief, the Petitioners are the biological children of Carmenza Grewe.

Development plans and/or amendments to development plans in the RC 5 zone must comply with the Performance Standards set forth in BCZR § 1A04.4. Deviation from the standards "is not permitted for the purpose of allowing additional lots." BCZR § 1A01.4.B.5. An amendment to an approved development plan must be in strict accord with the requirements in BCZR § 1B01.3.7. Once properties have been sold within an approved Final Development Plan, an amendment must comply with the special exception procedures and criteria in BCZR § 502. BCZR § 1B01.3.A.7.b. In addition to the special exception criteria, an amendment to a development plan "must be determined" to be "consistent with the spirit and intent of the original plan..." BCZR § 1B01.3.7.b.(3).

III. Arguments

A. Petitioners Do Not Hold Clear Title to the Property

The SWM Parcel, as created and approved in 1981, was required to be conveyed to the County as a 4.1 acre Stormwater Management Preservation Parcel. The SWM Parcel was created, and dedicated to the County, as part of the original approval for the Final Development Plan. The Baltimore County Code (BCC) requires that subdivision plats must be accompanied by "irrevocable offers of dedication to the public of all public improvements." BCC § 32-4-271(b). This law was effective in 1981 when the Worthington Valley Estates plat was recorded. BCC § 26-214(a) (1988) and § 22-66 (1978). As a result, the 2006 Chellis – Grewe conveyance was unlawful because the SWM Parcel should have been, and should be now, conveyed to the County as a stormwater management preservation parcel.

Maryland's Court of Appeals addressed a similar situation in Baltimore City and held that the City could accept the dedication and conveyance fifteen years after that same property was purportedly conveyed by deed to a third party. *Hackerman v. City of Baltimore*, 212 Md.

618, 626 (1957) (internal citations omitted). The Court found a conveyance to a third party after the property had been dedicated for the public was invalid. *Id.* In this case, the SWM Parcel was dedicated to the County and subsequently transferred to Mr. Grewe. As a result, the Chellis – Grewe transfer was invalid and the Petitioners do not hold valid title to the SWM Parcel, and thus lack standing to maintain this action. It's also worth noting that the *Hackerman* Court recognized the rights and interests of property owners (like the Eidelmans) who had purchased land in reliance on a development plan that indicated a public dedication. *Id.* at 625 (holding that a public dedication "may confer rights to the abutting owners who have bought in reliance on the offer [of dedication]").

B. The Proposed Subdivision Fails to Comply with the BCZR Requirements

1. Proposal is Not Consistent with the Spirit and Intent of the FDP

The spirit and intent of the Final Development Plan and the Second Amended Development Plan for Worthington Valley Estates provides for a "stormwater management preservation parcel" (emphasis added) to the south of the Eidelman Parcel. The spirit and intent of the SWM Parcel was to provide SWM for the Worthington Valley Estates subdivision, and not be developable as a residential lot. Moreover, as Mr. Eidelman testified, when the Eidelmans purchased their property in 2002, they relied on the Final Development Plan by choosing their property, in part, because it abutted a SWM preservation parcel that would remain undeveloped and supposedly would be transferred to the County. *See Hackerman, supra*. Adding a home is anathema to the original spirit and intent.

2. Proposal Fails to Comply with the Requirements in BCZR § 1B01.3.A.7 Petitioners have also failed to meet their burden to show such a proposal will comply

with the standards in BCZR § 1B01.3.A.7. The proposal disregards a stated purpose for

Development Plans – to protect buyers (like the Eidelmans) who made decisions to buy a lot based on Final Development Plans. BCZR § 1B01.3.1(a). Mr. Eidelman testified that he purchased the parcel relying on the Final Development Plan that shows a SWM preservation parcel to the south of and adjacent to the Eidelman Parcel. As a result, the SWM Parcel can never be anything other than a SWM Parcel. The Petitioners failed to show that the amendment would be "in accord with the provisions of the Comprehensive Manual of Development Policies... as required in BCZR § 1B01.3.A.7.b.(1). Finally, the Petitioners also failed to show compliance with the special exception standards in § 502, as required by § 1B01.3.A.7.b.

- 2. Proposal Fails to Comply with SPEX Requirements in BCZR § 502

 Petitioners failed to even address the special exception standards in BCZR § 502.

 Petitioners failed to adduce any evidence to show that the proposal would not be:
 - Detrimental to health, safety or general welfare of locality involved;
 - Inconsistent with the spirit and intent of these Zoning Regulations;
 - Inconsistent with impermeable surface & vegetative retention requirements of the BCZR; or
 - Detrimental to environmental and natural resources of site & vicinity including forests, streams, wetlands, aquifers and floodplains in an... R.C.5 Zone.

BCZR § 502.1.

Although the burden is on the Petitioners, Mr. Eidelman, nevertheless, testified that the proposal would (1) be inconsistent with the spirit and intent of the BCZR (as outlined above) and (2) would fail to address several of the special exception requirements. Specifically, Mr. Eidelman testified that the proposal would (1) be detrimental to the general welfare, (2) would negatively impact his property value, and (3) was inconsistent with the spirit and intent of the

BCZR and the Final Development Plan (as outlined above), that the Petitioners were unable to comply with the numerous comments from County agencies relating to the environmental and site plan requirements.

Petitioners bear the burden in this case, and they have failed to even address the specific special exception and other standards required by the BCZR.

IV. Conclusion

For the reasons provided at the June 1, 2017 hearing, and for those reasons outlined above, the Eidelmans respectfully request that the Board deny the Petition for Special Hearing.

I represent Mr. and Mrs. Gary and Jill Eidelman, abutting property owners who oppose the proposed subdivision of the Storm Water Management Reservation parcel in the above caption case. I'm counsel of record for the Eidelmans and my practice is primarily focused on land use and zoning law. I represented the Eidelmans before Judge Beverungen, and I continue to represent them for this appeal. Pursuant to Rule 2.C. of the Board's Rules of Practice and Procedure, and because of a personal family emergency that arose without notice this past weekend, I am asking the Board to postpone tomorrow's hearing.

Since receiving the Board's Notice on February 22, 2017, I have prepared for, and planned around, the Board hearing scheduled for Tuesday, April 4, 2017, at 10:00A.M. Despite my intentions and preparations, my plans changed this weekend when my wife and I learned that her grandmother, who lives in Columbia, South Carolina, was placed on home hospice and given days to live. My wife's grandmother has been an amazing source of love and support during our 20 year marriage, and has been an wonderful great-grandmother to our 12 and 10 year old boys. On Saturday evening, we were shocked to learn that this relatively healthy 90 year old woman was battling an aggressive cancer that had metastasized beyond any hope of cure or containment. Moreover, we had planned to visit on spring break next week, but we were told in no uncertain terms that next week would be too late. We left Saturday night, using the drive down to prepare our sons, and ourselves, to cherish her, celebrate her life, and say goodbye. We arrived Sunday, and it's clear we made the right decision.

At the same time, the unique circumstances leading to this request are also unusual. The surprise diagnosis, the speed and ferocity of her illness, the distance between us, and her close relationship with each of us, combine to make what I can only hope is a once-in-a-lifetime situation. I ask you to find that these extraordinary circumstances permit a postponement under Rule 2.C.

On Saturday evening, I called Gary Eidelman to explain the situation. Despite the fact that I've been preparing myself and we planned to meet Monday (today), the Eidelmans support this request and I was encouraged to put my family first. I also reached out to the Grewes on Saturday to ask if they would agree to a postponement. We spoke on Sunday afternoon and, for various reasons, none of which lacked sympathy, they don't feel they can agree to a delay. The Grewes understand that I'm filing this request for the Board to decide.

Rule 2.C. allows a postponement this close to a hearing upon a showing of "extraordinary circumstances" that are "of an unusual and extraordinary nature." To me, the situation we found ourselves in this weekend, and find ourselves in now, appear to fit within Rule 2.C. In addition, a postponement will allow my family to honor and grieve a great woman in her last days, and allow the Eidelmans to continue with their counsel of record in this matter. A delay will not unduly prejudice the appellants' case. For these reasons, we respectfully ask for a postponement.

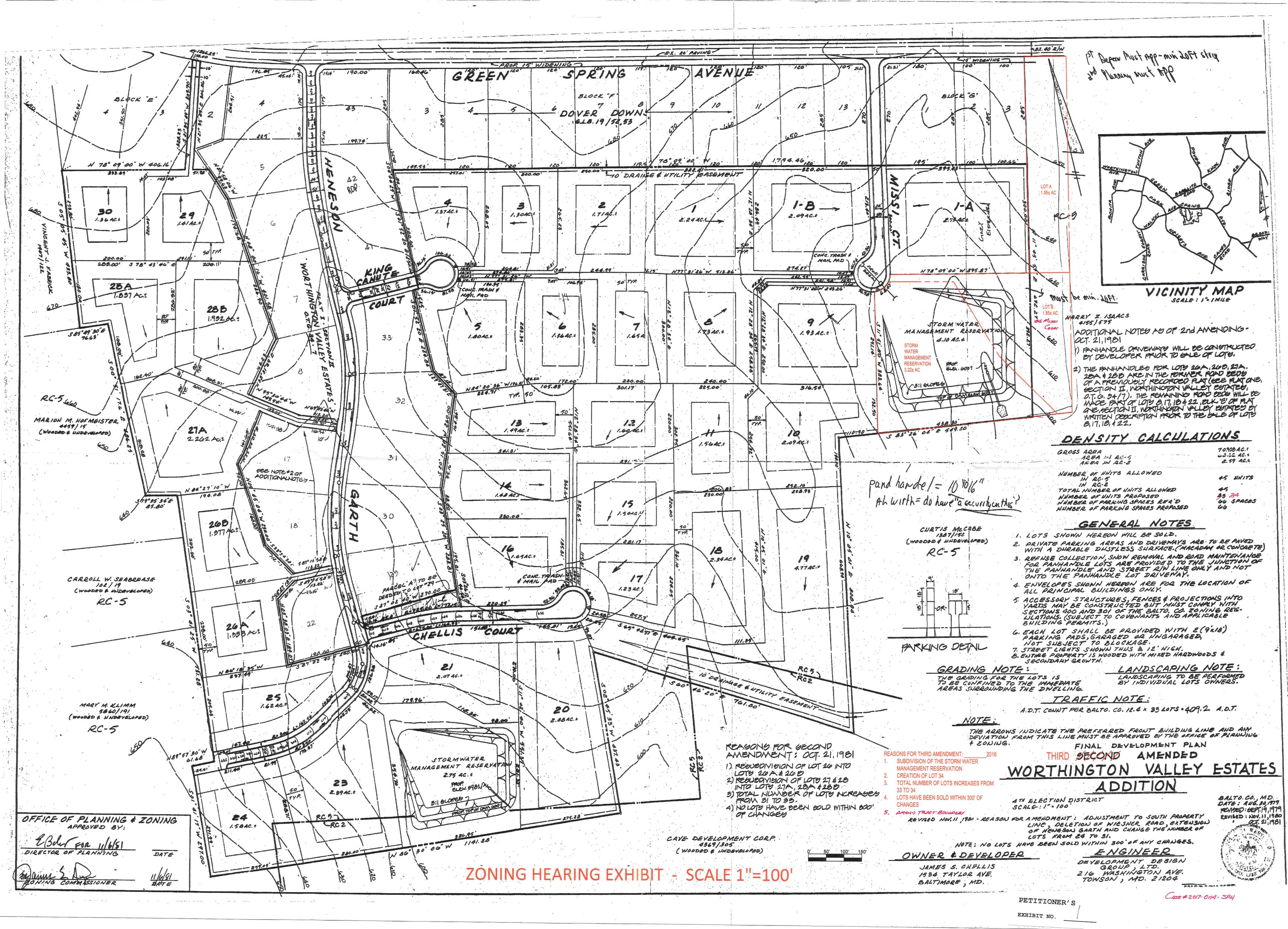

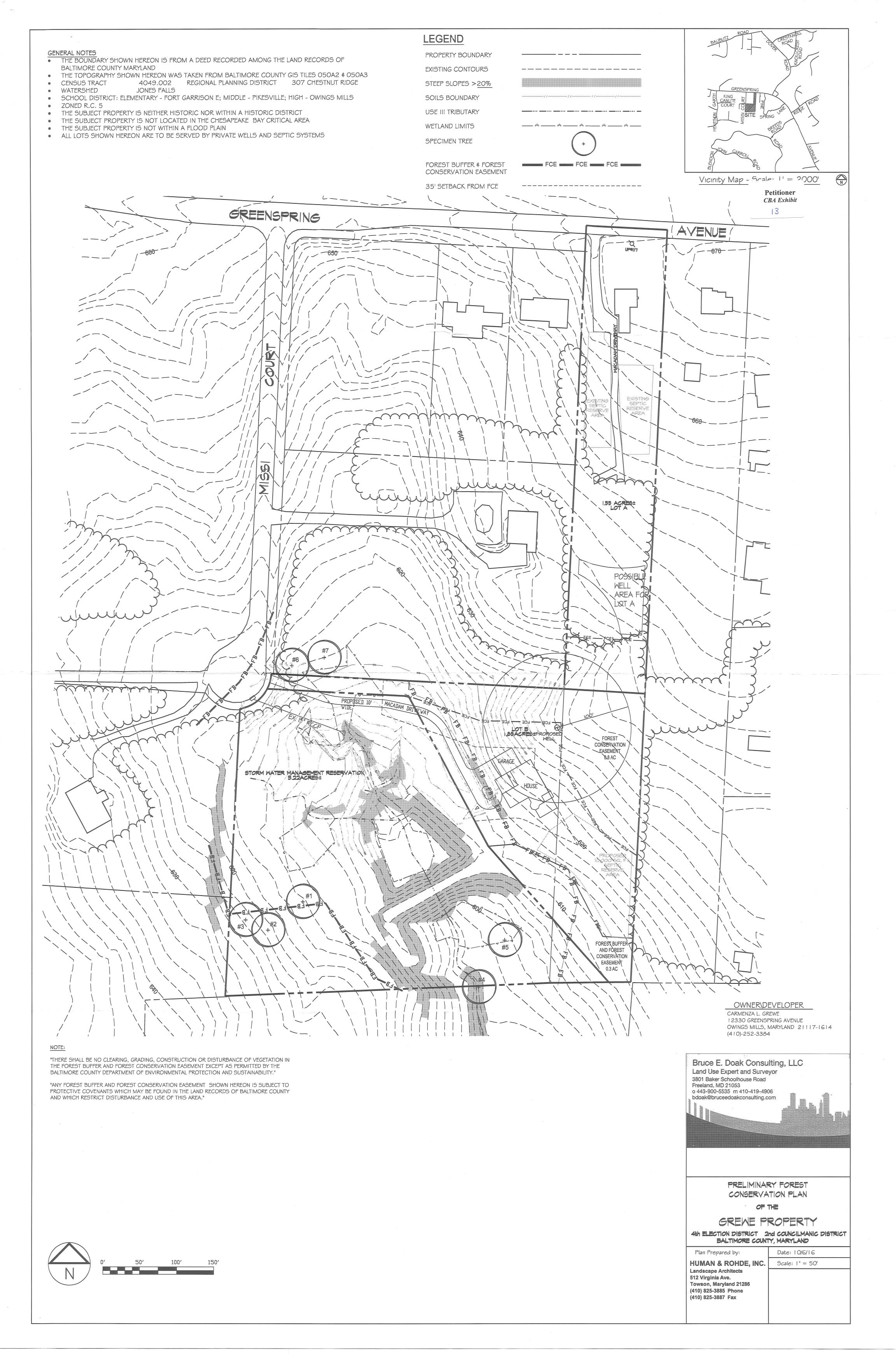

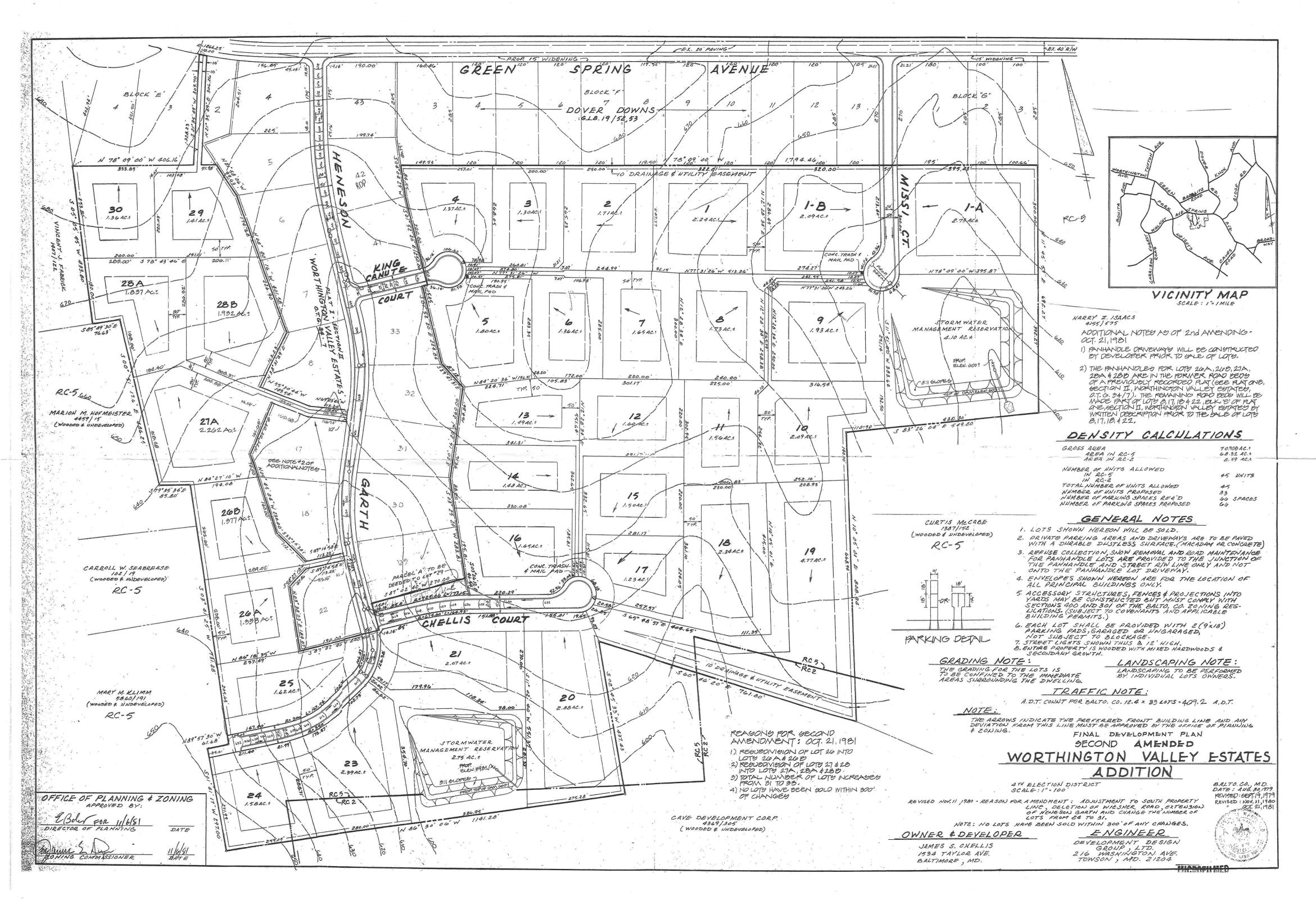
