OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for consideration of Petitions for Special Hearing and Variance filed on behalf of Kings Point Associates, LLC, legal owner ("Petitioner"). The Special Hearing was filed pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R") to approve the sale of utility trailers and trailer supplies in the B.L. zone. In addition, a Petition for Variance seeks to allow 464 off-street parking spaces in lieu of the required 791 parking spaces. A site plan was marked and accepted into evidence as Petitioner's Exhibit 1.

Joseph Savaro, professional engineer Joseph Ucciferro, and traffic engineer Ken Schmid appeared in support of the requests. David H. Karceski, Esq. and Neil Thupari, Esq. represented the Petitioner. Shirley and Jeff Supik attended the hearing and opposed the requests. In addition, numerous e-mails (included in the case file) were received from neighbors opposing the requests. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations. Substantive Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were received from the Department of Planning (DOP) and the Bureau of Development Plans Review (DPR). Neither agency opposed the requests.

ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING

The subject property is approximately 11.8 acres in size and is zoned BL-CCC. The property is improved with a shopping center which has been in operation for many years. This case concerns a large commercial space at the center, which is now vacant. The space was formerly occupied by a Food Lion grocery store which has closed. Petitioner proposes to lease the space to Tractor Supply, Inc. for operation of a retail store. To do so, variance relief is required.

SPECIAL HEARING

The petition for special hearing concerns the sale of "utility trailers and trailer supplies" at the site. Having reviewed the Regulations, I do not believe zoning relief of any sort is required for Petitioner to sell utility trailers at this site. The trailers in question are small utility trailers of the sort used by homeowners to transport mulch, garden supplies or hauling junk to the dump. Photos were submitted which show the type of trailer at issue. Petitioner's Exhibit 2D. These trailers are no larger or heavier than the tractors and riding lawn mowers which would also be sold at this store (and at other "big box" retailers like Home Depot).

While I do not believe granting the petition for special hearing would have a detrimental impact upon the community, I am concerned the approval could be construed as authority to sell at the site other sorts of "trailers" (e.g., RVs or manufactured homes) as that term is defined in the Regulations. B.C.Z.R. §415. To eliminate any doubt on the point, I will grant the request but permit sales of only the sort of trailers shown in the photos submitted at the hearing.

VARIANCE

A variance request involves a two-step process, summarized as follows:

- (1) It must be shown the property is unique in a manner which makes it unlike surrounding properties, and that uniqueness or peculiarity must necessitate variance relief; and
- (2) If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or hardship.

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Cromwell v. Ward, 102 Md. App. 691 (1995).

Petitioner has met this test. As Mr. Ucciferro testified, the large site is irregularly shaped and there is a significant grade change across the property. As such it is unique. Petitioner would experience practical difficulty if the regulations were strictly interpreted because it would be unable to lease the vacant space to the proposed tenant. Finally, I do not believe granting the variance request pertaining to the number of off-street parking spaces would have a detrimental impact upon the community. Mr. Ucciferro testified he visited the site on more than one occasion, and that nearly all of the spaces were unoccupied. Mr. Schmid performed a parking count study at the center and determined only 12-16% of the spaces were occupied on weekdays, while approximately 31% of the spaces were occupied on a Saturday. He opined that even if the variance was granted, only 61% of the spaces would be occupied with the center at full capacity. In these circumstances I do not believe there will be a shortage of parking at the shopping center.

The Supiks (and nearly all of the e-mails received from neighbors) expressed concern with the lack of a grocery store at this location, which they believed posed a special hardship for senior citizens. Ms. Supik testified she was "incensed [Petitioner] would put something in the community [i.e., the Tractor Supply store] they have no use for." I understand and am sympathetic to the community's plight, but the zoning regulations permit such an enterprise at this location. In addition, Mr. Savaro (on behalf of Petitioner) testified his firm attempted to lease the space to numerous grocery store chains, none of which were interested in this location.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED this <u>4th</u> day of **April**, **2017**, by this Administrative Law Judge, that the Petition for Special Hearing filed pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R) to approve the sale of utility trailers and trailer supplies (such as

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those shown in the attached photograph, which is expressly incorporated into this Order) in the B.L. Zone, be and is hereby GRANTED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the petition for variance to allow 464 off-street parking spaces in lieu of the required 791 parking spaces, be and is hereby GRANTED.

The relief granted herein shall be subject to and conditioned upon the following:

- 1. Petitioner may apply for necessary permits and/or licenses upon receipt of this Order. However, Petitioner is hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at its own risk until 30 days from the date hereof, during which time an appeal can be filed by any party. If for whatever reason this Order is reversed, Petitioner would be required to return the subject property to its original condition.
- 2. No permanent structures may be constructed and/or used in connection with the outdoor display area(s) shown on the plan.
- 3. No on-site rental and/or repair of any equipment or inventory offered for sale shall be permitted.
- 4. The outdoor sales area(s) shown on the plan shall be fenced and landscaped as determined in the sole discretion of the Baltimore County landscape architect.

Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

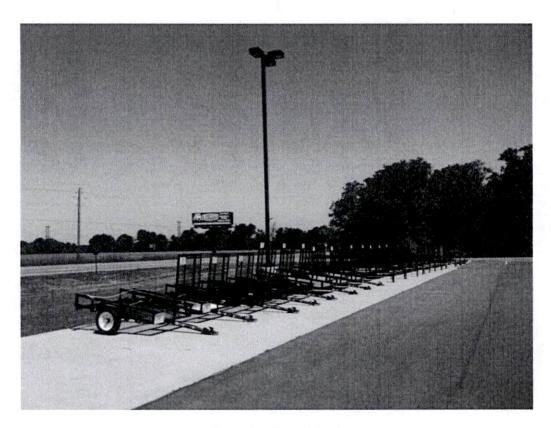

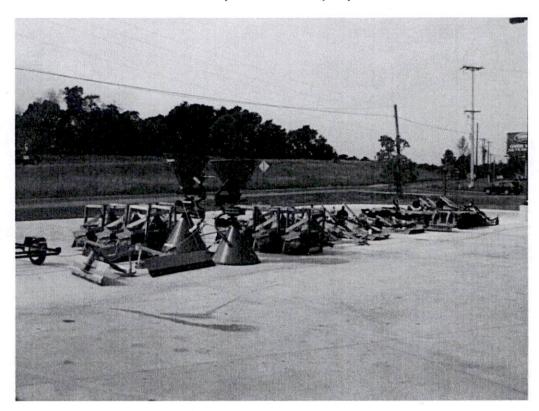

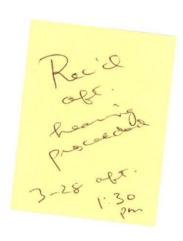

As a home owning resident of Hernwood Heights, I feel that the granting of variances to allow Tractor Supply Company to occupy the property that once housed Food Lion in the Kings Point Square Shopping Center is not in the best interest of the community.

We were just notified of this hearing today by Councilman Julian Jones. Since I work during the hours of the hearing, I cannot rearrange my schedule and be in attendance in person.

I do not feel that the community has been well served because there has not been any signs directly adjacent to the property to be affected so we would know this was happening. I drive past this shopping center every day and I've not seen it. I believe if more people knew about this, the outcry would be greater.

I'm curious what the conversations were like with the food store companies. Knowing that that store had undergone some renovations less than three so to hear that renovations were part of the issue, I'm confused. Instead of driving or walking down the hill to pick up groceries, I now either drive 4-10 miles. This is not what I signed up for when I purchased my home. While the only thing constant is change, this is quite a blow. Not just for me, but for all the other families that live within a one mile radius of this location.

I've been to Tractor Supply in Westminster to purchase attachments for my lawn mowers. This is not a store that I go into just to "browse and see if there is something I'd like to purchase". Is the goal just to fill the property with anyone willing to locate there? We have a Home Depot at the intersection of Liberty and Brenbrook Roads which is about 3 miles away where we purchase most of the items listed on the TSC website or in their stores. This is not a farming area and most of the new properties being built in the 3 mile radius of the store do not require tractors, livestock or poultry supplies so I just don't see where this will be a successful venture.

Maybe the real issue is the configuration of the property overall and that is what really needs to be addressed. When I look at one item I found on the internet, I wonder how old this information is which also leads to how appealing it might be to potential occupants. http://brahinproperties.com/properties/pdfs/KingsPoint.pdf

While I understand the Brahin Properties Company would like to increase the occupancy of their only holding in Maryland, I'm very concerned this will not serve the community and within a year or so, it will have folded up and be yet again vacant.

Please reconsider this variance request and minimally postpone it so community residents can attend the hearings. Best case scenario, deny the request.

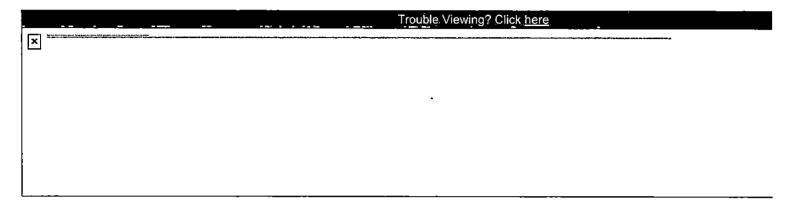

In total, all of this site work and improvements to the building will cost an estimated \$400,000.00 to compunderstand that this amount of money is a significant re-investment by my client in the property. They se reinvestment as necessary to retain existing tenants and as a catalyst to gain more tenants in the future Please do not hesitate to call me with additional questions....

So now we are faced with a decision. The question is does the community accept the <u>Tractor Supply Cc</u> to hold out for another use, such as a supermarket?
