OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for consideration of Petitions for Special Hearing and Variance filed on behalf of Richard O. and Elizabeth Huffman, legal owners and White Marsh Child Care, Inc., lessee ("Petitioners"). The Special Hearing was filed pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R"): (1) to approve an expansion of a special exception for a child care center in a DR 1 zone (DR 5.5 in 1982 under which the original approval was obtained) by adding a 1 story prefab modular 1,924 SF 2 classroom building, 24 ft. +/- x 75 ft. +/-; designed to accommodate additional children by modifying the special exception granted in Case No. 82-289-X utilizing the zoning regulations applicable in 1982 at the time of its original approval to establish a nursery school/day care facility; and as amended in Case No. 87-329-SPH to expand the nursery school/day care facility and Case No. 95-291-SPH to expand the nursery school/day care facility; and (2) for a determination the child care center is a principal use on the aforesaid subject property; or in the alternative, to determine the child care center is exempt from 1982 RTA requirements.

In addition, a Petition for Variance seeks: (1) To allow a rear yard setback for the proposed expansion building of 42 ft. in lieu of the required 50 ft.; and (2) To allow a side yard setback

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for the proposed expansion building of 11 ft. in lieu of the required 40 ft. A site plan was marked and accepted into evidence as Petitioners' Exhibit 1.

Elizabeth Huffman and professional engineer Rick Richardson appeared in support of the requests. Michael P. Tanczyn, Esq. represented Petitioners. A neighbor attended the hearing and opposed the requests. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations. No substantive Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were received from any of the reviewing county agencies.

The subject property is approximately five (5) acres in size and split-zoned DR 1 & DR 3.5. A group child care facility is operated at the site, pursuant to a special exception originally granted in 1982. Thereafter, the child care center expanded on the site as permitted in four subsequent zoning cases (in 1987, 1989, 1995 and 1997). Petitioners propose at this time to construct an additional building at the site, which would contain two classrooms that could accommodate an additional sixty (60) children.

SPECIAL HEARING

Having reviewed the petition for special hearing in detail, I am unsure exactly what relief is requested (or needed). The County zoning office maintains a microfiche copy of the entire zoning file from the 1982 case. Therein, a site plan marked as Ex. 1 indicates the parcel in question had an area of 4.74 +/- acres, which is the same as shown on the current site plan. There is no indication on the 1982 plan and/or order the special exception granted therein did not encompass the entirety of the tract. As such, the special exception granted in 1982 does not need to be expanded, as suggested in the petition for special hearing.

By special exception in the DR zone, Petitioners are entitled to operate a Class B group child care center with "more than 40 children." B.C.Z.R. §424.5.A. The Regulations do not provide a

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cap or limit on the number of children enrolled in such a facility, although presumably the State (Maryland Department of Education) does. The Regulation requires a minimum one acre lot size for the "first 40 children plus 500 sq. ft. per child for every child beyond 40 children." B.C.Z.R.§ 424.7.A. At present Petitioners are licensed for 159 children (*see* Petitioners' Ex. 6A), and the new building would accommodate 60 additional children. Per the above regulation approximately three acres are required for a center with 220 children, while this site is approximately five acres in size. Thus, it would appear Petitioners are in compliance with applicable density or bulk standards for group centers in DR zones.

The special hearing petition also seeks a determination the child care center is a principal use on the subject property. The Regulations define a Class A group child care center as one where no more than 12 children are enrolled, while a Class B group child care center is one where more than 12 children are enrolled. B.C.Z.R. §101.1. A Class A center is permitted as an accessory use within a single-family dwelling in all residential zones. B.C.Z.R. §424.4. A special exception is required to operate a Class B center in a DR zone, and Petitioners satisfied that requirement in 1982. Under the Regulations a Class B center is by definition a "principal use," and the center in this case will have in excess of 200 children enrolled, and is clearly the principal use on this property.

Though as discussed above I do not believe special hearing relief is required in this case, the petition was presumably drafted with input from the zoning office and the order below will therefore grant the requests.

<u>VARIANCES</u>

A variance request involves a two-step process, summarized as follows:

(1) It must be shown the property is unique in a manner which makes it unlike surrounding properties, and that uniqueness or peculiarity must necessitate variance relief; and

(2) If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING

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hardship.

Cromwell v. Ward, 102 Md. App. 691 (1995).

The property has irregular dimensions and an unusual shape. As such it is unique. If the Regulations were strictly interpreted Petitioners would experience a practical difficulty because they would be unable to construct the proposed building. Finally, I find that the variances can be granted in harmony with the spirit and intent of the B.C.Z.R., and in such manner as to grant relief without injury to the public health, safety and general welfare. The setbacks in question are on the interior of the site along the eastern property boundary. The adjoining property is unimproved (and owned by Petitioners) and the reduced setbacks will therefore have no discernable impact upon the community.

Michael Wilsynski, a neighbor, opposed the requests, and was primarily concerned with the volume and speed of traffic associated with the center. He said parents routinely exceed the speed limit and are always in a hurry when dropping off or picking up their children. He also noted ingress and egress was by way of a narrow, unmarked roadway without sidewalks, which he believed was dangerous. Ms. Huffman testified she is unaware of any motor vehicle and/or pedestrian accidents associated with the center in its 35 years of operation.

Mr. Wilsynski simply believes the child care center has grown too large for the site. His comments were echoed in a July 6, 2017 letter from the Perry Hall Improvement Association (as well as emails from two other neighbors) which is in the case file. While I am sympathetic to the community's concerns, traffic, congestion and similar woes are inherent in most special exception uses, and the County Council permits Class B child care centers in DR zones by special exception. These are exactly the types of inherent adverse effects the legislature was presumed to have anticipated when it allowed the use by special exception. In other words, most uses for which a

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special exception is required are regarded as "potentially troublesome because of noise, traffic, congestion...." *Montgomery County v. Butler*, 417 Md. 271, 297 (2010). And, Petitioners do not need a special exception; that was granted in 1982.

Instead, this is a variance case, which focuses upon the physical condition and attributes of the property itself, rather than exogenous issues such as traffic. *See, e.g., North v. St. Mary's County*, 99 Md. App. 502, 512 (1994) (a variance request requires an examination of the property's shape, topography, subsurface conditions, environmental factors, historical significance, etc.). And as noted above, the reduced setbacks are interior to the site and will not directly impact the community. Even assuming Petitioners could revise the plan and construct the building somewhere else on the site without needing setback variances, that would still not address in any way the concerns raised by the community, which are germane to a special exception case rather than a variance petition.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED this <u>17th</u> day of **July**, **2017**, by this Administrative Law Judge, that the Petition for Special Hearing filed pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R): (1) to approve an expansion of a Class B Group Child Care Center, as shown on the site plan marked and admitted as Exhibit 1, by adding a one story classroom building (1,924 sq. ft. in size) designed to accommodate additional children; and (2) for a determination the child care center is a principal use on the subject property, be and is hereby GRANTED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the petition for variance: (1) To allow a rear yard setback for the proposed expansion building of 42 ft. in lieu of the required 50 ft.; and (2) To allow a side yard setback for the proposed expansion building of 11 ft. in lieu of the required 40 ft., be and is hereby GRANTED.

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The relief granted herein shall be subject to the following:

- Petitioners may apply for necessary permits and/or licenses upon receipt of this Order. However, Petitioners are hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at their own risk until 30 days from the date hereof, during which time an appeal can be filed by any party. If for whatever reason this Order is reversed, Petitioners would be required to return the subject property to its original condition.
- 2. Petitioners shall provide an appropriate enclosure for the dumpster(s) at the site, as determined in the sole discretion of the Baltimore County landscape architect.

Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

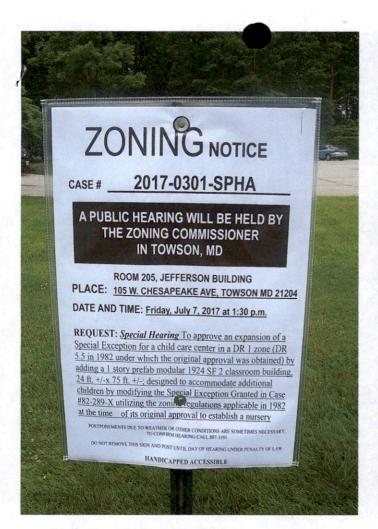

I am writing this letter to express my concerns and objections to the purposed zoning variance for property 8650 Winding Way 21128. Hearing is scheduled for July 7th at 1:30 pm. Case number: 2017-0301-SPHA

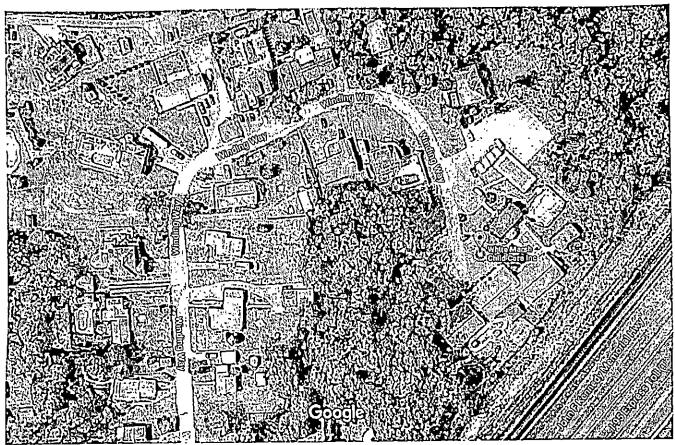
- 1. This property is located at the end of a narrow dead end street. Several years ago, the neighbors attempted to have speed bumps placed along the entire road. We were told since it was a dead-end street no speed bumps were permitted. The owner of the property placed 2 speed bumps along her section of road she owns and maintains, not Baltimore County Road. This has not slowed the large amount of traveler's speed in any fashion. We have a very narrow turn at 8630 Winding Way and at times only one car may navigate the blind turn safely.
- 2. Several years ago, a traffic volume study (The Neighborhood Traffic Management Program) was conducted and resulted in speed humps being placed on the entire section of Silver Spring Road from Honeygo Blvd. to the dead end of 195. This was in direct relation to the daycare and the increase speed and volume as a result. These are the same cars traveling on Silver Spring Road that continue to travel to Winding Way to the daycare. Therefore, the speed humps were placed in attempts to slow the motorist down, this has in turn failed to slow the speeding on Winding Way. The motorist increase their speed on Winging Way to make up for lost seconds on Silver Spring Road.
- 3. There are no sidewalks along any portion of Winding Way. This makes walking to school buses and standing at the bus stop extremely dangerous for the school age children on reside on Winding Way. The heavy traffic volume from the daycare puts our children at risk while standing at the school bus stop which is located on the corner of Winding Way and Silver Spring Road. There is no safe standing area, since there are no sidewalks, the children must stand in the road. Certain times of the year, the high school students are walking in the dark to the bus stop within prime time for the daycare hours drop off time frame.
- 4. The most dangerous hours for our street are between 7 am to 9:30 am and 3:30 pm to 6:15pm. These are the drop off and pick up times. The said business charges a late fee beginning at 6 pm and increases as the amount of tardiness increases. This causes parents to rush and speed to avoid a substantial late fee.
- 5. My husband was informed a few years ago, when he was attempting to have a gun repair shop in our garage, that our street and neighborhood was not zoned for walk up traffic. He explained that he does not want a store front, only the ability to have gun owners bring their firearms to him to repair and then pick back up. His request was denied but there is a 100 plus children daycare, which includes 5 buildings, several houses from our house with walk up traffic, a large amount of traffic.
- 6. The placement of the signs to notify surrounding residents were placed on the property which is at the end of a deadend road. Therefore, no one was made aware of the zoning notice. The business owner did not make any attempts, verbal or written to notify neighbors of this proposed zoning hearing.

Thank you for your assistance in this matter. I am hoping you may take my concerns into consideration and not allow the zoning variance to be granted to allow an additional non-residential building on our dead-end street which will create more traffic and in turn a substantial increase safety risk to our children and quite frankly every resident who resides on Winding Way on an already heavily traffic residential street. Unfortunately, I am unable to attend the meeting due to work commitments but I thank you in advance for taking the time to read this letter and your assistance in this matter.

Dear Judge Beverungen

I write to you today to express opposition to case 2017-3001-SPHA 8650 Winding Way for several reasons

As a community advocate association, we have heard from several residents of Winding Way that they received late notice of the hearing due to sign placement. Though it appears the signage was properly displayed, the property is primarily a business property at the dead end of the street with some obscurity due to a long driveway and landscaping. None of the residents would have cause or reason to travel to the location of the sign and it is not seen in normal, everyday travel. In speaking with a resident, there appears to have been no outreach or attempt to communicate with the neighbors, either in person or by mail, of the application for special exception.

At minimum, the case should be postposed until the residents have time to submit input.

The PHIA is principally opposed to the application as it is outside existing 2017 zoning for the location.

This once small, single residential type daycare has now grown into a primary business location with 4 buildings, 2 outdoor pools, a playground and utilization of a an adjacent residence for parking of 5 small passenger busses. The original business was approved under DR 5.5 in 1982. Its is believed that sometime after 1997, the zoning changed to the existing DR1, thus indicating the community and county preference of reducing the use and density of the property. While it is generally our position to support property owners rights, that opinion changes when those rights begin to affect others. While this is a small community of less than 20 residences, the bulk of the traffic is generated by the one property in question. It appears that there have been several

special exceptions #95-291-SPH, #89-7-SPHA, #87-329-SPH, #82-289-X to allow expansion of this business over the years. At what point does this have a limit? It also appears that some exceptions have been based on the 1982 zoning as opposed to the zoning in place at time of application. What is the purpose of current zoning if outdated zoning is continued to be utilized? Additionally, although not certain, it is believed that this was approved as a "class b" day care/school facility which to the best of my research has a limit of 40 children. Clearly, if expansion is needed, the intent is to add additional children. What will the actual "enrollment" be and what impact will this have on the community in relation to transportation routes?

I have driven down the street, and it is a narrow paved residential road with several ninety degree turns. I have been told and have personally experienced the difficulty of 2 vehicles passing at some points. Often, one vehicle must travel on the lawn of a private residence. As evidence, several have placed large stones and other obstacles to protect their property from such action. There are no sidewalks, and with the high school bus stop being at Silver Spring road, children are walking without buffer while daycare busses and private vehicles are traveling the narrow road at the same peak periods. This is a safety issue that would be compounded with additional expansion. This business, White Marsh Childcare, has 2 other locations within 5 miles that are in commercial, non-residential areas that would be more appropriate for expansion.

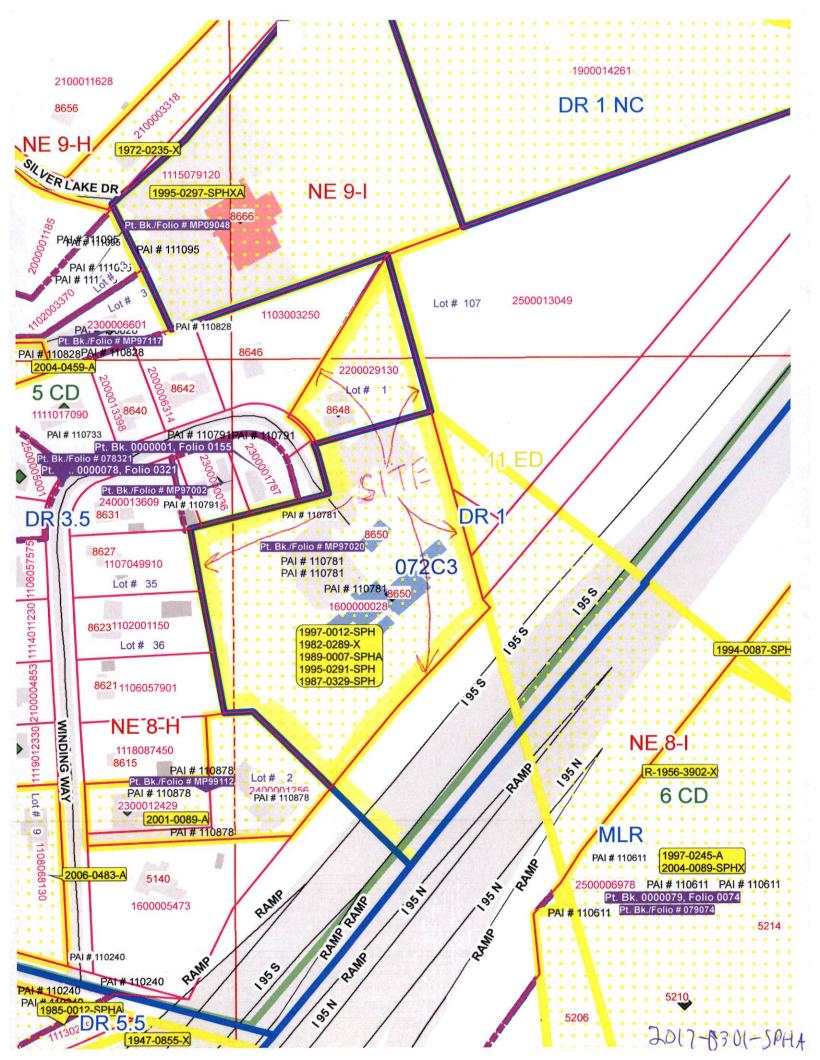
In summary, we are opposed to the expansion in general. More strongly, we feel that if a building is erected as matter-of right, that it be done following existing 2017 zoning, and not allowing the requested rear setback of 42 ft vs the required 50, as well as the 11 ft side setback as opposed to the 40ft required. We also support consideration of exception to traffic calming rules, (dead-end street) should the community request it.

Cooperation: Turning "No" Into "Yes"

Encouraging children's sense of fun and imagination often motivates young ones to do chores and routine tasks that aren't always fun.

Although a game approach isn't foolproof, more often than not it will minimize conflict and help children to act more independently.

- A toddler can pretend his rolled-up socks are a ball to be "tossed" into the laundry basket.
- Putting on shoes is quite boring for a three-year-old but visiting a pretend shoe store and trying them on for size may be quite appealing.
- A seven-year-old may eagerly pick up his room if encouraged to be a "human vacuum cleaner." This "cleaning machine" can make all sorts of noises for special effects.

HERE ARE SOME OTHER GAMES THAT CAN BE ADAPTED FOR CHILDREN OF DIFFERENT AGES

GETTING DRESSED

Turn your child into a robot with fast and slow buttons (a nose or an ear). She can choose whether she wants to get dressed quickly or slowly, and you can help by operating the buttons! Try the "Let's see if you can get dressed by the time I count to twenty" approach. Count slowly enough to ensure success. Hopefully, the next day your child will want to break her record.

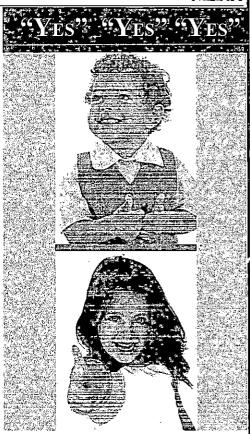
BATH TIME

Let your child select a few safe kitchen utensils to bring into the tub. A younger child will have fun with a plastic spatula, measuring cups and sieves. An older child can play with whisks, and shaving cream.

Children will have fun kicking up a storm while wearing goggles and swimsuits in the tub. They also love playing with spray bottles. Don't forget to set up a few rules, and spread a couple of towels on the floor to soak up accidental splashes. Put stickers on the ceiling for a distraction during hair washing. Ask your child what animal they want washing their hair, then use your fingers to scratch like a squirrel or hop like a rabbit on their head.

CUTTING FINGERNAILS

Sing "Where is Thumbkin?" Ask for individual fingers by name (pointer, tall man, ring finger, and pinkie). Toes can be "Little Piggies," and you and your child can recite nursery rhymes while you clip.



CLEAN UP

Give children scoops or tongs to use to pick up toys off the floor. The challenge of using a tool will make children forget they are actually cleaning!

Put on music and do the clean up dance. The object is to be done by the end of the song or CD. Vary this game by periodically switching the music off, at which point children can "freeze." When the music resumes, so does the cleaning.

Children are a great excuse to invite fun into daily life, so use your imagination and give game playing a try!

Summer is Coming It's Time for Ice Pops!

Make homemade ice pops by pouring fruit juice into an ice tray. When partially frozen, place a craft stick into each pop and freeze until firm.

These special treats are yummy, but they can be messy! Try this idea to do away with sticky fingers, clothing, and floors. Save plastic lids from margarine tubs and cut small slits in the top. Slide the stick into the lid. Now you have a drip pan for drippy treats!

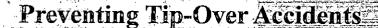

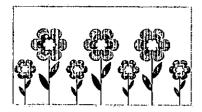

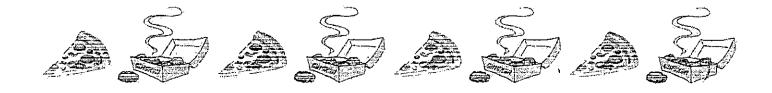

We will be celebrating Father's Day on Friday, June 16^{th} from 7 a.m.-9 a.m. with donuts for all dads when dropping off children at daycare.

Pre-School class Splash Pad days begin the week of June 12th. Designated class Splash Pad days and times are attached. All children using the Splash Pad will need the following items labeled with their name: bathing suit, towel, and a separate bag for all items. Plastic grocery bags <u>are not</u> allowed.

Medication forms must be signed and returned to your child's teacher for sunscreen to be applied to your child. Sunscreen should be brought from home, labeled with the child's name and given to their teacher. Please be sure to always try the particular sunscreen brand at home first in case of reaction.

Please remember that children <u>must</u> wear <u>closed-toed shoes</u>. This allows for safe playing while inside and out. If you haven't done so already, please be sure to check your child's extra clothing bin to be sure the clothing size is accurate and seasonally appropriate.

Please note our Summer Weather Policy: Code ORANGE: Children may go out at any time of the day for no longer than 20 minutes each time. Code RED: Children may go out until 11am ONLY and for no longer than 20 minutes each time. After 11am, the children may not go outside the rest of the day. The only exception to this policy is that children who are scheduled to swim or use the Splash Pad may do so at any time. Please understand that it is an Office of Child Care regulation that ALL children go outside at least twice per day (weather permitting). As stated in the Parent Handbook, if your child has a health condition restricting him/her from going outside on hot days or when the air quality is poor, it is best that your child remain at home. Thank you for your understanding in this matter.

In order to keep our children safe, please be sure to always pull our doors shut tightly behind you upon entering and leaving the buildings. <u>PLEASE</u> watch your child in the parking lot-keep a tight hold of their hand!

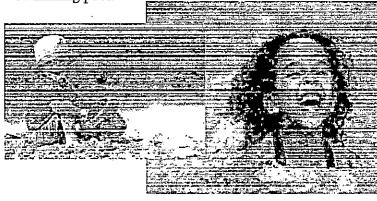


Water Safety

- Empty all buckets, pails, and wading pools completely after each use. Drowning can occur in less than two inches of water in a matter of seconds.
- Use a rigid, lockable cover on a hot tub, spa, or whirlpool, or fence in all four sides as you would a swimming pool.



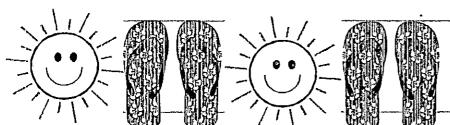

One Minute Safety Seat Checklist

Using a safety seat correctly makes a big difference. A child safety seat may not protect a child in a crash if it isn't used correctly and installed properly in your vehicle. Take a minute to Check To Be Sure...

- All children age 12 and under should ride properly restrained in the back seat!!!
- Never place a child safety seat in the front seat where a front mounted passenger air bag is present.

Do You Have and Understand the Instructions?

- Always read the child seat use and installation instruction manual.
- Read your vehicle owner's manual seat belt and child seat installation section.

Does Your Child Ride in the Correct Safety Seat?

- Infants, from birth to about age one, and at least 20 pounds should ride in the back seat in a rear facing safety seat.
 - > Harness straps should be at or below the infant's shoulders.
 - Harness straps should fit snugly. The straps should lie in a relatively straight line without sagging.
 - > The harness chest clip should be placed at the infant's armpit level. This keeps the harness straps positioned properly.
- Infants weighing 20 pounds or more before one year should ride in a safety seat rated for heavier infants (some convertible seats are rated up to 30-35 pounds rear facing).
- Children over one year and at least 20 pounds may ride forward facing in the back seat. Children should ride in a safety seat with full harness until they weigh about 40 pounds.
 - Harness straps should be at or above child's shoulders.
 - Harness straps should be threaded through the top slots, in most cases.
 - Harness should be snug. Straps should lie in a relatively straight line without sagging.
 - Harness chest clip should be at the child's armpit level, which helps keep the harness straps positioned properly on the child's shoulders.

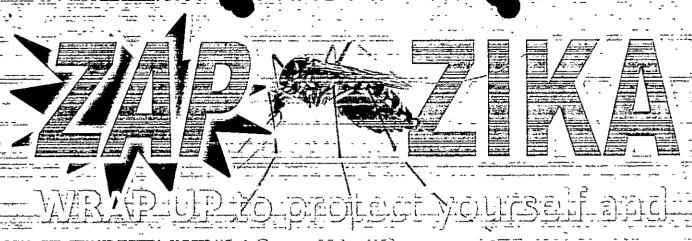
The Lower Anchors and Tethers for Children (LATCH) System is designed to make installation of child safety seats easier by requiring child safety seats to be installed without using the vehicle's seat belt system. As of September, 1999, all new forward facing child safety seats (not including booster seats) have to meet stricter head protection requirements, which calls for a top tether strap. This adjustable strap is attached to the back of a child safety seat. It has a hook for securing the seat to a tether anchor found either on the rear shelf area of the vehicle or, in the case of mini-vans and station wagons, on the rear floor or on the back of the rear seat of the vehicle. As of September 2000, all new cars, minivans, and light trucks have this tether anchor.

As of September 2002, two rear seating positions of all new cars, minivans, and light trucks come equipped with lower child safety seat anchorage points located between a vehicle's seat cushion and seat back. Also, all new child safety seats will have two attachments which will connect to the vehicle's lower anchorage attachment points. Together, the lower anchors and upper tethers make up the LATCH system.

Children between 40-80 pounds should ride in the back seat in a belt-positioning booster seat, which uses the adult lap and shoulder belt. Booster seats should be used until the adult lap and shoulder belt fit children properly.

- Belt-positioning boosters can only be used with both the lap and shoulder belt across the child. The shoulder belt should be snug against the child's chest, resting across the collar bone. The lap belt should lay low across the child's upper thigh area.
- Boosters should be used as "in between" safety devices for children over 40 pounds who have outgrown a forward-facing child seat.
- Booster seats should be used until the child can sit with his/her back against the vehicle seat back cushion, knees bent over the seat cushion edge, and feet on the floor, approximately 4'9".

If only a lap belt is available in the rear seating positions, an option may be to contact the vehicle dealer to see if retrofit shoulder belts can be installed. Another option may be to install products that can be used with a lap belt only such as a specially-made harness or vest. Helpecontro Mosquitoes that Spread Dangua Galkungunya ang Alka Viruses





Aside from being itchy and annoying, the bite of an infected female mosquito (Aedes aegypti or Aedes albopictus) can spread dengue, chikungunya, or Zika viruses. People become infected with dengue, chikungunya, or Zika after being bitten by an infected mosquito.

- Female mosquitoes lay several hundred eggs on the walls of waterfilled containers. Eggs stick to containers like glue and remain attached until they are scrubbed off. When water covers the eggs, they hatch and become adults in about a week.
- · Adult mosquitoes live inside and outside.
- They prefer to bite during the day.
- A few infected mosquitoes can produce large outbreaks in a community and put your family at risk of becoming sick.

Protect Yourself, Your Family, and Community from Mosquitoes



Eliminate standing water in and around your home:

- Once a week, empty and scrub, turn over, cover, or throw out items that hold water, such as tires, buckets, planters, toys, pools, birdbaths, flowerpots, or trash containers. Check inside and outside your home.
- Tightly cover water storage containers (buckets, cisterns, rain barrels) so that mosquitoes cannot get inside to lay eggs.
- For containers without lids, use wire mesh with holes smaller than an adult mosquito.



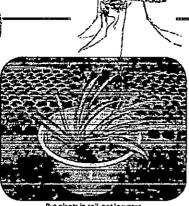
If you have a septic tank, follow these steps:

- Repair cracks or gaps.
- Cover open vent or plumbing pipes. Use wire mesh with holes smaller than an adult mosquito.



Keep mosquitoes out of your home:

- Use screens on windows and doors.
- Repair holes in screens.
- · Use air conditioning when available.











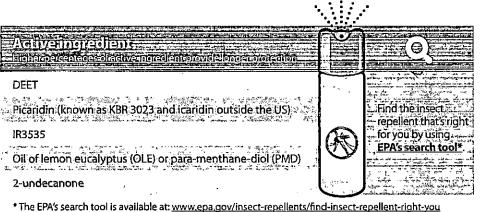


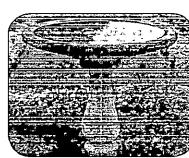

and the parties, having waived a trial by jury and a view by the Court of the property being acquired, and upon the consent and agreement of the parties being evidenced by their signatures and/or the signatures of their counsel, the Court does hereby find and determine, witnesseth:

THAT the Plaintiff has the right to condemn the subject property hereinafter

HUFFMAN, to William Hermann, Trustee for the benefit of GLENMORE INVESTORS LIMITED PARTNERSHIP, a Maryland limited partnership; and a Second Modification of Indemnity Deed of Trust dated November 8, 2006 and recorded among the Land Records of Baltimore County, Maryland, in Liber No. 24810, folio 634, from RICHARD O. HUFFMAN, JR. AND ELIZABETH S. HUFFMAN, to William Hermann, Trustee for the benefit of GLENMORE INVESTORS LIMITED PARTNERSHIP, a Maryland limited partnership. GLENMORE INVESTORS LIMITED PARTNERSHIP is not entitled to any of the just compensation paid pursuant to this Agreed Inquisition.

THAT the real estate taxes levied and due BALTIMORE COUNTY, MARYLAND on the subject property are paid in full and BALTIMORE COUNTY, MARYLAND is not entitled to any of the just compensation paid pursuant to this Agreed Inquisition.

THAT the purpose for which the said land and property above described is sought to be condemned is for the construction, reconstruction, improvement, maintenance and completion of the State System of Roads and Bridges and designated as I-95 Section 100 Extended from South of the I-95/I-895 Split (Moravia Road) to North of MD 43 (New

Forge Road) in Baltimore County, Maryland.

THAT on October 17, 2007 pursuant Md. Trans. Code Ann. §§ 8-318 through 8-331 (Part III. "Quick Take" Condemnation by Commission – Board of Property Review Procedure); Md. Real Prop.
