OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for consideration of a Petition for Special Exception filed on behalf of Raymond V. & Sandra P. Frank, legal owners and Inverness Brewing, LLC, lessee ("Petitioners"). The Special Exception was filed pursuant to the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R.") to operate a Brewery, Class 8, including accessory retail and wholesale distribution of beer produced on the premises, and temporary promotional events, such as beer tasting or public gatherings associated with the brewery.

Raymond and Sandra Frank appeared in support of the petition. Christopher D. Mudd, Esq. represented the Petitioners. Several members of the community opposed the request. Substantive Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were received from the Department of Planning (DOP), the Bureau of Development Plans Review (DPR) and the Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability (DEPS). None of the reviewing agencies opposed the request.

The subject property is approximately 92.325 acres and is zoned RC-2. The property is located in northern Baltimore County in the Monkton community, and is within the My Lady's Manor federal historic district established in 1975. It is undisputed the historic district designation does not impose any special rules or regulations concerning the use of the property.

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Raymond and Sandra Frank purchased the property in 2001, and several neighbors stated the property was at that time in deplorable condition. The owners have made substantial improvements to the property, which contains a dwelling, barns and several other farm buildings. Witnesses described the property as having a park-like setting. Petitioners propose to operate a small farm brewery at the site, which requires a special exception.

# Special Exception

Under Maryland law, a special exception use enjoys a presumption that it is in the interest of the general welfare, and therefore, valid. *Schultz v. Pritts*, 291 Md. 1 (1981). The *Schultz* standard was revisited in *Attar v. DMS Tollgate*, *LLC*, 451 Md. 272 (2017), where the court of appeals discussed the nature of the evidentiary presumption in special exception cases. The court again emphasized a special exception is properly denied only when there are facts and circumstances showing that the adverse impacts of the use at the particular location in question would be above and beyond those inherently associated with the special exception use.

Petitioners presented two witnesses in their case. First was Sandra Frank, who described in detail the operations of her farm, including the proposed brewery. Ms. Franks stated all of the equipment needed in the operation of the brewery would be located in several of the stalls inside one of the barns on the property. She described the process of growing hops, and has dedicated several acres of the farm to produce hops which would be used in the beer. Petitioners do not propose any new construction in connection with the proposed brewery. The witness testified there would be few if any delivery trucks used in connection with the brewery, which she explained would be a "small system." The witness also described the type of special promotional events she would like to hold, all of which she indicated would be family friendly.

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The next witness was David Martin, a landscape architect accepted as an expert. Mr. Martin explained the site plan he prepared for the case, and indicated he visited the property on several occasions. The witness reviewed each of the factors listed in B.C.Z.R. §502.1, and testified Petitioners have satisfied each of those requirements. He also opined the use would have no greater adverse impact at this location than on any other RC 2 zoned tract. Mr. Martin testified the brewery is an adjunct operation to the agricultural uses on the property, which will provide much needed income for the owners/farmers. This concluded Petitioners' case, and under *Attar* I believe they established a *prima facie* case entitling them to the special exception.

Eleven community members testified; several expressed strong support for the proposal while other vehemently opposed the brewery. Two of the opponents contended the brewery use would violate the terms of a Baltimore County agricultural easement which covers Petitioners' property, although that assertion is demonstrably false. The DOP noted in its zoning comment the Baltimore County Agricultural Land Preservation Advisory Board "approved the proposed use to be farm related" under the terms of the agricultural easement. In addition, the court of appeals has recently held non-party "interested persons" do not have standing to enforce provisions of an agricultural easement. Long Green Valley Ass'n. v. Bellevale Farms, Inc., 432 Md. 292 (2013).

The opponents are primarily concerned with noise, traffic, odors and a commercial operation in a rural, pastoral setting. While these are legitimate concerns, I believe they are inherent in the operation of a farm brewery. The obvious truth (a point conceded by Mr. Martin on cross-examination) is that a farm brewery will cause an increase in noise and traffic. But as recognized by Maryland's highest court, most if not all special exception uses have such adverse impacts. *Montgomery County v. Butler*, 417 Md. 271, 297 (2010) ("Most [uses for which a special exception is required] are regarded as potentially troublesome because of noise, traffic, congestion,

or other associated problems"). An opponent's burden, after a petitioner has established a *prima* facie case, is to rebut the presumption of validity of the special exception. I do not believe the evidence presented by the protestants satisfied this standard.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED this <u>8<sup>th</sup></u> day of August, 2017, by this Administrative Law Judge, that the Petition for Special Exception to use the herein described property for a Brewery, Class 8, including accessory retail and wholesale distribution of beer produced on the premises, and temporary promotional events, such as beer tasting or public gatherings associated with the brewery, be and is hereby GRANTED.

The relief granted herein shall be subject to the following:

- Petitioners may apply for necessary permits and/or licenses upon receipt of this Order. However, Petitioners are hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at their own risk until 30 days from the date hereof, during which time an appeal can be filed by any party. If for whatever reason this Order is reversed, Petitioners would be required to return the subject property to its original condition.
- 2. Petitioners must comply with the ZAC comment of DEPS, a copy of which is attached hereto.
- Prior to issuance of permits Petitioners must submit for approval by the DOP
  a schematic plan showing the location of any dumpster used for this facility,
  which must be screened in accordance with the requirements of the landscape
  manual.
- 4. The brewery shall be permitted to produce, sell and/or distribute no more than 5,000 barrels of malt beverage per year.
- 5. The hours of operation shall be restricted to Thursday-Sunday from 12 noon to 8:00 p.m., although certain special events (discussed below) may be held Thursday-Sunday from 12 noon to 10:00 p.m.
- 6. Petitioners may hold no more than eight (8) temporary promotional events or gatherings associated with the brewery per year.
- 7. After the proposed brewery has been in operation for one year, the restrictions contained herein are subject to modification following a public hearing, upon a showing of good cause.

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Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

Dear Judge Mayhew:

I write in response to Mr. Mudd's letter of November 4, 2019.

Mr. Mudd argues that my clients do not have the right to request a hearing because Condition 7 was imposed by Judge Beverungen to provide Petitioners with the opportunity to modify and potentially reduce the conditions in the Order. According to Mr. Mudd, the Condition was not imposed "to give opponents in attendance (who accepted the Order and did not file any appeal) a chance to seek new restrictions that exceed the scope of the existing conditions of approval."

There is no evidence that Judge Beverungen imposed Condition 7 solely for the purpose suggested by Mr. Mudd. I was not present at the hearing, as Mr. Mudd points out, but I did have the opportunity to listen to the audio recording and note that numerous members of the community expressed concerns about the number and scope of events that Petitioner might have at the property. Certainly, if it was Judge Beverungen' intention to limit the right to have a future hearing to only the Petitioners, then he would have said so. In the absence of such an expressed intention, I do not believe we can make the assumption suggested by Mr. Mud's argument. I should add that it is not at all unusual in my experience for the ALJ to

include in his Order a provision that allows for modification of its terms in a future public hearing.<sup>1</sup>

Mr. Mudd states that having a band play music on weekends is a "standard farm brewery operation" and "coupling music with weekend farm brewery operations is consistent with the operations of all farm breweries throughout Baltimore County and the State of Maryland." In his words, "[m]music does not equate to a special promotional event or gathering."

I think it's fair to say that the videos and documents sent with my prior letter reflect more than simply the playing of music on weekends. In any event, whether live amplified music every Friday, Saturday, and Sunday is a "standard farm brewery operation" is a matter of serious dispute, one that we believe should be resolved at the modification hearing requested by my clients.<sup>2</sup>

Mr. Mudd states that Petitioners have had "several *actual* temporary promotional events or gatherings" and obtained permits for these special events from the State of Maryland in accordance with section 2-210 of the Alcoholic Beverages Article. Mr. Mudd identifies two such events/gatherings – the Pig Roast Luau and Fall Farm Festival – which are referenced in documents produced with my prior letter.

My office submitted a request under the Public Information Act to the State Comptroller's Office and discovered that only four (4) special event permits have been issued by that Office since the Petitioner began operation of the brewery in the spring of 2018. (These applications and permits are attached). One of these permits appears to be for the Pig Roast Luau held on July 5, 6, and 7, 2019 (although the application for the permit describes the event as an "Independence Day" celebration to be held on July 4, 5, and 6). There was no permit issued by the Comptroller's Office for the Fall Farm Festival, but I do not disagree that the festival was a "temporary promotional event or gathering" under Judge Beverungen' Order and the Zoning Regulations. Indeed, the brewery's website identifies the Fall Festival as an "event weekend" occurring on October 18, 19, and 20, 2019. (See documents produced with prior letter). My point is that if these two occurrences are "temporary promotional events or gatherings" as Mr. Mudd concedes, there is nothing distinguishing them from the numerous others that are depicted in the videos, calendars, and other documents previously sent to you. Like

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> The fact that my clients did not appeal the ALJ's decision is irrelevant and certainly not an indication that they agreed at that time to forego any and all future legal challenges to the proposed brewery. My clients tell me that they were heartened by the prospect of being able to revisit the conditions in the Order and, on that basis, elected not to appeal Judge Beverungen' decision.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Notably, when the Petitioner was asked at the hearing whether she would have music at the events/gatherings, she responded yes, but "probably not loud music, [just] people walking around talking." (Audio recording, 2:31:50 p.m.). She later added, "I'm 60 years old. I want this to be a little fun retirement thing for my husband and me." (*Id.*, 2:41:40).

the Pig Roast Luau and Fall Farm Festival, they involve live music, large crowds, and often a cover charge for attendance.

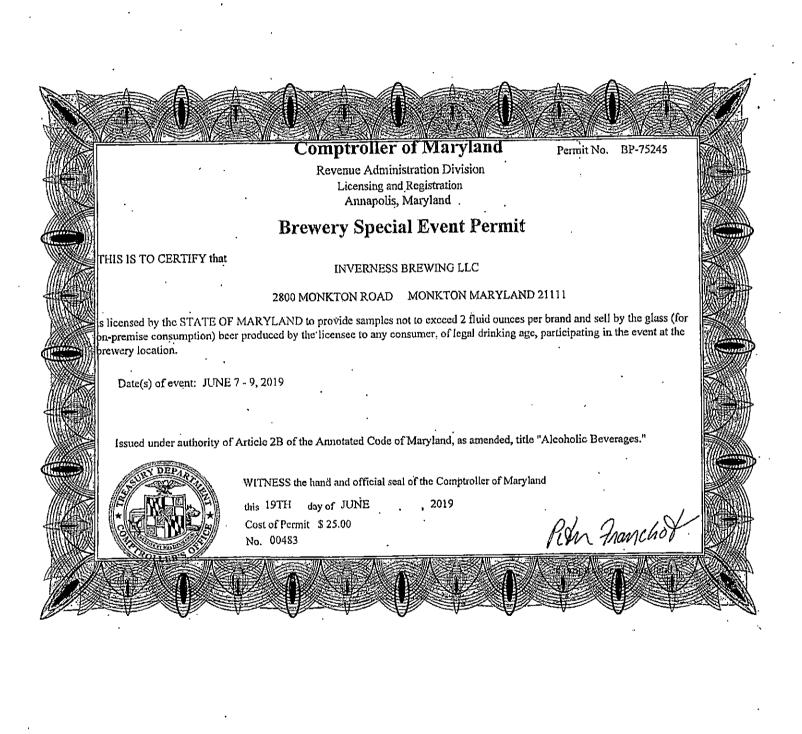

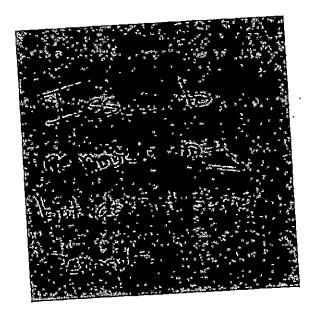

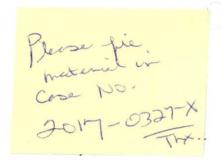

This correspondence is in response to a letter from Michael R. McCann dated October 29, 2019. Without identifying any Protestants or clients, Mr. McCann requests that an additional hearing be held to address certain alleged impacts arising out of the farm brewery approved in this case. For the following reasons, no further hearing or action of any kind is necessary.

Mr. McCann bases his request for a hearing on Condition 7 contained in the August 8, 2017 Order approving this special exception. That condition states as follows: "After the proposed brewery has been in operation for one year, the restrictions contained herein are subject to modification following a public hearing, upon a showing of good cause" (emphasis added).

Mr. McCann was not present at the special exception hearing before Judge Beverungen and therefore was not fully informed as to the origin of Condition 7. The condition was requested by the Petitioners in order to provide them with the opportunity to modify and potentially reduce the restrictions placed on the beer production, hours of operation, and the number of special events that can be held in conjunction with this farm brewery. The condition was not included to give the opponents in attendance (who accepted the Order and did not file any appeal), a chance to seek new restrictions that exceed the scope of the existing conditions of approval.

Without knowing who Mr. McCann represents, it is difficult to properly respond to any complaints regarding the operation and impacts associated with the farm brewery. However, it appears that Mr. McCann's primary allegation is that standard farm brewery operations, such as having a band play music on the weekends, constitute "temporary promotional events or gatherings" that are limited by Condition 6 of the Order in this case to a maximum of 8 per year.

Coupling music with weekend farm brewery operations is consistent with the operation of all farm breweries throughout Baltimore County and the State of Maryland. Music does not equate to a

special promotional event or gathering. Had Mr. McCann been asked to represent the opponents at the hearing in this case, perhaps he could have negotiated a condition regarding the location or frequency of music in conjunction with this farm brewery. However, no limiting condition involving music was placed on this farm brewery, and there is no basis for adding such a condition when there is a final, unappealable order in this case.

The Petitioners have had several actual "temporary promotional events or gatherings," including the Luau Pig Roast and Fall Farm Festival that are referenced in the attachments to Mr. McCann's letters. As required by § 2-210 of the Alcoholic Beverages Article of the Maryland Code, the Petitioners registered with the State of Maryland and obtained permits for these special events. However, simply having a band play music on the 92-acre farm associated with this farm brewery does not constitute a special promotional event or gathering, particularly when there is no condition limiting live music on this property.

Additionally, testimony at the public hearing in this matter confirmed that the farm brewery would inevitably cause an increase in noise and traffic in and around the property. Judge Beverungen confirmed, however, that these impacts are inherent to the operation of any farm brewery and are therefore not grounds to deny a special exception. See Order, pp. 3-4. If any neighbors wished to further contest the impacts associated with the daily operations of the farm brewery, such as having bands play music on the weekend, they had a full opportunity to request that Judge Beverungen impose a limiting condition, and they had the ability to appeal Judge Beverungen's Order to the Board of Appeals. However, they chose not to seek any conditions or any further administrative or judicial review of this matter and accepted the approval as is. There is no basis for these unnamed neighbors to now try to use a condition that was included for the benefit of the Petitioners to further limit the everyday operations of the farm brewery.

For these reasons, undersigned counsel respectfully submits that there is no reason to hold any additional hearings in this case.

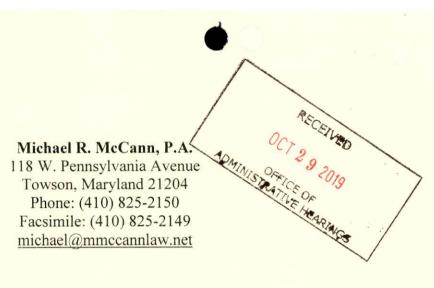

On August 8, 2018, your predecessor, Judge Beverungen, issued the attached Opinion and Order in which he approved a special exception for a Class 8 brewery at the above-mentioned property. In the Opinion, Judge Beverungen noted the Petitioners' testimony that their proposal called for a "small brewery" with "few if any truck deliveries" that would host "family friendly special promotional events." (Op. and Order, p. 2). Based on concerns expressed at the hearing by the community, Judge Beverungen ultimately imposed certain conditions on his approval of the special exception, including that (i) Petitioners were allowed to have only eight (8) "temporary promotional events or gatherings" per year, and (ii) such events are limited to the hours from noon to 10 p.m. At the conclusion of his Opinion, Judge Beverungen stated that, after the brewery was in operation for one year, the conditions he imposed "are subject to modification following a public hearing, upon a showing of good cause." (Op. and Order, p. 4).

We believe good cause exists for your Honor to conduct a hearing for the purpose of determining whether modification of the conditions imposed by Judge Beverungen is appropriate. Since last fall, my clients have documented and recorded numerous promotional events and gatherings held at the brewery, far in excess of the 8 permitted by Judge Beverungen. These events/gatherings, which occur nearly every weekend (Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights), attract large crowds and typically involve live, amplified music that can be heard from great distances in this rural part of the County. The brewery often holds these events/gatherings beyond

the permitted hours of operation. The brewery also has been advertising the rental of the facility for private gatherings for 25 to 100 people, a use clearly not permitted under the "Class 8, brewery" special exception or otherwise under the Zoning Regulations. In short, the Brewery has been operating, essentially, as a bar and restaurant.

Attached for your reference is a representative sampling of print-outs from the brewery's website and Facebook pages along with some photographs taken by my clients. Also attached is a thumb drive containing videos of four (4) recent events that took place at the brewery, which were downloaded from the brewery's Facebook page. These are typical of the events that have been held nearly every weekend since last fall. The Department of Planning has reviewed the petition for special exception to use the property for a Brewery, Class 8, including accessory retail and wholesale distribution of beer produced on the premises and temporary promotional events, such as beer tasting or public gatherings associated with the brewery.

A site visit was conducted on July 5, 2017.

This property is located within the White Hall and Monkton Agricultural Priority Preservation Area (Master Plan 2020, pg. 40). The property was placed under a conservation easement through the Baltimore County Agricultural Preservation Program in June 2002. The Baltimore County Agricultural Land Preservation Advisory Board approved the proposed use to be farm related in accordance with the Deed of Conservation Easement Article II B. and the Baltimore County Code §24-3-108. The petitioners have constructed trellises and planted hops to be used in the processing of their beer as seen on the plan. The property is also located within the National Register Historic District of My Lady's Manor.

Monkton Road is a Baltimore County Scenic Route and a Maryland State Highway Administration Scenic Route (Horses and Hounds). All components of the proposed special exception use are existing and are substantially removed from the scenic route such that no adverse impact to the view is created.

The Department has no objection to granting the petitioned zoning request conditioned upon the following:

- Submit for approval a landscape and lighting plan to the Baltimore County Landscape Architect prior to occupancy permit approval.
- Provide a refuse dumpster and indicate the location on the landscape plan. Said plan will show

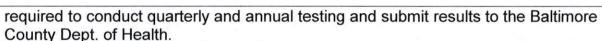

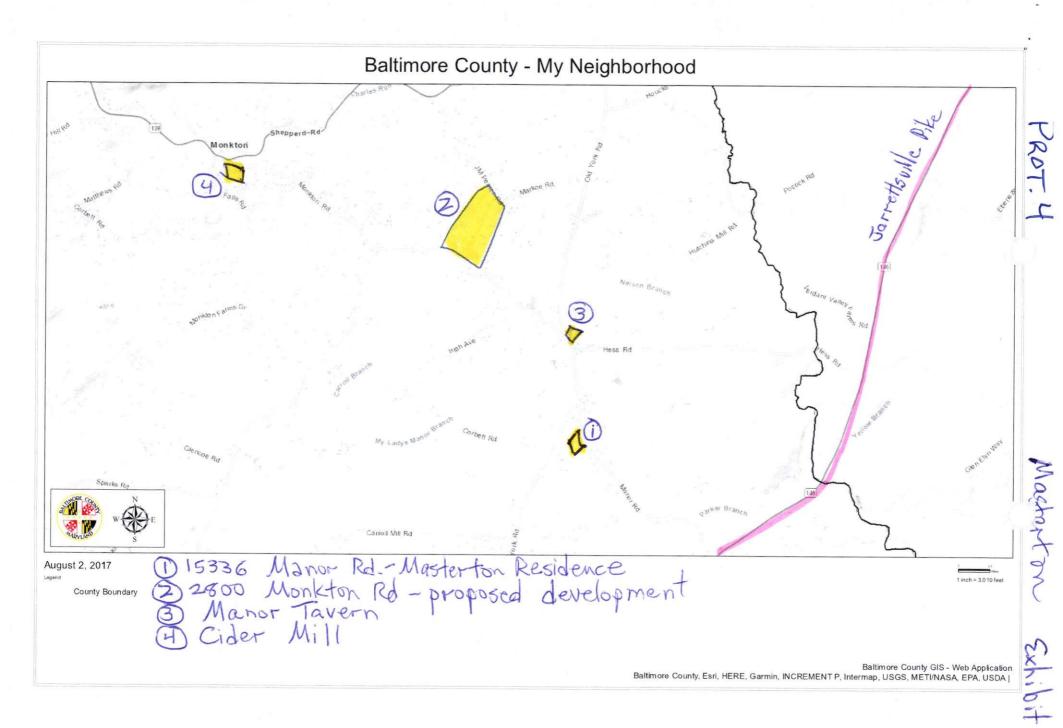

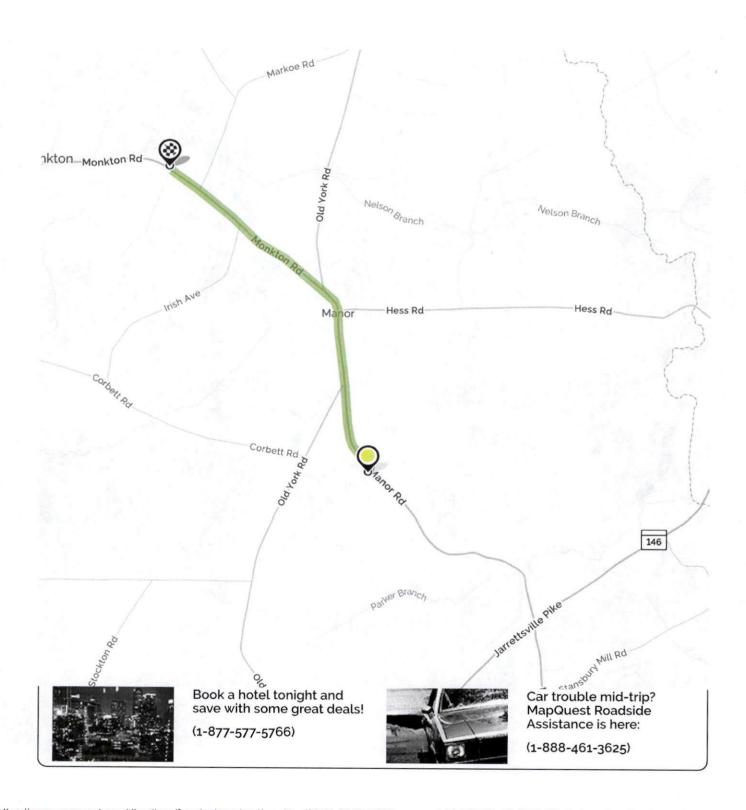

As Sam just pointed out, this part of Baltimore County is "beau colic." It is beau colic because there is no industry, no infrastructure, no public amenities and most of us who chose to live here are just fine with that. We would much rather have peace, quiet, clean air and water than public water, sewers, sidewalks, street lights and all other urban "improvements." A big reason that this area has remained beau colic, is that much of the property is part of My Lady's Manor Federal Historic District established in 1975, to protect the 10,000 acres that was Lord Baltimore's gift to his wife over 300 years ago. Inverness Farm is one of the original group of farms which formed this district, however, it was originally known as Belmore or Inverness/Holms farm.

The original farm was 235 acres on lot #54 of the 101 lots into which My Lady's Manor had been divided after the Revolution. It was acquired at auction by John Davidson in 1782. Through the years, pieces of the farm were either sold off or given to heirs and the 93-acre piece that became Belmore was owned by Mary Bacon Holms, widow, as listed on the 1823 tax assessment. She deeded it to Victor, her son and his new wife Elizabeth Stansbury. He built the house, which has since burned, in 1840.

This historic My Lady's Manor farm which was "recognized for its continued identity as a rural and agricultural treasure" by The Manor Conservancy, should do farming, not have "gatherings" for hire nor put a factory a.k.a a brewery on this beautiful agricultural land.

Another reason that a factory should not be allowed on this farm is that the present owners, Mr. And Mrs. Frank put the entire farm into an agricultural conservation easement in 2002. Thus, they agreed to keep the property in preservation which means the land would be used for "agricultural or open space in perpetuity."

Baltimore County paid the Franks \$368,356.80 or \$3990.00 per acre to not do anything commercial on this property. That means that they are not to sell lots to build houses, not to have commercial operations, not to have gatherings for which guests are charged.

Inverness Farm is to be a farm, not a disguise for commercial ventures. Please don't ruin this beau colic area, that we all love for the sake of greed.

Description: My Lady's Manor is, and always has been, a rural or agricultural area, with one village, Monkton. Monkton first developed around a water-powered grist mill; it continued to thrive because of that available source of power and later in the 19th century it became a station on the Baltimore and Susquehanna, later the North Central, Railroad. The 10,000-acre manor itself was established in 1713. Throughout the region, population growth has been very slow through the past two centuries; while houses exist, representing almost every decade in those two centuries, their density seems remarkably unchanged, and remarkably unlike all other regions so close to a metropolitan center, Baltimore. The architecture of this region has always been very traditional, with few attempts at conscious style; indeed, those few attempts are quite conservative. The region abounds in good building stone, so stone has always been a common building material. Clay deposits have allowed brick to be a readily available alternate, frequently employed when a greater degree of sophistication was desired. Of course, the once-boundless forests have made log and frame structures commonplace. Over 60 principal structures, plus numerous important outbuildings associated with them, are included in the district.

Significance: My Lady's Manor is an important area in northern Baltimore and western Harford County whose historical origin dates to 1713 and which has, through the years, remained a relatively isolated agricultural area in which one can see the development of architectural styles from pre-1800 to the present day. This area, because it has been segregated from the influence of industrial development and relatively free of great sociologic change until recently, has not been subjected to the gross intrusions which have destroyed the character of so much of our countryside. In its present state, My Lady's Manor is an area which represents Colonial life, the antebellum years, the Victorian era, and adaptation to modern times without losing all of the color or artifacts of its past.

Belmere is a stucceed brick two and one-half storey gabled roof, three bay house with a two storey gabled roof, four bay rear (north) wing, all (apparently) of concurrent construction. A two bay, frame, two and one-half storey addition on the east (or right) end of the front section completes a nearly symmetrical five bay composition, and it is covered with German sizing. At the rear or north end of the brick rear wing is a frame addition of one long bay, with an external stone fireplace chimney. The west wall of this section is unaccountably thick.

A single chimney rises from each end of the main house, and an interior chimney rises from the middle of the rear wing.

Only the east wall of the rear wing is of expessed brick, the other walls being stuccesa; it is of common bond, with every sixth course headers.

The wood cornice of both front sections is continuous, suggesting that it was adaed uniformly across the principal facade when the addition was made.

The stude hides the support above the front windows, but rear windows and doors have wood lintels with simple, turned corner blocks. Windows are 6/6, with louvred blinds. Sidelights and an eliptically—arched transom surround the principal entrance in the (now) center bay, which was once sheltered by a one bay, one storey portice, now removed. A "Venetian" window in the east gable lights the attic storey of the east addition; it was relocated there from the original east gable. Three dormers — two in the original section and one in the east addition — are on the south front roof slope.

Most interior trim is in situ, including mantels with columns or pilast rs; corner block architraves; the staircase with its moderately-sized turned newel, roundrail of black walnut, rerelled step ends which, with landings, extends clear to the third sterey; paneled doors with a horizontal panel across the top, two vertical panels beneath, another horizontal panel across immediately above the look rail, on finally color the look rail, two more vertical panels; secondary paneled coors with six manualded panels in the usual arrangement; and the Carpenter-type rim lacks.

In the cellar, which is under the front section of the house only, are linteled recesses beneath the fireplaces.

The general plan, form and details of this house, suggest a house of traditional form with simple Greek actailing, characteristic of ca. 1840-1845. The east addition, more or less "completing" the plan, was added very late in the 19th century or early in the 20th, consciously sympathetic with the original

This house is very similar to nearby Bellefield.

#### **DEED OF CONSERVATION EASEMENT**

THIS DEED OF CONSERVATION EASEMENT (this "Easement"), made this \_6 /72 day of \_\_\_\_\_\_, 2002 by and among RAYMOND V. FRANK and SANDRA P. FRANK hereinafter referred to as the "Grantors," and BALTIMORE COUNTY, MARYLAND, a body corporate and politic, to the use of the Department of Environmental Protection and Resource Management (herein after referred to as "DEPRM") on behalf of the Baltimore County Agricultural Land Preservation Advisory Board, hereinafter referred to as the "Grantee."

#### I. RECITALS

- A. Article XI, Section 14-457, of the Baltimore County Code, 1988, as amended, created the Baltimore County Agricultural Land Preservation Program to preserve productive agricultural land; and
- B. By authority of the Agricultural Land Preservation Article, Section 14-458, Baltimore County Code, 1988, as amended, the Grantee may purchase development rights or may accept the donation of development rights to restrict land to agricultural or open space use; and
- C. The Grantors own in fee simple 92.32 acres of certain real property (the "Property") situate, lying and being in the Tenth Election District of Baltimore County, Maryland, and more particularly described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto, which was conveyed to the Grantors by Deed dated May 24, 2001, and recorded among the Land Records of Baltimore County, Maryland in Liber S.M. 15235, folio 712, from Arthur A. Morgan and Erwin Diener, Co-trustees, to Raymond V. Frank and Sandra P. Frank, husband and wife.
- D. The Grantors desire to convey an agricultural preservation easement to the Grantee to restrict the property to agricultural or open space use in perpetuity, in order to conserve and preserve the significant conservation values including: the natural, agricultural, forestry, environmental, scenic, rural, woodland and wetland characteristics of the property, maintain viable resource-based land use and proper management of tillable and wooded areas of the property, and, to the extent hereinafter provided, prevent the use or development of the property for any purpose or in any manner that would conflict with the maintenance of the Property in its open-space condition;

NOW, THEREFORE, THIS DEED OF EASEMENT, WITNESSETH, that for and in consideration of the sum of Three Hundred Sixty-Eight Thousand Three Hundred Fifty-six Dollars (\$368,356.80), which equals \$3,990.00 per acre, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the Grantors for the Grantors and the Grantors' heirs, successors, personal representatives, and assigns, do hereby grant and convey to Baltimore County, Maryland, as Grantee, its successors and assigns, an agricultural preservation easement, in, on, and over the Property, subject to the covenants, conditions, limitations and restrictions herein set forth.

AND the Grantors covenant for the Grantors and the Grantors' heirs, successors, personal representatives, and assigns, with the Grantee, its successors and assigns, to do and refrain from doing upon the property all and any of the various acts hereafter set forth, it being the intention of the parties that said property shall be preserved for the agricultural use and open space use as defined in and in accordance with the provisions of the Article XI, Section 14-457, of the Baltimore County Code, 1988, as amended, and that the covenants, conditions, limitations, and restrictions hereafter set forth are intended to limit the use of the above described land and are deemed to be and shall be construed as covenants running with the land.

#### II. COVENANTS, CONDITIONS, LIMITATIONS, AND RESTRICTIONS

Subject to the reservations hereinafter contained and except as otherwise provided herein, the Grantors, for the Grantors and the Grantors heirs, successors, personal representatives and assigns, covenant and agree as follows:

- A. This easement shall be in perpetuity. The Grantors hereby specifically waive any rights to terminate under Section 14-462 of the Baltimore County Code, 1988, as amended. The property shall not be converted to non-agricultural uses unless that use is consistent with maintaining the natural productivity of the land for future agricultural uses.
- B. Other than farming, silviculture, horticulture, noncommercial hunting and fishing for the benefit of the owners and their guests, forestry and other types of agriculture (collectively, "Agriculture"), industrial, commercial recreational, or commercial activities are prohibited on the property, except for (a) other commercial or educational uses that relate to agriculture such as farm markets and farm festivals subject to Baltimore County zoning laws and regulations and the approval of the Grantee, (b) such activities as can be conducted in existing structures without alteration of the size and external appearance thereof, and for (c) all aspects relating to breeding, stabling, and training of horses as limited by the Baltimore County zoning laws and regulations, as amended from time to time. No approval shall be given if the use is detrimental to the agriculture production or productivity of the property
- C. The Grantors shall manage the property in accordance with sound agricultural soil and water conservation practices using a conservation plan that is developed utilizing the standards and specifications of the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) and approved by the local soil conservation district so as to promote the agricultural capability of the property.

- D. The Grantors shall implement all soil conservation and water quality practices that are contained within a Soil Conservation Plan (the "Plan") approved by the local soil conservation district, made or revised within the last ten (10) years of the date of the application to sell an easement, which lists all soil conservation and water quality problem areas on the Property provided no undue financial burden shall be imposed upon the Grantors. The Plan shall be implemented according to the schedule of implementation contained within the Plan that exists within six (6) months of easement settlement. Revisions to the schedule of implementation may be made as approved by the Board of Supervisors of the local soil conservation district, however, the Plan shall be fully implemented within ten (10) years of the easement settlement date. Exceptions may be considered by the Grantee on a case-by-case basis.
- E. The Grantors shall manage wood lots in accordance with sound forestry practices in accordance with a Forest Stewardship Plan approved by the Maryland Department of Natural Resources, Forest Service that will consider multiple resource objectives and assure protection of soil and water resources.
- F. Signs, billboards or outdoor advertising structures may not be displayed on the property, except that one sign, not exceeding applicable county zoning regulations, may be displayed to state the name of the property and the name and address of the occupant, to advertise an activity permitted above, and to advertise the property for sale or rental.
- G. No dumping of ashes, sawdust, bark, trash, rubbish, or any other material, except that which is for regular agricultural use, shall be permitted on the property.
- H. No other easements including, but not limited to, rights-of-ways to other properties, oil, gas, mineral, power line, microwave towers, forest mitigation, or other similar servitudes may be conveyed, or permitted to be established in, on, under or through the above described Property without the Grantee's express permission.
- I. In case of doubt concerning the appropriateness or permissibility of the use of the property, the Grantors may submit a written request to the Grantee for consideration and approval of the use.
- J. The rights reserved to the Grantors under Article III to request one lot exclusion shall be deemed a personal covenant only and one that is not intended to run with the land and may be exercised only by the conveyor of the easement so long as he/she shall own the property.
- K. The Grantors reserve all other rights, privileges, and incidents to the ownership of the fee simple estate in the above described property not hereby conveyed or otherwise limited by the covenants, conditions, limitations, and restrictions herein set forth.
- L. This instrument shall not be deemed to provide for or permit public access to any privately owned land.

M. The Grantors hereby grant to the Grantee all remaining development rights that are now or hereafter allocated to, implied, reserved or inherent in the property. All such granted development rights which may now or hereafter become or represent a transferable density right attributable to the Property are hereby assigned and transferred to the County and may be sold by it as a participant in any transferable density rights program for use outside of the Agricultural Preservation Areas, as defined in the 2010 Baltimore County Master Plan, as amended, but may not be used or transferred to any portion of the property as it now or hereafter may be bounded or described, or to any other protected property adjacent thereto nor used for the purpose of calculating permissible lot yield of the property.

#### III. SUBDIVISION, CONSTRUCTION AND IMPROVEMENTS

A. Subdivision for residential and commercial purposes is not permitted, however, upon written application to DEPRM, the conveyor of the easement shall retain as a personal covenant only and one that is not intended to run with the land the right to request the exclusion of lots for the purpose of construction of residential dwellings for either the conveyor of the easement or the children of the conveyor of the easement as limited below:

- 1. The conveyor of the easement who has owned the property for ten (10) years prior to the release may hereafter submit a written request to the Grantee to subdivide one lot for the use of the Conveyor. Satisfactory proof of the child's intent to build and reside on the newly created lots or to subdivide an existing dwelling, and documentation that the lot will have minimal impact on the agricultural and scenic characteristics of the property shall be submitted as well as a signed affidavit that the conveyor or the child or owner will reside in the dwelling for a minimum of three years.
- 2. The size of the lot shall be one acre or if necessary to meet Baltimore County requirements for well and septic or access and right-of-way requirements, the lot may be up to a maximum of two acres in size.
- 3. The location of the lot shall be subject to approval of the Grantee and shall not be located on Class I, II, or III soils as indicated in the Baltimore County Soil Survey unless no other location is suitable and locating a lot on these soils will not significantly diminish the agricultural resources and value of the property. The Grantee shall have the right to review and reject any proposed lot location that would have a significant negative impact on the scenic view from Monkton Road. The Grantee shall make a final determination of what constitutes "significant negative impact," however, the Grantee may not reject any reasonable location and must state its reasons for any rejection in writing to the Grantors.

- 4. The Grantors shall reimburse the County for the acreage released for the lot at the price per acre set forth on the first page of this Deed of Conservation Easement.
- 5. As used herein, "child" or "children" shall be construed in accordance with Section 14-461(b)(1)g. of the Baltimore County Code (Revised May 17, 1993). "Conveyor" shall be deemed to be those individuals listed on the Deed of Conservation Easement at the time of settlement. In the case of a partnership or corporation, the conveyor shall be limited to those individuals listed as owners on the legal document establishing the entity as indicated in Appendix C.
- B. The Grantors have one tenant building on the Property. In the event that the tenant building is to be replaced, approval of the Grantee must be obtained. The tenant house shall be used for housing for individuals involved in the operation of a commercial farm. Should the nature of the farming operation change over time, the Grantors may apply to the Grantee for approval to convert the tenant house to another residential use as permitted by Baltimore County Zoning to remain compliant with the terms of the easement. If approved, restrictions on the requirement that such a house may not be subdivided or conveyed independent of the original parcel will remain in force and no additional tenant houses are permitted.
- C. The Grantee acknowledges the existence of one main dwelling that exists on the property. This dwelling may not be subdivided from the easement. The Grantors may if necessary replace it with a new building utilizing the same location. If the Grantor wish to replace the dwelling with a new house elsewhere on the Property, the location is subject to the approval of the Grantee.
- D. 'The Grantors may construct accessory structures designed, constructed and utilized for the purpose of serving the existing residence (for example, garage, well house, and swimming pool), so long as such structures have a footprint of six hundred (600) square feet or less with a maximum height of 15 feet and the Grantors have obtained the approval of the Grantee for the location.
- E. The Grantors may construct, restore, and enlarge accessory and principal structures designed, constructed and utilized for agricultural purposes so long as the structures do not significantly negatively diminish the scenic view from Monkton Road and so long as the total amount of impervious surfaces do not exceed ten (10%) percent of the Property.
- F. Subdivision shall be limited to agricultural purposes or minor lot line adjustments that do not result in any net loss to the agricultural resources or agricultural capability. Subdivision for agricultural purposes shall be only for the purpose of enhancing the commercial agricultural production of the property. It shall not be granted for residential purposes. Approval is at the discretion of the Grantee and will require a finding that the agricultural subdivision will enhance the commercial agricultural production of the Property.

#### IV. RIGHTS, INSPECTION, AND ENFORCEMENT

DEPRM or any other department, agency or other public body or person duly authorized by the County Executive, shall have the right with a minimum 14 day notice to the landowner to enter on the above-described Property from time to time for the sole purpose of inspection and enforcement of the easements, covenants, conditions, limitations, and restrictions herein contained. However, the Grantee shall not have the right to inspect the interior of any residential dwelling or building designated as a residential dwelling on the Property. Upon any breach of the terms of this easement by the Grantors, the Grantee may, exercise any or all of the following remedies:

- Institute suits to enjoin any breach or enforce any covenant by ex parte, temporary, and/or permanent injunction either prohibitive or mandatory; and
- 2. require that the property be restored promptly to the condition required by this Deed of Conservation Easement.

The Grantee's remedies shall be cumulative and shall be in addition to any other rights and remedies available to the Grantee at law or equity. If the Grantors are found to have breached any of the terms under this easement, the Grantors shall reimburse the Grantee for any costs or expenses incurred by the Grantee, including court costs and reasonable attorney's fees.

#### ARTICLE V. EXHIBITS

The following exhibits are hereby made a part of this easement:

- A. Exhibit A: Boundary Description and Property Reference is attached hereto and made a part hereof. Exhibit A consists of one (1) page.
- B. Exhibit B: Inventory of Existing Structures and Signs is attached hereto and made a part hereof. Exhibit B consists of one (1) page.
- C. Exhibit C: Annotated aerial photograph of the Property With Labels is kept on file at the principal office of DEPRM and is fully and completely incorporated into this Easement as though attached hereto and made a part of this Deed of Conservation Easement.

### VI. MISCELLANEOUS

- A. The Grantors further covenant that the Grantors have not done or suffered to be done any act, matter, or thing whatsoever, to encumber the Property hereby conveyed; that the Grantors will warrant specially the property interest hereby conveyed; and the Grantors will execute such further assurances of the same as may be required.
- B. As used herein the singular form of a word includes both the singular and plural, the plural form of a word includes both plural and singular, and reference the words of certain gender includes reference to all genders.
- C. No determination by any court, governmental body, or otherwise that any provision of this Deed of Conservation Easement is invalid or unenforceable in any instance shall affect the validity or enforceability of (a) any other such provision or (b) such provision in any circumstance not controlled by such determination. Each such provision shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent allowed by, and shall be construed wherever possible as being consistent with, applicable law.
- D. The Grantors shall notify the Grantee in writing of the names and addresses of any party to whom the property, or any part thereof, is to be granted, conveyed or otherwise transferred at or prior to the time said transfer is consummated. The Grantors further agree to make specific reference to this easement in a separate paragraph of any subsequent deed or other legal instrument by which any interest in the property is granted, conveyed or otherwise transferred. The Grantors shall provide a copy of this easement to all subsequent grantees of the fee simple interest of any part or all of this property.
- E. In the event that any applicable State or federal law imposes affirmative obligations on owners of land which, if complied with by the Grantors would be a violation of a term of this easement, the Grantors shall: (i) if said law requires a specific act without any discretion on the part of the Grantors, comply with said law and give the Grantee written notice of the Grantors compliance as soon as reasonably possible, but in no event more than thirty (30) days from the time the Grantors begin to comply; or (ii) if said law leaves to the Grantors discretion how to comply with said law, use the method most protective of the agricultural values of the Property.
- F. Any notices by the Grantors to the Grantee pursuant to any term hereof shall be sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed to: Baltimore County, Maryland, Department of Environmental Protection and Resource Management, 401 Bosley Avenue, Towson, MD 21204 and to such other address as the Grantee may establish in writing on notification to the Grantors.

- G. In any case where the terms of this easement require the approval of the Grantee, such approval shall be requested by written notice to the Grantee. Such approval shall be deemed to have been given unless within sixty (60) days after receipt of notice the Grantee mails notice to the Grantors of disapproval and the reason. The Grantee will take into account the terms and purposes of this Deed of Conservation Easement in determining whether to give such approval, but its decision shall be final and in its sole and absolute discretion.
- H. The Grantee agrees to hold this easement exclusively for conservation purposes, as defined in Section 170(h)(4)(A) of the Internal Revenue Code.
- I. The Grantors and the Grantee agree that all mortgages and deeds of trust affecting the Property are subordinate to the rights of the Grantee under this easement. The Grantor have provided a copy of this Deed of Conservation Easement to all mortgagees, and trustees and beneficiaries of deeds of trust affecting the Property as of the date of this easement, and each mortgagee, trustee and beneficiary has subordinated the mortgage or deed of trust to this Easement, by signing a subordination agreement which shall be recorded in the Land Records at the time of recording of this Deed of Conservation Easement.
- J. This Deed of Conservation Easement shall be construed pursuant to the purposes set forth herein and the law of the State of Maryland, including the purposes of the statutes creating and governing the Maryland Agricultural Land Preservation Foundation, and the purposes of Section 2-118 of the Real Property Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland.
- K. The terms of this Deed of Conservation Easement shall be in addition to any local, State or federal laws imposing restrictions to the Property and any real estate interests imposing restrictions to the property.
- L. This instrument sets forth the entire agreement of the parties with respect to the easement and supersedes all prior discussions, negotiations, understandings or agreements relating to the Deed of Conservation Easement. If any term is found to be invalid, the remainder of the terms of this Deed of Conservation Easement, and the application of such term to persons or circumstances other than those as to which it is found to be invalid, shall not be affected thereby.
- M. The terms "Grantors" and "Grantee" wherever used herein, and any pronouns used in place thereof, shall include, respectively, the above-named Grantors and heirs, personal representatives, successors, and assigns and the above-named Grantee and their successors and assigns.

- N. The Grantee shall record this Deed of Conservation Easement in a timely fashion among the Land Records of Baltimore County, Maryland, and the Grantee may re-record it at any time as may be required to preserve its rights hereunder.
- O. Except to the extent provided for by State or local law, nothing herein contained shall relieve the Grantors of the obligation to pay taxes in connection with the ownership or transfer of the Property.

Your Honor, I hope you will forgive my evident discomfort. I have never even seen a hearing like this one on TV, and my last public speaking was some two decades ago, teaching graduate students: I was nervous then, and I am uneasy now.

Your Honor, I am here to try to convince you to deny this *special exception* to the zoning code. Such *special exceptions* should be justified, I believe, by their contribution to the community, and by their lack of destructive consequences. Please accept this packet of information relevant to my argument.

As the map in the packet shows, while the petitioner's address is on Monkton Road, the property is also bordered by Markoe and J.M. Pearce Roads. You should know that, while a few parcels in this immediate neighborhood, like that of the petitioner, are in the 50-100 acre range, my property on Markoe Road is but 10 acres, and most of my neighbors' are in that range or less. Thus, we live in a predominantly residential neighborhood. Women jog past my home on Markoe Road pushing baby carriages, and adults and children ride their bikes past.

My wife and I moved to My Lady's Manor about a quarter century ago to escape the stink, noise, traffic, and pollution of the city. We reveled in the pastoral paradise we had found, where hours can go by without a single car, and the loudest noise in the evenings tends to be the peeper frogs in the pond. And there was a bonus: the historic property at 2800 Monkton Road, which was nominated for the National Register of Historic Places

[http://msa.maryland.gov/megafile/msa/stagsere/se1/se5/003000/003300/003347/pdf/msa\_se5\_3347.pdf], with race horses grazing just across the street. This was what we had scrimped and saved for!

This bucolic dream was interrupted a few years ago, when the petitioner for this *special exception* began storing large equipment on the property, bringing incessant BEEP-BEEP-ing as the vehicles backed up. Someone filed a complaint, and that practice ended.

Then - I believe it was in about 2013 - the petitioner for this *special exception* had a large party with amplified music at the barn mentioned in the petition, nearly directly across the street from us. The noise was enough to disrupt our sleep, but we were tolerant, as it was the wedding of our next door neighbor. But then there were other weddings. A complaint assured that the amplified music would end by 11:00 p.m., a welcome improvement; however, the weddings became more and more frequent, until they were almost every weekend from May to September.

A complaint to Arnold Jablon, Director of Permits, Approvals and Inspections, got an investigation by a Mr. Cohen, who felt constrained to credit the story that all of these weddings were just friends and family. An internet search provided Mr. Jablon enough data to render this "friends and family" story implausible, and today's petitioner was enjoined to cease and desist, which was done, largely, albeit not entirely [https://citizenaccess.baltimorecountymd.gov/CitizenAccess/Cap/CapDetail.aspx? Module=Enforcement&TabName=Enforcement&capID1=16CAP&capID2=00000&capID3=00IM8&agencyCode=BALTCO &IsToShowInspection=]. Much of that email exchange with Mr. Jablon is in the packet I gave you earlier.

Now comes this proposed brewery, which will undermine the core features of the neighborhood for which my wife and I, and many of our neighbors, moved here, bringing stink, noise, traffic, and pollution, thus putting at risk the health, safety, and general welfare of our community, and undermining the value of our properties.

We know six things at least about this proposed brewery.

- (1) The brewery will be located in a barn the access to which is generally from Markoe Road, a small, residential road supporting pedestrian activities.
- (2) The brewery will be allowed under the law, Section 101.1, to produce up to 15,000 barrels of beer a year. At 31 gallons

per barrel, and about 10 12-oz bottles per gallon, that's about 14,900 6-packs a week. That's a lot of beer for a small residential area.

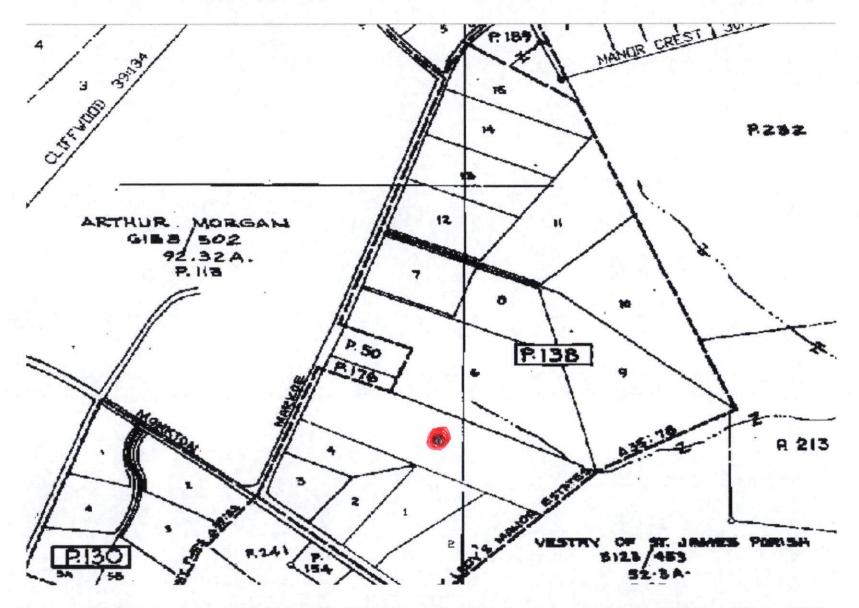
- So, Your Honor, you are being asked to make a special exception that will permit (a) a rather high volume of people to drive to and from that barn weekly, and/or (b) a rather high volume of trucks to be driven to and from that barn weekly, past the which barn children ride their bikes and women jog with their babies on a rural residential street.
- (3) The brewery will emit an uncomfortable, noxious odor, one that has been compared to a "sewer," a "skunk smell," and to "rotten eggs," all quite inappropriate for this primarily residential neighborhood, and guaranteed to reduce the value of local properties [http://www.thedenverchannel.com/news/brewery-blamed-for-obnoxious-odor]. And, as it happens, I and many of my neighbors, are located to the east and thus generally downwind of the barn in question, as are the church and school at St. James. Indeed, the school's property is contiguous with mine, and we can hear children playing outside there virtually all year long.
- (4) The brewery will produce liquid waste, which will threaten to foul wells in the neighborhood, as well as the extremely delicate watershed ecology of the area, and thus is also guaranteed to reduce the value of local properties. Years ago, the county put a pipe under Markoe Road to funnel storm drainage from the barn area to a channel, which leads eventually to the Little Gunpowder River, and thence to the Bay. Surely, wells and wetlands are something that zoning should be used to protect. Has there been an environmental impact study presented to Your Honor?
- (5) The brewery will involve traffic, with trucks coming and going to deliver supplies and take the product to market. There will be many parking spaces, for customers, and for retail distribution and "temporary promotional" events, all guaranteed to increase the traffic on Markoe Road, and thus to reduce the value of local properties.

Parenthetically, I will ask here what exactly is the meaning of "temporary event," other than a redundancy; for, are not all events temporary, in that they have a beginning and an end? Or, is this just an excuse to restart the aforementioned weddings?

(6) The brewery appears to violate the terms of the deed to 2800 Monkton Road, which I'm told states that the "property shall not be converted to non-agricultural uses unless that use is consistent with maintaining the agricultural productivity of the land for future agricultural uses." A beer store? A bar? A beer tasting zone like that in the Clipper Mill area of Baltimore? Really? Your Honor, do you believe that the zoning regulations are supposed to put alcoholic beverage outlets in rural residential areas?

In sum, your honor, this *special exception*, if *you* grant it, will bring the stink, noise, traffic, and pollution my wife and I, and most of our neighbors, came here to avoid. I rather suspect that some will welcome the addition of a smelly, loud, high traffic, and polluting beer factory, store, and party venue to our bucolic midst. For my wife and I, however, and I believe for the great majority of our neighbors, such an enterprise will undermine the health, safety, and general welfare of our community. It will distort and pervert the rural character of My Lady's Manor that the zoning was designed to maintain. Indeed, for the great majority of my neighbors in My Lady's Manor, this *special exception*, if *you* grant it, will despoil the very reasons we all chose to live there.

I urge you, Your Honor, to reject the proposed *special exception*. Please, do not destroy the rural character the Monkton zoning was designed to preserve. It is valuable, fragile, and well worth protecting.

Dear Mr. Jablon,

We have been trying for some time to get some relief from the behavior of neighbors at 2800 Monkton Road. We have corresponded with Robyn. C. Clark, who assigned the issue to Inspector Cohen. Still, the problem continues.

They stage large (attended by 50 or more vehicles generally, including a large bus last night) and loud (greater than 65 db *on our* property) events in their barn, which is almost directly across Markoe Road from our home. Mr. Cohen reported speaking with the residents, Mr. and Mrs. Frank, who reported that the events – generally large weddings – that took place on their property were for "family and friends," and not commercial enterprises. That account strains credulity, given the number and size of the events, yet Mr. Cohen seemed bent on simply taking the Franks' word for it.

We advised Mr. Cohen of events on 5/10/14, 5/24/14, 6/6/14, 10/4/14, 10/11/14, and five others in the Spring and Summer of 2015, including extremely large events on 5/16/15, 7/11/15, and 7/26/15.

Since we last corresponded with Mr. Cohen, there have been the following events, with some of the details we have discovered:

9/5/15, a wedding of people named Justin and Tiffany, event-planned & catered by Zeffert & Gold Catering;

9/19/15, a large undetermined party;

9/26/15, a wedding of people named Higgins and Carney;

10/3/15, a large undetermined event;

10/10/15, a large wedding catered by Linwoods;

5/21/16, the latest, last night, a wedding of people named Hopp and Reddish.

The Franks appear to have a remarkable number and variety of family and friends!

The Agri-Tourism Bill, you may recall, was defeated. It is unseemly that the County Government continues to allow these private landowners, who lack commercial zoning and do not pay commercial taxes, to hold the exact same sort of events.

We are writing to request action to have this outrageous behavior addressed by the appropriate authorities.

I am writing to complain about the loud, commercial enterprise my neighbors have begun. They have begun hosting large, catered, and very loud parties, attended by fifty (50) or more vehicles, on weekends, mostly in the evenings.

Their property is located on the north side of Monkton Road, at the corner of Markoe Road. The address is 2800 Monkton road, and they use their barn, which is across Markoe Road from our own property at 16109 Markoe Road. The volume is enough to keep us awake, suggesting that the level of noise is well above 65 decibels. I have no idea what impact all of these people are having on this watershed property.

So far, they have had these parties on May 10, May 24, June 6, October 4, and October 11, 2014, and five more so far this Spring & Summer, including an extremely large event on May 16, 2015, another on July 11, 2015, yet another on July 26, 2015, and the most recent on September 5; the internet shows a wedding for October 10.

We understand that the agri-tourism bill did NOT pass, yet what we are witnessing appears to fall under that rubric. With our agricultural zoning, we are used to the sounds of frogs, cows, horses, etc. I do not think the sounds of rock and roll bands belong here.

This is hardly the first letter we have submitted on this issue, and we would appreciate being advised why there seems to be no response to any of them. If we are addressing this concern to the wrong person, please advise whom we should address.

Thanks for stopping by the other day. I have thought a great deal about a couple of your comments at that time. I must be missing something, because they have me rather confused, so I am writing for the sort of clarification you have been so good at in the past.

As I recall it, you said that this was a "civil matter" between the Yaffes and the Franks, and so we would have to be prepared to testify with proof that the Franks are staging these huge parties for profit, rather than as a kindly gesture toward family and friends. You also stated, several times as I recall it, that you hoped that we would not report to you further instances of the Franks hosting major parties.

I confess that I find myself reverting again and again to another view of the matter. My picture is that my representatives, for whom I voted, and whose salaries I pay with my taxes, passed zoning laws and enacted regulations to put those laws into effect, in part in order to protect the property values of me and my neighbors. They then hired and instructed county officers, such as Mr. Jablon and yourself, to enforce those laws and regulations, again in order to protect the property values of me and my fellow citizens.

I presented Mr. Jablon with enough evidence that he saw fit to arrange to have Code Enforcement issue a correction notice to stop immediately and to say that, "If they continue, a citation will be issued." I assume that is a citation for violating the law. Now, when I receive a citation for exceeding the speed limit, that is not a civil matter: I am hauled into court to confront an officer of the county charged with enforcing the law (or I can often elect to simply pay a fine). And if I am repeatedly cited, I lose my license to operate a motor vehicle.

So I am puzzled, Mr. Cohen, regarding (1) why is this a civil matter, (2) why will we have to provide proof of the Frank's business arrangements, and (3) why did you so fervently hope that we would not report another party? Presumably, you already have proof that something unlawful is occurring, which I imagine is why a correction notice was issued, by you yourself as I understand it, and why a citation would be issued if they continue. And, I would assume, it is the responsibility of the government – you and/or your colleagues - to produce proof when the government's laws and regulations are violated, if the matter comes to court. The government would do this, I would assume, by subpoening the Frank's records, and the testimony of some of those many whose weddings were celebrated at the Frank's, in violation of county law. And, it seems to me, you would indeed hope that I would report another violation, as it is a civic duty to assist the authorities in enforcing the law.

Clearly, as I said above, I must be missing something, and I look forward to your clarification, so that I might come to understand the matter as you do.

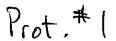

Dear Judge Beverungen,

The Sparks-Glencoe Community Planning Council opposes the grant of a special exception for the creation of a brewery at 2800 Monkton Road in Monkton. There are three primary reasons for this position.

First, the request for this special exception comes from individuals with a documented history of non-compliance with zoning regulations. There has, or will be, testimony about the nature and extent of these past violations, but no one can deny that they are considerable. This means that there is reason to believe that they will not abide by any restrictions that are imposed in conjunction with the special exception. Further, our experience over the years with Code Enforcement demonstrates, sadly, that that process is inadequate. Code Enforcement is over burdened with responsibilities, and much of the actual evidence collection and impetus is delegated to the neighborhood.

Secondly, a brewery should not be permitted on this property because of the nature of breweries. They are a notoriously obnoxious commercial activity, generating noise, traffic, and most of all particularly distasteful aromas. The surrounding property owners do not deserve to be subjected to this type of significant neighborhood disruption.

Finally, if the special exception is granted, it is requested that the public events be limited to four beer tastings per year. Many of those who opposed the special exception believe that the brewery is something of a subterfuge to enable the owners to resume the private events that were shut down and precluded in the past. The limitation to four events would enable authentic beer tasting but deny the ability to hold events which are not truly related to the brewery activity, such as weddings or private parties. By suggestion of this limitation, we do not want to be understood as implicitly endorsing or acquiescing in the special exception request.

The Department of Planning has reviewed the petition for special exception to use the property for a Brewery, Class 8, including accessory retail and wholesale distribution of beer produced on the premises and temporary promotional events, such as beer tasting or public gatherings associated with the brewery.

A site visit was conducted on July 5, 2017.

This property is located within the White Hall and Monkton Agricultural Priority Preservation Area (Master Plan 2020, pg. 40). The property was placed under a conservation easement through the Baltimore County Agricultural Preservation Program in June 2002. The Baltimore County Agricultural Land Preservation Advisory Board approved the proposed use to be farm related in accordance with the Deed of Conservation Easement Article II B. and the Baltimore County Code §24-3-108. The petitioners have constructed trellises and planted hops to be used in the processing of their beer as seen on the plan. The property is also located within the National Register Historic District of My Lady's Manor.

Monkton Road is a Baltimore County Scenic Route and a Maryland State Highway Administration Scenic Route (Horses and Hounds). All components of the proposed special exception use are existing and are substantially removed from the scenic route such that no adverse impact to the view is created.

The Department has no objection to granting the petitioned zoning request conditioned upon the following:

- . Submit for approval a landscape and lighting plan to the Baltimore County Landscape Architect prior to occupancy permit approval.
- Provide a refuse dumpster and indicate the location on the landscape plan. Said plan will show how the proposed dumpster area will be screened from view from the public right of way using plantings and an enclosure composed of materials similar to that of the existing structures.
- Any signage shall conform to BCZR § 450 and the aforesaid Deed of Conservation Easement. Other than diminutive directional signage, the Department does not support signage that will be visible from the scenic route.

 $\underline{X}$  The Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability offers the following comments on the above-referenced zoning item:

### Comments

- 1. A water usage letter must be submitted to Ground Water Management (GWM) detailing the size and scope of the proposed brewery operation along with an estimate of the volume (Design Flow) and strength of the wastewater that will be generated from the brewery operation and the "promotional events." See page 7 of the GWM Policy Manual for further information. It is advised that the owner/operator contact Mike Eisner at the Maryland Department of the Environment, Wastewater Permits Division (410-537-3771) about the possibility of land applying brewery wastewater through a Farm Plan. Depending on the volume and strength of waste to be disposed through an onsite sewage disposal system (OSDS), the owner may be required to hire an OSDS design consultant to propose an appropriate system.
- An application for Soil Percolation Testing must be submitted to Baltimore County indicating the proposed sewage disposal area that will be sufficient to support the approved Design Flow for 300% design. See Perc Test Checklist for plan requirements.
- 3. Existing and proposed wells must be shown on the plan and meet current regulatory setback requirements and construction standards. It must be demonstrated that the proposed well to be used for the brewery has adequate yield and water quality to support the proposed use. Ultimately, the water supply for the brewery will be designated as a transient noncommunity water supply and will be FILING.

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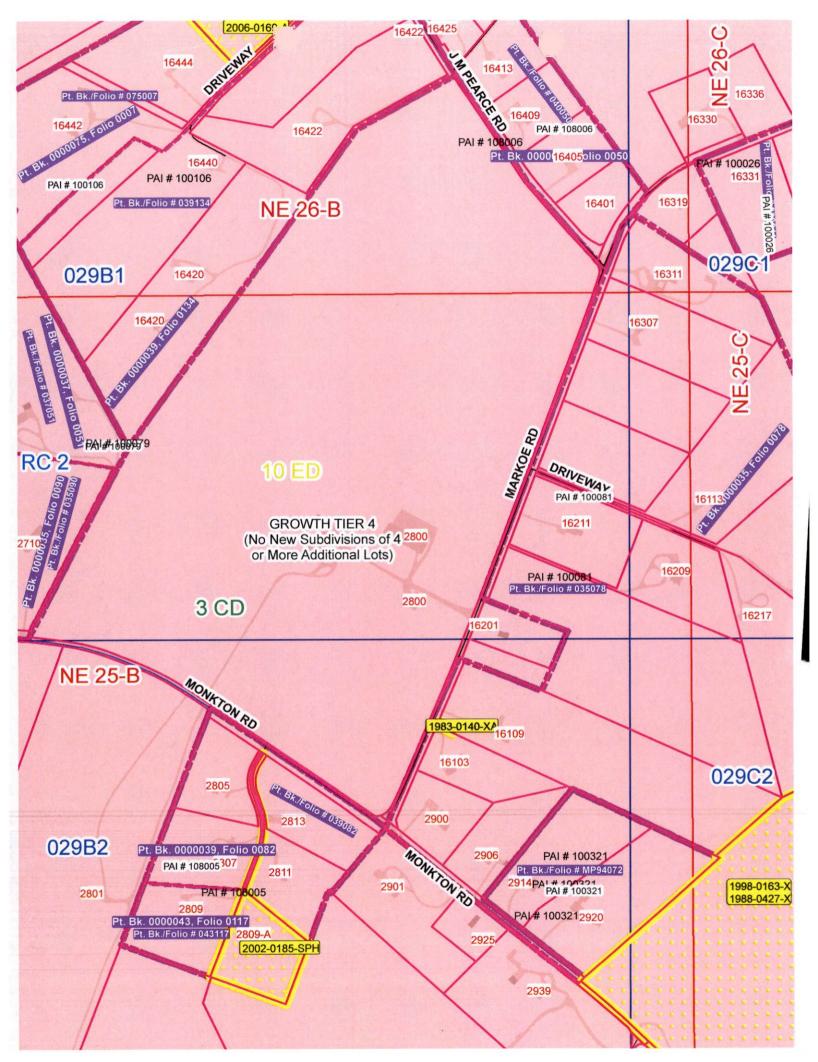

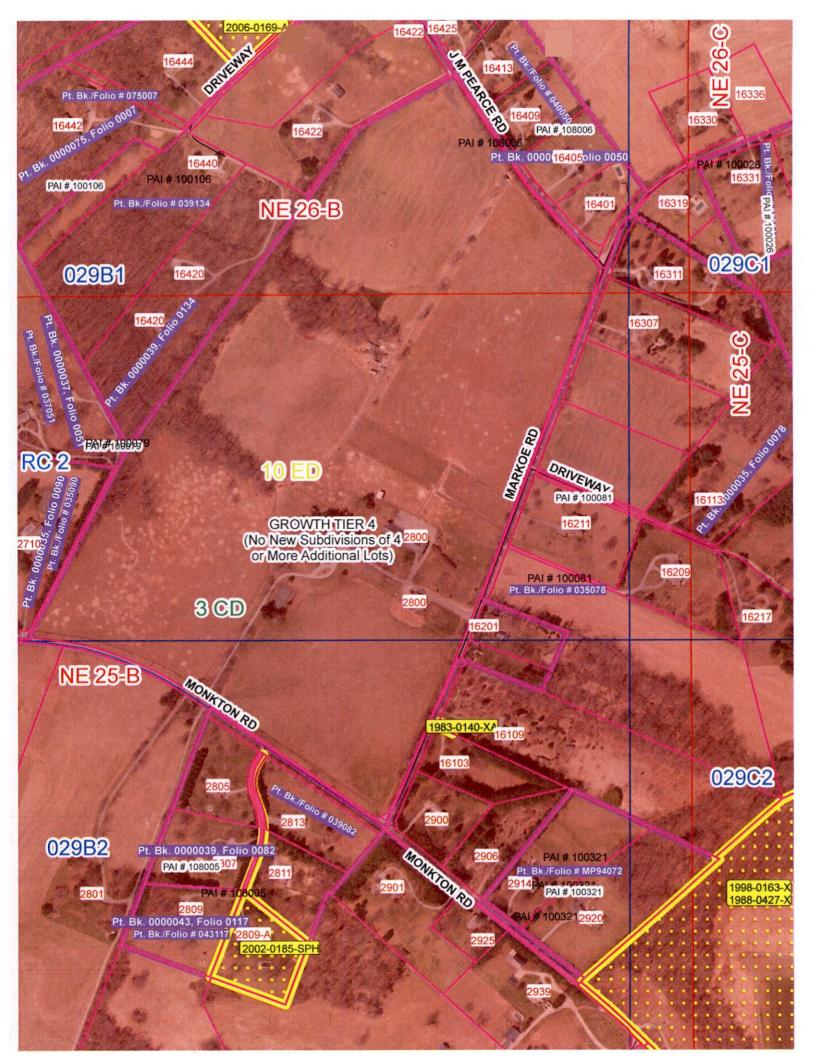

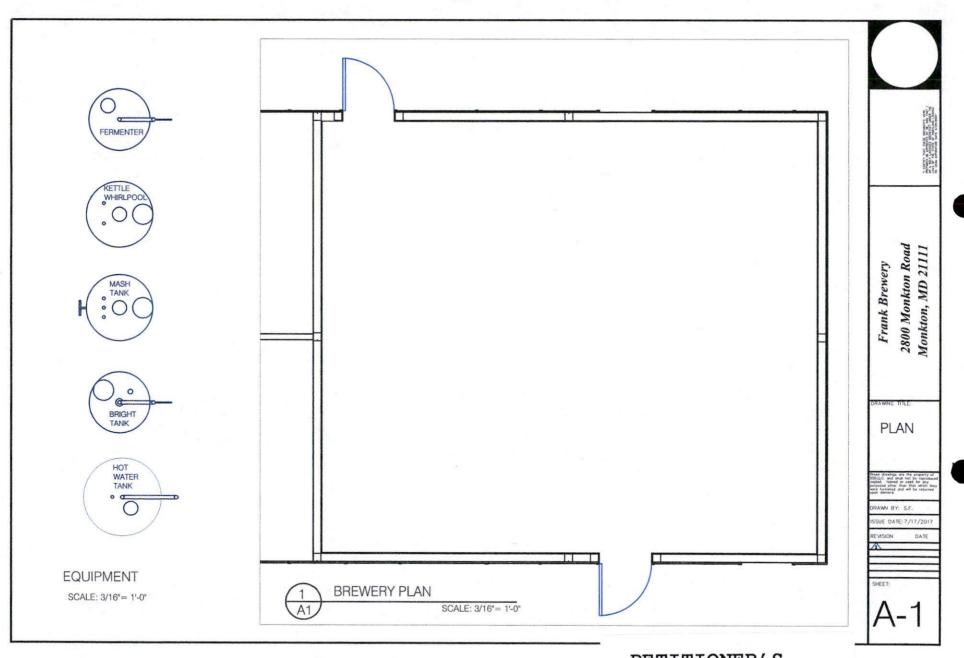
