OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for consideration of Petitions for Special Hearing and Special Exception filed on behalf of Baltimore County Game & Fish Protective Assoc. of Glen Arm, legal owner ("Petitioner"). The Special Hearing was filed pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R") to approve the non-conforming use of the subject property as a community building or other civic, social, recreational or educational use in a DR 2 & DR 1 NC zone. A Petition for Special Exception was filed to allow a community building or other civic, social, recreational or educational use in a DR 2 & DR 1 NC zone.

Numerous club members attended the public hearing in support of the requests. Timothy M. Kotroco, Esq. represented the Petitioner. There were no protestants or interested citizens in attendance. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations. No substantive Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were received from any of the reviewing county agencies.

The subject property is approximately 44.8 acres in size and is split-zoned DR 2 & DR 1 NC. Petitioner acquired this property in 1941, and since that time it has engaged in hunting, fishing and similar activities on this parcel. Petitioner operates in conjunction with the Maryland Department of Natural Resources and offers hunter safety, firearms safety and similar training ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING

SPECIAL EXCEPTION

Under Maryland law, a special exception use enjoys a presumption that it is in the interest of the general welfare, and therefore, valid. *Schultz v. Pritts*, 291 Md. 1 (1981). The *Schultz* standard was revisited in *Attar v. DMS Tollgate*, *LLC*, 451 Md. 272 (2017), where the court of appeals discussed the nature of the evidentiary presumption in special exception cases. The court again emphasized a special exception is properly denied only when there are facts and circumstances showing that the adverse impacts of the use at the particular location in question would be above and beyond those inherently associated with the special exception use.

John Motsco, a professional engineer accepted as an expert, testified via proffer he prepared the site plan and visited the property. He described the various buildings on the site which include a single family dwelling used by a property caretaker and a large meeting or assembly building used for club functions. He also identified the areas shown on the plan where firearm and archery activities take place, and he emphasized that these areas are surrounded by mature trees and forest which provides a buffer for the residential communities in the general area. He opined Petitioner satisfied the requirements set forth at B.C.Z.R. §502.1.

Rob Burkindine also testified via proffer on behalf of the Club. He explained the club has approximately 625 members at the present time, and he also described the history of this organization, which began in 1936. He also described the many activities which take place at the site, and noted the club is recognized by the IRS as a non-profit entity.

Based on this testimony, and considering these activities have been conducted at the site for over 75 years without complaint, I believe Petitioner easily satisfies the requirements for special exception relief and the petition will therefore be granted ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING



THIS IS TO CERTIFY:

FIRST: That we, the subscribers, John Frederick, whose post office address is 940 Patterson Park Avenue, Baltimore City, Maryland; John B. Dempsey, whose post office address is Chase, Baltimore County, Maryland; Harry T. Edel, whose post office address is Middle River, Baltimore County, Maryland; Daniel H. Sparr, whose post office address is 3327 Ravenwood Avenue, Baltimore City, Maryland; and Gerard P. Gassinger, whose post office address is 1766 North Gay Street, Baltimore City, Maryland; all being of full legal age, do under and by virtue of the general laws of the State of Maryland authorizing the formation of corporations, associate ourselves with the intention of forming a corporation.

SECOND: The name of the corporation (which is here-inafter called "Corporation") is:

"BALTIMORE COUNTY GAME AND FISH PROTECTIVE ASSOCIATION, INC."

THIRD: The purposes for which the corporation is formed and the objects to be promoted by it are as follows:

- (a) To procure the enactment of suitable laws for the protection and preservation of game and fish in Maryland; to promote the vigorous enforcement of such laws and to foster and increase the game and fish supply.
- (b) To maintain the various and usual facilities of a social club for the use of persons who desire to cooperate in

- (d) To purchase, lease, sell or acquire by gift, devise or legacy any real, personal or mixed property suitable or convenient for any of the purposes of the Corporation, and to hold, own, use, sell or dispose of the same, or to mortgage or encumber the whole or any part of such property to such extent as the Corporation may desire, and generally to do other and singular such matters and things as may be necessary and desirable to carry out the purposes and objects of the Corporation, and to sell, lease or otherwise dispose of any such property, real, personal or mixed.
- (e) To borrow or raise money for any of the purposes of the Corporation and to issue bonds, debentures, notes, or other obligations of any nature and in any manner permitted by law, for the money so borrowed, or in payment of any property so purchased and to secure the payment thereof and all interest thereon by mortgage, bond or pledge, upon the whole or any part of the property, and to sell, pledge, discount or otherwise dispose of bonds, notes, debentures, or other obligations for carrying out any of the purposes of the Corporation.

FOREWORD

The State of Maryland has for many years enjoyed an honored place in the thoughts of sportsmen the country over. As they turn the pages of memory, they live again the happy days spent with dog and gun tramping the broad fields and salt marshes of this state so abundant in its profusion of wild game. They let their thoughts stray ever and again to the tinkle of rippling streams and the play of light and shadow on the surface of some new found pool as yet untried with fly or spoon. The smash of the Trout, the scrappy fight of the Blue fish, the heavy surge of the Striped Bass will live forever in their dreams.

Few localities present such wealth of wild life, such opportunities for sportsmen afield and on the water Baltimore County is unique in its location in this paradise. It surrounds the metropolitan area of the City of Baltimore. Many of its best hunting and fishing areas are most accessible to the majority of the population of the State.

Its roads and by-paths, which are good and afford splendid routes to its more remote sections, together with its easily hunted fields, offer perfect conditions to the sportsman. Of course it is natural that conditions, so ideal, have resulted in over-gunned areas and a consequent scarcity of game. Such areas are those, which lie close to the thickly populated sections.

A group of prominent Baltimore County sportsmen, realizing the serious condition exiting and the necessity for intelligent handling of this condition, conceived the idea of a sportsman's organization claiming for its membership men from all classes, the only requirement being a love and understanding of the great outdoors and the desire to improve this condition through education, conservation, restocking and legislation. Contacting other interested sportsmen, an organization following these principles, was formed and incorporated as the:

BALTIMORE COUNTY GAME AND FISH PROTECTIVE ASSOCIATION in the year 1936.

BYLAWS April 2, 2014

ARTICLE I NAME

SECTION 1 The name of the Association shall be:

Baltimore County Game and Fish Protective Association, Inc.

ARTICLE II OBJECTS

SECTION 1 This Association is organized to procure the enactment of suitable laws for the protection and preservation of game, fish, forests and waters within the State of Maryland and for the vigorous enforcement of such laws, and to carry out all phases of conservation, such as, education, legislation, propagation of game and fish and any other activities that may come within the true interpretation of conservation of the natural resources and wild life and shall engage in activities tending to educate and create an interest in conservation.

SECTION 2 In keeping with the objects of this Association and as a means of continuing an active program in conservation and wherein, it is realized that the population growth of Baltimore County and the metropolitan area of Baltimore City may seriously effect such a program, this Association will therefore maintain a Real Estate Acquisition Fund. The fund shall be composed and regulate in the following manner:

- a) The fund shall apply only to the acquiring of real estate beyond or separate from existing boundaries of the Baltimore County Game and Fish Protective Association.
- b) The financial growth of this fund shall be by taking a maximum of 20% of the net profit from each money making affair and each money making committee at such time as these moneys are turned into the treasury
- c) The Real Estate Acquisition Fund shall be kept under a separate accounting control.
- d) To withdraw money front the Real Estate Acquisition Fund, there must be a three-quarter-majority vote of Officers and Members of the Board of Directors at a Meeting called expressly for this purpose.
- e) To further enhance this fund, it shall be invested so as to gain the maximum benefit possible. A committee consisting of the President, one member from the Board of Directors and one member from the General Body shall meet once a year within thirty (30) days of the installation of Officers to determine the amount and the manner in which the fund will be invested. They will be charged with the responsibility to invest at no risk to the fund. The decision of this committee shall be conveyed to the Treasurer within five (5) days of that decision, at which time the Treasurer will report to both the General Body and the Board of Directors of the compliance with this recommendation at both the succeeding Meetings (Board and General). The two members of this committee shall serve at the pleasure of the President.
- f) Whereas the Association finds that it is in need of funding for capital improvements there will be a moratorium on further contributions to fund for a period of five years ending May 1st, 2006. (General Meeting 04/04/2001)
- Whereas the Association finds that it is in need of funding for capital improvements there will be a moratorium on further contributions to fund for a period of five years ending May 1st, 2017. (General Meeting 10/05/2011)

ARTICLE III **PROHIBITIONS**

SECTION 1 This Association shall be absolutely non-profit making and non-sectarian; shall not be used for the dissemination of sectarian principles; nor shall any discussion not in conformity with the objects of the organization be permitted at any Meeting. No part of the income or the assets shall inure to the benefit of any of its members, directors or Officers, nor be distributable thereto. Political activity shall be limited to the subjects of wildlife conservation, 2nd amendment rights of citizens and private use of tools of hunting and fishing and any subjects closely related to these items. Candidates for public political office shall be heard and supported only on their stand on the above-mentioned subjects.

ARTICLE IV <u>MEMBERSHIP</u>

The membership shall consist of no more than 550 members, plus life members. The Officers and members of the Board of Directors alone shall have the power to open or close the membership. (Amended General Meeting 10/08/2009)

SECTION 1 Eligibility

Any person over eighteen years of age, of good character and who is interested in the objects and purpose of this Association may be eligible to become a member thereof. However, any person who is a member of a subversive group, whose functions are adverse or contrary to the Constitution of the United States of America, shall not be eligible for membership in this Association. Furthermore, the above outlined eligibility requirement shall also apply to any existing member.

SECTION 2 Application for Membership

- a) All applications shall be made on the prescribed application form; shall be sponsored by a member who has been in good standing for at least three years; and shall be accompanied by the annual dues and the initiation fee in the amounts in effect at the time of the application and designation on the application form. All applicants and sponsors shall conform to procedure as outlined on the application form. In the event the applicant is denied membership, all monies shall be returned to the applicant.
 (Amended 02/01/1995)
- b) Upon the presentation of an application for membership at a General Meeting, the applicant shall stand and be introduced to the General Body at that Meeting. The sponsor of the applicant shall be present at that time and shall stand with the applicant for recognition. Failure of either applicant or sponsor to be present will void acceptance of the application.
- c) Application Forms for new members shall be available from the Membership Council at the General Meeting designated by the Board of Directors when openings for new members are available. The Application Forms shall also be made available, in digital format on the official club website prior to said meeting, in order to expedite completion of the application process. (Amended 04/02/2014)
- d) A member in good standing may sponsor not more than one (1) applicant per year. Applications will be accepted only after the Chairman of the Membership Council announces at a General Meeting that there is an opening(s) for Membership. If there are more applicants than openings, the Chairman of the Membership Council will hold a fair and impartial drawing at a General Meeting for the number of Membership openings. (Amended 04/02/2014)
- e) All applicants will be assigned a sequential number, based on the above drawing process. A list will be maintained by the Membership Council listing the unsuccessful applicants name, street address, email address, phone number, date, and sequential drawing number. This sequential number will be used as preference during the next membership acceptance period. If the applicant fails to be present at the next membership open meeting, the preference status shall be forfeited. Openings for membership shall be taken in sequential order from those holding the previously assigned sequential number, before accepting new applications. (Amended 04/02/2014)
- f) The balance of the applications and deposits of unsuccessful applicants will be returned to the sponsors. (Amended 04/02/2014)
- g) Applications for new members shall be accepted only during the times designated by the Board of Directors. (Amended 02/01/1995)

SECTION 3 Acceptance

- a) Upon approval by the Membership Council, application must be submitted for vote at a regular Meeting of the Officers and Board of Directors. Any approval must be carried by at least two-third majority of the Officers and of the Board of Directors at that Meeting. All applications approved by the Board shall then be submitted to a General Meeting for final approval. Upon any objection to the applicant, the application shall revert to the Board of Directors and Officers for review and a hearing between the Objector and the Sponsor of the applicant.
 (Amended-renumbered to "a" 02/01/1995)
- b) All new members accepted after April 5, 1995 will be on a probationary period until the deadline for annual membership renewal, as specified under Article 10, Section2, Paragraph (b). During this probationary period, ALL able bodied persons shall be REQUIRED to contribute their five (5) hours work obligation for the betterment of the Club, as stipulated under Article 4, Section 5, Paragraph (b) of these Bylaws. Failure

to fulfill this work obligation during probation will be grounds to drop that member from the membership roster. Only those with a physical or health disability preventing them from physical labor shall be exempt from this requirement and said condition must be stipulated during the application process. Anyone who feels that they cannot fulfill this obligation due to unforeseen circumstances, MUST present their case before the Board of Directors, on or before the April Board Meeting, either in person or writing and each case shall be presented in a timely manner such that all information will be received by the Board prior to that deadline. The Board of Directors will review all cases on a case-by-case basis and their decision will be final.

c) All new members shall work two (2) Club sponsored affair (Bull Roast, Crab Feast, Fish Rodeo or other major event approved by the Board of Directors) in addition to the five (5) Hours Work obligation during their first two (2) years of membership. The Special Event Chairman shall assign their specific job at such affairs. (Amended General Meeting 4/3/2013)

SECTION 4 Obligations

- a) Membership in the Association shall carry with it an obligation on the part of the Members to abide by these Bylaws and Lawful Enactments of the Association and to obey the letter and the spirit of all Game and Fish Laws and to encourage by personal conduct and influence a public regard for the conservation of our natural resources.
- b) To the end that the welfare and preservation of this Association's property be continued in an uninterrupted manner, it shall be the duty of every member to participate in the endeavor to assure this continuity. Each member will be required to volunteer a minimum of five (5) hours of assistance per year in one of three categories:
 - (1) Ponds and Grounds
 - (2) Clean up of Clubhouse interior.
 - (3) Property
- c) The Board of Directors will be empowered at its discretion to add or remove other categories on a temporary or permanent basis to the existing categories that a member may receive credit for work hours. To ensure that it will be in the best interest of the Club, there will be a written ballot with two-thirds majority in favor to approve the addition or revocation of any such change. The additions and the revocations must be published in the Newsletter 60days prior to the effective date of any change. (Adopted 08/02/2000 General Meeting.)
- d) Or a member in good standing may elect to serve on a committee as a registered committee member. (A member who has been recognized and listed as a standing committee member by the committee chair) and receive his/her work hours on a 2 to 1 basis. (2 hours served on his/her elected committee equals one hour work on a work party of the following committees, Grounds and Pond/clean-up of Clubhouse Interior/Property). It will be the responsibility of the Committee Chair to supply a list of the Committee members and their work hours to the Records Committee on a quarterly basis. (Adopted at the January 5, 2005 General Meeting)
- e) Exemptions
 - (1) Exemptions for one (1) year (during tenure)
 - (a) President
 - (b) Treasurer
 - (c) Recording Secretary
 - (d) Financial Secretary
 - (e) Chairman of Standing Committees.
 - (2) Total exemption from participation in this program shall be afforded a Life Member. This does not, however, preclude his taking part in any or all activities either by request if voluntarily.
 - (3) Any member who is physically unable to perform any of the more arduous tasks required, shall notify the particular chairman in advance of the date scheduled for the work detail to explain his situation. Members who for reasons such as work schedules, schooling or other circumstances preventing their attending a scheduled work date, shall notify the particular chairman so that other arrangements for participation can be made.
- f) It shall be the duty of the chairman of each committee to administrate the work schedules and keep records as to the participants.
- g) Failure of a member to honor his commitment will result in an increase of twice the annual dues, payable with the yearly dues. Failure to pay this assessment will result in forfeiture of membership.
- A monthly listing of members required for participation in this program will be published with the News Letter.

SECTION 5 Conduct

Any member or members charged, in writing by the accuser(s), with conduct unbecoming a member of this Association, may be called before a Meeting of the Board of Directors and Officers for a hearing. To enable the Board and Officers to arrive at a fair and impartial decision, all members involved must be notified seven (7) days prior to the date of the hearing by registered mail and be present. The refusal of any member or members so charged to attend said hearing may result in a forfeiture of membership in the Association. The decision of the Board of Directors and Officers shall be final.

SECTION 6 Life Membership

A Member who has been in good standing for a period of 20 years and has contributed some outstanding work or benefit for the enhancement of the Association, regardless of age, may be considered for Life Membership. The nomination for Life Membership must be submitted in WRITING to the Membership Committee and shall consist of a detailed account of the member's contribution toward the "BETTERMENT OF THE ASSOCIATION". The sponsor shall sign the nomination and be available at a Board Meeting for discussion of said qualifications. After review, the Membership Committee will then present the nomination at a regular Board Meeting. A written ballot and three-quarters (3/4) majority of those Officers and members of the Board of Directors present shall be required for approval. All Life Members shall have all rights and privileges of the Club, such as voting, holding of office and have a key to the Club.

ARTICLE V GOVERNMENT

SECTION 1 The Officers and Board of Directors shall be the governing body. These Bylaws together with the Lawful Enactments shall constitute the governing law of this Association.

SECTION 2 The Recording Secretary shall keep current a copy of the Bylaws and Lawful Enactments. The Recording Secretary must make revised up-to-date copies of the Bylaws and Lawful Enactments available every two (2) years within thirty (30) days of the end of the fiscal year of the Association.

ARTICLE VI OFFICERS

SECTION 1 Roster

a) The Officers of this Association shall be: President, Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Financial Secretary, Treasurer, Sergeant-At-Arms and Board of Directors, consisting of thirty (30) Members.

SECTION 2 Restrictions

- a) In order for anyone to be eligible for any elective office, except that of President, they must be a member in good standing for at least two (2) years prior to the election.
- b) In view of the responsibility and honor attached to the office of President, nominations for this office shall be restricted to the elected Officers and members of the Board of Directors, who have served at least one full year preceding said election.
- SECTION 3 The retiring President shall serve as an ex-officio member of the Board of Directors for one year following the expiration of his term as President.
- SECTION 4 The Recording Secretary, Financial Secretary and the Treasurer shall be elected by the President, the Vice-Presidents, Sergeant-At-Arms and the Board of Directors at the first Meeting of the Officers and the Board of Directors following the election of the President, Vice-Presidents, Sergeant-At-Arms and members of the Board of Directors.

SECTION 5 Terms

- a) Elective Officers, excepting Directors shall serve for one (1) year.
- b) Directors shall serve for a period of three (3) years from date of installation. Their terms to be so staggered that not more than Ten (10) vacancies shall exist at any time.
- c) Duties of Directors. The property, business and affairs of the Association shall be conducted and managed by the Officers and Board of Directors which may exercise all the powers of the Association except as are by statute, by the charter or by these Bylaws conferred or reserved to the members.
- d) All committees shall serve during the term of the appointed president, unless sooner relieved or discharged. They shall make monthly reports to the Officers and the Board of Directors.
- e) The fiscal year shall begin May 1 and end April 30 of each year.

SECTION 6 Procedure

- a) At the stated Board Meeting in February, the President shall appoint a nominating committee consisting of seven (7) non-retiring members of the Board of Directors. The Officers and Board of Directors shall approve that committee. They shall submit at the General Meeting in March, a list of candidates for the offices to be filled for the next ensuing year. The recommendations of such committee shall not, however, preclude the nominations of any other eligible members from the floor, at said General Meeting in March. At the conclusion of nominations from the floor, the presiding officer shall allow a minute time lapse before final closing of nominations.
- b) At the General Meeting in April, the election of the elective Officers and members of the Board of Directors shall be conducted in the following manner: The President shall appoint a committee of five (5) tellers to conduct the election, at least two (2) of whom shall be non-office holding members and none of whom shall be candidates for office. The tellers shall also act as judges and shall, after checking dues cards, distribute, receive, sort and count the ballots. They shall then prepare a report of the results and tender it to the presiding officer, who shall then announce the results.
- c) The installation of the Officers elect shall take place at the first General Meeting in May.

SECTION 7 Resignation

- An elective officer wishing to resign shall tender a written resignation to the Board of Directors for consideration and action.
- b) Resignations of committee chairmen shall be submitted in writing to the President, who shall have power to accept it without reference to the organization.
- c) The acceptance of an elective office in this Association shall be construed as the making of an agreement to attend each Meeting and to perform the duties of that office.
- d) To the end that the welfare of the Association be conserved and promoted and not as a penalty on the member, the failure of any officer or member of the Board of Directors to attend three consecutive Meetings, whether they be three consecutive General Meetings or three consecutive Board Meetings or three consecutive Meetings of any kind other than special, shall constitute the constructive resignation of such officer or Board of Directors member, and the Officers and the Board of Directors may thereupon accept such resignation and proceed to fill the vacancy; and the replaced officer or member of the Board of Directors be notified.
- e) In order that no officer or member of the Board of Directors is ignorant of this contract before taking office, this bylaw shall be read in open Meeting at the time when such member accepts office.

SECTION 8 Filling of Vacancies in Office

- a) Elective Vacancies due to death, resignation or inability to serve in the offices of President, First and Second Vice-Presidents, Sergeant-At-Arms and Board of Directors, may be filled by an election held at any General Meeting provided, however, that notice of such election has been given at a General Meeting prior to the date specified for such election. Such notice shall appear in the News Letter.
- b) The Officers and Board of Directors may fill by election, vacancies due to death, resignation or inability to serve in the offices of Recording Secretary, Financial Secretary and Treasurer, at any Board Meeting provided however, that notice of such election has been given at a Board Meeting prior to the date specified for such election.

SECTION 9 Finance

a) Two of the following Officers: President, Recording Secretary, Financial Secretary or Treasurer must sign warrants or checks for any payment of money from the funds of the Association after the payment has been approved by the membership at a General Meeting or the Board of Directors and Officers at a Board of Directors Meeting.

ARTICLE VII <u>DUTIES OF OFFICERS</u>

SECTION 1 President

- a) He shall preside at all Meetings of the Association.
- b) He shall appoint all committees, the selection of whom is not otherwise provided for.
- c) He shall serve as a member, ex-officio, on all committees of the Association.
- d) He shall thoroughly familiarize himself with the laws of this organization and with the duties of President and all other Officers and shall see that they are likewise thoroughly informed.
- e) He shall see that the Secretaries and Treasurer, serving during his term in office, unless they be reelected, turn over to their successors all property, records and funds of the Association for which they may be accountable; and shall do all other things that might be necessary to promote the welfare of the organization.
- f) He shall defer to the next Board of Directors and Officers Meeting any controversy, expenditures, and matters of policy or purpose, which shall arise at a General Meeting for their consideration.
- g) He shall be responsible for the distribution of keys to the Clubhouse to all Officers, members of the Board of Directors, Life Members and all other members approved to have keys and shall maintain a current record of all keys so distributed.
- h) He shall have a key to a safe-deposit box in a bank and shall maintain a current list of the contents of the safe deposit box.

SECTION 2 Vice-Presidents

- a) The duties of a Vice-President shall be to carry out the duties of the President in the absence or inability of the President to act.
- b) The two (2) vice-Presidents shall act as the Reception Committee to all visitors and see to their comfort and welfare in all respects, while our guests.

SECTION 3 Recording Secretary

- a) He shall forward and circulate all orders and announcements of the Association.
- b) He shall, under the direction of the President, attend to all official correspondence of the Association.
- c) He shall keep a roster of the Association, with the names and addresses of all Officers, for the time being, together with the names and addresses of all other members, which roster is to be furnished to him by the Financial Secretary.
- d) He shall keep a chronological file of all orders and communications, either originating from or received by the Association.
- e) He shall be accountable for all property of the Association entrusted to his care and shall turn over all such property to his successor without delay.
- f) In the temporary absence of the Secretary, the President shall appoint a temporary Secretary.
- g) He shall, at the end of his term of office, turn over to the President a current copy of the Bylaws and Lawful Enactments of the Association. He shall, every two (2) years within thirty (30) days of the end of the Fiscal Year of the Association, have current copies of the Bylaws and Lawful Enactments for distribution at Meetings.

SECTION 4 Financial Secretary

- a) He shall keep a descriptive book or file, composed of the membership cards and shall see that these cards are properly and fully made out.
- b) He shall keep a roster of the Association, with the names and addresses of all Officers, for the time being, together with the names and addresses of all other members. He shall furnish a similar roster to the Recording Secretary.
- He shall submit to the President at each General Meeting a written report giving complete data as to membership of the Association.
- d) He shall receive from all standing committees a full report of their previous monthly activities, setting out their receipts and disbursements and shall collect from such standing committees such cash as may be due the Association as shown on such monthly reports.
- e) He shall give receipts for all monies received.
- f) He shall note all receipts in a ledger and immediately turn over the funds received, to the Treasurer.
- g) He shall keep an account with each member of the Association, charging each member respectively, with all amounts due the Association for fees, or other considerations.

- h) He shall furnish, at each Meeting, a statement of any funds in his hands or under his control.
- i) He shall turn over to his successor, without delay, all funds, supplies and property belonging to the Association together with all books of account, vouchers and other papers and records relating to his office.

SECTION 5 Treasurer

- a) He shall collect all money due the Association, giving receipt thereof.
- b) He shall deposit all money belonging to the Association in the name of the Association, with such bank or banks or other proper institutions as the Officers and the Board of Directors may designate.
- c) He shall pay out money of the Association only in accordance with the Bylaws and Lawful Enactments of the Association, approving expenditures upon warrants counter-signed by the President or the Secretaries.
- d) He shall keep a cashbook, in which he shall promptly enter all receipts and disbursements of the money of the Association in such detail as to show the sources of all receipts and the payees and objects of all disbursements.
- e) He shall furnish at each Meeting, a statement of the funds in his hands or under his control.
- f) He shall turn over to his successor, without delay, all funds, supplies and property belonging to the Association together with all books of account, vouchers and other papers and records relating to his office.
- g) He shall keep a chronological file of all bills.
- h) He shall have a key to safe deposit box in a bank and shall maintain a current list of the contents of the safe deposit box.

SECTION 6 Bonding

The President, Recording Secretary, Financial Secretary Treasurer and Chairmen of Special Affairs shall be bonded for the honest and faithful performance of their duties to the sun of at least double the amount of funds that are likely to be in their hands; the amount of bond to be determined by the Officers and Board of Directors and the surety therefore approved by the Board.

SECTION 7 Sergeant-At-Arms

- a) The President may charge him with determining order of recognition on the floor.
- b) He may be charged with the preservation of order on the floor.
- c) He shall perform such other duties as may be required of him by the President.

ARTICLE VIII COMMITTEES

SECTION 1 The following shall be the standing committees of this Association:

- a) Membership Council
- b) Ways and Means (Finance) Committees
- c) Food and Kitchen Committee
- d) Property Committee
- e) Grounds and Pond Committee
- f) Conservation
- g) Bar Committee
- h) Legislative Committee
- i) Education and Training Committee
- j) Publicity Committee
- k) Reception Committee (see duties of Vice-Presidents)
- 1) Historian
- m) Traps Committee
- n) Rifle and Shooting Area Committee
- o) Delegates to Affiliated Organizations Committee
- p) Health & Welfare
- q) Bylaws Committee
- r) Special Activities Committee
- s) Records Committee
- t) Archery Committee
- u) Audit Committee

- SECTION 2 Each of said committees shall be appointed by the President upon his installation, or as soon thereafter as possible and shall consist of such number, not less than three (3), as he shall decide and shall serve during his term unless sooner discharged or relieved by him.
- SECTION 3 The President shall appoint annually, not later than the April General Membership Meeting, an auditing committee composed of three (3) Members of the Board of Directors and two (2) members of the general body. It shall be their duty to audit and examine the Treasurers', Financial Secretary's and all money handling committee chairman's books and accounts as of April 30 of each year and present a written report to the Board of Directors at the first Board Meeting in May of that year.

SECTION 4 Duties of Committees

- a) Membership Council
 - To examine the applications for membership to determine if the applicant has been properly proposed by a member in good standing; that he has a genuine interest in conservation and is of good habits. Also, to check application forms so as to a complete mailing address and telephone number. The council shall act fair and impartial in the selection of such applicants whom in their judgment will be an asset to the Club. The council shall report their recommendations to the Board of Directors at a stated Board Meeting.
- Ways and Means Committee

 This committee shall devise ways and means to promote the economic welfare of the Association. They will meet with the President and plan the affairs to be held during the year or any other money-raising event Socials, Suppers, Parties, etc. All plans worked out by this committee must be submitted to the Officers and Board of Directors for approval.
- c) Food and Kitchen Committee This Committee will purchase, prepare and serve food at all General and Board Meetings. They shall also attend to all duties necessary to keep the kitchen in clean and sanitary condition and maintain an inventory of all kitchen and cooking equipment.
- d) Property Committee
 - This committee shall be responsible for the proper management of all the Association's property and physical assets. They shall be furnished a petty cash fund, the amount to be determined by the Officers and Board of Directors. They shall also maintain a complete inventory of all Association equipment.
- e) Grounds and Ponds Committee This Committee shall see to the preservation of the grounds and ponds of this Association and devise and enforce all rules for the proper use of it. They shall be furnished a petty cash fund, the amount to be determined by the Officers and the Board of Directors.
- f) Conservation Committee This Committee shall keep the Association informed of Local, State and National conservation issues or happenings that would be in the realm of interest or concern to the Association. They shall consider conservation projects for the Club and make recommendations to the Officers and Board of Directors.
- g) Bar Committee This committee shall operate and maintain the bar for the benefit of the members. This Committee shall submit to periodic audits as required by the Officers and Board of Directors and Auditing Committee. They shall be furnished a petty cash fund, the amount to be determined by the Officers and the Board of Directors.
- h) Legislative Committee

 This committee is to be informed of pending legislation of interest to the Association and shall report the same to the General Meetings and the Board of Directors Meetings and handle legislative matters of the Association.
- i) Education and Training Committee This committee shall provide and maintain an educational conservation program, which may be presented to public schools and other civic and community organizations, without charge as a conservation service.
- Publicity Committee
 This Committee shall publicize the activities of the Association through the proper channels.

k) Reception Committee

This committee shall consist of two (2) Vice-Presidents, who shall act as the Reception committee to all visitors and see to their comfort and welfare in all respects while our guests.

l) Historian

He shall keep a history of the Association.

m) Traps Committee

This committee shall maintain and operate the traps on our property. They shall control the proper amount of stock on hand for Association affairs only. They shall be furnished a petty cash fund, the amount to be determined by the Officers and the Board of Directors.

n) Rife and Shooting Area Committee

This committee shall operate and maintain this facility for the best interests of the Association. They shall control the proper amount of stock on hand for Association affairs only. They may be furnished a petty cash fund, the amount to be determined by the Officers and the Board of Directors.

o) Delegates to Affiliated Organizations Committee

- (1) This Committee shall keep the General Body and the Board of Directors informed of all activities engaged in by organizations with which this Association is affiliated.
- p) Health and Welfare

This Committee shall report at General and Board Meetings the names and disposition of Club Members who may be incapacitated.

q) Bylaws Committee

It shall be function of this Committee to recommend the Bylaws to be amended, modified, limited or repealed, consider proposed amendments properly worded and be responsible in interpreting the laws and making certain the Bylaws are not contrary to the General Law. (Ref. Article 13, Section 1, Paragraph 9A0.

r) Special Activities

It shall be the function of this Committee to organize activities that would increase interest in the Association.

s) Records Committee

It shall be the function of this Committee to maintain all Club records and have information available to the governing body of the Club.

- t) Archery Committee
- u) Audit Committee

SECTION 5 Reports of Committees

All Committees are to make monthly reports.

ARTICLE IX MEETINGS

SECTION 1 General Meetings

The General Meetings of this Association shall be held on their premises located at 3400 Northwind Road, Baltimore, Maryland 21234 on the first Wednesday of each month, unless otherwise designated by proper notice (i.e. deer season) in the Monthly bulletin of such Meeting, except that if such a Wednesday falls on a holiday, the Meeting shall be held of the Next Wednesday following.

SECTION 2 Meetings of the Board of Directors

The Board of Directors shall meet on the third Monday of each month at the Association's premises, unless otherwise designated by proper notice in the Monthly Bulletin of such Meeting, except that if such Monday falls on a holiday the Meeting shall be held on the following Monday.

SECTION 3 Special and Emergency Meetings

- a) Special Membership Meetings may be held at any reasonable time by order of the President. The President shall call a special Meeting of the Association whenever fifteen (15) members in good standing make a written request therefore, stating specifically the business to be transacted at that Meeting. He shall require the Recording Secretary to give seven (7) days notice thereof to all members in good standing of the time and date of said Meeting and the business to be transacted and only that business shall be discussed.
- b) Special Board of Directors Meetings may be held at any time by order of the President whenever there shall be such business that must be acted on before the next regular Board Meeting. The President shall state specifically in opening the Meeting the business to be transacted and only that business shall be discussed.

SECTION 4 Quorums

- a) Thirty (30) members in good standing shall constitute a quorum competent to transact business at any general or special Meeting of the Association. Only members in good standing shall be eligible to vote in any Meeting of the Association; and fifteen (15) members of the Officers and the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum for a Board of Directors Meeting whether a special or regular Meeting.
- b) If a quorum is not present at the General Meeting, the Meeting shall be passed.
- c) If a quorum is not present at a Board Meeting; the Meeting shall be called by giving proper notice thereof for the following Monday night.

SECTION 5 Procedure

- a) Order of business shall be as follows:
 - (1) Call to order.
 - (2) Roll call of Officers.
 - (3) Reading of minutes of preceding Meeting.
 - (4) At Board Meetings, the minutes of the preceding General Meeting are read for information.
 - (5) At General Meetings, the minutes of the preceding Board Meeting are read for information.
 - (6) Reading of bills, orders and communications.
 - (7) Reports of Officers and committees
 - (8) Unfinished business
 - (9) New business
 - (10) Remarks
 - (11) Report of Treasurer
 - (12) Adjournment

SECTION 6 Rules of Order

Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the proceedings of all General, Board and Special Meetings of the Association and its constituent parts except as otherwise provided by statute, by the Charter, by the Bylaws or the Lawful Enactments of the Association.

ARTICLE X REVENUE

SECTION 1 Sources

- a) There shall be paid to the Treasury of the Association by every member, except Life Members, annual dues.
 - (1) There shall be paid to the Treasury of the Association by every applicant for membership into the Association an initiation fee.
 - (2) Net receipts from all sources of revenue shall be promptly paid into the treasury. Monies from affairs to be paid to the Treasurer within thirty (30) days of the event. After that period, The Association shall assume the responsibility to collect unpaid monies due to the Association and pay outstanding obligations.

SECTION 2 When Due and Payable

- a) The annual dues shall be due and payable not later than the first (1st) General Meeting in May. The Financial Secretary shall send out with the March "NEWSLETTER", NOTICE OF MEMBERSHIP DUES DUE not later than March 7 each year.
- b) Any member whose dues shall remain unpaid after the General Meeting in May shall be considered resigned and his name stricken from the roster. The Officers and the Board of Directors when due cause is shown may consider reasons and causes leading to the act of automatic dismissal.
- c) Any past member who wishes to rejoin must do so by filling out a new application blank and follow the same procedure as any other new member, including initiation fees.

ARTICLE XI DISBURSEMENTS

SECTION 1 All expenditures must have the approval of the Officers and the Board of Directors. However, The President can order the payment of all fixed, administrative and running expenses during the interim between Meetings. Such expenditures or payments shall be brought before the next Meeting of the Officers and the Board of Directors for approval.

ARTICLE XII DISSOLUTION

SECTION 1 This organization shall not be dissolved so long as there shall be five (5) or more members who shall be willing to continue it in operation.

SECTION 2 In the event of the dissolution of the Association, its holdings and treasury balance shall be turned over to the Maryland Department of Natural Resources or any successor thereof to be used by them to develop and maintain a conservation educational program to be presented free of charge to any civic or community organization desiring this service.

ARTICLE XIII AMENDMENTS

- SECTION 1 January, April, July and October are the only months Bylaw changes can be voted on. Any proposals to amend, alter or add to these Bylaws by a member of this Association shall be offered in writing, and signed by the member, submitted to the Bylaws committee for review sixty (60) days in advance of the vote of the general membership at the designated Meeting. In the notice of the next General Meeting, said proposition shall be published in the exact language thereof, together with the statement that it will be acted upon at said Meeting and such notice shall be mailed or emailed to every member in god standing at least seven (7) days prior to the date of said Meeting. (Amended 04/3/2013 General Meeting)
- SECTION 2 At the Meeting designated by the previous section, the proposition shall be taken from the table, discussed and voted upon; and in the event that at least two-thirds (2/3) of the members in good standing, present and voting, favor it, said proposed amendment shall be adopted. Membership cards must be shown in order to obtain a ballot.
- SECTION 3 All business pertaining to the Constitution, Bylaws or Lawful Enactments of Baltimore County Game & Fish Protective Association and nominations for Life Membership that requires a vote by the general membership or Board of Directors shall be submitted in writing with the name of those submitting and recorded in the minutes of such Meeting and shall be voted upon exactly as recorded, including any proper amendments. Each vote for, against or abstaining, shall be recorded and announced to those voting and be published as enacted in the monthly newsletter.

To Whom It May Concern:

The purpose of this letter is to document the typical activities conducted by the Baltimore County Game and Fish Association in support of Maryland's mandatory Hunter Safety Program. This is an all volunteer program sponsored by the state of Maryland that must be successfully completed before a first time hunter can purchase a Maryland Hunting License. Hunter safety classes are typically conducted over several weekday evenings reviewing various hunter safety topics with a weekend session used to demonstrate safe firearms handling, woods-walk hunting safety and actual live fire procedures. The live fire component typically requires students to work on a one-on-one basis with a Certified Hunter Safety Instructor to load and discharge either a .22 rifle or 20 gauge shotgun (or both) three to five times. There are currently nearly a dozen certified instructors that teach at Baltimore County Game and Fish.

The success of this Maryland Program is due in large part to the availability of facilities like Baltimore County Game and Fish where students can learn in a comfortable class room environment and have immediate access to both wooded areas and a live fire range with safe backstops and shooting stations. Baltimore County Game and Fish's close proximity to Baltimore City makes this a convenient, premier location for the many citizens who live in and around Baltimore City that want to hunt with firearms and/or archery equipment.

Each year, Baltimore County Game and Fish offers four to five hunter safety classes. Additionally, the club is also used as a teaching facility for annual hunter safety instructor update meetings, tree stand teaching technique certification and advanced instruction in the use of archery equipment and primitive firearms (i.e. muzzleloading rifles).

Another service provided by this club is their outstanding support of young hunters.

Maryland currently sets no minimum age for participation in the Hunter Safety Program.

Baltimore County Game and Fish has a high percentage of students under the age of 12 passing the course – giving testimony to the success of their instructors in helping younger hunters understand important fundamentals of safe gun handling.

There are 30 teaching locations and nearly 300 teaching instructors in Maryland's Central Region which includes Howard, Cecil, Baltimore, Harford and Carroll Counties. Baltimore County Game and Fish is right at the top of the list of facilities offering this important program which allows over 100,000 Maryland hunters an opportunity to hunt safely in Maryland. We look forward to continuing the relationship we have with this important club in making hunting a safe experience for Maryland hunters and citizens alike.
