OPINION AND ORDER

*

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for Baltimore County for consideration of Petitions for Special Hearing, Special Exception and Variance filed on behalf of Perry Hall Boulevard Commercial, LLC, legal owner, and Two Farms, Inc., contract purchaser/lessee ("Petitioners").

The Petition for Special Hearing was filed pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R") to approve access to a commercial use through a residential zone (D.R.1). In addition, a Petition for Variance seeks: (1) To allow a maximum of 4 enterprise signs (1 wall-mounted and 1 canopy on front and rear facades) for a single tenant building, in lieu of the maximum permitted 3 signs with no more than 2 on a single façade; (2) To allow a freestanding enterprise sign on a lot which has a lot line that is co-terminous with a right-of-way line of a highway, but to which the premises does not have and is not allowed pedestrian or vehicular access; and (3) To allow a landscape transition area a minimum of 0 ft. in width in a side yard abutting non-residentially zoned land in lieu of the required 6 ft. Finally, a Petition for Special Exception seeks approval for a fuel station on an individual site.

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Appearing at the public hearing in support of the requests was Joe Moran, Kenneth W. Schmid, Tom Ruszin and Joshua T. Sharon, with Morris & Ritchie Associates, Inc. David H. Karceski, Esq. and A. Neill Thupari, Esq. with Venable, LLP represented the Petitioners. Mike Pierce attending the hearing and expressed concern with the signage for the project. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations. Substantive Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were submitted by the Bureau of Development Plans Review (DPR), the Department of Planning (DOP), the Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability (DEPS) and the State Highway Administration (SHA).

The subject property is approximately 2.23 acres in size and is zoned BM-CCC. The unimproved property is located at the intersection of White Marsh Boulevard and Perry Hall Boulevard. Petitioners propose to construct a Royal Farms store at the site.

Variances

A variance request involves a two-step process, summarized as follows:

- (1) It must be shown the property is unique in a manner which makes it unlike surrounding properties, and that uniqueness or peculiarity must necessitate variance relief; and
- (2) If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or hardship.

Cromwell v. Ward, 102 Md. App. 691 (1995).

Petitioners have met this test. The property has an irregular shape and is bordered by two public roads to which the site does not have access. As such the property is unique. If the Regulations were strictly interpreted, Petitioners would experience a practical difficulty because they would be unable to construct the proposed improvements and provide appropriate signage to alert motorists to the location of the store. Finally, I find that the variances can be granted in harmony with the spirit and intent of the B.C.Z.R., and in such manner as to grant relief without injury to

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the public health, safety, and general welfare. The variances primarily concern signage at the site, but I do not believe the signs proposed will be excessive or will create visual clutter.

Special Exception

Under Maryland law, a special exception use enjoys a presumption that it is in the interest of the general welfare, and therefore, valid. Schultz v. Pritts, 291 Md. 1 (1981). The Schultz standard was revisited in Attar v. DMS Tollgate, LLC, 451 Md. 272, (2017), where the court of appeals discussed the nature of the evidentiary presumption in special exception cases. The court again emphasized a special exception is properly denied only when there are facts and circumstances showing that the adverse impacts of the use at the particular location in question would be above and beyond those inherently associated with the special exception use.

Both Mr. Schmid and Mr. Sharon opined Petitioners satisfied each of the requirements set forth at B.C.Z.R. § 502.1, and no testimony or evidence was offered to rebut these opinions. As such, and in recognition of the presumption supplied by Maryland law, the petition for special exception will be granted.

Special Hearing

The petition for special hearing seeks approval to access the proposed Royal Farm store through a portion of land with residential (D.R.1) zoning. As shown on the site plan, only a small portion of the access drive would intrude upon the residential zone; all commercial structures, signage and related infrastructure is located in the BM-CCC zone. The access drive would be situated near (but not within) nontidal wetlands and the White Marsh Run. There are no dwellings situated in the immediate vicinity of the proposed access drive, and I do not believe granting the request would have a detrimental impact upon the community. The DEPS ZAC comment will be incorporated into the order below to ensure the environmental resources at the site are protected.

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As noted at the outset Mr. Pierce expressed concern with the proliferation of illegal signage at several Royal Farm stores throughout the County. He presented a series of photos (Protestant's No. 1) which identify the stores in question, all of which have unauthorized signs (the majority of which were advertisements for cigarettes and tobacco products). I share Mr. Pierce's concern. This type of signage creates visual clutter and mars the appearance of the community, which is what the sign ordinance seeks to prevent. B.C.Z.R. § 450.1. A condition will be added in the order below to prohibit such unsightly and unauthorized signs.

The final issue concerns "the right of ingress and egress" over the BGE property which bisects this site, a point raised in the DOP ZAC comment. The owner's representative confirmed that while BGE is the fee-simple owner, it has the right (by deed and license) to access its property over and across the BGE property.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED this <u>16th</u> day of **October**, **2017**, by this Administrative Law Judge, that the Petition for Special Hearing filed pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R.") to approve access to a commercial use through a residential zone (D.R.1), be and is hereby GRANTED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Petition for Special Exception for a fuel station on an individual site, be and is hereby GRANTED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Petition for Variance: (1) To allow a maximum of 4 enterprise signs (1 wall-mounted and 1 canopy on front and rear facades) for a single tenant building, in lieu of the maximum permitted 3 signs with no more than 2 on a single façade; (2) To allow a freestanding enterprise sign on a lot which has a lot line that is co-terminous with a right-of-way line of a highway, but to which the premises does not have and is not allowed pedestrian or vehicular access; and (3) To allow a landscape transition area a minimum of 0 ft. in

width in a side yard abutting non-residentially zoned land in lieu of the required 6 ft., be and is hereby GRANTED.

The relief granted herein shall be subject to the following:

- Petitioners may apply for necessary permits and/or licenses upon receipt
 of this Order. However, Petitioners are hereby made aware that
 proceeding at this time is at their own risk until 30 days from the date
 hereof, during which time an appeal can be filed by any party. If for
 whatever reason this Order is reversed, Petitioners would be required to
 return the subject property to its original condition.
- 2. Petitioners must comply with the ZAC comment of DEPS, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- 3. Petitioners must submit for approval by Baltimore County landscape and lighting plans for the site, which plans should specifically demonstrate how the proposed dumpster would satisfy the requirements of Condition "H" in the Landscape Manual.
- 4. Only "commercial special event" temporary signs (as described in B.C.Z.R. § 450.4, Class 17 on Table of Sign Regulations) shall be permitted at the site. Such signs shall be subject to the limitations set forth at B.C.Z.R. § 450.7.E.2.
- 5. Only signs for which a permit has been issued by Baltimore County may be placed or situated on the subject premises.

Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for consideration of Petitions for Special Hearing and Variance filed on behalf of Stanley & Denise Feiden and Paul & Rosemary Krause, legal owners, and JC Bar Development, LLC, contract purchaser ("Petitioners"). The Special Hearing was filed pursuant to \$500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R.") as follows: (1) to approve commercial parking in a residential zone; (2) to approve four stacking spaces, not including space next to the transaction window, for a pharmacy drive-up window; and (3) to permit access to a commercial use through a residential zone.

In addition, an amended Petition for Variance seeks the following: (1) to allow off-street parking spaces to be located a minimum of 15 feet from a tract boundary in lieu of the required 75 feet and to remove the required 50 foot landscaped residential transition area along the western portion of the property that is proposed to be undeveloped open space. In lieu, a 15-foot Class "A" landscape buffer will be provided; (2) from B.C.Z.R. §409.8 to permit a setback of 3 ft. in lieu of the required 10 ft. setback requirement from an adjoining commercial property; and (3) to permit a freestanding sign to be erected 0 ft. from a residential zone in lieu of the required 25 ft. A site plan was marked and accepted into evidence as Petitioners' Exhibit 1A & 1B.

Appearing at the public hearing in support of the requests was Jason Mitchell, Dan Wallace, Eric McWilliams, Carl Wilson, Garry Russell and Joseph Ucciferro. David H. Karceski, Esq. and Adam Rosenblatt, Esq. represented the Petitioners. There were no protestants or interested citizens in attendance. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations. Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were received from the Department of Planning (DOP) and Bureau of Development Plans Review (DPR). The DOP did not oppose the relief, but requested a note be added to the plan concerning a 2012 rezoning of the property. The Petitioners added such a note to the plan, and thus the DOP comment is satisfied. DPR requested a landscape plan for the site, and a condition to that effect is included below.

SPECIAL HEARING

The subject property contains approximately 3.04 acres and is located at the intersection of Joppa and Harford Roads. Petitioners propose to construct a CVS pharmacy, and due to several site constraints variance and special hearing relief is required.

The first special hearing request concerns commercial parking in a residential zone. The plan shows four parking spaces would be located in the DR zone, adjacent to an open space area of the site Petitioners propose to convey to NeighborSpace. Mr. Ucciferro, a professional engineer accepted as an expert, testified Petitioners satisfy all requirements in B.C.Z.R. §409.8, and I concur.

The second special hearing request relates to the number of stacking spaces required for a pharmacy drive thru lane, an issue which is not addressed in the Regulations. Developer's representatives noted the average drive thru transaction time at CVS is approximately 3-4 minutes, which means that an extended queue is unlikely. Other CVS stores in Baltimore County have been approved with only 2 stacking spaces, and Petitioners are confident four

spaces would accommodate even the busiest peak-hour periods at the store. As such, I believe four stacking spaces are sufficient for the proposed CVS.

The final special hearing request seeks approval for accessing a commercial use through a residential zone. Counsel indicated the Zoning Commissioner's Policy Manual (ZCPM) provides that such access is permitted when "it is the sole access to the site." ZCPM, p.1-42.2. As Mr. Ucciferro testified, the Joppa Road access shown on the plan, located in a residential zone, is the only "full access" point for the store. As such the request will be granted.

VARIANCES

A variance request involves a two-step process, summarized as follows:

- (1) It must be shown the property is unique in a manner which makes it unlike surrounding properties, and that uniqueness or peculiarity must necessitate variance relief; and
- (2) If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or hardship.

Cromwell v. Ward, 102 Md. App. 691 (1995).

Petitioners have met this test. Mr. Ucciferro testified the property is irregularly shaped and that a significant grade change (approximately 25 feet) exists at the site. As such it is unique. Petitioners would experience practical difficulty if the regulations were strictly interpreted because they would be unable to construct the proposed CVS store. Finally, I find that the variance can be granted in harmony with the spirit and intent of the B.C.Z.R., and in such manner as to grant relief without injury to the public health, safety, and general welfare.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED this 18th day of May, 2016, by this Administrative Law Judge, that the Petition for Special Hearing filed pursuant to \$500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R) as follows: (1) to approve commercial parking in a residential zone; (2) to approve four stacking spaces, not including space next to the transaction window, for

a pharmacy drive-up window; and (3) to permit access to a commercial use through a residential

zone, be and is hereby GRANTED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Petition for Variance: (1) to allow off-street parking

spaces to be located a minimum of 15 feet from a tract boundary in lieu of the required 75 feet and

to remove the required 50 foot landscaped residential transition area along the western portion of

the property that is proposed to be undeveloped open space. In lieu, a 15-foot Class "A" landscape

buffer will be provided; (2) from B.C.Z.R. §409.8 to permit a setback of 3 ft. in lieu of the required

10 ft. setback requirement from an adjoining commercial property; and (3) to permit a freestanding

sign to be erected 0 ft. from a residential zone in lieu of the required 25 ft., be and is hereby

GRANTED.

The relief granted herein shall be subject to the following:

1. Petitioners may apply for necessary permits and/or licenses upon receipt of this Order. However, Petitioners are hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at their own risk until 30 days from the date

hereof, during which time an appeal can be filed by any party. If for whatever reason this Order is reversed, Petitioners would be required to

return the subject property to its original condition.

2. Prior to issuance of permits Petitioners must submit for approval by

Baltimore County landscape and lighting plans for the site.

Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

This firm represents Two Farms, Inc. ("Royal Farms"), lessee of the above-referenced property located at the northeast corner of the intersection of Perry Hall Boulevard and White Marsh Boulevard in the White Marsh area ("the Property"). On behalf of our client, I am requesting verification from your office that the enclosed site plan (hereinafter "Redlined Site Plan") is within the spirit and intent of the Administrative Law Judge's Order issued in Case No. 2018-0059-SPHXA ("2017 Case") and that no additional zoning relief is required in connection with the Redlined Site Plan.

I. **Zoning Case History**

In the 2017 Case, Petitions for Special Hearing, Special Exception, and Variance were filed to permit: (1) access to a commercial use through a residential zone (Special Hearing); (2) a fuel service station on an individual site (Special Exception); (3) a maximum of 4 enterprise signs (1 wall-mounted and 1 canopy on front and rear facades), in lieu of the maximum permitted 3 signs with no more than 2 on a single façade (Variance); (4) a freestanding enterprise sign on a lot which has a lot line that is coterminous with a right-of-way line of a highway, but to which the premises does not have and is not allowed pedestrian or vehicular access (Variance); (5) and a landscape transition area with a minimum of 0 feet in width in a side yard abutting non-residentially zoned land in lieu of the required 6 feet (Variance). On October 16, 2017, the Administrative Law Judge issued an Order granting all of the requested zoning relief subject to five conditions contained in the Order. Copies of the Order and site plan approved in the 2017 Case are also enclosed for your review.

II. Redlined Site Plan

Royal Farms now plans to improve the Property with a 1-story convenience store and carryout restaurant building smaller than the one approved in the 2017 Case. As shown on the 2017 Case site plan, Royal Farms initially intended to construct its "Type Recon B" building, which is 5,371± square feet in size. Royal Farms now intends to construct its "King Con" building for the convenience store and carryout restaurant uses. The "King Con" building is 4,649± square feet in size. See Redlined Site Plan.

As shown and indicated on the Redlined Site Plan, the "King Con" building will have a smaller building footprint, and allows for a revised layout for the fuel canopy, fuel pump islands, and underground fuel tanks. Additionally, due to the smaller "King Con" building, Royal Farms is required to provide 6 fewer off-street parking spaces. Therefore, a total of 35 parking spaces are now required, and Royal Farms will provide a total of 60 off-street parking spaces. See Redlined Site Plan.

Please confirm, by your countersignature below, that the Redlined Site Plan is within the spirit and intent of the relief granted in Case No. 2018-0059-SPHXA and will not require any additional zoning relief.

OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for Baltimore County for consideration of Petitions for Special Hearing, Special Exception and Variance filed on behalf of Perry Hall Boulevard Commercial, LLC, legal owner, and Two Farms, Inc., contract purchaser/lessee ("Petitioners").

The Petition for Special Hearing was filed pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R") to approve access to a commercial use through a residential zone (D.R.1). In addition, a Petition for Variance seeks: (1) To allow a maximum of 4 enterprise signs (1 wall-mounted and 1 canopy on front and rear facades) for a single tenant building, in lieu of the maximum permitted 3 signs with no more than 2 on a single façade; (2) To allow a freestanding enterprise sign on a lot which has a lot line that is co-terminous with a right-of-way line of a highway, but to which the premises does not have and is not allowed pedestrian or vehicular access; and (3) To allow a landscape transition area a minimum of 0 ft. in width in a side yard abutting non-residentially zoned land in lieu of the required 6 ft. Finally, a Petition for Special Exception seeks approval for a fuel station on an individual site.

Appearing at the public hearing in support of the requests was Joe Moran, Kenneth W. Schmid, Tom Ruszin and Joshua T. Sharon, with Morris & Ritchie Associates, Inc. David H. Karceski, Esq. and A. Neill Thupari, Esq. with Venable, LLP represented the Petitioners. Mike Pierce attending the hearing and expressed concern with the signage for the project. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations. Substantive Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were submitted by the Bureau of Development Plans Review (DPR), the Department of Planning (DOP), the Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability (DEPS) and the State Highway Administration (SHA).

The subject property is approximately 2.23 acres in size and is zoned BM-CCC. The unimproved property is located at the intersection of White Marsh Boulevard and Perry Hall Boulevard. Petitioners propose to construct a Royal Farms store at the site.

<u>Variances</u>

A variance request involves a two-step process, summarized as follows:

- (1) It must be shown the property is unique in a manner which makes it unlike surrounding properties, and that uniqueness or peculiarity must necessitate variance relief; and
- (2) If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or hardship.

Cromwell v. Ward, 102 Md. App. 691 (1995).

Petitioners have met this test. The property has an irregular shape and is bordered by two public roads to which the site does not have access. As such the property is unique. If the Regulations were strictly interpreted, Petitioners would experience a practical difficulty because they would be unable to construct the proposed improvements and provide appropriate signage to alert motorists to the location of the store. Finally, I find that the variances can be granted in harmony with the spirit and intent of the B.C.Z.R., and in such manner as to grant relief without injury to

the public health, safety, and general welfare. The variances primarily concern signage at the site, but I do not believe the signs proposed will be excessive or will create visual clutter.

Special Exception

Under Maryland law, a special exception use enjoys a presumption that it is in the interest of the general welfare, and therefore, valid. Schultz v. Pritts, 291 Md. 1 (1981). The Schultz standard was revisited in Attar v. DMS Tollgate, LLC, 451 Md. 272, (2017), where the court of appeals discussed the nature of the evidentiary presumption in special exception cases. The court again emphasized a special exception is properly denied only when there are facts and circumstances showing that the adverse impacts of the use at the particular location in question would be above and beyond those inherently associated with the special exception use.

Both Mr. Schmid and Mr. Sharon opined Petitioners satisfied each of the requirements set forth at B.C.Z.R. § 502.1, and no testimony or evidence was offered to rebut these opinions. As such, and in recognition of the presumption supplied by Maryland law, the petition for special exception will be granted.

Special Hearing

The petition for special hearing seeks approval to access the proposed Royal Farm store through a portion of land with residential (D.R.1) zoning. As shown on the site plan, only a small portion of the access drive would intrude upon the residential zone; all commercial structures, signage and related infrastructure is located in the BM-CCC zone. The access drive would be situated near (but not within) nontidal wetlands and the White Marsh Run. There are no dwellings situated in the immediate vicinity of the proposed access drive, and I do not believe granting the request would have a detrimental impact upon the community. The DEPS ZAC comment will be incorporated into the order below to ensure the environmental resources at the site are protected.

As noted at the outset Mr. Pierce expressed concern with the proliferation of illegal signage at several Royal Farm stores throughout the County. He presented a series of photos (Protestant's No. 1) which identify the stores in question, all of which have unauthorized signs (the majority of which were advertisements for cigarettes and tobacco products). I share Mr. Pierce's concern. This type of signage creates visual clutter and mars the appearance of the community, which is what the sign ordinance seeks to prevent. B.C.Z.R. § 450.1. A condition will be added in the order below to prohibit such unsightly and unauthorized signs.

The final issue concerns "the right of ingress and egress" over the BGE property which bisects this site, a point raised in the DOP ZAC comment. The owner's representative confirmed that while BGE is the fee-simple owner, it has the right (by deed and license) to access its property over and across the BGE property.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED this <u>16th</u> day of **October**, 2017, by this Administrative Law Judge, that the Petition for Special Hearing filed pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R.") to approve access to a commercial use through a residential zone (D.R.1), be and is hereby GRANTED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Petition for Special Exception for a fuel station on an individual site, be and is hereby GRANTED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Petition for Variance: (1) To allow a maximum of 4 enterprise signs (1 wall-mounted and 1 canopy on front and rear facades) for a single tenant building, in lieu of the maximum permitted 3 signs with no more than 2 on a single façade; (2) To allow a freestanding enterprise sign on a lot which has a lot line that is co-terminous with a right-of-way line of a highway, but to which the premises does not have and is not allowed pedestrian or vehicular access; and (3) To allow a landscape transition area a minimum of 0 ft. in

width in a side yard abutting non-residentially zoned land in lieu of the required 6 ft., be and is hereby GRANTED.

The relief granted herein shall be subject to the following:

- 1. Petitioners may apply for necessary permits and/or licenses upon receipt of this Order. However, Petitioners are hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at their own risk until 30 days from the date hereof, during which time an appeal can be filed by any party. If for whatever reason this Order is reversed, Petitioners would be required to return the subject property to its original condition.
- 2. Petitioners must comply with the ZAC comment of DEPS, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.
- 3. Petitioners must submit for approval by Baltimore County landscape and lighting plans for the site, which plans should specifically demonstrate how the proposed dumpster would satisfy the requirements of Condition "H" in the Landscape Manual.
- 4. Only "commercial special event" temporary signs (as described in B.C.Z.R. § 450.4, Class 17 on Table of Sign Regulations) shall be permitted at the site. Such signs shall be subject to the limitations set forth at B.C.Z.R. § 450.7.E.2.
- 5. Only signs for which a permit has been issued by Baltimore County may be placed or situated on the subject premises.

Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

The Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability offers the following comments on the above-referenced zoning item:

X Development of the property must comply with Baltimore County Code Article 33. Environmental Protection And Sustainability, Title 3. Protection of Water Quality, Streams, Wetlands, and Floodplains. Pursuant to this code, an alternatives analysis is required for stormwater management, utility, or access road impacts proposed to the forest buffer. A variance is required for proposed forest buffer impacts for structures, including parking areas. All requirements must be met in order for approval of an alternatives analysis or variance. There are no guarantees of any approvals. State of Maryland and Army Corps of Engineers review of wetland, wetland buffer, and floodplain impacts is also required.
