OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for consideration of a Petition for Special Exception filed on behalf of Rodick Realty LLC, et al, legal owner and Two Farms, Inc., lessee ("Petitioners"). The petition was filed pursuant to the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R.") to amend the site plan for a fuel service station and enlarge the special exception area approved in Case No. 2003-0009-SPHX for the addition of a new roll-over car wash, fuel service station pumps, and other related improvements as shown on the site plan filed in this case.

Professional engineer Steve Warfield, Ken Schmid, Edward Steere and Jeff Bainbridge appeared in support of the petition. David H. Karceski, Esq. and A Neill Thupari, Esq. represented the Petitioners. There were no protestants or interested citizens in attendance. Substantive Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were received from the Bureau of Development Plans Review (DPR), State Highway Administration (SHA), Department of Planning (DOP), and Department of Public Works (DPW).

The subject property is approximately 3.24 acres in size and is split-zoned BR-AS, ML-AS. A gasoline station has existed at the site for many years. The operation was expanded in 2003, and this case proposes another expansion of the "fuel service station" and roll-over car wash, which ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING

is considered under the Regulations as a "use in combination" with the service station. B.C.Z.R. §405.4.E.

Special Exception

Under Maryland law, a special exception use enjoys a presumption that it is in the interest of the general welfare, and therefore, valid. *Schultz v. Pritts*, 291 Md. 1 (1981). The *Schultz* standard was revisited in *Attar v. DMS Tollgate, LLC*, 451 Md. 272 (2017), where the court of appeals discussed the nature of the evidentiary presumption in special exception cases. The court again emphasized a special exception is properly denied only when there are facts and circumstances showing that the adverse impacts of the use at the particular location in question would be above and beyond those inherently associated with the special exception use.

According to the file, special exceptions have been granted previously for this site in several cases spanning the years of 1954-2003. Mr. Warfield opined Petitioners satisfied all requirements for special exception relief under B.C.Z.R. §502.1 and the Maryland case law interpreting that provision. Mr. Warfield also noted a final landscape plan for the site was approved by Baltimore County on January 29, 2018.

Mr. Warfield also testified there is an abandoned fuel service station within one-half mile of this site. But he noted that in reality Royal Farm was only increasing the number of high-flow diesel dispensers at the site; the number of unleaded and diesel dispensers used by passenger vehicles would not be increased. As such, I believe Petitioners have a valid argument that the provision in the Regulations concerning abandoned fuel service stations (B.C.Z.R. §405.3) would not be applicable in the unique setting of this case.

Even so, and assuming the Regulation was applicable, Petitioners presented testimony from Edward Steere, a real estate development and planning expert. Mr. Steere studied the area

surrounding the site and noted the large number of trucks (approximately 3,500) which travel past this site on a daily basis. He also stated the nearest stations with high-flow diesel fuel dispensers were between one and three miles from this site. In conclusion, the witness opined that the "market data" he reviewed indicated unequivocally there was a need for diesel fuel at this location, and thus I believe Petitioners have successfully rebutted the presumption contained within the aforementioned regulation.

ZAC Comments

DPW noted a riverine floodplain exists on site, and Mr. Warfield described in detail the differing methods used by County and Federal authorities in defining the boundaries of such areas. A condition has been included below which incorporates the concerns set forth in the DPW comment.

The DOP expressed concern with temporary signage at the site, and a condition is included below to incorporate that comment. The DOP also requested Petitioners to demonstrate that the internal circulation on the site was safe and satisfied the special exception requirements. Both Mr. Warfield and Mr. Schmid (a traffic engineer accepted as an expert) explained the layout of the site and the points of ingress/egress. Of particular importance is that the existing diesel fuel dispensers for tractor trailers will be relocated to the other side of the site, which will greatly improve access for these large vehicles and prevent congestion on the site. As such, I believe Petitioners have satisfied their burden to show that the use and layout of the site will not cause traffic congestion or safety issues.

Finally, the DOP suggested architectural features be added to the 217 ft. long canopy over the fuel pumps. Mr. Warfield testified it would be impractical to do so and would cause Royal Farms to deviate from the uniform canopy design used at all of their area locations. In addition, he

noted many buildings in industrial zones are longer than 200 feet and that architectural features are not included on such structures, which he opined were far more imposing than the canopy roof proposed here. I concur, and will not include such a requirement in the final order.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED this <u>9th</u> day of March, 2018, by this Administrative Law Judge, that the Petition for Special Exception to amend the site plan for a fuel service station and enlarge the special exception area approved in Case No. 2003-0009-SPHX for the addition of a new roll-over car wash, fuel service station pumps, and other related improvements as shown on the site plan filed in this case, be and is hereby GRANTED.

The relief granted herein shall be subject to the following:

- Petitioners may apply for necessary permits and/or licenses upon receipt of this Order. However, Petitioners are hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at its own risk until 30 days from the date hereof, during which time an appeal can be filed by any party. If for whatever reason this Order is reversed, Petitioners would be required to return the subject property to its original condition.
- 2. Petitioners must obtain an "entrance permit" from the SHA.
- 3. Petitioners must prior to issuance of permits provide to the Bureau of DPR an approved FEMA Conditional Letter of Map Revision, wherein FEMA amends the Flood Insurance Rate Map to coincide with the riverine flood plain shown on the site plan.
- 4. No temporary banners, signs or promotional displays shall be permitted at the site.
- 5. Petitioners shall have three (3) years from the date hereof in which to utilize the special exception.

Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

I apologize for the delay, but thank you for the opportunity to comment on the above-referenced Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) case included on the agenda for its November 20, 2017 meeting.

Based on the information available for review, the State Coordinating Office of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) offers the following comments for consideration by the ZAC:

- 1. The southwest corner of Parcel 15, and the western half of Parcel 14 are in the FEMA-mapped floodway.
- 2. Development in the FEMA-mapped floodway is limited unless a hydrology and hydraulics engineering analysis shows a zero rise in the Base Flood Elevation (BFE) as a result of the proposed development.
- 3. If there will be any increase in the BFE as a result of the proposed development, then a Conditional Letter of Map Revision Based on Fill (CLOMR-F) must be obtained from FEMA prior to construction, and a Letter of Map Revision Based on Fill (LOMR-F) after construction is complete.

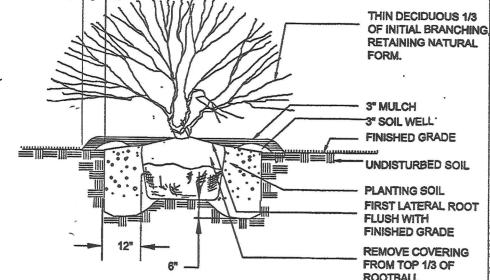


PLANTING DETAIL FOR EVERGREEN AND DECIDUOUS SHRUBS

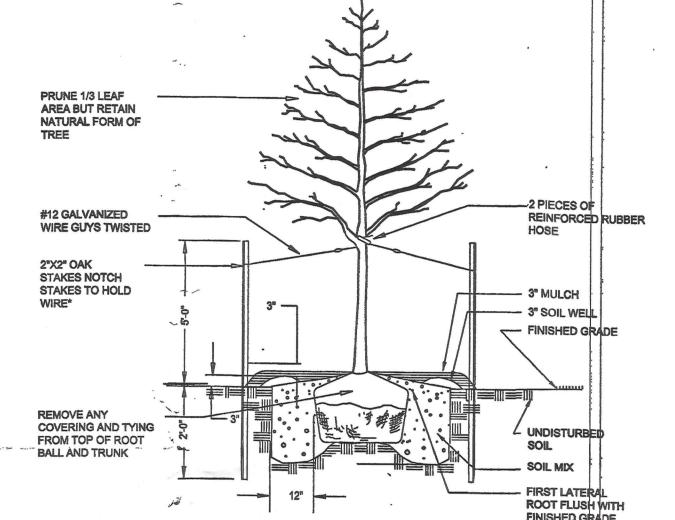
