OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for Baltimore County for consideration of Petitions for Special Hearing, Special Exception and Variance filed on behalf of Christina Kesting, legal owner ("Petitioner"). The Petition for Special Hearing was filed pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R") to confirm that the proposed Class B Group Child Day Care Center is exempt from RTA because the proposed improvements are compatible with the and general welfare of the surrounding residential premises. A Petition for Variance seeks the following: (1) to permit an area of 1.052 acres for the group child-care center in lieu of the required 1.689 acres; (2) to permit a front yard setback of 15 ft. from a street line in lieu of the required 25 ft.; (3) to permit a side yard setback of 20 ft. in lieu of the required 50 ft.; (4) to permit a rear yard setback of 20 ft. in lieu of the required 50 ft.; (5) to permit a perimeter vegetative buffer of 0 ft. in lieu of the required 20 ft.; and (6) to permit an impervious surface area of 44% in lieu of the maximum required 25%. Finally, a Petition for Special Exception was filed to permit a Class B Group Child Care Center for up to 100 children.

Appearing at the public hearing in support of the requests was Christina Kesting and surveyor Bruce Doak. Two neighbors attended the hearing and opposed the requests. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations. Substantive ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING.

Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were submitted by the Bureau of Development Plans Review (DPR), the Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability (DEPS), the Department of Public Works (DPW) and the State Highway Administration (SHA).

This case involves a 1.5 acre parcel of land in White Marsh. The property is improved with a small single-family dwelling ("SFD") and detached garage. Petitioner proposes, through use division lines (Z.C.P.M. §102-2) to divide the property into a ½ acre parcel containing the SFD and a 1 acre parcel on which a commercial building would be constructed for the operation of a Class B child care facility with up to 100 children.

Under the B.C.Z.R. bulk regulations, one acre is required for a child care facility with a maximum of 40 children. B.C.Z.R. §424.7. Petitioner seeks to have up to 100 children in a one acre area, which is 250% of the maximum number permitted by the Regulations. I believe that is simply too many children for the small site, which could present safety concerns not only for the children but also for the large volume of traffic which would have to enter and exit the site on a daily basis.

In addition, the DPW noted the property is situated within a riverine floodplain, and the neighbors testified the property and dwelling have flooded on many occasions. Although Petitioner revised the site plan so that only the proposed parking lot is within the floodplain, state and county law forbids new construction in riverine floodplains. At the very least Petitioner would need to request a waiver (BCC §32-4-107) from the DPW, which must be accompanied by a site plan prepared by a professional engineer. Although Mr. Doak indicated a waiver would be sought at the time of building permit application, the long-standing practice is for such waiver actions to be filed at the same time as, and considered with, zoning cases involving the property.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED this <u>16th</u> day of **March**, **2018**, by this Administrative Law Judge, that the Petition for Special Hearing filed pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R) to confirm that the proposed Class B Group Child Day Care Center is exempt from RTA because the proposed improvements are compatible with the and general

welfare of the surrounding residential premises, be and is hereby DENIED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Petition for Special Exception to permit a Class B Group Child Care Center for up to 100 children, be and is hereby DENIED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Petition for Variance to allow: (1) to permit an area of 1.052 acres for the group child-care center in lieu of the required 1.689 acres; (2) to permit a front yard setback of 15 ft. from a street line in lieu of the required 25 ft.; (3) to permit a side yard setback of 20 ft. in lieu of the required 50 ft.; (4) to permit a rear yard setback of 20 ft. in lieu of the required 50 ft.; (5) to permit a perimeter vegetative buffer of 0 ft. in lieu of the required 20 ft.; and (6) to permit an impervious surface area of 44% in lieu of the maximum required 25%, be and is hereby DENIED.

Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

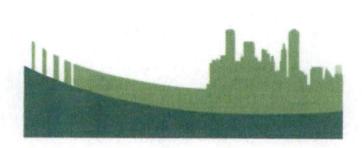

The Department of Planning has reviewed the petition for special hearing to determine whether or not the Administrative Law Judge should approve the proposed Class B Group Child Care Center as exempt from RTA and the petition for special exception to use the property for a Class B Group Child Care Center for up to 100 children. The Department has also reviewed the petition for variances as listed on the attachment submitted in support of said petition.

The petitioner's representative has submitted a compatibility narrative pursuant to BCZR §1B01.1.B.1.c (2). The Department finds deficiencies in the layout that prevent it from supporting approval of the petition as filed. With revisions to the plan as discussed below the Department recommends that the proposal better attains the compatibility objectives of BCC§ 32-4-402 and the special exception conditions established in BCZR § 502.1. The Department can review a plan so revised, possibly resulting in the issuance of amended zoning advisory comments.

The Department does not support granting special hearing relief pursuant to BCZR§1B01.B.1.g (11) as compliance with the bulk standards of BCZR § 424.7 is not maintained.

The Department cannot support granting the petitioned zoning special exception and variance relief as filed. The overall proposal appears excessive in its scale necessitating the multiple variances. As presented, the intensity, bulk and mass of the proposal within the limited site area is unsuccessful in its approach to the compatibility objectives required of the BCC becoming difficult to integrate into the community and putting into question whether the special exception conditions can be met. The following issues must be addressed in order for the Department to further consider the proposal.

• At 22 spaces, the site is parked at the minimum required level. In order to function, the "pick-up and drop-off" area must be clear. The plan utilizes two parking spaces for this area creating an overall parking deficiency. The plan shows no queue area for the pick-up and drop-off or is there a turnaround area. The plan proposes non-residential parking situated less than 10' from a public right of way without petition for variance relief. This may result in the loss of another space thereby exacerbating the parking situation. This negatively impacts vehicular circulation possibly creating an unsafe environment to embark and disembark children. The Department recommends

this is contrary to the conditions found in BCZR§ 502.1. A redesign of the parking area must provide for the safe traverse of children and adults from those spaces situated on the southwest boundary of the special exception area to the daycare entrance. The design must provide a sidewalk at the front of the building between the parking spaces and the building that will provide a safety buffer for children and adults. This sidewalk shall also be designed such that children, employees and or parents may safely walk to and from the daycare building out to Philadelphia Road so that they may access a school bus.

- The Department does not object to granting setback variance relief to BCZR §424.7 in that the HoneyGo design guidelines of BCZR § 259.9.B.5.b dictates a commercial setback of no more than 15'. That said, the Department does not support parking at less than 10' removed from the right of way and would apply the landscape buffer requirements of BCZR § 259.9.B.5.c.
- As stated, the Department recommends the project is not exempt from RTA requirements but may support a modified RTA providing screening to the extent possible. The petitioners must demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Administrative Law Judge that any component of the plan proposed to be setback at 0' from the property line can be installed and maintained without trespass. Petitioners must submit a landscape and lighting plan to the Baltimore County Landscape Architect for approval. Such a plan will include vegetative screening and opaque fencing along the tract boundary adjacent to the existing dwellings sufficient to mitigate the impacts of the special exception. Said plan shall also reflect the requirements of BCZR§1B01.B.1.e (4).
- The plan indicates the wood garage to remain is located within the special exception area. Is the garage to the use of the group childcare or is it to be accessory to the residence? The plan does not propose how the special exception use remains onsite and is prevented from bleeding into the residential use area. The use of bollards or other physical obstruction between the parking lot and residence is required.
- The Department recommends the petitioner revisit the proposed building and seek ways to reduce the footprint thereby allowing more buffer albeit still diminished. The structure is subject to the Honeygo Overlay District guidelines pursuant to BCZR § 259.9.G.3. If approved, the petitioners shall submit to the Department to the attention of the contact person listed below architectural elevations for review prior to the issuance of building permits.

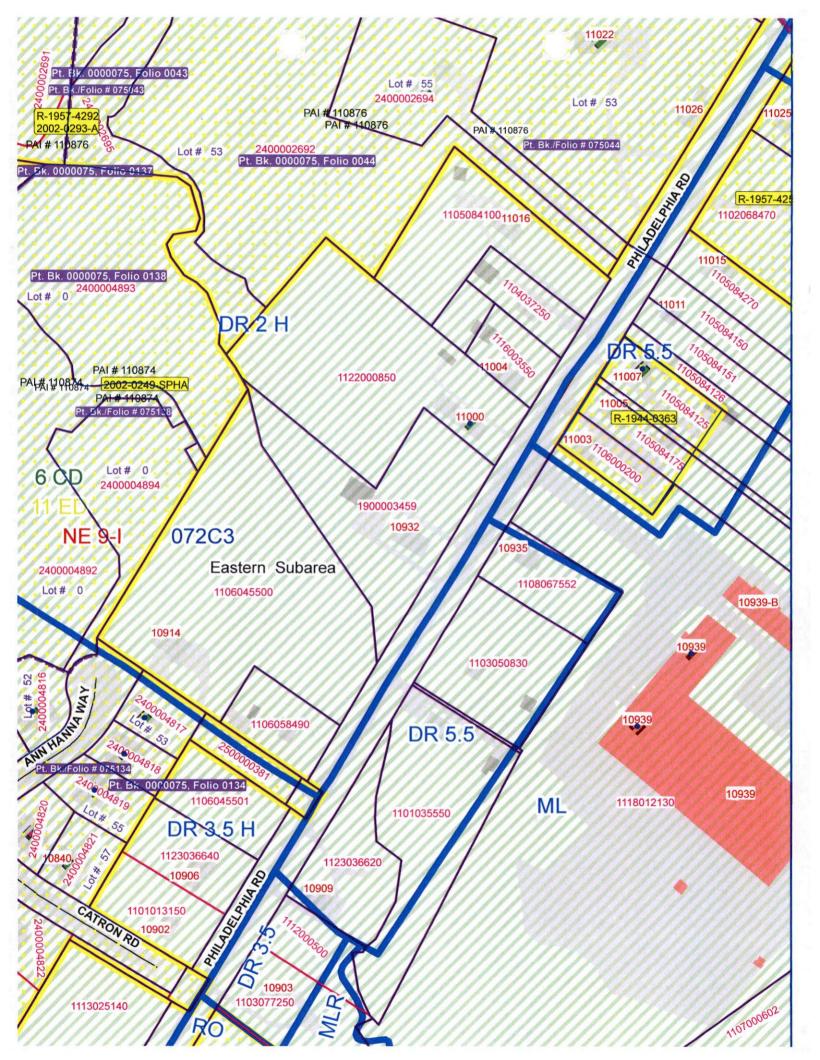

The Department of Planning has reviewed the petition for special hearing to determine whether or not the Administrative Law Judge should approve the proposed Class B Group Child Care Center as exempt from RTA and the petition for special exception to use the property for a Class B Group Child Care Center for up to 100 children. The Department has also reviewed the petition for variances as listed on the attachment submitted in support of said petition.

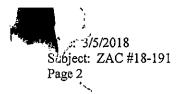
The petitioner's representative has submitted a compatibility narrative pursuant to BCZR §1B01.1.B.1.c (2). The Department finds deficiencies in the layout that prevent it from supporting approval of the petition as filed. With revisions to the plan as discussed below the Department recommends that the proposal better attains the compatibility objectives of BCC§ 32-4-402 and the special exception conditions established in BCZR § 502.1. The Department can review a plan so revised, possibly resulting in the issuance of amended zoning advisory comments.

The Department does not support granting special hearing relief pursuant to BCZR§1B01.B.1.g (11) as compliance with the bulk standards of BCZR § 424.7 is not maintained.

The Department cannot support granting the petitioned zoning special exception and variance relief as filed. The overall proposal appears excessive in its scale necessitating the multiple variances. As presented, the intensity, bulk and mass of the proposal within the limited site area is unsuccessful in its approach to the compatibility objectives required of the BCC becoming difficult to integrate into the community and putting into question whether the special exception conditions can be met. The following issues must be addressed in order for the Department to further consider the proposal.

• At 22 spaces, the site is parked at the minimum required level. In order to function, the "pick-up and drop-off" area must be clear. The plan utilizes two parking spaces for this area creating an overall parking deficiency. The plan shows no queue area for the pick-up and drop-off or is there a turnaround area. The plan proposes non-residential parking situated less than 10' from a public right of way without petition for variance relief. This may result in the loss of another space thereby exacerbating the parking situation. This negatively impacts vehicular circulation possibly creating an unsafe environment to embark and disembark children. The Department recommends





this is contrary to the conditions found in BCZR§ 502.1. A redesign of the parking area must provide for the safe traverse of children and adults from those spaces situated on the southwest boundary of the special exception area to the daycare entrance. The design must provide a sidewalk at the front of the building between the parking spaces and the building that will provide a safety buffer for children and adults. This sidewalk shall also be designed such that children, employees and or parents may safely walk to and from the daycare building out to Philadelphia Road so that they may access a school bus.

- The Department does not object to granting setback variance relief to BCZR §424.7 in that the HoneyGo design guidelines of BCZR § 259.9.B.5.b dictates a commercial setback of no more than 15°. That said, the Department does not support parking at less than 10° removed from the right of way and would apply the landscape buffer requirements of BCZR § 259.9.B.5.c.
- As stated, the Department recommends the project is not exempt from RTA requirements but may support a modified RTA providing screening to the extent possible. The petitioners must demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Administrative Law Judge that any component of the plan proposed to be setback at 0' from the property line can be installed and maintained without trespass. Petitioners must submit a landscape and lighting plan to the Baltimore County Landscape Architect for approval. Such a plan will include vegetative screening and opaque fencing along the tract boundary adjacent to the existing dwellings sufficient to mitigate the impacts of the special exception. Said plan shall also reflect the requirements of BCZR§1B01.B.1.e (4).
- The plan indicates the wood garage to remain is located within the special exception area. Is the garage to the use of the group childcare or is it to be accessory to the residence? The plan does not propose how the special exception use remains onsite and is prevented from bleeding into the residential use area. The use of bollards or other physical obstruction between the parking lot and residence is required.
- The Department recommends the petitioner revisit the proposed building and seek ways to reduce the footprint thereby allowing more buffer albeit still diminished. The structure is subject to the Honeygo Overlay District guidelines pursuant to BCZR § 259.9.G.3. If approved, the petitioners shall submit to the Department to the attention of the contact person listed below architectural elevations for review prior to the issuance of building permits.

SECTION 102.2

A. MIXED USES ON ONE PROPERTY

- If several uses are proposed as separate structures on one property, each use must meet the zoning requirements as if it was a separate parcel.
- 2. Even if subdivision of the property is not proposed, the Zoning Commissioner may require that a line of division either a lease line or a zoning use division line between each use be shown on the plat.
 - a. <u>Conditions</u>: The following guidelines have been formulated so that this matter can be handled consistently:
 - i. Both existing and proposed uses, as divided, must be able to meet the B.C.Z.R. requirements with respect to area, density, parking, setbacks between buildings and to the division lines as if they were property lines.
 - ii. Residential density may be calculated on the overall property acreage if all uses are residential and is allowed in that zone.
 - b. <u>Interpretation</u>: This determination may be subject to a Special Hearing at the discretion of the Zoning Commissioner.

B. SETBACKS AND BUILDINGS ACROSS ZONE LINES

 If the property is bisected by a zone or a use and setback limitation line, the required applicable setbacks (for a building legally located in one of these zones) would be measured to the property or street right of way line and not the zone line.

The only exceptions to this method of measuring setbacks would be:

- a. If there is a specific use limitation within a certain distance of a particular zone, then the distance would have to be maintained, or <u>if</u> <u>possible</u>, a variance may be applied for.
- b. If there are 2 principal buildings proposed in different zones, on the same property, in close proximity, then the greatest distance between principal buildings will have to be maintained or a variance granted.
- If a building is proposed across a zone or use and setback limitation line, regardless of what percentage of the building is on each side, the setbacks for each section of the building will be determined and applied separately, according to each separate zone or zone proximity requirement.

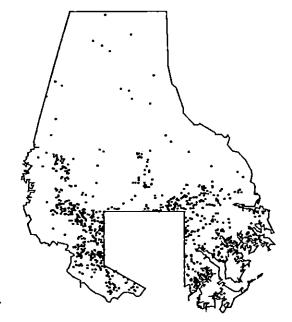

Density of Regulated Family Child Care Homes in Baltimore County

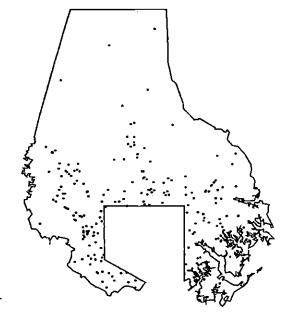

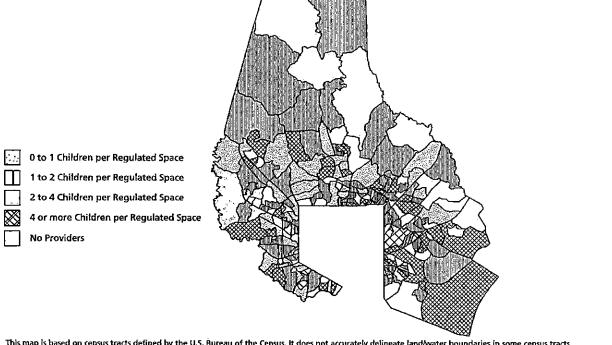

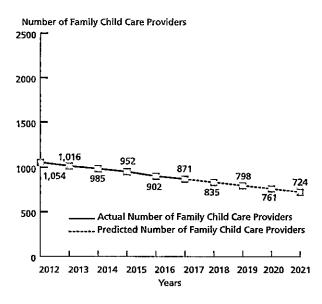
Number of Children 0-5 Years Per Regulated Child Care Space by Census Tract



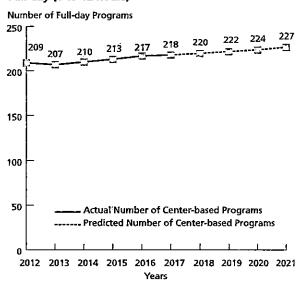

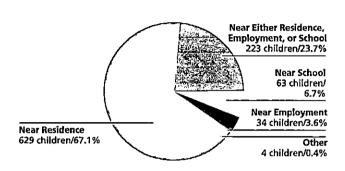

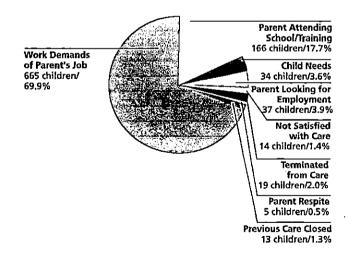
