#### OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings ("OAH") for Baltimore County as a Petition for Variance filed by CMW Properties, LLC, legal owner of the subject property ("Petitioner"). The Petition seeks variance relief from §1B02.3.C.1 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR") to permit a side yard setback of 7 ft., lot width of 43.4 ft., and a lot area of 4,426 sq. ft. in lieu of the required 10 ft., 55 ft., and 6,000 sq. ft. respectively, for a replacement dwelling on an existing lot of record. A site plan was marked as Petitioner's Exhibit 1.

Charles Wolinski and David Billingsley appeared in support of the petition. There were no Protestants or interested citizens in attendance. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the BCZR. Substantive Zoning Advisory Committee ("ZAC") comments were received from the Department of Planning ("DOP") and the Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability ("DEPS").

The site is approximately 4,426 square feet in size and zoned DR 5.5. The subject property is improved with one-half of a semi-detached or duplex dwelling. The home was constructed in 1919 and is in poor condition. Petitioner proposes to raze the structure and construct a single family dwelling on the lot.

A variance request involves a two-step process, summarized as follows:

(1) It must be shown the property is unique in a manner which makes it unlike surrounding properties, and that uniqueness or peculiarity must necessitate variance relief; and

(2) If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or hardship.

Cromwell v. Ward, 102 Md. App. 691 (1995).

The subject property is narrow and deep and is therefore unique. If the Regulations were strictly interpreted Petitioner would experience a practical difficulty because it would be unable to construct the proposed replacement dwelling. Finally, I find that the variance can be granted in harmony with the spirit and intent of the BCZR, and in such manner as to grant relief without injury to the public health, safety and general welfare. This is demonstrated by the absence of Baltimore County and/or community opposition.

In its ZAC comment the DOP recommended that parking for the new dwelling be provided at the rear of the home, along Blank Avenue. Mr. Billingsley explained that in the Blank Plat (recorded in 1944) which created this neighborhood, what is now Blank Avenue was shown as an alley. See Ex. 6. Blank Avenue is narrow and provides access and on-street parking for several dwellings located along that road. I believe additional parking on this narrow street/alley could present a safety hazard, and as Mr. Billingsley also noted the proposed home will have a garage and parking pad for residents' vehicles.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, this <u>17<sup>th</sup></u> day of May, 2018, by the Administrative Law Judge for Baltimore County, that the Petition for Variance pursuant to §1B02.3.C.1 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR") to permit a side yard setback of 7 ft., lot width of 43.4 ft., and lot area of 4,426 sq. ft. in lieu of the required 10 ft., 55 ft. and 6,000 sq. ft., respectively, for a replacement dwelling on an existing lot of record, be and is hereby GRANTED.

- 1. Petitioner may apply for necessary permits and/or licenses upon receipt of this Order. However, Petitioner is hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at his own risk until 30 days from the date hereof, during which time an appeal can be filed by any party. If for whatever reason this Order is reversed, Petitioner would be required to return the subject property to its original condition.
- 2. Prior to issuance of permits Petitioner must comply with the CBCA regulations.

Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

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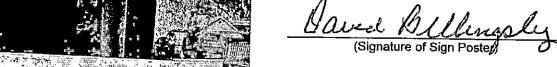

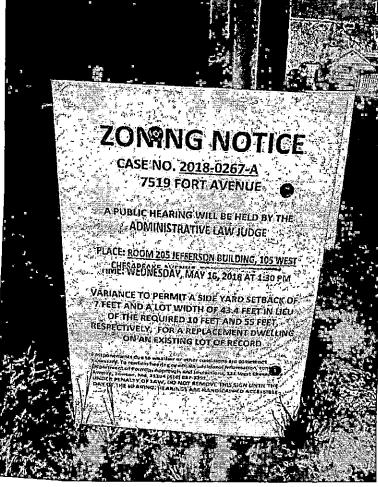

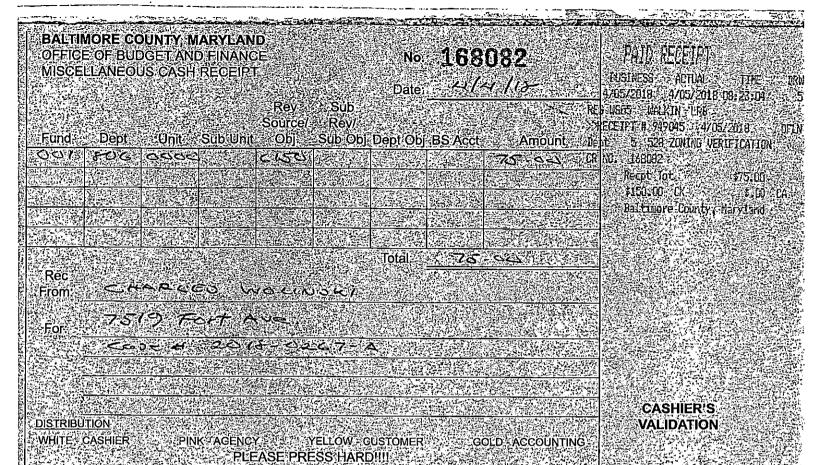

The Department of Planning has reviewed the petition for variance to permit a side yard setback of 7 feet and a lot width of 43.4 feet in lieu of the required 10 feet and 55 feet, respectively, for a replacement dwelling on an existing lot of record.

A site visit was conducted on April 17, 2018. The site is within a Community Conservation Area (CCA) as per the Master Plan 2020. The subject property is currently improved with a duplex dwelling a portion of which occupies 7517 Fort Avenue. Zoning petition in case # 18-266-A, being nearly identical to this petition, has been filed for 7517 Fort Avenue. Because of the immediate proximity, the Department will review the proposals comprehensively.

The Department has no objection to granting the petitioned zoning relief conditioned upon the following:

• This filing presents an opportunity to raise the residential performance of this property and provide incentive for other residential properties in the area to do the same. The Department is fully supportive of the petitioner's efforts. That notwithstanding, the Department advises that no matter the condition the community may be in, the Department is not obviated from its duty to apply the goals of the Master Plan 2020 in ensuring the orderly development of the County so directed by BCZR § 100.1.A. CCAs were established to "conserve, revitalize and enhance our older communities" (MP2020 pg. 39). ### **OPINION AND ORDER**

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for consideration of a Petition for Special Hearing filed on behalf of Carolyn Whittington, legal owner, and Paulette Ringley, lessee ("Petitioners"). The Special Hearing was filed pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR") as follows:

- 1. To approve an amended site plan to include a new agriculture building;
- 2. To confirm the special exception area may also include RC 2 uses by right;
- 3. To amend the prior Special Exception Order dated November 9, 2006 in Case No. 06-437-X to allow the agricultural use of the barn in the special exception area;
- 4. To amend Condition 2 of the Order, Case No. 06-437-X:
- a. To allow the facilities within the special exception area to be utilized for private parties and to allow the advertising of such events; and
- b. To allow a farmer's roadside stand to sell farm products to customers inside and outside the special exception area;
- 5. To amend Condition 4 of the previous Order to eliminate the restrictions for use of the stables;
- 6. To amend Condition 5 of the previous Order:

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- a. To eliminate the limit to the number of dogs that can attend commercial kennel (dog training classes);
  - b. To amend the hours to Monday through Sunday, 9:00 a.m.-9:00 p.m.;
- c. To allow outside training of dogs in the outdoor riding ring area in addition to the outdoor riding ring uses provided in Condition 8 of the previous Order, and;
- 7. To confirm the by-right commercial agricultural uses of the subject property, including farmer's roadside stand, field crops, animal husbandry, raising/keeping of animals, riding stables and horse training.

A site plan was marked and admitted as Petitioners' Exhibit No. 1.

Paulette Ringley and Bernadette Moskunas appeared in support of the petition. J. Neil Lanzi Esq., represented the Petitioners. Several neighbors attended the hearing to obtain additional information and to express concern regarding certain aspects of the operation. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations. A substantive Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comment was received from the Department of Planning (DOP). That agency opposed several of the special hearing requests.

#### SPECIAL HEARING

Petitioners in 2006 (No. 2006-437-X) were granted special exception approval to operate a "commercial kennel" on the subject property, a 19.9 acre tract zoned RC-2. Ms. Ringley testified she has worked at the farm for 12+ years, and she described the types of animals, crops and flowers that she raises at the site. The kennel business, known as the Humane Domain, provides dog training classes, educational seminars and other learning experiences for children, students, veterans and other special needs groups. Dog boarding is not offered at the site. The business has been successful and has grown since it was approved in 2006 Part Forder INDEA.

time friction and disagreements have arisen with certain neighbors. This had led to numerous complaints filed with the County's Code Enforcement bureau. Petitioners seek through this special hearing to amend certain of the restrictions imposed in the 2006 order and to obtain clarification of exactly what activities/uses are permitted at the subject property.

An owner/lessee may seek to modify a zoning order, provided she can show there has been a change in circumstances which justifies reconsideration of the original order. *Seminary Galleria, LLC v. Dulaney Valley Improv. Ass'n.*, 192 Md. App. 719 (2010). In this case the commercial kennel and other activities at the property have increased in scale, which I believe justifies revisiting the earlier Order which is now 12 years old. In addition, Petitioners are not seeking variances or additional special exceptions. Rather, the petition for special hearing is in essence a declaratory judgment, which is specifically permitted under B.C.Z.R. §500.7. *Antwerpen v. Balto. Co.*, 163 Md. App. 194, 209 (2005) ("A request for special hearing is, in legal effect, a request for a declaratory judgment"). Such a petition seems especially appropriate in this case, since it will hopefully clarify the terms under which the property must operate and impose clear restrictions which should eliminate the need for code enforcement officials to make judgment calls when interpreting the 2006 Order.

As noted above, the subject property is zoned RC-2 and is actively farmed by Petitioners. Petitioners also raise farm animals at the property. These uses are favored in the RC-2 zone. Owners of agricultural land in Baltimore County often struggle to generate sufficient income from their property, and frequently seek to offer additional services or products to increase their rate of return. This is not an unreasonable goal, but an owner cannot be given carte blanche authority to use her property as she sees fit.

The zoning regulations specifically require that a special exception use (i.e., commercial ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING

kennel) not have a detrimental impact upon the community. BCZR §502.1. The subject property is located in a rural section of Baltimore County, but there are also single-family dwellings within the immediate vicinity. Petitioners must operate the property in such a manner that, while enabling them to obtain a reasonable rate of return on their investment, preserves the rural nature of the community.

As listed above the zoning petition contains several special hearing requests. Many of the requests seek to relax certain restrictions imposed upon the kennel operation in the 2006 Order. Petitioners would like to be able to train dogs and conduct educational seminars in the outdoor riding ring area shown on the plan. Petitioners explained that search and rescue dogs require outdoor training and the riding ring proposed for this use is situated at the rear of the site far removed from any off-site dwellings. As such I believe this is a reasonable request which will serve the public interest and the 2006 Order (which required all dog training to be indoors) will be amended accordingly.

Other requests in the petition pertain to the hours of operation and number of dogs permitted at any one time on the property. Petitioners explained many of their clients have requested expanded hours of operation. It is of course common for service businesses to offer expanded hours of operation to cater to working clients who find it difficult to make appointments during what was heretofore "normal business hours." I believe the kennel should be permitted to expand its hours of operation to accommodate its clientele, and I also believe the restriction on the number of dogs can be relaxed without having a negative impact upon the community. But Restriction No. 5 (i.e., "no training shall occur on Sunday") is reasonable and will be retained. While commercial activities are appropriate in rural areas under certain circumstances, I do not believe they should be 7-day a week operations.

businesses in Baltimore County do not operate on Sundays; such businesses in rural zones should be closed on Sunday as well.

Petitioners also seek to confirm that uses permitted by right in the RC-2 zone (such as a produce stand or agricultural buildings for storing agricultural equipment or products) may be conducted within the special exception area (approx. 5.5 acres) outlined on the site plan. Real property--especially an approximately 20 acre rural parcel—may be used for more than one purpose, provided the owner does not jeopardize the health, safety and welfare of her neighbors. While I am mindful of the disagreements which have arisen between Petitioners and an adjoining neighbor, I do not believe the business and agricultural activities at the subject property have had a detrimental impact upon the community. Activities and uses permitted by right under the RC-2 regulations may be conducted anywhere on the 20 acre tract, although all activities and parking for the commercial kennel must take place entirely within the special exception area.

In opposing certain of the zoning requests, the DOP cited the property's "close proximity" to Liberty Reservoir. Ms. Moskunas prepared a map (Pets. Exhibit No. 6) showing that the reservoir is approximately 1,400 feet from the subject property. As such, I do not believe the relief granted herein will have a detrimental impact upon that resource.

The DOP also noted in its ZAC comment that any increase in the number of dogs permitted on site should be considered an "accommodation" to allow dog training clients and their animals to enter and exit the site before and after class. I concur, and the modification below (permitting 20 dogs) is designed to allow Petitioners to operate the kennel without fear of receiving a code enforcement citation when there is a temporary increase in the number of dogs during the period of ingress and egress from a training session.

The Department of Planning has reviewed the petition for a special hearing to determine whether or not the Administrative Law Judge should approve the zoning relief as identified on the attachment submitted in support of the petition.

A site visit was conducted on May 10, 2018. Wards Chapel Road is a Baltimore County Scenic Route. The subject property lies within a Resource Preservation Area as established by the Baltimore County Master Plan 2020 (MP 2020). A stated goal of the Master Plan 2020 for these important areas is to "preserve valuable cultural, historic, recreational and environmental resources" (MP2020 Pg.91). The site is the subject of previous zoning case no. 06-437-X wherein petitioned zoning relief was denied in part and granted in part with conditions. The property gains access at two points, from Wards Chapel Road and from a shared driveway at the north of the property.

The Department cannot support granting the requested zoning relief in its entirety. Addressing the zoning petition attachment point by point, the Department offers the following recommendations.

Attachment #1 – The Department can support the expansion of the previously approved special exception through the construction of a new agricultural building only if such building provides sufficient separation from the dwelling at 4233 Wards Chapel Road to mitigate any adverse impacts.

Attachment #2 – The Department recommends that the riding stable and commercial kennel uses established in the prior case along with the pasturing of a menagerie of animals represents the limit the land may accommodate such activities and remain within the goals of the MP 2020 for Resource Preservation Areas, especially for an area in such close proximity to the Liberty Reservoir. Limiting the intensity of the use to that already established will also ensure the requirements of BCZR §502 are met therefore the Department does not support additional RC 2 uses, whether by right or by special exception, in combination with the prior approved special exception uses.

Attachment #4 (a) (b) and #7 – Please see Attachment #2 response above. The Department is not opposed to a <u>temporary</u> produce stand as defined in BCZR §101.1 at a location on the south side of the property, outside of the established special exception area and in close proximity to Wards Chapel Road, provided adequate sight distance is provided to ensure public safety.

Attachment #5 – The plan does not indicate changes to the riding stable operation to cause the condition # 4 of the previous order be changed and therefore Department does not support granting the requested relief.

#### Attachment #6

- (a) The Department is not opposed to amending condition # 5 to allow a maximum of 14 canines on site but only as a brief accommodation to allow reasonable time for dog training clients to enter and exit the property before and after class. Class participation shall remain at 7 canines pursuant to said condition.
- (b) The Department is not opposed to amending condition # 5 in said order to allow dog training to occur entirely within the existing barn Monday thru Friday 12 p.m. to 9 p.m. and Saturday 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. with no dog training permitted on Sundays.

The Department of Planning has reviewed the petition for a special hearing to determine whether or not the Administrative Law Judge should approve the zoning relief as identified on the attachment submitted in support of the petition.

A site visit was conducted on May 10, 2018. Wards Chapel Road is a Baltimore County Scenic Route. The subject property lies within a Resource Preservation Area as established by the Baltimore County Master Plan 2020 (MP 2020). A stated goal of the Master Plan 2020 for these important areas is to "preserve valuable cultural, historic, recreational and environmental resources" (MP2020 Pg.91), The site is the subject of previous zoning case no. 06-437-X wherein petitioned zoning relief was denied in part and granted in part with conditions. The property gains access at two points, from Wards Chapel Road and from a shared driveway at the north of the property.

The Department cannot support granting the requested zoning relief in its entirety. Addressing the zoning petition attachment point by point, the Department offers the following recommendations.

Attachment #1 – The Department can support the expansion of the previously approved special exception through the construction of a new agricultural building only if such building provides sufficient separation from the dwelling at 4233 Wards Chapel Road to mitigate any adverse impacts.

Attachment #2 - The Department recommends that the riding stable and commercial kennel uses established in the prior case along with the pasturing of a menagerie of animals represents the limit the land may accommodate such activities and remain within the goals of the MP 2020 for Resource Preservation Areas, especially for an area in such close proximity to the Liberty Reservoir. Limiting the intensity of the use to that already established will also ensure the requirements of BCZR §502 are met therefore the Department does not support additional RC 2 uses, whether by right or by special exception, in combination with the prior approved special exception uses.

## FINDINGS OF FACTS AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter comes before the Zoning Commissioner for consideration of a Petition for Special Exception filed by the owner of the subject property, Carolyn V. Whittington and the lessee, Humane Domain, LLC (collectively, the "Petitioners"). The Petitioners seek relief from Sections 1A01.2C.21 & §1A01.2C.2 of the *Baltimore County Zoning Regulations* ("BCZR"), for use of the specifically delineated areas of the subject property and the improvements constructed thereon as a riding stable [for horses, donkeys and mules] and an outdoor commercial kennel/dog run, as shown graphically or textually on the Plat submitted in support of the Petition. The subject property and requested relief are more particularly described on the site plan submitted with the Petition and marked into evidence as Petitioners' Exhibit 1.

The record in this case reflects that the subject property was properly posted and advertised as required by the *Baltimore County Zoning Regulations* ("BCZR"). Appearing at the public hearing on this Petition were Ms. Carolyn V. Whittington who owns the subject property and Ms. Deborah Askew and Ms. Paulette Ringley, members of the lessee, Humane Domain, LLC. Accompanying the Petitioners was Daniel R. Staley, a Maryland Registered Land Surveyor and President of D.R.S.

& Associates who prepared Plat to accompany the zoning petition. Mr. Staley affixed his professional seal to the Plat. The Petitioners were represented by Howard L. Alderman, Jr., Esquire. Appearing initially in opposition to the requested relief were Ernest Conrey and Richard and Nancy Smith who were represented by Francis X Borgerding, Jr., Esquire. Also appearing in initial opposition to the relief requested was Mr. Jacobs who was represented by Benjamin Bronstein, Esquire. There were several other citizens and neighbors present who were also in initial opposition to the relief requested. The clients of Messrs. Borgerding and Bronstein and the others in initial opposition to the requested relief are referred to, collectively herein, as the Protestants.

Before this case was officially called, Messrs. Alderman, Borgerdine and Bronstein requested an opportunity to discuss the specifics of the requested relief and to explore the possibility of conditions and/or restrictions acceptable to those in attendance which, if implemented, would remove the opposition to the relief requested and proposed uses. After consultations with their respective clients and others in attendance, the attorneys present were able to develop conditions and restrictions for the proposed uses.

The hearing proceeded by way of a proffer of the evidence by Mr. Alderman, with a complete recitation of the agreed upon conditions and restrictions. Mr. Alderman proffered that the Petition was filed by the owner, who resides and will continue to reside at the subject property, and the lessee which intends to operate a riding stable and, what the BCZR define as, a commercial kennel. The subject property is approximately 19 acres in size and is presently zoned RC-2. At present, although the subject property fronts directly on Wards Chapel Road, the owner's residence is accessed through an existing gravel driveway that runs parallel to and binds on the northern property line of the subject property. In addition to Ms. Wittington's home and detached garage, the

subject property is improved with an existing metal barn and attached stables.

As originally presented, the lessee proposed to use the existing gravel drive to gain access to a proposed gravel parking area located just west of the existing metal barn. The metal barn was proposed for use as an indoor riding ring. As depicted on Petitioners' Exhibit 1, an outdoor commercial kennel/dog run was proposed for the northeast corner of the portion of the subject property shown on Sheet 1 of 2. The use of the gravel road for the proposed special exception uses and the outdoor commercial kennel/dog run were opposed by the Protestants. Mr. Alderman proffered that because the lessee proposed to train dogs to be used as search/rescue animals, assistance animals, dogs trained for therapy of disabled individuals and the training of private dogs under the K-9 good public citizen program, the BCZR (Section 101) define such training as a commercial kennel. No overnight boarding, breeding or sale of dogs was ever proposed by the lessee.

As a result of the negotiations among the Petitioners, Protestants and legal counsel, redline modifications to Petitioners' Exhibit 1 and additional conditions and restrictions were agreed upon. Specifically, the outdoor area proposed for the commercial kennel is to be removed from the plan presented for approval. The training of the dogs, to be conducted only during the days and times specified below, will occur within the existing metal barn. Additionally, there are to be no retail uses conducted on the subject property, including no sales of dog, horse or animal products. The dog training/commercial kennel use will be limited to seven (7) dogs at any one time and only during the following hours: i) Weekdays - only during evening hours; ii) Saturday - only between noon and 5:00 p.m.; and no training on Sunday.

To address the issue of access to the proposed uses, the Protestants required the special

exception use driveway to be located on the south side of the subject property within an area designated as a 50 foot wide use-in-common right of way and a permanent fence to be installed along the existing opening on the present access road, preventing its use to access the areas of special exception uses. Rather than having the special exception access road paved with macadam, which is an impervious surface, or a gravel base which might generate dust in dry periods, the Protestants proposed and the Petitioners agreed to cover the width and length of the southern access road and the required parking area with millings. To mitigate any potential visual impact on the property of Ms. Crissman, who lives south of the referenced right-of-way, her neighbors requested and the Petitioners agreed to the planting of eight, evergreen trees, 10 feet on center, parallel to the southern property line in the area of Ms. Crissman's home.

Limitations on the existing stables included four (4) stalls for the boarding of horses/donkeys/mules and six (6) stalls for the horses/donkeys/mules owned by the lessee or the owner of the subject property. The outdoor area labeled as "Riding Ring" will be used only for the riding, cantering, etc. of horses/donkeys/mules. The indoor riding ring will be used for the same functions, as well as therapeutic riding for those individuals having physical or developmental disabilities. Any and all manure will be managed in accordance with a County approved nutrient management plan.

Mr. Alderman proffered that Mr. Staley, being familiar with the subject property and the area in which the subject property is located, would offer his professional opinion that the proposed special exception uses, as limited and conditioned by agreement would not be detrimental to the health, safety or general welfare of the community nor will the uses overcrowd the land or create congestion on roads in the area. The proposed uses as conditioned and limited will not have any

adverse impact on public facilities or improvements nor will they create a potential hazard from fire, panic or other danger or otherwise interfere with adequate light and air, or be inconsistent with the impermeable surface and vegetation retention requirements of the BCZR. The proposed uses as conditioned and limited will not be inconsistent with the agricultural purposes of the property's zoning classification or with spirit and intent of the BCZR. The proffered testimony of Mr. Staley was that the proposed uses, as conditioned and limited by agreement would not be detrimental to the environmental and natural resources of the site and the vicinity including forests, streams, wetlands, aquifers and floodplains in a RC2 zone, nor would such uses as limited have any adverse effects above and beyond those inherently associated with such special exception uses irrespective of where they are located in the same zone.

The Petitioners and the Protestants agreed that a modified plan to accompany the requested relief would be prepared by the Petitioners, consistent with the proffered testimony and the agreed upon conditions and restrictions. Additionally, legal counsel for the Petitioners agreed to prepare a draft of an order for my consideration, which draft order and modified plan would be sent to Messrs. Borgerding and Bronstein for review and approval before its presentation to me for my consideration. The modified plan to accompany the Petition is accepted as Petitioners' Exhibit No. 2.

I am persuaded that the requested special exception relief should be granted, subject to the modified plan and the conditions and limitations below. The proffered testimony and evidence of the Petitioners has shown that the proposed uses, as conditioned below, meet the requirements of BCZR §§ 1A01.2C.21, 1A01.2C.2 and 502.1 and will not be detrimental to the health safety or general welfare of the public or the community.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED by the Zoning Commissioner for Baltimore County, this day of November, 2006, that: (i) the commercial kennel area in the northeast corner of the subject property and the outdoor commercial kennel use originally proposed by Petitioners have been eliminated from Petitioners' Exhibit No. 2 and are NOT approved in conjunction with this Order; and (ii) the Petition for Special Exception as modified at the time of the public hearing held, for use of specifically delineated areas of the subject property and the improvements constructed thereon as a riding stable [for horses, donkeys and mules] and a commercial kennel all as depicted on Petitioners' Exhibit No. 2, be and are hereby GRANTED, subject to the following restrictions which are conditions precedent to the relief granted herein:

- 1) Petitioners are hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at their own risk until such time as the thirty day Appellate process from this Order has expired. If, for whatever reason, this Order is reversed, the Petitioners would be required to return, and be responsible for returning, said property to its original condition.
- 2) No retail sales or uses of any kind, including without limitation sales of dog, horse or animal products shall be permitted.
- 3) No dogs are to be bred, housed overnight or boarded as part of the special exception uses granted, including no dog day care or dog weekend care.
- 4) The stables are limited to a maximum of ten (10); four (4) for boarding and six (6) for private use for horses/mules/donkeys.
- 5) The commercial kennel dog training shall be conducted entirely within the existing barn, shall be limited to seven (7) dogs at any one time and only during the following days, times and hours: i) Weekdays 4:00 p.m. until 8:30 p.m.; and ii) Saturday only between noon and 5:00 p.m.; no training shall occur on Sunday.
- 6) A permanent fence shall be constructed adjacent to the south side of the existing access road as shown on Petitioners' Exhibit No. 2, prohibiting use of such existing road for the special exception uses

approved. The existing access road will be used for residential purposes only.

- A new access road for the special exception uses shall be constructed, intersecting with Wards Chapel Road and running easterly within the existing 50 foot wide right-of-way for a distance, then running parallel to the northerly edge of the right-of-way, not less than 15 feet from said right-of-way to the proposed parking area. In lieu of a macadam surface, millings shall be used as a road surface, all as shown more particularly on Petitioners' Exhibit No. 2.
- 8) The outdoor riding ring shall be used only for the riding, cantering, etc. of horses/donkeys/mules. The open space pasture areas depicted on Petitioners' Exhibit No. 2 shall be used for the grazing of horses/donkeys and mules and are not to be used for dog training. Grazing on the balance of the entire property is permitted if all such grazing areas are properly fenced. The areas depicted on Petitioners' Exhibit No. 2 shall be used for grazing. Not less than ten acres of Petitioners' property shall be available for grazing of the horses, donkeys and/or mules.
- 9) A nutrient management plan shall be submitted to and reviewed by the County in connection with the manure/waste products resulting from the approved special exception uses and all manure removed to an approved disposal/deposition location.
- 10) If any use other than approved by this Order or as shown on Petitioners' Exhibit No. 2 is proposed, specifically on any of the open field areas in the rear of the subject property, Petitioners shall be required to seek approval by filing a Petition for Special Hearing to amend the Plan/plat approved as Petitioners' Exhibit No. 2.

When applying for a building permit, the site plan filed must reference this Case and set forth and address the conditions and restrictions of this Order.

Dear Mr. Jabion,

I am writing to you after making several attempts to resolve a few issues I have concerning the property located at 4231 Wards Chapel Rd. Marriottsville Md, 21104.

After speaking with several of your employees in the zoning department and code enforcement department I was told it was best to express my concerns to you.

I have lived at 4233 Wards Chapel road for the last 20 years. In 2005 there was a huge barn constructed on the property located at 4231 Wards Chapel Rd. This property has been listed as having agricultural zoning.

Why do I question this? It is because that is the excuse I receive every time I have a problem. The answer they give me is because it is agricultural zoning she can do it or she can build it. Yet when talking to several of my neighbors who have the same zoning they have to abide by certain rules when building on their property BUT she does not. Why is this so? Why is it still that the property has agricultural zoning I don't understand . She does not sell the hay off the farm. Does dog training income constitute as agricultural income? When speaking with several people in zoning it seems this property does not have the necessary requirements for this zoning but no one wants to question it.

I have several concerns and will go through them one at a time.

First, from the very beginning Ms. Paulette Ringley and Ms. Deborah Askew have just done whatever they wanted. ( Mrs. Carolyn Whittington owns the property). Everyone else would have been required to pull the necessary permits to run electric or put plumbing in. If you check your files there has been only one permit pulled for electric on May 31, 2006 with very little installed. The only plumbing permit was pulled on June 19, 2006 again with only a few things installed. Yet since then there has been additional electric installed inside the barn as well as outside the barn and all around the property. The same goes for plumbing. An added upstairs apartment that several people live in not specified on the original site plan has been added. Still no permits. Outdoor lighting no permit. She has even had wiring installed to run very large machines used in run a mill to process wool into yarn.

When asked by the person who was installing the mill, they were told don't worry about getting the necessary permits, don't need them. When the owners of the mill found out about the special exception ruling about no retail use or sales of any kind other than training of dogs was allowed she immediately shut down the mill and moved it out. The business was called The Mill at Meadowlands.

How is this facility safe for the public to enter if there is electric and plumbing that has not been inspected to be up to code and safe? Add a wagon full of hay inside and you have a great fire hazard.

Second, according to agricultural code there is a specific number of animals allowed per acre. At last count there are over fifty animals on this property consisting of horses, mules, donkeys, cows, alpacas, sheep, goats, and turkeys, chickens Over limit?

Third, behind the barn there is a broken down fence with a trailer, breeding area for mice, rats, possums, raccoons. Allowed?

Now to the Special Exception granted. I have enclosed a copy for your convenience.

#5 Operating hours

They start several of their classes at 10 or 11 A.M exception states 12 noon.

There is not to be any classes of any kind on Sundays. Her intern program run two days Saturday and Sunday.

They are there all hours of the day having activities going on with a parking lot full of cars.

#8 Grazing on the balance of the entire property if properly fenced. Animals get out regularly because fences are falling down. Any additional buildings are to be preapproved if being built on any of the grazing fields. She currently is building a huge building located on the property line. Awful big for a run in shed. Looks more like another barn. Why not 6 feet from boundary line? Where's the preapproval.

#9 I have made several calls to find out if there is a Nutrient Management Plan. No one seems to be able to tell me if one exists. The manure is left on the fields. They are never raked or treated. When they clean the stalls the manure is piled outside of stall door in corner and left. The animals use it as a bed.

We are right across the street from Liberty Dam and when it rains the water runs off the barn into the fields and then runs down the street and crosses over and eventually ends up in the dam. We get our water from a well that is located less than 20 feet from this property. Would you not be concerned? Is not all manure to be removed to an approved disposal/deposition location?

Why have we waited this long to file a complaint. We have tried to ignore her but guess I am finally tired of having the local police and DNR police visit my house for every little unfound thing. It seems the more you try to ignore her the worst she gets. I truly think she must have too much time on her hands with nothing to do but harass other people, pick on a 13 year old boy or a handicapped 76 year old man. She thinks she is above the law and she can do whatever she wants when she wants. Maybe my complaints will keep her busy for a while. She is the first to complain about what other people are doing. My mother always taught me people who live in glass houses should not throw stones. I guess her mother never taught her the same.

I would like to thank you in advance for taking the time to look into my concerns and would appreciate it if you could send me your results in writing as it seems no one in your departments take the time to respond back to me when I have a complaint even though I leave my name and telephone number.

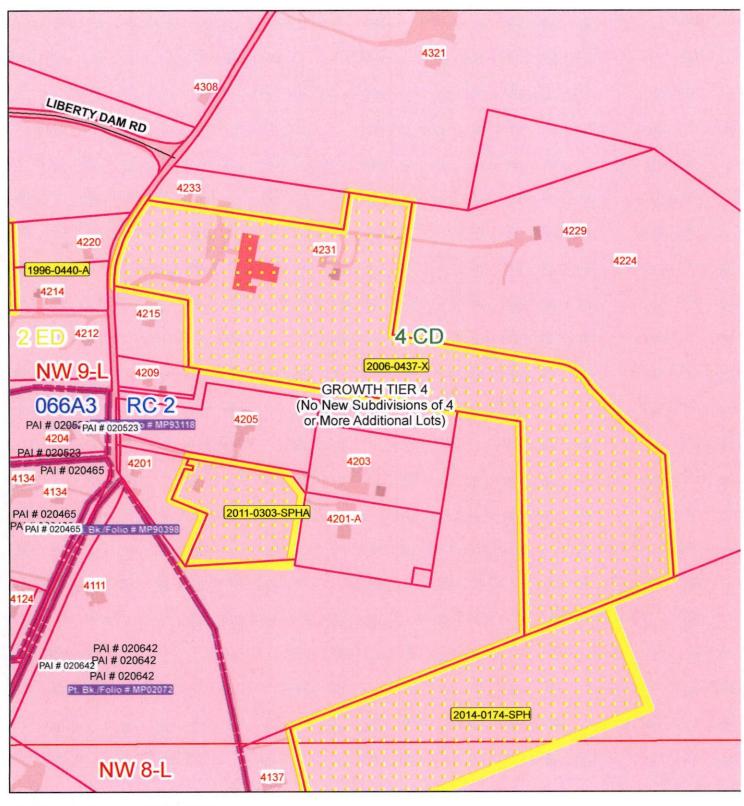

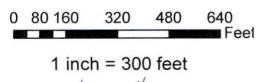

I am in receipt of and have reviewed your letter dated June 14, 2018 in connection with the captioned zoning case, on which Ms. Merrick was copied. You are seeking clarification of certain issues discussed in the June 1, 2018 order issued in this zoning case.

The restrictions in the order pertaining to the days and hours of operation concern only the "commercial kennel" special exception granted in the 2006 order involving the subject property. Such restrictions are expressly contemplated by BCZR Sec. 502.2, and thus any and all activities which would be encompassed within the BCZR definition of "commercial kennel" must be conducted within the special exception area and are subject to the days and hours of operation restrictions. The BCZR (Sec. 101.1) defines "commercial kennel" (in pertinent part) as an "establishment where the...training of dogs takes place." As such, any activities at the property which directly or tangentially involve dog training are subject to the restrictions in Condition No. 6 of the June 1, 2018 Order.

Uses permitted by right in the RC 2 zone may be conducted anywhere on the property and are not subject to the restrictions imposed on the commercial kennel use.

Thank you for the Decision and Order rendered in the above captioned case. In the interest of my client avoiding conflicts and potential code violations in the future, I am writing to you today for clarification.

Specifically, in Item 6 of your Order, you allowed the amendment of Condition 5 of the 2006 Order by now limiting the number of dogs at any one time on the property to 20 and amending the hours of operation for the dog training (special exception use) Monday through Friday, 12:00 p.m. – 9:00 p.m. and Saturdays, 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. In Item 4 of your Order, you approved the use of the facilities within the special exception area of the property for ancillary agricultural uses without any restriction as to days or times. You indicated in the body of the Opinion that such ancillary agricultural activities that were permitted by right under RC2 Regulations could be conducted anywhere on the 20 acre tract and not be limited to the special exception area.

Accordingly, I specifically request confirmation the ancillary (by right) agricultural uses (educational seminars and programs, children's educational programs, animal rescue training, animal trainer training, assistance dog training, patient therapy, rabbit rescue and to allow the advertising of such on petitioner's website and otherwise) are allowed without restriction as to location on the property, days or times. You had also indicated in the body of your Opinion that you agreed that Restriction 5 in the previous Order (i.e., "no [dog] training shall occur on Sunday") would be retained thus limiting the restriction to no dog training only on Sundays. My understanding of your Order is the day and time restriction is limited to dog training only.
