ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE'S DEVELOPMENT PLAN AND ZONING OPINION & ORDER (COMBINED HEARING)

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for Baltimore County for a public hearing on a development proposal submitted in accordance with Article 32, Title 4, of the Baltimore County Code ("BCC"). Trustees of Collective Christian Ministries, Inc., Collective Christian Ministries, Inc., P & S Development Co. and Edward Jr. & Cleotha McLaurin, *Legal Owners*, and P & S Development Co., *Applicant/Developer*, of the subject property, (hereinafter "the Developer"), submitted for approval a one-sheet redlined Development Plan ("Plan") prepared by Colbert, Matz, Rosenfelt, LLC, known as "Raven Ridge."

The Developer is proposing 17 single family detached dwellings and two (2) existing church structures on 5.17 gross acres zoned D.R. 5.5, R-O, OR-1 and CB. The property is currently improved with two (2) church structures which will remain.

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The Developer also has filed a Petition for Special Hearing pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR") as follows:

- 1. To amend the previously approved site plan and Order in Zoning Case No. 2005-0250-A to remove the proposed and never constructed 3,523 sq. ft. assembly hall and potential 3,608 sq. ft. expansion building and 69 space parking lot and to affirm the Residential Transition Area ("RTA") relief of 10 ft. for the existing church,
- 2. To approve a modified parking plan as permitted by BCZR, § 409.12.B, for the existing parking conditions for the existing use,
- 3. To grant the recommendation of the Director of Environmental Protection and Sustainability ("DEPS") and to grant a Special Variance to permit the removal of specimen trees in accordance with BCC § 33-6-116(g), and
- 4. To approve a waiver from Baltimore County Standard Design Plate R-J-4 to permit a public street with a 50 ft. right-of-way with 28 ft. wide paving in lieu of the required 50 ft. right-of-way with 30 ft. wide paving.

Finally, Developer has filed a Petition for Variance from the BCZR as follows:

- 1. § 1B01.2.C.1.b, to permit a minimum distance of 11 ft. from the front building face to public street right-of-way in lieu of the required 25 ft. for Lot No. 7,
- 2. § 1B01.2.C.1.b, to permit a minimum distance of 6 ft. from the side building face to public street right-of-way in lieu of the required 15 ft. for Lot No. 7, and
- 3. § 301.1.A, to permit an 18 ft. rear yard setback from an open porch to the rear property line in lieu of the required 22.5 ft. for Lot Nos. 5-7 and 9-16.

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The development and zoning cases were considered at a combined hearing as permitted by BCC § 32-4-230. Details of the proposed development are more fully depicted on the redlined one-sheet Development Plan that was marked and accepted into evidence as Developer's Exhibit 2. The property was posted with the Notice of Hearing Officer's Hearing and Zoning Notice on June 23, 2018, in compliance with the regulations, in order to inform all interested citizens of the date and location of the hearing. The undersigned conducted the hearing on July 27, 2018, at 10:00 AM, Room 205 of the Jefferson Building, 105 West Chesapeake Avenue, Towson, Maryland.

In attendance at the Hearing Officer's Hearing (HOH) in support of the Plan on behalf of the Developer and property owner were Edward McLaurin, Cleo McLaurin, Dalmir Rodrigues, Richard Matz, Tony Corteal, Tom Scherr, Gavin Scherr, and Matthew Bishop, landscape architect, with Colbert, Matz & Rosenfelt, LLC, the consulting firm that prepared the site plan. Timothy M. Kotroco, Esquire appeared and represented the Developer. Several members of the community (whose names are on the sign-in sheets in the file) attended the hearing to obtain additional information regarding the project.

Numerous representatives of the various Baltimore County agencies who reviewed the Plan also attended the hearing, including the following individuals from the Department of Permits, Approvals and Inspections ("PAI"): Darryl Putty, Project Manager, Eugene Cauley, Development Plans Review ("DPR")/Department of Public Works ("DPW"), LaChelle Imwiko, DPR/Recreation and Parks ("R&P"), and Leonard Wasilewski (Office of Zoning Review). Also appearing on behalf of the County were Steve Ford from the Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability ("DEPS"), and Jeffrey D. DelMonico from the Department of Planning ("DOP").

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All County agency representatives (with one exception noted below) indicated the Plan addressed all comments submitted by their agency, and they each recommended approval of the Plan. Mr. DelMonico indicated that although the DOP approved a pattern book (Baltimore County Exhibit 5) for the project, that agency noted in its compatibility findings (Baltimore County Exhibit 6) that the proposed dwelling accessed from Liberty Road should provide parking in the rear of the dwelling rather than in a front-loaded garage as shown on the Plan.

In its case, the Developer presented one (1) witness: Matthew Bishop with Colbert, Matz, & Rosenfelt, LLC, a registered landscape architect who was accepted as an expert. The witness described the project in detail and also discussed the zoning requests, as detailed in a subsequent portion of this Order. Mr. Bishop described the means of access to the project, which will primarily consist of 16 single family dwellings oriented around a cul-de-sac. As noted above, one single-family dwelling shown on the Plan will be accessed from Liberty Road. The witness also testified that the Developer prefers to construct homes with front-loaded garages, which is a more modern design sought by purchasers. With respect to the one home accessed off of Liberty Road, Mr. Bishop testified there will be ample room for the owners to back their vehicle out of the garage and into a paved turn around shown on the Plan. He opined this would be a safe configuration and would not require owners to back out of the driveway onto Liberty Road. In conclusion, Mr. Bishop opined Developer satisfied all Baltimore County development rules and regulations.

The BCC provides that the "Hearing Officer shall grant approval of a development plan that complies with these development regulations and applicable policies, rules and regulations." BCC § 32-4-229. Based on the testimony and evidence presented by the Developer, and confirmation from the various County agencies that the Plan satisfies those agencies'

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requirements, I find that the Developer has satisfied its burden of proof and, therefore, the Development Plan shall be approved.

VARIANCE REQUESTS

The zoning petition filed in this case contains three (3) variance requests, as detailed hereinabove. There were no substantive Zoning Advisory Committee ("ZAC") comments received from any of the County reviewing agencies.

Variances

A variance request involves a two-step process, summarized as follows:

- (1) It must be shown the property is unique in a manner which makes it unlike surrounding properties, and that uniqueness or peculiarity must necessitate variance relief; and
- (2) If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or hardship.

Cromwell v. Ward, 102 Md. App. 691 (1995).

Mr. Bishop testified the property is irregularly shaped with the one lot on Liberty Road creating a "finger" off of the otherwise rectangular tract. The property is therefore unique. If the regulations were strictly interpreted, Developer would experience a practical difficulty because it would be unable to build the dwelling units shown on the Plan. Finally, I find that the variances can be granted in harmony with the spirit and intent of the BCZR, and in such manner as to grant relief without injury to the public health, safety and general welfare. This is demonstrated by the lack of Baltimore County and/or community opposition.

With regard to the proposed dwelling on Liberty Road, I believe the means of ingress and egress described by Mr. Bishop would be safe and should be approved. DOP representatives stressed safety is in fact the paramount consideration (more so than concerns with aesthetics and/or compatibility) and I believe Developer successfully addressed that point. In addition, the ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING

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State Highway Administration ("SHA") submitted a ZAC comment indicating that agency will need to review and approve the proposed means of ingress/egress from this lot. I trust the SHA will issue a "residential access permit" only if it is satisfied the access is safe and satisfies state guidelines.

Two remaining items need to be addressed. First, the DPW approved "waivers" permitting a 40 ft. cul-de-sac radius (in lieu of 60 ft.) and street paving width of 28 ft. in lieu of 30 ft. Mr. Bishop testified such requests are routinely granted and he explained they allow the developer to provide wider sidewalks and less impervious surface in the community. These are worthwhile goals and I will approve the waivers.

The final point concerns a Special Variance granted by DEPS, permitting "critical impacts to five specimen trees." Developer's Exhibit 2, Note 15. Mr. Ford testified DEPS analyzed the request and determined Developer satisfied the requirements set forth at BCC § 33-6-116. No evidence or argument was presented to suggest that agency's analysis was defective or incorrect, and I will accept the recommendation and grant the Special Variance.

For purposes of clarification, only two (2) specimen trees will be removed from the subject property. The Developer indicated three (3) other specimen trees located off site (but close to the property boundary) could be impacted, which will require the Developer to observe certain root protection measures, as determined in the sole discretion of DEPS.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED by this Administrative Law Judge/Hearing Officer for Baltimore County, this <u>3rd</u> day of **August**, **2018**, that the "RAVEN RIDGE" redlined Development Plan, marked and accepted into evidence as Developer's Exhibit 2, be and is hereby **APPROVED**, subject to the conditions noted below.

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IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Petition for Special Hearing pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR") as follows:

- 1. To amend the previously approved site plan and Order in Zoning Case No. 2005-0250-A to remove the proposed and never constructed 3,523 sq. ft. assembly hall and potential 3,608 sq. ft. expansion building and 69 space parking lot and to affirm the Residential Transition Area ("RTA") relief of 10 ft. for the existing church; and
- 2. To approve a modified parking plan as permitted by BCZR, § 409.12.B, for the existing parking conditions for the existing use; and
- 3. To approve a waiver from Baltimore County Standard Design Plate R-J-4 to permit a public street with a 50 ft. right-of-way with 28 ft. wide paving in lieu of the required 50 ft. right-of-way with 30 ft. wide paving,

be and is hereby **GRANTED**.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Petition for Variance from the BCZR as follows:

- 1. § 1B01.2.C.1.b, to permit a minimum distance of 11 ft. from the front building face to public street right-of-way in lieu of the required 25 ft. for Lot No. 7,
- 2. § 1B01.2.C.1.b, to permit a minimum distance of 6 ft. from the side building face to public street right-of-way in lieu of the required 15 ft. for Lot No. 7, and
- 3. § 301.1.A, to permit an 18 ft. rear yard setback from an open porch to the rear property line in lieu of the required 22.5 ft. for Lot Nos. 5-7 and 9-16,

be and is hereby **GRANTED**.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Petition for Special Variance to accept the recommendation of the Director of the DEPS and to permit the removal of two (2) specimen

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trees in accordance with BCC § 33-6-116(g), as approved by DEPS on May 17, 2018, be and is hereby GRANTED.

The relief granted herein shall be subject to the following condition(s):

• Prior to recordation of a plat for the project, Developer shall pay to Baltimore County \$51,365.43, which represents the required fee in lieu of providing approximately 14,634 sq. ft. of open space, as detailed on Baltimore County Exhibit 2.

Any appeal of this Order shall be taken in accordance with Baltimore County Code, § 32-4-281.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter comes before the Zoning Commissioner for consideration of a Petition for Variance filed by the owner of the subject property, Trustees of Collective Christian Ministries, Inc., through their attorney, John B. Gontrum, Esquire. The Petitioners seek relief from the Residential Transition Area requirements set forth in Section 1B01.1B.1(c) of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) to permit a church and parking lot with a setback and buffer of 2 feet each in lieu of the required 75 feet and 50 feet, respectively. In the alternative, a special hearing is requested, pursuant to Section 1B01.1.B.1.g(6) of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (BCZR), seeking a determination that the proposed church and parking lot have been planned in such a way that compliance to the extent possible with the RTA use requirements will be maintained and can be expected to be compatible with the character and general welfare of the surrounding residential premises. The subject property and requested relief are more particularly described on the site plan submitted, which was accepted into evidence and marked as Petitioner's Exhibit 1.

Appearing at the requisite public hearing in support of the request were Reverend Edward McLaurin, on behalf of Trustees of Collective Christian Ministries, Inc., property owners, and John B. Gontrum, Esquire, of Whiteford, Taylor & Preston, LLP, attorney for the

Owners/Petitioners. Appearing in opposition to the request was William Obriecht, a representative of the Liberty Road Community Council, Inc. Dave Green, Area Planner, appeared on behalf of the Office of Planning. There were no other interested persons present.

Testimony and evidence offered revealed that the subject property is a rectangular shaped, parcel located on the northeast side of Liberty Road, just south of Chapman Road in Randallstown. The property contains a gross area of 2.4 acres, more or less, split zoned R.O. and D.R. 5.5, and is improved with a one story office building and a two story dwelling which features an attached garage, both within the R.O. zone. As shown on the site plan submitted into evidence as Petitioner's Exhibit 1, the property has frontage of approximately 154 feet along Liberty Road; however, about 200 feet back from the road, it widens to 230 feet in width and is approximately 524 feet deep. The Petitioners are desirous of utilizing the property for a church and have apparently used the existing office building for such purpose for the past 3 years. In order to accommodate their growing congregation, the Petitioners propose improvements to the site. As shown on the site plan, the Petitioners propose construction of a 3,528 sq.ft. Church in the rear portion of the property with a seating capacity for up to 200 people. The new church will be located approximately 111 feet from the rear property line, over 121 feet from the eastern side of the property, and 84 feet from the western side of the property. Also shown is the future expansion of the new church building to provide a 3,608 sq.ft. hall. The Petitioners intend to retain the two existing buildings in the front portion of the site, zoned R.O. The macadam parking area on the west side of the existing office building will be removed and landscaped and the new parking area will be located in the center of the site, closer to the western property line adjacent to property owned by William and Ethel Darling. Due to the unique configuration of the property, the proposed improvements will be located closer to the western side of the property

than the eastern side, and thus a setback of only 2 feet will be provided at the closest point from the Darling property. It should also be noted that there appears to be a very small amount of residential zoning to the rear of the adjacent property to the east that may be an anomaly of the zoning line not conforming to the lot line. The bulk of the adjacent property at 9134 Liberty Road is zoned C.B. but the rear 15 feet of the lot is zoned D.R. 5.5 and results in the new parking area being located 35 feet from this zone line.

None of the adjacent neighbors appeared at the hearing; however, the proffered testimony indicated that the Trustees had discussed the proposed improvements and shared the site plan with the adjacent neighbors, and specifically, with Mr. Darling. Further testimony indicated that Mr. Darling's property lies between the subject site and a funeral home further to the west. While Mr. Darling has no intention of leaving his home, he has no objections to the setbacks and proposed parking, and would consider selling his property to the church. (See Petitioner's Exhibit 2, Mr. Darling's notarized statement.)

The Liberty Road Community Council, Inc. through Mr. Obriecht, its authorized representative, expressed concern over the variance requested and the precedent it might set if approved. The community association had no objection to the requested variances if the church buildings were centered on the rear of the property; however, it had no knowledge of any discussions that had been held between the church and the neighboring property owners. It consequently does not oppose the concept of the variances at this location but only the extent of the relief being sought.

The Office of Planning, within its Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments, indicated they would have no objections to the proposal provided the parking was shifted an additional 10 feet from the Darling property line. The Planning Office also believes that the

setback area should be landscaped with dense evergreen plantings and a 6-foot high privacy fence placed along the side of the property.

New churches are permitted as of right in residential zones. Although the RTA applies to new churches, two provisions are available for churches to obtain waivers or variances. Section 1B01.1B.1.c of the B.C.Z.R. provides that variance relief can be granted, based on recommendations from County agencies, provided that the hearing officer "specifically finds and determines that such a reduction will not adversely impact the residential community or development on the land adjacent to the property to be developed." In the alternative, Section 1B01.1B.1g(6) provides that following a public hearing, the hearing officer may determine that the RTA is not applicable upon a finding that "the proposed improvements are planned in such a way that compliance, to the extent possible with RTA use requirements, will be maintained and that said plan can otherwise be expected to be compatible with the character and general welfare of the surrounding residential premises."

The standards differ between Section 1B01.1B.1g(6) and Section 1B01.1B.1.c. The former requires a finding that the proposed improvements are planned so that compliance with RTA is "to the extent possible...." Section 1B01.1B.1.c allows variance relief to be granted, provided that there is no adverse impact by virtue of the variance to the adjoining property or residential community.

It is clear from the proffered testimony that there are no objections to the proposed church, its size or scope of activities at this location. It also is clear that no one is protesting the 69 parking spaces provided or the future expansion. What makes this case unusual is that the Petitioners deliberately chose not to center the proposed church and parking on the lot, but rather

placed it in the western portion of the site in expectation, no doubt, of perhaps acquiring the adjacent Darling tract at some point in the future.

It is clear that the Darlings do not have any objection to the church's proposal, and indeed the testimony and evidence presented was to the contrary. It was represented by Pastor McLaurin that he had personally met with Mr. Darling and that Mr. Darling was not interested in additional landscaping, fences or setbacks beyond those shown on Petitioner's Exhibit 1. Moreover, the adjacent property is only 70 feet wide, and development of the rear portion of the tract is going to be problematic given the location of the existing house and the location of the funeral home to the west. I can well appreciate why providing a 19-foot buffer between the existing church office building and the Darling house on the adjacent property as proposed would be more attractive than a buffer area to the rear of the site.

Based on the representations made at the hearing, it would appear that Mr. Darling has no objections and feels that there would be no detriment to his property by allowing the variance requested. Furthermore, the proposed parking setback from the undeveloped portion of his property would appear to have little impact on the development potential of his site. I further understand that he has no desire for a fence or landscaping along the property line, although such a fence or landscaping would screen vehicle lights in the evening from his property.

After due consideration of the testimony and evidence presented, I am persuaded that the relief requested meets the spirit and intent of Section 307 of the B.C.Z.R., and that variance relief should be granted from Section 1B01.1B.1(c). I find that the church proposed is compatible with the neighborhood and that the variances proposed will not be a detriment to the residential community or adjacent property. I am not convinced that there is an appreciable difference between a 2-foot setback and a 10-foot setback for the parking area as recommended by the

Office of Planning, given its location relative to the adjacent property. I recognize the desire of the church to maintain flexibility in its parking, and I believe that adequate parking is more important to the adjacent community for a facility of this nature than a setback from what is essentially open space. Furthermore, there is no indication of any adverse impact from the proposal to the residential properties to the east or north or to the front property, predominantly zoned C.B. As shown on the site plan, the Petitioners will provide a 10-foot wide amenity open space area along the eastern side of the parking lot.

Pursuant to the advertisement, posting of the property and public hearing on this Petition held, and for the reasons set forth above, the requested variance relief will be granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED by the Zoning Commissioner for Baltimore County this ______ day of March 2005 that the Petition for Variance seeking relief from the Residential Transition Area requirements set forth in Section 1B01.1B.1(c) of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) to permit a church and parking lot with a setback and buffer of 2 feet each in lieu of the required 75 feet and 50 feet, respectively, in accordance with Petitioner's Exhibit 1, be and is hereby GRANTED, subject to the following restrictions:

- 1) The Petitioners may apply for their building permit and be granted same upon receipt of this Order; however, the Petitioners are hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at their own risk until the 30-day appeal period from the date of this Order has expired. If an appeal is filed and this Order is reversed, the relief granted herein shall be rescinded.
- 2) But for the recommendation as to a 10-foot setback and landscaping, the Petitioners shall comply with the recommendations made by the Office of Planning, within its ZAC comment dated December 10, 2004, a copy of which is attached hereto be made a part hereof. The Petitioners shall not be required to provide landscaping within the 2-foot setback; however, a 6-foot high wood privacy fence shall be erected anywhere that the proposed parking lot adjoins a residential

property line. Elevation drawings for the proposed fence shall be provided to the Office of Planning for review and approval.

3) When applying for any permits, the site plan filed must reference this case and set forth and address the restrictions of this Order.

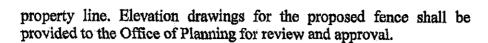

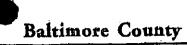

WHEREAS, this matter came before the Zoning Commissioner for consideration of a Petition for Variance filed by the owner of the subject property, Trustees of Collective Christian Ministries, Inc., through their attorney, John B. Gontrum, Esquire. The Petitioners sought relief from the Residential Transition Area requirements set forth in Section 1B01.1B.1(c) of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) to permit a church and parking lot with a setback and buffer of 2 feet each in lieu of the required 75 feet and 50 feet, respectively. In the alternative, the Petitioner sought approval, pursuant to Section 1B01.1.B.1.g(6) of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (BCZR), that the proposed church and parking lot comply to the extent possible with the RTA use requirements.

At the public hearing held on January 24, 2005, Reverend Edward McLaurin, appeared on behalf of Trustees of Collective Christian Ministries, Inc., property owners, as well as their attorney, John B. Gontrum, Esquire, of Whiteford, Taylor & Preston, LLP. William Obriecht, a representative of the Liberty Road Community Council, Inc., and Dave Green, a representative of the Office of Planning, appeared in opposition to the request.

It is the reduced buffer area that is at issue.

By my Order dated March 7, 2005, I granted the variance relief, given the fact that testimony presented at the hearing indicated that the Darlings had no objection to the reduced setback from their property line. Moreover, Counsel for the Petitioners indicated that the Church anticipated purchasing the Darling property at some point in the future and thus, the reduced setback would not be an issue. Further testimony indicated that a funeral home is located immediately west of the Darling property. I also found that adequate parking is more important to the adjacent community for a facility of this nature than a setback from what is essentially open space. Finally, I found that there would be no adverse impacts to the residential properties to the east or north or to the front property, which are predominantly zoned C.B.

Subsequent to the issuance of said Order, Motions for Reconsideration were received from the Office of People's Counsel and Mr. Obriecht. Both parties question whether the proposed improvements are appropriate for this site and request, at a minimum, that I amend my decision and require a minimum 10-foot buffer/setback on the west side, as originally recommended by the Office of Planning.

After due consideration of all of the representations made by both parties, I decline to reppen this case for further proceedings. As noted in my prior opinion, churches are permitted as of right in residential zones. Moreover, variances from the RTA requirements can be granted, pursuant to Section 1B01.1B.1.c of the B.C.Z.R., provided that the relief sought will not oversely impact the residential community or development on the land adjacent to the property



to be developed. In this regard, the Petitioners testified that they specifically met with immediately adjoining property owners and no one had any opposition to their plans. It is also of note that the Petitioners have operated a church on the subject property for the past 3 years, without complaint, and none of the neighbors who would be most affected by the Petitioners' proposal attended the hearing. Thus, it appears that only an amendment of my prior decision to require a minimum buffer/setback of 10 feet is necessary, and I shall so Order.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED by the Zoning Commissioner for Baltimore County this ______ day of April 2005 that the Order issued on March 7, 2005 be and the same shall hereby be AMENDED;

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a variance from the Residential Transition Area requirements set forth in Section 1B01.1B.1(c) of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) to permit a church and parking lot with a setback and buffer of 10 feet each in lieu of the required 75 feet and 50 feet, respectively, be and is hereby GRANTED, subject to the following restriction:

1) Prior to the issuance of any building permits, the Petitioners shall submit a revised site plan to the Office of Planning and the Department of Permits and Development Management which reflects a minimum 10-foot setback and buffer on the west side of the property.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that but for the modified relief set forth above, all other terms and conditions of the Order issued March 7, 2005 shall remain in full force and effect.

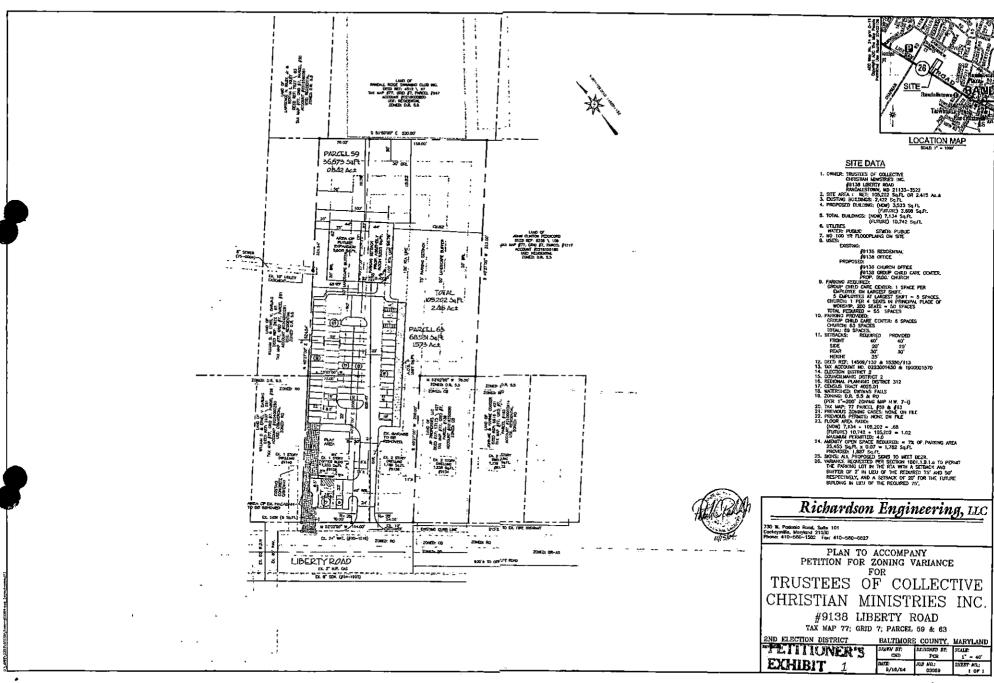
