OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for Baltimore County for consideration of Petitions for Special Hearing, Special Exception and Variance filed on behalf of Dan Mar Enterprises, LLC & 10825 Beaver Dam Road, LLC, legal owners, and 10825 Beaver Dam Road, LLC, contract purchaser ("Petitioners").

The Petition for Special Hearing was filed pursuant to Section 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR") to approve additional fuel dispensers in an existing fuel service station and an amendment to the previously approved zoning site plan in Case No. 2014-0263-SPHX. In addition, a Petition for Variance seeks approval: (1) for a side yard setback of 10 ft. in lieu of the 30 ft. required; and (2) for two freestanding enterprise signs in lieu of one permitted. Finally, a Petition for Special Exception was filed to use the herein described property for a fuel service station, a full service car wash and a fast food restaurant as uses in combination with a fuel service station.

Appearing at the public hearing in support of the requests was professional engineer Wayne Newton. Dino C. La Fiandra, Esq., represented the Petitioners. There were no protestants or interested citizens in attendance. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the BCZR.

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Substantive Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were submitted by the Bureau of Development Plans Review ("DPR"), the Department of Planning ("DOP") and the Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability ("DEPS"). None of the reviewing agencies opposed the requests.

The subject property is approximately three (3) acres in size and is zoned ML-IM. A gasoline station has operated at the site since 1972, and at present a fuel service station and High's convenience store is operated on the subject property. Petitioners propose to expand the fuel service operation and add a fast-food restaurant (inside of a convenience store) and full service car wash, both of which are permitted in the ML-IM zone by special exception.

The Bureau of DPR noted a flood plain exists on a portion of the site, and Petitioners revised the plan to show the limits of the flood plain. Wayne Newton, a professional engineer accepted as an expert, testified no structures or improvements (including the trash corral, which was relocated outside of the flood hazard area) would be situated within the flood plain. Mr. Newton also confirmed several mature evergreen trees located along the southeast tract boundary will be retained, as requested by the DOP. Petitioners also presented preliminary elevations of the car wash (which were also shown to the DOP), and it appears the structure will be attractive and complement existing site improvements.

Special Exception

Under Maryland law, a special exception use enjoys a presumption that it is in the interest of the general welfare, and therefore, valid. *Schultz v. Pritts*, 291 Md. 1 (1981). The *Schultz* standard was revisited in *Attar v. DMS Tollgate*, *LLC*, 451 Md. 272, (2017), where the court of appeals discussed the nature of the evidentiary presumption in special exception cases. The court again emphasized a special exception is properly denied only when there are facts and ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING

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circumstances showing that the adverse impacts of the use at the particular location in question would be above and beyond those inherently associated with the special exception use.

Mr. Newton opined Petitioners satisfied all requirements set forth in BCZR §502.1 and the Maryland case law interpreting that provision. As noted earlier a fuel service station has operated at this location for more than 45 years, and no evidence was presented to rebut the presumption in favor of the special exception use. Moreover, one of the ingress/egress points will be relocated so that it aligns with the existing traffic signal at Beaver Dam and McCormick Roads, which will greatly improve traffic flow. As such the petition will be granted.

Special Hearing

The petition for special hearing is essentially a "housekeeping" matter rather than a substantive zoning request. In 2014 a site plan was approved in Case No. 2014—0263-SPHX. That plan showed certain improvements which were proposed at the time, although they never were constructed. The present request simply seeks to amend that earlier plan, in accordance with the site plan approved in this case, which would supersede the 2014 plan. This is a reasonable (and frequent) request, and it will benefit both the community and County review agencies. The petition will therefore be granted.

Variance

A variance request involves a two-step process, summarized as follows:

- (1) It must be shown the property is unique in a manner which makes it unlike surrounding properties, and that uniqueness or peculiarity must necessitate variance relief; and
- (2) If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or hardship.

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Cromwell v. Ward, 102 Md. App. 691 (1995).

The property has irregular dimensions and is therefore unique. If the Regulations were strictly interpreted Petitioners would experience a practical difficulty because they would be unable to construct the proposed improvements. Finally, I find that the variance can be granted in harmony with the spirit and intent of the BCZR, and in such manner as to grant relief without injury to the public health, safety and general welfare. This is demonstrated by the lack of community and/or Baltimore County opposition.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED this <u>15th</u> day of August, 2018, by this Administrative Law Judge, that the Petition for Special Hearing filed pursuant to Section 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR") to approve additional fuel dispensers in an existing fuel service station and an amendment to the previously approved zoning site plan in Case No. 2014-0263-SPHX, be and is hereby GRANTED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Petition for Special Exception to use the subject property for a fuel service station, with a full service car wash and fast food restaurant as uses in combination with a fuel service station, be and is hereby GRANTED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Petition for Variance: (1) for a side yard setback of 10 ft. in lieu of the 30 ft. required; and (2) for two freestanding enterprise signs in lieu of one permitted, be and is hereby GRANTED.

The relief granted herein shall be subject to the following:

- Petitioners may apply for necessary permits and/or licenses upon receipt
 of this Order. However, Petitioners are hereby made aware that
 proceeding at this time is at their own risk until 30 days from the date
 hereof, during which time an appeal can be filed by any party. If for
 whatever reason this Order is reversed, Petitioners would be required to
 return the subject property to its original condition.
- 2. Petitioners must comply with the ZAC comment submitted by DEPS, a copy of which is attached.

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- 3. Petitioners must provide a pedestrian crosswalk connecting the existing sidewalk adjacent to Beaver Dam Road with the convenience store.
- 4. Petitioners must submit for approval by Baltimore County landscape and lighting plans for the subject property.

Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

The Bureau of Development Plans Review has reviewed the subject zoning items and we have the following comments.

If Special Exception and Zoning Relief is granted a Landscape Plan is required, per the requirements of the Landscape Manual. A Lighting Plan is also required.

During our review of this site, I noticed that the site is within the Zone X shaded special flood hazard area as shown on FIRM Panel 2400100235F dated September 26, 2008. Looking at the FIRM closer there are associated Flood Insurance Study cross-section locations close to and running through the site.

The closest cross-sections gives water surface elevations of about 264. Based on our Baltimore County GIS, the flood plain delineation on the FIRM does not follow the ground elevations and contours shown on our GIS. Per FEMA's regulations, the flood plain delineation should follow the contour lines. This would place the rear northeast corner of this property within the special flood hazard area. It appears that there are no proposed buildings in this area. However, there is a proposed trash dumpster corral proposed in this location.

Our office does not want to make a major issue for the proposed convenience store. We recommend that the trash corral be moved to the other side of the site so it is outside of the special flood hazard area.

A revised Site Plan to Accompany Zoning Petition for the Zoning Advisory Committee as well as all other required plans should be submitted showing the trash corral relocation as well as flood plain delineation based on the elevations from the cross-sections shown on the FIRM. The engineer may use Baltimore County GIS or field run surveys to interpolate where the actual flood plain delineation is.

OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for consideration of Petitions for Special Hearing and Special Exception filed by Dino C. LaFiandra, Esquire, with Whiteford, Taylor & Preston, on behalf of 10825 Beaver Dam Road, LLC, legal owner. The Petition for Special Hearing was filed pursuant to §500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R.") to approve an amendment to the previously approved site plan in Case No. 89-306-SPHX. In addition, a Petition for Special Exception was filed pursuant to B.C.Z.R. §405.2.B.1 to use the herein property for additional fuel service in an existing fuel service station, and pursuant to §405.4.E.1 for a convenience store larger than 1,500 square feet inclusive of accessory storage.

Appearing at the public hearing in support of the requests was Briana Darnell and Wayne Newton, a professional engineer whose firm prepared the site plan. Timothy Kotroco, Esquire, with Whiteford, Taylor & Preston, represented the Petitioner. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations. There were no Protestants or interested citizens in attendance, and the file does not contain any letters of protest or opposition.

Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were received and are made part of the record of this case. Substantive comments were received from the Department of Planning ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING

Date M/7//M

(DOP) dated March 10, 2014, and the Bureau of Development Plans Review (DPR) dated February 10, 2014. The DPR requested that a landscape plan be submitted for approval by the County and the DOP opined the proposed use was appropriate and would not be injurious to the community.

Testimony and evidence offered at the hearing revealed that the subject property (comprised of two parcels) totals 113,283 square feet and is zoned ML-IM. The site is improved with a fuel service station and High's convenience store, which was approved by special exception in 1989. (Case No. 89-306-SPHX). The Petitioner proposes to expand the fuel service operation and convenience store, and was instructed by the County to file the above Petitions.

Special Hearing

The Petition for Special Hearing seeks to amend the site plan approved in Case No. 89-306-SPHX. This is in the nature of a "housekeeping" matter, and the primary issue in the case concerns the petition for special exception, discussed below.

Special Exception Standards

Special exception uses are presumptively valid and consistent with the comprehensive zoning plan, People's Counsel v. Loyola College, 406 Md. 54, 77 n. 23 (2008), and no evidence was offered here to rebut the presumption. The reality is that the special exception use has been conducted at this site for over twenty years, and there is nothing to indicate that the welfare of the community has been compromised. The BCZR contains a specific provision relating to fuel service stations lawfully in operation prior to 1993, BCZR § 405.6. That regulation contemplates that both special hearing and special exception relief is necessary in a case like this, where the operation is expanding and will include an ancillary "use in combination," (i.e., the convenience store).

Here, no testimony or evidence was presented showing that an abandoned fuel service station exists within a one-half or one mile radius of this station. In addition, both the DOP and Petitioner's engineer opined the proposal satisfied all B.C.Z.R. requirements. Mr. Newton also testified (via proffer) that the use would serve the industrial area surrounding the station, which is shown on the site plan as "Metropolitan Industrial Park." Ex. 1. As such, I believe the Petitioner has satisfied the requirements for relief, and the Petition for Special Exception will be granted.

Pursuant to the advertisement, posting of the property, and public hearing, and after considering the testimony and evidence offered, I find that Petitioner's Special Hearing and Special Exception requests should be granted.

OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for Baltimore County as a Petition for Variance on behalf of Dan Mar Enterprises, LLC, owner of the subject property ("Petitioner"). Petitioner is requesting Variance relief from the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) as follows: (1) to permit the northern addition to the garage to have a side yard setback of 4 ft. in lieu of the required 30 ft.; (2) to permit the southern addition to the garage to have a side yard setback of 4 ft. in lieu of the required 30 ft.; and (3) to permit 13 parking spaces in lieu of the required 16 parking spaces. A site plan was marked as Petitioner's Exhibit 1.

Bruce Doak, a property line surveyor, appeared in support of the petition. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the B.C.Z.R. No protestants or interested citizens attended the hearing. Substantive Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comments were received from the Department of Planning (DOP) and the Bureau of Development Plans Review (DPR).

The subject property is approximately 16,391 sq. ft. and zoned ML-IM. The property is triangular in shape and is improved with two buildings which house commercial uses. At the front of the site is a dry cleaner (which occupies a former single-family dwelling) and in the rear is an automotive body shop, which is the subject of this case. The owner of that business proposes to construct a paint booth and small addition to the body shop building. To do so variance relief is

required.

A variance request involves a two-step process, summarized as follows:

- (1) It must be shown the property is unique in a manner which makes it unlike surrounding properties, and that uniqueness or peculiarity must necessitate variance relief; and
- (2) If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or hardship.

Cromwell v. Ward, 102 Md. App. 691 (1995).

Petitioner has met this test. The property is triangular and the unique shape generates the need for the setback variances. In fact, variances for this property were granted in Case No. 1988-0496 on the same basis. If the Regulations were strictly interpreted, Petitioner would experience a practical difficulty because it would be unable to construct the paint booth and garage addition which will help to streamline its business. Finally, I find that the variance can be granted in harmony with the spirit and intent of the B.C.Z.R., and in such manner as to grant relief without injury to the public health, safety, and general welfare. This is demonstrated by the lack of community opposition.

While the DOP did not oppose the variances for the building setbacks, it did object to the parking variance. That agency indicated the site is congested and the proposed improvements would intensify the operations and demand for parking. Based on the photographs submitted at the hearing (Petitioner's Exhibit 3), it is clear the site is small and supports two commercial enterprises. But I do not believe either business generates much demand for parking. The dry cleaner is a small operation, and Petitioner explained its customers come and go within minutes. And the body shop is essentially an industrial operation which does not generate customer traffic and vehicle trips in the way most commercial and retail operations do. Petitioner testified that for the most part damaged and/or disabled vehicles are brought to the site by tow truck and owners retrieve their car at a later date when the repairs are completed.

Mr. Vekker, who operates the body shop, testified he wants the paint booth to streamline his business rather than increase the number of repairs he performs. He explained he now has to "jockey" vehicles in and out of the garage when a vehicle needs to be painted, while the paint booth will allow cars to be repaired and then painted in assembly-line fashion. As such, I do not believe permitting 13 spaces in lieu of the required 16 (which is greater than 80% of the number of spaces required by B.C.Z.R. §409) would be injurious to the community.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, this 13th day of September, 2016, by the Administrative Law Judge for Baltimore County, that the Petition for Variance seeking relief from the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R.") as follows: (1) to permit the northern addition to the garage to have a side yard setback of 4 ft. in lieu of the required 30 ft.; (2) to permit the southern addition to the garage to have a side yard setback of 4 ft. in lieu of the required 30 ft.; and (3) to permit 13 parking spaces in lieu of the required 16 parking spaces, be and is hereby GRANTED.

The relief granted herein shall be subject to the following:

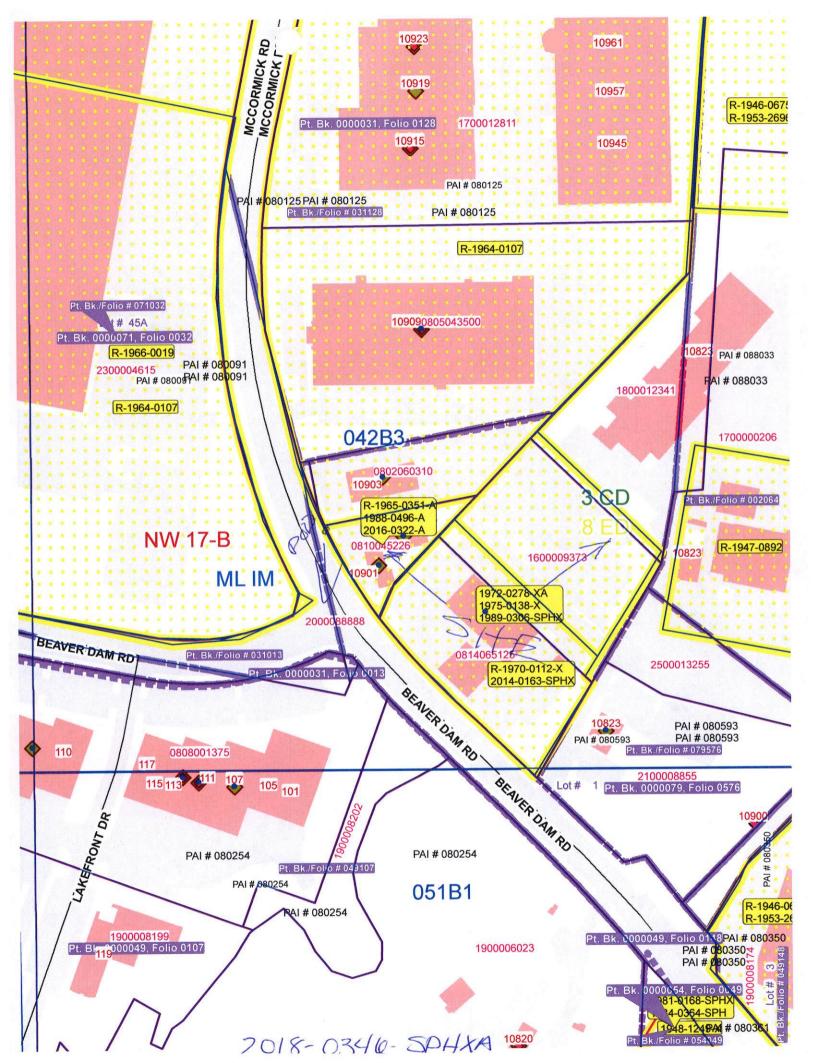
- 1. Petitioner may apply for necessary permits and/or licenses upon receipt of this Order. However, Petitioner is hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at its own risk until 30 days from the date hereof, during which time an appeal can be filed by any party. If for whatever reason this Order is reversed, Petitioner would be required to return the subject property to its original condition.
- 2. Prior to issuance of building permits Petitioner must submit for approval by DPR lighting and landscape plans for the site to include an enclosure for the existing dumpster.
- 3. No damaged or disabled motor vehicles shall for a period longer than 24 hours be stored or kept in the parking areas at the front of the site nearest Beaver Dam and McCormick Roads. All such vehicles must be kept in the storage area shown on the plan (which is enclosed by an 8' high slatted fence) and in compliance with the requirements of B.C.Z.R. §405A.

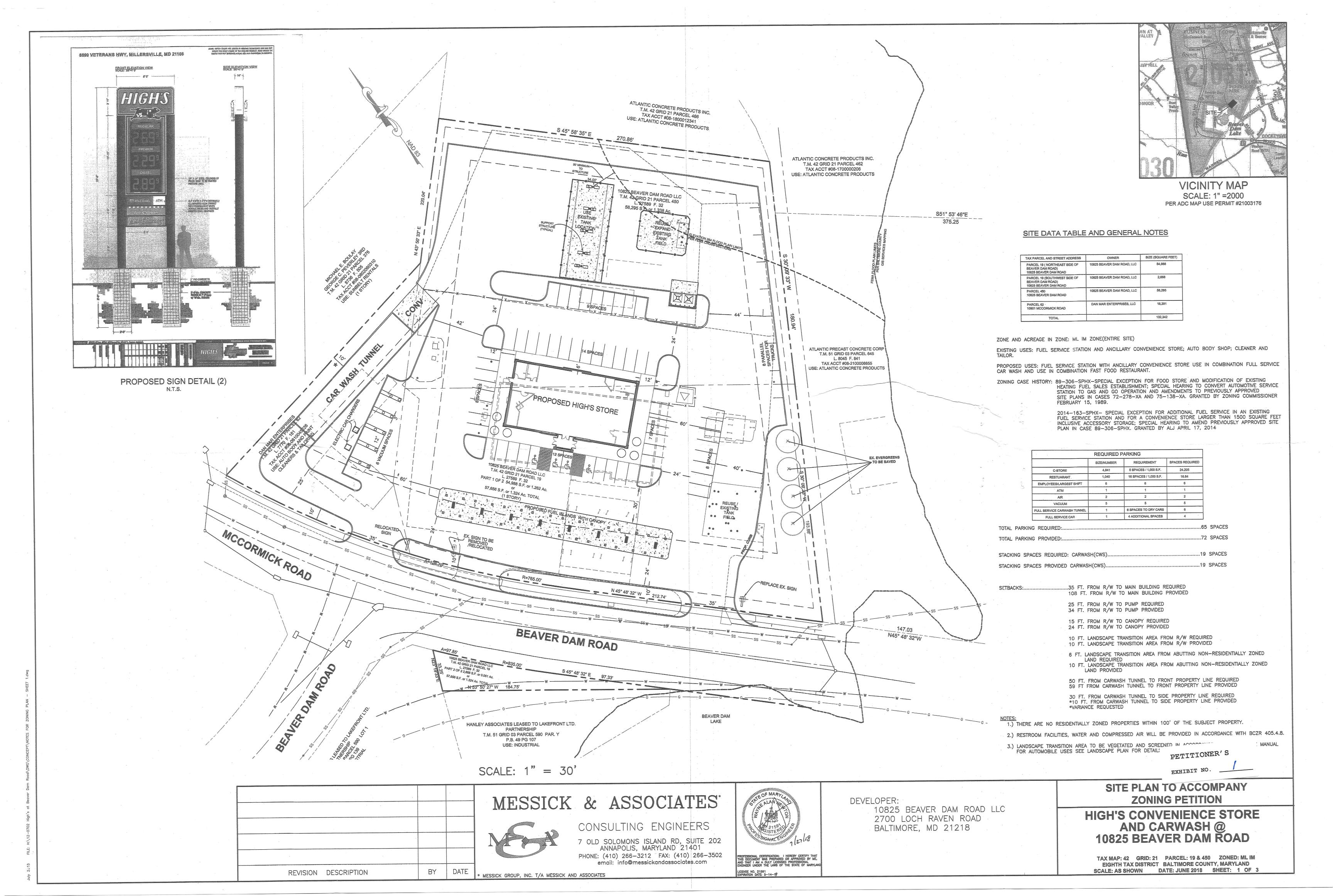
Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

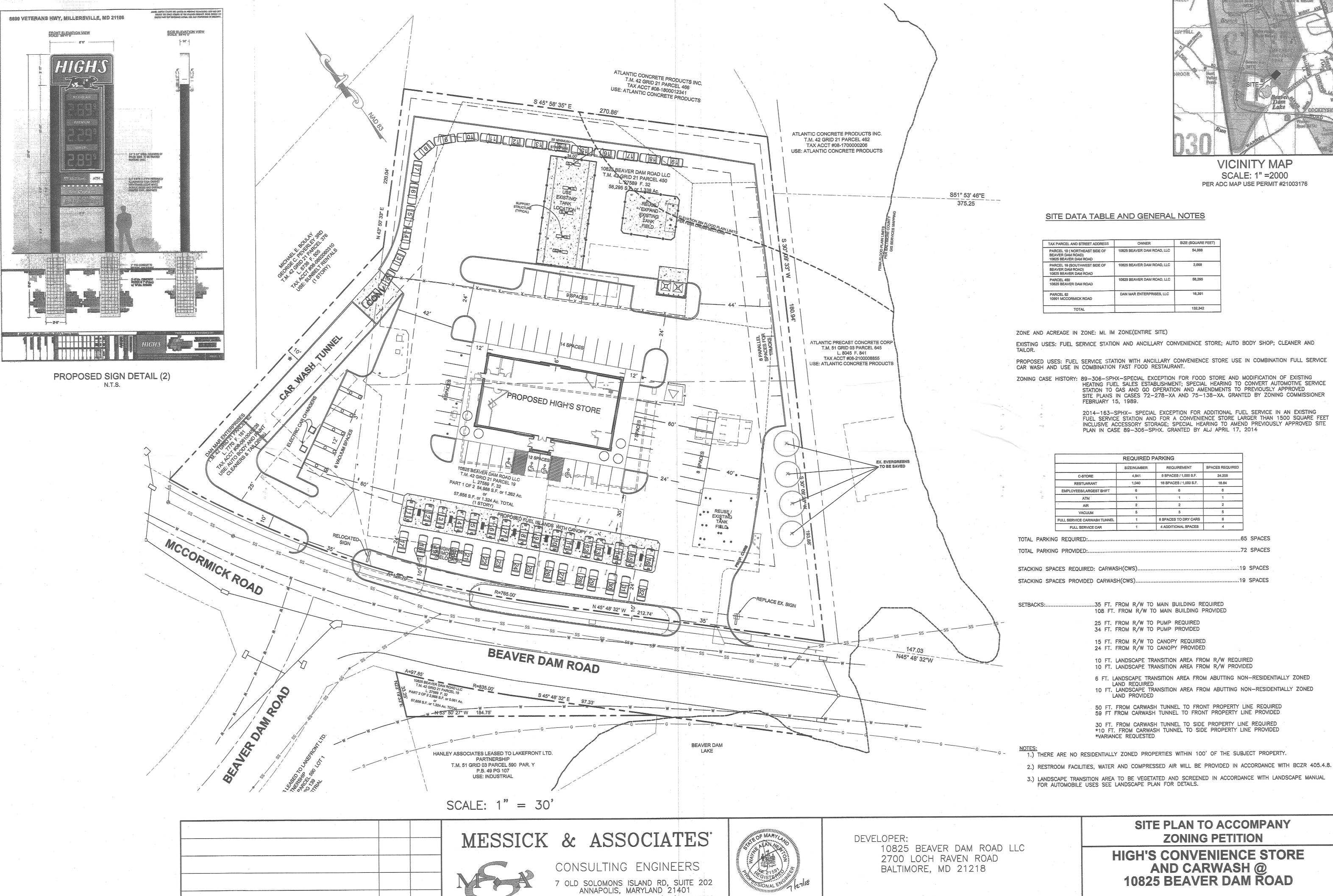

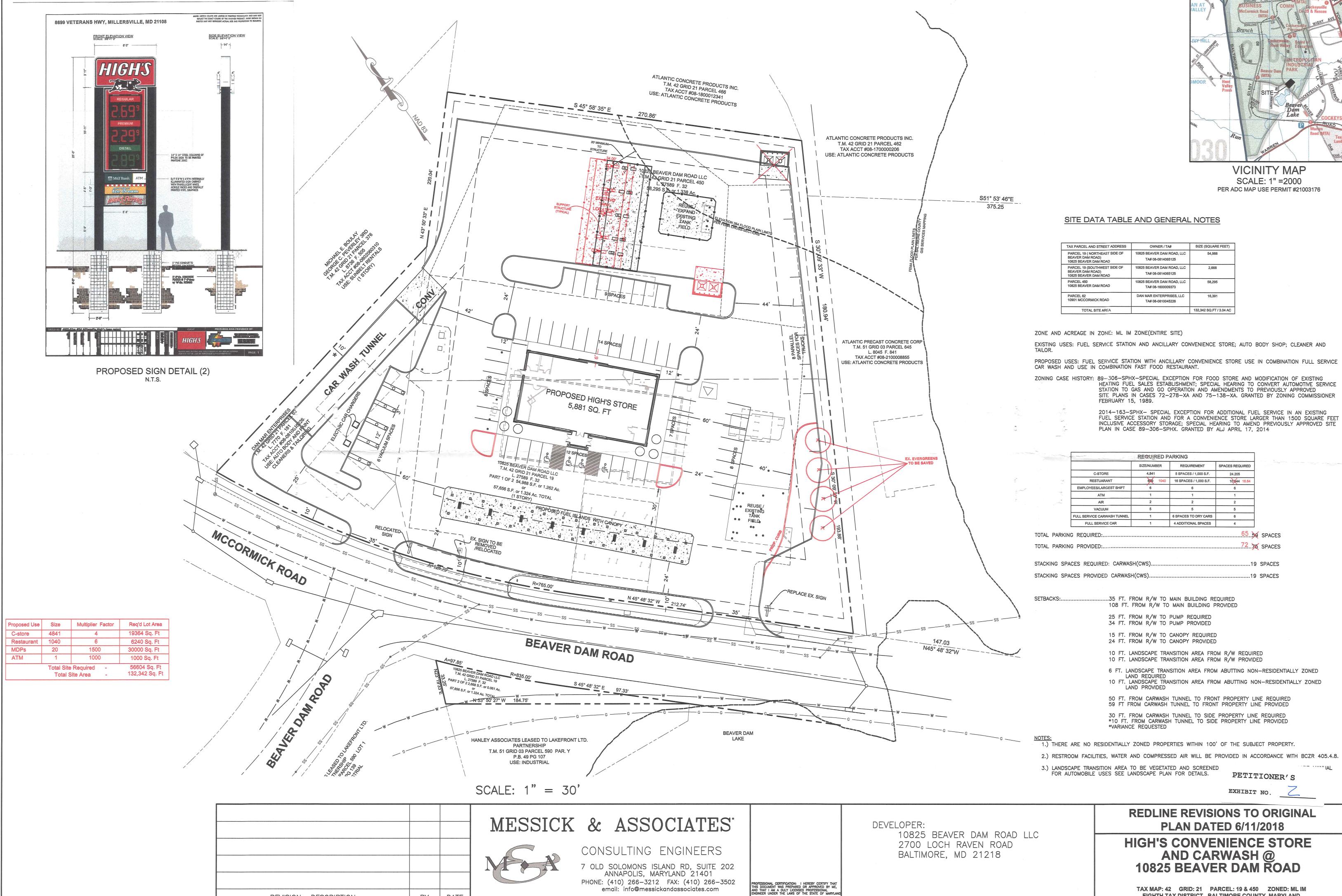
