OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) for consideration of Petitions for Special Hearing and Variance filed on behalf of Oekos Dundalk, LLC, legal owner ("Petitioner"). The Special Hearing was filed pursuant to Section 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR") to approve an amendment to the site plan approved in Case No. 2008-0336-A. A petition for variance seeks to allow a total of 990 off-street parking spaces in lieu of the required 1,131 parking spaces. A site plan was marked and accepted into evidence as Petitioner's Exhibit 1.

Gary Getz, Mark Keeley, Ken Myers and Laurie Mazzotta appeared in support of the requests. David H. Karceski, Esq. represented the Petitioner. There were no protestants or interested citizens in attendance. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the BCZR. A substantive Zoning Advisory Committee (ZAC) comment was received from the Department of Planning ("DOP"). That agency did not oppose the requests.

SPECIAL HEARING

The special hearing request is essentially a housekeeping matter, in that it seeks only to amend a site plan approved in a 2008 zoning case which also granted variance relief in connection

with off-street parking at this shopping center. As such the petition for special hearing will be granted.

VARIANCE

A variance request involves a two-step process, summarized as follows:

- (1) It must be shown the property is unique in a manner which makes it unlike surrounding properties, and that uniqueness or peculiarity must necessitate variance relief; and
- (2) If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or hardship.

Cromwell v. Ward, 102 Md. App. 691 (1995).

The property has an irregular shape and is therefore unique. If the Regulations were strictly interpreted Petitioner would experience a practical difficulty because it would be unable to attract new tenants to the shopping center. Finally, I find that the variance can be granted in harmony with the spirit and intent of the BCZR, and in such manner as to grant relief without injury to the public health, safety and general welfare. This is demonstrated by the lack of County and/or community opposition. In addition, Mr. Keeley, a transportation planner accepted as an expert, conducted a parking utilization study at the site and determined that even at peak periods the offstreet parking at the center would only be 73% occupied. As such, I do not believe granting the petition will have any discernable impact upon the community.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED this 7th day of January, 2019, by this Administrative Law Judge, that the Petition for Special Hearing pursuant to Section 500.7 of the BCZR to approve an amendment to the site plan approved in Case No. 2008-0336-A, to reflect the variance relief granted herein, be and is hereby GRANTED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Petition for Variance to allow a total of 990 offstreet parking spaces in lieu of the required 1,131 parking spaces, be and is hereby GRANTED.

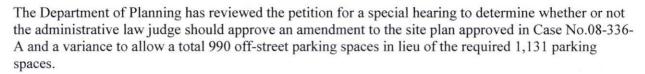

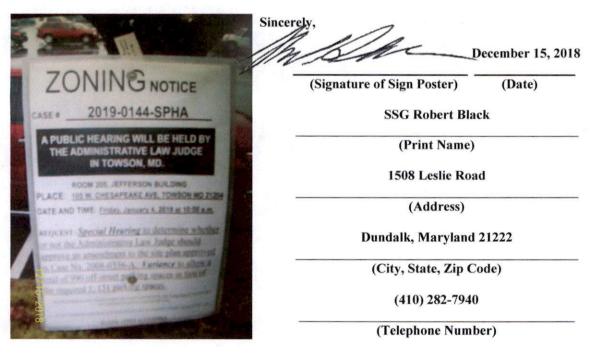

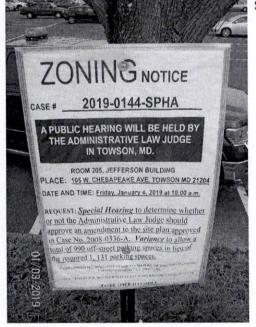

OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings ("OAH") for Baltimore County as a Petition for Variance filed by Oekos Dundalk, LLC, legal owner of the subject property ("Petitioner"). The Petition seeks variance relief from § 450.4 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("B.C.Z.R.") as follows: (1) to allow 2 freestanding joint identification signs on Merritt Boulevard with sign areas/faces of 100 and 150 sq. ft. in lieu of the permitted 1 freestanding joint identification sign with a sign area/face of 150 sq. ft. (Signs C,D); (2) to allow freestanding joint identification signs to display a maximum of 8 lines of text with a sign copy a minimum of 3 in. in height in lieu of the permitted 5 lines of test and required 8 in. height for sign copy (Signs A, C, D); (3) to allow tenants in a multi-tenant commercial building a wall-mounted enterprise sign with a sign area/face that exceeds two times the length of the wall containing the exterior entrance and defining the space occupied by the tenant (Sign 3 [165 sq. ft, lieu of 139 sq. ft.], Sign 5B [85 sq. ft. in lieu of 76 sq. ft.], Sign 9B [273 sq. ft. in lieu of 96 sq. ft.]); (4) to allow a wall-mounted enterprise sign to be installed in a different location than the tenant space (Sign 9A); and (5) to allow an additional wall-mounted enterprise sign to be installed on a multi-tenant commercial building over other tenant spaces in lieu of the permitted 1 wall-mounted enterprise sign for each tenant space (Sign 9A). A four-sheet site plan was marked as Petitioner's

Exhibit 1A-1D.

Architect Gary Getz, Ken Myers and Laurie Mazzotta appeared in support of the petition. David Karceski, Esq. represented the Petitioner. There were no protestants or interested citizens in attendance. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the B.C.Z.R. A substantive Zoning Advisory Committee ("ZAC") comment was received from the Bureau of Development Plans Review (DPR).

The site is approximately 16 acres in size and zoned BM. The Dundalk Plaza Shopping center has been operated at the site for many years. The center is undergoing substantial renovations including new signage for which zoning relief is required.

A variance request involves a two-step process, summarized as follows:

- (1) It must be shown the property is unique in a manner which makes it unlike surrounding properties, and that uniqueness or peculiarity must necessitate variance relief; and
- (2) If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or hardship.

Cromwell v. Ward, 102 Md. App. 691 (1995).

Mr. Getz testified the property is much wider than it is deep. He also noted the road frontage on Merritt Boulevard is 2-3 times more than that of nearby strip shopping centers. As such the property is unique. If the Regulations were strictly interpreted Petitioner would experience a practical difficulty because it would be unable to provide adequate signage for the center. Finally, I find that the variance can be granted in harmony with the spirit and intent of the BCZR, and in such manner as to grant relief without injury to the public health, safety and general welfare. This is demonstrated by the absence of community and/or Baltimore County opposition.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, this 20th day of March, 2018, by the Administrative Law Judge for Baltimore County, that the Petition for Variance: (1) to allow 2 freestanding joint

identification signs on Merritt Boulevard with sign areas/faces of 100 and 150 sq. ft. in lieu of the permitted 1 freestanding joint identification sign with a sign area/face of 150 sq. ft. (Signs C,D); (2) to allow freestanding joint identification signs to display a maximum of 8 lines of text with a sign copy a minimum of 3 in. in height in lieu of the permitted 5 lines of text and required 8 in. height for sign copy (Signs A, C, D); (3) to allow tenants in a multi-tenant commercial building a wall-mounted enterprise sign with a sign area/face that exceeds two times the length of the wall containing the exterior entrance and defining the space occupied by the tenant (Sign 3 [165 sq. ft. in lieu of 139 sq. ft.], Sign 5B [85 sq. ft. in lieu of 76 sq. ft.], Sign 9B [273 sq. ft. in lieu of 96sq.ft.]); (4) to allow a wall-mounted enterprise sign to be installed in a different location than the tenant space (Sign 9A); and (5) to allow an additional wall-mounted enterprise sign to be installed on a multi-tenant commercial building over other tenant spaces in lieu of the permitted 1 wall-mounted enterprise sign for each tenant space (Sign 9A), be and is hereby GRANTED.

The relief granted herein shall be subject to the following:

- 1. Petitioner may apply for necessary permits and/or licenses upon receipt of this Order. However, Petitioner is hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at its own risk until 30 days from the date hereof, during which time an appeal can be filed by any party. If for whatever reason this Order is reversed, Petitioner would be required to return the subject property to its original condition.
- 2. Petitioner must provide landscaping near the base of the freestanding signs on the property, as determined in the sole discretion of the Baltimore County landscape architect.

Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter comes before this Deputy Zoning Commissioner for consideration of a Petition for Variance filed by Sid Roros, Vice President, on behalf of the legal owner of the subject property, Petitioner Oekos Management Corporation. Petitioner is requesting variance relief from Section 409.6.A.2 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) to permit 954 parking spaces in lieu of the required 984 spaces. The subject property and the requested relief are more fully described on the site plan which was marked and accepted into evidence as Petitioner's Exhibit 1.

Appearing at the requisite public hearing in support of the variance request were Sid Roros on behalf of Petitioner Oekos Management Corporation, Petitioner's attorney, Jennifer R. Busse, Esquire, and Bill Monk with Morris & Ritchie Associates, Inc., the consulting firm that prepared the site plan. Also appearing in support of the requested relief were Dharmesh Shah, employed with Planet Fitness, the proposed tenant of Petitioner, Peter Powell with Beck, Powell & Parsons, Petitioner's architectural consultant, Keith Barnett with KLNB Retail, Petitioner's commercial real estate firm, and Chris McCollum with the Baltimore County Department of Economic Development. There were no Protestants or other interested citizens in attendance at the hearing, and there were no adverse Zoning Advisory Committee comments received.

The hearing proceeded by way of a modified proffer from Ms. Busse and from Mr. Monk. Testimony and evidence offered revealed that the subject property is a large commercial parcel containing approximately 17.21 gross acres and 16.19 net acres, zoned B.M. (Business, Major). The property is developed as the Dundalk Plaza shopping center and contains a total of 185,502 square feet of building area and located in the Dundalk area of Baltimore County. The site plan depicts the subject property and surrounding area.

Petitioner is a Columbia, Maryland based company that owns approximately 1.4 million square feet of property between Wilmington, Delaware and Fredericksburg, Virginia. Petitioner has owned the subject property since 2004 and in addition to this shopping center, owns two other shopping centers in Baltimore County. The shopping center is an older center and has been at this location for decades. Since its purchase of the shopping center, Petitioner has made a number of upgrades and improvements, including a new roof over the entire shopping center.

Petitioner now proposes to locate Planet Fitness, an athletic club, within a 14,072 square foot area that has been vacant for some time. Other tenants at the shopping center include a grocery store, a discount clothing store, a video rental store, a restaurant, a carryout restaurant, a bank, a furniture store, and other various retail stores. Mr. Monk described the topography of the site as unique in the slope of the center and its relationship to Merritt Boulevard, which is unusual compared to other similarly developed parcels in the area. The existing parking lot servicing the shopping center is located along the front, sides and rear of the shopping center. It is connected to the parking lot of the adjoining shopping center to the south. There are a total of 954 parking spaces currently provided.

A photograph was presented of the property showing the location of the proposed athletic club tenant within the shopping center, and was marked and accepted into evidence as Petitioner's Exhibit 2. The site is already fully developed and with the exception of some

landscaping, is entirely paved. The proposed tenant will be centrally located on the site but more toward the south side of the property as shown on the site plan. This is the area of the site where there is parking at both the front and rear of the shopping center -- in close proximity to the proposed athletic club.

The proposed tenant, Planet Fitness, is a fast growing athletic club which currently has two other Baltimore County locations, one in Lutherville and the other in Glen Burnie. Mr. Shah noted that the facility will typically have three employees at one time on site and the expected hours of operation are 5:00 AM to 10:00PM Mondays through Thursdays, 5:00 AM to 9:00 PM on Fridays, and 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM during the weekends. Ultimately, Planet Fitness desires to operate 24 hours a day at this location, as they do at their other locations. In fact, Planet Fitness has already received a fair amount of interest by clients with regard to its plans to locate at the property. There will be approximately 80 pieces of cardio equipment and the club will not operate any exercise classes, nor will it offer a daycare component for its clients. There will be a few tanning beds and showers for use by clients. Based on the practices of clients at the other facilities, Planet Fitness expects clients will spend an average of 30 minutes at the facility at any one time, and that the club's busiest times will be in the evenings and on weekends.

It was noted during the hearing that the Baltimore County Department of Economic Development supports the location of the Planet Fitness at the Dundalk Plaza. Chris McCollum is a Commercial Revitalization Specialist with the County's Department of Economic Development and submitted a letter in support of Petitioner's requested parking variance. The Department encourages uses which will likely stimulate growth, and it is anticipated that the location of Planet Fitness at this shopping center will be positive for the community, not only by providing a useful service but also by drawing additional customers to the existing tenants at Dundalk Plaza and the surrounding area. For example, Planet Fitness clients will likely take

advantage of the retail and service uses at Dundalk Plaza such as the grocery store, bank, carryout restaurant, etc.

Section 409.6A.2 of the B.C.Z.R. contains the current regulations for shopping centers. New shopping centers containing 180,387 square feet are required to provide parking at a rate of five spaces per 1,000 square feet or 902 spaces instead of the 954 spaces provided. Because this shopping center predates the current regulations it provides parking based on the individual tenants. Section 409.6A.4 of the B.C.Z.R. requires athletic clubs to provide 10 parking spaces per 1,000 square feet of building area. Because Planet Fitness proposes to occupy a 14,072 square foot area, the regulations require 141 parking spaces be provided for the athletic club use. Consequently, based on the per use parking calculation the center would be required to provide 984 spaces total.

The reasoning behind the change in the calculations for large shopping centers appears fairly intuitive. Larger centers generally have multiple uses, and those uses have varying times of peak traffic. Also, there are so many parking spaces required under the five spaces for every 1,000 square, feet requirement that there will seldom be a time where there is no parking available. Even restaurants, which by themselves require 16 spaces per 1,000 square feet are included in the five spaces per 1,000 square feet large shopping center calculations. Indeed, it seems reasonable going forward not to require a center to readjust its plan every time a tenant changes.

This particular athletic club proposes to offer only 80 pieces of cardio equipment and since there will be no exercise classes at this location, the requirement of 141 parking spaces appears excessive given the likely use patterns. Even if one assumes there is no car-pooling and no one walking or biking to the club for additional exercise from the adjacent residential community, the idea that over 100 people would be using this facility at any one time appears

farfetched. If the facility becomes so crowded that there is a waiting line for every piece of equipment, people would be expected to either stop coming or to adjust their times to hours when it is less crowded.

There is no evidence that the subject property is providing insufficient parking, and there have been no complaints to this effect. To the contrary, the shopping center appears to be doing well. Finally, it is apparent from the hours of operation that the peak times of customer use for this tenant will vary significantly from the peak hours of customer use for many of the other tenants in the center.

In the overall context of the size of the parking facility, the requested 3% deviation in parking proposed from that which is required under the old regulations is very minor -- the variance request is for only 30 spaces. As noted, if this center were built today, no variance would be necessary. In that sense, the imposition of zoning on this property disproportionably impacts the subject property as compared to others in the zoning district. In addition, the proposed athletic club will provide the community with a positive service which will likely act as an economic stimulus for the area. Hence, knowing that the athletic club's clients will essentially self-police the parking issue, the benefits here outweigh any other issues.

Considering the uncontroverted testimony and evidence presented at the hearing, I find that the subject property has characteristics which are unique, thereby meeting the first prong of the test set forth in *Cromwell v. Ward*, 107 Md. App. 691 (1995) and contained in Section 307.1 of the B.C.Z.R. Specifically, I find that the topography of the property and the existing conditions including the positioning of the existing building and parking create a unique situation that generates a practical difficulty in meeting the bulk and setback requirements. I further find that consistent with the test articulated in *McLean v. Soley*, 270 Md. 208 (1973), compliance with the strict letter of the restrictions would unreasonably prevent the owner from using the property

for a permitted purpose, the granting of the variance will do substantial justice to the applicant as well as to others in the area, and the relief sought is within the spirit of the ordinance and will not be injurious to the public safety and welfare. *Id.* at 214-215.

Pursuant to the advertisement, posting of the property, and public hearing on this petition held, and after considering the testimony and evidence offered, I find that Petitioner's variance request should be granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED this _____ day of March, 2008 by this Deputy Zoning Commissioner, that Petitioner's variance request from Section 409.6.A.2 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.) to permit 954 parking spaces in lieu of the required 984 spaces be and is hereby GRANTED, subject to the following.

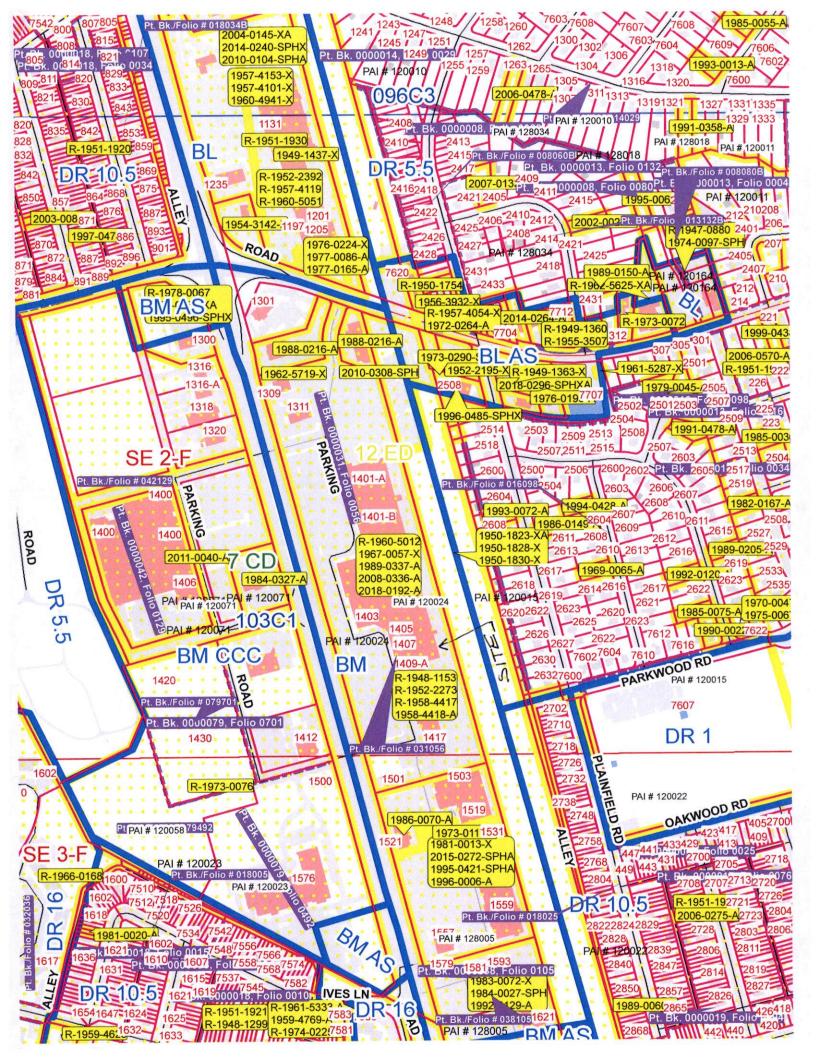

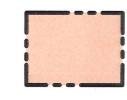
