OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Board of Appeals for Baltimore County as an appeal of Baltimore County Administrative Law Judge, John Beverungen's April 16, 2019 Opinion and Order, and his May 21, 2019 Opinion and Order on Motion for Reconsideration, both denying a Petition for Variance filed by James and Verna Jones as owners and Krystyna Osowski, purchaser of the property at 7520 Avondale Avenue, (collectively, "Petitioner").

The Petitioner is requesting variance relief from Section 1B02.3.C.1 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R) (1) to allow a dwelling with a side yard setback of five feet in lieu of the required ten feet and a street-side setback of ten feet in lieu of the required twenty-five feet; (2) to allow a lot width of forty-five feet in lieu of fifty-five feet; and (3) to allow an area of five thousand one hundred eleven square feet in lieu of the required six thousand square feet.

A hearing was held before this Board on December 5, 2019. Timothy M. Kotroco, Esquire appeared on behalf of the Petitioner. Also appearing for Petitioner was Mitchell Kellman of DMW, accepted as an expert in land planning and zoning. Also in attendance was Protestant, James Shomper. The case was publically deliberated on January 15, 2020.

FACTS

The subject property is located in southeast Baltimore County in an area lying east of Eastern Avenue and south of North Point Boulevard. The property consists of lots 556 and 557 of the 1920 subdivision of East-View, which predates the enactment of zoning in Baltimore County by at least 25 years.

The property is zoned D.R. 5.5 and is located at the southwest corner of the intersection of Avondale Avenue and Southern Avenue. The lot is irregularly shaped, being most narrow at the street frontage on Avondale Avenue and widest at the rear property line. Public utilities serve the property.

Mr. Jones testified that he grew up on Southern Avenue next to the subject property, which he acquired in 1957. Mr. Jones, who is now 86 years old, wishes to sell the property. He engaged a surveyor to prepare Petitioner's Exhibit 1, a site plan, which accompanied the petition.

Mitch Kellman then testified in support of the Petition. He stated that the lot is governed by the small lot table of the BCZR and that no variances were being sought for the front or rear yards, only for the lot size and side yards. Mr. Kellman further stated that the proposal is consistent with development that has occurred in the area. The use is one permitted as of right in the zone and will not increase density over that permitted in the zone. Mr. Kellman further testified that the relief being sought is the minimum required to allow a house to be constructed on the lot.

Mr. Kellman also testified that the corner location and irregular lot configuration render it unique. He also stated that BCZR setback requirements for a corner lot are greater than those for an interior lot. These factors, coupled with the physical characteristics of the property result

in the BCZR requirements impacting the property in a manner different than other properties in the zone, thus resulting in practical difficulty.

Mr. Kellman submitted as Petitioner's Exhibit 4 a plat showing the building envelope that would exist if the small lot table setbacks were required without variance relief, and opined that not granting the variances would render the lot unusable for any permitted purpose.

Following the close of Petitioner's case, James Shomper testified in opposition to the subject petition. Mr. Shomper lives directly opposite the property at 7519 Avondale Avenue, and his house similarly occupies two of the originally platted lots, though these form a regular rectangle. Mr. Shomper disagrees with granting a side yard variance as narrow as five feet out of a concern that doing so would create a hazard from fire. Mr. Shomper also described traffic concerns created by vehicles exceeding the speed limit on Southern Avenue. He also believes that vehicles, especially emergency vehicles, do not have sufficient turning radius to navigate turns at this corner, and any improvements on the subject property would exacerbate these conditions.

DECISION

A variance request involves a two-step process, summarized as follows:

- (1) It must be shown the property is unique in a manner which makes it unlike surrounding properties, and that uniqueness or peculiarity must necessitate variance relief; and
- (2) If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or hardship.

Cromwell v. Ward, 102 Md. App. 691 (1995).

The first determination is that of the uniqueness of the property. Here the Board found that the irregular shape and corner location are characteristics unique to this site and not generally shared by other properties in the area.

The second determination is whether strict application of the BCZR to this property has a disproportionate impact caused by the property's unique characteristics.

The 2018 case of Dan's Mountain Wind Force, LLC v. Allegany County Board of Zoning Appeals, 236 Md. App 483, is instructive in this analysis in that any variance analysis must also examine the nexus between the property's unusual characteristics and the application of the zoning law from which relief is sought. Quoting Cromwell, the Court reiterated "[v]ariances should be granted when the uniqueness or peculiarity of the subject property is not shared by the neighboring property and where the uniqueness of that property results in an extraordinary impact upon the operation of the statute," and "where by reason of the exceptional narrowness, shallowness, or unusual shape of a specific property, or by reason of exception topographic conditions or other extraordinary situations or special conditions of property...make it exceptionally difficult to comply." North v. St. Mary's County, 99 Md. App 502.

The Court's analysis applied to the subject property satisfies both prongs of the tests articulated in *Cromwell* and expanded upon in *Dan's Mountain*, and the standards for variance relief set forth in BCZR Section 307.1. Therefore, the requested relief will be granted.

PURPOSE: To deliberate the following:

Petition for Variance relief pursuant to BCZR § 1B02.3.C.1 to allow:

1) a dwelling with a side yard setback of 5 ft. in lieu of the required 10 ft., and a street-side setback of 10 ft. in lieu of the required 25 ft.;

2) a lot width of 45 ft. in lieu of 55 ft.; and

3) an area of 5,111 sq. ft. in lieu of 6,000 sq. ft.

PANEL MEMBERS DISCUSSED THE FOLLOWING:

- The Board reviewed the history of the case. The Petitioners testified they purchased the lot, which is actually a double lot located on the corner, over 60 years ago and never developed it. They now wish to sell the lot, and need variance relief for the construction of a house.
- The Board heard testimony from community members expressing concerns about traffic at the intersection, and safety. They believe the laws are there for a reason and should be enforced.
- The Board discussed the practical difficulty factor of *Cromwell*. The Board noted there is a mirror lot across the street which has a house built prior to the zoning laws. The use is permitted in the zone, and the minimum relief necessary is being requested. The Board found the Petitioners would suffer a practical difficulty if the variance was not granted.
- The Board next discussed the uniqueness requirement of Cromwell. The Board noted that without variance relief the property cannot be used for its intended purpose. It was noted that although the topography of the lot is similar to others in the area, due to its shape and location on the corner, the regulations impact the lot differently. It was also noted there is a geographic uniqueness to the lot due to its side setback which changes down the length of the lot. The Board found that the property is unique.

CONCLUSION: After thorough review of the facts, testimony, and law in the matter, the Board unanimously agreed to GRANT the requested Petition for Variance.

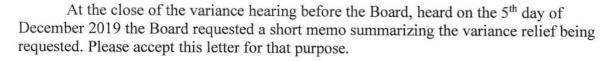

Dear Members of the Board,



You will recall that Mr. & Mrs. Jones, the petitioners and owners of this lot of record, purchased this vacant lot 62 years ago, upon Mr. Jones' return from service from the Korean War. This lot of record is located within the East-View subdivision which was recorded 100 years ago. The lots comprise 20 ft wide lots with most owners buying two lots for a total lot width of 40 feet. The lot owned by Mr. & Mrs. Jones is a corner lot, measuring 40 ft in width along Avondale Avenue. Due to the "pie-shaped" nature of the lot, the rear lot line measures 62.22 ft. This lot fronts on Avondale Avenue.

After paying taxes and maintaining this property for the past 62 years, Mr. & Mrs. Jones, now both octogenarians wish to sell this lot to a buyer and intend to use the proceeds of sale for their future care. The lot is useless unless a variance is granted to allow a house to be constructed thereon.

Mr. Jones testified as did Mr. Mitchell Kellman, an expert in the Baltimore County zoning and development regulations. To summarize, the current BCZR require the following setbacks for properties zoned DR 5.5.

Required	Proposed
25 ft. Front Yard	25 ft. provided
30 ft. Rear Yard	30 ft. provided
10 ft. Side Yard	5 ft. requested
25 ft. Side/Corner Yard	10 ft requested
55 ft. Lot width at front foundation line	45 ft. requested
6,000 sq. ft lot size	5,111 sq. ft requested



The attachments to this letter illustrate the setback requirements of the BCZR and the extreme hardship those regulations would impose upon Mr. & Mrs. Jones if no variance relief is granted for this lot. Exhibit #1 shows our lot of record with the required setbacks highlighted thereon. Exhibit #1 shows that a house (without variance relief) would have a width of 5 feet at the front, widening to about 13 feet to the rear. Without variance relief being granted, this lot is rendered useless and unbuildable. (See attached)

The second exhibit #2 demonstrates the relief we are requesting, allowing for a house of reasonable size to be built on this lot. Our proposed house will be compatible with the other houses in the neighborhood. (See attached)

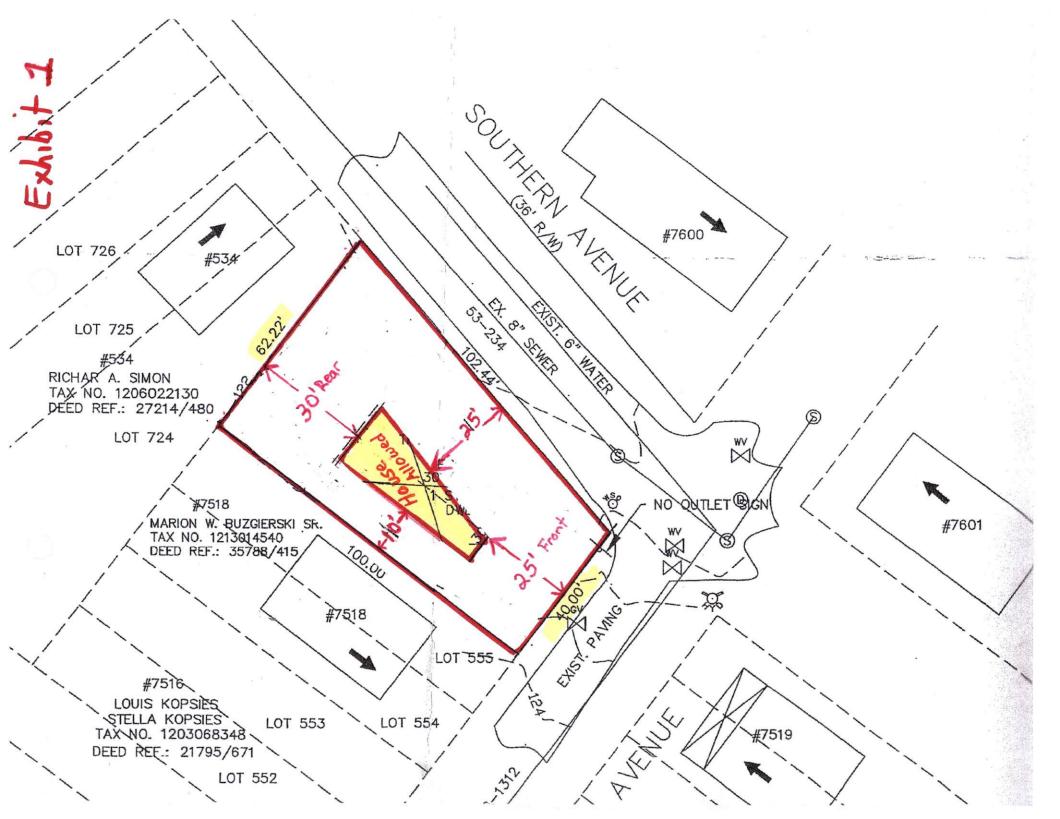
It is respectfully requested that the variance relief requested by Mr. & Mrs. Jones be granted. Thank you for your consideration of this request.

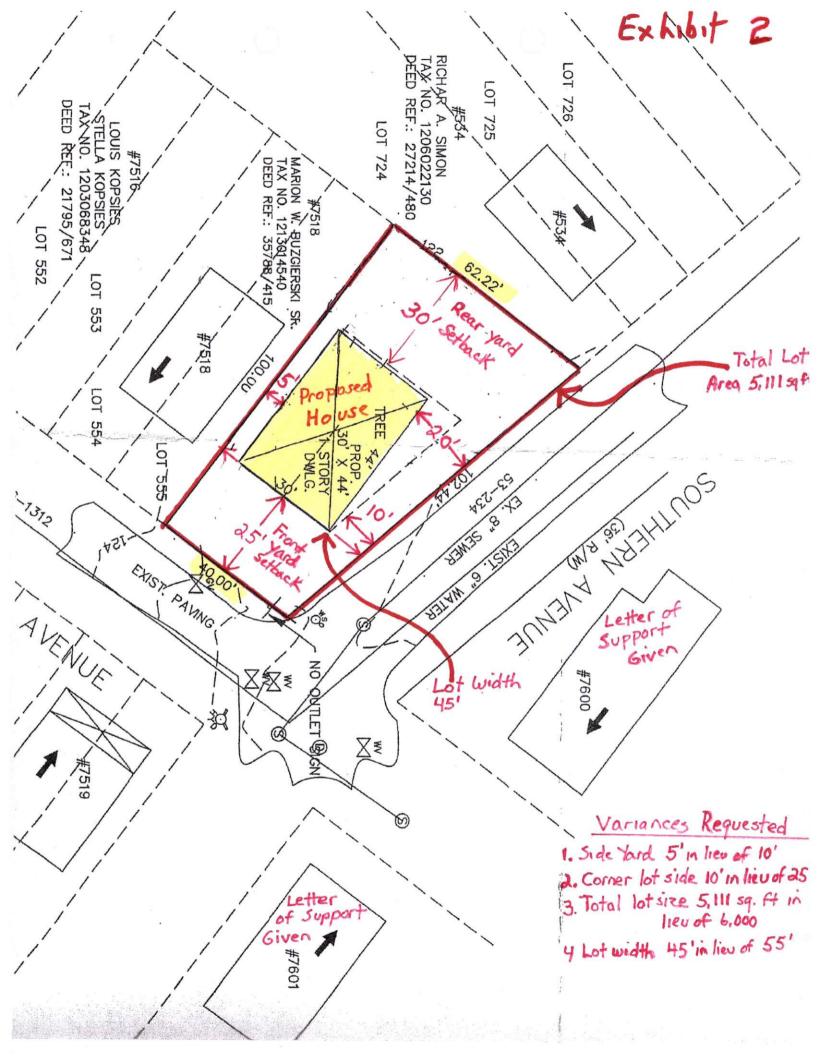

OPINION AND ORDER ON MOTION FOR RECONSIDERATION

Now pending is a Motion for Reconsideration filed in a timely fashion by Petitioner James Jones. Petitioner seeks reconsideration of the April 16, 2019 Order denying variance relief in the above case. While I am sympathetic to Petitioner's plight, I cannot grant a variance on that basis.

In his motion Petitioner presents evidence that -- contrary to the testimony of his neighbors who attended the hearing -- there have been only 10 auto accidents at the intersection of Southern and Avondale Avenues in the last 11 years. Petitioner also submitted documents showing his neighbor's house sits 5-feet higher than the subject property and that drainage would be graded to the street rather than his neighbor's yard. Having reviewed these materials I believe both arguments raised by Petitioner are valid. But the variance was not denied for either of those reasons.

Under Maryland law variances are supposed to be granted "sparingly," since it is an authorization for something prohibited by the zoning regulations. Petitioner's lots were created long before adoption of the BCZR, and Section 304 of the regulations would allow a dwelling to be constructed on a 45 ft. wide lot which is only 5,111 square feet in size. But Petitioner also requires two side yard setback variances. While the proposed 5 ft. setback adjacent to 7518 Avondale might not be problematic in and of itself, the proposed road side setback of 10 ft. is only

40% of the 25 foot setback required. This is a significant departure from the regulations and I do not believe a variance can be properly granted in these circumstances.

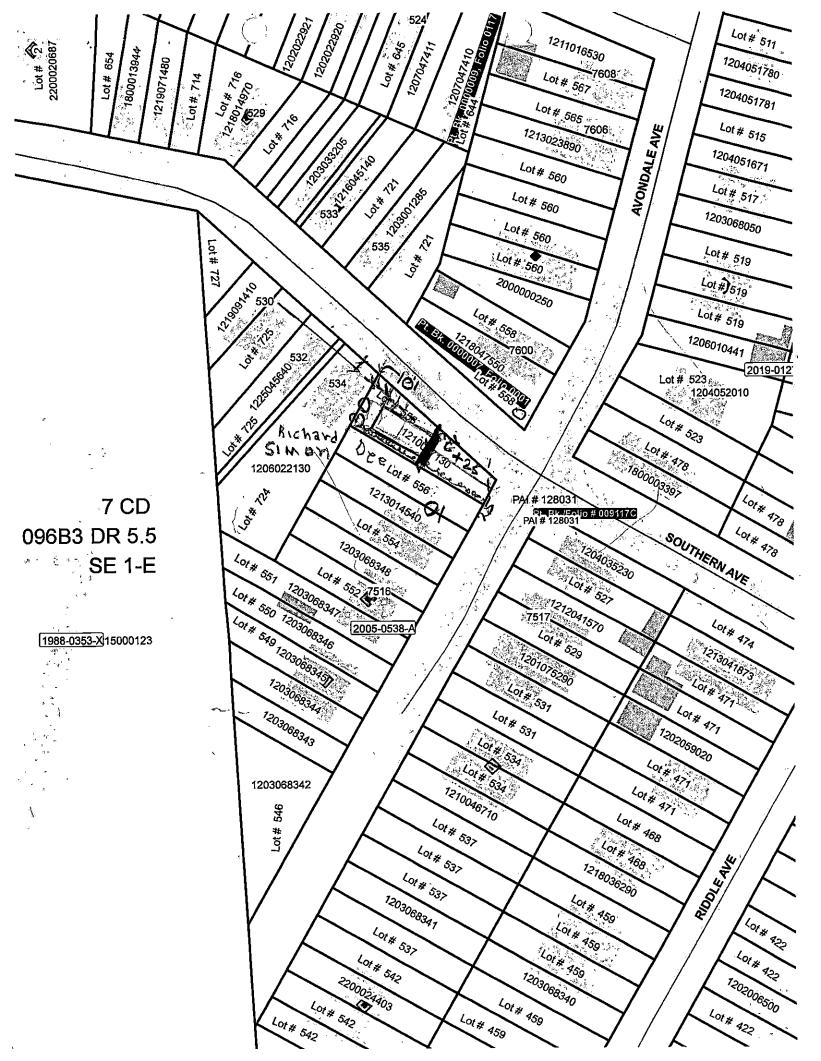

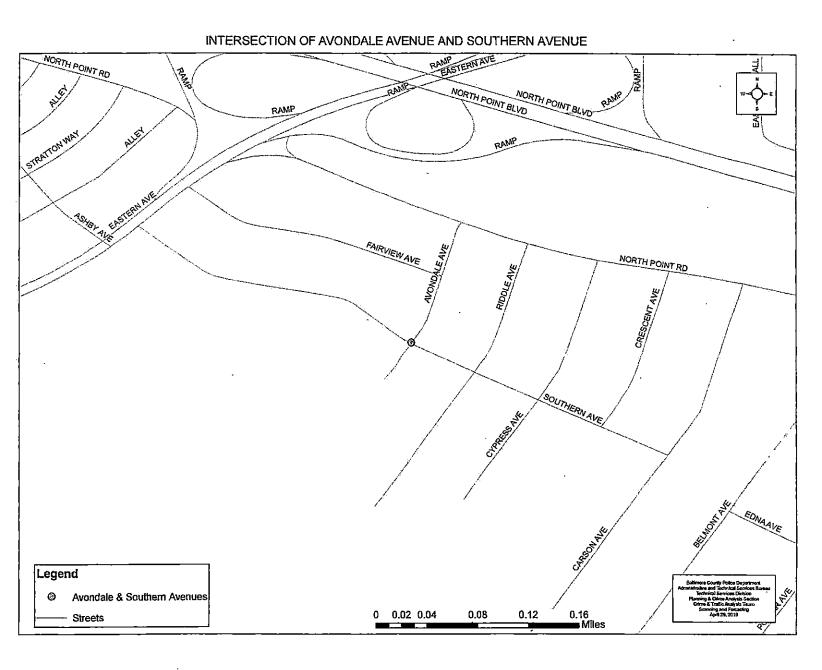

OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings ("OAH") for Baltimore County as a Petition for Variance filed by James and Verna Jones, legal owners of the subject property and Krystyna Osowski, contract purchaser ("Petitioners"). Petitioners are requesting variance relief from Section 1B02.3.C.1 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR"): (1) to allow a dwelling with a side yard setback of 5 ft. in lieu of the required 10 ft. and a street-side setback of 10 ft. in lieu of the required 25 ft.; (2) to allow a lot width of 45 ft. in lieu of 55 ft.; and (3) to allow an area of 5,111 sq. ft. in lieu of 6,000 sq. ft. A site plan was marked as Petitioners' Exhibit 1.

James Jones appeared in support of the petition. Two neighbors opposed the request. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the BCZR. A substantive Zoning Advisory Committee ("ZAC") comment was received from the Department of Planning ("DOP").

The site is approximately 5,111 sq. ft. in size and is zoned DR 5.5. The property is unimproved and Petitioners propose to construct a single family dwelling (30' x 44') on the lots. Two neighbors opposed the requests and expressed concern with traffic safety (especially for fire trucks and other emergency vehicles) and stormwater drainage issues.

A variance request involves a two-step process, summarized as follows:

(1) It must be shown the property is unique in a manner which makes it unlike surrounding properties, and that uniqueness or peculiarity must necessitate variance relief; and

(2) If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or hardship.

Cromwell v. Ward, 102 Md. App. 691 (1995).

Based on a review of the site plan (Petitioners' Exhibit 1), it appears as if the subject property is very similar to other lots in the neighborhood in terms of size and lot dimensions. No evidence was presented to show the lots are unique in a zoning sense, and the petition must therefore be denied. Maryland courts have made clear variances can only be granted "sparingly," since it is an "authorization for [that] ... which is prohibited by a zoning ordinance." <u>Cromwell</u>, 102 Md. App. at 699.

I am mindful of the fact Mr. Jones has owned the property for more than 60 years, and I regret that I cannot accommodate his request. But I am obligated to resolve cases based on the facts and the law, and not on whether I believe it would be equitable to approve the petition. For what it is worth, the state tax records reflect a nominal \$1,000 assessed value for the land, which is at least some indication this is not a buildable lot.

OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Board of Appeals for Baltimore County as an appeal of Baltimore County Administrative Law Judge, John Beverungen's April 16, 2019 Opinion and Order, and his May 21, 2019 Opinion and Order on Motion for Reconsideration, both denying a Petition for Variance filed by James and Verna Jones as owners and Krystyna Osowski, purchaser of the property at 7520 Avondale Avenue, (collectively, "Petitioner").

The Petitioner is requesting variance relief from Section 1B02.3.C.l of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R) (1) to allow a dwelling with a side yard setback of five feet in lieu of the required ten feet and a street-side setback of ten feet in lieu of the required twenty-five feet; (2) to allow a lot width of forty-five feet in lieu of fifty-five feet; and (3) to allow an area of five thousand one hundred eleven square feet in lieu of the required six thousand square feet.

A hearing was held before this Board on December 5, 2019. Timothy M. Kotroco, Esquire appeared on behalf of the Petitioner. Also appearing for Petitioner was Mitchell Kellman of DMW, accepted as an expert in land planning and zoning. Also in attendance was Protestant, James Shomper. The case was publically deliberated on January 15, 2020.

FACTS

The subject property is located in southeast Baltimore County in an area lying east of Eastern Avenue and south of North Point Boulevard. The property consists of lots 556 and 557 of the 1920 subdivision of East-View, which predates the enactment of zoning in Baltimore County by at least 25 years.

The property is zoned D.R. 5.5 and is located at the southwest corner of the intersection of Avondale Avenue and Southern Avenue. The lot is irregularly shaped, being most narrow at the street frontage on Avondale Avenue and widest at the rear property line. Public utilities serve the property.

Mr. Jones testified that he grew up on Southern Avenue next to the subject property, which he acquired in 1957. Mr. Jones, who is now 86 years old, wishes to sell the property. He engaged a surveyor to prepare Petitioner's Exhibit 1, a site plan, which accompanied the petition.

Mitch Kellman then testified in support of the Petition. He stated that the lot is governed by the small lot table of the BCZR and that no variances were being sought for the front or rear yards, only for the lot size and side yards. Mr. Kellman further stated that the proposal is consistent with development that has occurred in the area. The use is one permitted as of right in the zone and will not increase density over that permitted in the zone. Mr. Kellman further testified that the relief being sought is the minimum required to allow a house to be constructed on the lot.

Mr. Kellman also testified that the corner location and irregular lot configuration render it unique. He also stated that BCZR setback requirements for a corner lot are greater than those for an interior lot. These factors, coupled with the physical characteristics of the property result

in the BCZR requirements impacting the property in a manner different than other properties in

the zone, thus resulting in practical difficulty.

Mr. Kellman submitted as Petitioner's Exhibit 4 a plat showing the building envelope

that would exist if the small lot table setbacks were required without variance relief, and opined

that not granting the variances would render the lot unusable for any permitted purpose.

Following the close of Petitioner's case, James Shomper testified in opposition to the

subject petition. Mr. Shomper lives directly opposite the property at 7519 Avondale Avenue,

and his house similarly occupies two of the originally platted lots, though these form a regular

rectangle. Mr. Shomper disagrees with granting a side yard variance as narrow as five feet out

of a concern that doing so would create a hazard from fire. Mr. Shomper also described traffic

concerns created by vehicles exceeding the speed limit on Southern Avenue. He also believes

that vehicles, especially emergency vehicles, do not have sufficient turning radius to navigate

turns at this corner, and any improvements on the subject property would exacerbate these

conditions.

DECISION

A variance request involves a two-step process, summarized as follows:

(1) It must be shown the property is unique in a manner which makes it unlike

surrounding properties, and that uniqueness or peculiarity must necessitate variance relief; and

(2) If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or

hardship.

The first determination is that of the uniqueness of the property. Here the Board found that the irregular shape and corner location are characteristics unique to this site and not generally shared by other properties in the area.

The second determination is whether strict application of the BCZR to this property has a disproportionate impact caused by the property's unique characteristics.

The 2018 case of Dan's Mountain Wind Force, LLC v. Allegany County Board of Zoning Appeals, 236 Md. App 483, is instructive in this analysis in that any variance analysis must also examine the nexus between the property's unusual characteristics and the application of the zoning law from which relief is sought. Quoting Cromwell, the Court reiterated "[v]ariances should be granted when the uniqueness or peculiarity of the subject property is not shared by the neighboring property and where the uniqueness of that property results in an extraordinary impact upon the operation of the statute," and "where by reason of the exceptional narrowness, shallowness, or unusual shape of a specific property, or by reason of exception topographic conditions or other extraordinary situations or special conditions of property...make it exceptionally difficult to comply." North v. St. Mary's County, 99 Md. App 502.

The Court's analysis applied to the subject property satisfies both prongs of the tests articulated in *Cromwell* and expanded upon in *Dan's Mountain*, and the standards for variance relief set forth in BCZR Section 307.1. Therefore, the requested relief will be granted.

OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings ("OAH") for Baltimore County as a Petition for Variance filed by James and Verna Jones, legal owners of the subject property and Krystyna Osowski, contract purchaser ("Petitioners"). Petitioners are requesting variance relief from Section 1B02.3.C.1 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR"):

(1) to allow a dwelling with a side yard setback of 5 ft. in lieu of the required 10 ft. and a street-side setback of 10 ft. in lieu of the required 25 ft.; (2) to allow a lot width of 45 ft. in lieu of 55 ft.; and (3) to allow an area of 5,111 sq. ft. in lieu of 6,000 sq. ft. A site plan was marked as Petitioners' Exhibit 1.

James Jones appeared in support of the petition. Two neighbors opposed the request. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the BCZR. A substantive Zoning Advisory Committee ("ZAC") comment was received from the Department of Planning ("DOP").

The site is approximately 5,111 sq. ft. in size and is zoned DR 5.5. The property is unimproved and Petitioners propose to construct a single family dwelling (30' x 44') on the lots. Two neighbors opposed the requests and expressed concern with traffic safety (especially for fire trucks and other emergency vehicles) and stormwater drainage issues.

A variance request involves a two-step process, summarized as follows:

- (1) It must be shown the property is unique in a manner which makes it unlike surrounding properties, and that uniqueness or peculiarity must necessitate variance relief; and
- (2) If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or hardship.

Cromwell v. Ward, 102 Md. App. 691 (1995).

Based on a review of the site plan (Petitioners' Exhibit 1), it appears as if the subject property is very similar to other lots in the neighborhood in terms of size and lot dimensions. No evidence was presented to show the lots are unique in a zoning sense, and the petition must therefore be denied. Maryland courts have made clear variances can only be granted "sparingly," since it is an "authorization for [that] ... which is prohibited by a zoning ordinance." <u>Cromwell</u>, 102 Md. App. at 699.

I am mindful of the fact Mr. Jones has owned the property for more than 60 years, and I regret that I cannot accommodate his request. But I am obligated to resolve cases based on the facts and the law, and not on whether I believe it would be equitable to approve the petition. For what it is worth, the state tax records reflect a nominal \$1,000 assessed value for the land, which is at least some indication this is not a buildable lot.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, this <u>16th</u> day of April, 2019, by the Administrative Law Judge for Baltimore County, that the Petition for Variance seeking relief from Section 1B02.3.C.1 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR"): (1) to allow a dwelling with a side yard setback of 5 ft. in lieu of the required 10 ft., and a street-side setback of 10 ft. in lieu of the required 25 ft.; (2) to allow a lot width of 45 ft. in lieu of 55 ft.; and (3) to allow an area of 5,111 sq. ft. in lieu of 6,000 sq. ft., be and is hereby DENIED.

Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

Dear Members of the zoning board my name is Richard Simon a neighbor of the proposed lots 556 and 557 Eastview located at the intersection of Southern Avenue and Avondale Avenue. I come before you today to review the proposed site plan for Mr. Jones property. I have prepared hundreds if not more of Single Family, Condominium, Commercial, and Town House Site & Grading Plans in Baltimore County, Harford County, Cecil County, Anne Arundel County, Montgomery County, New Castle Delaware, Dover Delaware, and York Pennsylvania. In many counties they also require a as-Built lot grading topographic survey before the use and Occupancy is granted for a property.

Issue Number 1:

When the last two houses in our subdivision were constructed in 2005 and 2006 along Avondale avenue I put my trust and Faith in the professionalism of Baltimore County and their site plan review process. I and my neighbors were let down by Baltimore County and this Zoning Review Commission. If you review the Baltimore County Topographic Quad Sheets I have brought you will notice that either the site plan reviewers allowed the two additional houses at 7514 and 7516 Avondale Avenue to fill their entire rear lot with additional fill material. This may have also been a done illegally by the contractor at the time of construction. Even if this was done illegally by the contractor a second change to right this wrong became available when this zoning commission reviewed a variance on 06/14/2005 for 7516 Avondale Avenue for a detached garage in their rear yard. This immediately should have raised red flags because detached garages always bring many issues for drainage and impervious surface totals. During the Zoning hearing a detailed topographic site plan showing both existing and proposed contouring should have been prepared and submitted. This construction of 7514 and 7516 Avondale Avenue has caused a severe property value decrease and created a neighborhood health risk. During Large Storms my yard is flooded with several inches to almost a foot of standing water in my rear yard that lasts for several days. Having a newly formed ponding swamp in my backyard dramatically decreases my property value and is a haven for mosquito growth and spread of such disease such as West Nile Virus. Over time it is Known that standing water from poor construction design, and engineering methods can literally change the soil types and conditions of a site and can make the property reclassified as wetlands. What is Baltimore County and this zoning commission going to do to correct this poor judgement and failure to protect my property and our community from these issues and threats? This new property if constructed without proper on site micro-bioretention practices and structures along with drainages swales will just add to my flooding issues by increasing the amount of Impervious surface of the area. What will this zoning commission do? I need to know because these issues were all preventable by Baltimore County Site Plan Review and this Zoning Board.

Issue Number 2:

Setback reductions for the proposed lot. The property lies on a very busy intersection of Avondale Avenue and Southern Avenue. Numerous accidents and near misses occur at this intersection many times a year. People who drive through our neighborhood drive in excess of 40 to 50 miles per hour and the speed limit is 25. Coming from Avondale Avenue towards Southern many drivers fly up the steep hill and miss or almost miss the stop sign at the intersection almost hitting a car coming down southern Avenue. It is daily that people drive into the other lane and some times onto Mr. Jones property to avoid a collision. For many years neighbors have requested Baltimore county to install speed bumps in the community to curtail this speeding. It had never been granted. The intersection in question is very narrow and the neighboring property located on the intersection at 7600 Avondale Avenue has a tall

retaining wall and fence that runs right along the road. This blocks the intersections sight distance and turning radius. Fire Trucks, School Busses, and Delivery Trucks sometimes hit the gravel area of Mr. Jones property to make the right hand turn. I fear the proposed house if allowed to be closer to Southern Avenue will have a dangerous condition for the owner of that house. Starting soon Southern Avenue and neighboring roads will be torn up by Baltimore Gas and Electric Company for installation of a new low pressure natural gas supply lines. This will only add to the number of large vehicles, equipment, and additional vehicles coming through our neighborhood. To build a house closer to Southern Avenue than regulations state will create a dangerous situation for the house and the community. There is a reason why corner lots always have two setback lines from intersections and this is one reason why.

Issue 3:

Elevation issues. With a house being constructed at the intersection, the first floor of the house will be almost halfway up the first floor of the neighboring house. This will create a internal shadow onto the neighboring house and pretty much make their bay window useless. The house will tower over the neighboring property if the side yard setback is reduced between houses.
