### ORDER ON MOTION FOR RECONSIDERATION

Now pending is a Motion for Reconsideration filed by the Developer in the above-captioned case. Developer seeks reconsideration of the denial of the Special Hearing request in this case, in which the development and zoning cases were combined for hearing as permitted by the Baltimore County Code ("BCC").

In the zoning petition, the Developer requested an order declaring that the density anomaly policy was applicable in this case which involves a split-zoned property. In essence, the Developer requested an order which would approve the density and house locations on the development plan ("Plan"), which it contended were in compliance with the "long-standing" density anomaly policy.

In support of its argument, the Developer references a 1988 restrictive covenant agreement entered into by and between the former owners of the subject property and several communities.

See Motion for Reconsideration, pp. 2-3. I believe the Developer is correct that the Plan and use/density proposed are not in violation of that agreement. But that is beside the point since Baltimore County ("County") is not a party to that agreement and a contractual agreement cannot bind the County in zoning matters. More importantly, as stated in the order dated August 1, 2019, I believe the proposed density shown on the Plan is not in compliance with the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR").

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The Developer also contends the density anomaly policy is a binding County regulation. <u>See</u> Motion for Reconsideration, ¶ 16. I disagree. The BCC specifies that all regulations must be adopted by a procedure which includes a public notice and hearing requirement. BCC § 3-7-101 <u>et. seq.</u> There is no indication the density anomaly policy was adopted in such a fashion, and for the reasons previously stated I do not believe that policy is binding or authoritative in this matter.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED by this Administrative Law Judge/Hearing Officer for Baltimore County, this 19th day of August, 2019, that the Motion for Reconsideration be and is hereby DENIED.

Any appeal of this Order shall be taken in accordance with Baltimore County Code, § 32-4-281.

# ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE'S COMBINED DEVELOPMENT PLAN AND ZONING OPINION AND ORDER

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings ("OAH") for Baltimore County for a public hearing on a development proposal submitted in accordance with Article 32, Title 4, of the Baltimore County Code ("BCC"). Howard L. Alderman, Esquire, on behalf of Pahl Farm, LLC, c/o CHAI, *Legal Owner* (hereinafter "the Developer"), submitted for approval a two-sheet redlined Development Plan ("Plan") prepared by Colbert, Matz & Rosenfelt, Inc., known as "Townes at Pahl's Farm".

The Developer is proposing 17 townhouses, six (6) semi-detached dwellings and one (1) existing single-family dwelling to be renovated on a 4.671 acre tract with 4.130 acres zoned DR 5.5 and 0.539 acres zoned BL. The property is currently improved with five (5) greenhouses, a 1-½ story single-family dwelling and one-story garage.

In addition, the Developer filed a Petition for Special Hearing seeking relief pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR"), as follows: (1) to the extent the same may be required, approve the density, house location, use areas and lot configurations for Lot Nos. 3, 4, and 5 shown on the Plan to Accompany the petition as an exception permitted and recognized by the Density Anomaly Policy; and (2) approve any and all such relief as the nature

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of this case as presented at the time of the hearing on the Petition may require, within spirit and intent of the BCZR.

The development and zoning cases were considered at a combined hearing as permitted by BCC § 32-4-230. Details of the proposed development are more fully depicted on the redlined two-sheet Development Plan that was marked and accepted into evidence as Developer's Exhibits 1A and 1B. The property was posted with the Notice of Hearing Officer's Hearing ("HOH") on June 18, 2019 and Zoning Notice on June 19, 2019, in compliance with the regulations. The undersigned conducted a public hearing on July 18, 2019, in Room 205 of the Jefferson Building, 105 West Chesapeake Avenue, Towson, Maryland.

In attendance at the HOH in support of the Plan on behalf of the Developer was Ellen Jarrett. Also in attendance was Nick Linehan and Matthew Bishop, with Colbert, Matz & Rosenfelt, Inc., the firm that prepared the site plan. Howard L. Alderman, Esquire represented the Developer. Several neighbors attended the hearing and expressed opposition to and concerns about various aspects of the project.

Numerous representatives of the various Baltimore County agencies who reviewed the Plan also attended the hearing, including the following individuals from the Department of Permits, Approvals and Inspections ("PAI"): Darryl Putty, Project Manager, Vishnu Desai and Michael Viscarra (Development Plans Review ["DPR"]), Brad Knatz, Real Estate Compliance, and Jeff Perlow (Office of Zoning Review). Also appearing on behalf of the County were Stephen Ford from the Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability ("DEPS"), and Brett M. Williams from the Department of Planning ("DOP").

Each County representative indicated the Plan addressed all comments submitted by their agency, and they each recommended approval of the Plan. Mr. Williams indicated none of the ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING

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schools in the district exceed 115% of State Rated Capacity ("SRC") as shown in the school impact analysis admitted as Baltimore County Exhibit 1. Mr. Desai confirmed his agency approved a schematic landscape plan (Baltimore County Exhibit 4) and that the Developer will provide onsite more than the required amount of open space to satisfy County regulations.

#### **DEVELOPER'S CASE**

In the "formal" portion of the case, the Developer presented one (1) witness: Matthew Bishop, a landscape architect with Colbert, Matz & Rosenfelt, Inc. Mr. Bishop was accepted as an expert and explained in detail the development proposal. He described the layout of the site and reviewed each sheet of the development plan. Mr. Bishop opined that the redlined Development Plan (Developer's Exhibit 1) satisfied all requirements set forth in the development and zoning regulations.

Several neighbors expressed opposition to the Plan, citing concerns with storm water drainage, traffic, property values and the design of the proposed homes. <u>See</u> Protestants' Exhibit 1. While many of the points raised by protestants are valid, I cannot deny the request on that basis. Under the Baltimore County Code, when all County agencies recommend approval of a development plan it is "deemed Code-compliant in the absence of evidence to the contrary." <u>People's Counsel v. Elm Street Dev., Inc.,</u> 172 Md. App. 690, 703 (2007). The court in <u>Elm Street</u> held that once county agencies recommend approval of a plan "it was then up to [protestants] to provide evidence rebutting the Director's recommendations." <u>Id.</u> at 703. I do not believe protestants presented sufficient evidence to rebut the agency recommendations.

While I do not believe the concerns identified by protestants are sufficient as a matter of law to prevent plan approval, I do believe certain conditions should be included to address certain of those issues. Most significant is the storm water drainage from the site. As with many areas of ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING

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the County this is an older community and much of the infrastructure is in dire need of repair or replacement. Strictly speaking, drainage of storm water is a nondelegable duty of Baltimore County, and thus the County (and not a private developer) must remedy these defects. <u>See</u>, <u>e.g.</u>, <u>Eisenstein v. City of Annapolis</u>, 177 Md. 222 (1939) (Maryland's highest court confirmed a municipality is required to construct and maintain drains and outlets to carry off all surface water).

But, the law does allow a local government to require a developer to construct certain infrastructure improvements provided the scope of the request bears a reasonable nexus to the proposed impact of the new development project. *Dolan v. City of Tigard*, 512 US 374 (1994). Here 24 new dwellings are proposed, and a large amount of impervious surface will be added to the site. While I am confident the Developer will comply with current storm water regulations and Baltimore County has approved a conceptual storm water management plan (Baltimore County Exhibit 3) invariably some of the drainage from the site will reach the adjoining roadways.

One citizen showed a video on her phone of flooding conditions during a recent storm event, with extremely high levels of runoff in roadways bordering this site. Many other residents described flooding conditions which have existed for years, and apparently County staff has inspected the drains in the area and informed residents that many of the pipes or inlets are clogged and/or broken. As noted above, while I believe the onus (to a large extent) is upon Baltimore County to remedy this situation, I believe the Developer should be responsible for repairing or replacing the storm drain inlets along the roadway frontage of this project, and a condition to that effect will be included below.

#### Traffic Signal

Several residents suggested a traffic signal should be installed at the intersection of Chai Court (the proposed new road entering the subdivision) and Bedford Road. Neighbors advised ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING

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cars routinely exceed the speed limit on Bedford Road, which I am sure is the case. Even so, the Developer's engineer noted on the Plan there is 390 feet of sight distance to the left or right for a motorist turning from Chai Court onto Bedford Road. The sight distance exceeds the standards required by American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials ("AASHTO"), and thus I do not believe the Developer or Baltimore County is obligated to install a traffic signal at this intersection.

#### Fence

Several neighbors requested that the Developer install a fence enclosing its project. Citizens said crime is increasing in the area and they believed a fence would restrict the flow of foot traffic and prevent the new residents, their guests and others from trespassing upon their property. I am sympathetic to this concern but cannot require the Developer to install a fence surrounding the community.

The Developer proposes to install attractive landscaping in connection with the project, and the Baltimore County Landscape Architect has approved that proposal. Baltimore County Exhibit 4. The County's Landscape Manual does include fencing as an option for screening in certain circumstances, but I have not in the past insisted upon a fence enclosing a development and if that somewhat unorthodox option was chosen the decision would need to be made by Mr. Hermann (a registered landscape architect) and not the undersigned.

The BCC provides that the "Hearing Officer shall grant approval of a development plan that complies with these development regulations and applicable policies, rules and regulations." BCC § 32-4-229. After considering the testimony and evidence presented by the Developer and the positive recommendations of all County reviewing agencies, I find that the Developer has satisfied its burden of proof and is entitled to approval of the Plan.

### ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING

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Pursuant to the advertisement, posting of the property, and public hearing held thereon, the requirements of which are contained in Article 32, Title 4, of the BCC, the plan known as "Townes at Pahl's Farm" shall be approved, subject to the resolution of the zoning petition, discussed below.

#### ZONING REQUEST

The Developer has also requested zoning relief to approve the density and lot configurations for Lot Nos. 3, 4 and 5 as shown on the Development Plan. Developer cites the "Density Anomaly Policy" as the authority and justification for the special hearing request.

Having reviewed the document Developer submitted in support of this argument.

(Developer's Exhibit 4), I am not inclined to grant the request. The policy, which was apparently adopted in 1992, purports to provide a degree of "flexibility" which would allow the undersigned to calculate density for a split-zoned tract in a manner that is "not strictly zone specific." Id.

As an initial matter, this would appear to be an internal policy of the Office of Zoning Review and I was unable to locate any reference to "Density Anomalies" in either the BCZR and/or Zoning Commissioner's Policy Manual. As such, I do not believe the policy is binding or authoritative. Furthermore, I believe the policy essentially allows one to disregard zoning lines, which by definition are meant to be rigid and immutable, not "flexible." *Village of Euclid v. Ambler Realty Co.*, 272 US 365 (1926).

The denial of the petition for special hearing means the density for this overall tract is zone-specific. The Development Plan contains a density chart which shows the DR 5.5 zone (approximately 4.094 acres) would permit 22 dwellings, although the Plan proposes only 19 new homes and one (1) existing single-family dwelling. Developer's Exhibit 1B. The B.L. zone (0.539 acre) would permit two (2) dwellings while the Plan proposes four (4) due to the "density anomaly." In light of the denial of the petition for special hearing, only two (2) dwellings can be

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constructed in the B.L. zone, and the Plan must be amended accordingly.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED by this Administrative Law Judge/Hearing Officer for Baltimore County, this <u>1</u><sup>st</sup> day of **August**, **2019**, that the "**TOWNES AT PAHL'S FARM**" Plan marked and accepted into evidence as Developer's Exhibit 1A and 1B, be and is hereby **APPROVED**, subject to the ruling below on the zoning petition.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Petition for Special Hearing seeking relief pursuant to § 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR") to approve the density, house location, use areas and lot configurations for Lot Nos. 3, 4, and 5 shown on the Plan to Accompany the petition as an exception permitted and recognized by the Density Anomaly Policy, be and is hereby **DENIED**.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Waiver Request No. 3 (shown on Developer's Exhibit 1B) concerning the length of the sidewalk on the side of the street opposite the new homes, be and is hereby **GRANTED**.

The relief is subject to the following condition:

• Prior to issuance of building permits for the dwelling units shown on the Plan, Developer must repair or replace (as determined in the sole discretion of the Bureau of DPR and/or Department of Public Works) at its sole cost all storm drain inlets along the public roadway frontage bordering the subject property.

Any appeal of this Order shall be taken in accordance with Baltimore County Code, § 32-4-281.

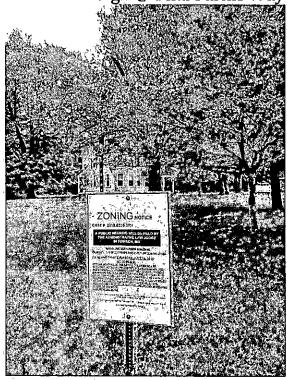

# MOTION FOR RECONSIDERATION AND TO ALTER/AMEND ORDER

Pahl Farm, LLC ("Owner", "Petitioner" or "Developer") by and through its undersigned legal counsel, in accordance with the Code of Baltimore County Regulations, Title 2, Chapter 1, Rule 4K., hereby moves that the Administrative Law Judge's Combined Development Plan and Zoning Opinion and Order, dated August 1, 2019 (the "Order"), be reconsidered, altered and/or amended. In support of its request, the Owner states as follows:

- 1. The Administrative Law Judge for Baltimore County ("ALJ") denied the Owner's requested special hearing relief seeking application of the long-standing "Density Anomaly Policy" (the "Policy") permitting certain calculation and location of density for a split-zoned property.
- 2. Prior to 1988, the property at 4223 Bedford Road (the "subject property") was zoned DR 5.5 in its entirety, identical to the neighborhood in which it is located.

- 3. Comprised of approximately 4.6 acres +/-, the subject property contained one residential dwelling, with the majority of the land being farmed and the farm products were sold from a produce stand located on the subject property, a use which had commenced in 1956.
- 4. Following a formal zoning complaint about the produce stand being an illegal use in the DR zone, the then owners of the subject property filed an application during the 1988 Comprehensive Zoning Map Process ("CZMP") to rezone approximately 0.539 acres to a classification of Business Local (BL) to permit continued operation of the produce stand sales.
- 5. To address community concerns about this enclave of proposed commercial zoning in an otherwise completely residentially zoned area (*See* Petitioner's Exhibit No. 5, Baltimore County "My Neighborhood" Zoning Map), the then owners worked with members of several communities in the development of a Restrictive Covenant Agreement (the "Covenant Agreement").
- 6. To address the community's desire that the area around the subject property retain its residential character without commercial encroachment, the Covenant Agreement contained strict and specific limitations on the use of the area requested for rezoning.
- 7. Moreover, to ensure that only a produce stand would be allowed if the requested area was rezoned, the then owners of the subject property and community members agreed that if the produce stand activity was abandoned or terminated in the future, the uses

on the property requested for rezoning "shall be limited to those uses permitted in a DR 5.5 zone as presently constituted or whatever zone is then in effect on the immediately adjacent residential property if it is not DR 5.5." **Petitioner's Exhibit No. 3**, *Restrictive Covenant Agreement*, dated October 4, 1988 and recorded among the Land Records of Baltimore County in Liber 7989 at page 108.

- 8. During the 1988 CZMP, the Baltimore County Council changed the zoning on the area of the subject property as requested from DR 5.5 to BL.
- 9. Uncontradicted testimony at the ALJ's hearing was that the produce stand use had been abandoned years ago, thus invoking the Covenant Agreement's limitation on uses on the BL zoned land to only those allowed in the DR 5.5 zone.
- 10. Residential density in the BL Zone is calculated based on the residential zoning of the adjoining land. Baltimore County Zoning Regulations § 230.1.A.1.
- 11. The total residential density allowed on the subject property is 24 units, 22 in the DR 5.5 zone and 2 in the BL zone.
- 12. To provide for a more compatible pattern of homes on the subject property, the Developer proposed to spread out the units with 4 located in the BL zoned area and 20 in the DR 5.5 zoned area, under the auspices and authority of the Policy.
- 13. The ALJ concluded *sua sponte* the Policy was "an **internal policy** of the Office of Zoning Review" determining the Policy was neither binding or authoritative. Order at 6. [Emphasis Supplied.]

- 14. In adopting the *Baltimore County Code* ("Code"), the County Council has drawn a bright and distinct line between a "Rule" and a "Regulation". A "Rule" means a statement, policy, directive or operating procedure of county government that:
  - (1) concerns only internal management of the county government;
  - (2) requires compliance by county employees with provisions relating to attendance, conduct, training, discipline, and procedure; or
  - (3) does not affect directly the rights of the public or the procedures available to the public. Code §3-7-101(c) [Emphases supplied.]
  - 15. Conversely, a "Regulation" means a statement of county government that:
    - (1) has general application;
    - (2) has future effect;
    - (3) details or carries out a law that the County government administers; and
    - (4) is in any form including:
      - (i) a requirement;
      - (ii) a standard;
      - (iii) a statement of interpretation; or
      - (iv) a statement of policy. Code § 3-7-101(b) [Emphases supplied.]
- 16. It cannot be gainsaid that the County's Density Anomaly Policy is a County Regulation as compared to an internal policy used by the Office of Zoning.
- 17. The Policy has been applied in decisions on public Development and Zoning Hearings for many years by more than one Zoning Commissioner/Deputy Zoning Commissioner. A small sample of such cases includes:
- A. In Re: Development Plan Hearing and Petitions for Special Hearing

- and Variance, Calverton Court, Case Nos.: 3-463 & 98-44-SPHA [Kotroco];
- B. In Re: Petitions for Special Hearing and Variance, 9321 Old Harford Road, Case No. 99-264-SPH [Kotroco];
- C. In Re: Development Plan Hearing and Petition for Special Hearing, Holly Ridge, Case Nos. VIII-270 & 03-307-SPH [Schmidt]; and
- D. In Re: Development Plan Hearing, Peter Berger Property, Case Nos.: IV-657 & 07-456-SPH [Bostwick].
- Bostwick, summarizing part of the evidence submitted, stated "Mr. Alderman submitted a copy of the relevant part of the Code of County Regulations dated October 22, 1922 entitled 'Policy: Density Anomalies.'" Order in Case No. 07-456-SPH at 10. [Emphasis supplied.]
- 19. After determining that the application of the Density Anomaly Policy "will not increase the density calculation otherwise allowable for this property", Deputy Zoning Commissioner Bostwick found "that the granting of relief is within the spirit and intent of the Zoning Regulations, and in particular the Code of Baltimore County Regulations." Order in Case No. 07-456-SPH at 12. [Emphases supplied.]
- 20. In the instant case, without knowledge of the restrictions of the Covenant Agreement, all reviewing County agencies, including without limitation the Department of Planning, recommended approval of the Development Plan which distributed the dwelling density across the subject property with four dwelling units in the BL zoned portion of the subject property.
  - 21. The application of the long-standing Density Anomaly Policy to the subject

property will not result in any additional density. Rather, it permits the density to be distributed across the subject property, in conformance with other residential development in the area and what the surrounding communities demanded in the Covenant Agreement.

- 22. While members of the community who attended the Hearing Officer's Hearing had concerns about traffic, stormwater and a possible increase of interlopers passing through the subject property, no concern or objection was even mentioned regarding the number of dwellings in the BL zoned portion of the subject property pursuant to the Policy.
- 23. The requested Special Hearing relief is in accord with long-standing, long-applied, County Policy and Regulation and should be granted.

FOR ALL OF THE FOREGOING REASONS, the Owner respectfully requests that the ALJ:

- A. Reconsider the Order issued August 1, 2019; and
- B. Revise, alter and amend the Order, by finding that: (i) the Density Anomaly Policy can be applied to the subject property properly allowing distribution of the proposed dwellings across the subject property; (ii) a total of four (4) homes in the BL zoned portion of the subject property are approved; (iii) the application of the Density Anomaly Policy will not result in an increase of dwelling units otherwise allowable on the subject property; (iv) the Order should be modified at page 7 to read "for Lot Nos. 3, 4 and 5 shown on the Plan to Accompany the petition as an exception permitted and recognized by the Density Anomaly Policy, be and is hereby **GRANTED**"; (v) the Order

- ---2) Decorative fencing should be installed along the property lines of properties adjacent to the development to correctly identify and protect property rights. This will also help to prevent misunderstandings in open areas of adjacent properties and the development.
- ---3) There needs to be a complete review that includes a <u>thorough analysis</u> of where and how SW is diverted into the existing drainage system. This plan has the SW from the new development, which includes enlarged drains and additional runoff, being directed to the drainage system which runs through the Villa Nova portion of the Gwynns Fall Watershed. There is concern that low lying and downstream areas will be adversely impacted. The results of this analysis needs to identify potential issues and include remedial actions needed.
- ---4) The plan needs to more <u>clearly identify</u> the areas on <u>adjacent properties which will or may be disrupted</u> <u>or affected</u> by the entire construction process including in private and public roads and areas. This will help clarify responsibilities for repair, align expectations of property owners, and perhaps avoid misunderstandings.

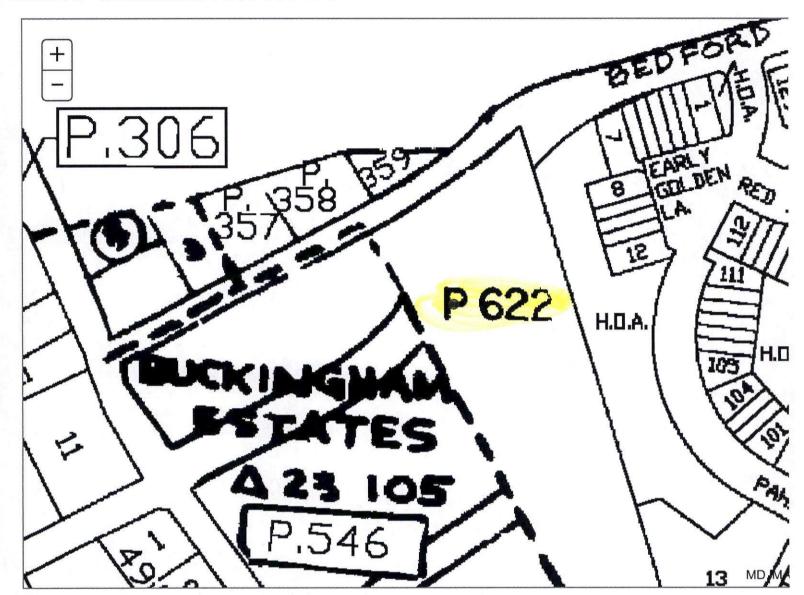

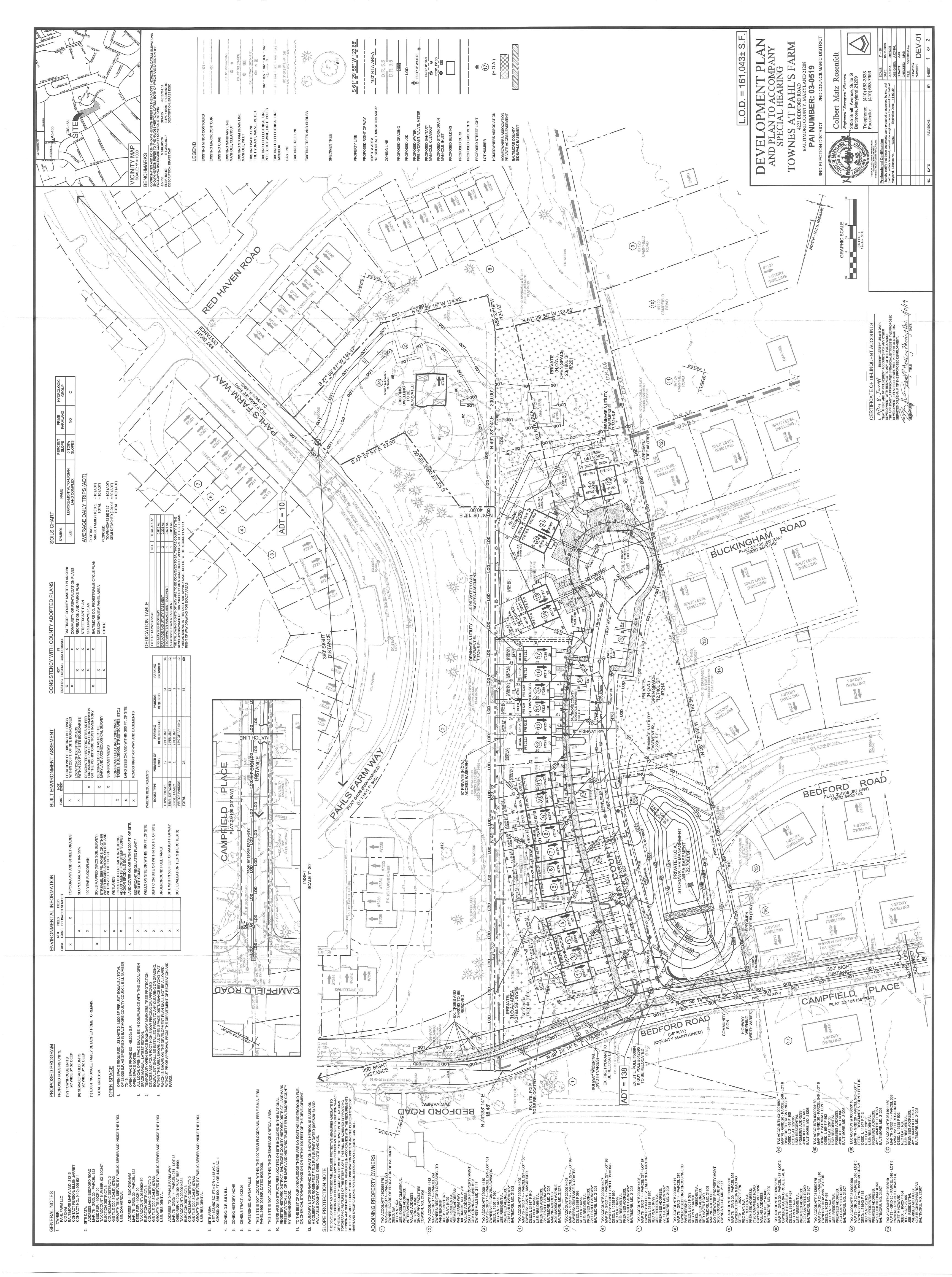

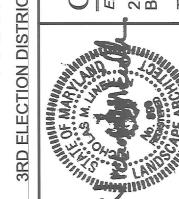
