MODIFIED OPINION AND ORDER¹

This matter comes before the Office of Administrative Hearings ("OAH") for consideration of Petitions for Special Hearing and Variance filed on behalf of Lake Falls Village Limited Partnership. LLLP, legal owner ("Petitioner"). The Special Hearing was filed pursuant to Section 500.7 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations ("BCZR"): (1) to approve an amendment to the previously approved site plan in Zoning Case No. 1997-0272-X; (2) commercial parking in a residential zone pursuant to BCZR Section 409.8 B for six (6) existing parking spaces that partially extend into the adjacent DR 3.5 zone and partial drive aisle in DR 2; (3) a modified parking plan under BCZR Section 409.12.B to allow the existing surface parking lot containing 184 parking spaces as shown on the Plan to Accompany Petition for Zoning Hearing to serve the proposed uses on the property, which would otherwise require 207 parking spaces; (4) for modification of the Residential Transition Area ("RTA") under BCZR Section 1B01.1.B.1.c(2) to permit the existing surface parking to be located within the 50-ft. RTA buffer and the 75-ft. RTA setback otherwise required by BCZR Section 1B01.1.B.1.E(3) and Section 1B01.1.B.1.E(5), respectively; and (5) such further and other relief as the nature of this cause may require. In addition, a Petition for Variance was filed pursuant to BCZR as follows: (1) from BCZR Section 409.6 to permit 184 existing parking spaces in lieu of the 207

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parking spaces required; (2) from BCZR Section 409.8.A.4 to permit existing parking spaces to be as close as four (4) ft. from the right-of-way line of a public street, in lieu of the ten (10) ft. required (no new development proposed); (3) from BCZR Section 1B01.1.B.1.E.3 to permit an RTA Buffer of zero feet in lieu of the 50 feet required in order to accommodate an existing surface parking lot (no new development proposed) and (4) from BCZR Section 1B01.1.B.1.E.5 to permit an RTA setback of zero (0) ft. in lieu of the 75 ft. required in order to accommodate an existing surface parking lot (no new development proposed). A redlined site plan was marked and accepted into evidence as Petitioner's Exhibit 1.

John Harrington, Senior Vice President of MacKenzie Commercial Real Estate Services, LLC and one of the tenants, Emily Howell, the owner of the Corner Pantry, a restaurant in the Lake Falls Village center appeared in support of the requests. Dino La Fiandra, Esq. represented the Petitioner. Steve Warfield, the professional engineer who sealed the redlined plan also attended. There were no protestants or interested citizens in attendance. The Petition was advertised and posted as required by the BCZR. No substantive Zoning Advisory Committee ("ZAC") comments were received from any of the County reviewing agencies.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Because there were no protestants Mr. La Fiandra was allowed to proffer the following: He explained that the tenant, Corner Pantry was now occupying approximately 1200 square feet of space in the development and that because of the success of her business she wishes to double the size of her restaurant, thus necessitating the requested relief. He explained that the Lake Falls Village development was built in 1982 and that under the then existing BCZR the expanded restaurant space of 2400 square feet would cause the entire Lake Falls Village center to require a total of 207 parking spaces for all the uses in the center, if the parking for the center were tabulated

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under the parking requirements of the BCZR in effect at the time center was originally developed which is what was depicted on the original blacklined site plan that was filed on August 19, 2019. However, in preparing for this hearing Mr. La Fiandra and Mr. Warfield realized that the proposed plan would be covered by the "shared parking adjustment" under the current BCZR Sec. 409.6.B.3 if they were to upgrade the Lake Falls Village to the parking regulations of the current BCZR, which is permitted by BCZR §409.1. As a result, Mr. Warfield prepared the redlined plan (Exhibit 1) with a "Shared Parking Analysis" Table which shows that the "adjusted" required number of spaces is only 159 under these current regulations. Mr. La Fiandra explained that since there are 184 existing spaces they do not need the Variance requested in paragraph 1 of the Variance request. However, as he further explained, since the shared parking adjustment is part of the current BCZR they must comply with all other aspects of the current BCZR as part of upgrading to the current regulations. Therefore, he requested that they be relieved from any minor deficiencies in the existing surface parking lot from the standpoint of BCZR §§409.3 and 409.4 of current BCZR relating to the required dimensions of the parking spaces, driveways and aisles as part of upgrading to the current regulations. For instance, Mr. Warfield pointed out that at the back of the property the parking spaces are only 15 feet in length and under the current regulations they are supposed to be 18 feet. Mr. La Fiandra asked that this relief be granted under paragraph 5 of the Special Hearing request.

With regard to paragraph 2 of the Special Hearing relief, Mr. Warfield explained that when the GIS line was created it did not precisely mirror the property line. As a result, on the south side of the property there is a very small section of the property that is now in the DR 3.5 zone, which partially extends into 6 of the existing parking spaces, thereby constituting commercial parking in a residential zone.

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The relief requested in paragraph 4 of the Special Hearing is also a result of the GIS anomaly discussed above. Hence the Petitioner needs relief from the RTA buffer and setback requirements. Mr. La Fiandra explained that if this relief is granted it will obviate the identical relief that is requested in paragraphs 3 and 4 of the Variance petition. With regard to paragraph 2 of the Variance relief, Mr. La Fiandra further explained that the parking spaces at the front of the property were built only 4 feet from the roadway and have existed there since 1982 and have caused no complaint or incident. He observed that several businesses in the vicinity along Falls Road have no parking out front and use the Lake Falls Village lot.

SPECIAL HEARING

Based on the foregoing I find that all of the conditions of BCZR Sec. 502.1 are satisfied and that the requested relief is in keeping with the spirit and intent of the BCZR and that it will not harm the public health, safety, and general welfare. Accordingly, I shall grant the relief requested in Special Hearing Request Number 1.

With regard to the requirements for commercial parking in a residential zone, I find that BCZR § 409.8.B.2 is satisfied, and I will grant the requested relief as it relates to the 6 existing parking spaces and the partial drive aisle. Accordingly, I shall grant the relief requested in Special Hearing Request Number 2.

With regard to the modification of the Residential Transition Area under BCZR Section 1B01.1.B.1.c(2) to permit the existing surface parking to be located within the 50-ft. RTA buffer and the 75-ft. RTA setback otherwise required by BCZR Section 1B01.1.B.1.E (3) and (5), respectively, I find that the reduction of the RTA as requested will be compatible with the neighborhood within the context of BCC § 32-4-402 in that Lake Falls Village Shopping Center (including the parking spaces at issue) are and have been existing for almost 40 years and indeed

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are a component of this neighborhood. I further specifically find that the reduction ordered hereby will not adversely impact the residential community or development on the land adjacent to the Lake Falls Village Shopping Center, as that land is already fully developed. Accordingly, I shall grant the relief requested in Special Hearing Request Number 4.

As discussed above, I have determined that the nature of this cause requires other incidental relief in the form of a modified parking plan for the existing surface parking lot under the authority of BCZR § 409.12 to allow minor deficiencies in the parking space dimensions and parking driveway and parking aisle dimensions otherwise required by BCZR §§ 409.3 and 409.4, and I shall grant this relief under Special Hearing Request Number 5.

VARIANCE

As to the variance, it requires a two-step process, summarized as follows:

- (1) It must be shown the property is unique in a manner which makes it unlike surrounding properties, and that uniqueness or peculiarity must necessitate variance relief; and
- (2) If variance relief is denied, Petitioner will experience a practical difficulty or hardship.

Cromwell v. Ward, 102 Md. App. 691 (1995).

The property is split-zoned and is an irregularly shaped lot that is sandwiched between the Jones Falls and Falls Road. The rear section of the property is within the 100 year floodplain. As such, the property is unique. If the Regulations were strictly interpreted, Petitioner would experience a practical difficulty because it would be unable to accommodate its tenant's proposed restaurant expansion. Further, I find that the variance can be granted in harmony with the spirit and intent of the BCZR, and in such manner as to grant relief without injury to the public health, safety and general welfare. This is demonstrated by the absence of County and/or community opposition. Finally, I note that the proposed restaurant expansion will not affect the existing ORDER RECEIVED FOR FILING

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exterior structure of the Lake Falls Village buildings or its existing exterior parking, features, or amenities.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED this 15 day of Novumbur, 2019, by this Administrative Law Judge, that the Petition for Special Hearing: (1) to approve an amendment to the previously approved site plan in Zoning Case No. 1997-0272-X; (2) to allow commercial parking in a residential zone pursuant to BCZR Section 409.8 B for six (6) existing parking spaces that partially extend into the adjacent DR 3.5 zone and partial drive aisle in DR 2; (3) a modified parking plan for the existing surface parking lot under the authority of BCZR § 409.12 to allow minor deficiencies in the parking space dimensions and parking driveway and parking aisle dimensions otherwise required by BCZR §§ 409.3 and 409.4; including, but not limited to, permitting the existing 15 foot spaces at the rear of the property in lieu of the required 18 foot spaces; (4) for modification of the Residential Transition Area ("RTA") under BCZR Section 1B01.1.B.1.c (2) in order to allow the existing surface parking to be located within the 50-ft. RTA buffer and the 75-ft. RTA setback otherwise required by BCZR Section 1B.01.1.B.I.E (3) and (5), respectively, be and is hereby GRANTED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Petition for Variance as follows: (1) from BCZR Section 409.8.A.4 to permit existing parking spaces to be as close as four (4) ft. from the right-of-way line of a public street, in lieu of the ten (10) ft. required (no new development proposed, be and is hereby GRANTED.

(1) The variance relief requested in paragraphs 3 and 4 is now MOOT based on the Special Hearing relief granted above.

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(2) The variance relief requested in paragraph 1 is MOOT based on the applicability of the Shared Parking Adjustment pursuant to BCZR Sec. 409.6.B.3, as depicted in the Shared Parking Analysis Table on the redlined Plan.

The relief granted herein shall be subject to the following:

1. Petitioner may apply for necessary permits and/or licenses upon receipt of this Order. However, Petitioner is hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at its own risk until 30 days from the date hereof, during which time an appeal can be filed by any party. If for whatever reason this Order is reversed, Petitioner would be required to return the subject property to its original condition.

Any appeal of this decision must be made within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

This matter comes before the Deputy Zoning Commissioner as a Petition for Special Exception for that property known as 6080 Falls Road, located in the vicinity of its intersection with Lake Avenue in the Bare Hills section of Towson. The Petition was filed by the owner of the property, Lake Falls Village Limited Partnership, by Mackenzie Properties, Inc., a General Partner, and the Contract Lessee, Corlyn, L.L.P., by Laureen Gischel, a Partner, through their attorney, Julius W. Lichter, Esquire. The Petitioners request a special exception for a tanning salon on the subject property, zoned B.L.-A.S., pursuant to Section 230.13 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.), and the Zoning Commissioner's Policy Manual, Re: 230.13, at Page 2-36. The subject property and relief sought are more particularly described on the site plan submitted which was accepted and marked into evidence as Petitioner's Exhibit 1.

Appearing at the public hearing on behalf of the Petition were representatives of the Lake Falls Village Limited Partnership, owners of the property, representatives of Corlyn, L.L.P., operators of the subject tanning salon, and Julius W. Lichter, Esquire, attorney for the Petitioners There were no Protestants or other interested persons present.

Testimony and evidence offered revealed that the property known as 6080 Falls Road is the site of a strip shopping center known as Lake

Falls Village, which consists of a variety of commercial, retail and office uses. The Petitioners propose to utilize one of the spaces on its lower level, consisting of approximately 1300 sq.ft., for use as a tanning salon which will be operated by Corlyn, L.L.P. The Petitioners commenced renovating the space and will have accommodations for nine tanning rooms. Due to the property's zoning classification, a special exception is necessary in order to utilize the property as proposed. The Petitioners submitted as Petitioner's Exhibit 4, a petition of support which had been signed by other business owners within the Lake Falls Village shopping center as well as many of the residents from the surrounding community.

It is clear that the B.C.Z.R. permits the use proposed in a B.L.-A.S. zone by special exception. It is equally clear that the proposed use would not be detrimental to the primary uses in the vicinity. Therefore, it must be determined if the conditions as delineated in Section 502.1 are satisfied.

The Petitioner had the burden of adducing testimony and evidence which would show that the proposed use met the prescribed standards and requirements set forth in Section 502.1 of the B.C.Z.R. The Petitioner has shown that the proposed use would be conducted without real detriment to the neighborhood and would not adversely affect the public interest. The facts and circumstances do not show that the proposed use at the particular location described by Petitioner's Exhibit 1 would have any adverse impact above and beyond that inherently associated with such a special exception use, irrespective of its location within the zone. Schultz v. Pritts, 432 A.2d 1319 (1981).

The proposed use will not be detrimental to the health, safety, or general welfare of the locality, nor tend to create congestion in

roads, streets, or alleys therein, nor be inconsistent with the purposes of the property's zoning classification, nor in any other way be inconsistent with the spirit and intent of the B.C.Z.R.

After reviewing all of the testimony and evidence presented, it appears that the special exception should be granted with certain restrictions as more fully described below.

Pursuant to the advertisement, posting of the property, and public hearing on this Petition held, and for the reasons given above, the relief requested in the special exception should be granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED by the Deputy Zoning Commissioner for Baltimore County this day of February, 1997 that the Petition for Special Exception for a tanning salon on the subject property, zoned B.L.-A.S., pursuant to Section 230.13 of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations (B.C.Z.R.), and the Zoning Commissioner's Policy Manual, Re: 230.13, at Page 2-36, in accordance with Petitioner's Exhibit 1, be and is hereby GRANTED, subject to the following restriction:

1) The Petitioners may apply for their permits and be granted same upon receipt of this Order; however, Petitioners are hereby made aware that proceeding at this time is at their own risk until such time as the 30-day appellate process from this Order has expired. If, for whatever reason, this Order is reversed, the relief granted herein shall be rescinded.

Section 409-OFFSTREET PARKING AND LOADING (see Section 409.5) [B.C.Z.R., 1955.]

409.1-Parking and Loading Spaces-There shall be provided, at the time of application for a building permit for the erection or enlargement of any building for which offstreet parking and/or loading space is hereinafter required, other than a dwelling, a plan showing such parking and loading spaces, including the means of access and interior circulation both from the standpoint of the project itself and in relation to its surroundings. [B.C.Z.R., 1955.]

409.2-Parking space-Each offstreet parking space shall be not less than 8 1/2 ft. wide by 18 ft. long, and there shall be not less than 300 sq. ft. per space in the case of lot or garage parking where there is no attendant, and not less than 250 sq. ft. where there is an attendant, such square foot figures to include access aisles. [B.C.Z.R., 1955; Resolution, November 21, 1956.]

- a. Parking space for dwellings, including apartment houses—In any zone, except as otherwise provided below, at least 1 garage space or other usable offstreet parking space must be provided for each dwelling unit other than housing for the elderly. In all zones, in the case of a lodging, rooming or boarding house, fraternity or sorority house or dormitory, there shall be one offstreet parking space for each 5 guests or members residing on the premises, but not less than 2 parking spaces in any case. In the case of a hotel or apartment hotel, there shall be one such parking space for each guest room or suite. In the case of a motel, there shall be at least one parking space for each rental unit. Parking space as required above shall be provided on the same lot with the building which it serves or within 300 feet thereof (see Section 217.6). [B.C.Z.R., 1955; Bill No. 80, 1981.]
- b. Parking space for uses other than dwellings In all zones, permanently maintained offstreet parking spaces shall be provided as follows. For the purposes of measuring the floor area of a building in order to determine the number of required offstreet parking spaces, the floor area of any ambulatory, open or enclosed, shall be excluded. [B.C.Z.R., 1955; Bill No. 18, 1976; No. 85, 1983.]

409.2.b.(8) (Parking)

(8) Trucking facilities, Class I

5 plus 1 for each 2 employees in the largest shift except that the Zoning Commissioner, pursuant to a public hearing, may reduce the number of spaces required where employment conditions are such as to make the above requirements clearly excessive [Bill 18-76]

(9) Trucking facilities, Class II

I for each 2 employees in the largest shift, or I for each 3000 square feet of total area devoted to parking of truck tractors, truck trailers, or tractor-trailers (not including truck maneuvering area or loading area), but in no case less than 10 except that the Zoning Commissioner, pursuant to a public hearing, may reduce the number of space required where employment conditions are such as to make the above requirements clearly excessive [Bill 18-76]

Parking space as required above shall be either on the same lot with the principal use to which it is accessory or within 500 feet of the building it is intended to serve. [B.C.Z.R., 1955; Bill No. 18-76]

- c. Requirements for all parking spaces or parking lots-All offstreet parking facilities shall be either contained within buildings or subject to the following requirements. [B.C.Z.R., 1955.]
 - (1) Screening shall be provided in accordance with the Landscape Manual adopted pursuant to Section 22-105 of Title 22 of the Baltimore County Code. [B.C.Z.R., 1955; No. 31, 1984.]
 - (2) Surface-Any parking or storage space for more than 5 vehicles shall provide a durable and dustless surface, and shall be properly drained. [B.C.Z.R., 1955.]
 - (3) Lighting-Any fixture used to illuminate any offstreet parking area shall be so arranged as to reflect the light away from residential lots. [B.C.Z.R., 1955.]
 - (4) No parking space shall be closer than eight feet to a street property line. [B.C.Z.R., 1955.]
- d. Modification of Parking-Space Requirements in C.C.C. Districts or Town Centers. The Planning Board may adopt, and from time to time revise, parking-space standards for C.C.C. districts or town centers, which standards differ from the parking-space requirements otherwise applicable under these Zoning Regulations; but the provisions of the Zoning Regulations shall control unless and until the Zoning Commissioner, upon petition and after public hearing, orders that the Planning Board's standards may be applied to the subject property of the petition. [Bills No. 111, 1968; No. 100, 1970.]

In formulating such parking-space standards, the Planning Board shall consider: any relevant surveys and studies submitted by the Baltimore County Department of Traffic Engineering; projections of transit usage; any probability of lessened parking demand as a result of integrally housed business establishments with different (complementary) peak hours; trends with respect to patterns of car ownership or usage within the areas of concern; probability of assisted ("attendant") parking, nearby parking facilities developed by the Baltimore County Revenue Authority; and other pertinent factors under which recommended decreases in parking requirements may be effected. [Bills No. 111, 1968; No. 100, 1970.]

409. 2.e (Parking)

- e. Parking Requirements for Housing for the Elderly- For housing for the elderly, at least 1 usable offstreet parking space must be provided for each 2½ dwelling units in a town center or for each 2 dwelling units elsewhere. In either case, the Zoning Commissioner may allow the provision of fewer parking spaces, after a public hearing at which evidence has been given regarding the availability of developer-sponsored van service or other ride-sharing for the prospective residents of the housing and the Director of Planning and Zoning has furnished information regarding the availability and accessibility to the elderly of public mass transportation to the site. In no case, however, may the petitioner be allowed to provide less than 1 parking space for each 10 dwelling units. [Bill Nos. 139-79; 80-81]
- In the CT District of the Towson town center, only one parking space for each 325 square feet of total floor area need be provided for any building devoted to retail trade and no parking spaces need be provided for any restaurant. All parking spaces for any non-residential use in the CT District of the Towson town center may be located as much as 1500 feet from the building housing the use. Except for parking spaces for dwellings, all such parking spaces must be located inside the boundaries of the CT District of the Towson town center. These standards are applicable to any property only to the extent that they are consistent with the detailed plan for the Towson town center. These standards are not applicable to any property governed by parking-space standards implemented by a petition granted pursuant to paragraph (d) above. In addition, this paragraph may not be construed to prohibit any grant of a further decrease in parking requirements pursuant to Section 307. [Bill No. 210-80].
- 409.3—Loading Space—On the same premises with every building or part thereof, hereafter erected, having a total floor area of at least 10,000 square feet, occupied for manufacturing, storage, warehouse, goods display, retail store, wholesale store, market, hotel, elevator apartment building, hospital, mortuary, laundry, dry cleaning, or other uses which similarly involve deliveries or shipments of materials or merchandise by truck, there shall be provided and maintained at least one offstreet loading space plus one additional such loading space for each 50,000 square feet of total floor area so used in excess of 10,000 square feet. Each offstreet loading space shall be not less than 10 feet wide, 25 feet long, and 14 feet high. Where buildings are so located on the lot that loading facilities are provided within the premises so that no part of a loading or unloading vehicle projects into or across any publicly-used street, alley, or sidewalk, the Zoning Commissioner may reduce the number of loading spaces required under this paragraph. [8.C.Z.R., 1955.]

- 409.4-Business or Industrial Parking in Residence Zones-Upon application the Zoning Commissioner may issue a use permit for the use of land in a residential zone for parking areas to meet the requirements of the foregoing schedule, subject to the following conditions. If granted, such use permit shall be conditioned as follows, in lieu of the provisions in Section 409.2 (c): [B.C.2.R., 1955; Resolution, November 21, 1956; Bill No. 31, 1984.]
 - A. The land so used must adjoin or be across an alley or street from the business or industry involved. [B.C.Z.R., 1955; Resolution, November 21, 1956.]
 - b. Only passenger vehicles, excluding buses, may use the parking area. [B.C.Z.R., 1955; Resolution, November 21, 1956.]
 - c. No loading, service, or any use other than parking shall be permitted. [B.C.Z.R., 1955; Resolution, November 21, 1956.]
 - d. Lighting shall be regulated as to location, direction, hours of illumination, glare, and intensity, as required. [B.C.Z.R., 1955; Resolution, November 21, 1956.]
 - e. Screening shall be provided in accordance with the Baltimore County Landscape Manual adopted pursuant to Section 22-105 of Title 22 of the Baltimore County Code. [Resolution, November 21, 1956; No. 31, 1984.]
 - f. A paved surface, properly drained, shall be required. [B.C.Z.R., 1955, Paragraph 409.4.e; Resolution, November 21, 1956.]
 - g. A satisfactory plan showing parking arrangement and vehicular access must be provided. [Resolution, November 21, 1956.]
 - h. Method and area of operation, provision for maintenance, and permitted hours of use shall be specified, and regulated as required. [B.C.Z.R., 1955, Paragraph 409.4.e; Resolution, November 21, 1956.]
- 409.5-Exception-Where the requirements for parking space or loading space in Section 409 would create an undue hardship the Zoning Commissioner may approve a modified plan upon petition and after a public hearing. [B.C.Z.R., 1955.]

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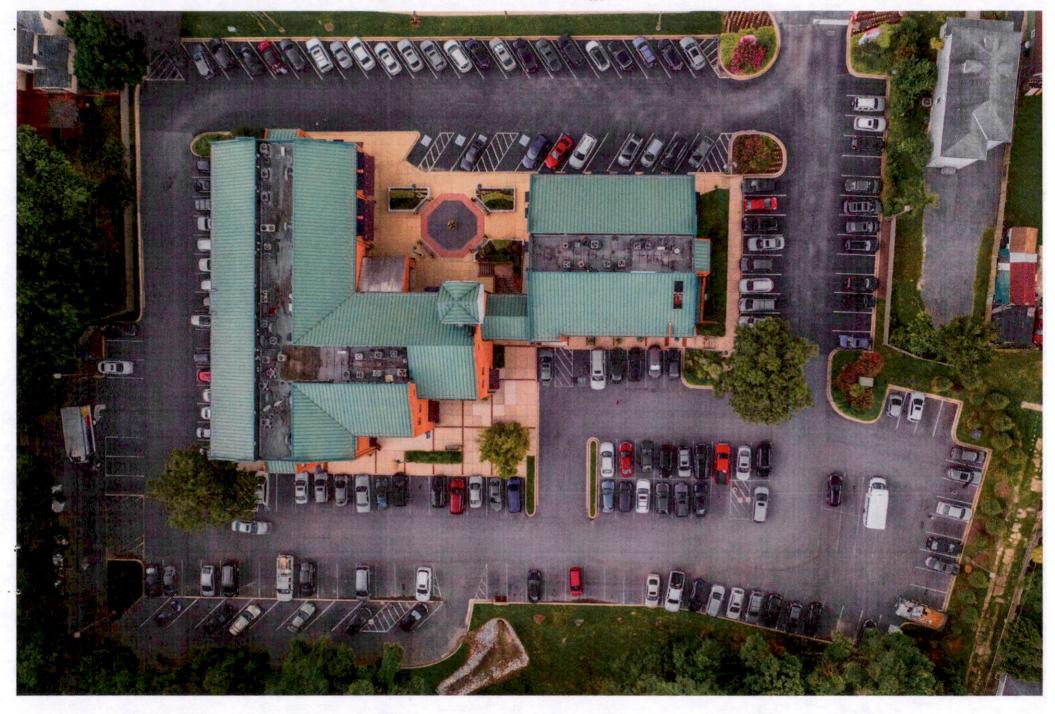
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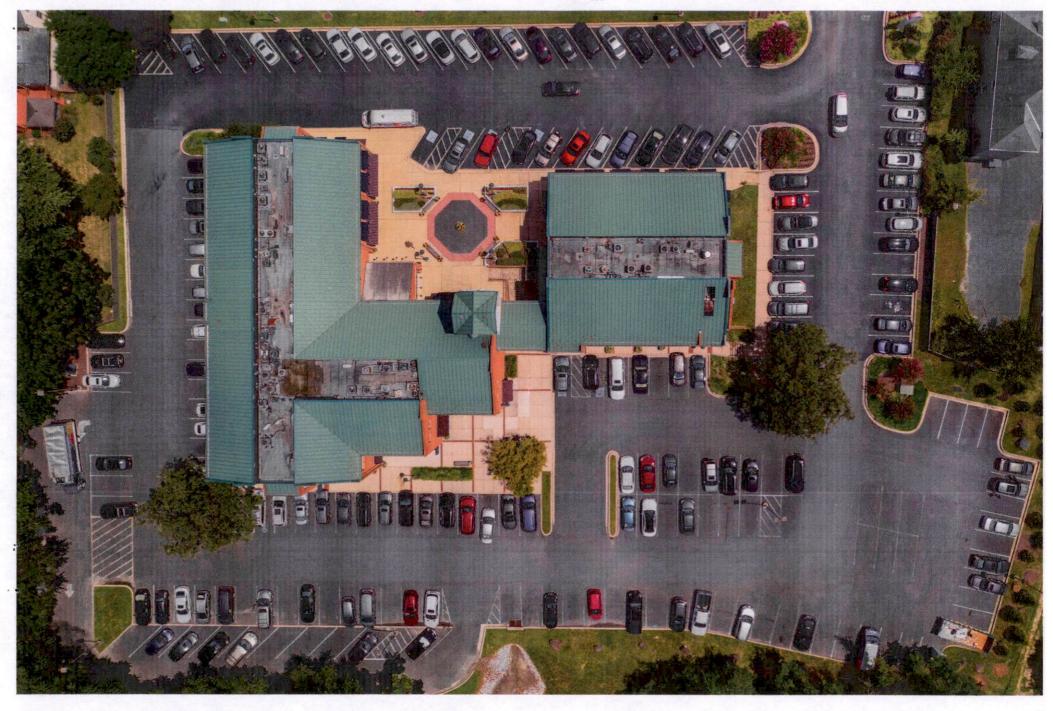


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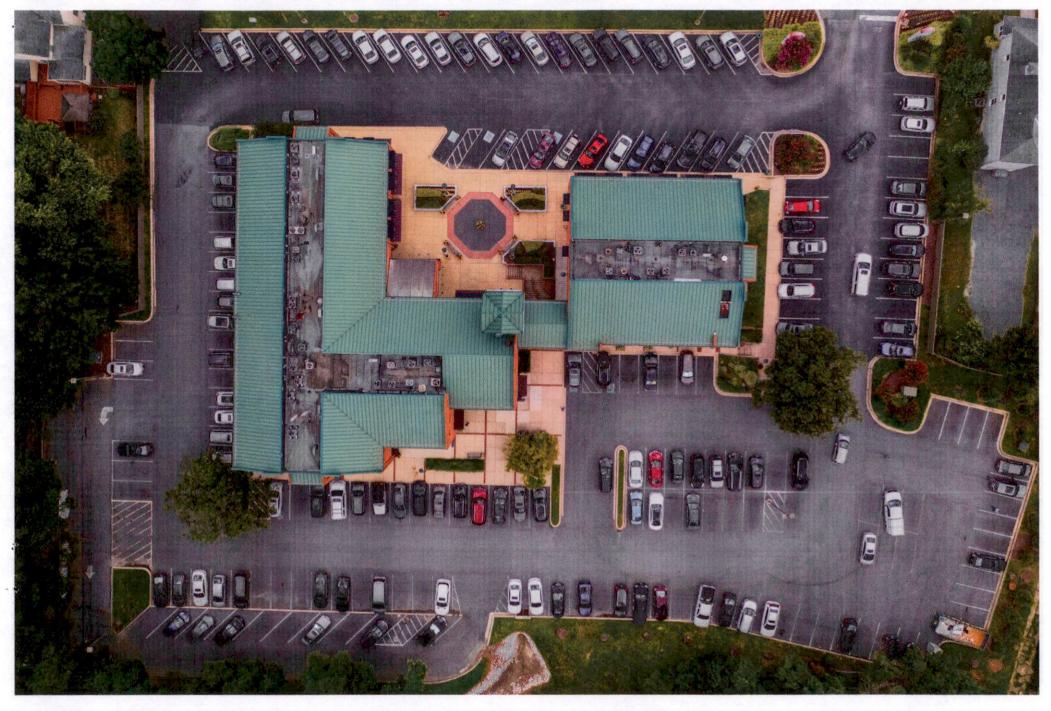


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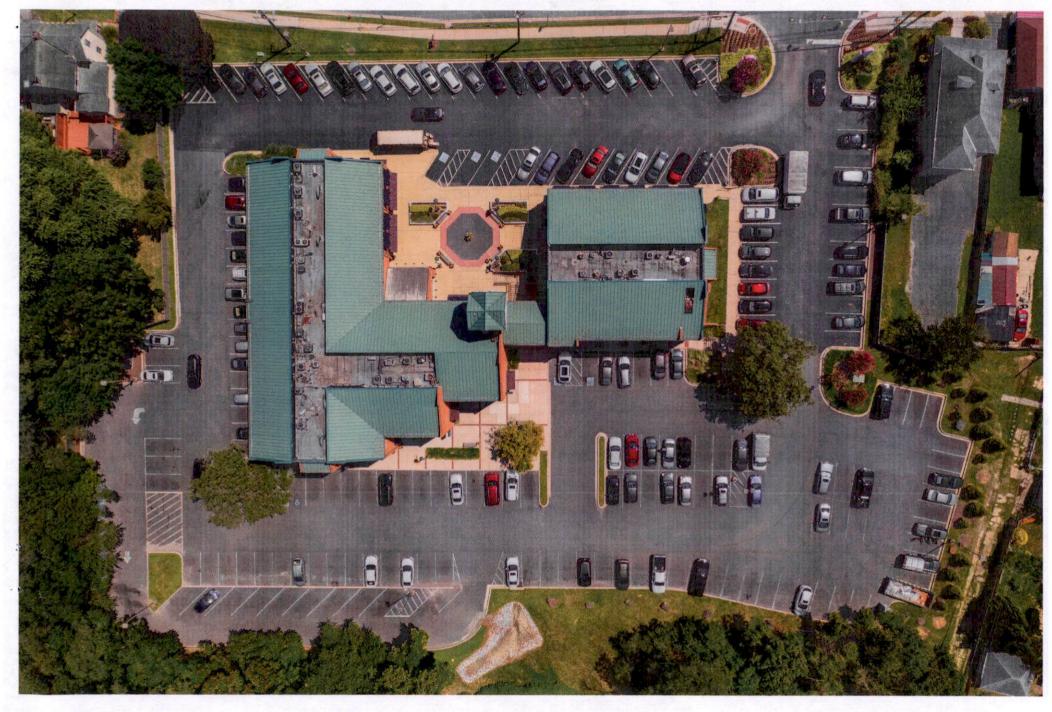
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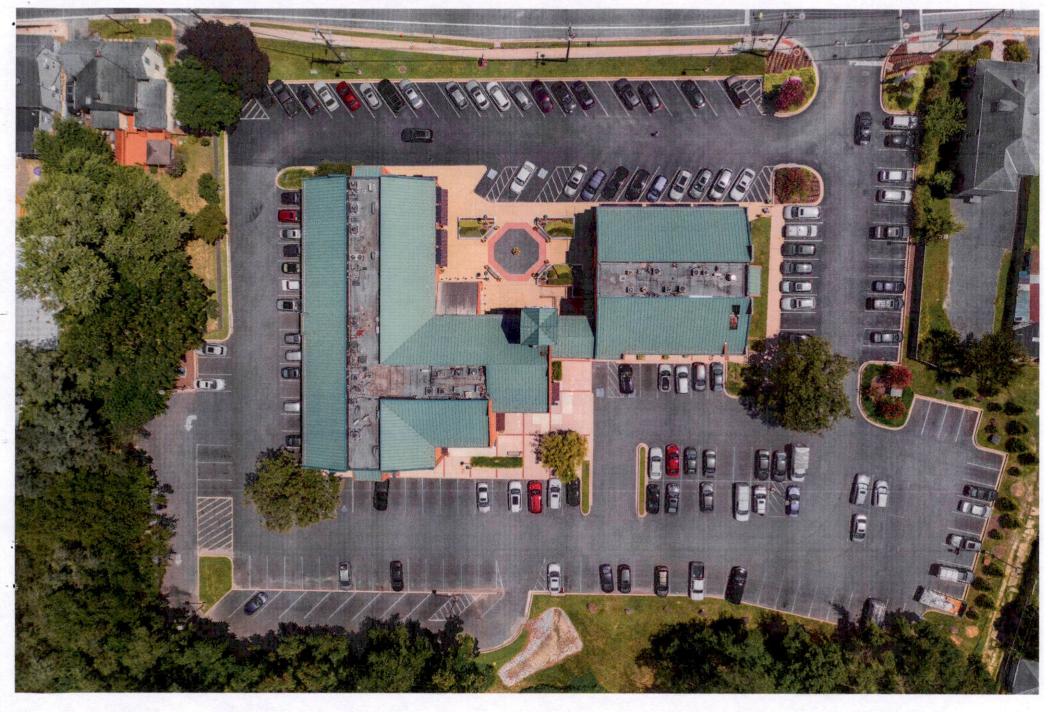
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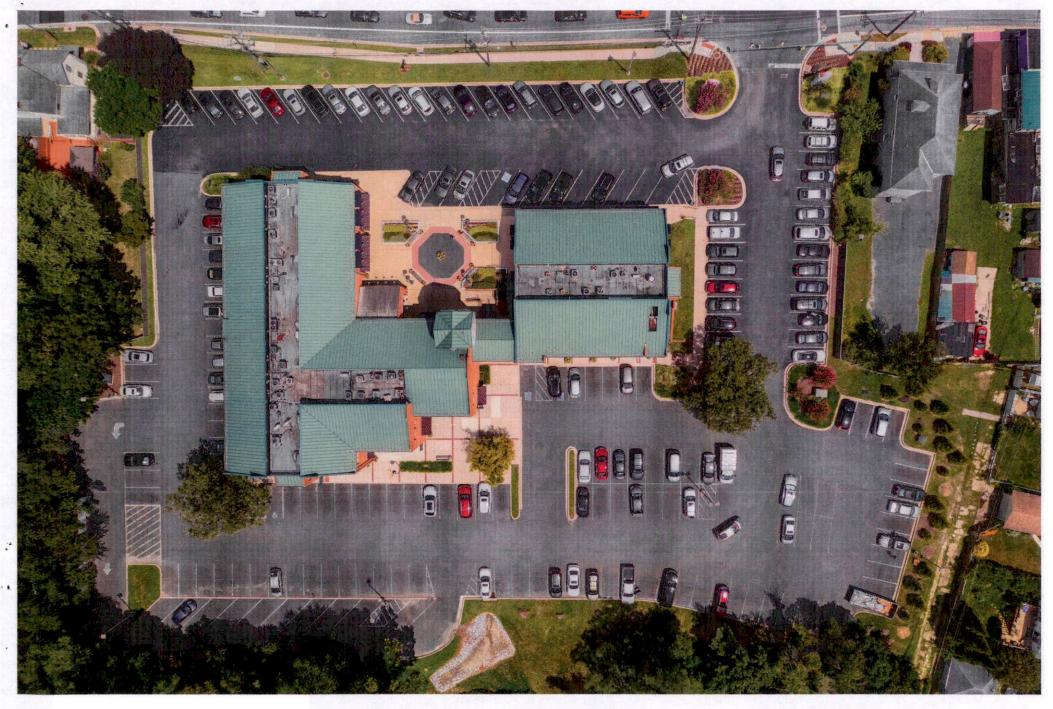
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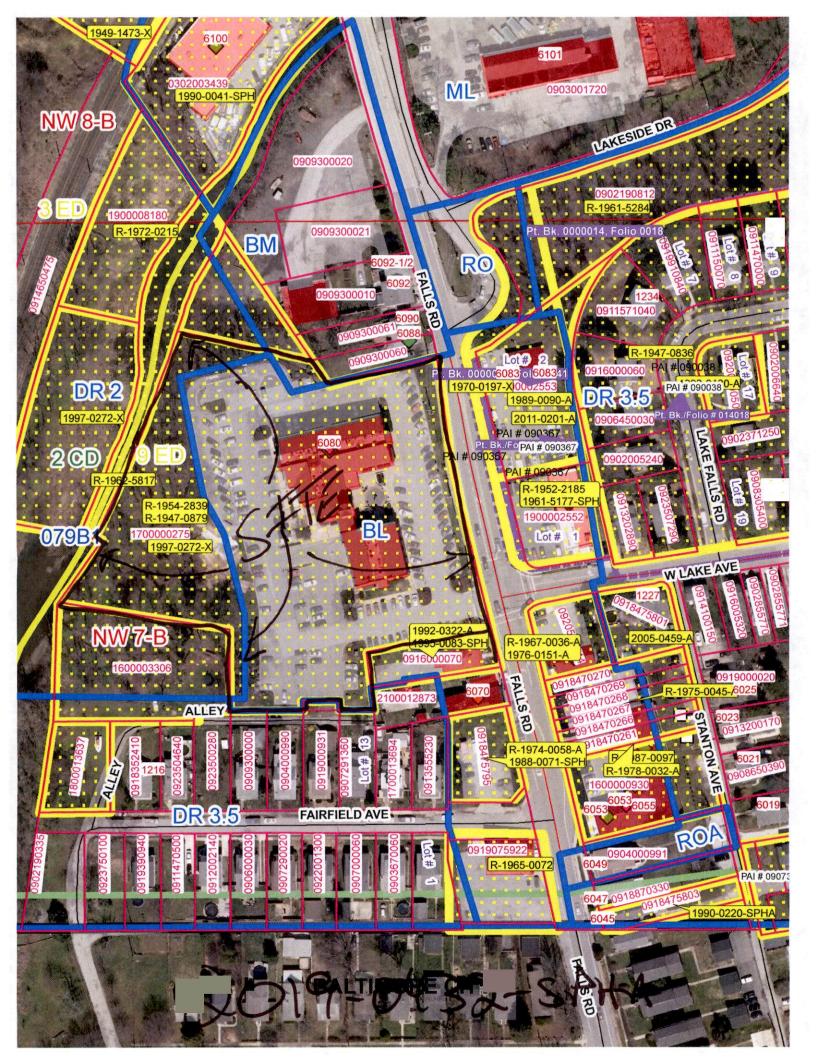
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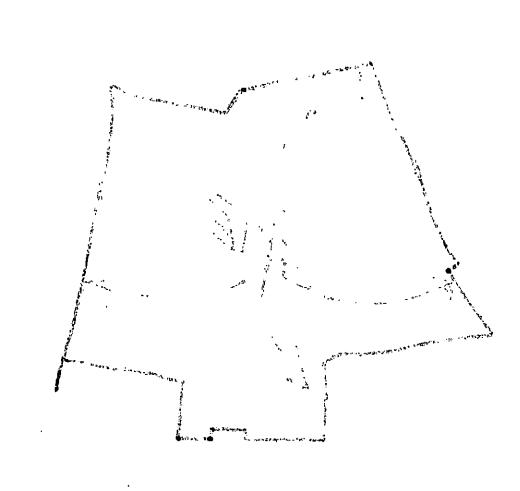


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
